

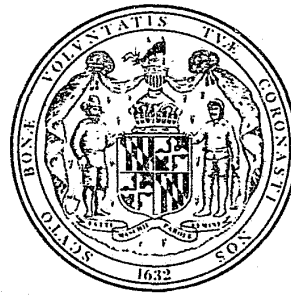

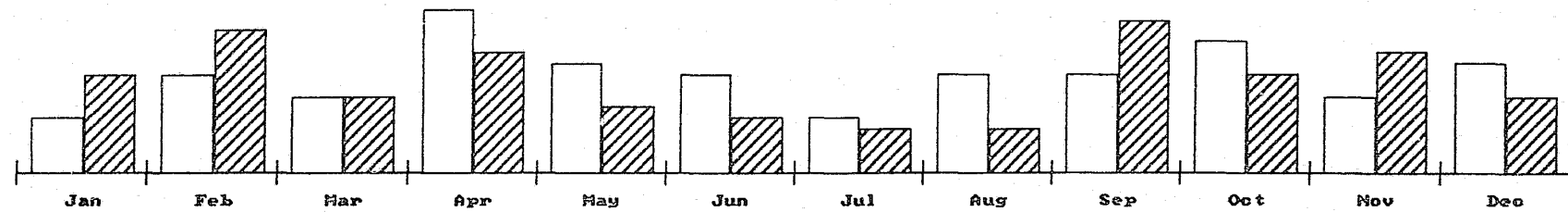

INTRODUCTION

IN AN EFFORT TO ASSIST DECISION MAKERS, THE OFFICE OF RESEARCH AND STATISTICS DEVELOPED THIS DOCUMENT TO PROVIDE A SYNOPSIS OF THE TRENDS IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE PROCESSING STATISTICS WHICH HAVE OCCURRED OVER THE MOST RECENT CALENDAR YEARS. AN EFFORT HAS BEEN MADE TO CAPTURE ON A MONTHLY BASIS STATISTICAL DATA WHICH PROVIDES SOME INDICATORS AS TO THE CHANGES IN OFFENSE AND ARREST PATTERNS, LOCAL JAIL POPULATIONS, PAROLE AND PROBATION CASELOADS, STATE CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTION POPULATIONS AND PAROLING AUTHORITY ACTIVITIES. IN EACH SECTION OF THE REPORT A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE DATA SOURCES AND RECENT TRENDS IS PRESENTED. THIS REPORT ACTS AS A REPRESENTATION OF THE EVENTS WHICH HAVE OCCURRED OVER THE PAST TWO CALENDAR YEARS. CAUSE-EFFECT RELATIONSHIPS CANNOT BE DRAWN FROM THE VARIOUS DATA PRESENTED. HOWEVER, RELATIONSHIPS IN TRENDS CAN AID USERS OF THIS DOCUMENT IN OBTAINING AN INDICATION OF POSSIBLE FUTURE TRENDS.

OFFENSES AND ARRESTS

Data Sources

The information contained in the offenses and arrests section of the Agency Processing Statistics is based upon data tabulated through the statewide Uniform Crime Reporting program managed by the Maryland State Police Criminal Records Central Repository (CRCR). Each month, summary data on offenses and arrests is compiled and submitted to CRCR by each of Maryland's 134 law enforcement agencies. These reports are edited and prepared for data entry. Computer generated output reports are produced to summarize the information received in a variety of formats. CRCR then provides monthly summaries of the offense and arrest data to the Office of Research and Statistics.

Comparisons of data trends occurring between CY 1986 and CY 1985 have been graphically depicted in charts. Index Offenses - Total, Property and Violent are displayed (page 3) as well as a comparison of Total Offenses (reported) and Adult Arrests (page 4). Data associated with these graphs is provided in tables for each calendar year (pages 5 and 6). A quarterly comparison of the changes in reported index offenses over these two calendar years is also provided (page 7).

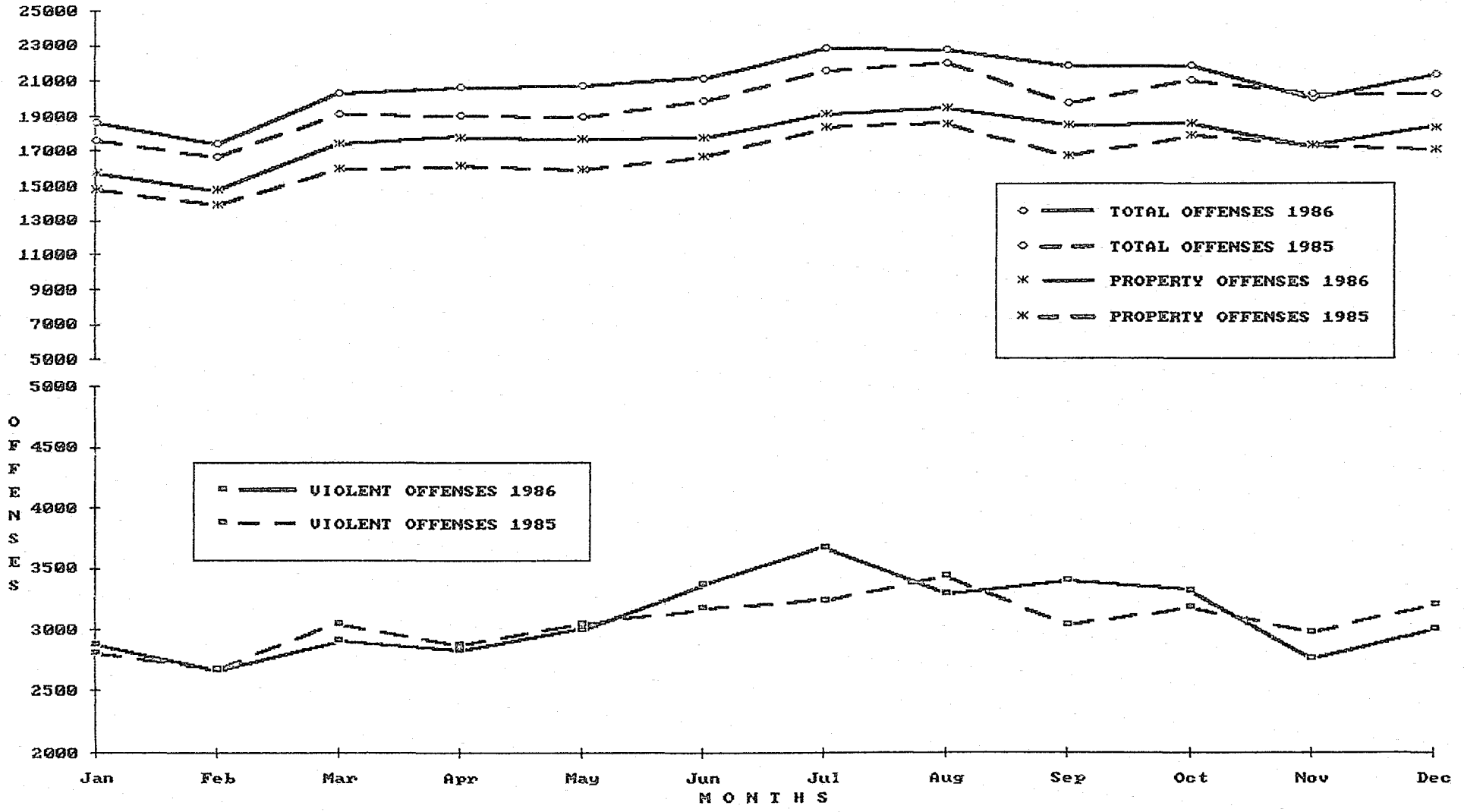
Recent Trends

Total offenses were up 5.7% from 236,388 in CY 1985 to 249,968 in CY 1986. This increase occurred in all index crime categories except Aggravated Assault, which decreased slightly from 21,425 in CY 1985 to 21,226 in CY 1986. Combined categories of offense data show that violent offenses (murder, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault) increased 1.0% from 36,762 in CY 1985 to 37,142 in CY 1986. Property Offenses (burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft) increased 6.6% from 199,626 in CY 1985 to 212,826 in CY 1986. See pages 3, 5, 6, and 7.

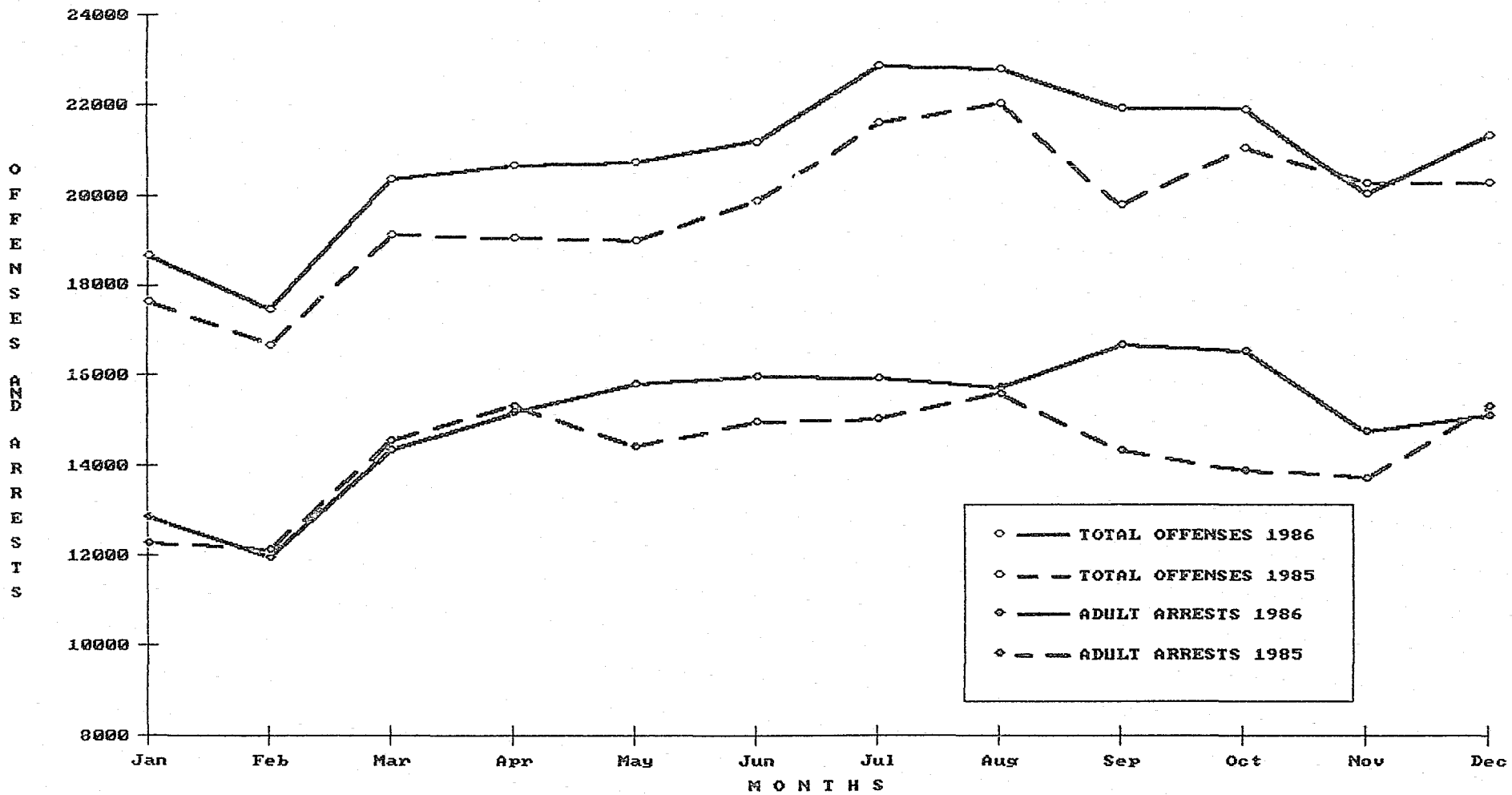
Adult arrests increased 5.4% from 171,646 in CY 1985 to 180,902 in CY 1986. It should be noted that offense data is collected for only index crimes (murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft) and only when they are reported. Arrest data includes not only index crimes but other crimes, generally considered less serious. Offense data and arrest data are, therefore, mutually exclusive and difficult to compare to each other.

Data on juvenile arrests in tables 5 and 6 shows a reversal of a previous declining trend. The number of juveniles arrested in CY 1986 was 38,955, a 3.2% increase from the 37,753 juveniles arrested in CY 1985.

LOCAL JAIL STATISTICS

Data Sources

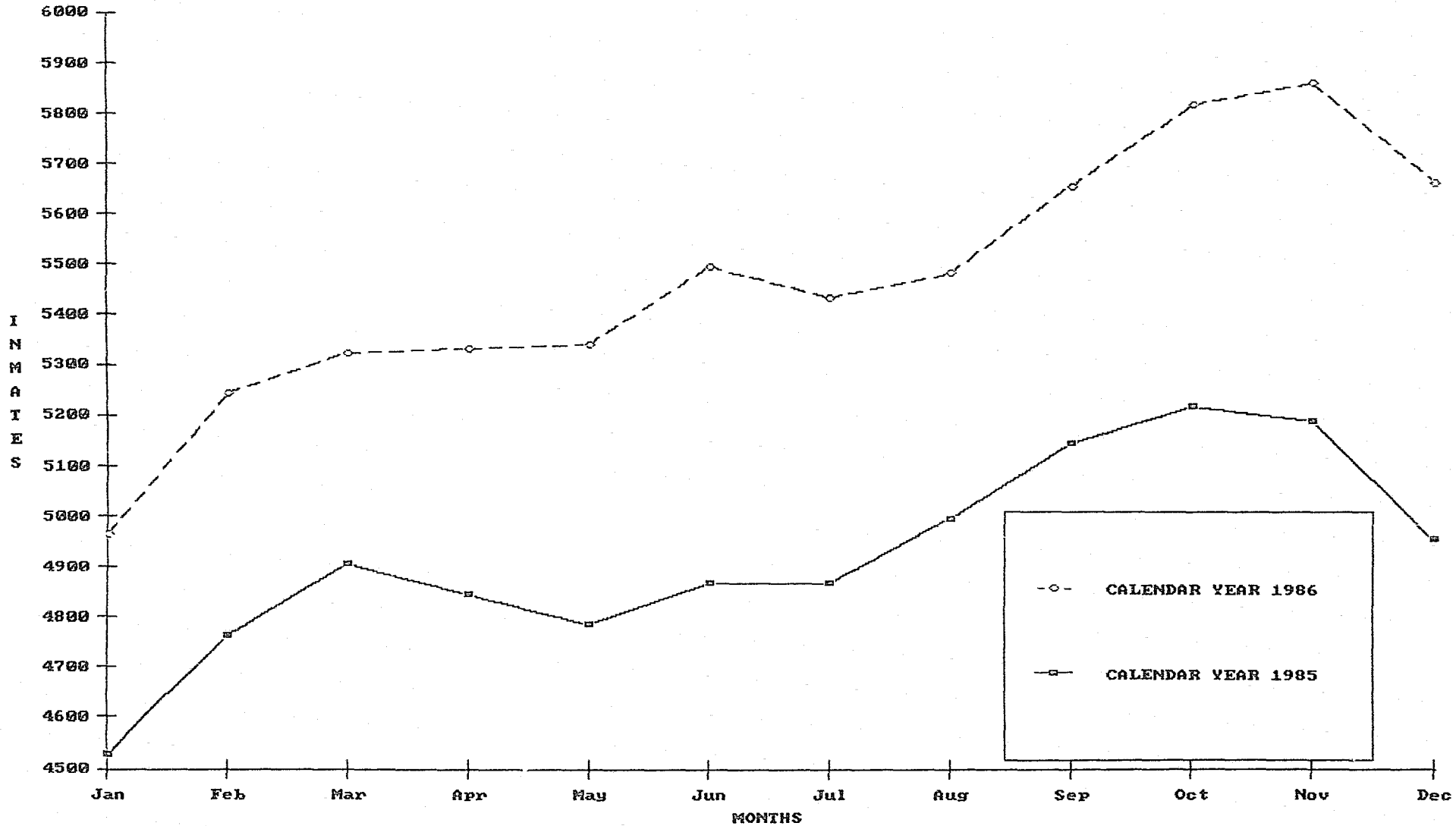
The information contained in this section of the Agency Processing Statistics is derived from Statewide data collection efforts by the staff of the Maryland Commission on Correctional Standards. The Commission staff tabulates and summarizes data submitted by local jurisdictions. Statewide aggregate data reflecting monthly trends for Calendar Years 1985 and 1986, spanning all local jurisdictions, are displayed as value lines in the following charts: Average Daily Population in Local Jails, Local Versus DOC Sentenced Inmates, and Awaiting Trial, PSI and Other (Jail Population) on pages 9 to 11. The calendar year data (CY 1985 - CY 1986) used to derive these charts is presented in the tables on page 12. The Statewide Average Daily Population is calculated by Commission staff. Data on the status of local jail prisoners (sentenced, awaiting trial, etc.), the intake and the departures represent end of month actual counts forwarded to the Commission and aggregated.

Recent Trends

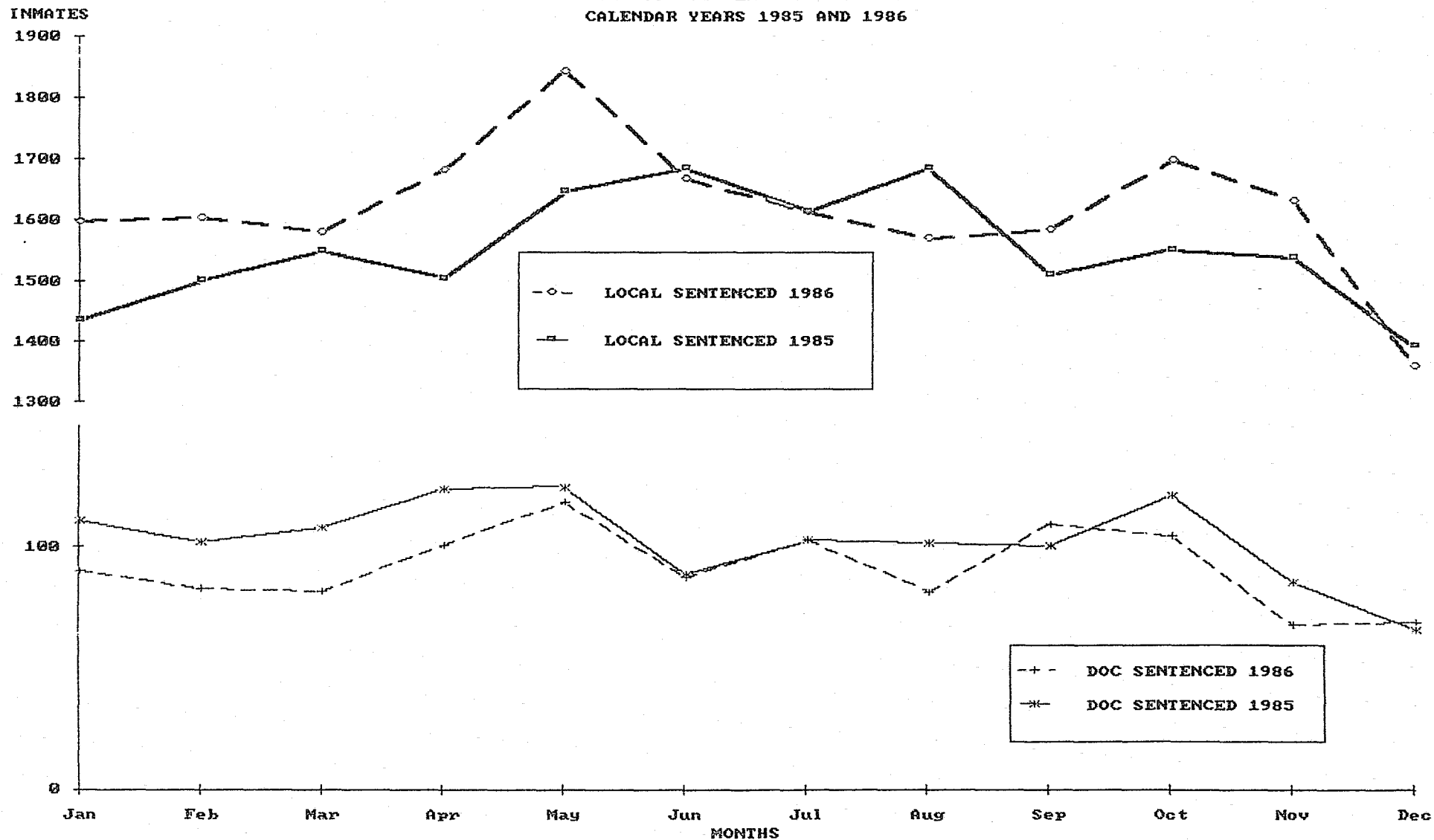
The CY 1986 average daily population in local jails increased 11.1% over CY 1985 (CY 1986 - 5,467 v. CY 1985 - 4,922). This growth in the average daily population incarcerated in local jails is reflected in the chart on page 9. The previous pattern of parity between total intakes and departures is replaced by an increase in intakes over departures in CY 1986 (75,440 v. 73,088). If this pattern continues, future average daily population levels will continue to grow beyond present levels (CY 1986 average: 5,467 v. CY 1985 average: 4,922).

A complex interaction of jail population factors influences population growth as reflected in the average daily population. Expressed as monthly averages these factors are: 1) local sentenced prisoners, 2) DOC sentenced inmates and 3) prisoners awaiting trial, pre-sentence investigation or others (see the table on page 12). Local sentenced prisoners increased from an average of 1,553 in CY 1985 to an average of 1,621 in CY 1986. The influence of DOC sentenced backup on local jail population is not significant because the average of these prisoners dipped from 103 in CY 1985 to 92 in CY 1986 (see the chart on page 10). The number of prisoners in local detention awaiting trial, pre-sentence investigation or in an undefined other category may be a significant population factor based on the 14.8% increase in these prisoners from 3,256 in CY 1985 to 3,737 in CY 1986 (see the chart on page 11). The inmates awaiting trial is the leading subgroup in this growth category. Caution must be used in extrapolating this data in the context of local conditions at each jail and detention center.

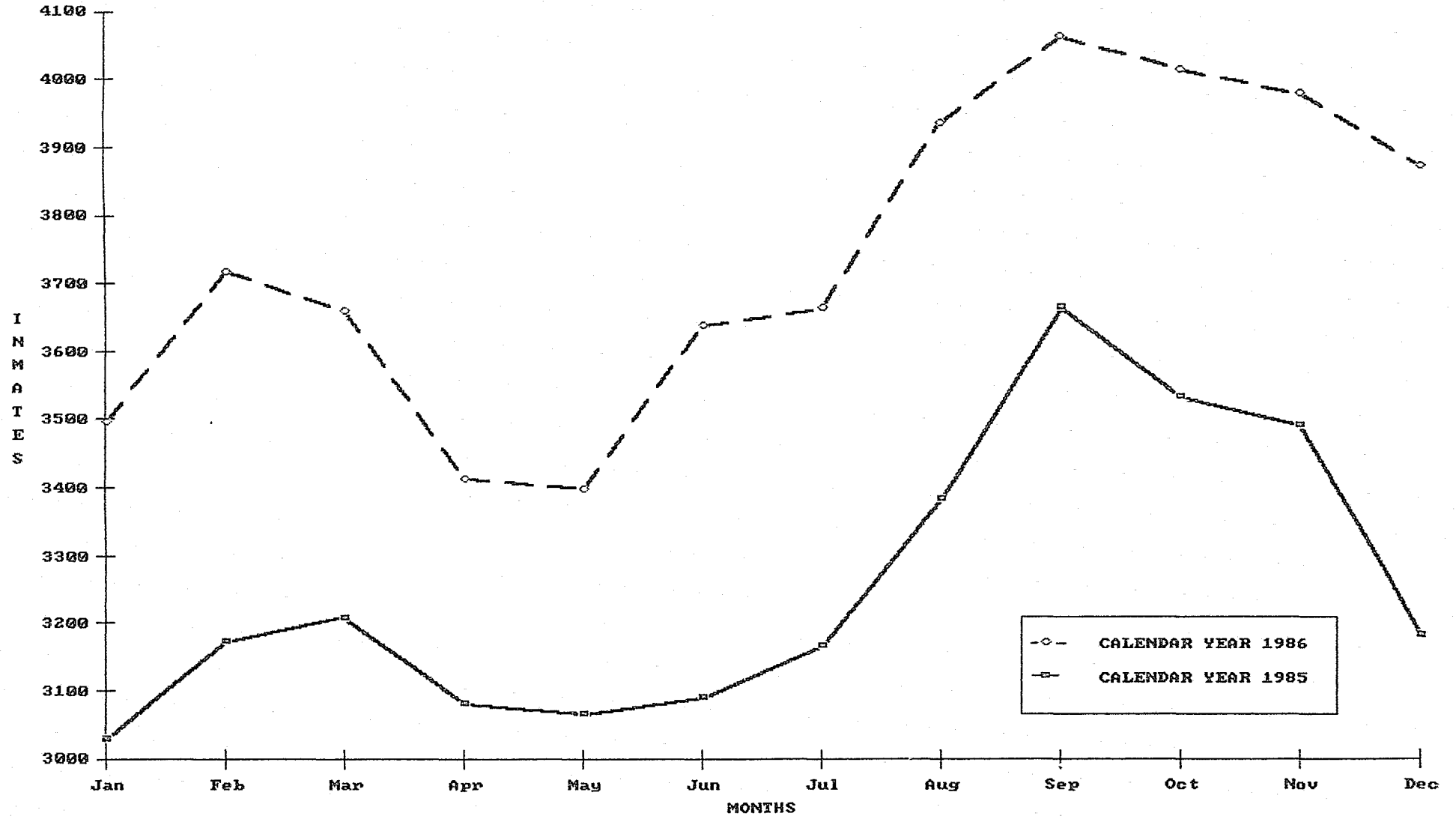
AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION IN LOCAL JAILS

PAROLE AND PROBATION STATISTICS

Data Sources

The information contained in the Division of Parole and Probation section of the Agency Processing Statistics is based upon an automated information system and is summarized on a Statewide basis by the Office of Research and Statistics. The Cases Under Active Supervision (see charts at pages 18 & 19 and tables at pages 24 & 25), Cases Being Administered (see charts at pages 20 & 21 and tables at pages 26 & 27) and the intake data (see charts at pages 14 & 15 and tables at pages 22 & 23) were all extracted from the OBSCIS II automated system. Case Closings data (see charts at pages 16 & 17 and tables at pages 22 & 23) was derived by means of a formula comparing intakes to monthly changes in the Cases Being Administered totals.

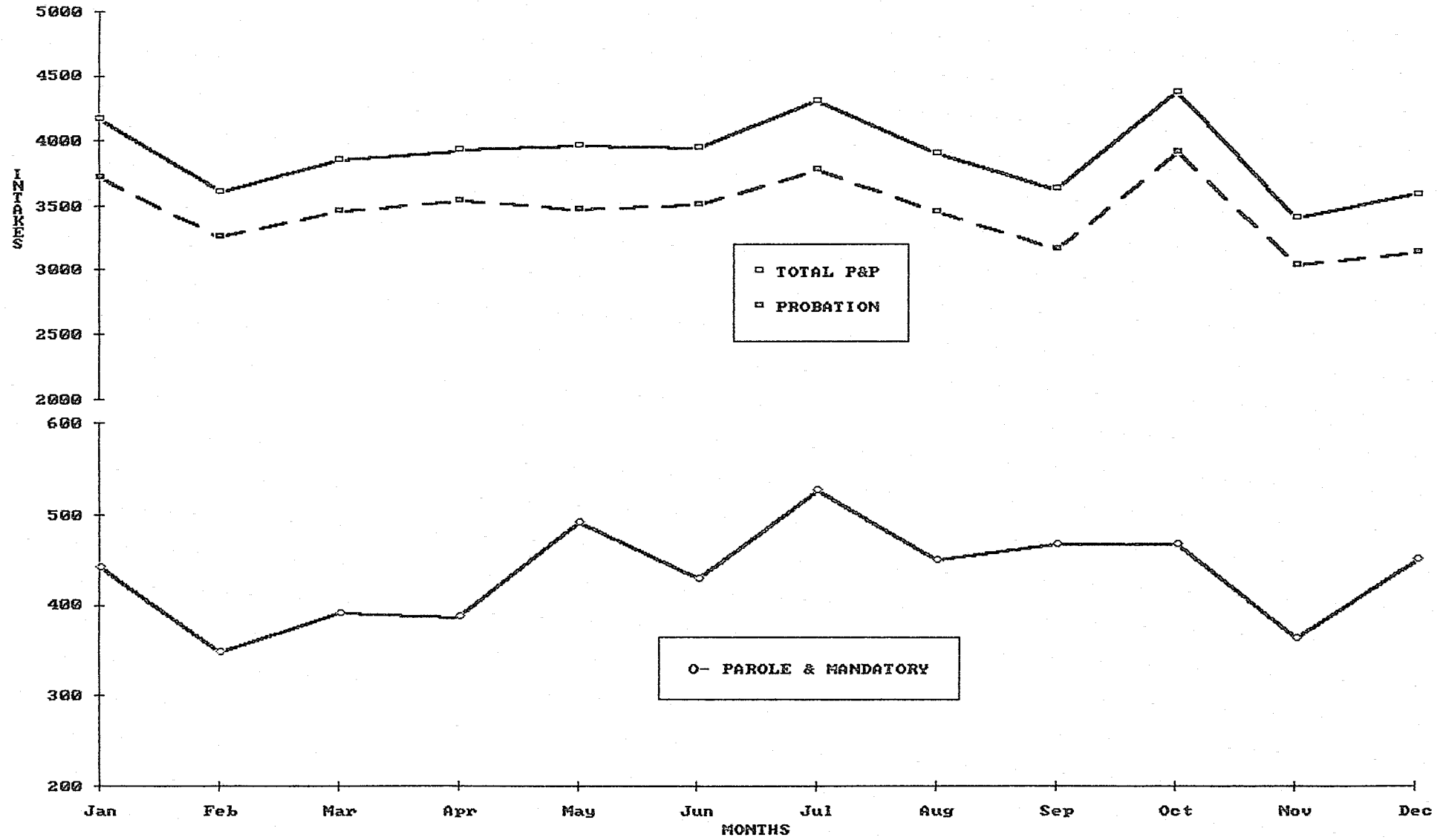
Recent Trends

During Calendar Year 1986, the Division's Cases Under Active Supervision increased from 44,795 to 46,349 cases, representing an increase of 3.5%. This compares to a decrease in Calendar Year 1985 of 2.7% (see charts at pages 18 & 19 and tables at pages 24 & 25). While Active Cases increased by 3.5% in Calendar Year 1986, Total Cases Being Administered by the Division increased 3.0%, from 82,654 to 85,137 cases. This compares to a growth of 3.8% in Calendar Year 1985 (see charts at pages 20 & 21 and tables at pages 26 & 27).

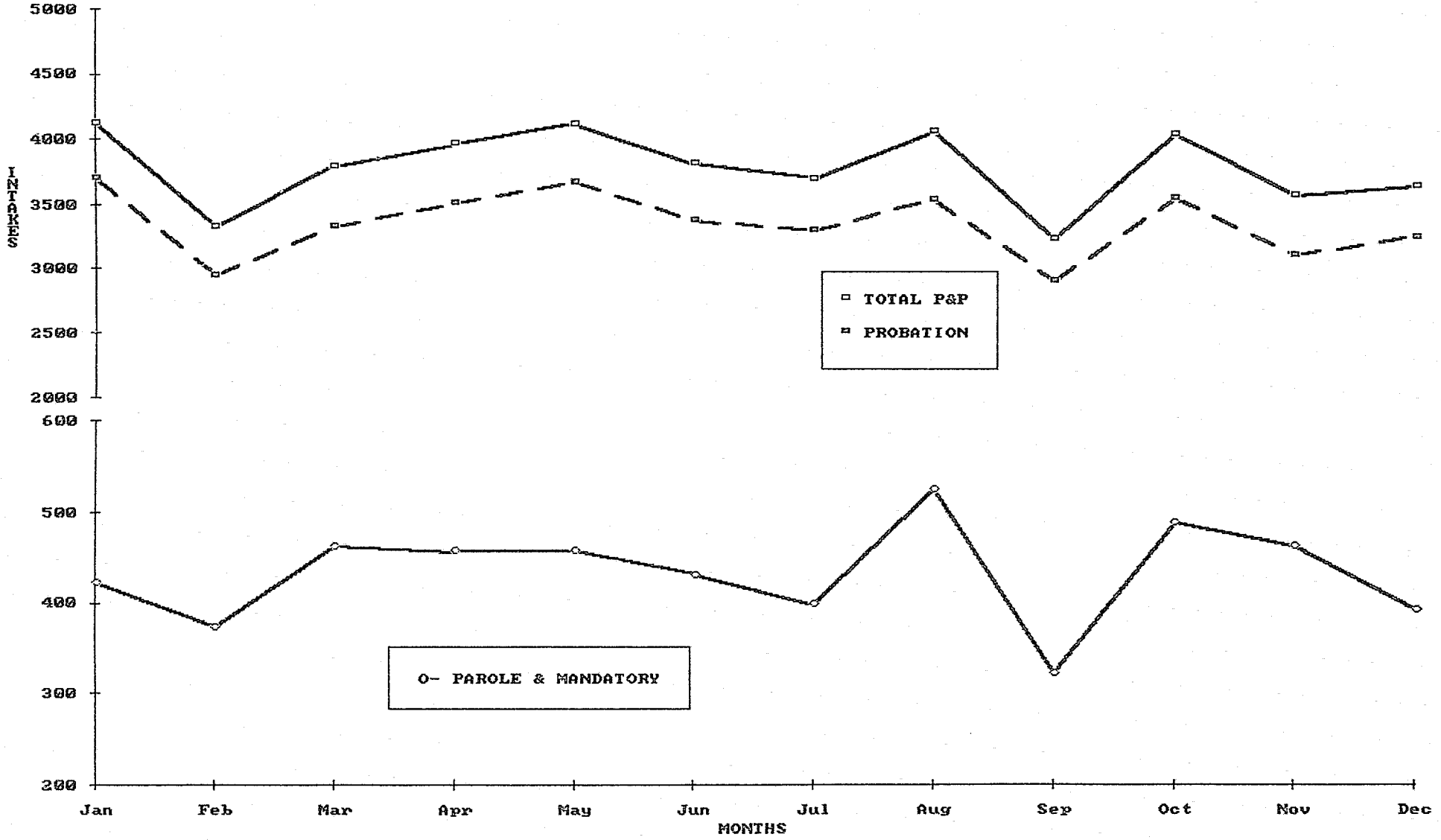
The primary factor contributing to the increase in Total Cases Administered and the Cases Under Active Supervision during Calendar Year 1986 was the increased probation intake from the circuit courts. The total number of circuit court probation intakes processed during Calendar Year 1986 increased 15.5%, from 14,370 to 16,603. Active circuit court probation cases under supervision increased 13.0%, from 16,590 to 18,739 and the total circuit court probation cases under supervision increased 11.9% from 32,076 to 35,879. Although the gap between total Intakes and Closings continues to narrow, this increase in circuit court case activity has resulted in a return to workload growth patterns that have not been experienced since Calendar Year 1983.

The increase in Cases Being Administered and the simultaneous increase in Cases Under Active Supervision has resulted in a leveling of the percentage of non-active and delinquent cases in the Cases Being Administered category. At the end of Calendar Year 1985, 54.2% of the Cases Being Administered were in an Active status (i.e., not delinquent or non-active). By the end of Calendar Year 1986, 54.4% of the Total Cases Being Administered were under active supervision.

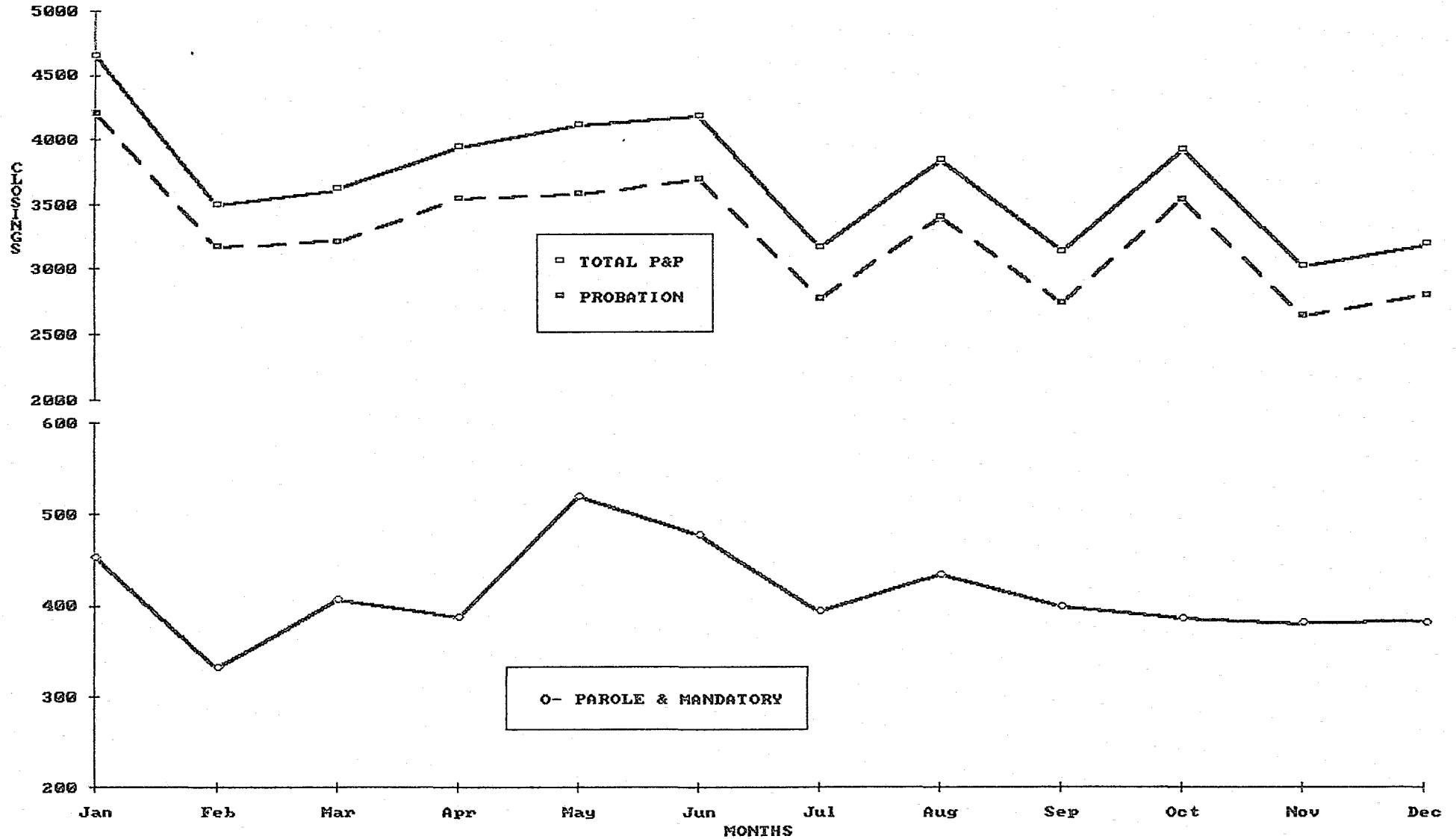
CY86 DIVISION OF PAROLE AND PROBATION INTAKES



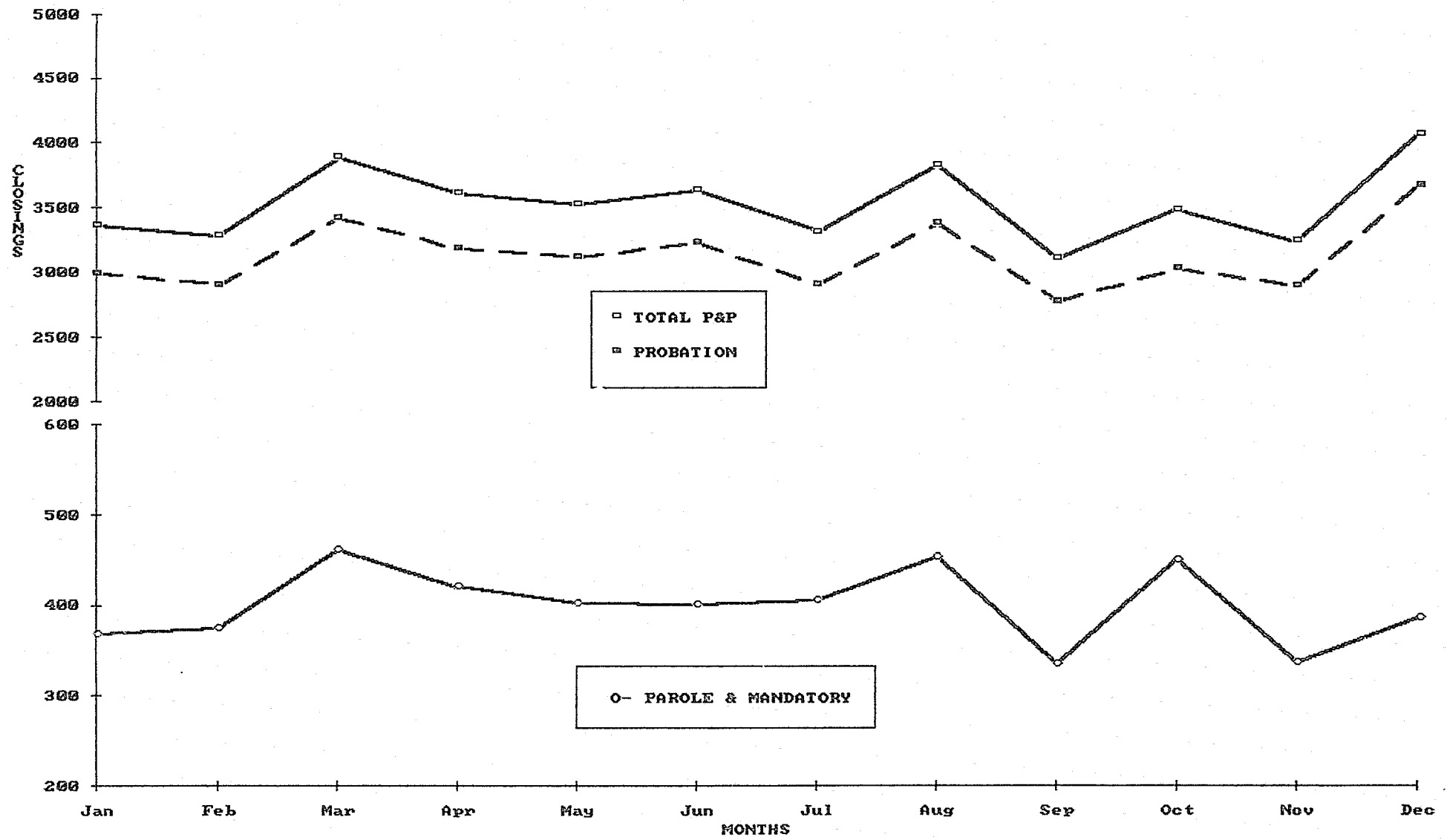
CY85 DIVISION OF PAROLE AND PROBATION INTAKES



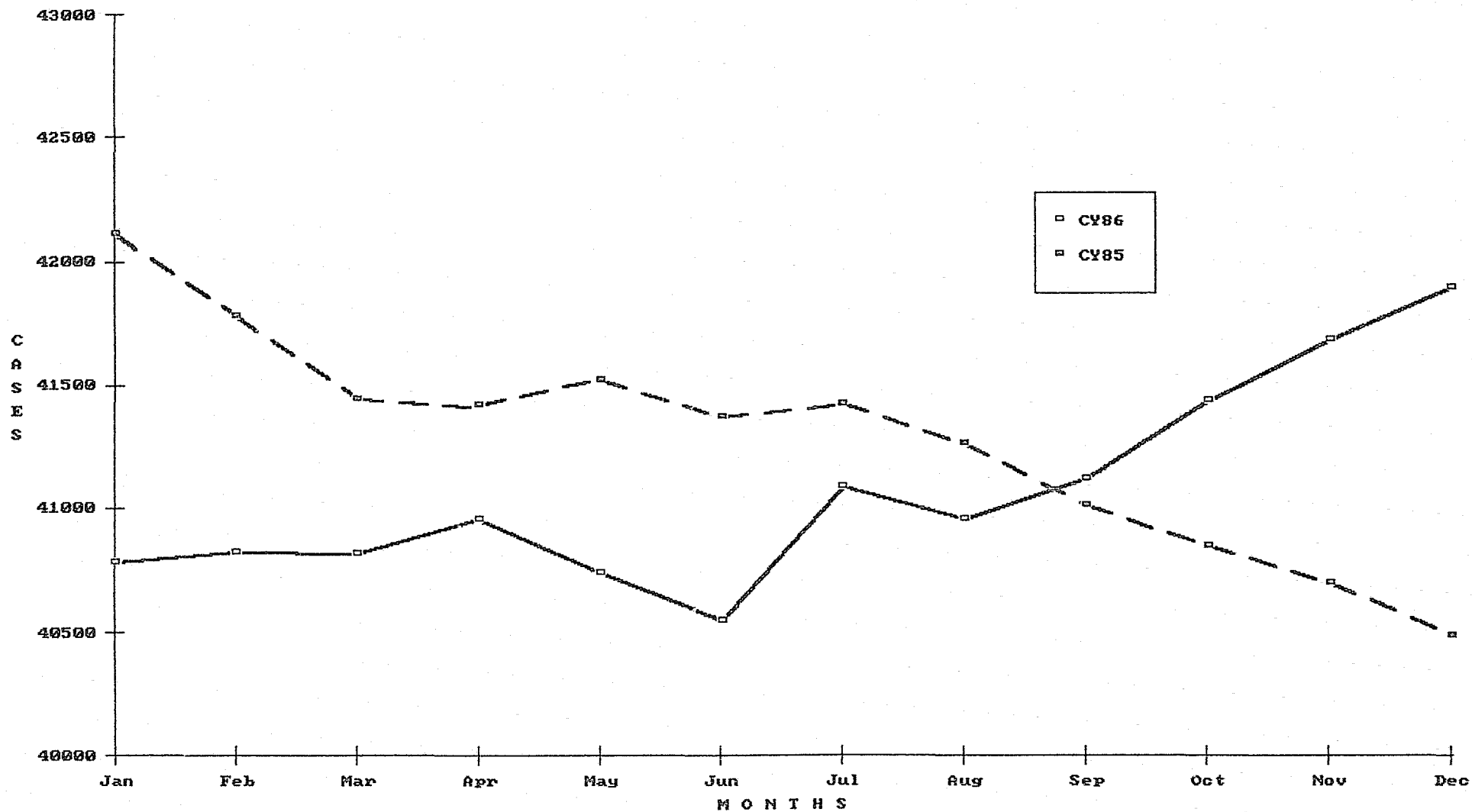
CY86 DIVISION OF PAROLE AND PROBATION CASE CLOSINGS



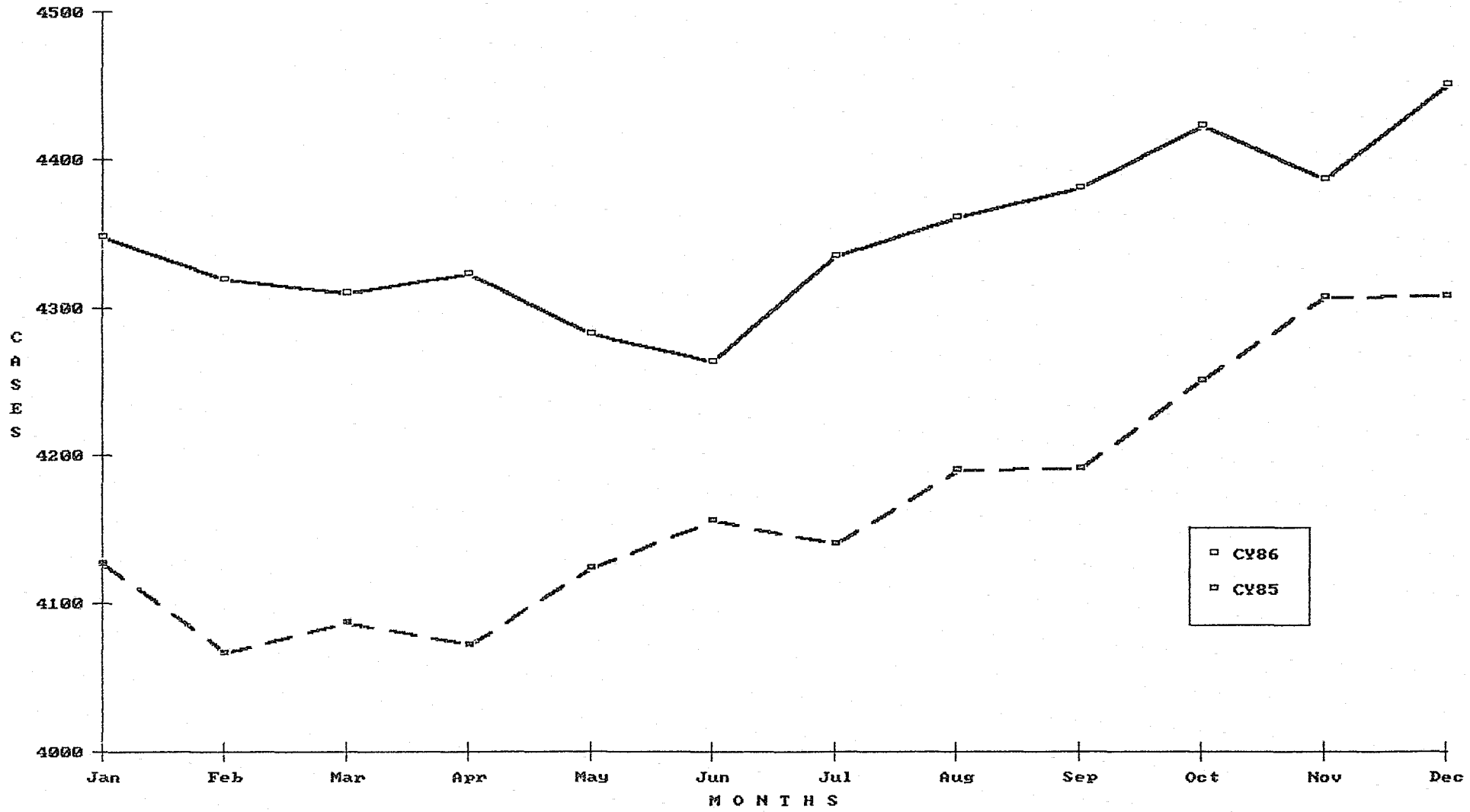
CY85 DIVISION OF PAROLE AND PROBATION CASE CLOSINGS



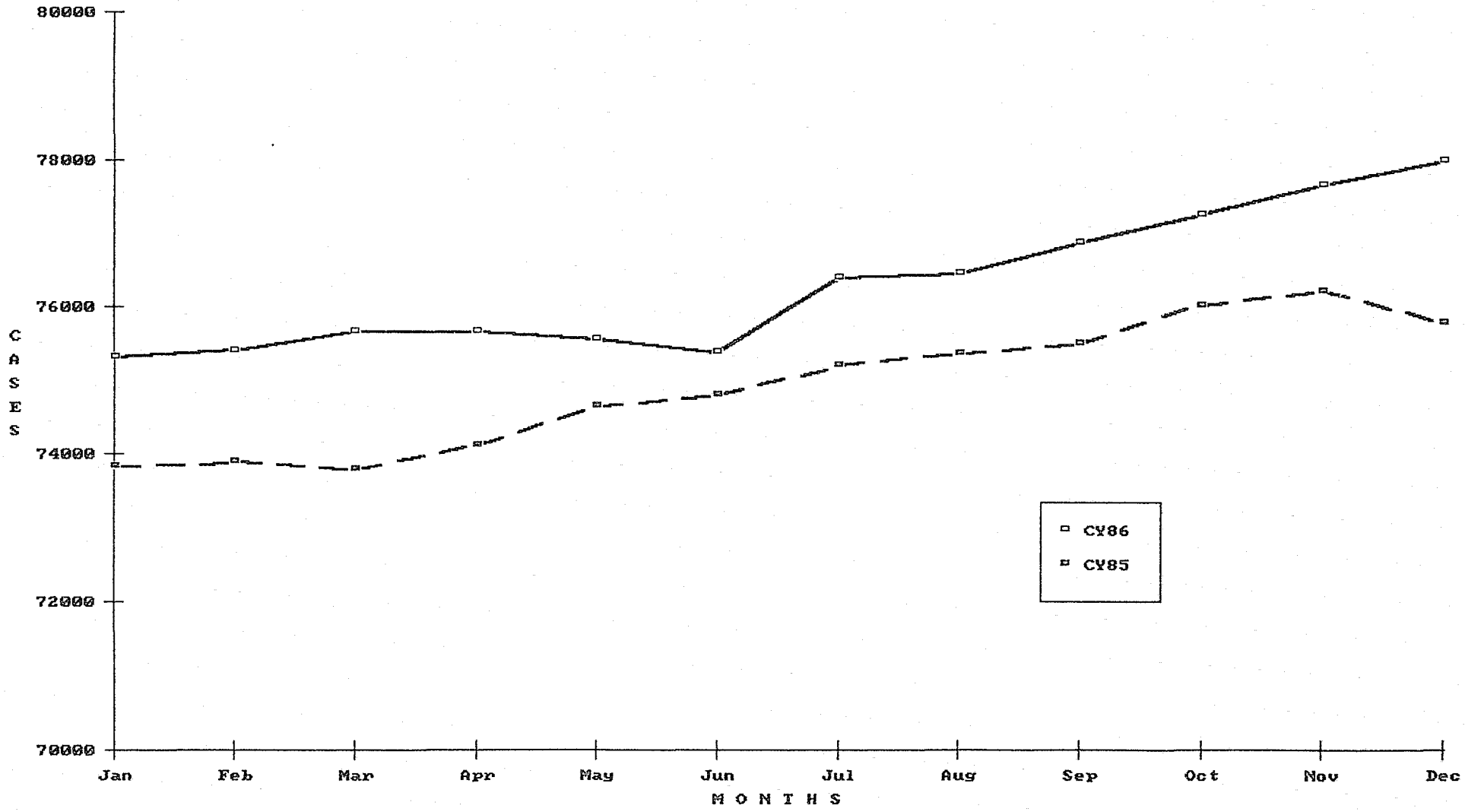
PROBATION, COMPACT PROBATION AND LIVE-IN CASES

(CALENDAR YEARS 1985 AND 1986)



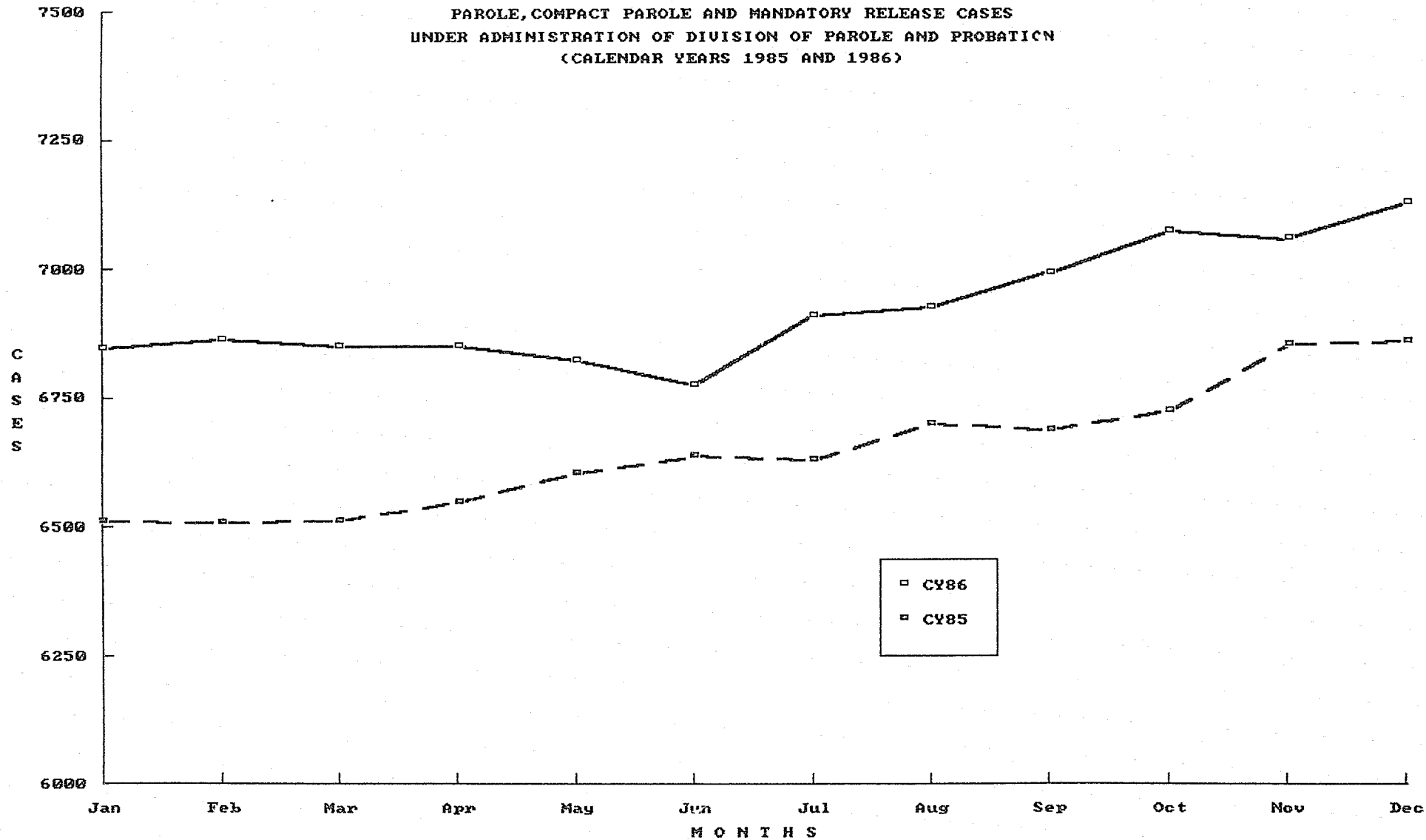
PAROLE, COMPACT PAROLE AND MANDATORY RELEASE CASES

DIVISION OF CORRECTION STATISTICS

Data Sources

The information contained in the Division of Correction section of the Agency Processing Statistics is based upon data from a combination of manual and automated information systems that are summarized at the Office of Research and Statistics. The monthly average total populations (see charts at pages 30, 31 & 33 and table at page 36) are calculated from daily population sheets submitted by the Data Processing Office of the Division of Correction. The daily population sheets are manually compiled at Division Headquarters based on telephone reports from each institution. Intake and Release information (see charts at pages 30, 31, 32, 34, & 35 and tables at pages 37 & 38) is compiled from monthly reports sent to the Office of Research and Statistics by the individual DOC institutions. Average sentence length by jurisdiction and life and death sentence by jurisdiction information (see tables at pages 39, 40, 41 & 42) is based upon information from the male and female reception centers. This information is also received monthly and applies only to new court commitments.

The Inmate Characteristics Report (see tables at pages 43 through 49) is based almost entirely upon data from the Offender Based State Correctional Information System (OBSCIS). The only exception is that manual population data is used in the Sex Distribution table at page 43 to allow comparisons to be made between the actual population and the computerized counts for each institution. All of the remaining characteristic information is extracted from OBSCIS via a computerized data interface software package.

Recent Trends

During CY 1986, the Division's average daily total population increased by 3.1% from 12,451 during January to 12,834 during December. Population data is displayed on charts at pages 30, 31 and 33.

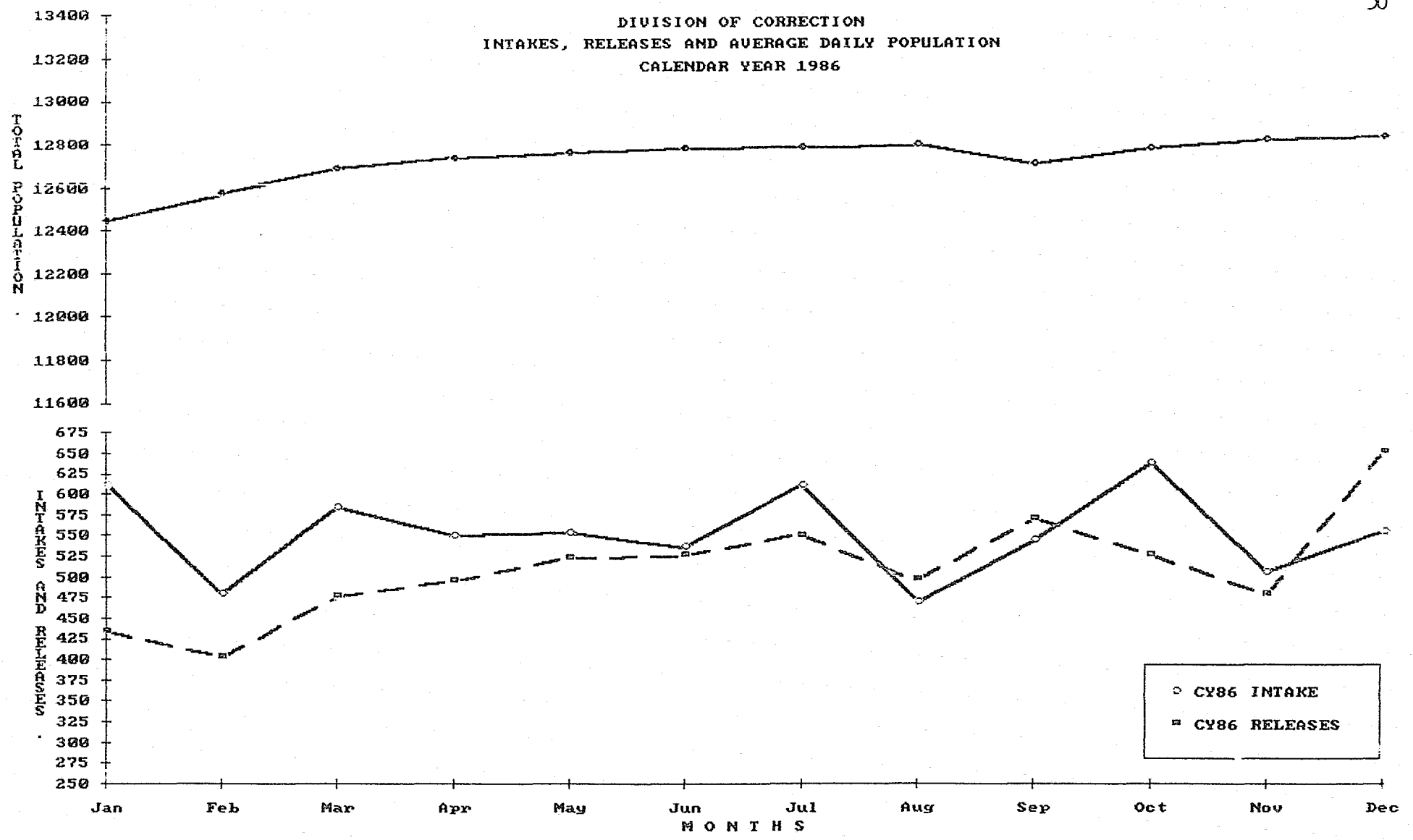
The most significant factor contributing to the growth in population was increasing intakes. Total intakes numbered 6,650 or 554 per month during CY 1986 compared to 5,859 or 488 per month in CY 1985. Total releases increased from 5,861 or 488 per month in CY 1985 to 6,140 or 512 per month in CY 1986. Total intakes increased 13.5% between calendar years while total releases increased by only 4.8%. Intake and release information is presented on data tables at pages 37 and 38 and the charts at pages 30, 31 and 33.

Escapes, presented on the data tables at pages 37 and 38 and the chart on page 35, have increased by 9.1% from 88 in CY 1985 to 96 in CY 1986. Expiration/mandatory releases have increased by 11.1% from 2,936 in CY 1985 to 3,263 in CY 1986. Parole releases during this same period have decreased slightly from 1,744 to 1,701 (see data tables at pages 37 and 38 and the chart at page 34).

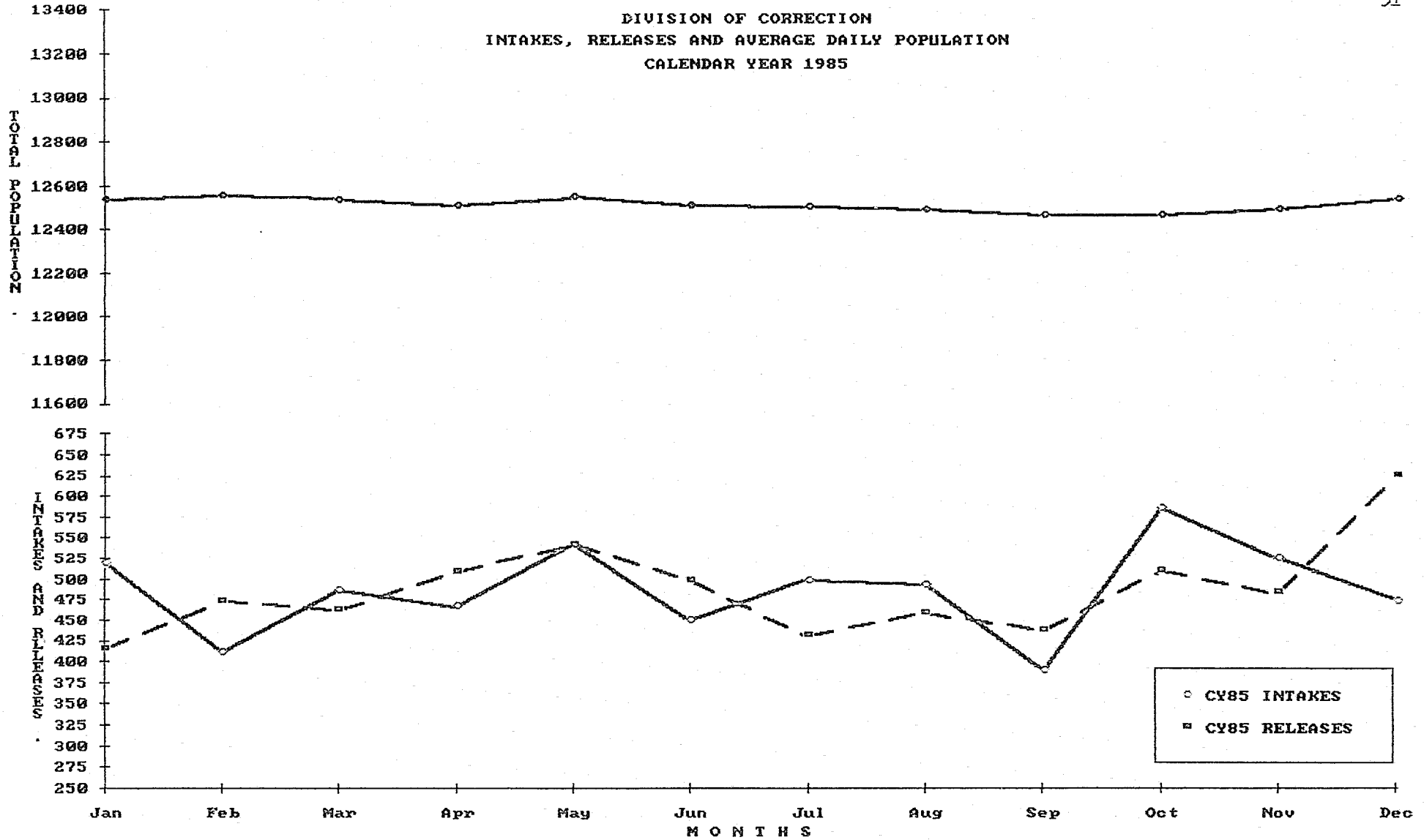
The average length of sentence for new court commitments (see tables at pages 39 and 41) has remained nearly unchanged, decreasing from 54.0 months in CY 1985 to 53.7 months in CY 1986. Life sentences to the Division have increased from 59 in CY 1985 to 82 in CY 1986.

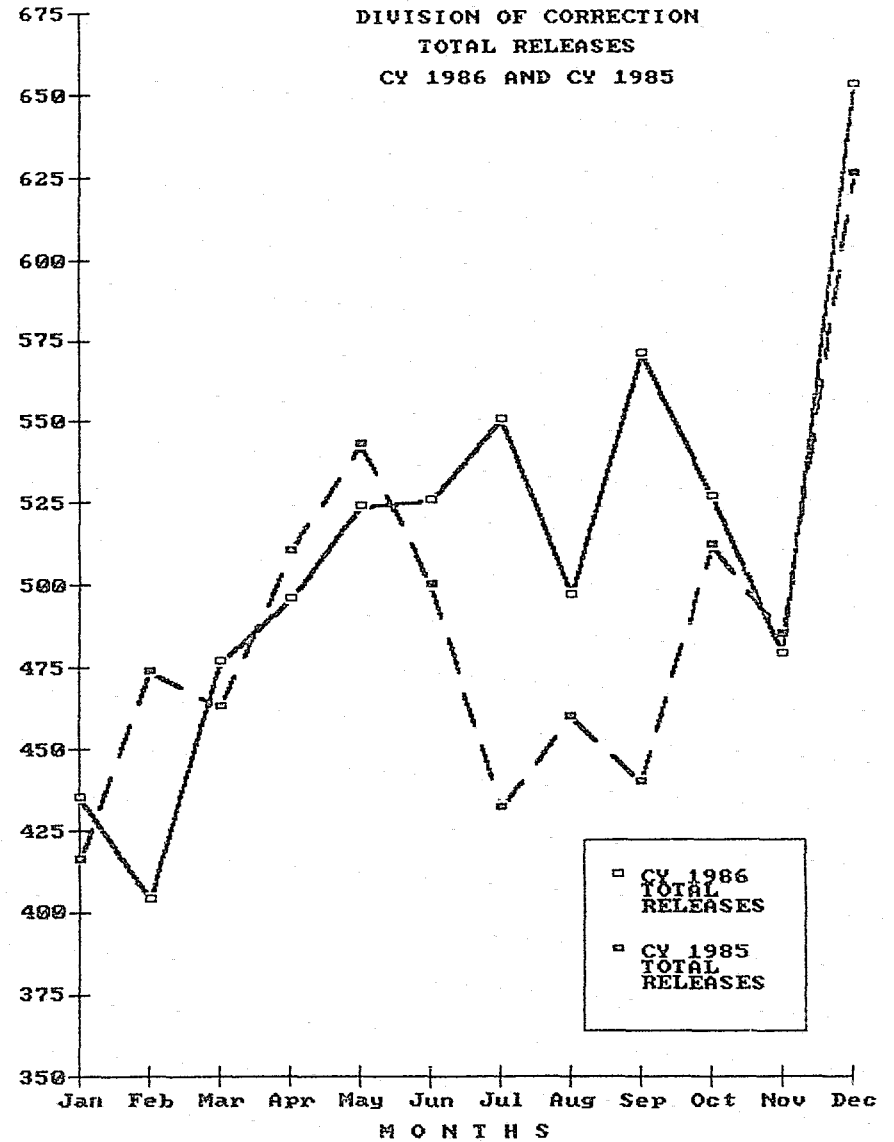
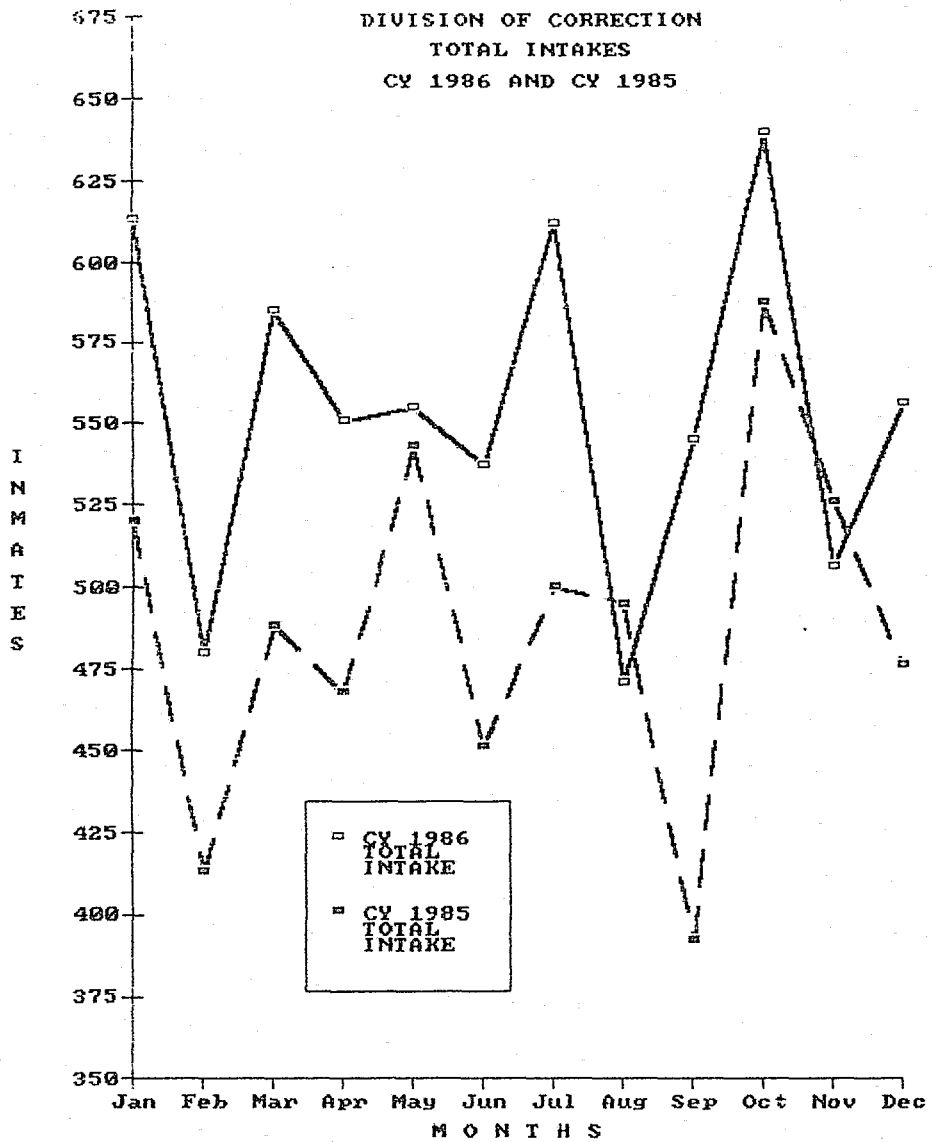

CALENDAR YEAR 1986

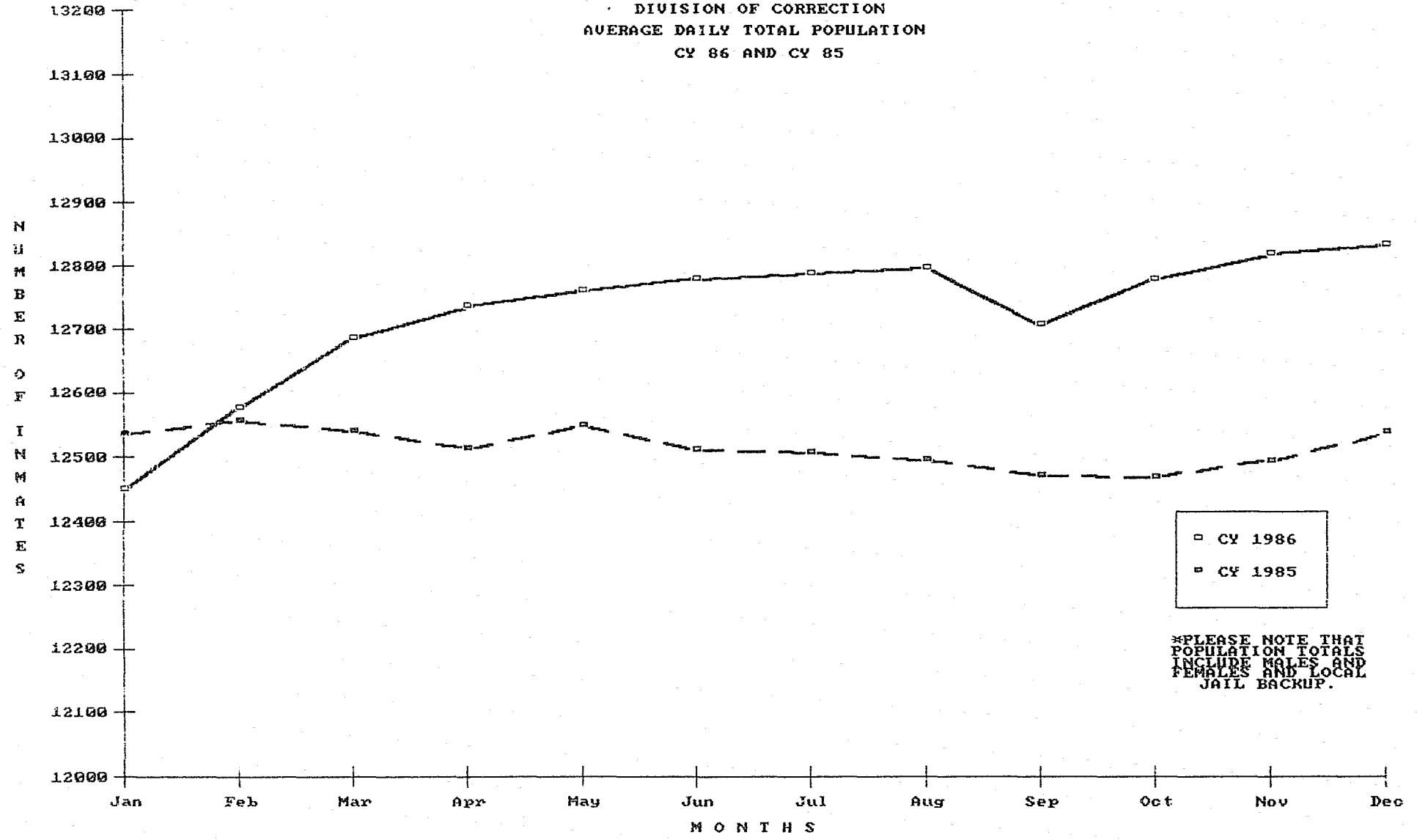


DIVISION OF CORRECTION

CALENDAR YEAR 1985



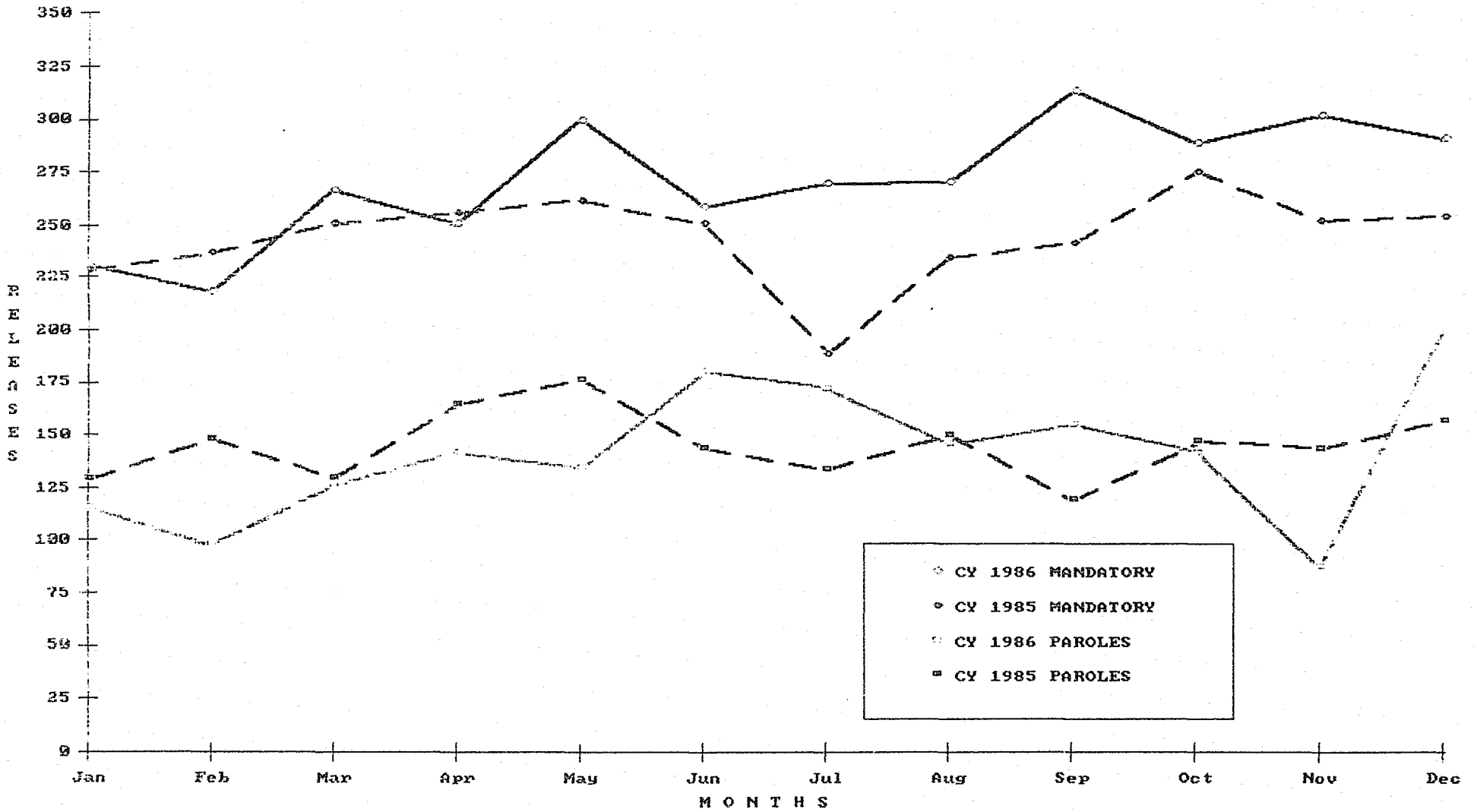


DIVISION OF CORRECTION

CY 86 AND CY 85

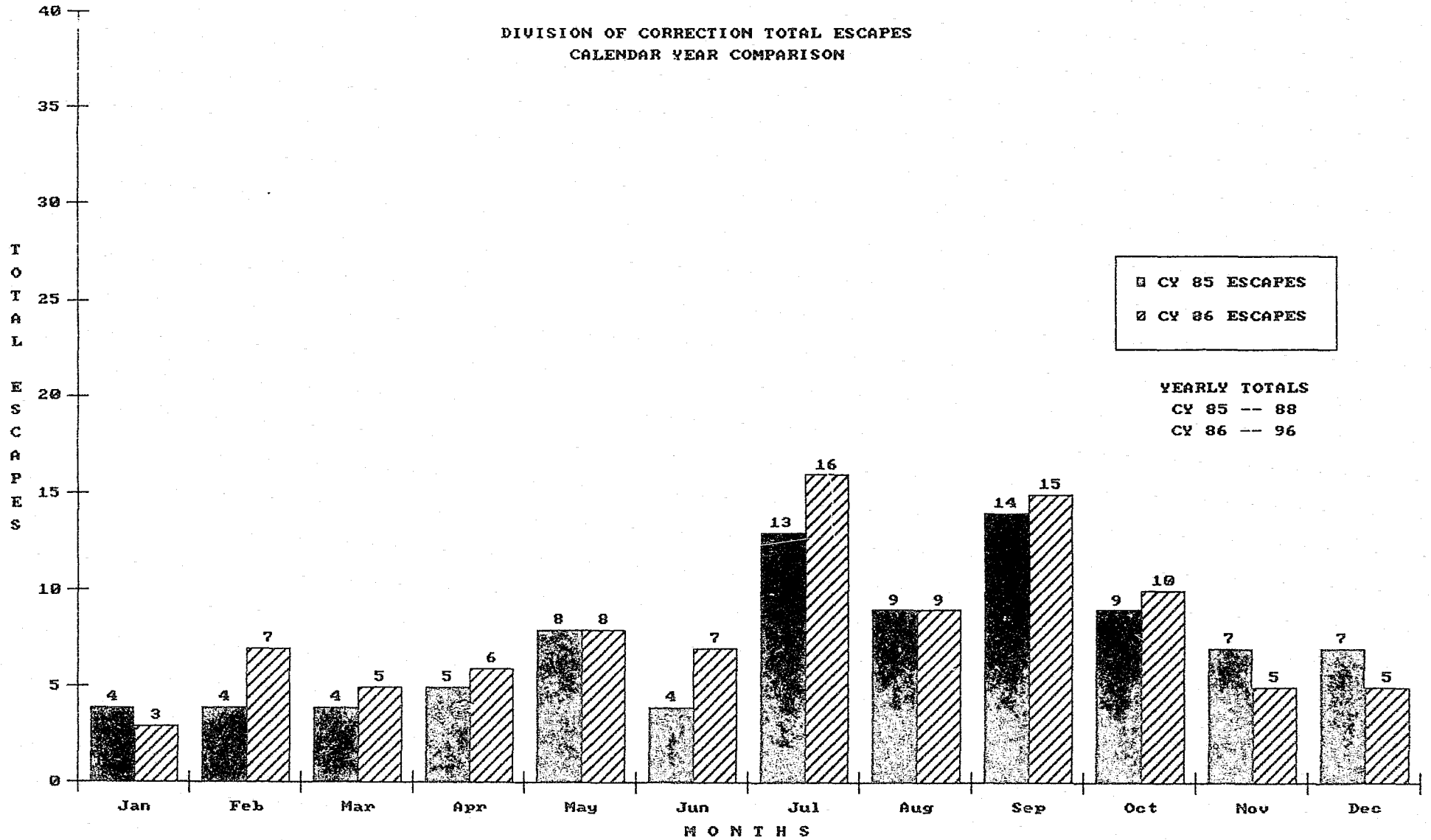

PATUXENT INSTITUTION

Data Sources

The information contained in the Patuxent Institution section is based upon data from a combination of manual and automated information systems that are summarized by the Office of Research and Statistics. The data on Average Monthly Population, Institutional Activity, and Discharges is manually compiled by the Patuxent Office of Research and Evaluation based upon internal institution reports (see tables at pages 51 and 52). The Inmates Characteristics Report (see tables at pages 43 thru 49 of this publication) is based almost entirely upon data from the Offender Based State Correctional Information System (OBSCIS I). The only exception is that the manual population data is used in the Sex Distribution table, at page 43 of this publication, to allow comparisons to be made between the actual population and the computerized count for Patuxent.

Recent Trends

During CY 1986, the Patuxent Institution average monthly total population increased to 607; a 1.7% increase from the corresponding CY 1985 average (CY 1986 - 607; CY 1985 - 597). The average for the population of resident eligible persons decreased slightly less than 1.7% over the corresponding average for the prior calendar year (CY 1986 - 464; CY 1985 - 472). The total number of Patuxent inmates under parole supervision in the community ranged from 85 to 102 during this calendar year with an average of 93 for the period. In CY 1986 the average for Patuxent parolees under supervision in the community increased by 19.2% over the corresponding average for prior calendar year (CY 1986 - 93; CY 1985 - 78). The DOC Housed Inmates category, which represents those DOC inmates who are temporarily housed at Patuxent but are not currently under evaluation for admission to Patuxent's program, decreased from an average of 95 during CY 1985 to an average of 85 during CY 1986 (see Section I of tables at pages 51 and 52).

The total intake to Patuxent Institution during CY 1986 has increased by 12.1% to 380 as compared to 339 in CY 1985. Discharges* during this period grew from a total of 348 in CY 1985 to 362 in CY 1986 or an increase of 4.0%. No escapes occurred during either CY 1985 or CY 1986 (see Section IV of the tables at pages 51 and 52.) The Inmate Characteristics of the Patuxent population as of the end of CY 1986 were relatively unchanged from the end of CY 1985. (See tables at pages 43 thru 49).

*It should be noted that the discharge data is limited to the residential population and does not include release of inmates to the community after parole to the halfway house.
