NEARLY \$5.5 MILLION IN NEW JUSTICE DEPARTMENT FUNDING TO ADVANCE VICTIM SERVICES WILL BE ANNOUNCED

WASHINGTON – Mary Lou Leary, Acting Assistant Attorney General for the Office of Justice Programs will announce funding to develop and enhance support to crime victims at the opening session of the National Center for Victims of Crime's 2012 National Conference. Hundreds of victim service providers, government leaders, policy leaders, members of law enforcement, criminologists, victim advocates and survivors are expected to attend.

Acting Assistant Attorney General Leary also will preview an upcoming national report: *Vision 21: Transforming Victim Services*, which will provide recommendations for a comprehensive and systematic approach for responding to crime victims. The report will be available later this fall.
