******MEDIA ADVISORY****** JUSTICE DEPARTMENT TO HONOR FOUR INDIVIDUALS AT NATIONAL MISSING CHILDREN'S DAY CEREMONY

WASHINGTON—Deputy Attorney General James M. Cole will recognize law enforcement officers, a prosecutor and a concerned citizen from Florida, Missouri, North Dakota and Wisconsin for their efforts to recover missing children, rescue children from abuse and prosecute sexual predators at the annual National Missing Children's Day commemoration at the Justice Department's Great Hall, on **WEDNESDAY**, **MAY 23, 2012**, **at 2:00 p.m.**

Yvonne Pointer, a renowned anti-violence activist, philanthropist and author whose 14 year-old daughter was abducted, raped and murdered, will be a featured speaker. Pointer has launched a number of crime prevention programs and has received numerous national awards for her charitable and philanthropic work. At the event, the Justice Department will announce newly translated publications to support Spanish-speaking child abduction survivors and their siblings.
