# FEDERAL JUDICIAL WORKLOAD STATISTICS

December 1987

This report contains a summary of the business of the courts for the twelve month period ended December 31, 1987. Unless stated otherwise, all references to year in this report apply to the twelve month period ended December 31.

## U. S. COURTS OF APPEALS

During 1987, filings and terminations reached record levels in the twelve regional courts of appeals. Total annual filings rose 3 percent to 35,700 appeals, up from 34,753 appeals in 1986. Most of the increase occurred in Federal and state prisoner petitions, jumping by more than 1,100 cases combined. This year, the number of filings was higher in every quarter except the first, with the largest growth as well as number of cases occurring during the April through June period. Table 1 is a summary of appeals filings, by quarter, from 1982 through 1987.

During the year, the number of dispositions increased 4 percent, up from 33,936 appeals in 1986 to 35,276 appeals in 1987. Nearly all of this growth can be attributed to substantial increases in both terminations on the merits after submission on briefs (up 11 percent) and procedural terminations by staff (up 7 percent). For the past two years,

merit dispositions after submission on briefs have grown steadily and each year comprised a larger portion of the overall termination workload in the regional courts. Due to the large number of terminations, the overall pending caseload grew less than 2 percent to 26,894 appeals. This year's increase in cases pending represents the lowest numerical and percentage growth in the regional courts since 1982. Detailed data for the courts of appeals are provided in Appendix Tables B, B-1 and B-5.

The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit docketed 18 percent more appeals during 1987, in contrast to a substantial decline in new filings reported last year. A total of 1,406 filings were reported this year compared to 1,187 filings in 1986. Terminations, on the other hand, dropped 30 percent, down from 1,942 appeals in 1986 to 1,363 appeals this year. Almost all of the decrease was caused by a 45 percent reduction in terminations of appeals from the Merit Systems Protection Board. Because of the increased filings, the pending caseload grew 7 percent to 674 appeals on December 31, 1987. Detailed data for the Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit are provided in Appendix Table A.

## U.S. DISTRICT COURTS

### Civil Workload

Civil activity in the U.S. district courts continued to decline in most areas during 1987. Much of the decline was a result of decreased filings for recovery of overpayments of veterans' benefits (VA cases), asbestos personal injury product liability claims, and marine contract disputes. The aggregate decline in filings for such cases was 27 percent. Detailed data on civil activity in the U.S. district courts are provided in Appendix Tables C, C-1, C-2 and C-3.

During 1987, a total of 233,292 civil cases were filed. This represents a decline of 4 percent from the 243,946 cases filed last year. The largest decrease in civil filings occurred in VA cases, which dropped from 24,516 to 17,122. Asbestos personal injury product liability cases fell from 7,934 to 6,553, and marine contract cases fell from 4,555 to 3,429. There were significant decreases in all other contracts (excluding insurance) and civil rights (excluding prisoner petitions), which fell 2,245 cases and 1,113 cases, respectively. Also, labor suits other than those involving the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA) dropped by 849 cases. The most notable increases in filings were in Social Security disability insurance cases (from 8,542 to 11,275) and prisoner civil rights petitions (from 22,553 to 24,082). Other categories which rose substantially were Social Security supplemental security income (from 2,155 to 2,935) and ERISA (from 5,777 to 6,468).

Filings for the three month period from October through December 1987 totaled 57,387 cases. This figure is down less than 1 percent from the previous quarter and 2

percent from the same period a year ago. Table 2 is a summary of civil cases filed, by quarter, from 1983 through 1987.

As indicated by the substantial drop in VA filings, the number of cases involving the U.S. as a plaintiff declined more than 19 percent in 1987 to 38,728. U.S. defendant actions rose 11 percent to 30,913 because of the increase in Social Security disability and supplemental security income claims. On the other hand, both federal question and diversity actions declined during the year, down 3 percent and 2 percent, respectively. In 1987, federal question actions totaled 97,418 and diversity actions totaled 65,676.

During 1987, civil dispositions dropped 8 percent from 250,758 to 230,543. This decrease in civil terminations was accentuated by reductions in dispositions for VA cases (down 10,440), Social Security disability cases (down 3,196), and defaulted student loan cases (down 1,728). Also, there was a significant decline in marine contract cases, from 5,352 to 4,020. Substantial increases in disposition activity were reported in prisoner civil rights cases (up from 21,895 to 23,486) and asbestos personal injury product liability suits (up from 2,650 to 3,959).

The pending civil caseload increased during the year, up 1 percent from 244,358 to 247,107. Pending asbestos personal injury product liability cases increased more

than any other case type, rising from 17,992 in 1986 to 20,595 in 1987. These actions now comprise more than 8 percent of the pending caseload. Pending Social Security disability cases also increased dramatically from 8,545 to 10,676. There were also large decreases in the pending caseload of several case categories. Pending VA cases declined from 9,393 to 6,853; marine personal injury cases from 5,261 to 4,533; and marine contract cases from 4,158 to 3,567. The number of civil cases pending three years or more increased during 1987, up 3 percent to 21,326.

### Criminal Workload

During 1987, filings, terminations and pending cases (including transfers) in the U. S. district courts increased consistently with trends in previous years. Criminal case filings were up 4 percent to 44,335 from 42,549 in 1986. Case terminations were up 5 percent over last year, from 40,936 to 43,152. On December 31, 1987, the pending caseload had increased nearly 5 percent from 25,271 in 1986 to 26,454. Appendix Table D-1 provides data on the number of cases and defendants commenced, terminated and pending for 1987.

During the six month period ended December 31, 1987, case filings increased 5 percent to 21,842 compared with 20,788 filings for the same period in 1986. Cases closed totaled 20,682, a 3 percent increase over the 20,097 cases closed in 1986. Table 3 provides data on the number of cases filed, terminated and pending for the six month periods beginning January 1983 to December 1987.

During 1987, case filings (excluding transfers) increased in five of the eleven major offense categories and decreased in six categories. Prosecutions for sex of-



fenses increased 35 percent, the largest percentage increase for a major offense category, but the increase in the number of cases was only 123. Case filings under the Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Act (DAPCA) rose by 15 percent this year to 9,635 cases. Within the DAPCA category, prosecutions for marijuana violations increased 33 percent, by 817 cases, and contributed over half the increase in case filings this year. Prosecutions related to narcotic drug violations rose by only 7 percent this year, but still accounted for more than 56 percent of all prosecutions under DAPCA. Under the fraud category, passport fraud violations were up 109 percent or 157 cases, while prosecutions for false claims and statements increased 15 percent, by 202 cases. Drunk driving and traffic violations which dropped 4 percent last year increased 2 percent this year (150 cases). Appendix Table D-2, provides data on filings by major offense category for the twelve month periods beginning January 1983 and ending December 1987.

Filings increased more than 200 cases in three districts: Texas, Western (up 204 cases); Georgia, Middle (up 650 cases); and California, Southern (up 798 cases). In Texas, Western, filings under DAPCA were up 161 cases and prosecutions for fraud and larceny up 30 and 61 cases, respectively. California, Southern also had an increase in DAPCA filings (up 487 cases), more than half of the 798 caseload increase in that district. The increase in filings for traffic violations (up 568 cases) accounted for the majority of the 650 case increase in Georgia, Middle.

Of the 40 districts with a decrease in case filings, 5 districts had a decrease of more than 100 filings: New York, Southern (down 121 cases); California, Central (down 130 cases); Florida, Middle (down 139 cases); Georgia, Northern (down 150 cases); and California, Northern (down 178 cases). The majority of the decrease in California, Northern; California, Central; and New York, Southern were for larceny, embezzlement, and fraud. Georgia, Northern had a 68 percent decrease in traffic cases (down 105 cases), and a 162 percent decrease in escapes (down 21 cases). Appendix Table D-3 provides, by district and offense, data on case filings and defendants for 1987.

### **Grand Juror Service**

During 1987, there were 764 grand juries serving, 18 fewer than a year ago. As a result, the number of grand jury sessions convened declined more than 2 percent from 11,188 in 1986 to 10,903 in 1987. Correspondingly, the number of jurors in session declined 3 percent and the number of hours in session declined 2 percent. The overall decline in grand jury activity was due, in part, to the Department of Justice's recent policy directing its U.S. attorneys to restrict grand jury usage by (1) limiting the number of regular grand juries impaneled; and (2) scheduling a minimum of six hours of business for each session. During 1987, an average of nearly 20 jurors attended each session for slightly more than 5 hours.

Appendix Table J-1 provides, by district, grand juror activity for 1987. New York, Southern continues to record the most activity with 994 sessions convened, 19,412 jurors in session, and 3,926 hours in session. The largest increase in grand jury sessions occurred in the District of Columbia (up 123 sessions) due primarily to a 40 percent increase (up 200 cases) in criminal filings. Together, the five busiest districts in terms of the number of grand jury sessions (New York, Southern; Florida, Southern; New York, Eastern; Massachusetts; and the District of Columbia) accounted for 29 percent of all the grand jury sessions convened during 1987.

The total number of defendants indicted also declined during 1987 (down 1 percent) but at a slower rate than the number of grand jury sessions. As a result, the average number of defendants indicted per grand jury session rose slightly from 3.51 in 1986 to 3.56 in 1987. This is due, in part, to another substantial increase (up 15 percent) in prosecutions under the Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Act.

### Petit Juror Service

While the total number of available jurors rose slightly in 1987 (1 percent) to

726,457, the total number of jury trial days remained virtually the same as last year at 43,677. Civil trial days rose 4 percent to 24,936; however, this increase was offset by a 4 percent decline in criminal trial days. Of the 726,457 available jurors, 346,567 (48 percent) were present for jury selection while the remaining were either returning for service on continuing trials or were in travel status. More than 30 percent of the jurors present for jury selection were actually selected and another 37 percent were challenged. The remaining 32.5 percent were not selected or challenged, a slight improvement (decline) over the 32.8 percent not selected or challenged in 1986. The not selected or challenged category includes those jurors called to cover anticipated challenges which, in fact, were not exercised.

Appendix Table J-2 summarizes, by district, jury selection day activity during 1987. Attention continues to focus on the not selected or challenged category. During 1987, 55 districts improved (reduced) their percentage in this category. The largest improvement was registered by Alabama, Northern. This district improved by nearly 23 percentage points due to fewer last minute cancellations of jury selections and the use of smaller panels of jurors for jury selection. Five other districts improved by more than 10 percentage points.

In an effort to further reduce the number of jurors not selected or challenged, many courts have enacted local rules allowing the assessment of juror costs. During 1987, 41 districts assessed juror costs on at least one occasion. A total of \$134,331 covering the costs of 2,818 jurors were returned to the general revenue funds of the U.S. Treasury.

Alabama, Southern reported the highest percentage of jurors selected (61 percent) due, in large part, to its extensive use of the multiple voir method of selecting jurors. This district selected as many as 12 juries in a single day. In sharp contrast, because of a large number of highly publicized trials and last minute settlements, the District of Columbia reported the lowest percentage of jurors selected with 19 percent.

## U.S. BANKRUPTCY COURTS

There were 574,849 bankruptcy petitions filed in the U.S. bankruptcy courts during 1987, an increase of 44,411 or 8 percent above the 530,438 filed last year. The number of terminations rose to 532,957 compared to 413,763 in 1986. In spite of the 29 percent increase in terminations, the number of pending petitions rose to 819,726, up 5 percent over last year; however, the rate of increase for pending cases declined from the 18 percent reported in 1986. Detailed data by district are provided in Tables F and F2.

Non-business filings rose by 43,647 petitions, an increase of 10 percent above the 449,203 filed in 1986. Business petitions increased slightly to 81,999 (up 1 percent). The largest increase occurred in business Chapter 13 debt adjustments, totaling 12,056, which was 42 percent above the 8,512 filed last year. Chapter 7 liquidations rose 31,975 (up 9 percent) to 406,761 this year. Also, there were 6,078 petitions filed under Chapter 12, which deals with family farmer business bankruptcy debt adjustment. This is the first complete year of data collected under this new chapter.

During the three month period October through December 1987, a total of 144,407 petitions were filed, an increase of 6 percent over the 136,840 filed during the

same period a year ago. This number is a slight increase of 1 percent when compared to petitions commenced during the previous quarter. Table 6 is a summary, by quarter, of bankruptcy petitions filed from 1983 through 1987.

There were 56,637 adversary proceedings commenced this year, down 11 percent from 1986, while dispositions increased to 65,680. As a result, the number of pending adversary proceedings declined 9 percent to 95,147 as of December 31, 1987.

### FEDERAL PROBATION SYSTEM

Consistent with previous years, the Federal Probation System has experienced an increase in the number of persons under its supervision. This year, the total increased 3 percent from 72,416 to 74,760. The number of persons received for supervision during the year, excluding transfers, decreased to 38,173, down 1 percent from the 38,787 received last year. Persons received from the courts decreased 8 percent to 25,066, whereas persons released from institutions increased 13 percent to 13,107.

There was a decrease in all types of supervision received from the courts with the notable decrease in the pretrial diversion receipts. In May 1987, a decision was made to discontinue collecting statistics on pretrial diversion supervision in the Probation Reporting system and to collect this data in the Pretrial Services Reporting system. The result is that there were only 529 persons reported as pretrial diversion in the

Probation statistical system this year.

Persons received for supervision from institutions increased 13 percent from 11,586 to 13,107 this year. Although each of the supervision types increased this year, the number of persons received on mandatory release and special parole terms increased 26 percent or 797 cases and 14 percent or 282 cases, respectively.

The overall increase in persons under supervision this year resulted from a 5 percent rise in persons under supervision from judge imposed probation and an 8 percent increase in parolees. Additionally, persons under supervision from special parole increased 13 percent. The number of persons under supervision on December 31, 1987 increased in 64 districts, decreased in 28 districts and remained unchanged in one district. The Southern District of Florida recorded the largest increase in persons under supervision with 323 more persons to supervise. Florida, Middle and New Jersey both were up 10 percent or 181 and 178 persons, respectively; Virginia, Eastern was up 12 percent or 168 persons; Maryland was up 8 percent or 161 persons.

Table E in the appendix shows the number of persons received for supervision in each district during the past two years, and the total number of persons under supervision when each year ended. Table E-1 provides details on the numbers of persons received for and removed from each type of supervision in each district during the year. Table E-2 shows the number of persons under each type of supervision at the end of the year.

## PRETRIAL SERVICES

The Pretrial Services Act Information System (PSAIS), which was implemented in January 1987, provides detailed information on Pretrial Services cases activated. The system provides information regarding a defendants' personal background, criminal history, education, employment, and other factors necessary to assist judicial officers in making bail release or detention decisions pending trial and/or appeal. Also, PSAIS provides information on decisions made by judicial officers involving release or detention and information on defendants in pretrial diversion status (Deferred Prosecution). Detailed data from PSAIS are provided in Appendix Tables H-1, H-2 and H-3.

The total number of defendants eligible for pretrial services rose 3 percent from 47,330 (excluding Rule 40 transfers) in 1986 to 48,569 in 1987 while the number of cases activated increased by only 17 cases. The underlying reason for this small increase in cases activated was a change to the new PSAIS data collection method. Under the new PSA system, a single case is activated on each criminal defendant regardless of the number of indictments, informations, or complaints filed for that defendant. Prior to 1987, a case was activated each time the defendant was charged. During 1987, a total of 1,557 pretrial diversion cases were reported in PSAIS. There were 1,413 diversion cases (91 percent) which included persons who were never charged in U.S. district courts (Pre-Charged). Another 144 cases (9 percent) involved persons who were originally charged in U.S. district courts who later had their case dismissed and subsequently, placed on pretrial diversion (Post-Charged). Revised Appendix Table H-1 provides data, by district, for cases activated during 1987.

Of the total number of cases activated, 90 percent (27,663) were interviewed; 6 percent (1,754) were not available for interview; and 4 percent (1,279) refused to be interviewed. Of the total PSA cases activated in 1987, 25,642 involved prebail reports (84 percent), a 2 percent decrease from 1986. Postbail reports, which were prepared for 10 percent of the total cases activated, decreased 22 percent (830) from 3,812 last year to 2,982 this year. "Other" reports prepared by PSO's decreased 51 percent (422) from 821 last year to 399 this year. Five percent (1,673) of all defendants under PSA did not have a bail report prepared. Revised Appendix Table H-2 provides data, by district, for defendants interviewed and reports prepared during 1987.

In 1987, 16,490 or 54 percent of all defendants reported under PSA were released on bail at the initial hearing. There were 3,254 defendants (11 percent) who were detained due to their inability to make bail. Another 1,325 (or 4 percent) defendants were detained temporarily to permit revocation of conditional release, deportation or exclusion under Title 18 USC Section 3142(D). A total of 8,558 (28 percent) defendants were detained pending a detention hearing with 1,556 defendants (5 percent) having a detention hearing held on the same day of the initial hearing. Another 794 defendants (3 percent) were detained with bail not set and a total of 275 defendants or

1 percent pled guilty at the initial hearing. Revised Appendix Table H-3 provides data, by district, for defendants detained or release at the initial hearing.

### FEDERAL DEFENDER ORGANIZATIONS

Representations by the 34 Federal public defender and 6 community defender organizations rose more than 6 percent during the 6 month period ended December 31, 1987. Criminal case representations increased by 566 cases, up 5 percent; appeals representations were up 41 cases, a 9 percent increase. Other matters, including representations for habeas corpus petitions and parole/probation revocation hearings, increased by 472 matters, up 8 percent. Almost a quarter of the 1,079 case increase in new representations arose from the defender organization in California, Southern. That organization continues to be the largest in terms of workload; during the six months ended December 31, 1987 a total of 3,668 new representations were assigned to the California, Southern organization.

While the number of case closings also increased nationwide in the six month period, closings never reached the level of new representations. As a result, the pending caseload continued to grow and was at its highest level ever on December 31, 1987. The defender organization in the Southern District of Florida reported 1,821 pending representations, accounting for 18 percent of the national total. A large portion of the district's pending workload (22 percent) involves criminal defendants prosecuted for drug-related offenses.

Appendix Table K-1 provides detailed information on the representations handled by each Federal public and community defender office during the six month period July-December, 1987. Information on representations by private panel attorneys under the Criminal Justice Act of 1964 is available in the Report to the United States Judicial Conference Committee on Defender Services.

### U.S. COURT OF INTERNATIONAL TRADE

During the three-month period ended December 31, 1987, there were 258 cases filed with the U.S. Court of International Trade. The number of cases filed was 11 percent below the number filed during the previous quarter and approximately 30 percent below the average quarterly filings last year. The court closed 802 cases during the quarter ending December 31, 1987, substantially less than in the previous quarter when the court closed nearly 5,900 cases. Closings in the previous quarter, however, included 5,343 reappraisal actions. During the current quarter, the 802 terminations included only 272 reappraisements, 5 protests, and 525 civil actions. On December 31, 1987, there were 7,004 pending cases on the court's docket. This was more than 7 percent below the 7,548 cases pending just three months earlier.

## U.S. CLAIMS COURT

During the quarter ended December 31, 1987, there were 187 complaints filed with the U.S. Claims Court. The number of new complaints was approximately 8 percent below the average quarterly filings from last year. The court closed 261 cases during the current quarter, which was approximately 50 percent above average quarterly dispositions from last year. Since terminations exceeded filings, the pending caseload fell by nearly 4 percent over the three months from September 30 to December 31, 1987. At the end of the year, the court had 1,837 pending complaints.
