






# AVERAGE MAXIMUM SENTENCE GIVEN FY 1980-81 Through FY 1986-87




MALE RELEASES BY RACE Fiscal Year 1986-87



FEMALE RELEASES BY RACE Fiscal Year 1986-87










# INMATE POPULATION BY SEX As of June 30, 1987




# INMATE POPULATION BY RACE As of June 30, 1987




## INMATE POPULATION BY CUSTODY LEVEL As of June 30, 1987




## INMATE POPULATION BY AGE As of June 30, 1987



# OFFENDERS BY STATE OF BIRTH AS of June 30, 1987




## INMATES WHO SERVED IN MILITARY As of June 30, 1987





## ESCAPES FROM ADULT INSTITUTIONS By Month (FY 1986-87)




# ESCAPES FROM ADULT INSTITUTIONS By Institution (FY 1986-87)




## ADULT SECURITY POSITIONS As of June 1987





# INMATES WORKING (ALL JOBS) Daily Average - FY 1986-87




### INMATE JOBS (FARMS/WORKLINES) Monthly Average — FY 1986-87







### PARTICIPATION IN EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS Adult Institutions FY 1986-87







### ADULT PROBATION CASELOAD As of June 30




## ADULT PROBATION CASELOAD — BY REGION Fiscal Year 1986-87





## TOTAL COMMITMENTS BY REGION Fiscal Year 1986-87




### JUVENILE COMMITMENTS BY RACE Fiscal Year 1986-87










## AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION Fiscal Year 1986-87




# TOTAL POPULATION BY AGE As of June 30, 1987



## DISTRIBUTION OF TOTAL POPULATION BY AGE GROUP June 30, 1987









TOTAL JUVENILE POPULATION BY SEX As of June 30, 1987




JUVENILE POPULATION BY RACE As of June 30, 1987



## YEAR END POPULATION Fiscal Year 1986-87




## JUVENILE POPULATION GROWTH




MALE RELEASES BY RACE Calendar Year 1987








## INMATE POPULATION BY RACE As of December 31, 1987




## INMATE POPULATION BY SEX As of December 31, 1987




## INMATE POPULATION BY CUSTODY LEVEL As of December 31, 1987




INMATE POPULATION BY AGE As of December 31, 1987








## ESCAPES FROM ADULT INSTITUTIONS By Month (1987)




# ESCAPES FROM ADULT INSTITUTIONS By Institution (1987)




### ADULT SECURITY POSITIONS As of December 1987





# INMATES WORKING (ALL JOBS) Daily Average - CY 1987

### TOTAL COMMITMENTS BY REGION Calendar Year 1987








## JUVENILE POPULATION BY RACE As of December 31, 1987




## TOTAL JUVENILE POPULATION BY SEX As of December 31, 1987






### AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION Calendar Year 1987








TOTAL POPULATION BY AGE As of December 31, 1987



### DISTRIBUTION OF TOTAL POPULATION BY AGE GROUP December 31, 1987








