Why the OJP Diagnostic Center?

- Policy makers need technical assistance to identify, assess and implement data-driven strategies to combat crime and improve public safety at the state, tribal and local level.
- OJP needs to be strategic in leveraging investments in technical assistance.
 - Multiple TA programs and funding streams with OJP and DOJ
 - Few resources for broad scope, systems-change assistance
 - Request requiring resources from multiple DOJ components to respond effectively
 - Leveraging the investment by building capacity in communities

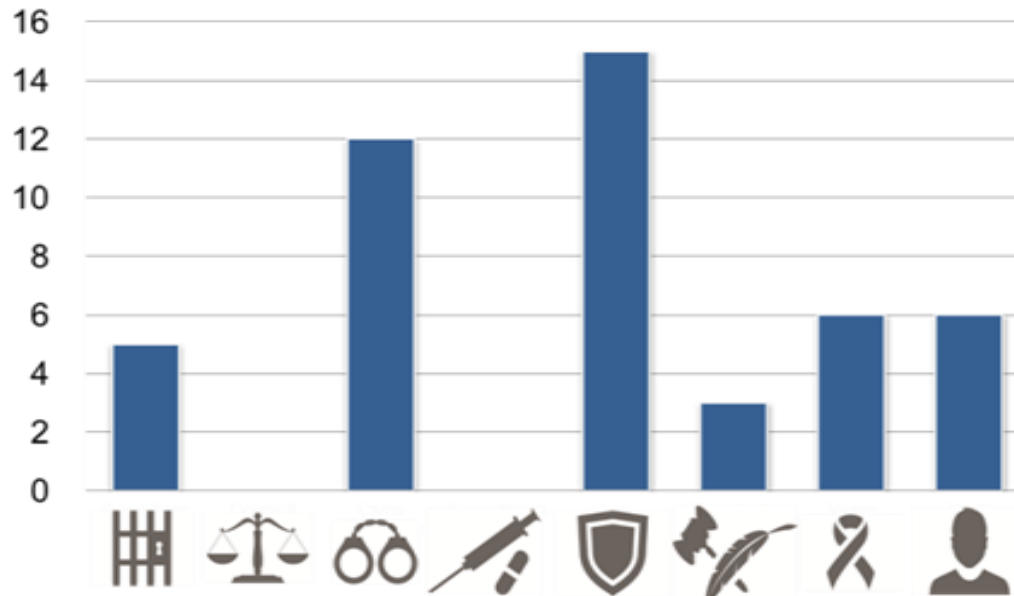


The Diagnostic Center supports communities facing complex challenges that require system change across multiple crime topics

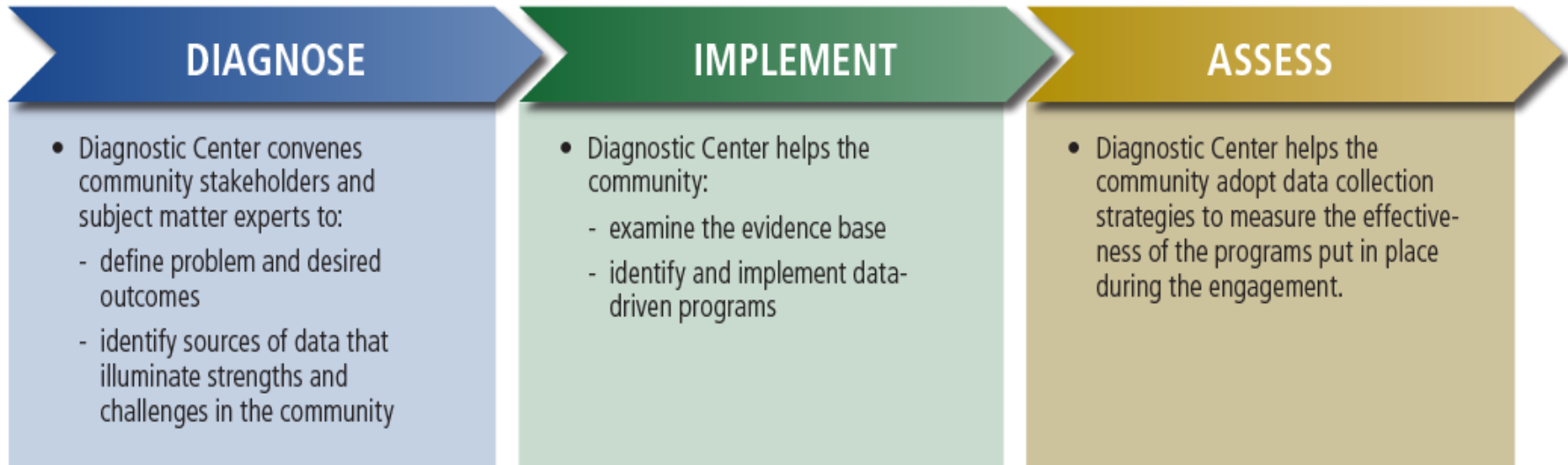

The Diagnostic Center follows a three-phase process

The Diagnostic Center consistently applies its three-phased process for providing assistance to communities – **Diagnose**, **Implement** and **Assess** – to identify the true contributing factors to crime, and to map them to strategies and solutions that have demonstrated success in reducing crime.



The Diagnostic Center develops products tailored to each community and that help to advance knowledge of *what works*

- Diagnostic Center leverages local data to diagnose factors contributing to a community's public safety issues and then maps those factors to strategies and solutions that have demonstrated success in reducing crime
- Diagnostic Center develops products that can be leveraged by communities to help inform their approach and decision-making and to advance knowledge of *what works* in the criminal justice, juvenile justice and victim services fields

Our Approach to Assisting Communities
 Investigate Assemble and analyze data from the community on the criminal justice, juvenile justice, or victim service issue of concern.
 Diagnose Document the factors contributing to the issue of concern and identify evidence-based models that can be implemented.

Search Evidence-Based Resources by Crime Topic:
 Corrections, Courts and Justice Systems, Crime Prevention, Drugs and Substance Abuse, Emergency Management, Evidence-Based Practices, Health, Human Trafficking, Juvenile Justice, Public Safety, Victim Assistance, Youth Assistance.

Subject matter experts will deliver dual workshops to the NFPD and community stakeholders on CPED

The Diagnostic Center identified data-driven and evidence-based practices that align to the EHPD's public safety issue areas

The EHPD seeks data-driven strategies to address public safety problem

The Diagnostic Center proposes the following training and technical assistance to improve police effectiveness

Top 10 addresses for CG calls account for 10% of all calls and less than 0.3% of addresses to which the EHPD was dispatched

Data analysis validated EHPD perceptions that alarm calls account for a small portion (nearly 17%) of reactive workload

High incident density locations demonstrated little geospatial deviation between IO and CG calls
