**OUTCOMES**

**Short Term (year 1):**  
 -Identify current resources, challenges, gaps, and best practices for sexual violence provisions.  
 -Recommendations to address challenges and gaps.

**Intermediate (years 2-4):**  
 -Increased utilization of victim services.  
 -Increased number of sexual assault examinations.  
 -Increased evidence kits collected.  
 -Increased community awareness activities.  
 -Increased evidence kits submitted to law enforcement.  
 -3 model demonstration sites.  
 -Development of National Guidelines to address sexual violence in AI/AN communities.  
 - Victims will experience increased satisfaction with the coordinated community sexual violence response.
