We participate in a Victim Assistance Academy bringing together advocates, law enforcement, prosecutors and community members. A staff member attends monthly meetings of the Sexual Assault Response Team (S.A.R.T.) in a tri-county area, as well as STOPVIEW (Stop Violence Against Woman) monthly forums.
