

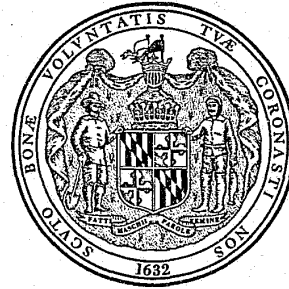

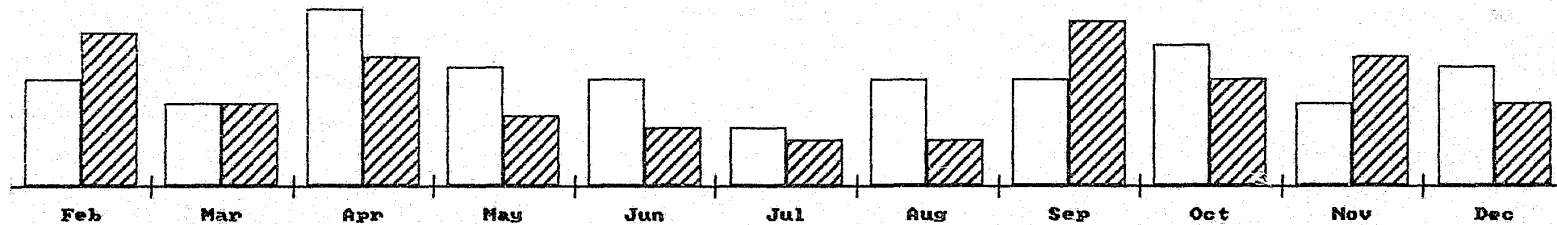

INTRODUCTION

IN AN EFFORT TO ASSIST DECISION MAKERS, THE OFFICE OF RESEARCH AND STATISTICS DEVELOPED THIS DOCUMENT TO PROVIDE A SYNOPSIS OF THE TRENDS IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE PROCESSING STATISTICS WHICH HAVE OCCURRED OVER THE MOST RECENT CALENDER YEARS. AN EFFORT HAS BEEN MADE TO CAPTURE ON A MONTHLY BASIS STATISTICAL DATA WHICH PROVIDES SOME INDICATORS AS TO THE CHANGES IN OFFENSE AND ARREST PATTERNS, LOCAL JAIL POPULATIONS, PAROLE AND PROBATION CASELOADS, STATE CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTION POPULATIONS AND PAROLING AUTHORITY ACTIVITIES. IN EACH SECTION OF THE REPORT A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE DATA SOURCES AND RECENT TRENDS IS PRESENTED. THIS REPORT ACTS AS A REPRESENTATION OF THE EVENTS WHICH HAVE OCCURRED OVER THE PAST TWO CALENDER YEARS. CAUSE-EFFECT RELATIONSHIPS CANNOT BE DRAWN FROM THE VARIOUS DATA PRESENTED. HOWEVER, RELATIONSHIPS IN TRENDS CAN AID USERS OF THIS DOCUMENT IN OBTAINING AN INDICATION OF POSSIBLE FUTURE TRENDS.

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OFFENSES AND ARRESTS

Data Sources

The information contained in the offenses and arrests section of the Agency Processing Statistics is based upon data tabulated through the State-wide Uniform Crime Reporting program managed by the Maryland State Police Criminal Records Central Repository (CRCR). Each month, summary data on offenses and arrests is compiled and submitted to CRCR by each of Maryland's 134 law enforcement agencies. These reports are edited and prepared for data entry. Computer generated output reports are produced to summarize the information received in a variety of formats. CRCR then provides monthly summaries of the offense and arrest data to the Office of Research and Statistics.

Comparisons of data trends occurring between CY 1985 and CY 1984 have been graphically depicted in charts. Index Offenses - Total, Property and Violent are displayed (page 3) as well as a comparison of Total Offenses (reported) and Adult Arrests (page 4). Data associated with these graphs is provided in tables for each calendar year (pages 5 and 6). A quarterly comparison of the changes in reported index offenses over these two calendar years is also provided (page 7).

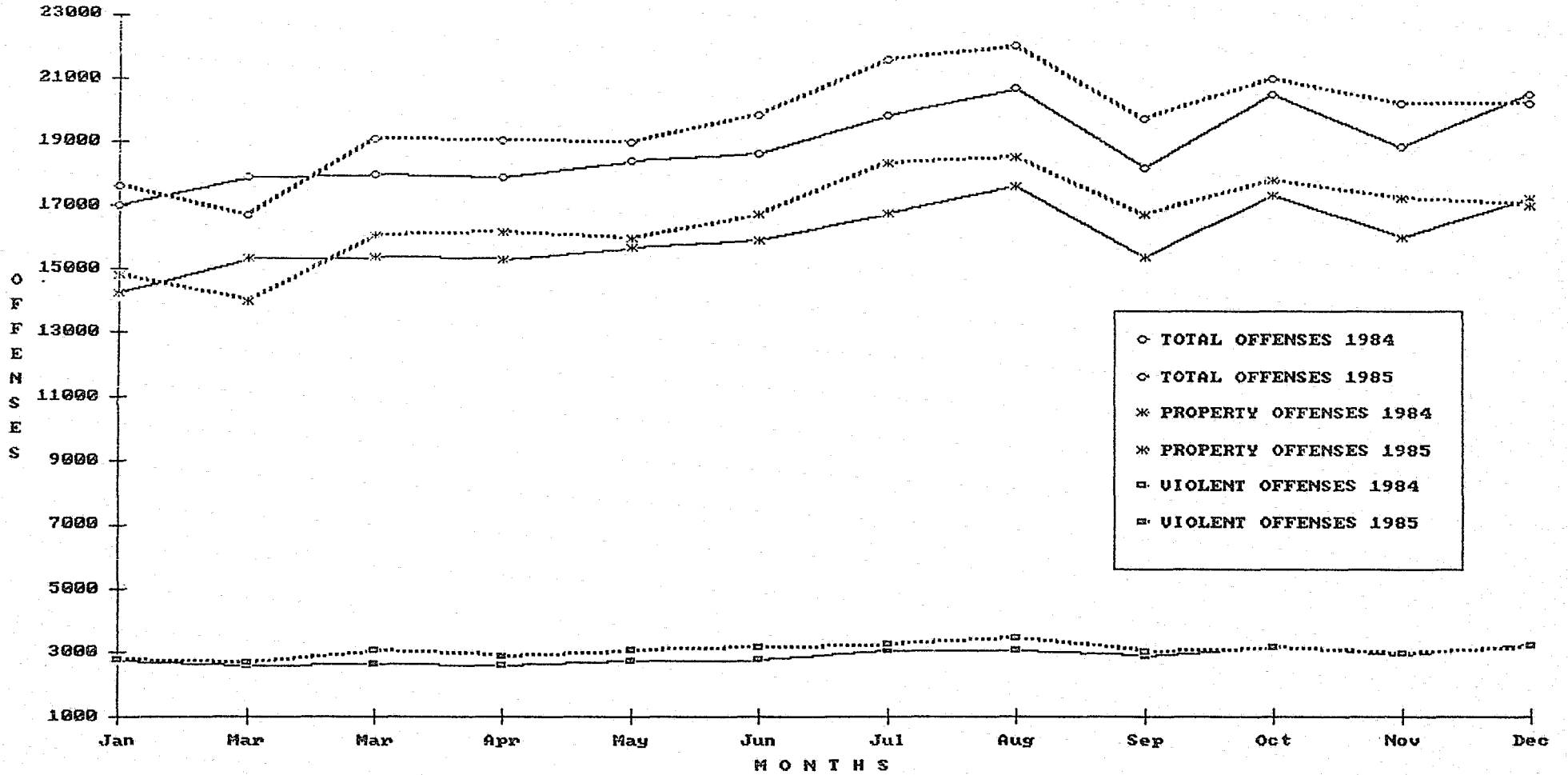
Recent Trends

Total offenses were up 4.2% from 226,887 in CY 1984 to 236,388 in CY 1985. This increase occurred in all index crime categories except Murder, which decreased slightly from 354 in CY 1984 to 350 in CY 1985. Combined categories of offense data show that violent offenses (murder, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault) increased 6.6% from 34,480 in CY 1984 to 36,762 in CY 1985. Property Offenses (burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft) increased 3.8% from 192,407 in CY 1984 to 199,626 in CY 1985. See pages 3, 5, 6, and 7.

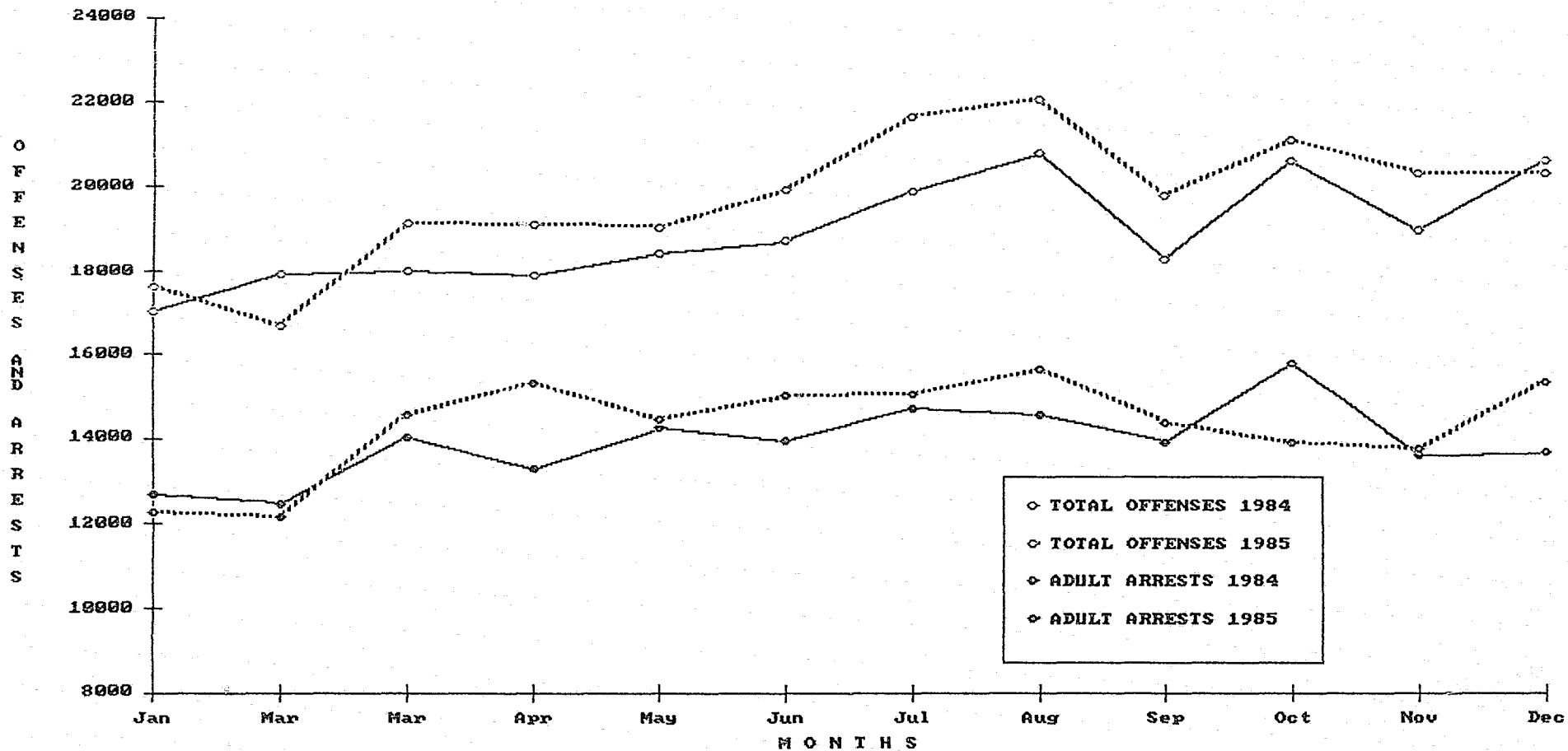
Adult arrests increased 2.9% from 166,832 in CY 1984 to 171,646 in CY 1985. It should be noted that offense data is collected for only index crimes (murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft) and only when they are reported. Arrest data encompasses not only index crimes but other crimes, generally considered less serious. Offense data and arrest data are, therefore, mutually exclusive and difficult to compare to each other.

Data on juvenile arrests in tables 5 and 6 show a leveling of the previous declining trend. The number of juveniles arrested in CY 1985 was 37,753, a 0.7% decrease from the 38,005 juveniles arrested in CY 1984.

LOCAL JAIL STATISTICS

Data Sources

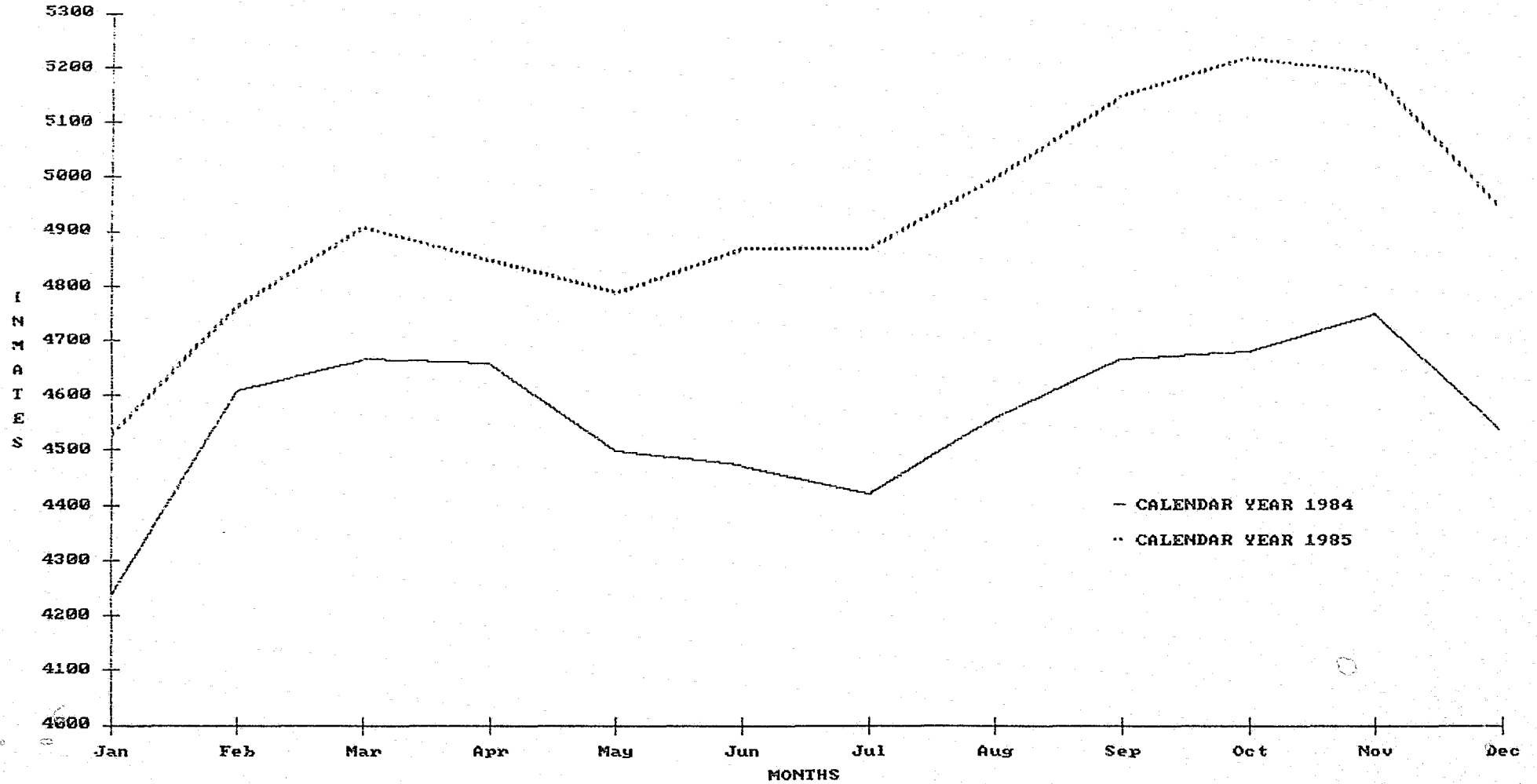
The information contained in this section of the Agency Processing Statistics is derived from State-wide manual data collection efforts by the staff of the Maryland Commission on Correctional Standards. The Commission staff tabulates and summarizes data submitted by local jurisdictions. State-wide aggregate data reflecting monthly trends for Calendar Years 1984 and 1985, spanning all local jurisdictions, are displayed as value lines in the following charts: Average Daily Population in Local Jails, Local Versus DOC Sentenced Inmates, and Awaiting Trial, PSI and Other (Jail Population) on pages 9 to 11. The calendar year data (CY 1984 - CY 1985) used to derive these charts is presented in the tables on page 12. The State-wide Average Daily Population is calculated by Commission staff. Data on the status of local jail prisoners (sentenced, awaiting trial, etc.), the intake and the departures represent end of month actual counts forwarded to the Commission and aggregated.

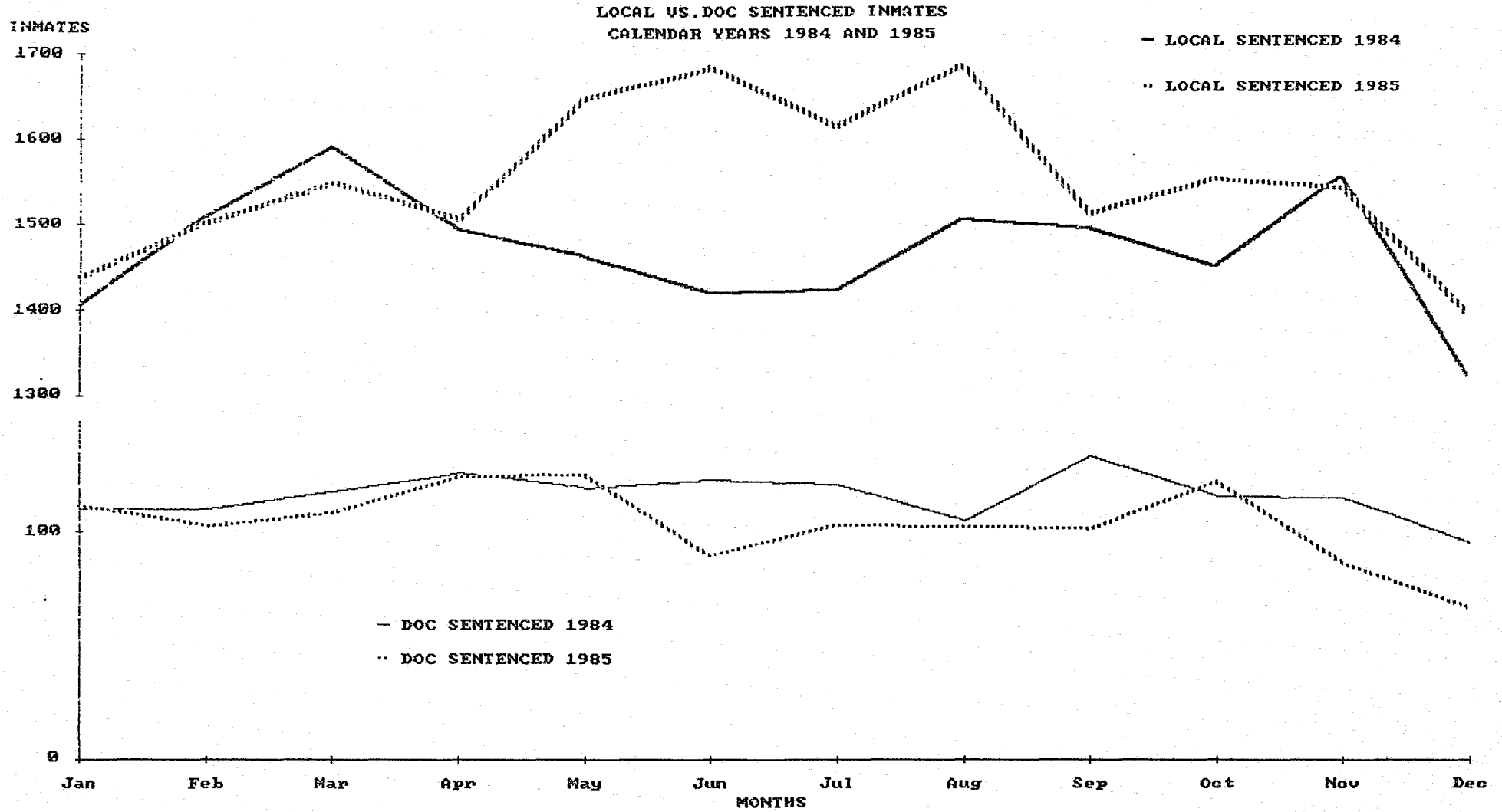
Recent Trends

The CY 1985 average daily population in local jails increased 7.8% over CY 1984 (CY 1985 - 4,922 opposed to CY 1984 - 4,563). This growth in the average daily population incarcerated in local jails is reflected on the chart on page 9. The balance between average intakes and average departures is nearly equal (CY 1985 intakes 5,956; CY 1985 departures 5,928). This indicates that the average daily population level for CY 1985 could be continued into future periods.

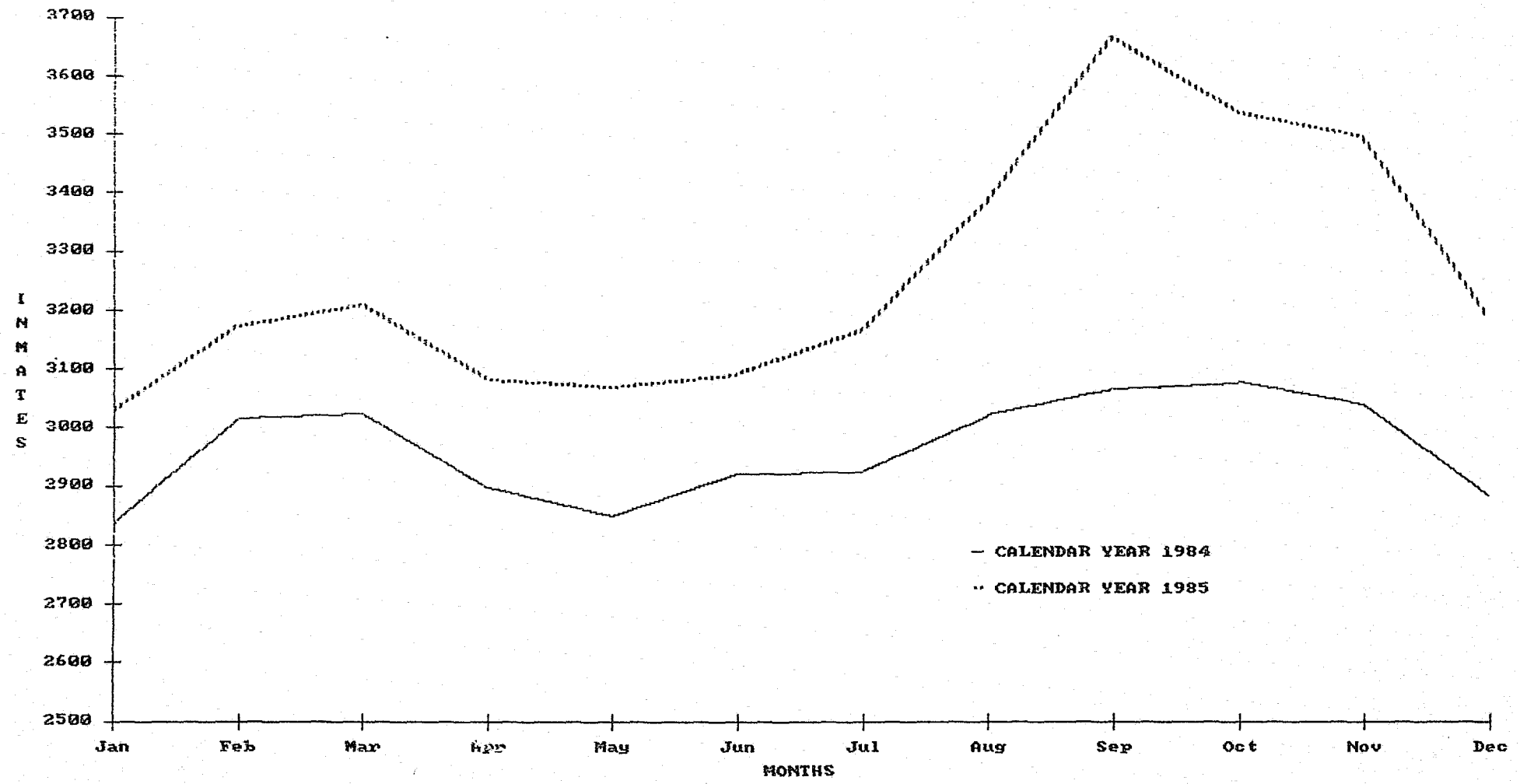
A complex interaction of jail population factors influences population growth as reflected in the average daily population. Expressed as monthly averages these factors are: 1) local sentenced prisoners, 2) DOC sentenced inmates and 3) prisoners awaiting trial, pre-sentence investigation or others (see the table on page 12). Local sentenced prisoners increased from an average of 1,469 in CY 1984 to an average of 1,553 in CY 1985. Apparently the influence of DOC sentenced back-up on local jail population is not significant because the average of these prisoners dipped from 116 in CY 1984 to 103 in CY 1985 (see the chart on page 10). The number of prisoners in local detention awaiting trial, pre-sentence investigation or in an undefined other category may be a significant population factor based on the 9.9% increase in these prisoners from 2,962 in CY 1984 to 3,255 in CY 1985 (see the chart on page 11). The inmates awaiting trial is the leading subgroup in this growth category. Caution must be used in extrapolating this data in the context of local conditions at each jail and detention center.



PAROLE AND PROBATION STATISTICS

Data Sources

The information contained in the Division of Parole and Probation section of the Agency Processing Statistics is based upon a combination of manual and automated information systems that are summarized on a State-wide basis by the Office of Research and Statistics. For January of 1984, the Cases Under Active Supervision (see charts at pages 19 & 20 and tables at pages 25 & 26) and Cases Being Administered (see charts at pages 21 & 22 and tables at pages 27 & 28) were manually compiled by all supervision agents for their individual caseloads as of the last day of the month and totalled by the Division's Headquarters staff in the Division's Monthly Workload Summary Report. Beginning in February, 1984, the Division of Parole and Probation converted from using manually collected data to relying on the OBSCIS II automated system for reporting the supervision workload. Similarly, the intake data for Calendar Years 1984 and 1985 (see charts at pages 15 & 16 and tables at pages 23 & 24) was extracted from the OBSCIS II automated system. Case Closings data (see charts at pages 17 & 18 and tables at pages 23 & 24) was derived by means of a formula comparing intakes to monthly changes in the Cases Being Administered totals.

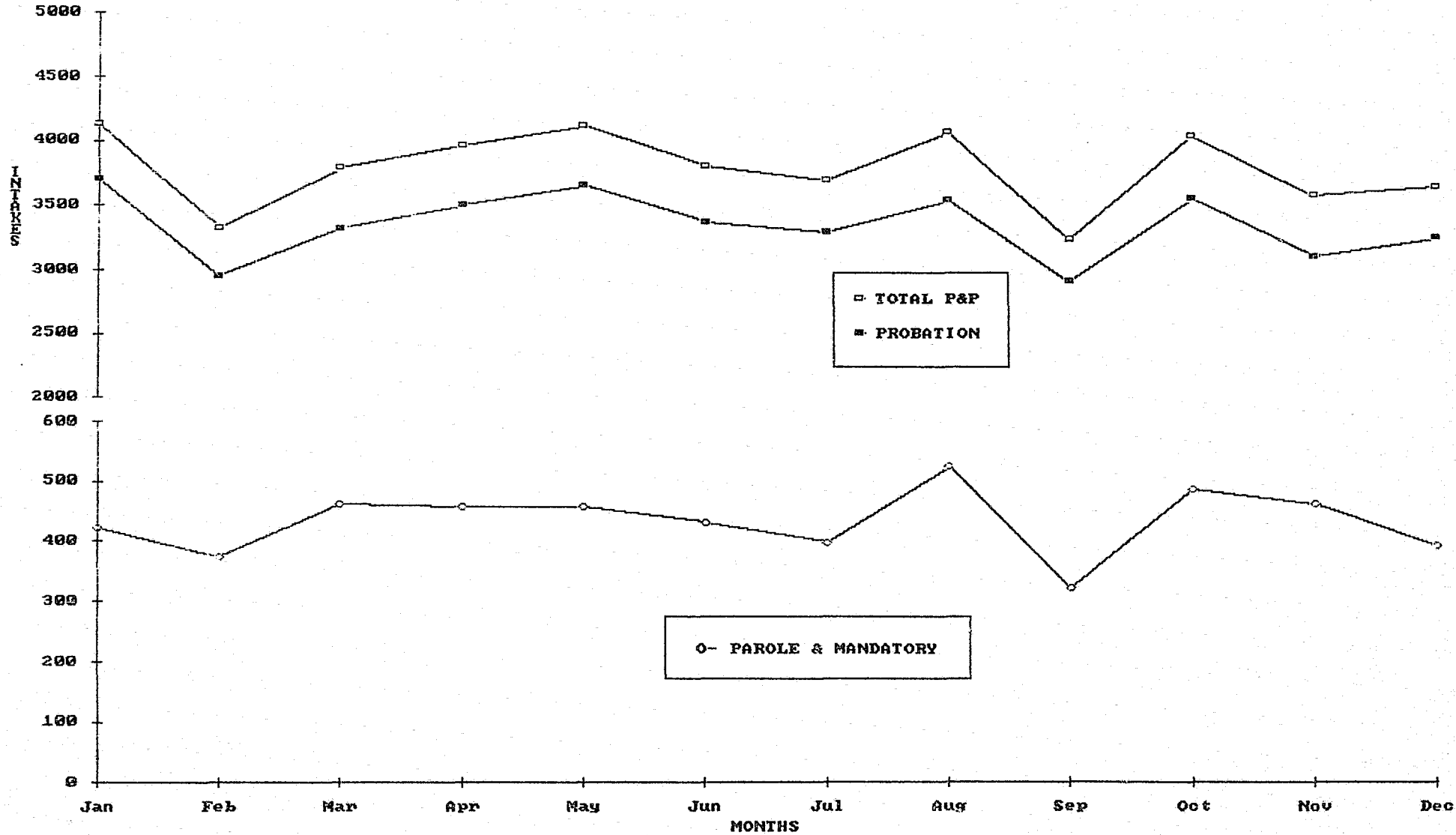
Recent Trends

During Calendar Year 1985, the Division's Cases Under Active Supervision fell from 46,028 to 44,795 cases, representing an annual decrease of 2.7%. This compares to a decrease in Calendar Year 1984 of 5.5% (see charts at pages 19 & 20 and tables at pages 25 & 26). While Active Cases decreased in Calendar Year 1985, Total Cases Being Administered by the Division increased 3.8%, from 79,605 to 82,654 cases. This compares to a growth of 6.2% in Calendar Year 1984 (see charts at pages 21 & 22 and tables at pages 27 & 28).

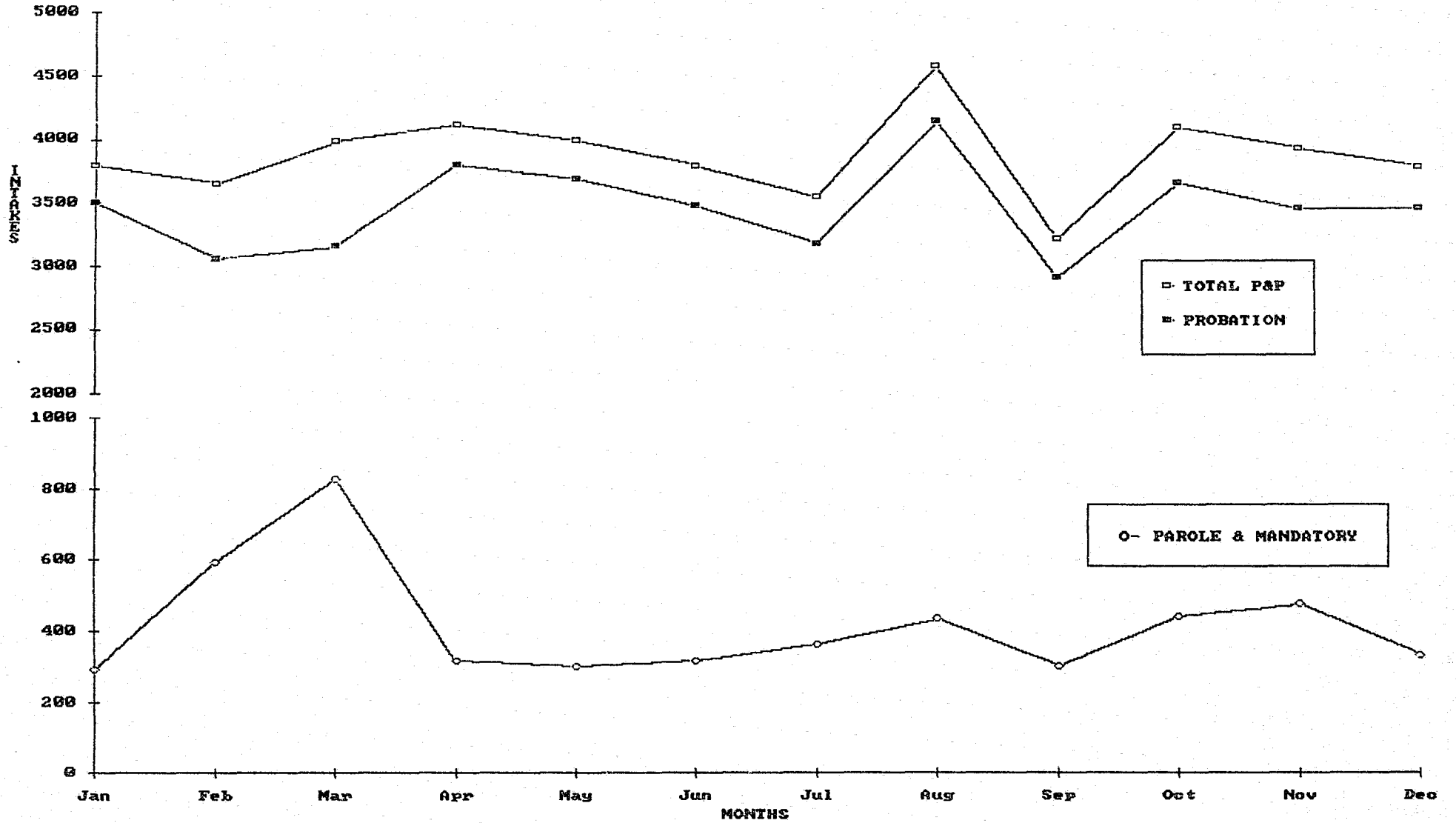
The primary factor contributing to a lower percentage increase in Total Cases Administered during Calendar Year 1985 was the continued contrasting trend of Intakes and Closings. The total number of case intakes processed during Calendar Year 1985 decreased 2.2%, from 46,365 to 45,353, while case closings in Calendar Year 1985 increased 1.5%, from 41,692 to 42,304. This reduced the gap between Intakes and Closings, causing a continued leveling in the previously dramatic growth patterns experienced as recently as Calendar Year 1983. It should be noted that the conversion of manual to automated data by the Division of Parole and Probation has created the erroneous impression that a disproportionate number of mandatory intakes occurred in February and March of 1984. In reality, the growth in these intakes over the last few years has occurred in a relatively uniform fashion.

The increase in Cases Being Administered and the simultaneous decrease in Cases Under Active Supervision reflects a steadily growing percentage of non-active and delinquent cases in the Cases Being Administered category. At the end of Calendar Year 1984, 57.8% of the Cases Being Administered were in an Active status (i.e. not delinquent or non-active). By the end of Calendar Year 1985, only 54.2% of the Total Cases Being Administered were under active supervision.

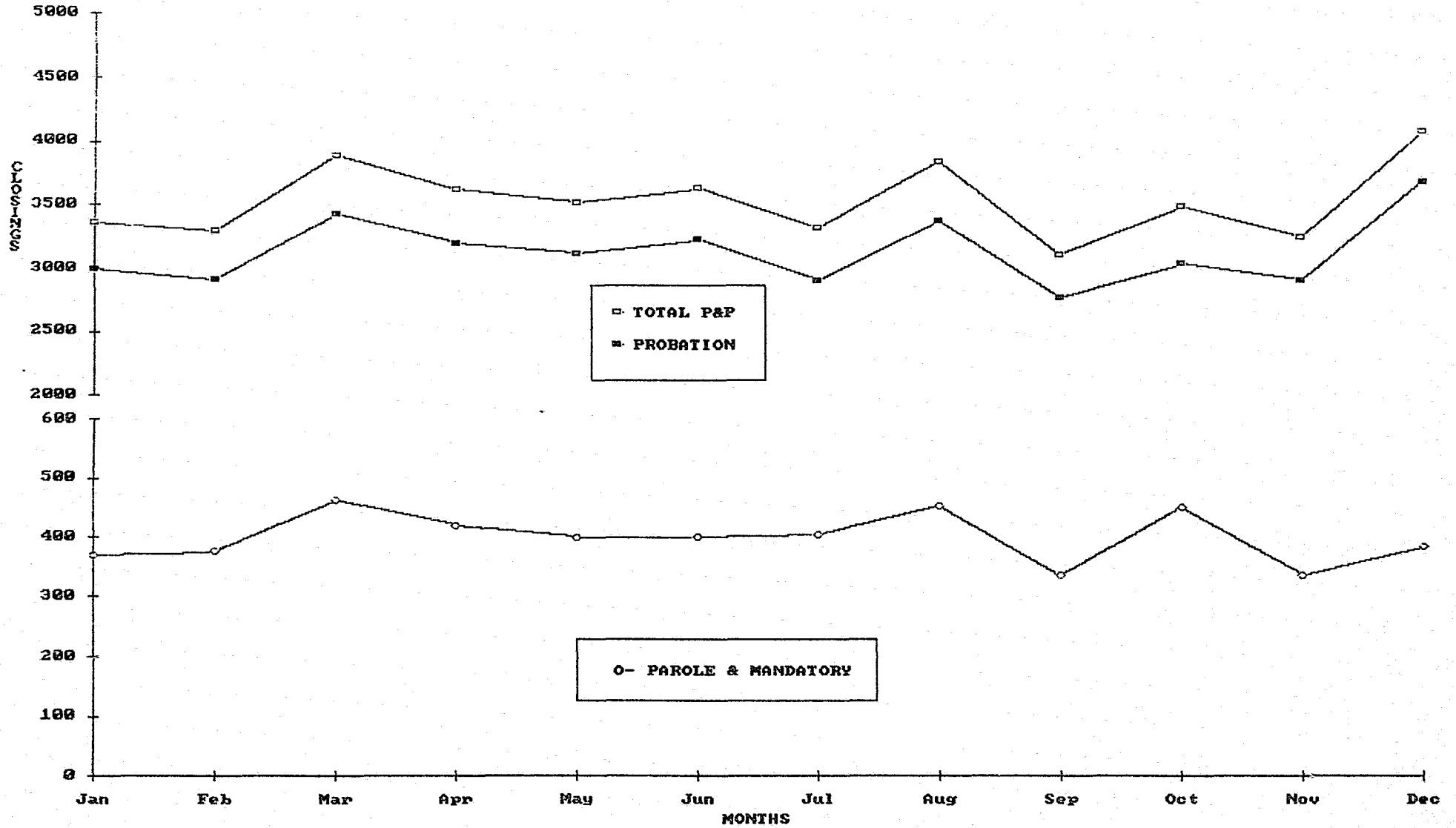
CY85 DIVISION OF PAROLE AND PROBATION INTAKES



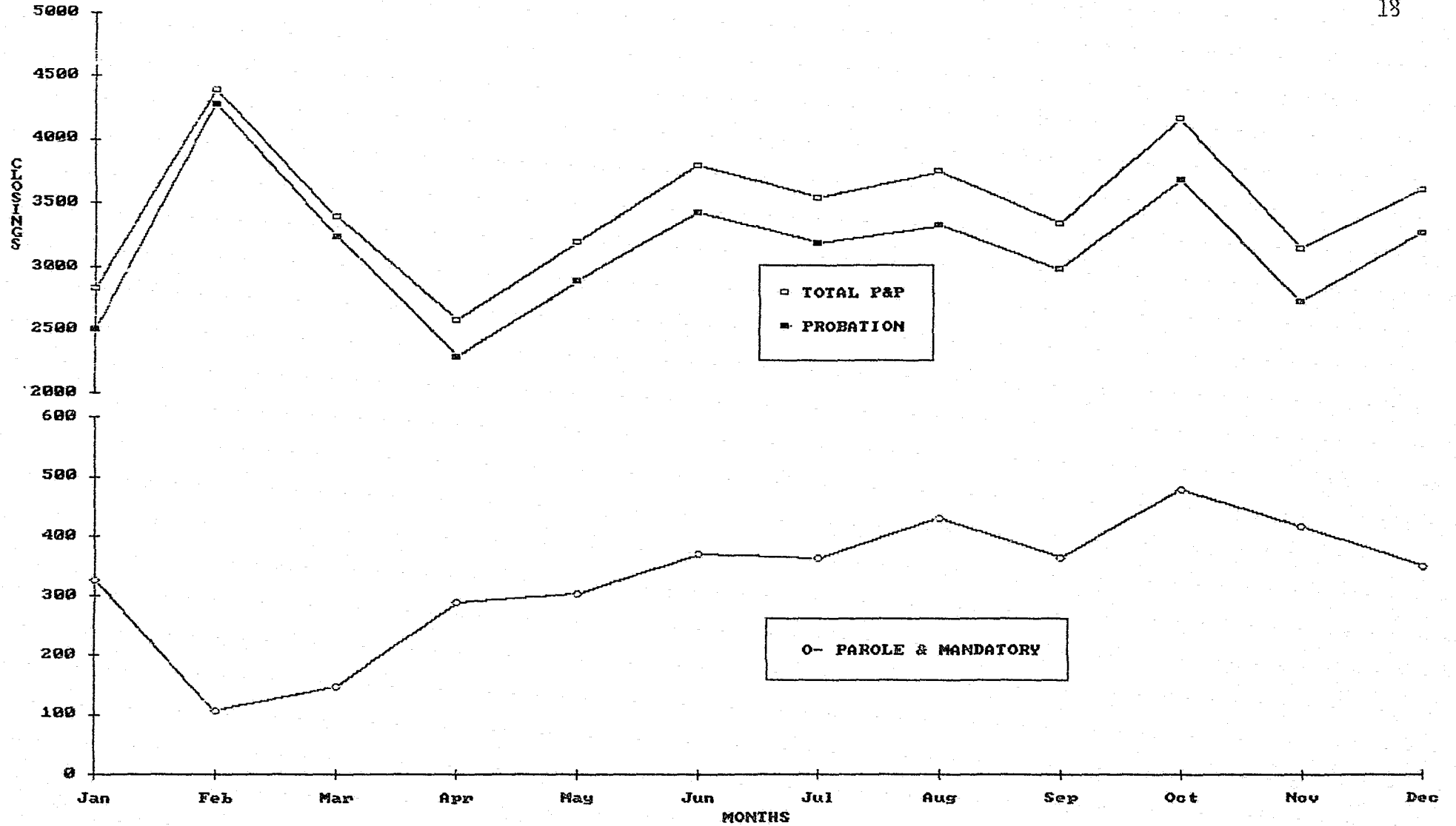
CY84 DIVISION OF PAROLE AND PROBATION INTAKES



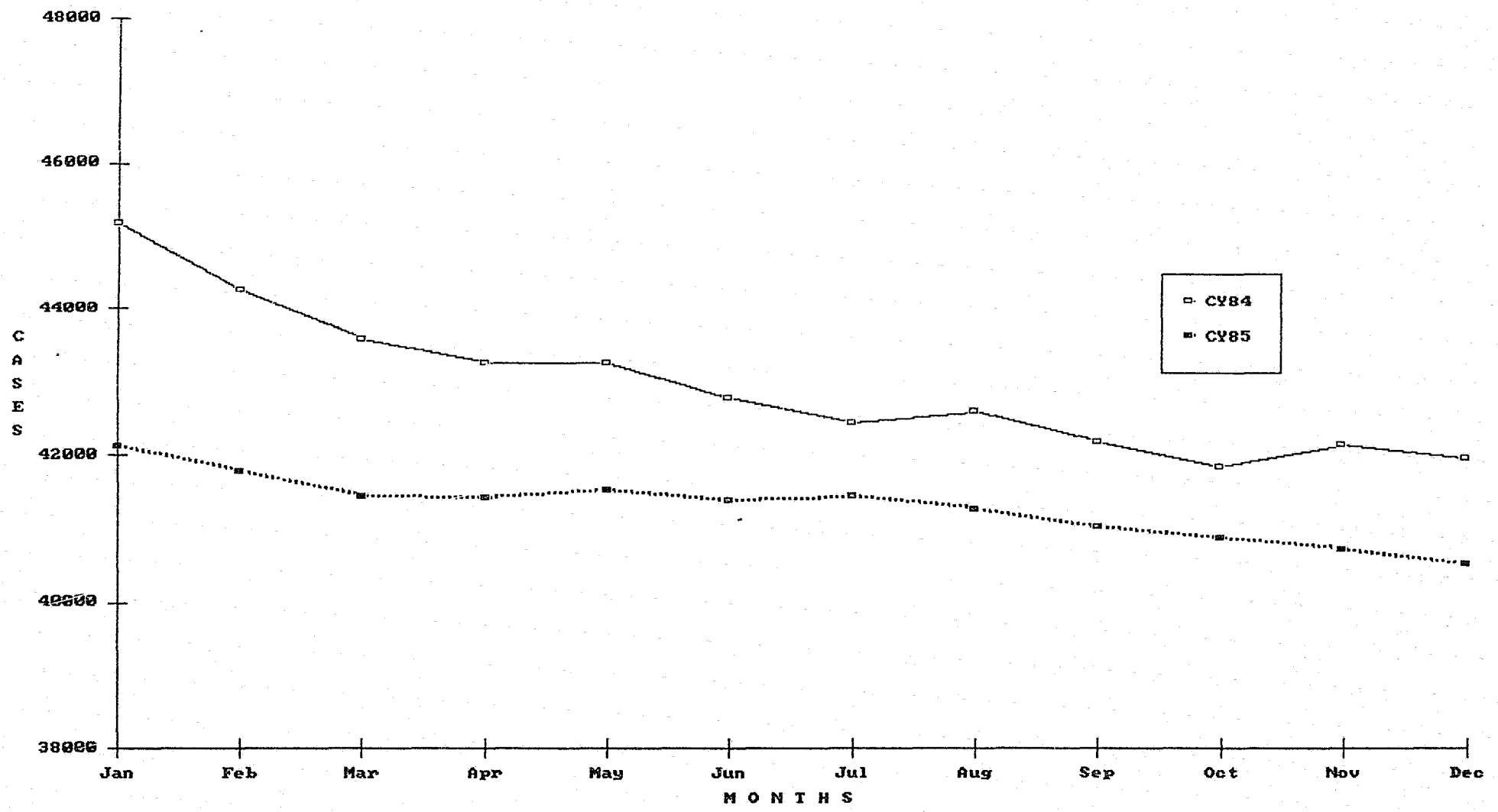
CY85 DIVISION OF PAROLE AND PROBATION CASE CLOSINGS



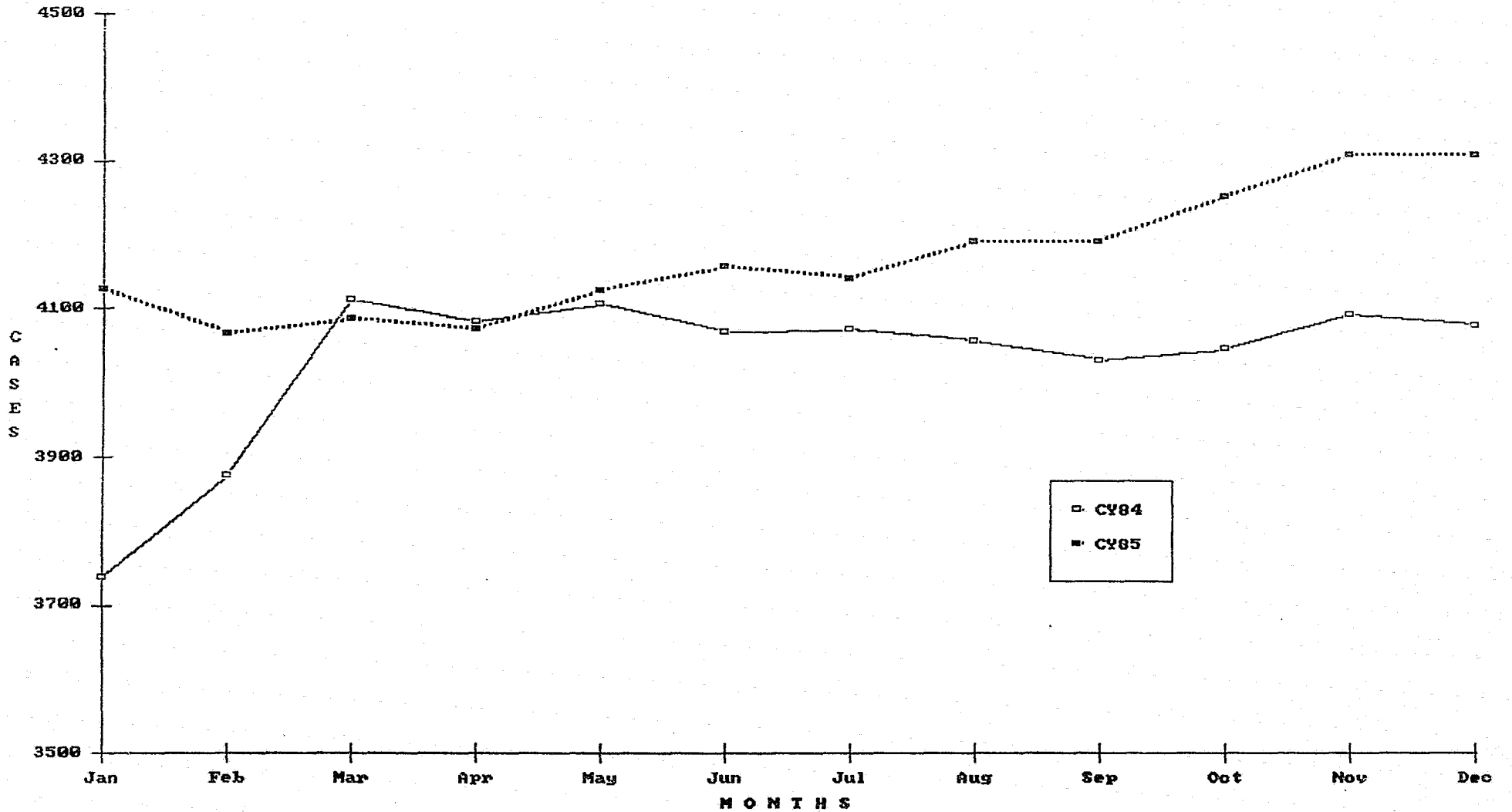
CY84 DIVISION OF PAROLE AND PROBATION CASE CLOSINGS



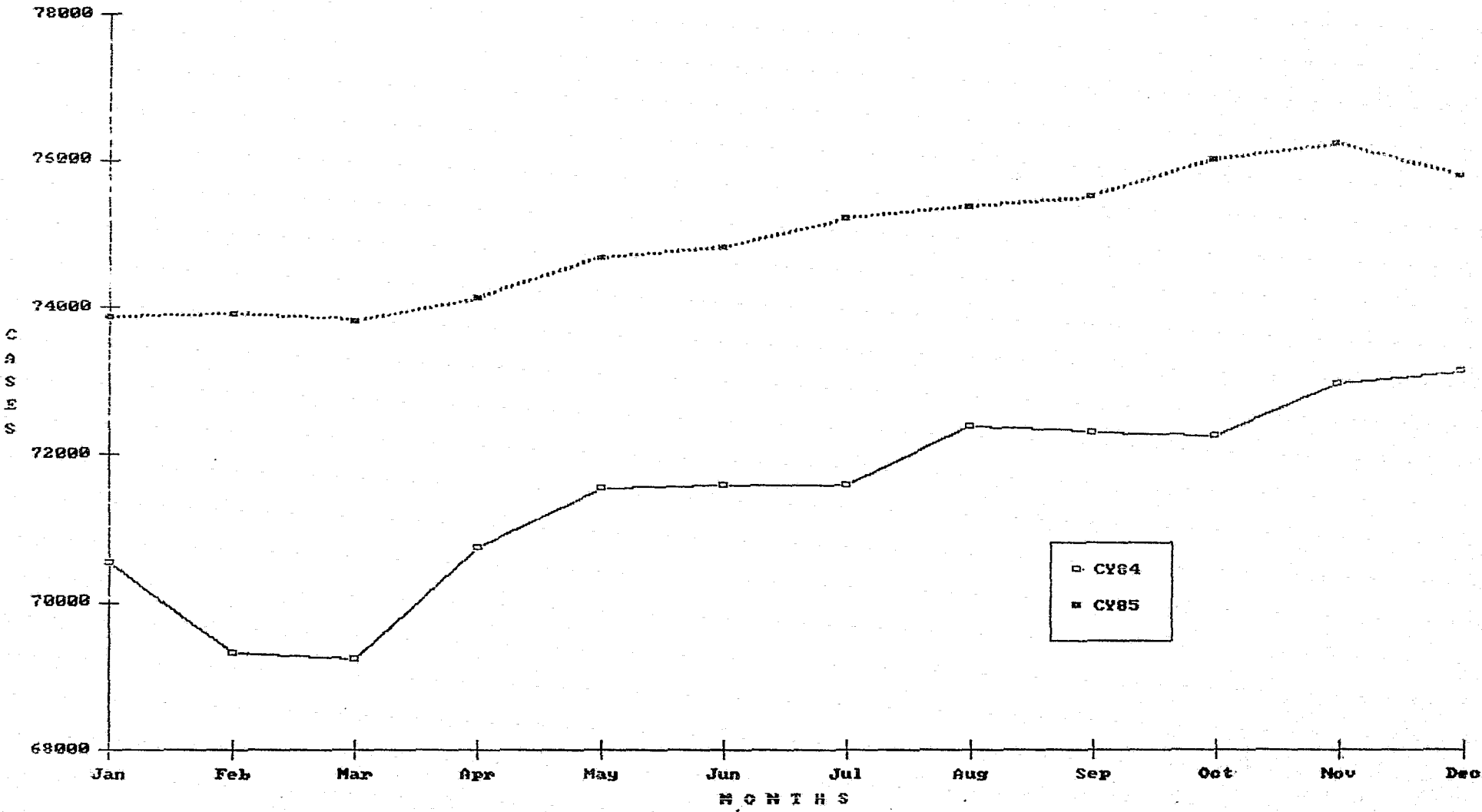
PROBATION, COMPACT PROBATION AND LIVE-IN CASES

(CALENDAR YEARS 1984 AND 1985)



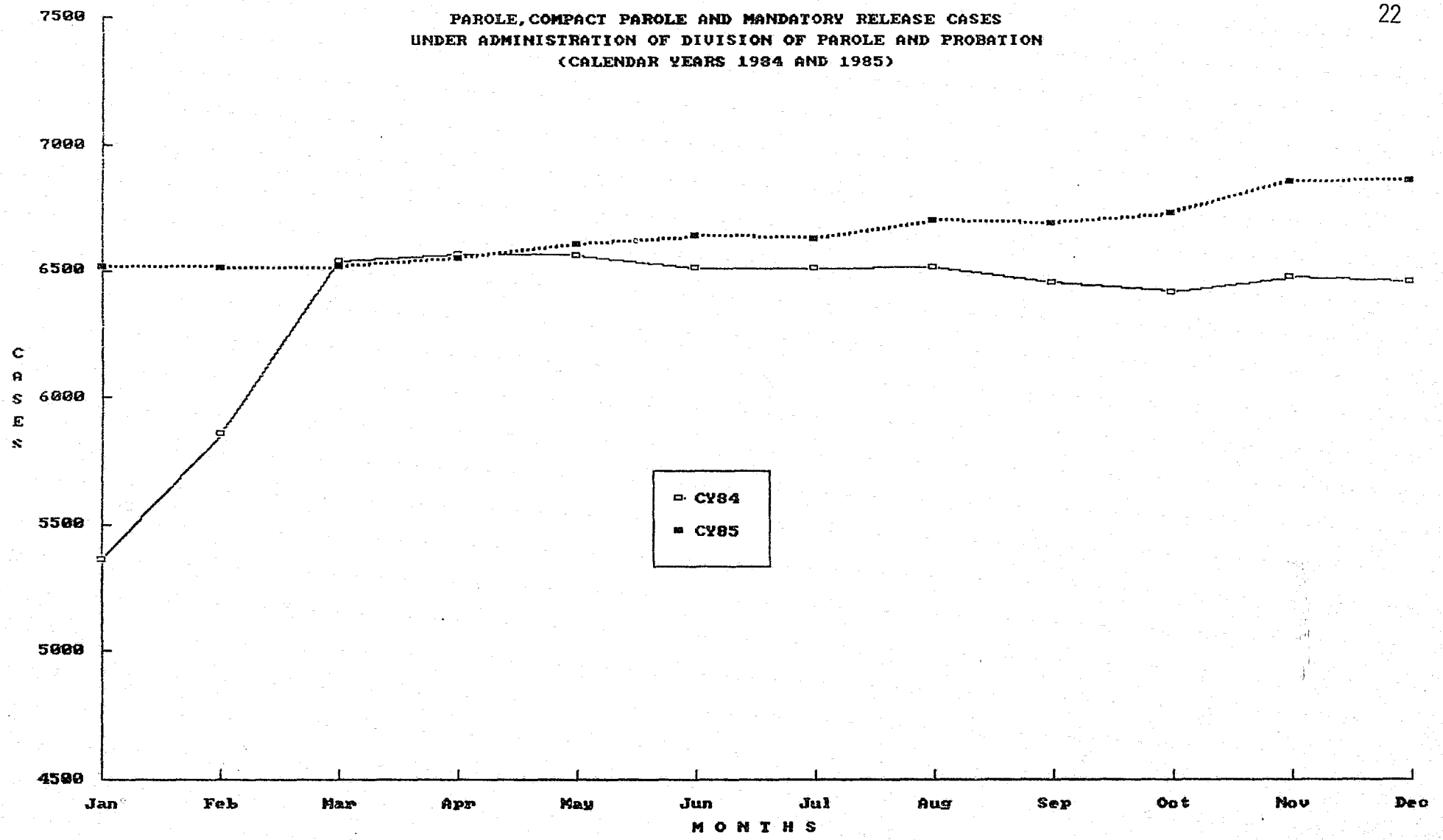
PAROLE, COMPACT PAROLE AND MANDATORY RELEASE CASES

DIVISION OF CORRECTION STATISTICS

Data Sources

The information contained in the Division of Correction section of the Agency Processing Statistics is based upon data from a combination of manual and automated information systems that are summarized at the Office of Research and Statistics. The monthly average total populations (see charts at pages 31, 32 & 34 and table at page 37) are calculated from daily population sheets submitted by the Data Processing Office of the Division of Correction. The daily population sheets are manually compiled at Division Headquarters based on telephone reports from each institution. Intake and Release information (see charts at pages 31, 32, 33, 35, & 36 and tables at pages 38 & 39) is compiled from monthly reports sent to the Office of Research and Statistics by the individual DOC institutions. Average sentence length by jurisdiction and life and death sentence by jurisdiction information (see tables at pages 40, 41, 42 & 43) is based upon information from the male and female reception centers. This information is also received monthly and applies only to new court commitments.

The Inmate Characteristics Report (see tables at pages 44 thru 50) is based almost entirely upon data from the Offender Based State Correctional Information System (OBSCIS). The only exception is that manual population data is used in the Sex Distribution table at page 44 to allow comparisons to be made between the actual population and the computerized counts for each institution. All of the remaining characteristic information is extracted from OBSCIS via a computerized data interface software package.

Recent Trends

During CY 1985, the Division's average daily total population was virtually the same at the beginning of the year (12,537 January) as at year end (12,538 December). Average population ranged from a high of 12,557 in February to a low of 12,469 in October. Population data is displayed on charts at pages 31, 32 & 34.

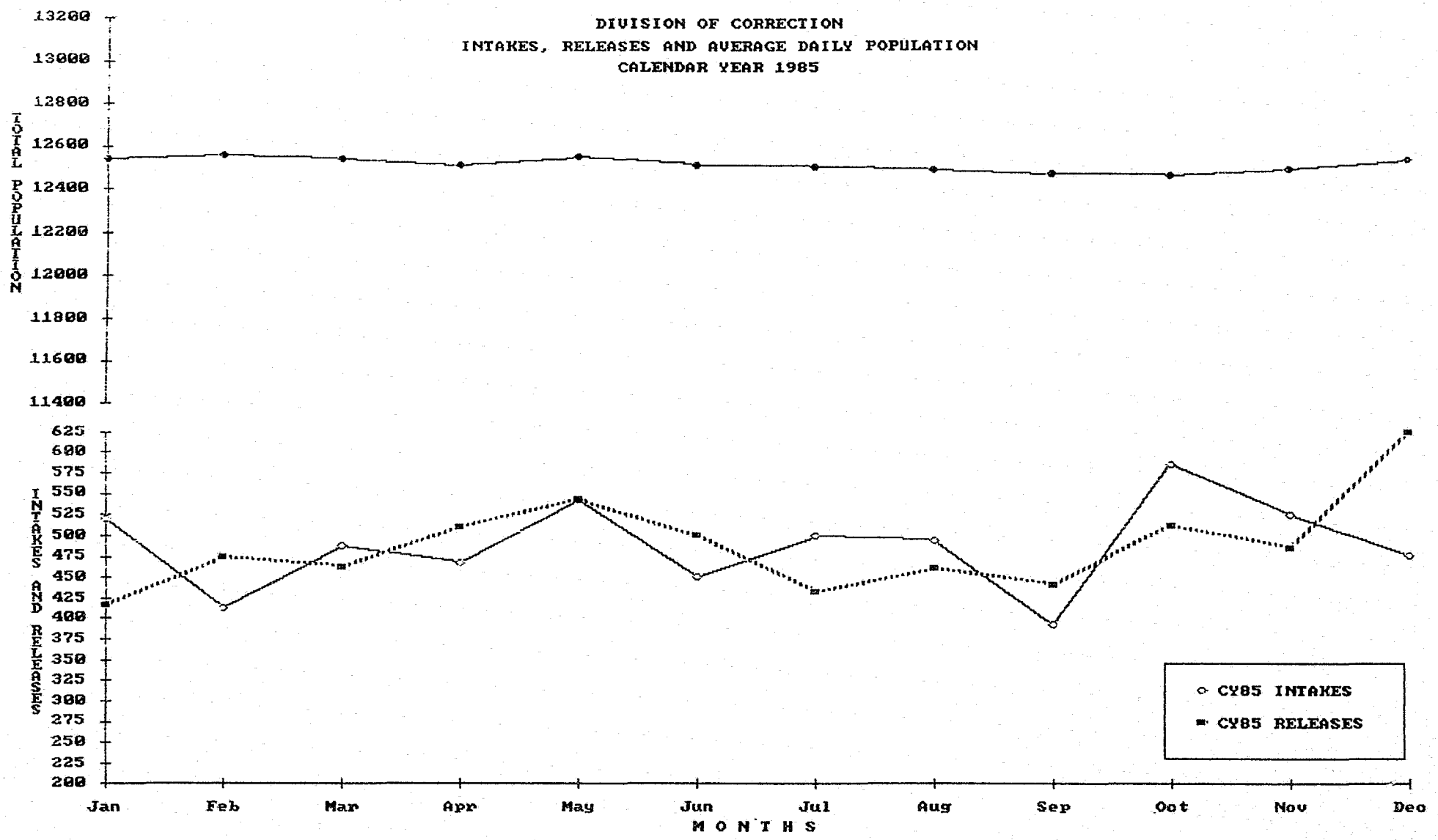
The most significant factor contributing to the stability of population growth was the equilibrium of intakes and releases. Total intakes numbered 5,859 or 488 per month during CY 1985, while total releases for the same period were 5,861 or 488 per month. Total intakes during CY 1985 were less than 1% higher than during CY 1984, while total releases have increased by 13.1%. Intake and release information is presented on data tables at pages 38 & 39 and the charts at pages 31, 32 & 33.

Escapes, presented on the data tables at pages 38 & 39 and the chart on page 36, have been reduced by 5.4% from 93 in CY 1984 to 88 in CY 1985. Expiration/mandatory releases have increased by 9.1% from 2,690 in CY 1984 to 2,936 in CY 1985. Parole releases during this same period have increased by 17.7% from 1,482 to 1,744 (see data tables at pages 38 & 39 and the chart at page 35).

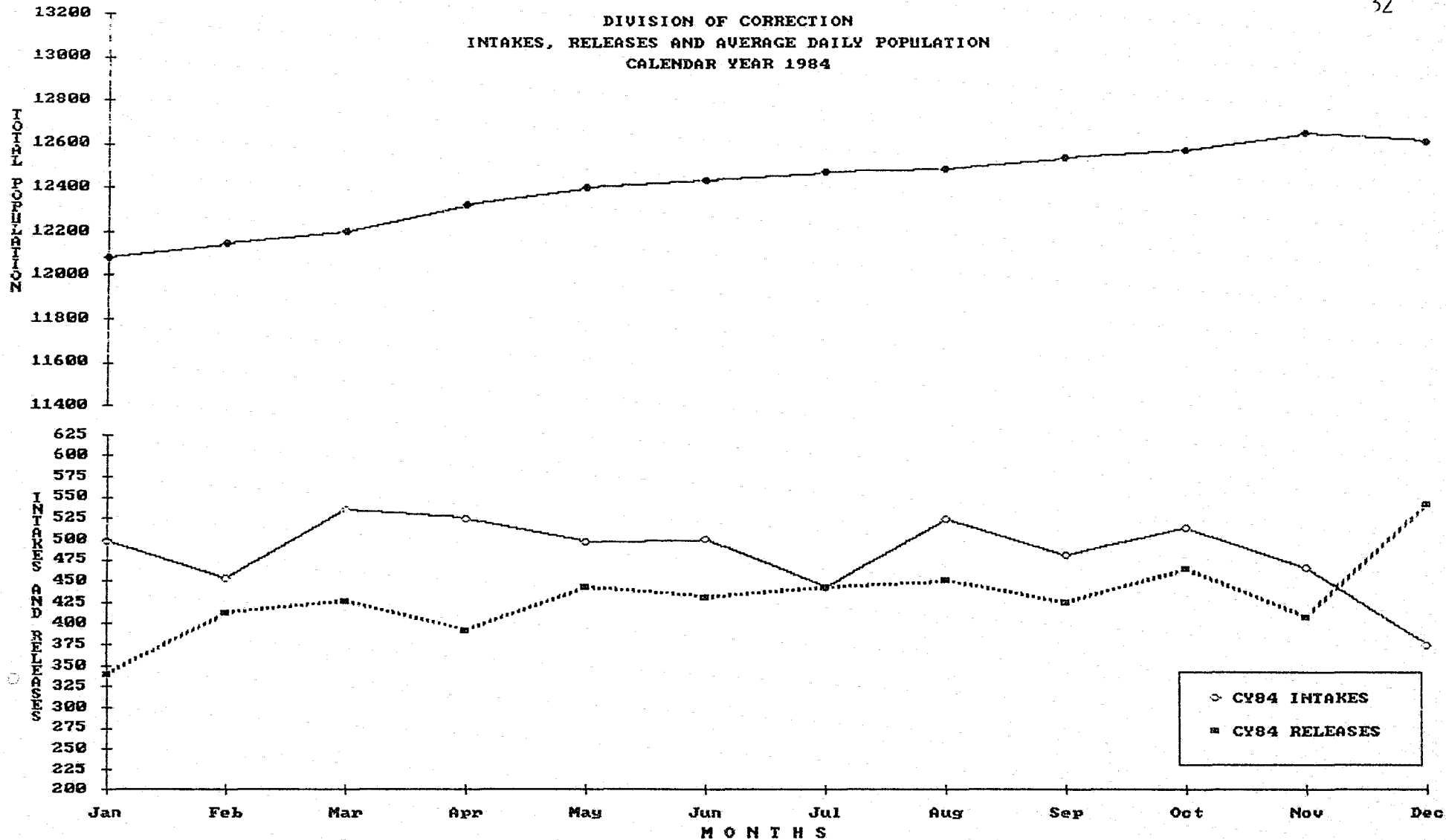
The average length of sentence for new court commitments (see tables at pages 40 and 42) has declined by 2.2 months from 56.2 in CY 1984 to 54.0 in CY 1985. Life sentences to the Division have decreased by 28% from 82 in CY 1984 to 59 in CY 1985.

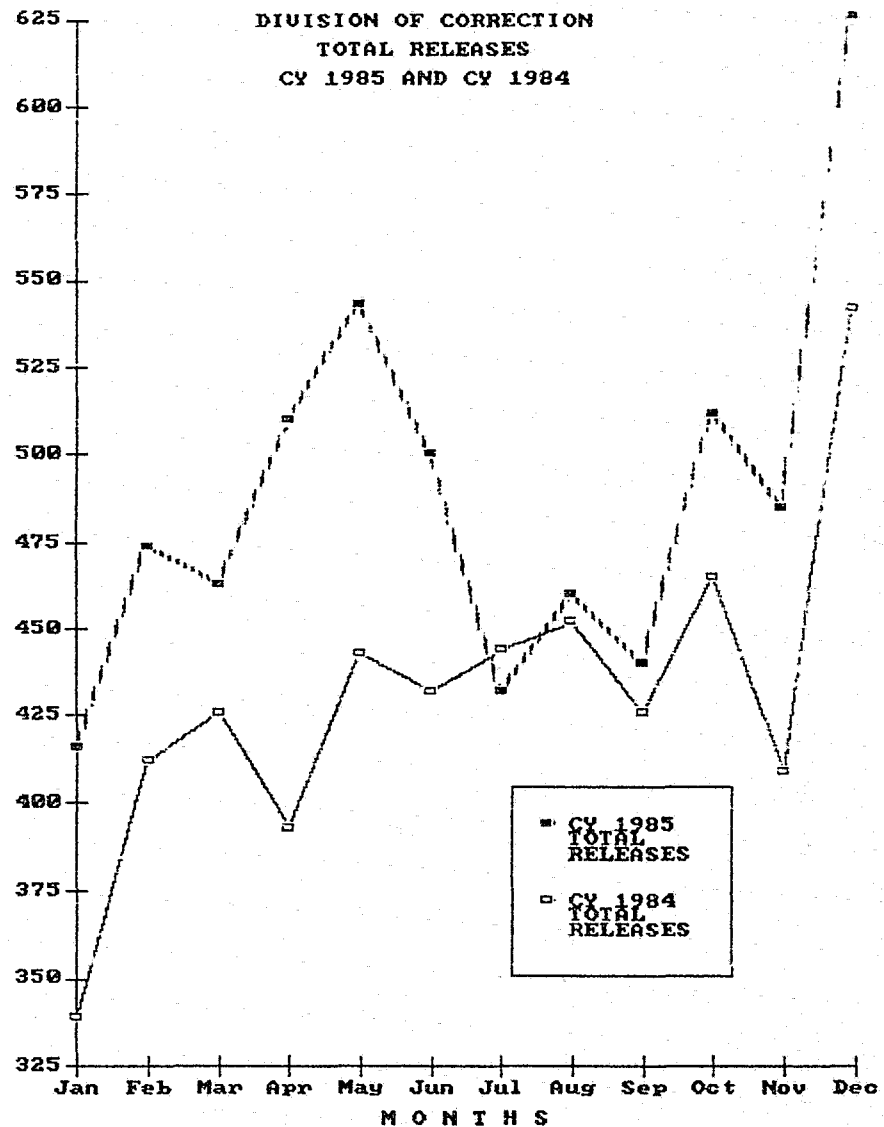
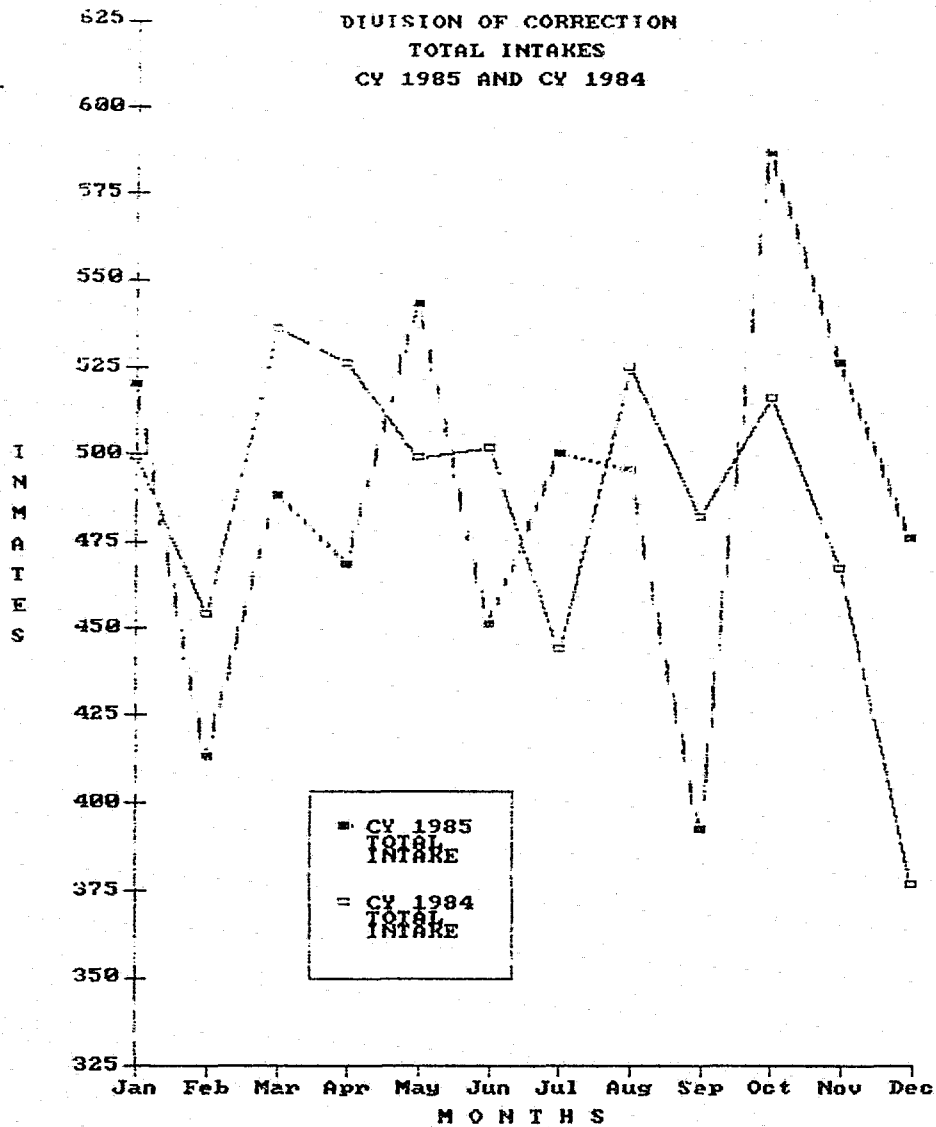
The Inmate Characteristics of the Division's population as of the end of CY 1985 are nearly unchanged from the end of CY 1984. The average sentence length of inmates incarcerated at year end increased by 2 months from 135 months at the end of CY 1984 to 137 months at the close of CY 1985. The age, sentence, race and offense distributions have remained unchanged.

CALENDAR YEAR 1985

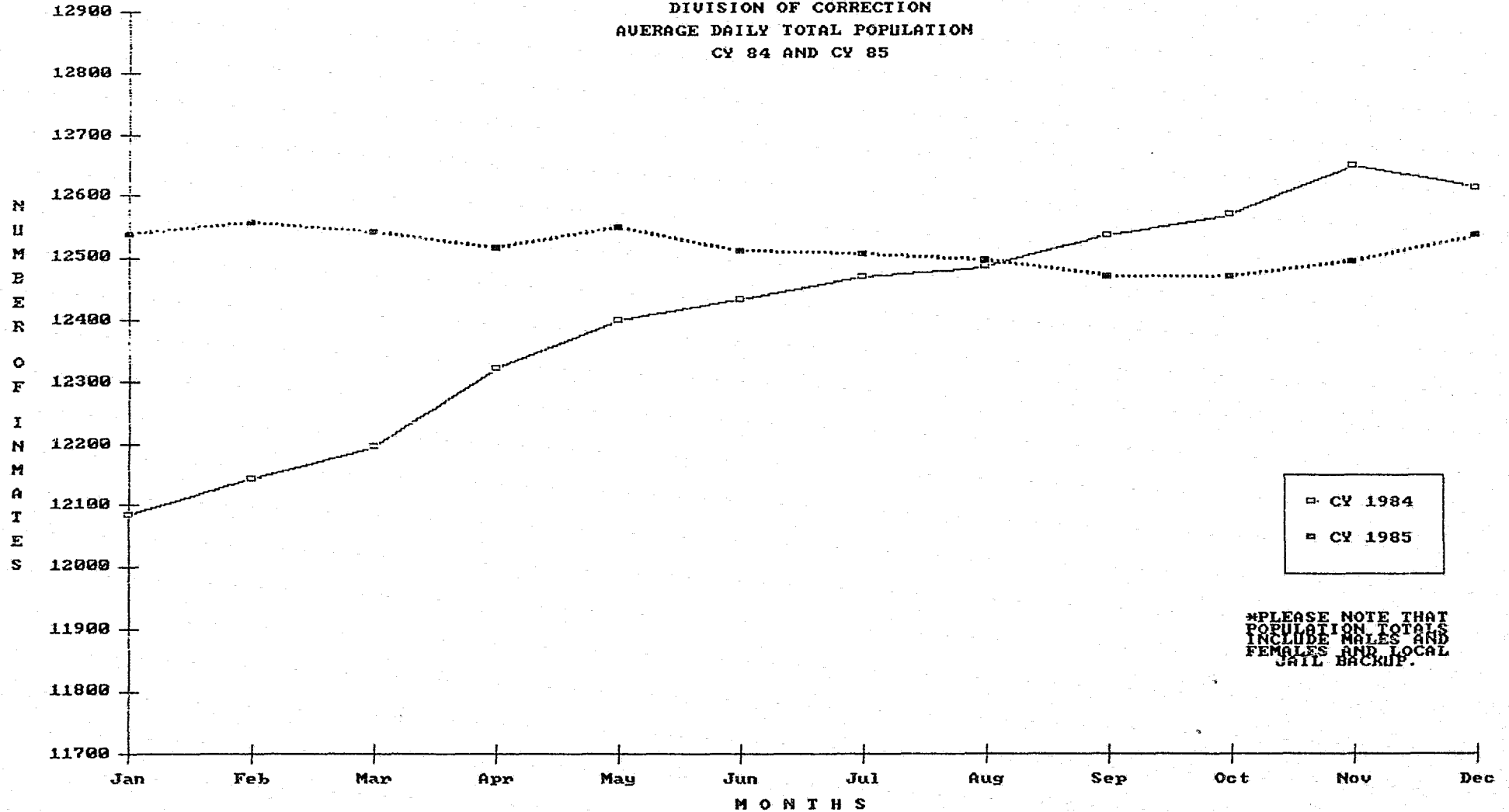


DIVISION OF CORRECTION

 CALENDAR YEAR 1984



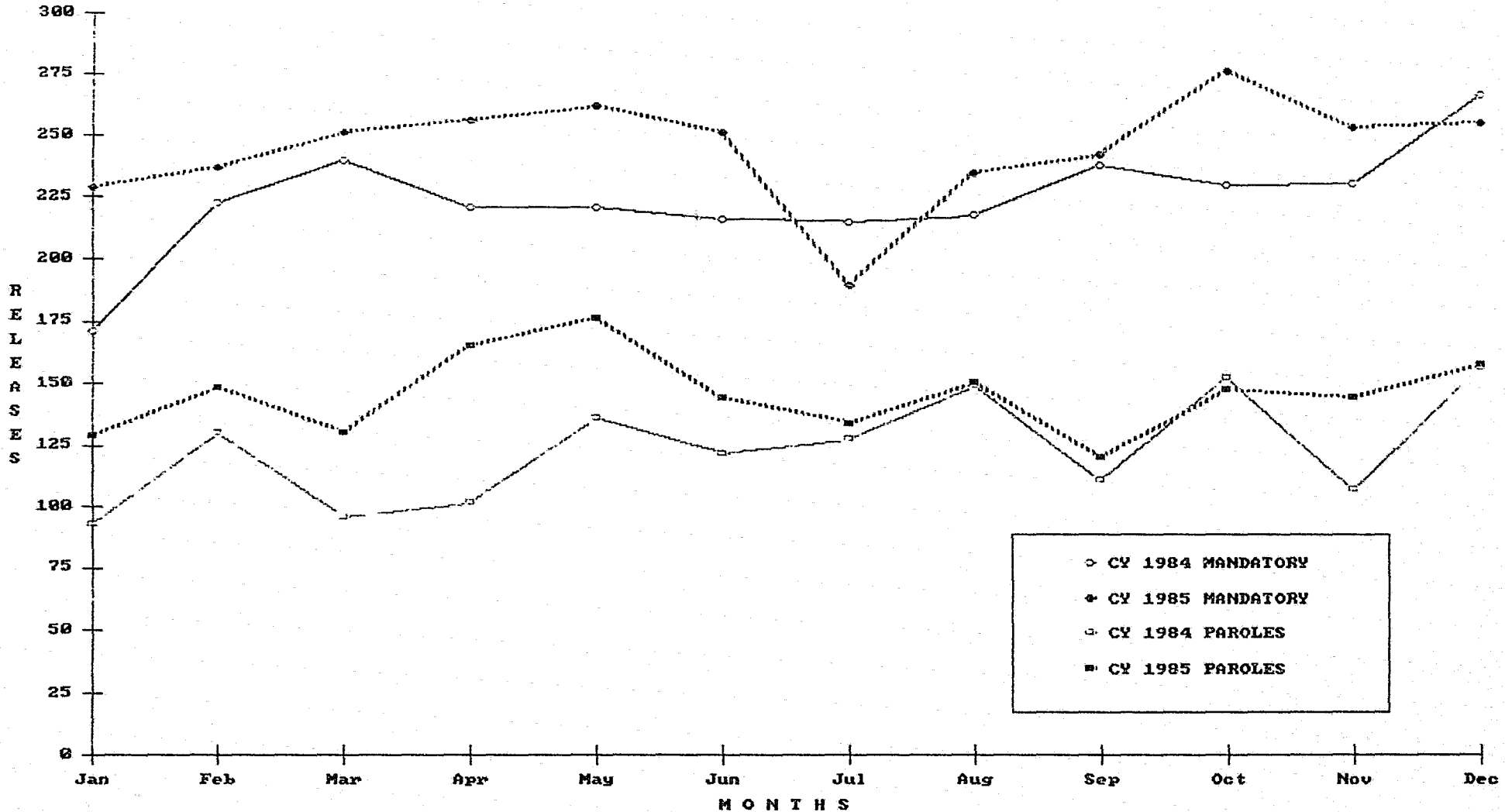


DIVISION OF CORRECTION

CY 84 AND CY 85

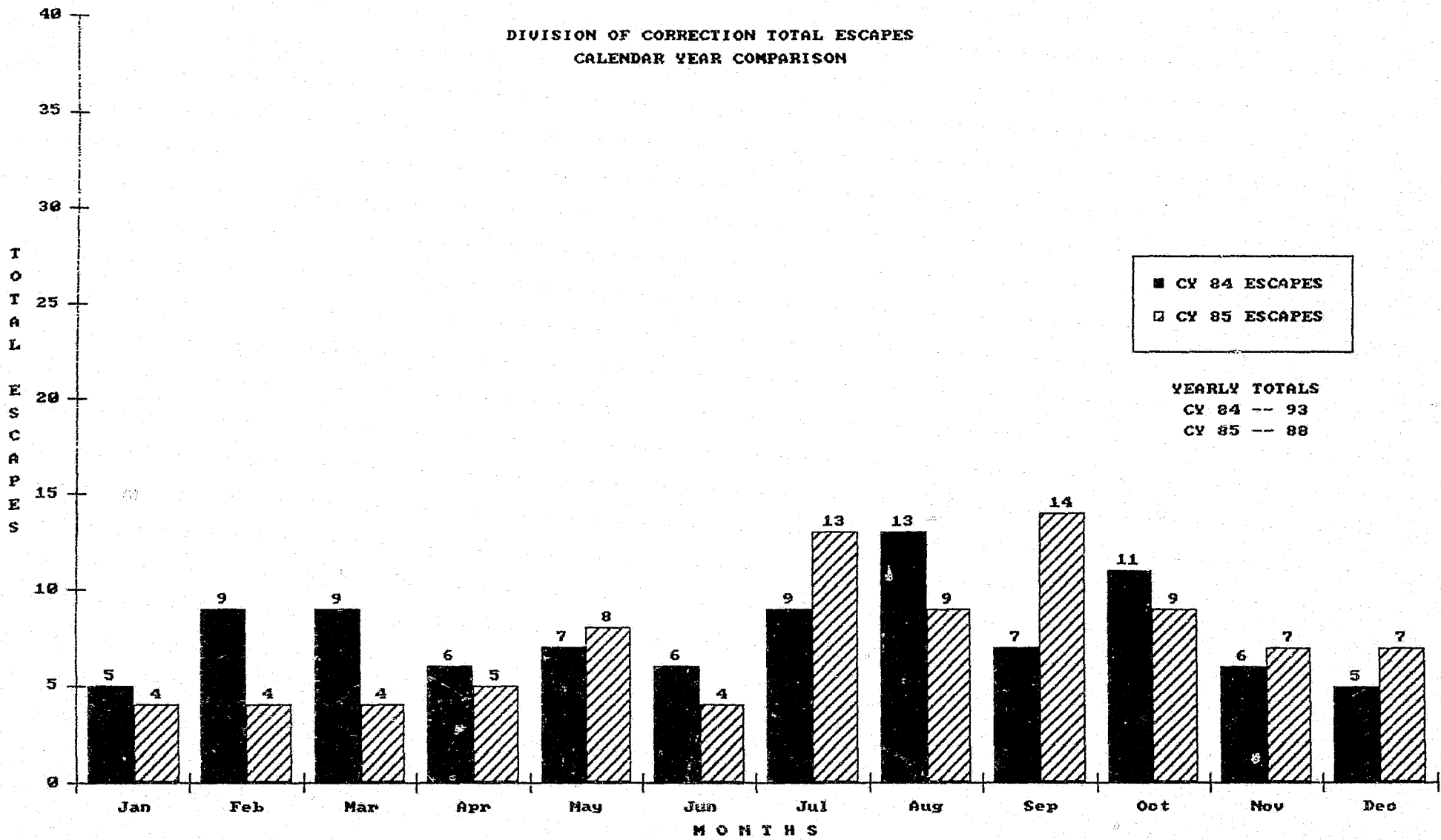

PAROLE COMMISSION STATISTICS

Data Sources

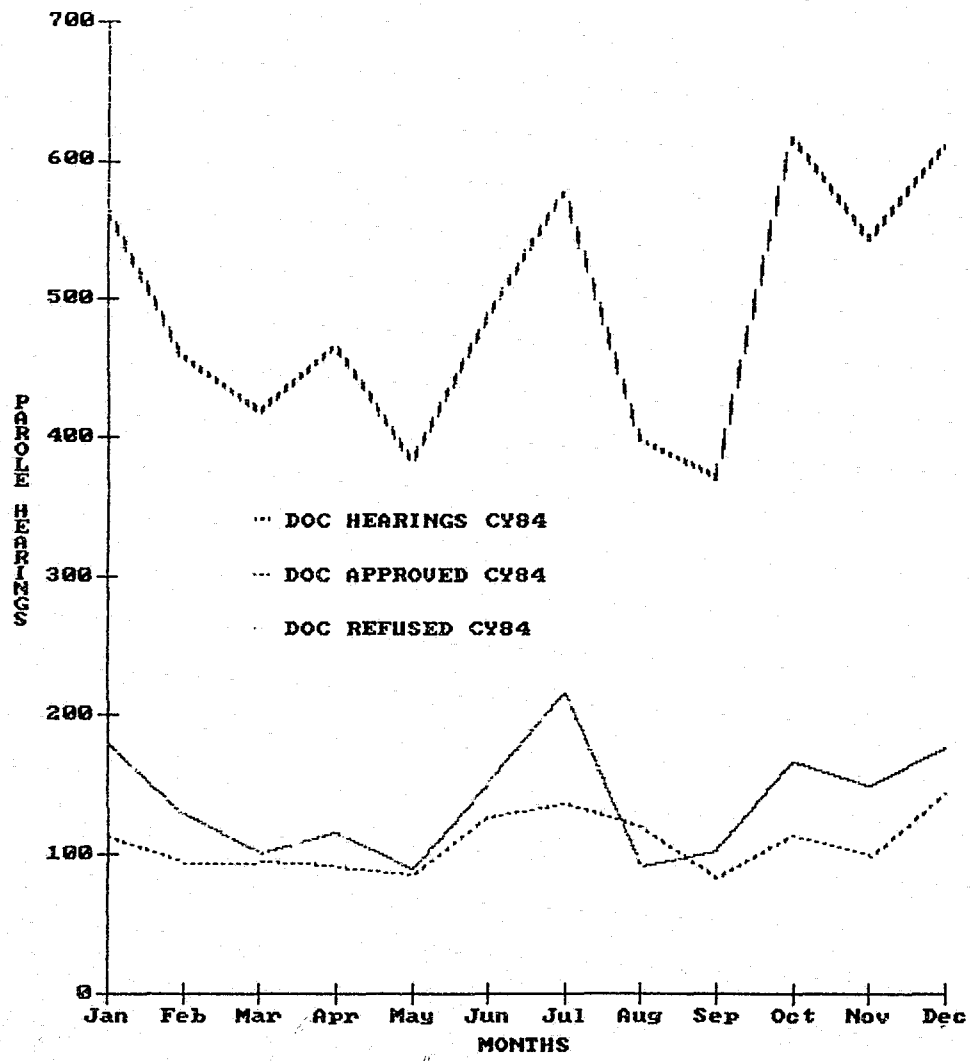
The information contained in the Parole Commission section of the Agency Processing Statistics is based upon data recorded by Parole Commissioners and Hearing Officers and tabulated monthly by Parole Commission staff from hearing dockets. Parole Commission activity relating to Division of Correction (DOC) and local jail inmate parole evaluation hearings is reported separately. The reported activity relating to revocation of parole hearings at DOC and local jails are combined. The vast majority of this activity occurs at DOC.

The Parole Hearing data presented in charts at pages 52 through 56 and the tables at pages 58 and 59 are based upon the recommendations rendered by Parole Commission Hearing Officers and Parole Commissioners during an inmate's parole hearing. The four basic recommendations that can be made are: 1) approve parole release, 2) refuse parole release, 3) reschedule the inmate for a rehearing at a later date, or 4) hold the decision in abeyance until further information is obtained to determine parole eligibility. These recommendations do not constitute a final decision until adopted by the Commission or affirmed after appeal by the inmate. The Parole Revocation Hearing dispositions presented in charts at page 57 and the table at page 60 are based upon the decision rendered by Parole Commissioners when inmates have been charged with failing to comply with the conditions of their parole release. These charges of noncompliance with the conditions of release can be divided in two broad categories: New Offenses (where a parolee has been primarily charged with committing a new crime while under parole supervision) and Technical Violations (where a parolee is charged with failing to comply with such conditions of release as reporting to an agent, absconding from supervision, failing to attend treatment programs as directed, etc.). At the time of a revocation hearing, the Parole Commission can decide to revoke parole, continue parole supervision, hold the case for further information, or administratively close the case.

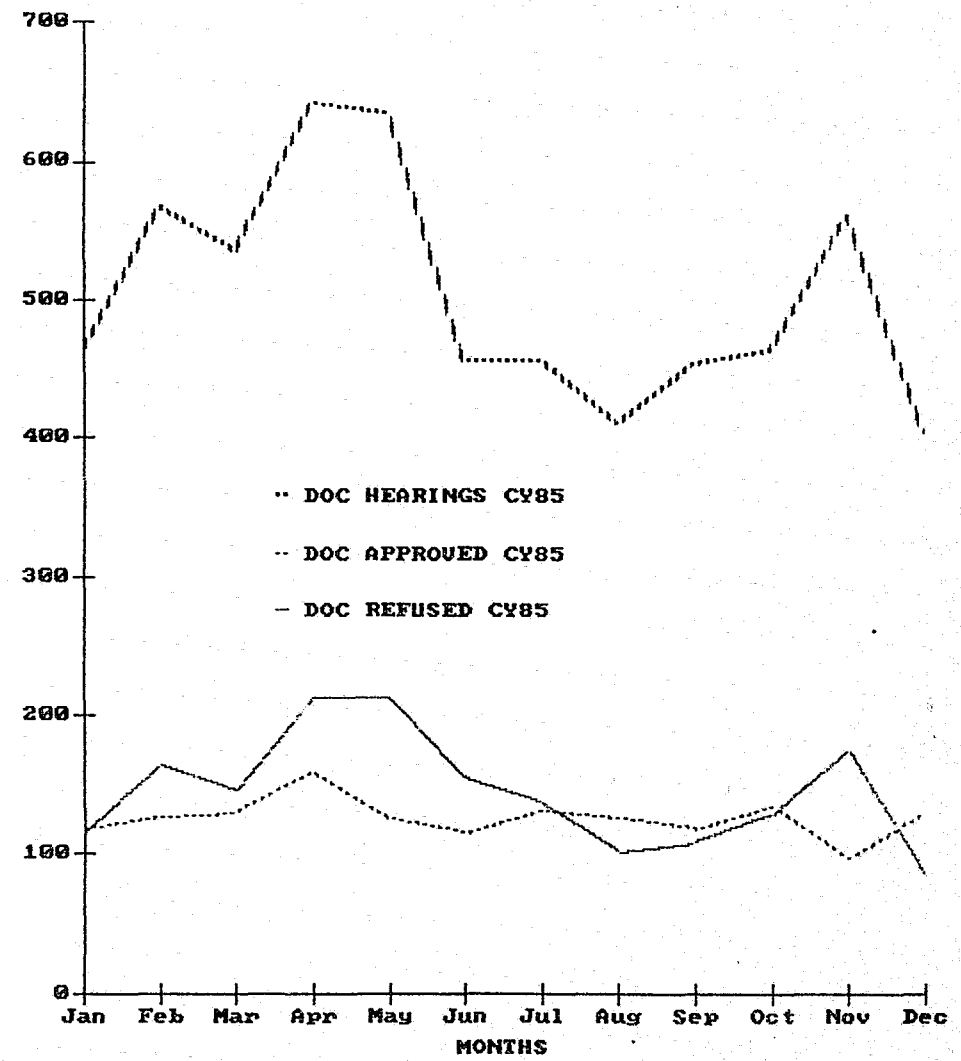
Recent Trends

Parole evaluation hearings for DOC prisoners increased from 5,885 in calendar year (CY) 1984 to 6,032 in CY 1985. Conversely the parole evaluation hearings for jail inmates decreased from 971 in CY 1984 to 843 in CY 1985. The revocation hearing activity decreased from 988 in CY 1984 to 827 in CY 1985. Variation in parole evaluation hearing levels and their outcomes is influenced by complex factors including: institutional population levels, legislative enactments establishing parole eligibility and Parole Commission policies.

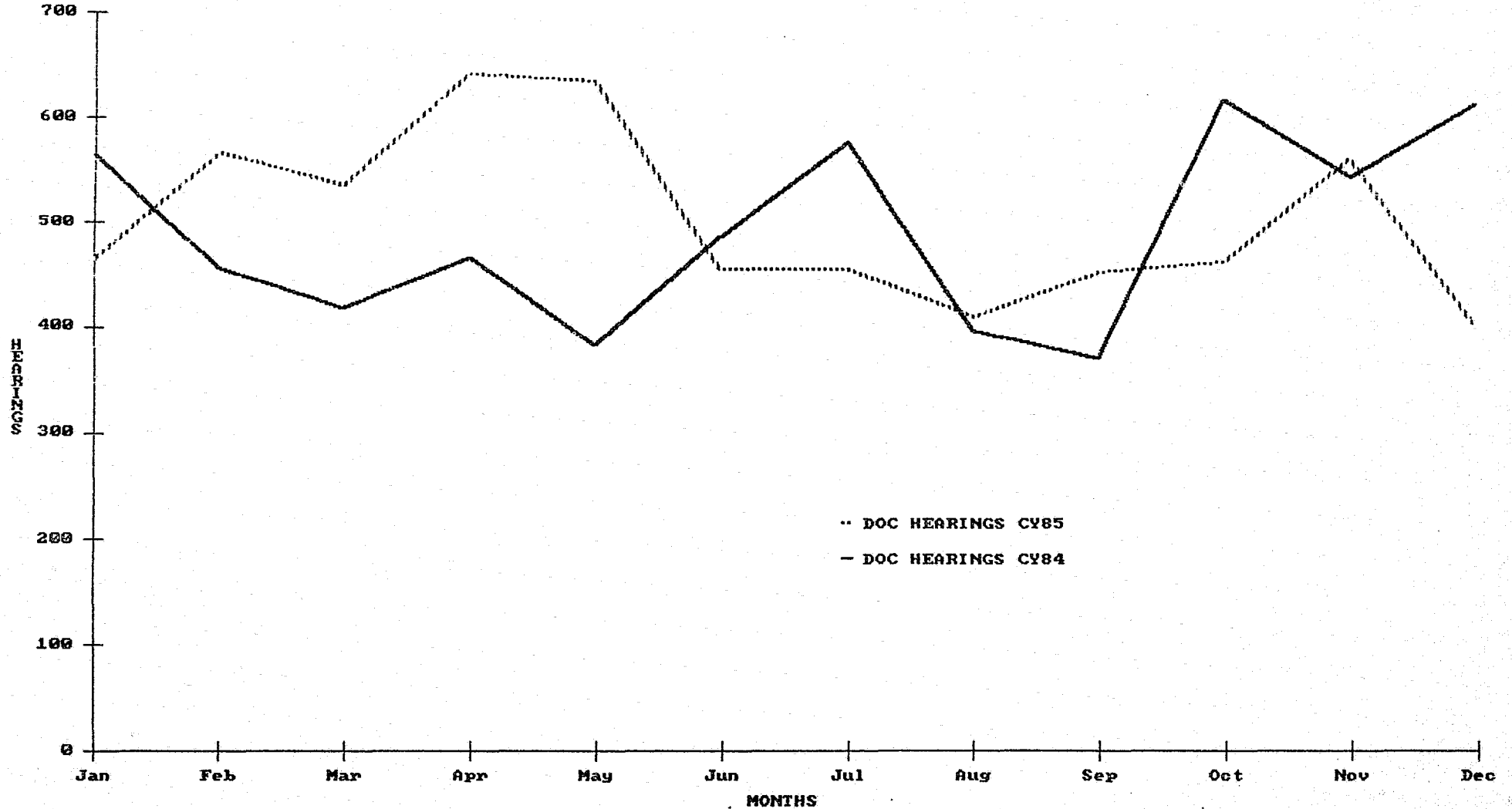
PAROLE COMMISSION

CALENDAR YEAR 1984



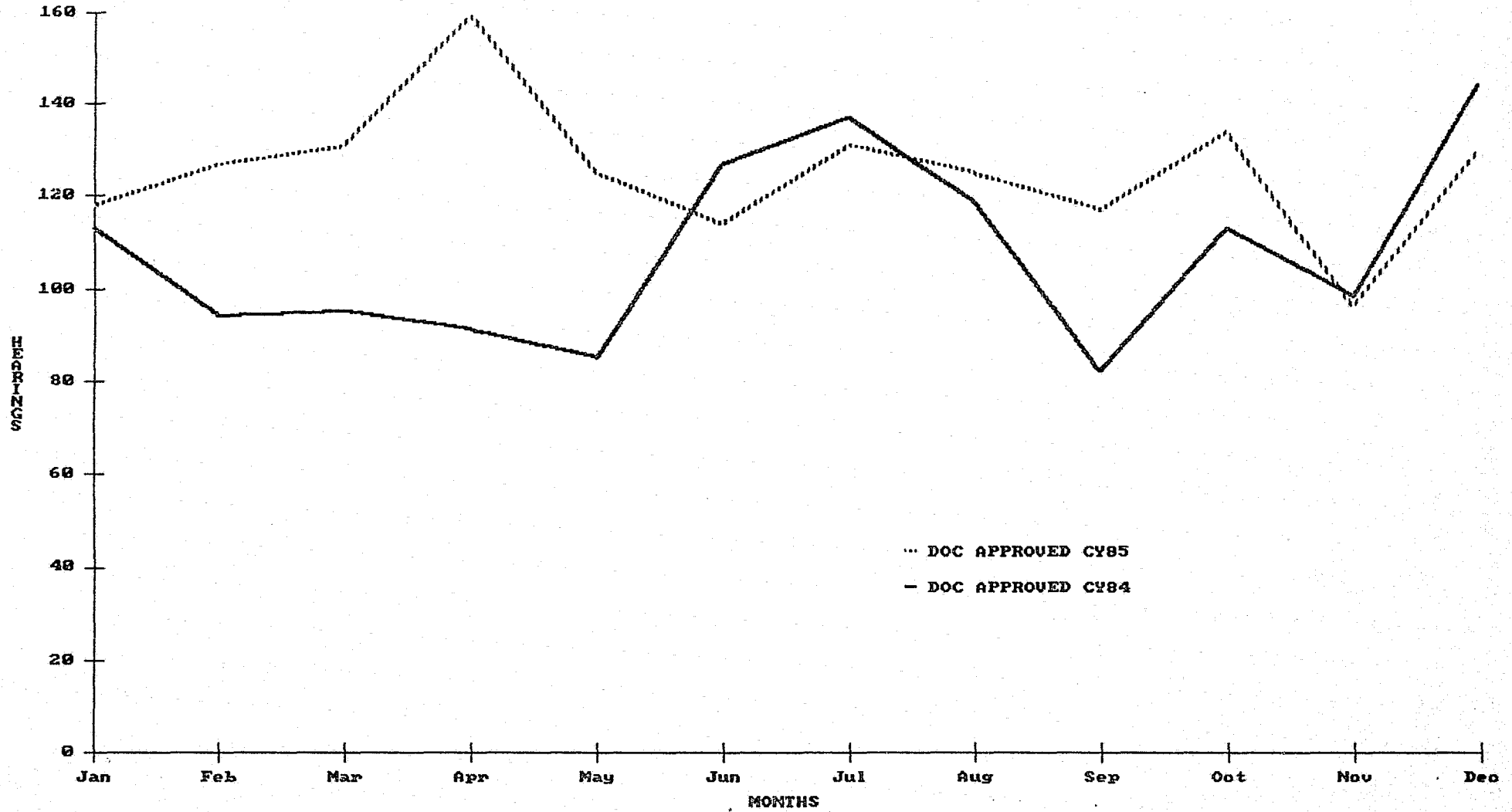
PAROLE COMMISSION

CALENDAR YEAR 1985



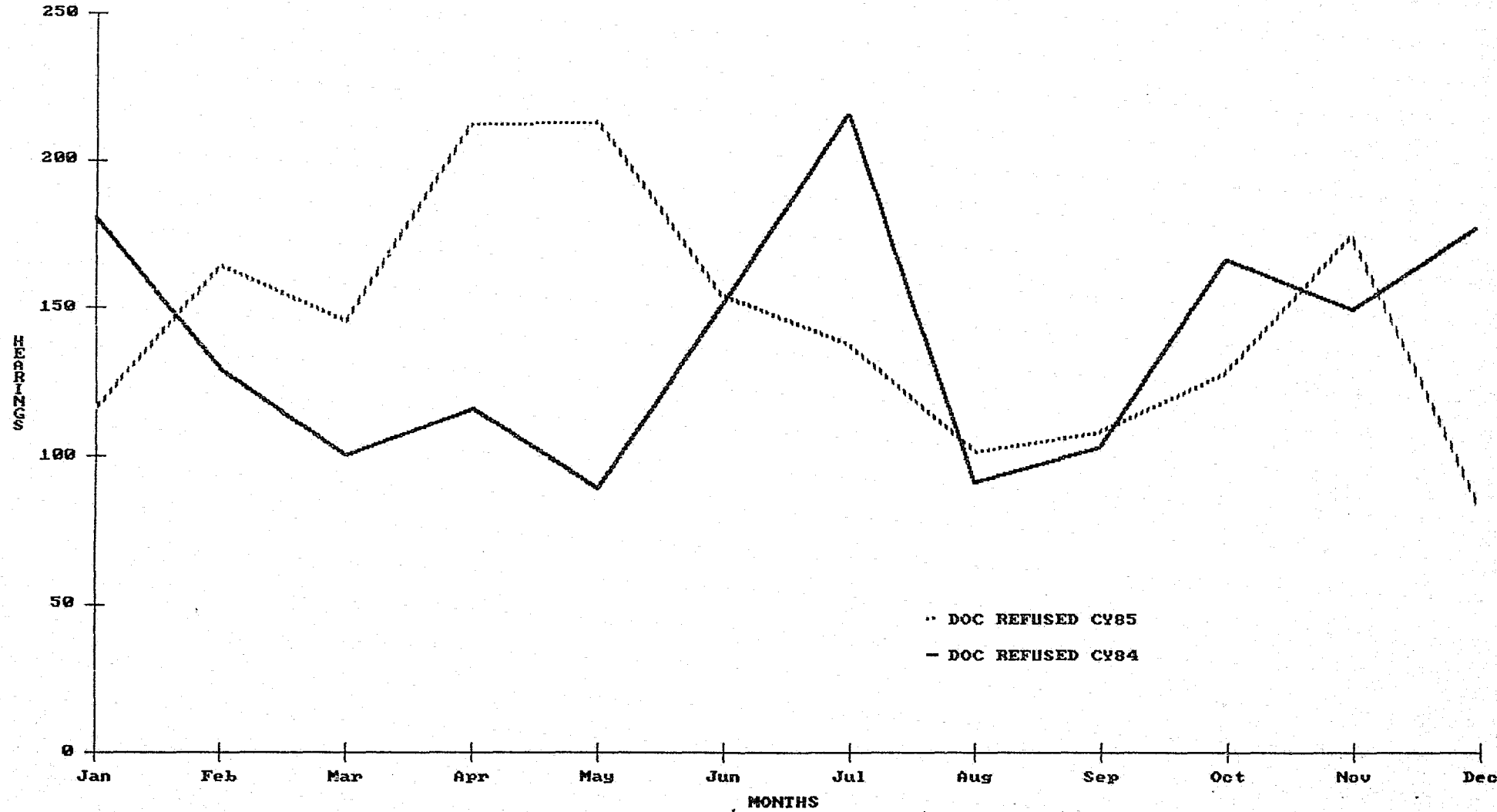
PAROLE COMMISSION - DIVISION OF CORRECTION

CALENDAR YEAR 1984 VS. 1985



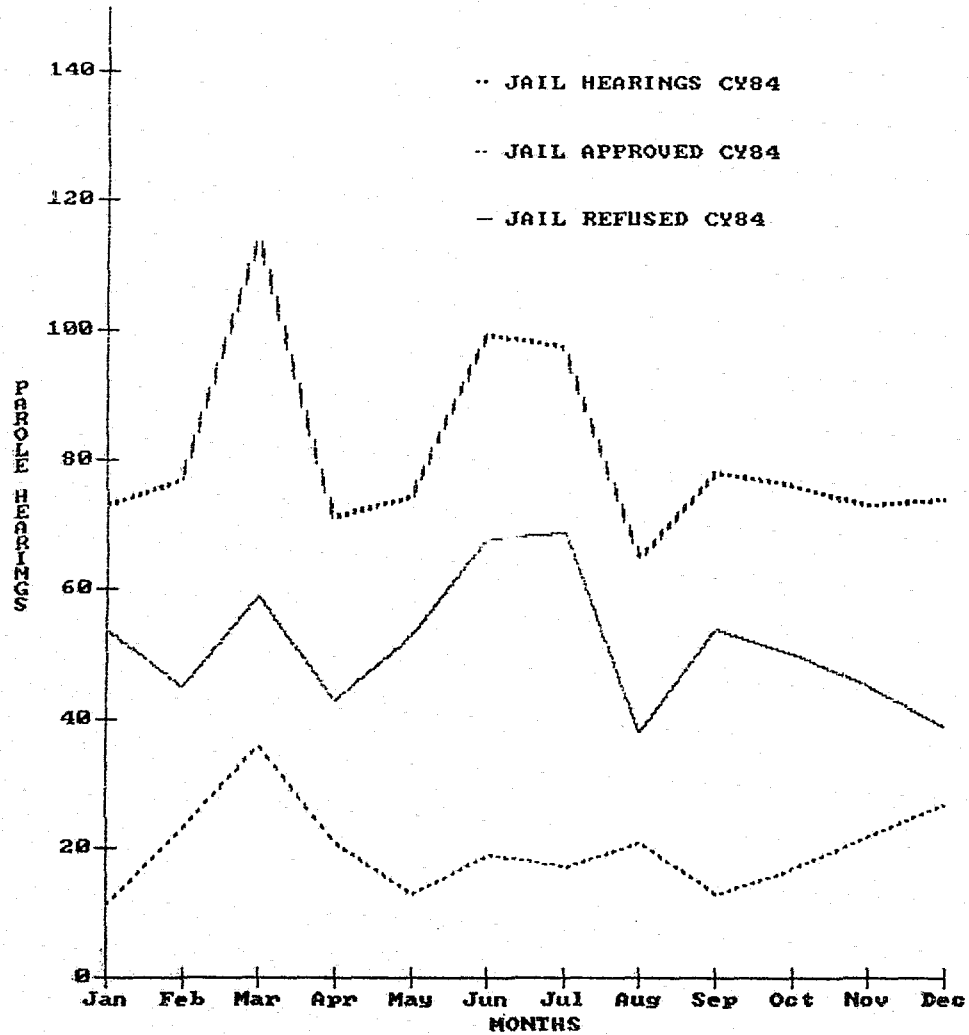
PAROLE COMMISSION - DIVISION OF CORRECTIONS PAROLE HEARINGS

CALENDAR YEAR 1984 US. 1985



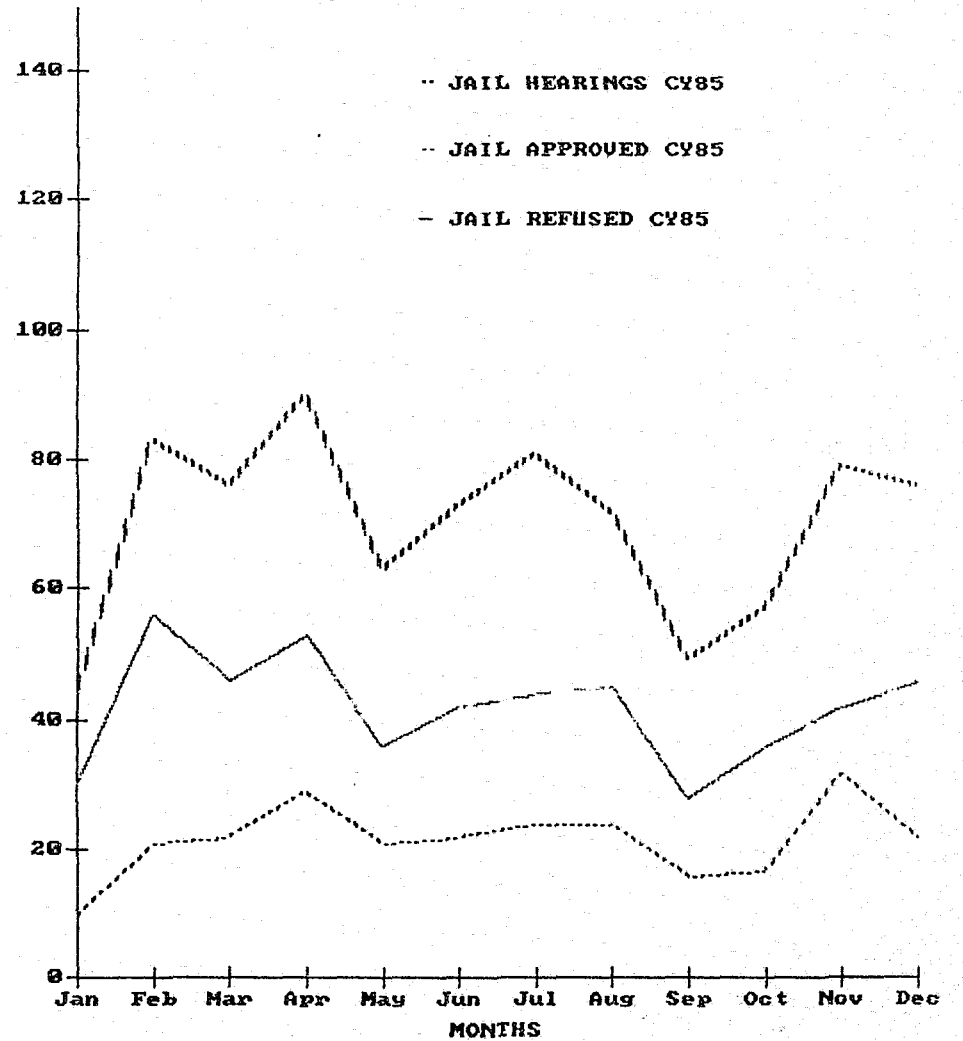
PAROLE COMMISSION - DIVISION OF CORRECTION PAROLE HEARINGS

CALENDAR YEAR 1984 VS. 1985



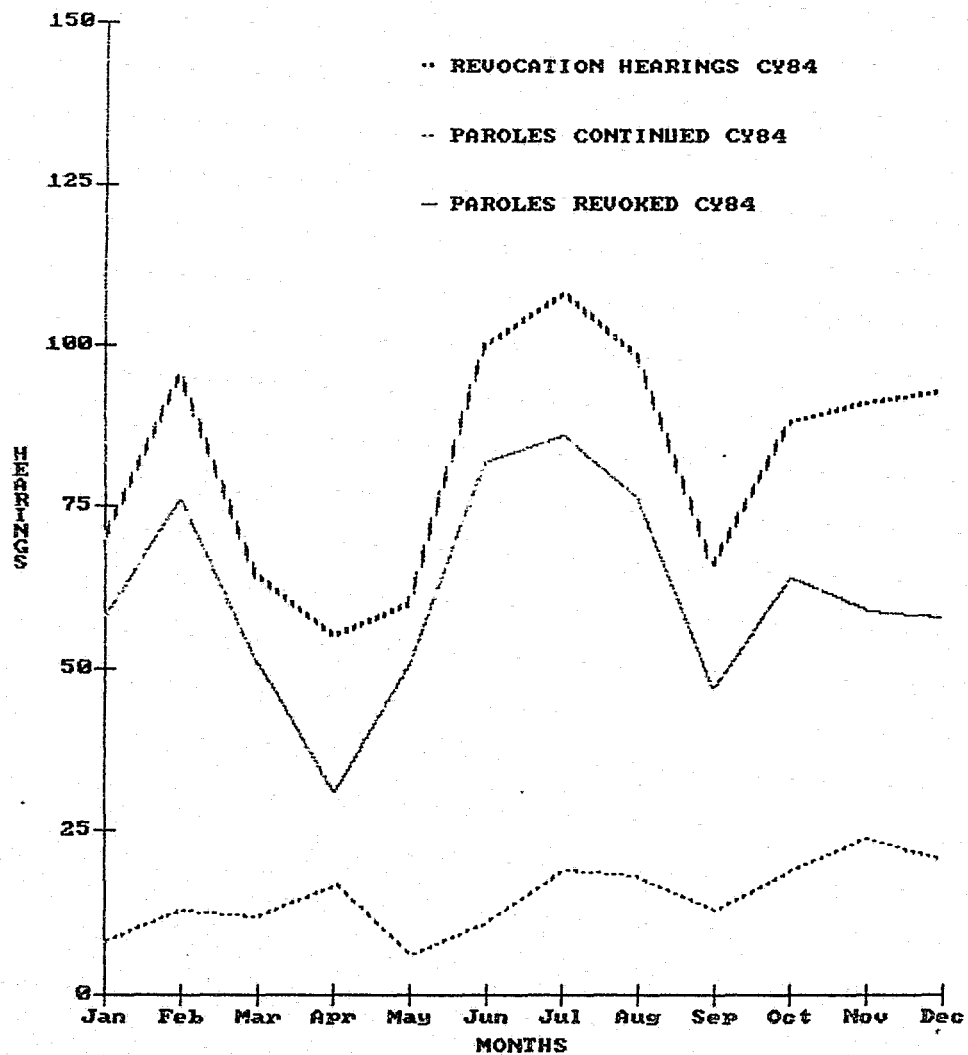
PAROLE COMMISSION

CALENDAR YEAR 1984



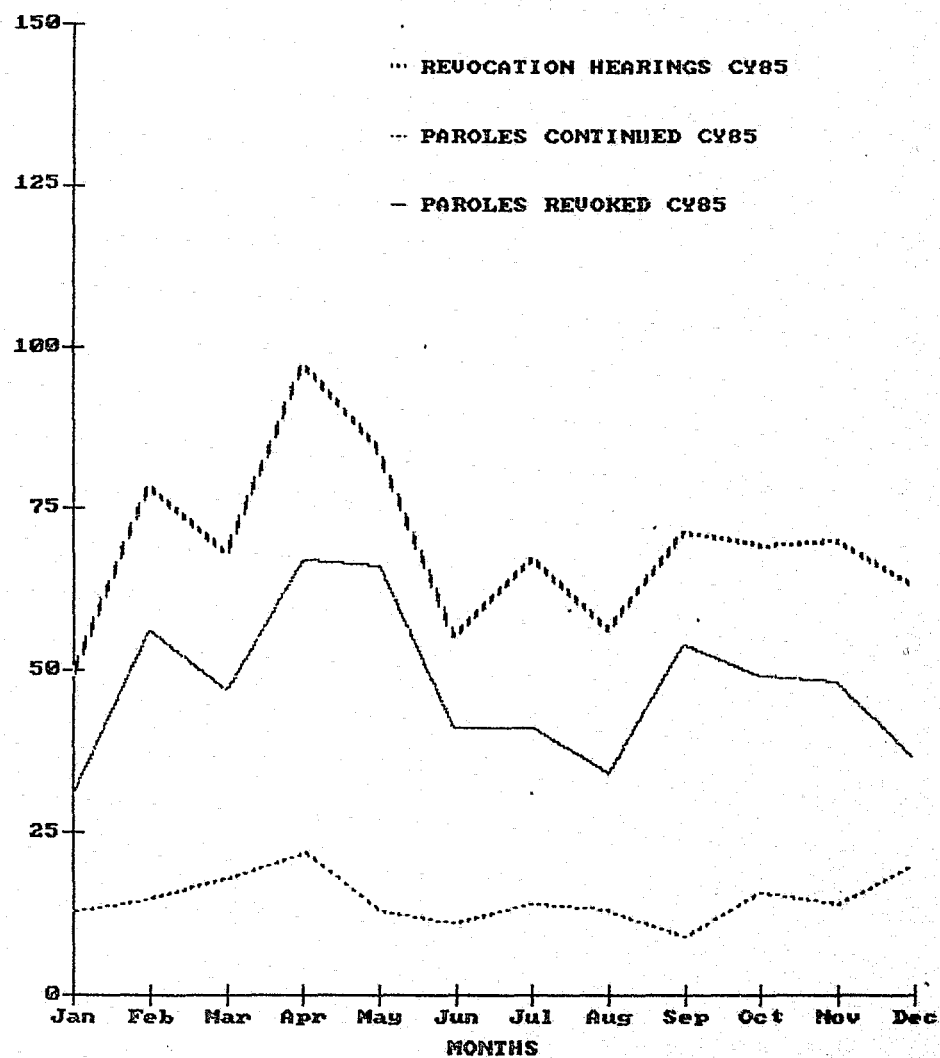

PATUXENT INSTITUTION

Data Sources

The information contained in the Patuxent Institution section is based upon data from a combination of manual and automated information systems that are summarized by the Office of Research and Statistics. The data on Average Monthly Population, Institutional Activity, and Discharges is manually compiled by the Patuxent Office of Research and Evaluation based upon internal institution reports (see tables at pages 62 and 63). The Inmates Characteristics Report (see tables at pages 44 thru 50 of this publication) is based almost entirely upon data from the Offender Based State Correctional Information System (ORSCIS I). The only exception is that the manual population data is used in the Sex Distribution table, at page 44 of this publication, to allow comparisons to be made between the actual population and the computerized count for Patuxent.

Recent Trends

During CY 1985, the Patuxent Institution average monthly total population decreased from 603 to 597, which represents a 1.0% decrease from the corresponding CY 1984 average. Of the total inmates in residence, the number of inmates committed as eligible persons ranged from 461 to 489 during this calendar year with an average of 472. The number of inmates under evaluation ranged from 110 to 140 with an average of 125. In CY 1985 the average for the population of resident eligible persons increased by slightly less than 2.0% over the corresponding average for the prior calendar year (CY 1985 - 472; CY 1984 - 463). The total number of Patuxent inmates under parole supervision in the community ranged from 73 to 87 during this calendar year with an average of 78 for the period. The DOC Housed Inmates category, which represents those DOC inmates who are temporarily housed at Patuxent but are not currently under evaluation for admission to Patuxent's program, decreased from an average of 161 during CY 1984 to an average of 95 during CY 1985. (See Section I of tables at pages 62 and 63.)

The total intake to Patuxent Institution during CY 1985 has increased by 18.5% to 339 as compared to 286 in CY 1984. Discharges* during this period grew from a total of 277 in CY 1984 to 348 in CY 1985 or an increase of 25.6%. No escapes occurred during either CY 1984 or CY 1985. (See Section IV of the tables at pages 62 and 63.) The Inmate Characteristics of the Patuxent population as of the end of CY 1985 were relatively unchanged from the end of CY 1984. (See tables at pages 44 thru 50.)

*It should be noted that the discharge data is limited to the residential population and does not include paroles of inmates transferred to the halfway house.
