BJS TO RELEASE CONTACTS BETWEEN POLICE AND THE PUBLIC, 2015

WASHINGTON — The U.S. Department of Justice's Bureau of Justice Statistics will issue a press release and report, *Contacts Between Police and the Public, 2015*, **EMBARGOED UNTIL <u>THURSDAY, OCTOBER 11, 2018, 8 A.M. ET.</u>** The report presents data on the nature and frequency of contact between police and U.S. residents. Findings are based on data from BJS's 2015 Police-Public Contact Survey, a supplement to the National Crime Victimization Survey.
