#### INTRODUCTION

This report has been developed to provide information regarding the Average Daily Population in each Correctional Complex, Major Institution and Satellite Housing Unit under the jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections during Fiscal Year 1987 (July 1, 1986 to June 30, 1987). In addition, Average Daily Population (ADP) and end of month counts are reported for the community and Residential Juvenile Programs.

The Prison Complex includes the Trenton, Rahway, Leesburg, Mid-State, Southern State, Riverfront and Clinton Facilities, as well as the Adult Diagnostic and Treatment Center.

The Youth Correctional Complex consists of the Youth Reception and Correction Center-Yardville, the Youth Correctional Institution-Bordentown and the Youth Correctional Institution-Annandale.

The Juvenile Facilities include the Jamesburg Training School for Boys, The Skillman Training School for Boys and Girls and the Juvenile Medium Security Facility.

The Average Daily Population for each major institution reported in Table I includes the number of inmates housed at the main institution <u>plus</u> those immates who are assigned to each of the respective satellite units and prefabricated modular units where applicable. Average daily population counts for each of the individual housing units are reported in Tables II through V.

#### NOTES ON FISCAL 1983 - 1987 TRENDS

During Fiscal Year 1987 there was an Average Daily Population of 15,911 offenders in the Department of Corrections, 8502 of whom were housed in State Prison Facilities while 3499 were housed in Youth Correctional Facilities, 716 were housed in Juvenile Facilities, 246 were housed in Halfway Houses, 614 in Community and Residential Programs and 1779 were housed in County Facilities.

From Fiscal 1986 to Fiscal 1987 the average daily offender count for the Department as a whole increased 15% from 13,868 to 15,911 offenders. The following are the changes within the various correctional complexes or facilities:

- The County Waiting list increased 45% from 1226 to 1779.
- The State Prison Complex count increased 8% from 7855 to 8502.
- The Youth Correctional Complex count increased 13% from 3102 to 3499.
- The Juvenile Facilities population increased 16% from 618 to 716.
- The Community Residential Juvenile Programs increased 16% from 528 to 614.

The average daily offender population in New Jersey State Correctional Institutions during Fiscal 1987 was greater than the peak populations experienced in 1982 through 1986. This figure is 2018 offenders or 15% higher than the average daily population experienced during Fiscal 1986.

This continued increase in institutional population was the result of the continued impact of Title 2C, the New Criminal Code, Legislative ammendments to title 2C and the Administrative Office of the Courts' Speedy Trial Program. Continued correctional population growth has contributed significantly to the severe prison overcrowding. (See tables of monthly population counts during Fiscal 1987 on pages 10, 11 and 12).

Also, it should be noted that there was continued increase in the number of juvenile offenders residing in the Community and Residential Juvenile Programs during this period. The average daily population in Fiscal 1987 was 614 or 16% greater than the Fiscal 1986 count of 528.

#### PRISON COMPLEX AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION

The Trenton Prison Facility (main and satellites) had an average daily population of 2309 residents during Fiscal 1987. This represented 27% of those offenders housed in all prison facilities. Trenton Main had an average daily population count of 1969 with the West Trenton (Jones Farm) minimum security satellite accounting for an additional 140 daily residents. The maximum security Vroom Readjustment Unit maintained an average daily population of 132 during the 1987 Fiscal Year. The Central Medical Unit had an average daily count of 63 offenders during the year.

Of the 8502 average daily offenders housed in State Prison Facilities during the year, 1620 or 19% were resident at the Rahway Facility. The main institution at Rahway had an average daily population of 1385 with minimum security units averaging an additional 235 residents on a daily basis.

The Leesburg Prison Facility accounted for approximately 18% of the daily residents housed in the Prison Complex with an average daily count of 1501. Leesburg Main (medium unit) maintained an average daily population of 844 with the minimum security satellite units housing an additional 657 residents on a daily basis.

The average daily population for the Mid-State Correctional Facility during Fiscal 1987 represented approximately 6% of those offenders housed in all prison facilities with an average daily population of 489.

The average daily population for Southern State Correctional Facility was 1196 or 14% of those offenders housed in Prison Facilities.

The Riverfront State Prison accounted for 5% of the daily residents housed in the Prison Complex with an average daily count of 445.

The newly opened Northern State Prison accounted for 1% of the daily residents housed in the Prison Complex with an average daily count of 96.

The average daily population for the Adult Diagnostic and Treatment Center was 380 or 4% of those housed in Prison Facilities.

Clinton Correctional Institution accounted for approximately 5% of the daily residents in the Prison Complex, with an average count of 466. Of the 466 residents, 41 were male offenders and 425 were female offenders.

There was an average daily count of 3499 offenders resident in the Youth Correctional Facilities during the 1987 Fiscal Year. Thirty-three percent or 1144 inmates were resident in the Youth Reception and Correction Center at Yardville of which 1081 were in the main institution and 63 were in minimum custody satellite units.

The Bordentown Youth Correctional Institution maintained an average daily population of 1104 which represented 32% of the residents housed in youth facilities. Nine hundred seventy-two residents were housed in the medium facility at the main institution with the remaining 132 average daily residents housed in its minimum security satellite units at New Lisbon and the NPI Unit at Skillman.

The Annandale Youth Correctional Institution accounted for approximately 36% of the total offenders housed in youth facilities with an average daily population of 1251 inmates. Annandale Main averaged a daily resident count of 1055 while the institution's satellite units accounted for an additional 196 daily residents.

#### NOTES ON AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION FISCAL 1987

A/ Residents include offenders in the institution and on furlough on the last day of the report period. For the Prison Complex and Youth Complex, number on furlough is included only in the total complex counts and not in the counts for separate units.

Also note that, for this report, offender counts are based on physical location and not on correctional jurisdiction (e.g., prison offenders housed in Youth Correctional Facilities are included in Youth Correctional Counts).

B/ MEDIUM/MAXIMUM UNITS: Footnote "B" identifies units providing medium or maximum custody. The count provided includes all offenders resident in units which primarily house offenders requiring more than minimum custody. Thus these counts are not a count of offender by custody status but are a count of the total number of offenders resident in designated units.
