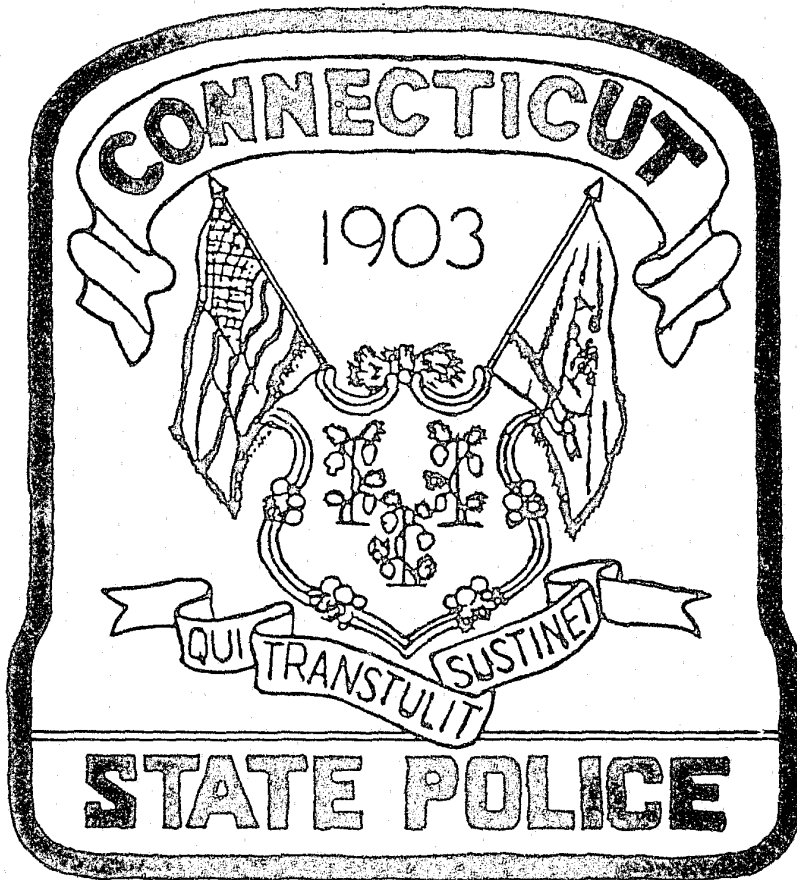

INTRODUCTION

This report is a statistical summary of sex offense cases submitted to the Connecticut State Police Sex Crimes Analysis Unit during the 1986 calendar year.

A total of 565 cases were reported to the Unit, primarily from state and local police departments, rape crisis centers, and private treatment agencies. The cases are processed, placed in a computer file and used as data for this report and as intelligence information for police investigators involved in active sex crimes investigations.

Our efforts to increase reporting compliance appears to have made a difference in this years figures. Of the 760* reported forcible and attempted forcible rapes reported to police in 1986, 238 incidents or 31.3% of those reported were submitted to the Sex Crimes Unit for statistical and investigatory purposes. This is a 6.6% increase over the 1985 figure of submitted rapes and attempted rapes to the Unit. Although this increase in reporting is appreciated, over two-thirds of rapes and attempts are not reported, even though the information is easily available to investigators. Unit personnel will continue efforts to obtain the reporting compliance mandated by Title 29, s.7a, C.G.S.

Since the best current estimates in usage claim that the ratio of reported rapes to unreported rapes is about 1:10, there is clearly a larger problem in Connecticut regarding forcible rape than is currently available for analysis and interpretation. It is clear that the intent and purpose of this report is to infer patterns inherent to assaults of this nature. No hard conclusions should be attempted regarding absolute numbers due to the suspected high degree of under-reporting.

To restate our reporting practices, only data of a summary nature is released to reporters. Names of offenders are referred to police investigators only when those offenders have been convicted of a criminal offense in Connecticut. Names of victims, witnesses or any juveniles are not released to anyone. If a case pertains to an active investigation, then the requesting party is referred to the submitting police department. Case reports from rape crisis centers, and other civilian agencies are normally used for statistical purposes only.



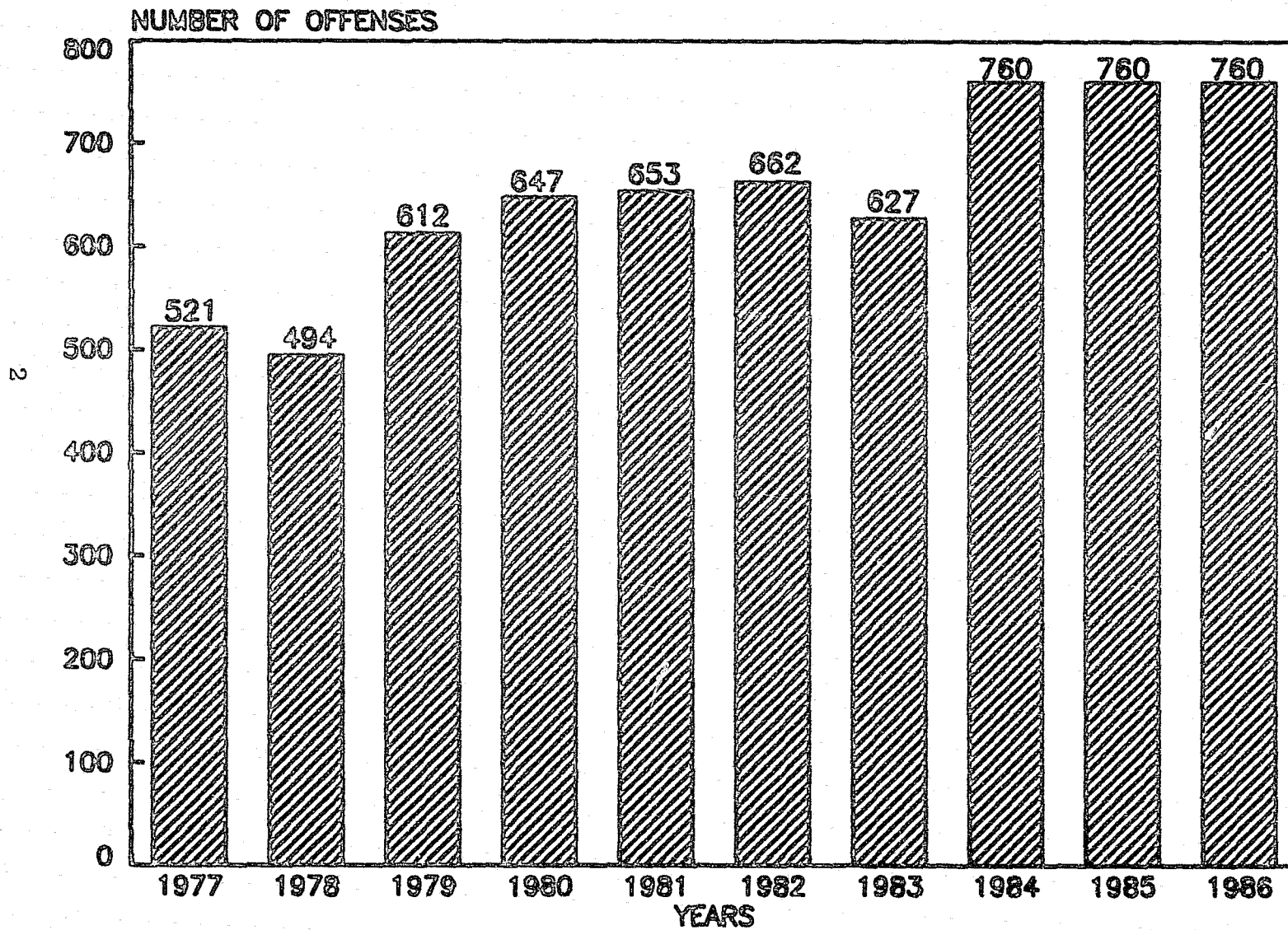

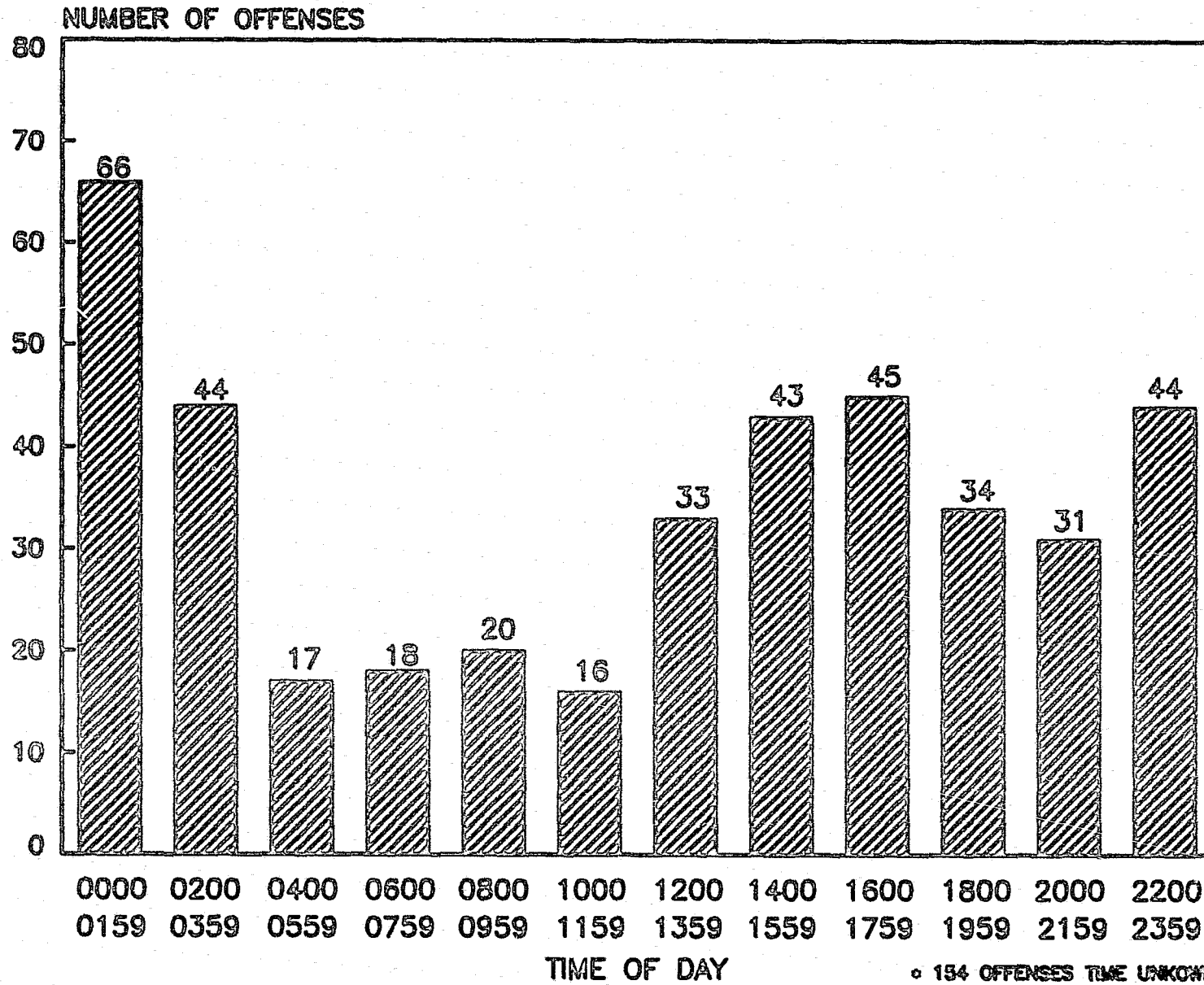

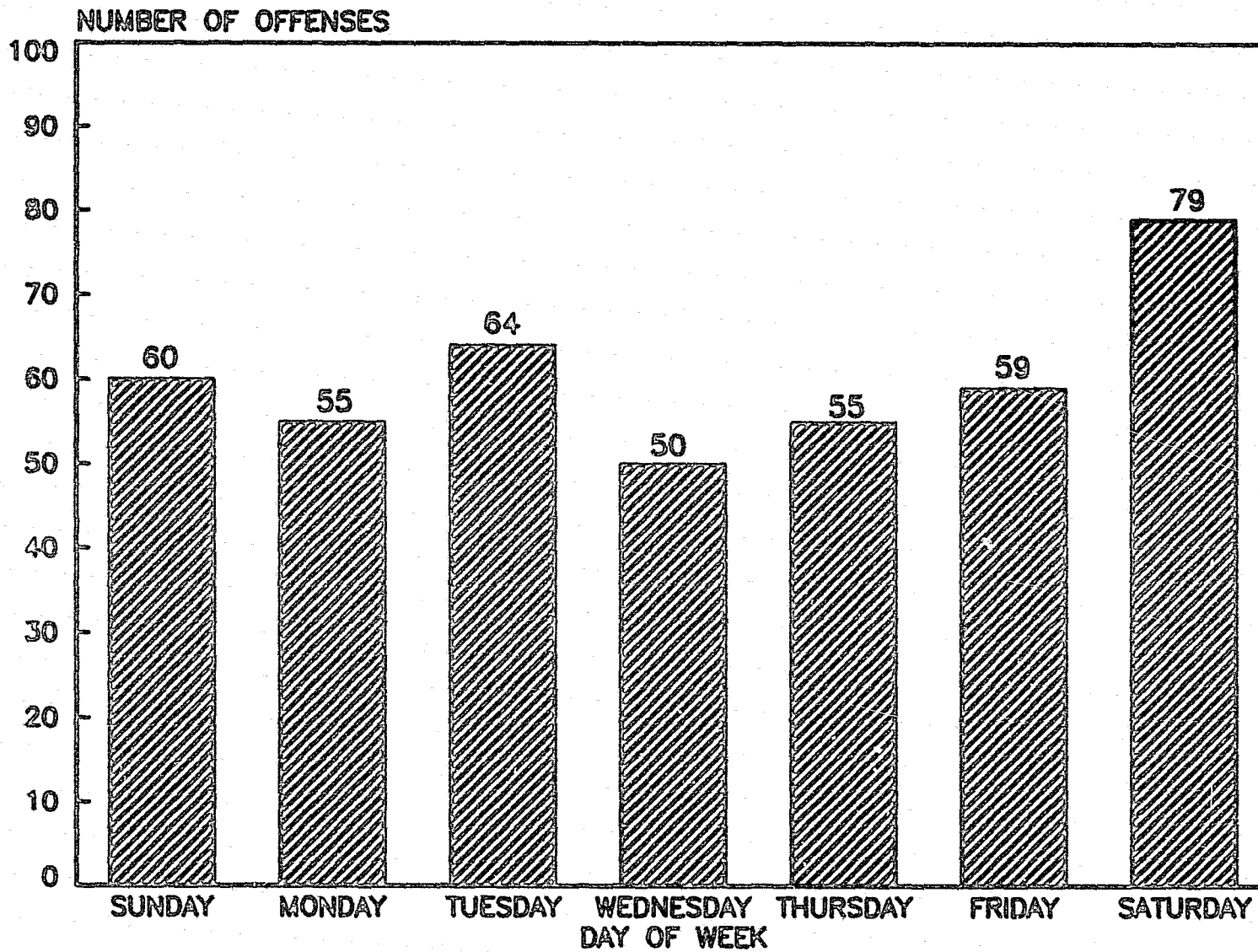

SEXUAL ASSAULT BY TIME OF DAY 1986

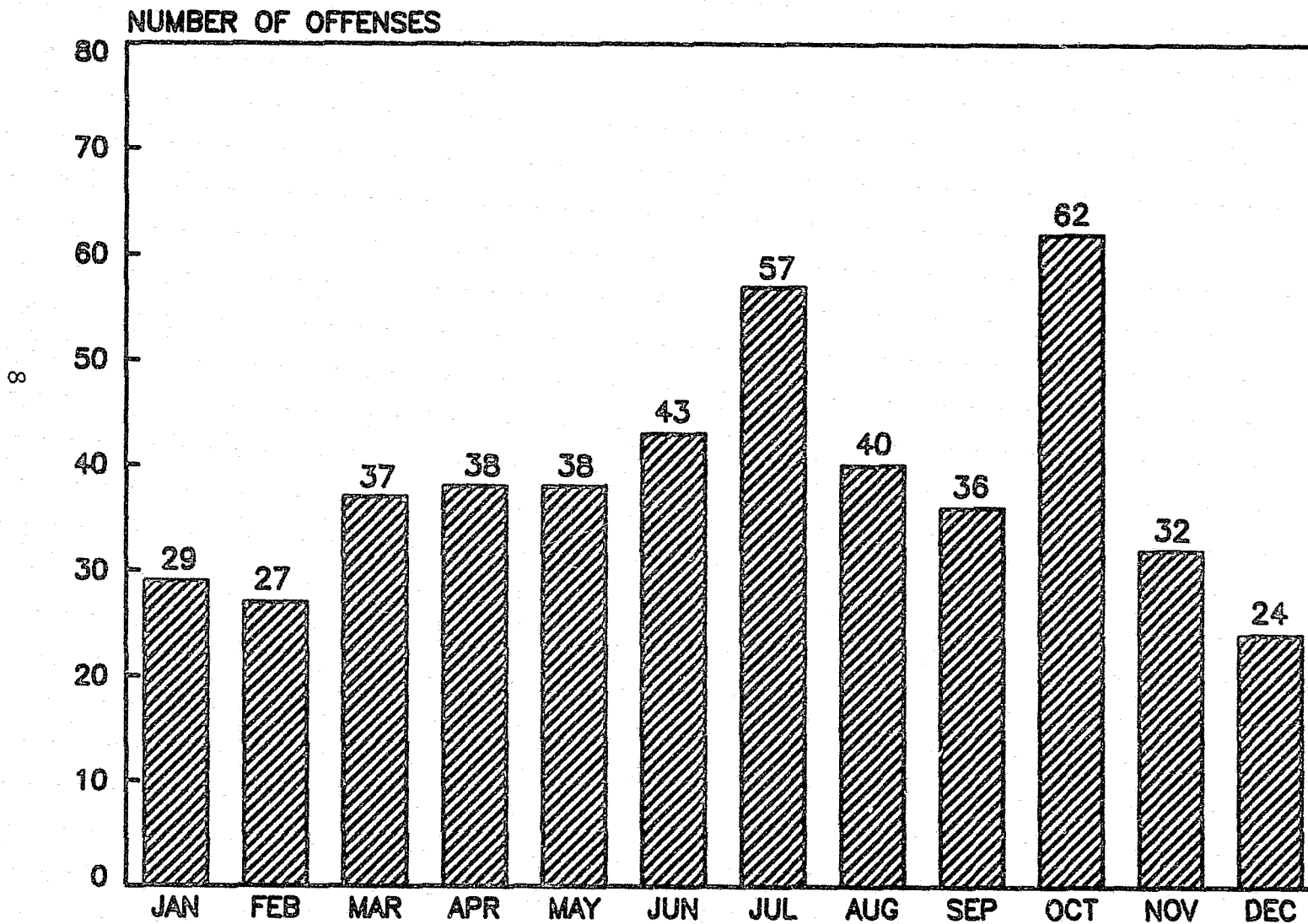


SEXUAL ASSAULT BY DAY OF WEEK 1986

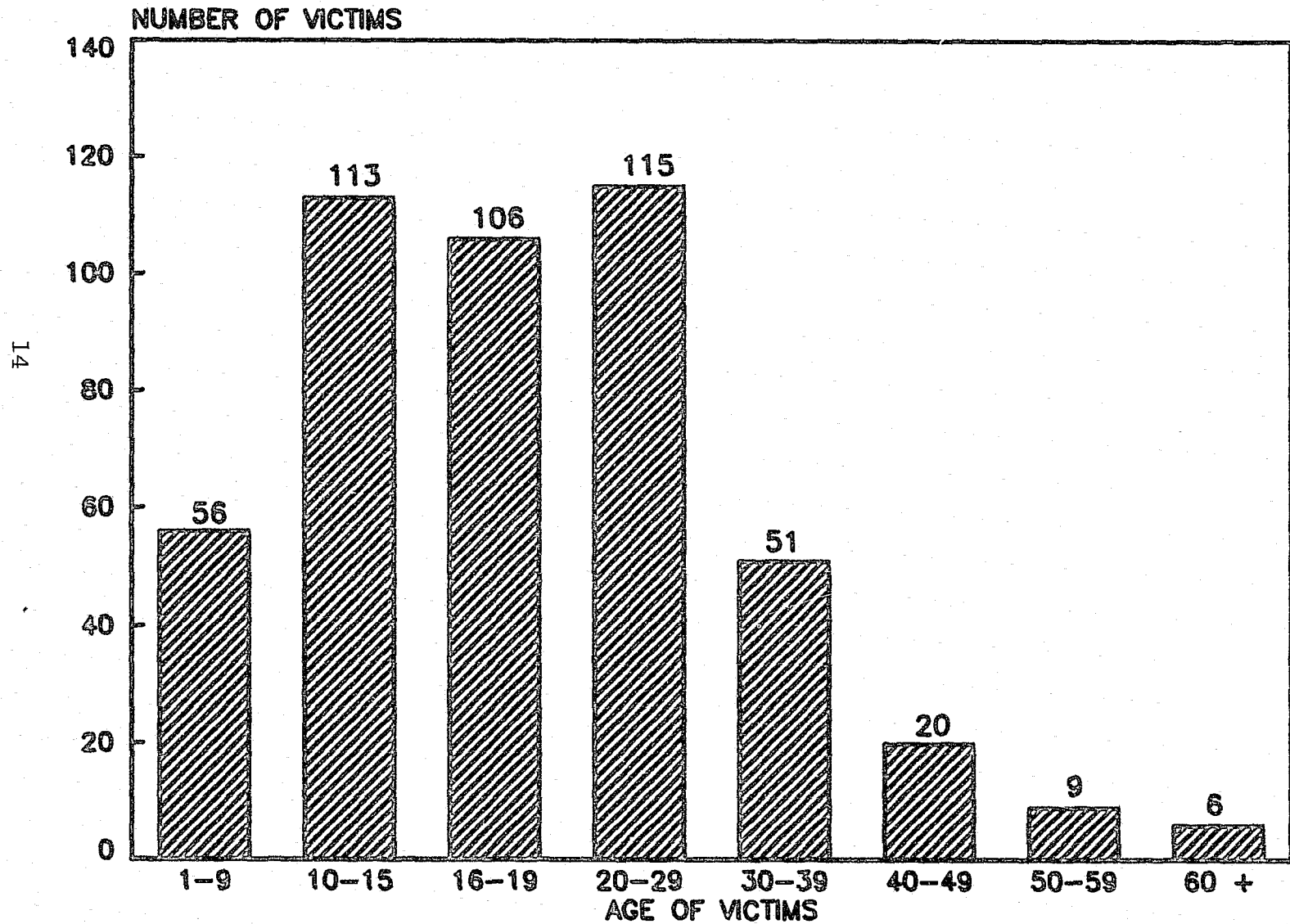

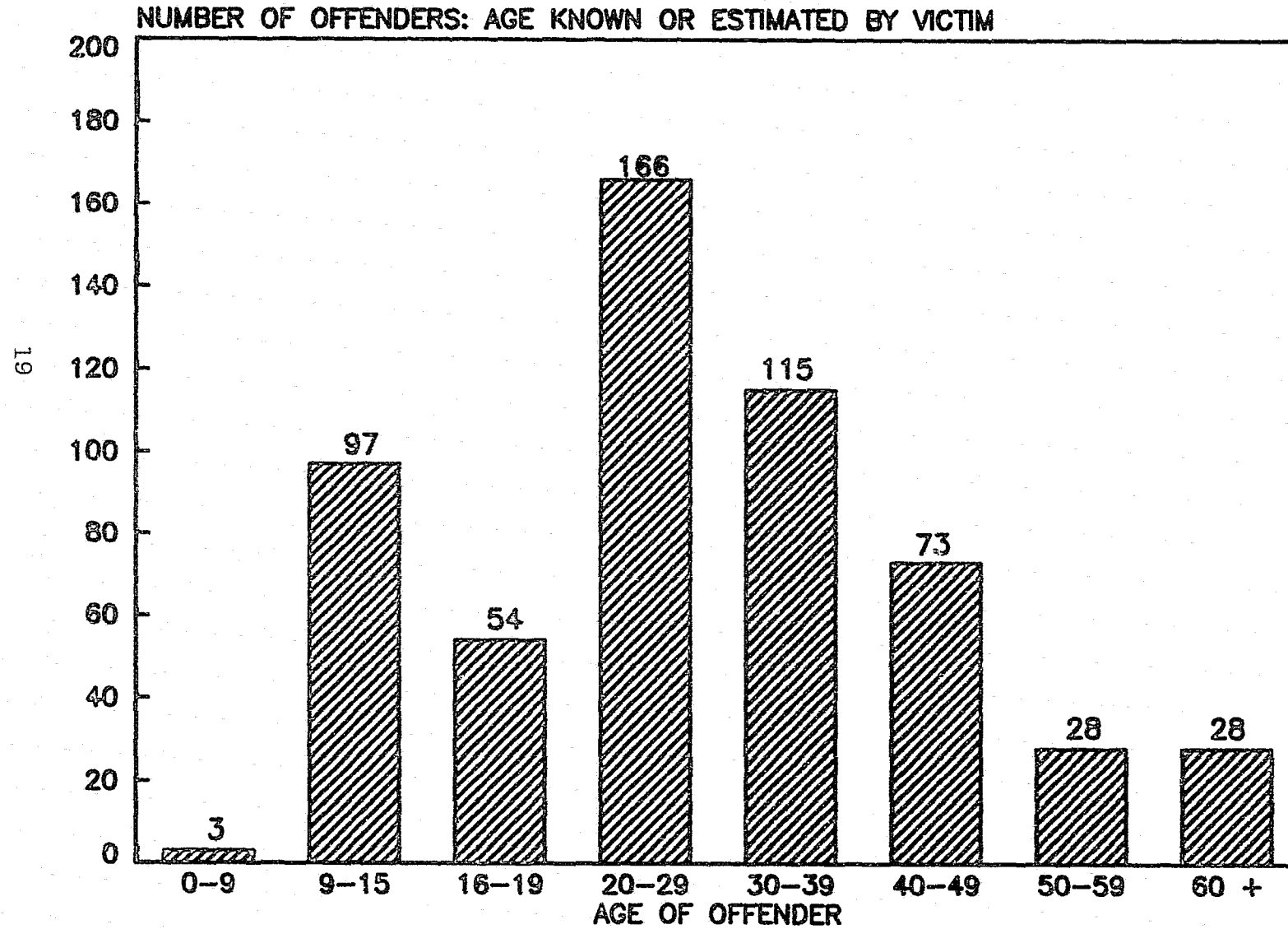
