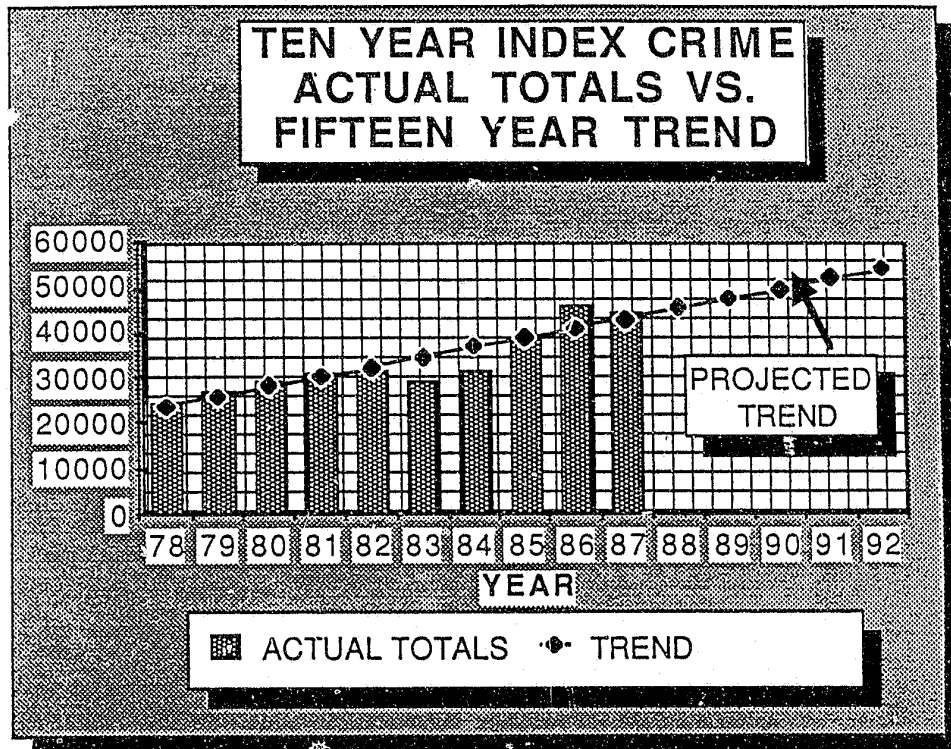

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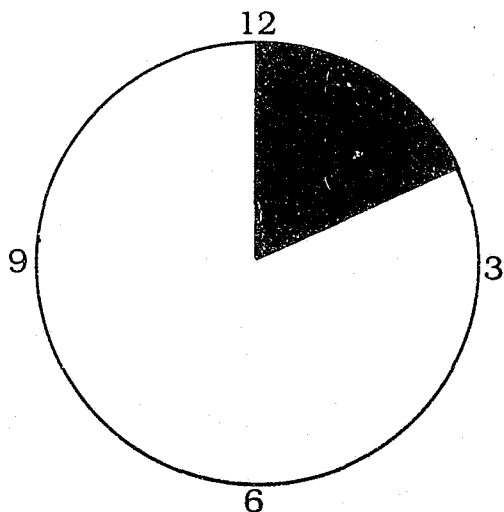

INTRODUCTION

Although the basic mission of any police department remains constant through time, achievement of this mission is dependent on the flexibility and adaptability of the department to meet changing demands caused by economical, environmental, and social issues. The Austin Police Department is committed to providing a high standard of service to protect life and property. With the increasing populace and the economic climate of 1987, the Department was challenged to new heights of innovation and flexibility to meet that commitment.

Ever mindful of citizens' expectations, the Department expanded its horizons by seeking new approaches to meet both present and future demands. Cooperative efforts with local government, business, and service organizations provided new programs to strengthen our service goals. Grant funds fortified our detection, deterrence and apprehension objectives. Working with other law enforcement agencies, we were able to coalesce efforts to impact crime and promote individual efficiency on a multiple county basis.

Internal examinations of the Department were performed to increase the efficiency and effectiveness of our operations. Our policies and procedures were measured against national standards both in the accreditation process and the IACP review. Fifty-four per cent of IACP recommendations were implemented. General Orders were revised and reissued to update our written policies; Standard Operating Procedures were written at the Division level providing in-depth analysis of our operations. An independent City audit initiated further changes in operations. All these methods were employed to assure the citizens of Austin that our operations were productive, effective, and cost efficient.

The previous analysis provides a broad generalization of activities of the Austin Police Department in 1987. The following statistical report provides specific, detailed information concerning our activities. The report serves two purposes. The statistical information is used as a measuring device to acknowledge accomplishments of 1987 and as a forecasting tool to determine the direction our operations and personnel must take to continue in our efforts of crime prevention and reduction.

Unless otherwise denoted, the data published in this report was provided by the individual Sections and Divisions. This data will not always correspond to the Uniform Crime Report (UCR) because of different reporting criteria. The UCR classifies incidents by the one, most serious type of crime per incident. In actual practice, two or more crimes may be involved in one offense report and more than one Section involved in the investigation. Joint investigations with outside agencies account for another difference between the two. Any discrepancy between internal reports and the UCR should not automatically infer error in one or the other. The UCR is not an all-inclusive report of police operations. Different methods of data collection and classification are necessary to satisfy UCR guidelines and departmental requirements.

"Total Indexed Crime by Sector/District" was provided by Crime Analysis using a manual tabulation of PIN (Police Information Network) data. All other charts and tables were tabulated by Research and Planning using computer generated reports, UCR information, and 4th Quarter population estimates from Planning and Growth Management. In-house computer generated reports may have an error factor of 1% (plus or minus) when compared to UCR data.

This report, in some areas, details crime by geographic area. Other factors relating to crime occurrence are not weighed into the analysis. Knowledge of these crime factors is necessary to reach viable conclusions regarding probability and trend analysis. Some of these crime factors include: composition of population, population density, residential versus business inhabitants, economic status, cultural conditions, crime reporting practices, citizen attitudes, and administrative and investigative emphasis of law enforcement. It is important to remember that statistics are numerical data applied to situations; other aspects, both tangible

and intangible, must be applied for complete and accurate interpretation.

The progressive approach we have undertaken is reflected in the scope and quality of service provided by the Austin Police Department. We will continue to build on the accomplishments detailed in this report to provide the level of service and protection expected and deserved by the citizens of Austin.

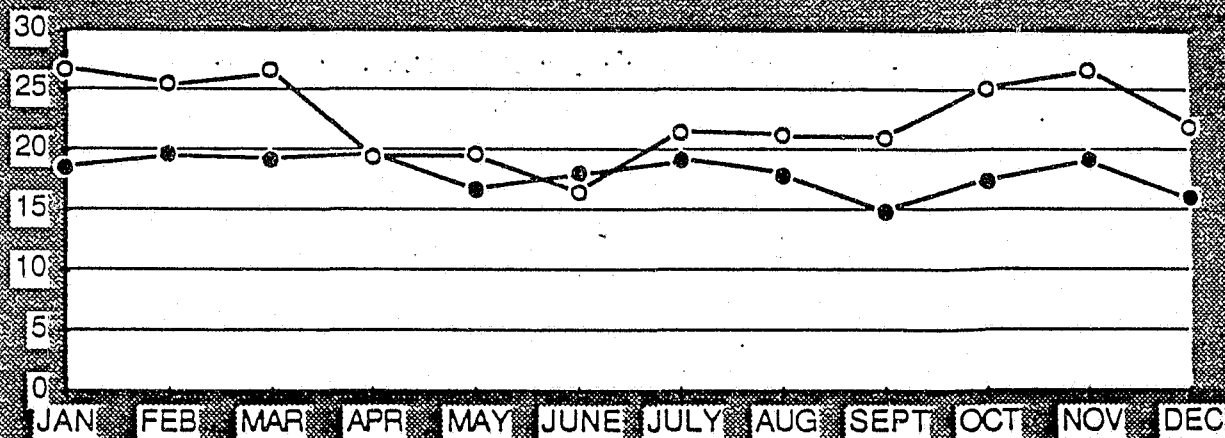

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT INDEX 1986 - 1987

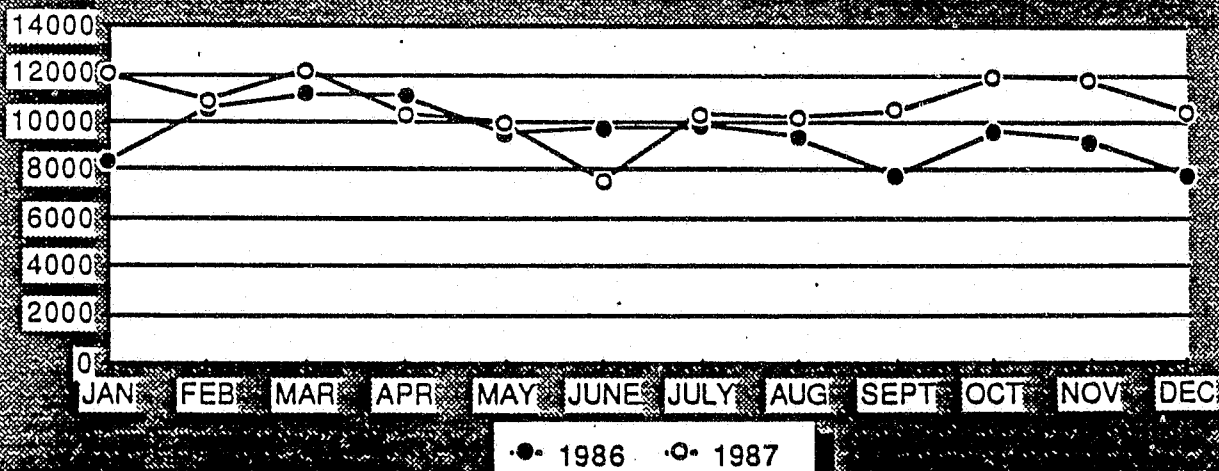

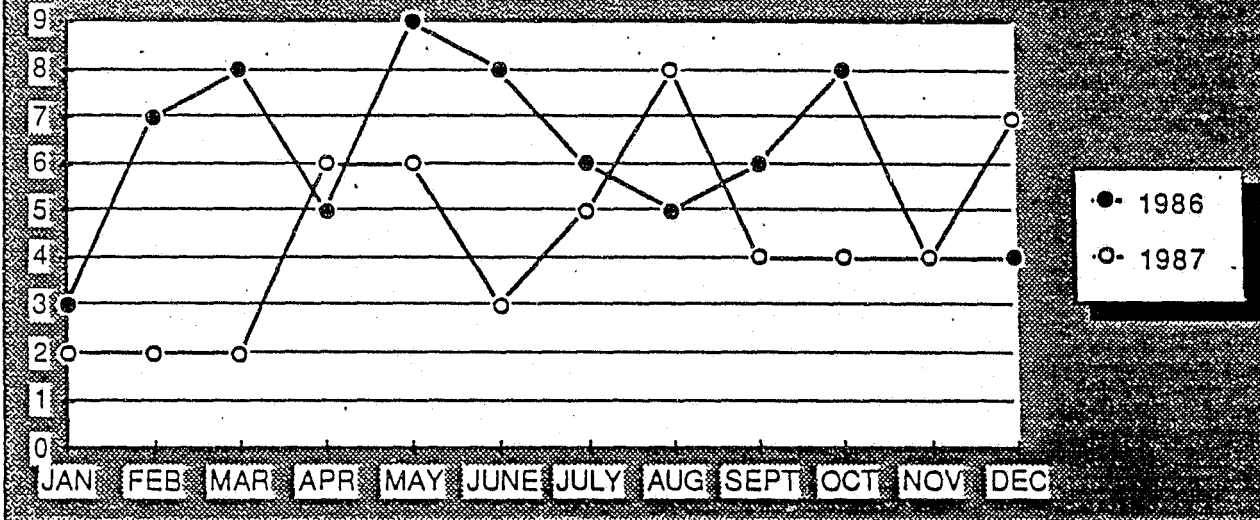

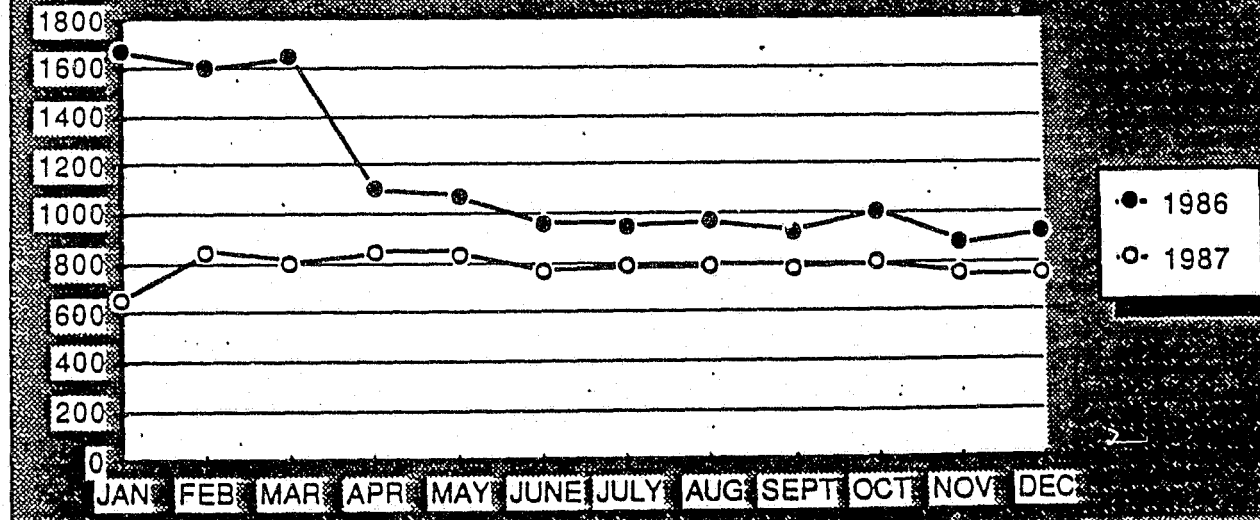
TOTAL HAZARDOUS INFRACTIONS 1986 - 1987



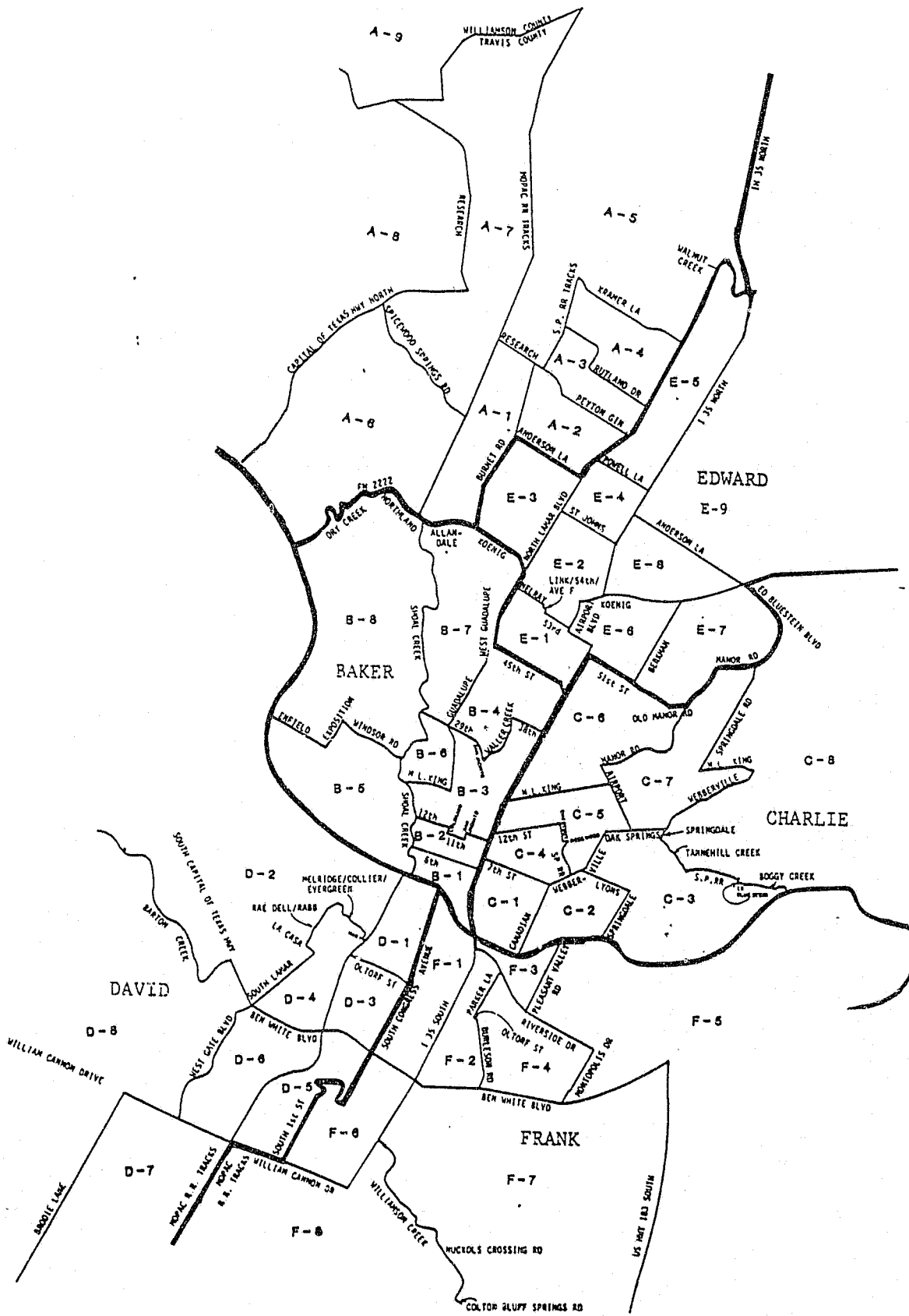
FATALITY ACCIDENTS 1986 - 1987

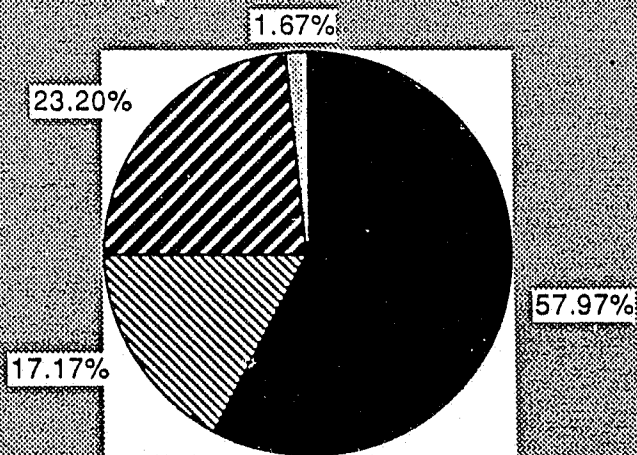

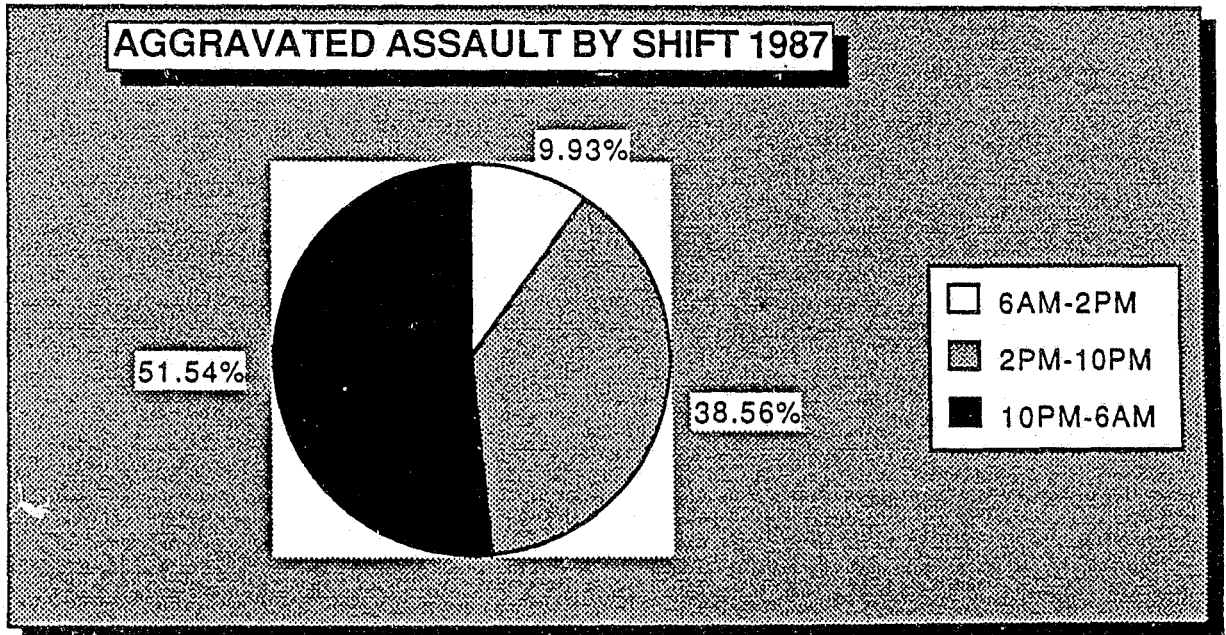


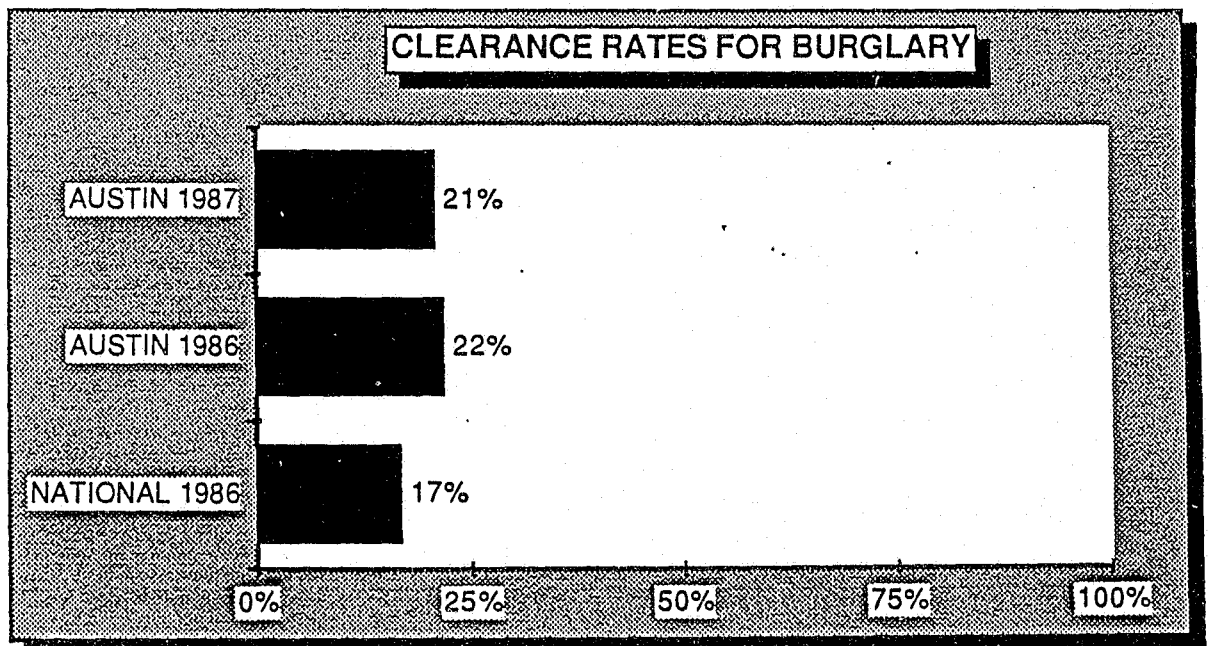
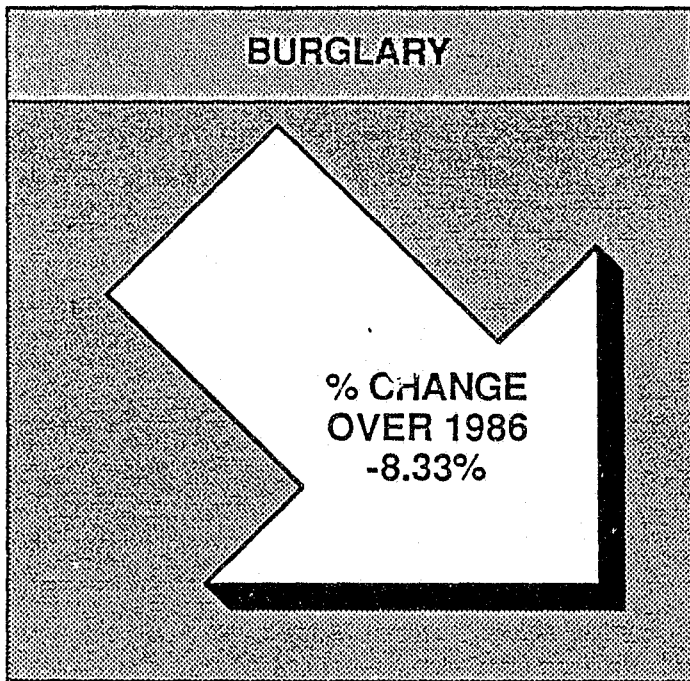


AGGRAVATED ASSAULTS BY SECTOR 1987

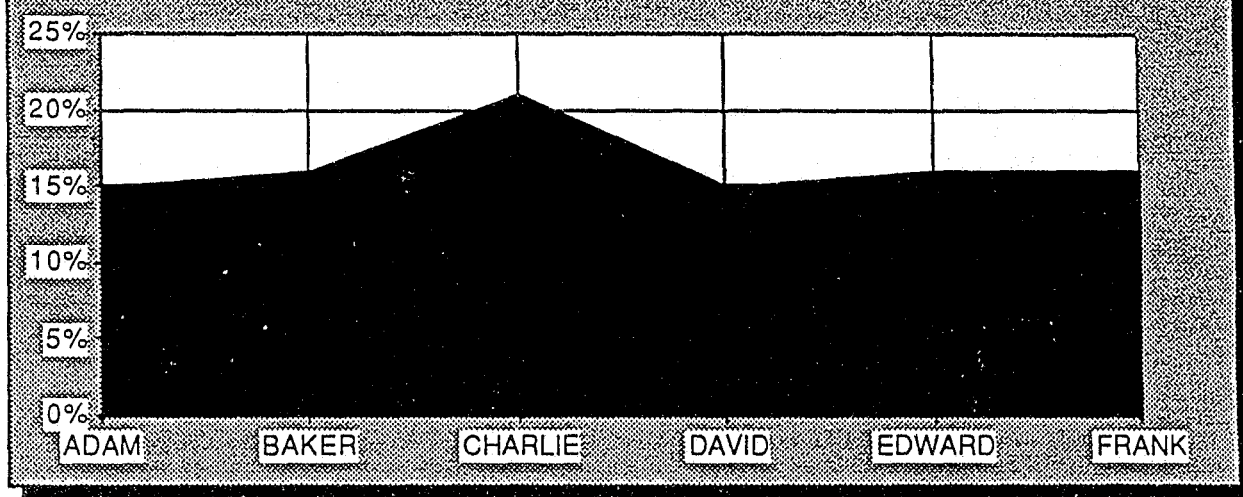

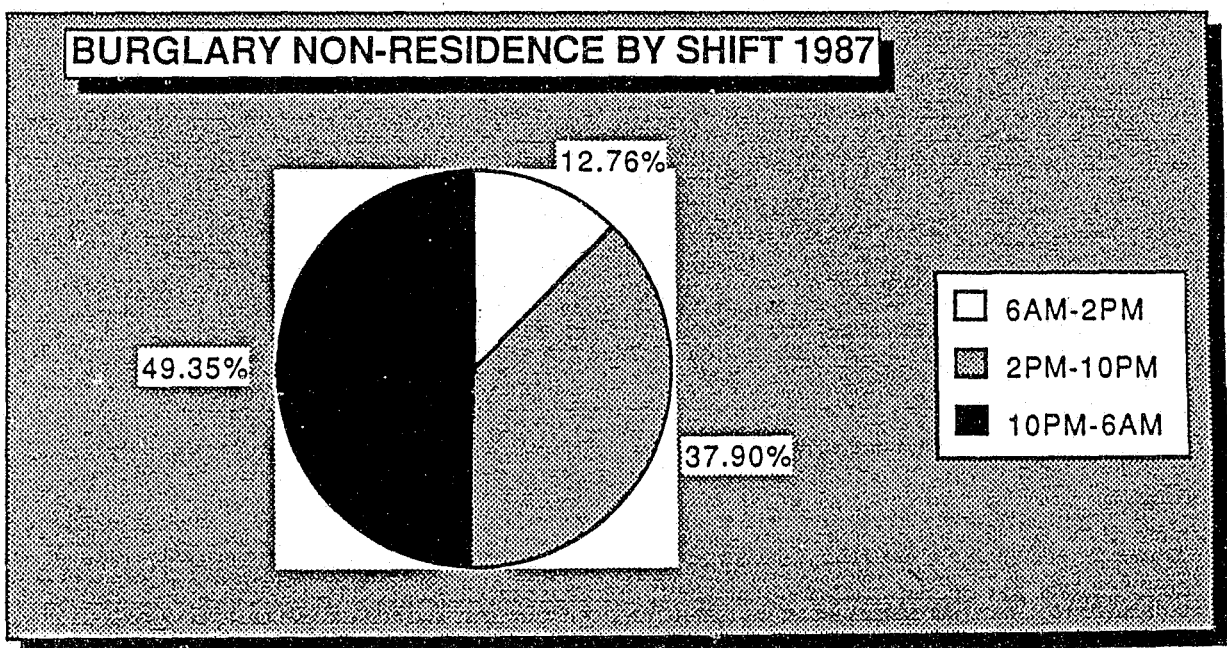




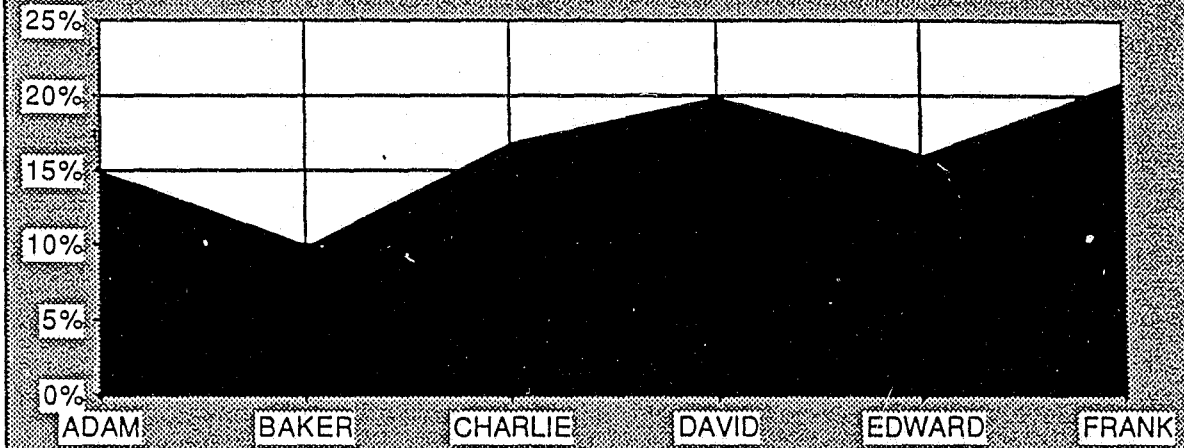
**BURGLARIES NON-RESIDENCE
BY SECTOR 1987**



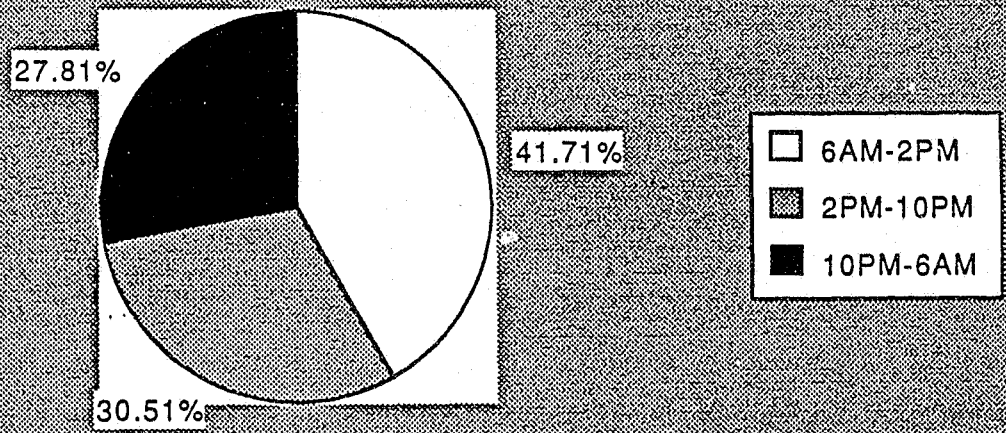
