

With Five-Year Trends for 1981-1985


The Division of Corrections, on December 31, 1985, was responsible for a total of 5,241 institutionalized adult offenders, 5,001 males and 240 females; an increase of 8.2 percent over the previous year when 4,845 offenders were reported to be in residence. It should be noted that these figures include 300 residents (5.7 percent) housed under contractual agreements in correctional facilities operated by the State of Minnesota and the Federal Bureau of Prisons as well as in the Milwaukee County House of Corrections and the Dane County Ferris Center. The Wisconsin Resource Center, operated by the Division of Care and Treatment Facilities, housed a small portion (3.8 percent) of the resident population. The locations and the security level of the various facilities operated by the Division of Corrections can be found by consulting the map and key which precede this text.

Table 1, Admission Status, indicates that 9 out of 10 persons (99.6 percent) of those in residence on December 31, 1985, were classified as serving sentences handed down by the state's courts; i.e., new adult sentences, returns from adult parole with new sentence, returns from mandatory release without new sentence, etc. The remaining 20 residents, all males, were institutionalized to await the outcome of parole, mandatory release, or special action early release revocation hearings (8 cases), had voluntarily returned to the institution from mandatory release supervision (1 case), or were serving alternative to revocation contracts (11 cases). These 20 males have been excluded from the descriptive data (offense, length of sentence, race and ethnicity, etc.) presented in Tables 2 through 15 as well as from the remainder of the text. Maps A and B provide a geographical description of the population by county of commitment while trend data for the years 1981-1985 can be found in Tables A and B.

The number of males in residence on December 31 continued to rise, reaching a five-year high of 5,001 on December 31, 1985; an increase of 8.0 percent over the previous year when 4,632 males were reported to be in confinement. About four-fifths (81.2 percent) of the males in residence on December 31, 1985, as in past years, were classified as new admissions. This category includes males who received new sentences from the courts, probation violators institutionalized with or without new sentences, and juvenile aftercare violators who received new sentences as adult offenders. Just under two-fifths (39.1 percent) of the males in residence on December 31, 1985, had been committed by courts in Milwaukee County while commitments from Kenosha (345 cases), Racine (323 cases), Dane (304 cases), and Rock (224 cases) counties accounted for roughly one-fourth (24.0 percent) of the population. Further information about the geographic origins of the resident population can be found in Table 6 and Map A.

Residents reported to be from non-White backgrounds made up approximately two-fifths (41.1 percent) of the resident population; a proportion that has remained fairly constant since December, 1981. Less than one-tenth (5.9 percent) of the population on December 31, 1985, were reported to be from Hispanic ethnic and cultural backgrounds. The average (median) age of males in residence, which stood at a five-year low of 26.5 years in 1982, reached a high of 27.7 years in 1985. A sentence of 6.2 years was reported to be the average (median) for those incarcerated on December 31, 1985.

No involvement in assaultive, sex, or drug offenses was noted for slightly less than two-fifths (37.4 percent) of the males in residence on December 31, 1985; a slight decrease from the previous low of 37.7 percent reported on December 31, 1984. Males serving sentences solely for the commission of drug offenses made up less than one-tenth (5.4 percent) of the resident population. This proportion, although low, does represent a high for the five-year period. The proportion of males sentenced solely for sex offenses continued to be less than one percent of the population. Males regarded only as assaultive offenders made up somewhat less than two-fifths (38.3 percent) of the resident population; a decrease from the five-year high of 39.8 percent reported on December 31, 1984. The proportion of residents categorized as both assaultive and sex offenders reached a low of 13.7 percent on December 31, 1983, began to increase, and stood at 17.2 percent on December 31, 1985. This proportion, however, remains lower than the 18.3 and 20.3 percent recorded in 1981 and 1982 respectively.

December 31, 1985



Two hundred and forty females were resident in correctional facilities for adult offenders on December 31, 1985; an increase of 12.7 percent over the 213 reported the previous year and a high for the period 1981-1985. The largest increase during the five-year period was 18.0 percent between 1981-1982; the smallest, 4.9 percent between 1983-1984. The majority (94.6 percent) of the females in residence on December 31, 1985, were in facilities operated by the Division of Corrections; i.e., the Taycheedah Correctional Institution (85.0 percent) and the Women's Correctional Center (9.6 percent). Dane County's Ferris Center provided housing and supervision under contractual agreements for the remaining 5.4 percent of the resident population.

First admissions, including females who entered the institution with new sentences or were incarcerated as probation violators with or without new sentences, continued to make up the greater part (93.5 percent) of the resident population. Three-fourths (74.6 percent) of the females in residence on December 31, 1985, were committed to the institution from 12 counties all of which are located in the southern one-third of the state. Thirty-three out of the state's 72 counties (45.8 percent) were not represented in the resident population. Readers interested in data for specific counties or areas of the state will find such information in Map B and Table 6. An average (median) age of 29.3 years was reported for females in residence on December 31, 1985; a high for the five-year period and an increase of 2.3 years over the low of 27.0 years recorded in 1981. Females from non-White backgrounds made up slightly over one-half (52.4 percent) of those in residence on December 31, 1985; a high for the past five years and an increase of 6.7 percent over the low (45.7 percent) noted on December 31, 1984. The average (median) length of sentence has increased steadily from a low of 3.8 years in 1982 to 5.1 years in 1985.

The proportion of females serving sentences for crimes not classified as assaultive, drug, or sex offenses dropped from a high of slightly more than one-half (51.2 percent) in 1982 to a low of just over two-fifths (43.8 percent) in 1985. Females confined solely because of drug offenses made up less than one-tenth of the resident population throughout the years 1981-1985. Residents serving sentences for assaultive offenses, either singly or in combination with sex or drug offenses, made up just under one-half (48.3 percent) of the population on December 31, 1985. It should be noted that this proportion has increased each year since the low of 42.8 percent noted on December 31, 1983.
