






AVERAGE MAXIMUM SENTENCE GIVEN (DAYS)




FEMALE RELEASES BY RACE FY 1984-85




MALE RELEASES BY RACE FY 1084-85










INMATE POPULATION VS. CAPACITY



INMATE POPUATION BY RACE




INMATE POPULATION BY SEX AS OF JUNE 30,1986




INMATE POPULATION BY SECURITY LEVEL






INMATES WORKING (ALL JOBS)










EDUCATION LEVEL AT COMMITMENT FOR FY 85-86 ADMISSIONS




ADULT MATH SKILLS (BY GRADE LEVEL) AS INDICATED BY TEST SCORES







JUVENILE POPULATION BY SEX AS OF JUNE 30,1986







JUVENILE COMMITMENTS BY REGION FY 1985-86




JUVENILE COMMITMENTS BY RACE (FEMALE)




JUVENILE COMMITMENTS BY RACE (MALE)



JUVENILE COMMITMENTS/RECOMMITMENTS FY 1984-85











EDUCATIONAL/VOCATIONAL ENROLLMENT AS OF JUNE 30,1986










INMATE POPULATION VS. CAPACITY






INMATE POPULATION BY SEX

AS OF DECEMBER 31,1986






ESCAPES FROM ADULT INSTITUTIONS


INMATES WORKING (ALL JOBS)



INMATE JOBS (FARMS)








JUVENILE COMMITMENTS BY RACE (FEMALE)


JUVENILE COMMITMENTS BY REGION CY 1986


