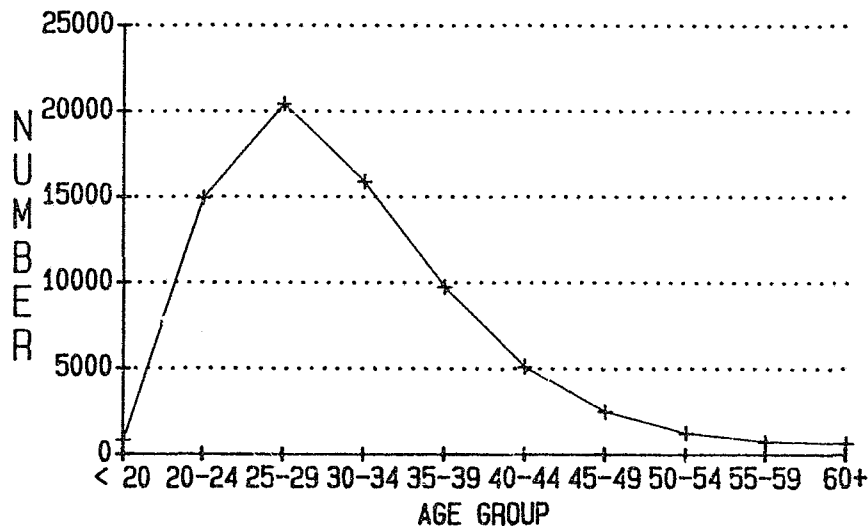
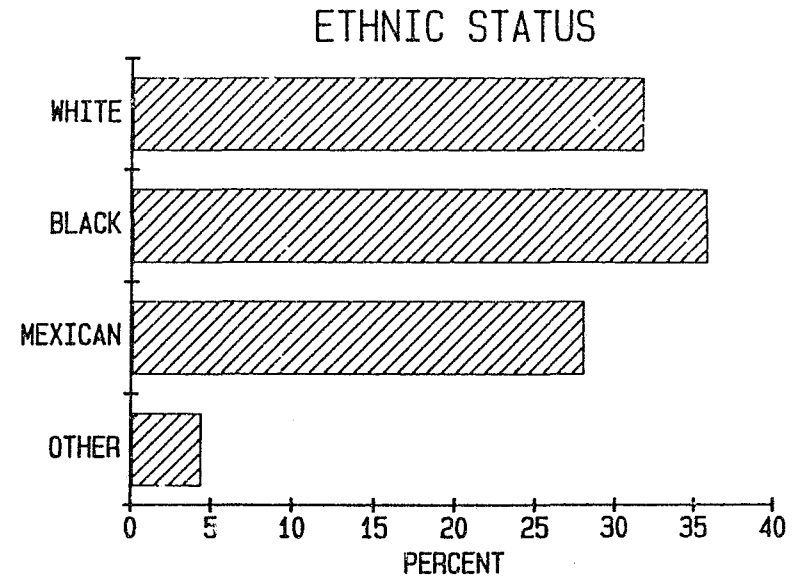
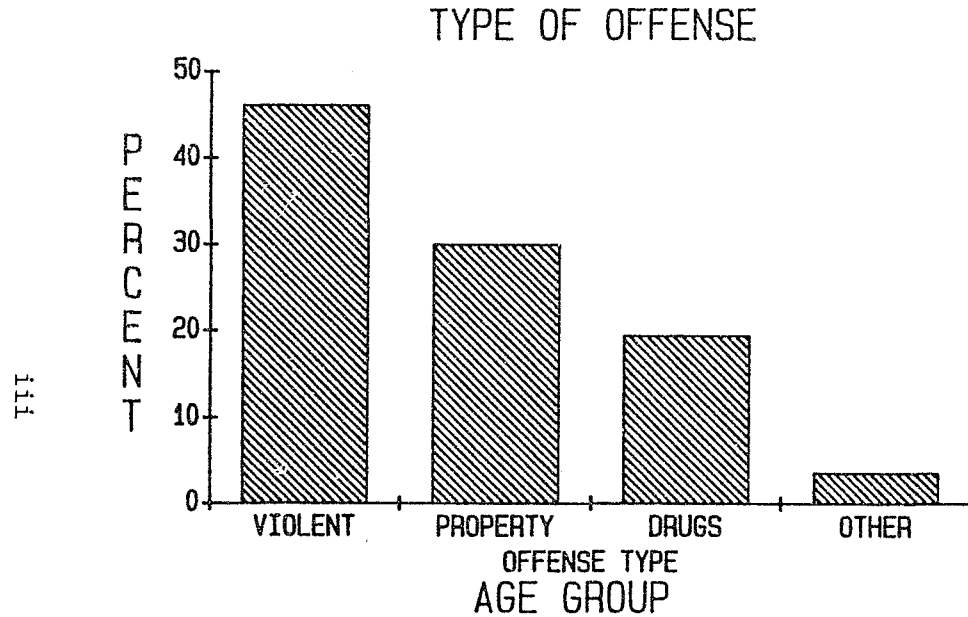

AREA OF COMMITMENT

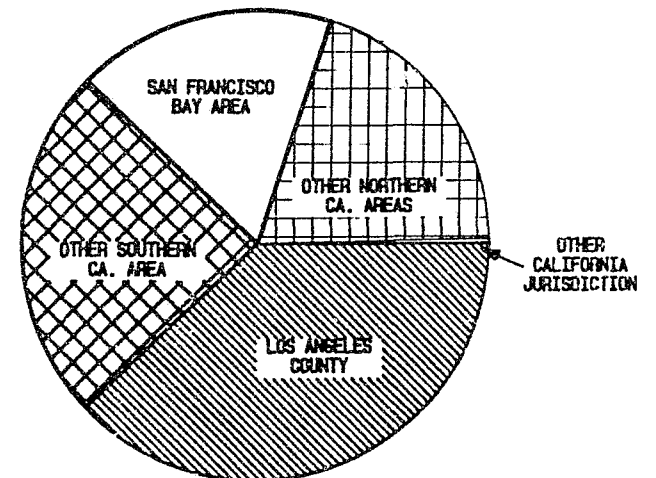
