

### INTRODUCTION DESCRIPTION

Homicide in California, 1986 provides an annual overview of the crime of homicide and its victims, information on persons arrested for murder, and the system's response by type of disposition and sentence given. Homicide data are monitored on an annual basis to detect significant year-to-year changes and to provide information on special interest topics such as peace officers killed.

The major sections of the report are:

- □ Willful Homicide Crimes
- Arrests for Murder
- Dispositions of Adults Arrested for Murder

Most data presented were obtained from three independently compiled Bureau of Criminal Statistics (BCS) data bases: the Automated Homicide File for data pertaining to both willful and justifiable homicides; the Monthly Arrest and Citation Register for data relevant to the characteristics of persons arrested for murder; and the Offender-Based Transaction Statistics for information on types of dispositions, sentences, and death penalty cases.1 The reader is cautioned against comparing data from the three independent data bases.

This publication relies principally on charts to convey essential facts about homicide in California. These charts refer to and are based on tables presented in the Data Section at the back of the report. The Data Section contains raw and "analyzed" data tables. For any given variable, the raw data table shows the frequency count of each category, including that of "unknown." When, for purposes of analysis, unknown data are removed and categories are combined, the table becomes an analyzed data table. Analyzed data tables are the source tables for all charts in the report.

<sup>1</sup> Tables 3-5, 7-44, and 63-72 were compiled from Automated Homicide File data. The data source for Tables 45-49 was the Monthly Arrest and Citation Register. The Offender-Based Transaction Statistics system was the source of data for Tables 50-61.

Willful homicides increased in number and rate per 100,000 population from 1985 to 1986 (up 9.0 and 6.7 percent, respectively).

Over half of the victims were the friend or acquaintance of the offender (51.5 percent).

Female victims were four times more likely than male victims to be a family member of the offender (36.6 versus 8.2 percent).

More victims were killed at their place of residence than at other locations (34.9 percent).

More victims were killed by firearms than by all other types of weapons combined (56.6 percent).

In 1986, the rate of black homicide victims was more than eight times that of white (not Hispanic) victims (46.4 versus 6.1).

The number of arrests for murder decreased 4.7 percent from 1985 to 1986 (2,943 to 2,805).

Of the 1,745 persons arrested for murder for which dispositions were received in 1986, over one-third (38.8 percent) were convicted of murder.

Twenty-one persons were sentenced to death in 1986. There are currently 179 persons sentenced to death in California.

Since 1977, 83 peace officers have been killed in the line of duty. Six were killed in 1986.

#### WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES

The crime of willful homicide is defined by the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program of the Federal Bureau of Investigation as the "willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another." Attempted murder, justifiable homicide, manslaughter by negligence, and suicide are excluded. The data presented in this section of the report coincide with that definition, and were obtained almost exclusively from the Automated Homicide File. Other data sources are indicated in the footnotes of the appropriate tables.

From 1985 to 1986:

The	number	of willful	homicides	increased	from 2	.781 to	3.030.

(10.5 to 11.2	2).							

From 1977 to 1986:

The	number	of willful	homicides	increased from	2,481 to 3,030.

The willful homicide rate per 100,000 population increased .9 percent (11.1 to 11.2).

Of the four violent crime offenses, willful homicide has maintained the lowest rate per 100,000 population for the years shown.

For purposes of comparison, changes in the rates of the violent crimes from 1977 to 1986 were as follows:



When willful homicide victim data were analyzed by sex, it was found that:

- ☐ In 1986, 77.7 percent were male and 22.3 percent were female.
- For each year, 1977-1986, the largest proportion of homicide victims was male (from 74.0 to 79.6 percent).

Chart 2 **WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1986** Distribution of Victims by Sex






Chart 3 WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIME TRENDS, 1977-1986 Preportions of Homicide Victims by Sex

Distribution of Victims by Known Race/Ethnic Group



When willful homicide victim data were analyzed by race/ethnic group, it was found that:

- In 1986, 33.4 percent were white (not Hispanic), 30.1 percent were Hispanic, 31.5 percent were black, and 5.1 percent were of "all other" race/ethnic groups combined.
- For each year, 1977-1986, the proportion of homicide victims classified white (not Hispanic) has tended to decrease while the proportion of those classified as non-white has tended to increase or remain fairly stable.



## **CRIMES**

When willful homicide victim data were analyzed by age, it was found that:


- In 1986, 34.3 percent were under 25 years, 40.9 percent were 25-39 years,
   and 24.7 percent were 40 years of age or older.
- For each year, 1977-1986, the smallest proportion of homicide victims was 40 years of age and older.
- The 25-39 year age group continues as the largest proportion of homicide victims since 1978.

Distribution of Victims by Known Age






# Chart 8 WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1986 Sex of Victim by Known Race/Ethnic Group

When sex of victim data were analyzed by race/ethnic group, it was found that:

- Proportionately, fewer white (not Hispanic) homicide victims were male than were either Hispanic or black homicide victims (66.0 versus 89.4 and 80.7 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more white (not Hispanic) homicide victims were female than were either Hispanic or black homicide victims (34.0 versus 10.6 and 19.3 percent, respectively).

When known age of victim data were analyzed by race/ethnic group, it was found that:

- For each race/ethnic group the largest proportion of homicide victims was 25-39 years of age.
- Proportionately, fewer white (not Hispanic) homicide victims were 24 years of age or younger than were either Hispanic or black homicide victims (24.5 versus 40.3 and 39.3 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more white (not Hispanic) homicide victims were 40 years of age or older than were either Hispanic or black homicide victims (37.4 versus 17.1 and 17.7 percent, respectively).


## CRIMES

The willful homicide rate in 1986 was 11.2 per 100,000 population. Charts 10, 11, and 12 show willful homicide rates per 100,000 population for subgroups of victims classified by sex, race/ethnic group, and age.

Throughout the period 1977 to 1986:

- Males were three times as likely as females to be homicide victims.
- Blacks were more than twice as likely as Hispanics and about six times as likely as whites (not Hispanic) to be homicide victims.
- Persons 25-39 years of age were almost twice as likely to be homicide victims as were either younger or older persons.






Chart 12 **WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1977-1986** Rate per 100,000 Population by Known Age of Victim

Chart 13 **WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1986** Known Relationship of Victim to Offender




This chart excludes 461 cases in which the relationship of the victim to the offender is unknown. A study has shown that if these "unknowns" were known, the "stranger" category would increase in relation to the other categories. However, the "friend, acquaintance" category would still remain the most frequent relationship (Homicide in California, 1983).



When 1986 willful homicide crimes were analyzed by known relationship of the victim to the offender, it was found that:

- □ 51.5 percent of the victims were friends or acquaintances of the offenders.
- 23.4 percent of the victims were strangers to the offenders.
- 10.5 percent of the victims were gang members.
- 6.7 percent of the victims were spouses of the offenders.
- □ 4.7 percent of the victims were parents or children of the offenders.
- ☐ 3.2 percent of the relationships of victim to offender were classified as "all other."

Known Relationship of Victim to Offender by Sex of Victim







When known relationship of the victim to the offender was analyzed by sex, it was found that:

- The male victim was much more likely than the female victim to be a gang member (13.0 versus 1.8 percent).
- ☐ The male victim was more likely than the female victim to be a friend or acquaintance of the offender (53.1 versus 45.7 percent).
- The female victim was much more likely than the male victim to be the spouse of the offender (23.5 versus 2.1 percent).
- The female victim was more likely than the male victim to be the parent or child of the offender (8.7 versus 3.6 percent).

Known Relationship of Victim to Offender by Race/Ethnic Group of Victim



When known relationship of the victim to the offender was analyzed by race/ethnic group, it was found that:

- ☐ The black victim was more likely to be a friend or acquaintance to the offender than the white (not Hispanic) or Hispanic victim (55.3 versus 53.8 and 47.8 percent, respectively).
- ☐ The white (not Hispanic) victim was more likely to be the spouse, parent, or child of the offender than either the Hispanic or black victim (19.1 versus 6.2 and 6.9 percent, respectively).
- ☐ The Hispanic and black victims were more likely to be gang members than the white (not Hispanic) victim (16.2 and 16.0 versus 1.1 percent, respectively).

## CRIMES MANUEL

When 1986 willful homicide crimes were analyzed by known month of incident, it was found that:

- The incident which ultimately led to death occurred more often in the last six months than in the first six months (52.6 versus 47.4 percent).
- This relationship has been found to exist each year since 1974 (Homicide in California, 1983).

This suggests a seasonal pattern in willful homicide crimes in which more persons are killed in the last six months than in the first six months of the year.

(First Half vs Second Half)






When 1986 willful homicide crimes were analyzed by known day of incident and race/ ethnic group of victim, it was found that:

- Most willful homicides occurred on Saturday and Sunday (17.3 and 17.5 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more Hispanic victims than white (not Hispanic) or black victims were killed on Saturday and Sunday (43.4 versus 32.0 and 29.9 percent, respectively).
- White (not Hispanic) victims were killed most often on Friday and Saturday (16.8 percent each), while Sunday was the peak day for Hispanics (23.9 percent) and Saturday was the peak day for blacks (15.9 percent).

When known day of incident data were analyzed by sex of victim, it was found that:

□ For both male and female victims, over one-fourth were killed on weekends (37.0 and 27.2 percent, respectively).


When 1986 willful homicide crimes were analyzed by known location of incident and sex of victim, it was found that:

- 34.9 percent of homicide victims were\_ killed at their places of residence.
- Proportionately, many more female than male homicide victims were killed at their places of residence (58.2 versus 28.3 percent).

And.


- 29.7 percent of homicides occurred on streets or sidewalks.
- Proportionately, many more male than female homicide victims were killed on streets or sidewalks (34.9 versus 11.4 percent).


Chart 21 WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1986 Known Location of Homicide

Known Location of Homicide by Race/Ethnic Group of Victim



When willful homicide crimes were analyzed by race/ethnic group of victim and known location of incident, it was found that:

- Proportionately, more white (not Hispanic) than Hispanic or black victims were killed at their places of residence (49.7 versus 22.5 and 30.3 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, fewer white (not Hispanic) than Hispanic or black victims were killed on streets or sidewalks (14.9 versus 36.9 and 39.5 percent, respectively).

When 1986 willful homicide data were analyzed by known type of weapon used, it was found that:

- 56.6 percent resulted from the use of firearms.
  - 45.2 percent resulted from the use of handguns.
  - 11.4 percent resulted from the use of other and unknown types of firearms.
- 22.7 percent resulted from the use of knives.
- 8.0 percent resulted from the use of blunt objects.
- 7.5 percent resulted from the use of personal weapons (hands, fists, feet, etc.).
- 1.8 percent resulted from the use of ropes.
- 3.4 percent resulted from the use of weapons grouped in the "all other" category.

Known Type of Weapon by Sex of Victim




When known type of weapon used was analyzed by sex and race/ethnic group of the homicide victim, it was found that:


- Regardless of sex or race/ethnic group, the victim was most likely to have been killed by a firearm.
- The proportion of males killed by firearms was greater than that of females (60.7 versus 42.6 percent).
- The proportion of females killed by personal weapons (hands, fists, feet, etc.) was much greater than that of males (15.8 versus 5.2 percent).

- Proportionately, more white (not Hispanic) victims were killed by personal weapons than were Hispanics or blacks (11.1 versus 5.0 and 6.0 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more Hispanic and black victims were killed by firearms than were white (not Hispanic) victims (61.1 and 65.1 versus 45.1 percent, respectively).

Known Contributing Circumstance



When 1986 willful homicide crimes were analyzed by known contributing circumstance, it was found that:

- □ 52.5 percent were associated with arguments.
- 13.5 percent were associated with robbery.
- 9.6 percent were gang-related.
- 9.2 percent were drug-related.
- 2.6 percent were associated with burglary.
- □ 2.5 percent were associated with rape.
- 10.2 percent were associated with "all other" contributing circumstances.

# Chart 28 WILLFUL HOMICIDE CRIMES, 1986 Known Contributing Circumstance by Sex of Victim





When willful homicide crimes were analyzed by known contributing circumstance and sex of victim, it was found that:

- Females were more likely than males to have been victims of homicides in which the contributing circumstance was either a rape, robbery, or burglary (25.0 versus 16.8 percent).
- Males were much more likely than females to have been victims of homicides in which the contributing circumstance was gang-related or drug-related (11.8 and 10.6 versus 1.7 and 3.8 percent, respectively).



When willful homicide crimes were analyzed by known contributing circumstance and race/ethnic group of the victim, it was found that:

- For each race/ethnic group shown, the circumstance which most contributed to homicides was an argument.
- White (not Hispanic) victims were much more likely than either Hispanics or blacks to have been victims of homicides in which the contributing circumstance was either a rape, robbery, or burglary (24.6 versus 12.5 and 15.9 percent, respectively).
- Whites (not Hispanic) were less likely than either Hispanics or blacks to have been victims of homicides in which the contributing circumstance was gangrelated (.9 versus 15.0 and 14.6 percent, respectively).
- Blacks were much more likely than either whites (not Hispanic) or Hispanics to have been victims of homicides in which the contributing circumstance was drugrelated (13.9 versus 6.9 and 7.6 percent, respectively).

When willful homicide crimes were analyzed by known contributing circumstance and known age of victim, it was found that:

- Of the 132 victims 0-14 years of age, 40.9 percent of the homicides were the result of child abuse. This finding was even more pronounced for the 0-4 year age group in which 54.3 percent of the deaths resulted from child abuse (Table 43).
- Of the 299 victims in the 15-19 year age group, 35.1 percent of the homicides resulted from gang-related circumstances.
- ☐ Of the 2,232 victims in the 20-69 year age group, 57.8 percent of the homicides resulted from arguments.
- Of the 100 victims 70 years of age and older, the contributing circumstance was rape, robbery, or burglary in 63.0 percent of the homicides (2.0, 39.0, and 22.0 percent, respectively).

#### ARRESTS FOR MURDER


This section of the report is concerned with arrests for murder in 1986. Murder is defined as the unlawful killing of a human being with malice aforethought.

Data pertaining to reported arrests for murder were obtained from the Monthly Arrest and Citation Register (MACR). The MACR contains information on all arrests made in 1986, as reported to BCS by California law enforcement agencies.


Data which follow pertain to personal characteristics (sex, race/ethnic group, and age) of those arrested for murder in 1986, and to the manner in which these characteristics relate to one another, for example, the distribution of age of arrestee as a function of race/ethnic group.





- ☐ 90.8 percent were male.
- 9.2 percent were female.

And,

- 89.9 percent were adult.
- 10.1 percent were juvenile.

- □ 32.4 percent were Hispanic.
- ☐ 35.3 percent were black.

## ARRESTS E

When sex of arrestees for murder in 1986 was analyzed by race/ethnic group, it was found that:

The ratio of male to female arrestees was much greater for Hispanic than for either white (not Hispanic) or black arrestees (20 to 1 versus 7 to 1 and 9 to 1, respectively).

When age of arrestees for murder was analyzed by race/ethnic group, it was found that:

- Proportionately, fewer white (not Hispanic) arrestees were under 25 years of age than were Hispanic or black arrestees (32.2 versus 54.3 and 49.4 percent, respectively).
- Conversely, the proportion of white (not Hispanic) arrestees 25 years of age or older was greater than Hispanic or black arrestees in the same age group (67.8 versus 45.7 and 50.6 percent, respectively).

When data relating to juvenile and adult arrestees for murder were analyzed by race/ethnic group, it was found that:

- The proportion of white (not Hispanic) juvenile arrestees was less than the proportion of white (not Hispanic) adult arrestees (12.4 versus 28.9 percent).
- Conversely, the proportion of Hispanic and black arrestees was greater for juveniles than for adults (37.2 and 42.2 versus 31.8 and 34.6 percent, respectively).

# Chart 32 ARRESTS FOR MURDER, 1986 Sex of Arrestee by Race/Ethnic Group



Age of Arrestee by Race/Ethnic Group




## DISPOSITIONS PROPERTY

#### DISPOSITIONS OF ADULTS ARRESTED FOR MURDER

This section of the report describes the dispositions made during 1986 of adults arrested for murder, regardless of the year of arrest. Data were obtained from the Offender-Based Transaction Statistics (OBTS) system.

OBTS system data are compiled from information collected on the JUS 8715 Disposition of Arrest and Court Action form. Despite underreporting of JUS 8715 forms, it is believed that these dispositions are generally descriptive of those adult felony arrestees processed through the criminal justice system.


There were 21 persons sentenced to death in 1986. Twenty were arrested for murder and are included in the "prison" category when type of sentence was related to convicted offense (one arrest was initially for robbery and is not included). Disposition data presented are based on arrests for murder only. Specific information pertaining to these persons was also obtained from the OBTS system and is presented in the Death Penalty Section on page 40.

#### Analysis of OBTS information involves:

- The relationship between type of disposition (release, dismissal or acquittal, and conviction) and the personal characteristics of the arrestee.
- The relationship between convicted offense (murder and "other" offenses, such as manslaughter, assault, and robbery) and the personal characteristics of the convicted arrestee.
- The relationship between type of sentence received and the convicted offense of the arrestee.

The analysis of race/ethnic data (particularly for Hispanics) must be considered in light of the subjectivity of the labeling process.



Analysis of 1986 dispositions of adults arrested for murder showed that:

- 20.3 percent were released by the police or had complaints against them denied.
- 11.2 percent were dismissed or acquitted.
- 68.5 percent were convicted of some offense.



When the dispositions of adults arrested for murder were analyzed by sex, race/ethnic group, and age, it was found that:

- ☐ There was little difference in the disposition breakdown by sex.
- Relatively more whites (not Hispanic) than Hispanics or blacks were convicted (71.9 versus 67.1 and 66.4 percent, respectively).
- Releases and convictions varied inversely with age. Releases decreased with age while convictions increased (31.2 to 14.8 percent and 56.7 to 74.7 percent, respectively).


Of those adults arrested for murder who were convicted in 1986, it was found that:

- ☐ 38.8 percent were convicted of murder.
- 61.2 percent were convicted of lesser crimes, such as manslaughter, assault, and robbery.




DISPOSITIONS IN 1986 OF ADULTS ARRESTED FOR MURDER AND CONVICTED



When the dispositions of adults arrested for murder and convicted in 1986 were analyzed by sex, race/ethnic group, and age, it was found that:

- Considerably more males than females were convicted of murder (40.4 versus 23.7 percent).
- Fewer Hispanics were convicted of murder than either whites (not Hispanic) or blacks (30.3 versus 44.2 and 40.0 percent, respectively).
- Convictions for murder varied inversely with age. Of those in the youngest age group (under 20 years of age), 46.1 percent were convicted of murder and of those in the oldest age group (40 years of age and over), 40.7 percent were convicted of murder.

Analysis of type of sentence received by adults arrested for murder and convicted in 1986 showed that:

Proportionately, more of those convicted of murder were sentenced to prison or to the Youth Authority than were those convicted of lesser offenses (99.6 versus 74.7 percent).

Prison includes 20 death penalty dispositions of adults arrested for murder and reported via the OBTS system. See page 40 for additional information on death penalty cases.

## DEATH PENALTY CASES

#### **DEATH SENTENCES**

This section presents information on those persons sentenced to death in California superior courts in 1986. Death penalty cases were extracted from the 1986 Offender-Based Transaction Statistics (OBTS) system.

The death penalty in California was ruled unconstitutional by the California Supreme Court in February 1972. This was followed by a public vote and the reinstatement of the death penalty in January 1974. The resultant statute was subsequently declared unconstitutional by the California Supreme Court in December 1976. By virtue of a veto override in August 1977, new legislation was adopted that reinstated the death penalty in California.

By public vote on November 7, 1978, additional criteria were added to the special circumstances under which a person could be sentenced to death. A summary of the criteria specified by Penal Code Section 190.2 follows:

Intentional murder for financial gain.
Previously convicted of murder in the first or second degree.
Multiple convictions for first or second degree murder.
Murder perpetrated by means of destructive device, bomb, or explosive.
Murder to prevent arrest or to effect escape from custody.
Murder of a peace officer or fireman engaged in the performance of his/her duties.
Murder of a witness to prevent testimony or in retaliation for testimony given.
Murder of an elected or appointed official, judge, or prosecutor in retaliation for performance
of his/her official duties.
Murder by ambush.
Murder because of the victim's race, color, religion, nationality, or country of origin.
Murder involving torture.
Murder by poison.
Murder during the commission of: a) robbery, b) kidnapping, c) rape, d) lewd or lascivious act
upon a child under the age of 14, e) sodomy or oral copulation in violation of Penal Code
Sections 286 and 288a, f) burglary, g) arson, and h) train wrecking.

California Supreme Court decisions in 1983 and 1985 have affected the special circumstances pertaining to murder during the commission of another crime. The issue is complex and its effect on currrent death row inmates is not clear.


PERSONS UNDER CALIFORNIA SENTENCE
OF DEATH, 1978-1986

In 1972, and again in 1976, the California
Supreme Court, ruled, the death penalty

In 1972, and again in 1976, the California Supreme Court ruled the death penalty statute unconstitutional. This resulted in a large decrease in the number of persons on death row. Existing death penalty cases were returned to court for resentencing to the next most severe punishment.

With the reinstatement of the death penalty in August 1977, the number of persons under sentence of death began to grow. By 1986, 179 persons were under sentence of death in California.

During 1986, 21 persons were convicted of first degree murder and sentenced to death. These were initial death sentences only and do not include persons who were resentenced to death after their death sentences were reversed on appeal. The sex, race/ethnic group, age, and sentencing county of those sentenced to death are presented in Table 2.

### PEACE OFFICERS KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY

Data pertaining to peace officers were obtained from the Automated Homicide File. Sworn officers killed while acting in the line of duty are included. Non-sworn officers, such as security guards, are excluded.

From 1977-1986, 83 peace officers were killed in the line of duty. Analysis of the data in Table 3 showed that:

- On the average, 8 peace officers were killed annually. In 1986, the number was 6.
- ☐ The number of peace officers killed in the past five years (1982-1986) was 40.4 percent less than that of the previous five years (31 versus 52).

In 1986, all six peace officers killed in the line of duty were white males.

With respect to type of weapon used to kill peace officers in 1986:

- Four peace officers were killed by firearms three by handguns, and one by a rifle.
- Two were killed while attempting to detonate an explosive device.

## JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDES DOMESTIC



#### JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDES

A justifiable homicide is defined by the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program as the killing of a felon by a private citizen or a peace officer during the commission of a felony. Justifiable homicides are sometimes referred to as excusable or noncriminal homicides. The California Penal Code defines killing in self-defense as justifiable homicide, whereas the national UCR Program does not. Therefore, self-defense cases are treated as willful rather than justifiable homicides.


In 1986, when justifiable homicides committed by peace officers and by private citizens were analyzed by sex, known race/ethnic group, and known age, it was found that:


- Most felons killed by peace officers and private citizens were male (98.8 and 98.9 percent, respectively).
- Proportionately, more felons killed by peace officers were white (not Hispanic) than were felons killed by private citizens (35.7 versus 27.0 percent).
- Proportionately, fewer felons killed by peace officers were black than were felons killed by private citizens (26.2 versus 42.7 percent).
- Most felons killed by peace officers were 20-29 years of age (36.6 percent).
- Most felons killed by private citizens were 20-29 years of age (52.9 percent).


JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDES BY PEACE OFFICERS AND PRIVATE CITIZENS, 1986





- The location where felons were most frequently killed by peace officers was a street or sidewalk (50.6 percent).
- The location where felons were most frequently killed by private citizens was the citizen's residence (28.4 percent).

In 1986, when justifiable homicide data were analyzed by contributing circumstance, it was found that:

- For justifiable homicides by peace officers, the most frequent contributing circumstances were that of the felon being killed when attacking a peace officer (47.1 percent) and in the commission of a crime (28.2 percent).
- For justifiable homicides by private citizens, the most frequent contributing circumstance was also that of the felon being killed in the commission of a crime (64.0 percent).
