FAC Purpose

 Federal Advisory Committees (FAC) are established to help inform federal policy, programs

• FACs assemble individuals with diverse expertise, experience, backgrounds

Member Roles

 Advisory Committee is to provide advice on social science and statistics to the Assistant Attorney General of OJP

 Advice should help OJP enhance its overall impact and performance of its programs by assisting OJP's adherence to the highest levels of scientific rigor.

Member Roles

- Conduct hearings to gather information on the scientific soundness of OJP programs and the impact of OJP's research, statistics and grant programs.
- Serve as a base of contact with the academic and practitioner communities.
- Science Advisor Board is independent, but operates through Designated Federal Official.

Ethical Considerations

• Access to OJP staff and non-public information

- Conflict of interest is a major concern
 - Personal conflicts
 - Organizational conflicts
 - Family conflicts
- Generally may not accept gifts

Ethical Considerations

• Think general vs. specific recommendations

 Specific recommendations require financial disclosure forms

Overall: Avoid taking positions that look as if any particular organization or individual is being favored

Lobbying

 2002 anti-lobbying statute expanded lobbying restrictions to state/local/tribal governments, all grantees and FAC members

 Federally registered lobbyists are prohibited from serving on FACs
