******MEDIA ADVISORY****** TASK FORCE TO EXAMINE CHILDREN'S EXPOSURE TO VIOLENCE IN RURAL AND TRIBAL COMMUNITIES

WASHINGTON— U.S. Attorney General Eric Holder's National Task Force on Children Exposed to Violence will hold its second public hearing on Tuesday, Jan. 31. The task force will gather testimony on the epidemic of children's exposure to violence from nationally recognized experts and members of the Albuquerque community.

Hearing speakers include Associate Attorney General Thomas J. Perrelli, U.S. Attorney Kenneth J. Gonzales, task force co-chairs Joe Torre and Robert Listenbee, task force members as well as Albuquerque and regional residents who have experienced family, community and other types of violence.
