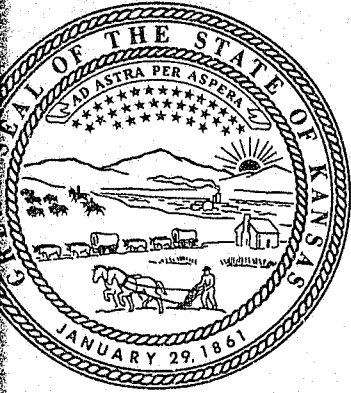

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

## CRIME IN KANSAS

### SUMMARY

1987

- \* *Crime Index Offenses increased 3.1% (117,063 in 1986 to 120,716 in 1987).*
- \* *Violent Crime decreased 1.7% (8,965 in 1986 to 8,817 in 1987).*

*Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter increased 1.9% (108 in 1986 to 110 in 1987).*

*Rape decreased 3.4% (816 in 1986 to 788 in 1987).*

*Robbery increased 3.6% (1,951 in 1986 to 2,022 in 1987).*

*Aggravated Assault/Battery decreased 3.2% (6,090 in 1986 to 5,897 in 1987).*

*Simple Assault/Battery increased 2.4% (20,877 in 1986 to 21,286 in 1987).*

- \* *Property crimes increased 3.5% (108,098 in 1986 to 111,899 in 1987).*

*Burglary increased 8.7% (34,645 in 1986 to 37,656 in 1987).*

*Theft increased 1.6% (67,194 in 1986 to 68,260 in 1987).*

*Motor Vehicle Theft decreased 4.4% (6,259 in 1986 to 5,983 in 1987).*

*Criminal Damage to Property, reported through the Incident Based Reporting System, totalled \$5,758,488 in 1987; damage done to vehicles accounted for 37.7% of the total.*

- \* *Statistics for 1987 indicate Violent Crime affected 3.6 persons per thousand population while Property Crimes affected 45.2 persons per thousand.*
- \* *The State Fire Marshal's Office reported Incendiary/Suspicious Fires decreased 10.9% (1,852 in 1986 to 1,651 in 1987).*
- \* *The reported value of Property Stolen increased 4.9% (\$67,149,992) with Motor Vehicle Theft accounting for 40.4% of the total.*

- \* *The reported value of Property Recovered decreased 8.1% to \$20,723,214.*
- \* *The Kansas Incident Base Reporting System received reports on 128,680 incidents that involved violations of state statutes.*
- \* *Total arrests increased 4.0% (93,611 in 1986 to 97,355 in 1987). Juveniles were arrested most frequently for theft; Adults for DUI.*
- \* *Assaults on Law Enforcement Officers decreased 7.3% (995 in 1986 to 922 in 1987).*

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## INTRODUCTION

The Kansas Bureau of Investigation Statistical Analysis Center's Incident Based Reporting program has voluntarily participated, in one form or another, in the national Uniform Crime Reporting program administered by the Federal Bureau of Investigation since 1969. This program collects offense data on what are referred to as Part I crimes: murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault/battery, burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft and arson. Arrest statistics are collected on those crimes, as well as other offenses, (Part II or Class II crimes). K.S.A. 21-2501(a) and K.S.A. 21-2504 require the submission of certain crime data from all local police and sheriff's departments to the KBI. There were 350 reporting entities for the year 1987 which is representative of nearly 100% of our state's population. The data presented in this publication will reflect offense data on the above Part I crimes, will provide some historical and definitive data, along with descriptive trend analyses, and introduce several new sections addressing the needs and concerns of our contributing agencies and the citizens of the State of Kansas.

Part I crimes are divided into two categories; violent crimes (murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault/battery) and property crimes (burglary, theft, and motor vehicle theft). These specific offenses are also referred to as the Crime Index and were selected by the national program because of their severity, their frequency of occurrence and the likelihood of being reported to the local authorities. Other federal program principles are followed as well for the sake of nationwide uniformity. These principles include using the hierarchy rule (counting only the most serious crime in a multiple offense situation), counting only arrests made for crimes committed in an agency's jurisdiction, etc. Arson was added to the crime index in 1979 and so as not to distort data in providing trends for the other seven Part I offenses, arson data will continue to be reported supplementally.

In order to better address requests for crime statistics and to provide a more complete view of the complexion of crime in Kansas, a pilot program on Incident Based Reporting was begun in 1984 with participation by ten local law enforcement agencies. This program

detailed crime reporting based upon incidents of reported crime wherein numerous points of information could be gathered and studied. Prior to implementation of this program, summary reports were prepared by the local agencies, forwarded to the KBI, tallied by the state and sent to the FBI. In 1987, all but six law enforcement agencies reported on the Incident Based Reporting System and this publication reflects crime studies on this expanded data base.

The goals of the Incident Based Reporting System are: 1) the standardization of reporting methods and data elements; 2) the collection and reporting of data based on Kansas law, rather than national standards; 3) the maintenance of a state-level stolen property file; 4) to maintain a broad data-base allowing for the analysis of crimes, victims, suspects, etc.; 5) better feedback to local agencies. Long range goals include the ability to: 1) link arrests with offenses; 2) count arrests made for another agency; and 3) track offenders through the justice system.

#### OBJECTIVES OF CRIME IN KANSAS 1987:

- o - To provide law enforcement administrators with crime statistics for administrative and operational use.
- o - To inform the Executive, Legislative and Judicial branches of government, and the public, as to the nature of the crime problem in Kansas -- its magnitude and its trend.
- o - To provide information to those charged with the responsibility of formulating public safety policy.
- o - To determine who commits crimes by age, sex, race, and other attributes in order to find the proper focus for crime prevention and law enforcement.
- o - To provide Kansas citizens with the most complete information on the nature and extent of crime.
- o - To include comprehensive data for researchers and planners.
- o - To provide base data and statistics to assist in the assessment of social and other causes for the development of theories of criminal behavior; to

assist in the assessment of the efficiency, effectiveness and performance of criminal justice agencies; to measure the effects of prevention and deterrence programs.

- o - To respond to the national program's request by providing the FBI with complete data to be included in the national crime report.

#### **CRIME FACTORS:**

It is important to remember that crime is a social problem and, therefore, a concern of the entire population of Kansas.

The most important and vital influences on the occurrence of crime are:

- o - Density and size of the community population and its surrounding area.
- o - Composition of the population with reference particularly to age, sex, race, and ethnic origin.
- o - Economic status and mores of the population.
- o - Stability of the population with respect to transient factors.
- o - Climate, which includes seasonal weather conditions.
- o - Cultural conditions; i.e., educational, recreational and religious characteristics.
- o - Effective strength of the law enforcement agencies.
- o - Standards governing appointments to law enforcement agencies.
- o - Policies and/or attitudes of criminal justice system, including prosecution, courts, corrections and probation.
- o - Relationship and attitudes of the public toward law enforcement problems.
- o - Administrative and investigative efficiency of law enforcement, including the degree of adherence of crime reporting and crime description standards.
- o - Organization and cooperation of adjoining and overlapping police jurisdictions.

## DATA COMPARISONS/LIMITATIONS:

This program was developed for Kansas law enforcement agencies by the Kansas Bureau of Investigation to furnish information for use primarily by contributing agencies. The tendency with a publication of this nature is to attempt to make comparisons of data between jurisdictions, whether between agencies, counties, or regions. Caution is urged in attempting to make comparisons between agencies and the reasons for this will become apparent as the reader reviews the publication. Studies presented herein are carefully planned to present the truest and most accurate picture possible of crime in Kansas.

It is not always appropriate to compare single agencies because of the great variety of factors which affect the extent and fluctuation of crime and which are not taken into consideration in either raw data or crime rates. For example, one occurrence of theft is weighed equally with one occurrence of murder, even though the two crimes are obviously at opposite spectrums on a scale of seriousness. For the purpose of this publication, all crimes are weighted equally in computing crime rates.

The Incident Based Reporting program in Kansas is the best information presently available for reflecting crime as reported to law enforcement. It does not claim to represent all crime occurring in Kansas because it is dependent upon the willingness of the victim to report the crime to law enforcement and the willingness of law enforcement to report the crime to the Kansas Bureau of Investigation.

This publication of Crime In Kansas, 1987 is the result of the efforts of 350 local and state law enforcement agencies submitting required information to the state program maintained by the Kansas Bureau of Investigation. The effort by the numerous individuals responsible for this process is greatly appreciated.

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## CRIME INDEX OVERVIEW

Crime Index Offenses (murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault/battery, burglary, theft and motor vehicle theft) totaled 120,716 in 1987, an increase of 3.1% over 1986. The ten year trend of Crime Index Offenses shows an increase of 16% in crimes reported in 1987 as compared to 1978 figures. This increase is due, in part, to better reporting methods and the participation of more agencies.

Crime Index Offenses are divided into two sub-categories; 1) Violent Crime, and 2) Property Crime. In the Violent Crime category aggravated assault/battery continues to be the most frequently reported crime and constitutes 66.9% of all violent crime reported. Theft is the most often reported Property Crime; 61% of reported property crime and nearly fifty-seven percent of the entire Crime Index are theft.

The Crime Clock suggests that, on an average, one Crime Index Offense occurred every four minutes in 1987, while the individual categories of Violent Crime and Property Crime show an occurrence rate of 59 minutes, 37 seconds and 4 minutes, 42 seconds, respectively. August ranks as the month with the most Crime Index offenses reported.

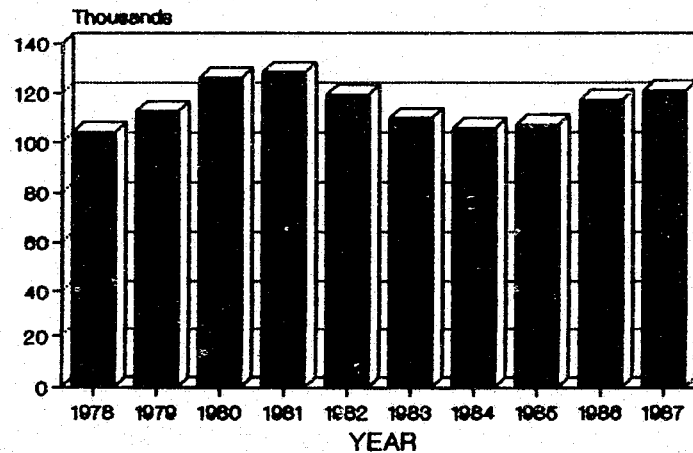
There are thirty-five cities in Kansas with populations of over 10,000. Those cities account for 80.9% of all Crime Index Offenses that occurred in 1987. Kansas City experienced the greatest number of violent crimes; Wichita had the largest number of property crimes.

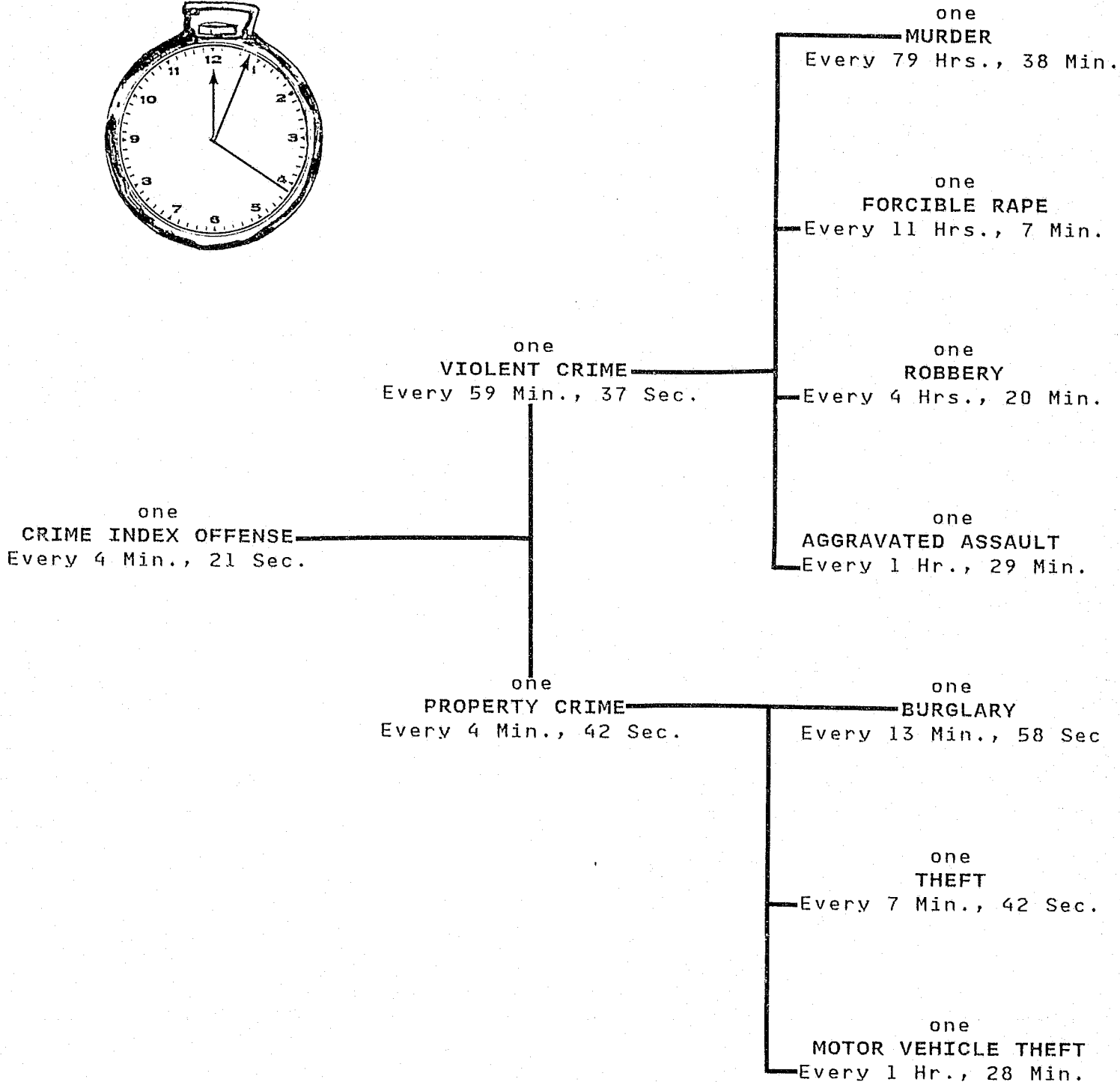
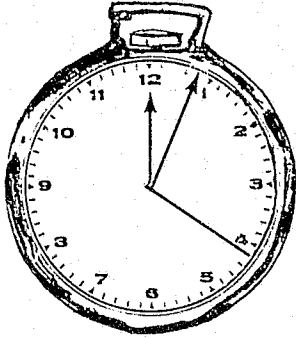
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**CRIME INDEX TREND

# CRIME CLOCK 1987

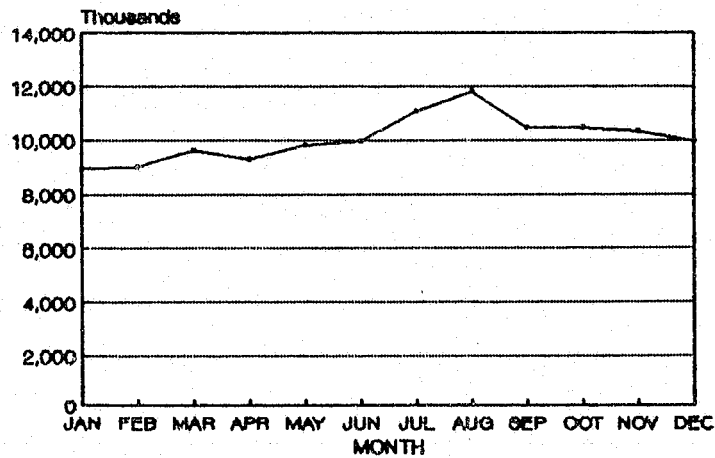


The crime clock should be viewed with care. Being the most aggregate representation of crime data, it is designed to convey the annual reported crime experience by showing the relative frequency of occurrence of the Index Offenses. This mode of display should not be taken to imply a regularity in the commission of the Part I Offenses; rather, it represents the annual ratio of crime to fixed time intervals.

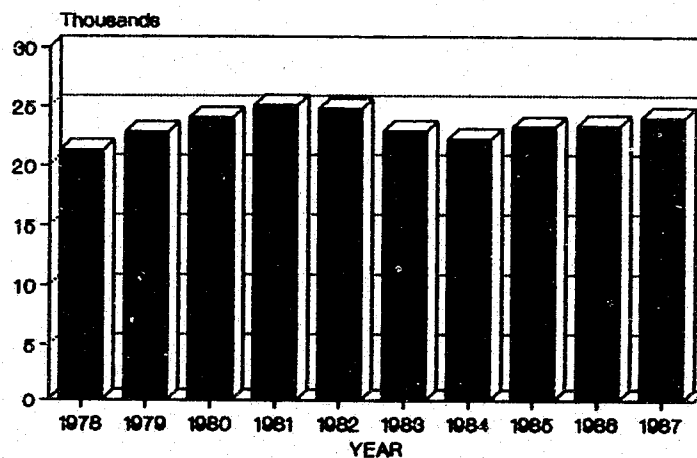

\* This table represents the primary offense, under UCR guidelines, listed in the 128,680 incident reports received by the Incident Based Reporting System for 1987. Clearances are directly related to the incident received and reflect the number of clearances at the time of table generation. The clearance may not have occurred in calendar year 1987. The number of reports also reflects only those agencies on IBR for the entire reporting period. For example, for the statutory violation of K.S.A. 21-3701, Theft, 43,313 reports were received from the IBR reporting agencies. At the time of table generation, 10,612 clearances had been made against these original reports. This calculates out to a clearance rate of 24.5% for the originally reported offenses.

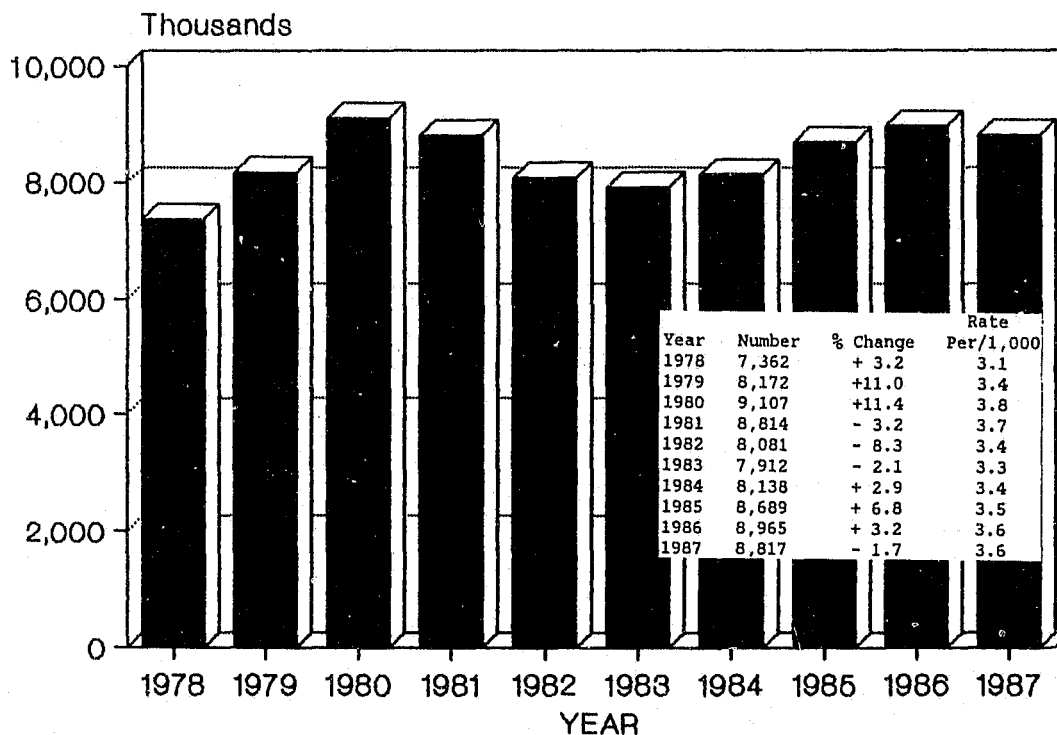
## VIOLENT CRIME

In 1987 a violent crime of murder, rape, robbery or aggravated assault/battery occurred on an average of every 60 minutes in Kansas. Statistics for 1987 indicate that 3.6 persons per thousand population experienced some type of violent crime.

Violent crime accounted for 7.3% of the total crime index offenses reported in 1987. This crime category totaled 8,817 in 1987 compared to 8,965 in 1986, a decrease of 1.7%.

Information on simple assault/battery has been included for the first time. Previously, this offense was not included because it is considered a Part II offense under UCR guidelines. However, due to the frequency that this crime against persons is reported, the information is valuable to law enforcement. The trend study shows a steady rate of increase from 1979 through 1987 with the largest increase (23.8%) between 1985 and 1986. However, this increase may be due, in part, to better reporting methods.

1978 - 1987**



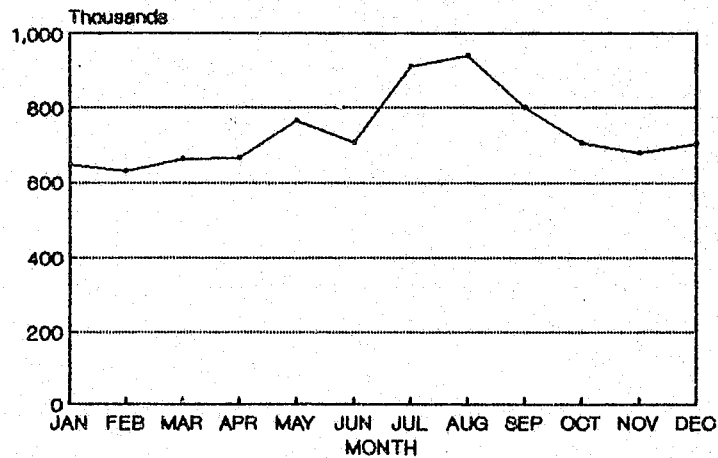

## MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER

Kansas Statutes define murder and non-negligent manslaughter as follows:

"Murder in the first degree is the killing of a human being committed maliciously, willfully, deliberately and with premeditation or committed in the perpetration or attempt to perpetrate any felony," (K.S.A. 21-3401).

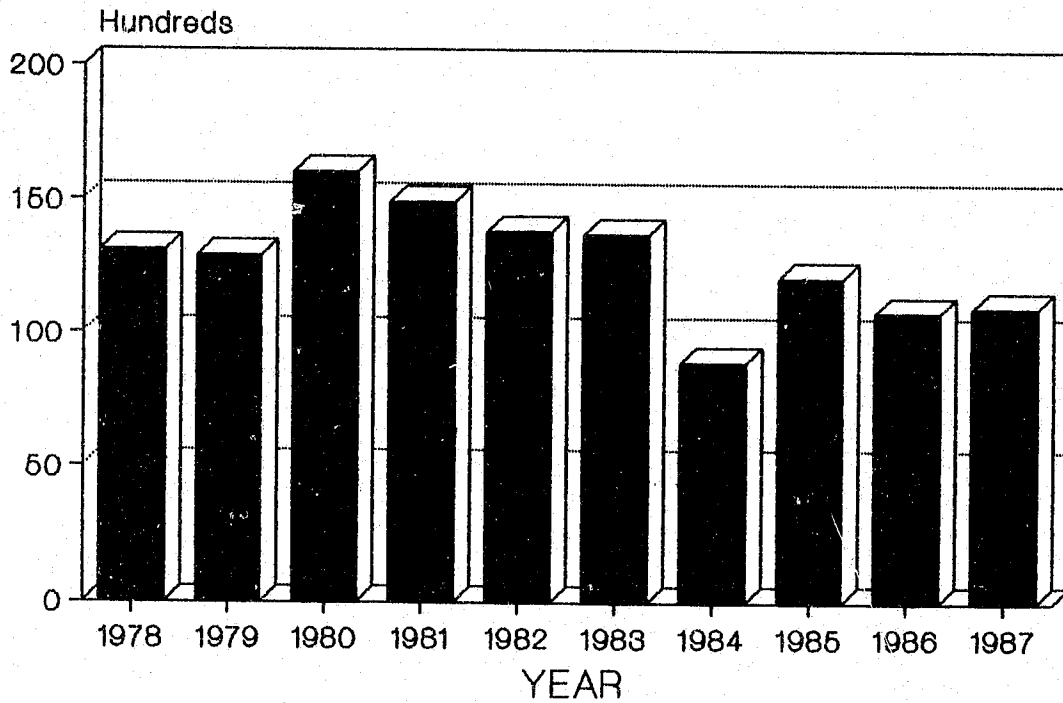
"Murder in the second degree is the malicious killing of a human being, committed without deliberation or premeditation and not in the perpetration or attempt to perpetrate a felony," (K.S.A. 21-3402).

"Voluntary manslaughter is the unlawful killing of a human being, without malice, which is done intentionally upon a sudden quarrel or in the heat of passion," (K.S.A. 21-3403).

The national program defines murder as "the willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1984, page 6).

In 1987, Kansas reported 110 homicides, an increase of 1.9% compared to the 108 homicides reported in 1986. Slightly over half (53.6%) of these crimes were committed with a firearm of some type. Of the 110 homicides reported, 19.1% involved family members and an additional 3.6% involved girlfriend/boyfriend relationships. Both the greatest number of victims and offenders were non-hispanic, white males, between the ages of 22 to 30. The largest number of homicides were reported in three separate months, (January, May, and December), with 13 each.

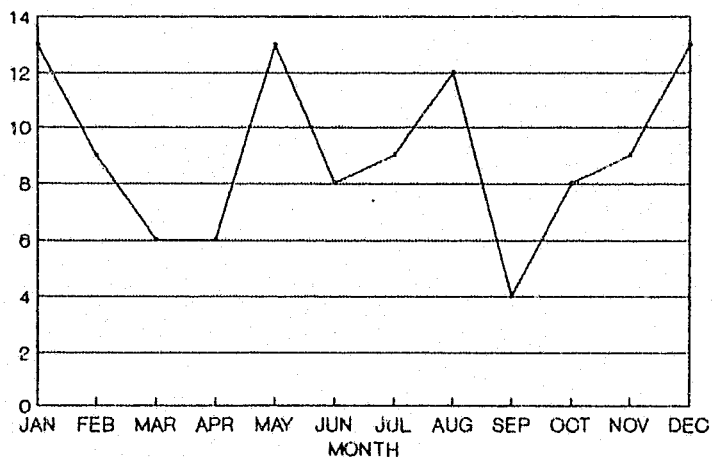

# RAPE

K.S.A. 21-3502 defines rape as:

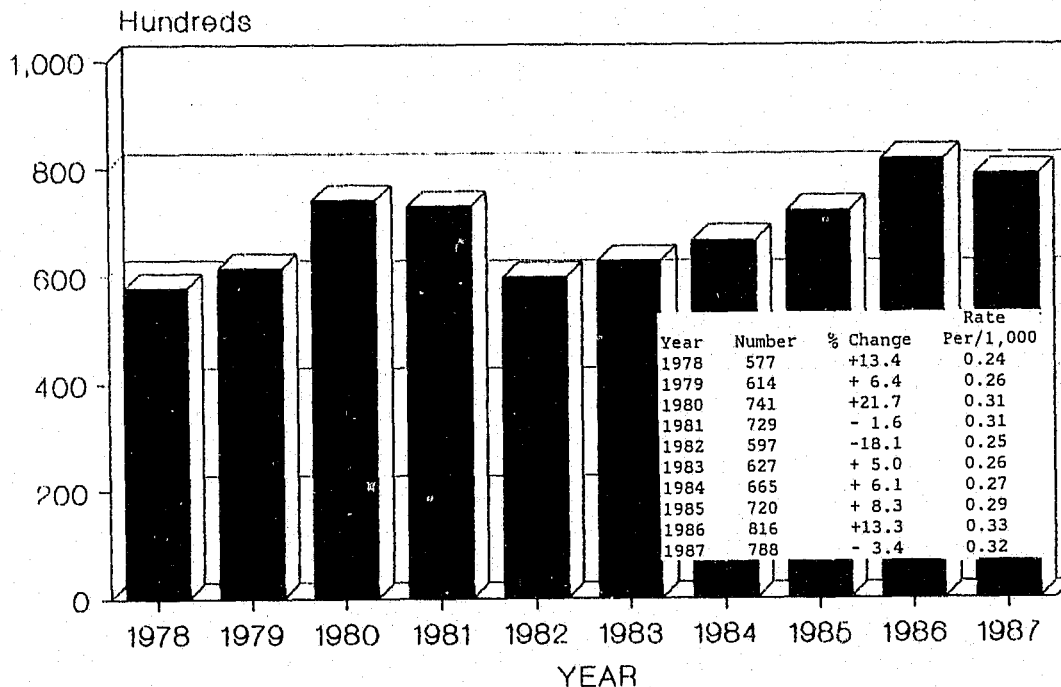
"...sexual intercourse with a person who does not consent to the sexual intercourse..."

The national UCR program does not include male sexual assaults under the rape definition; those are considered "other sex offenses" and fall within the Part II crimes category. However, under Kansas Statutes, male sexual assault is considered rape in some incidents and counted as such.

There were 788 reported rapes in 1987, a decrease of 3.4% as compared to 816 reported in 1986. Most of these rapes (82.4%) occurred in cities with populations of 10,000 or greater. The highest number of rapes were reported in the summer months of June, July and August with the greatest number reported in August. Slightly over half of these rapes (50.9%) occurred between 10:00 p.m. and 4:00 a.m. and happened in residences and apartments (59.5%).

The most frequent rape victim is a white female, between 15-19 years of age, while the most common offender is a white male, age 20-24. In 55.5% of reported rapes the offender was known by the victim. Eight males were victims of rape, while 7 females were offenders in 1987.

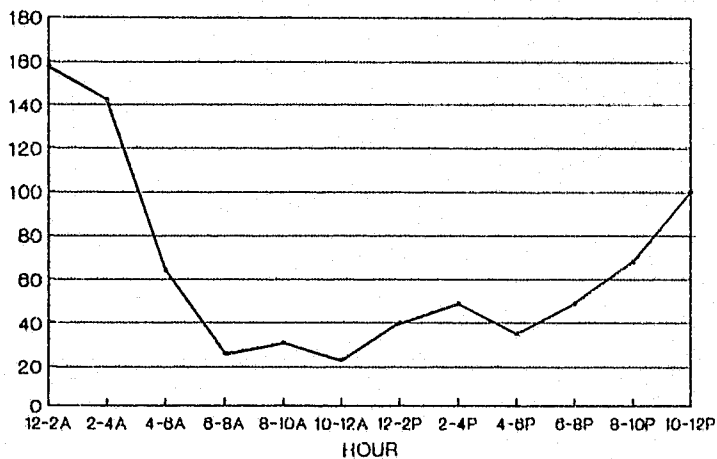

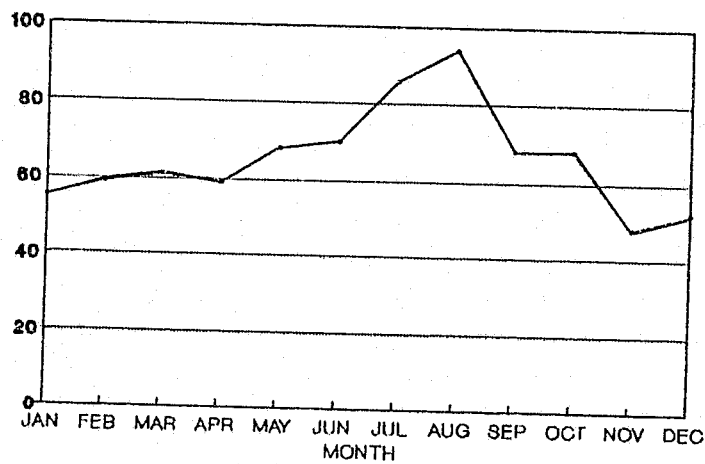

## ROBBERY

Under the national UCR program and Kansas law, robbery is:

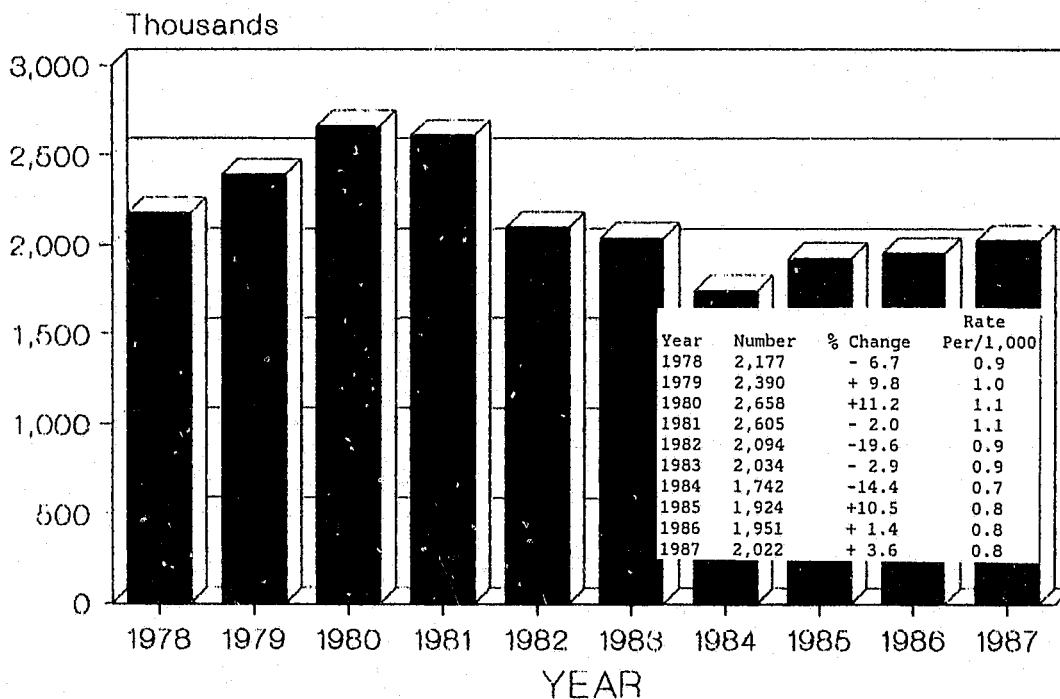
"...the taking of property from the person or presence of another by threat of bodily harm to his person or the person of another or by force."

Robberies reported increased 3.6% in 1987 compared to 1986, this slight increase reflects a trend that has been appearing since 1984 when the lowest number of robberies were reported in a ten year span. The majority of robberies (91.9%) occurred in cities with populations of 10,000 or greater and the largest number (901) occurred in business establishments where \$472,238 of property was reported stolen.

The highest number of robberies (202) were reported in July. Robberies most frequently occurred on Sunday and Thursday between 6:00 p.m. and 12:00 p.m.

The majority of the offenders (52.7%) were a stranger to the victim and used a firearm to commit the offense.

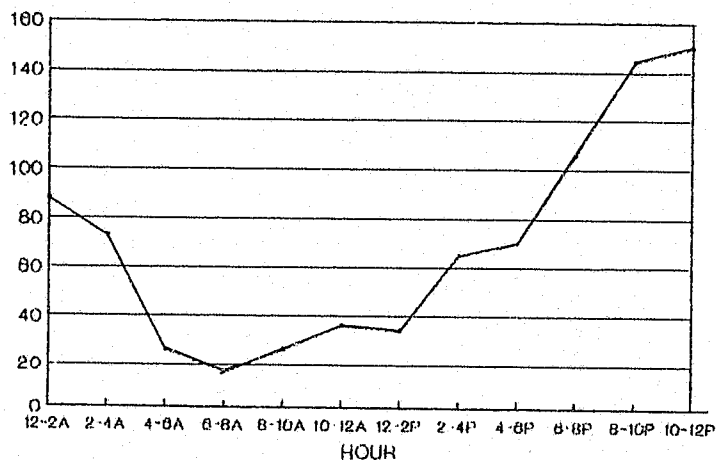

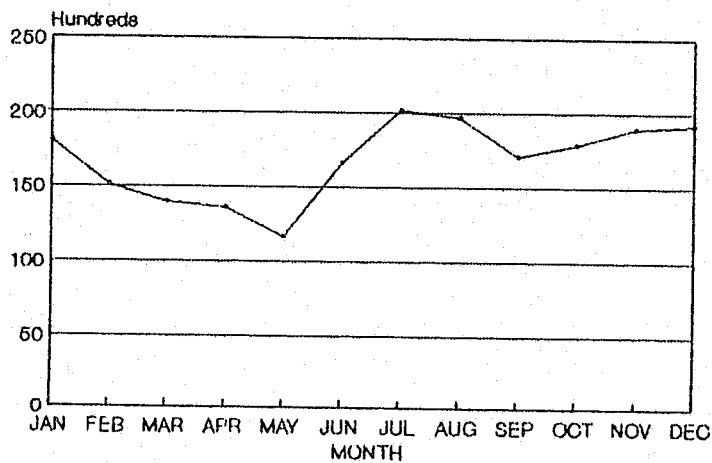

## AGGRAVATED ASSAULT/BATTERY

Aggravated assault is defined in Kansas under K.S.A. 21-3410 as:

- "(a) Unlawfully assaulting or striking at another with a deadly weapon; or
- (b) Committing assault by threatening or menacing another while disguised in any manner designed to conceal identity; or
- (c) Willfully and intentionally assaulting another with intent to commit any felony."

Aggravated battery is defined in Kansas under K.S.A. 21-3414 as:

- "(a) Inflicts great bodily harm upon him; or
- (b) Causes any disfigurement or dismemberment to or of his person; or
- (c) Is done with a deadly weapon, or in any manner whereby great bodily harm, disfigurement, or death can be inflicted."

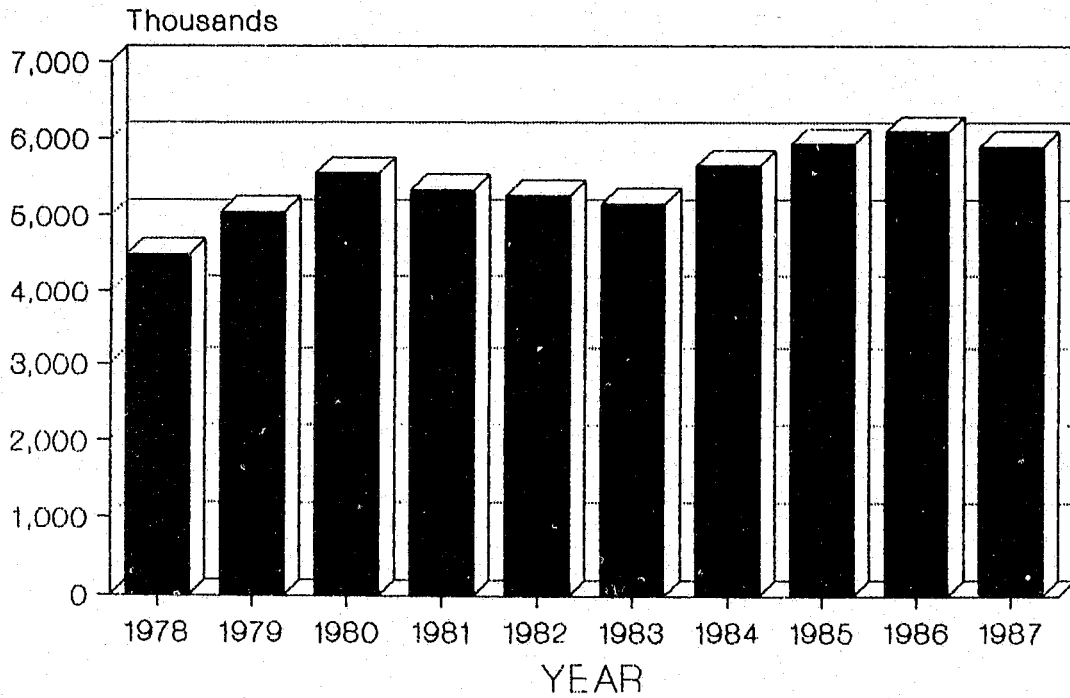
Aggravated assault is defined for the Uniform Crime Report as:

"An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm,"  
(Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1984, page 16).

Aggravated assault/battery continued to be the most frequently reported violent crime representing 66.9% of this category. Aggravated assault/battery decreased 3.2% in 1987, as compared to 1986.

The largest percentage of aggravated assault/battery reports (66.2%) occurred in the population group of over 100,000. Victims were most often age 20-25 (1,074) and nearly half (46.2%) took place in residences. The largest number of assault/battery reports occurred on weekends with 1,511 offenses.

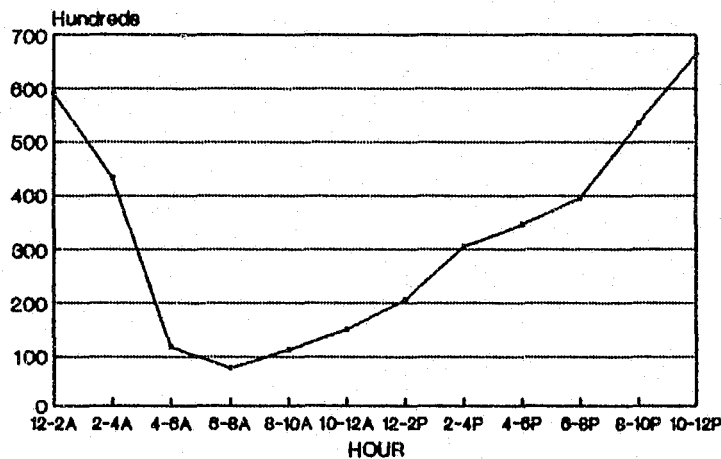

 BY TWENTY-FOUR HOUR TREND, 1987**

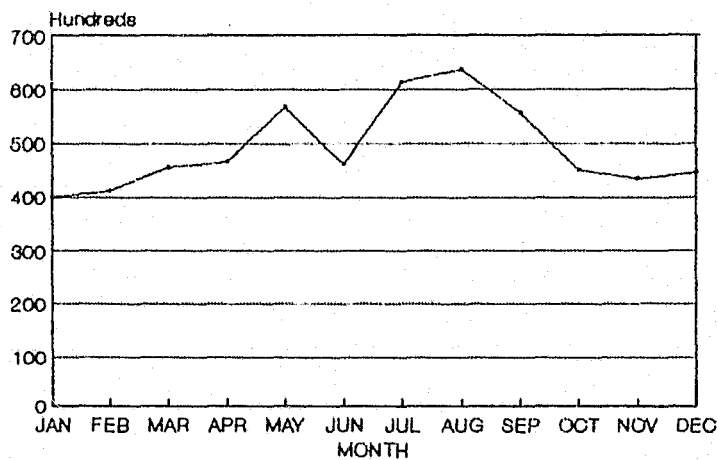

## SIMPLE ASSAULT/BATTERY

Assault is defined in Kansas under K.S.A. 21-3408 as:

"An assault is an intentional threat or attempt to do bodily harm to another coupled with apparent ability and resulting in immediate apprehension of bodily harm. No bodily contact is necessary."

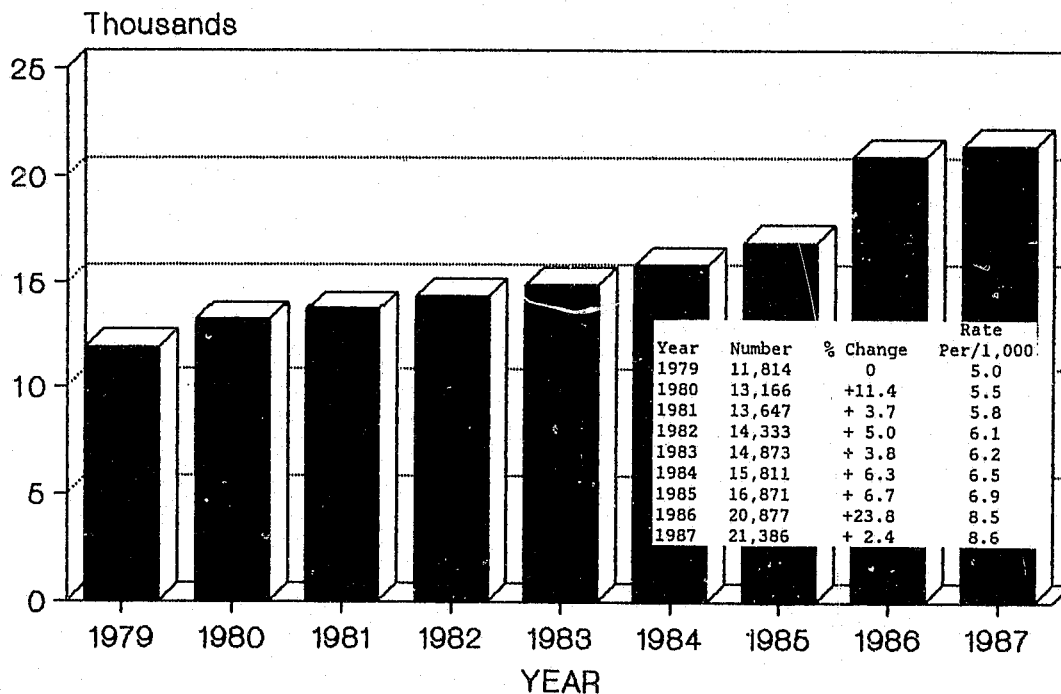
Battery is defined in Kansas under K.S.A. 21-3412 as:

"Battery is the unlawful, intentional touching or application of force to the person of another, when done in a rude, insolent or angry manner."

Simple assault/battery (no weapon and no injury involved) is a Part II crime. In 1987, this crime totaled 21,386 reflecting a 2.4% increase from 1986. The trend shows a continuous pattern of simple assault/battery increasing since 1979, with the smallest increase occurring in 1987.

Most simple assault/battery is committed by acquaintances of the victim (28.3%); the majority of the victims, 3,130, are between 20 and 25. These offenses most often occurred on weekends with 4,118 reported incidents and 42.4% happen between 8:00 p.m. and 2:00 a.m.

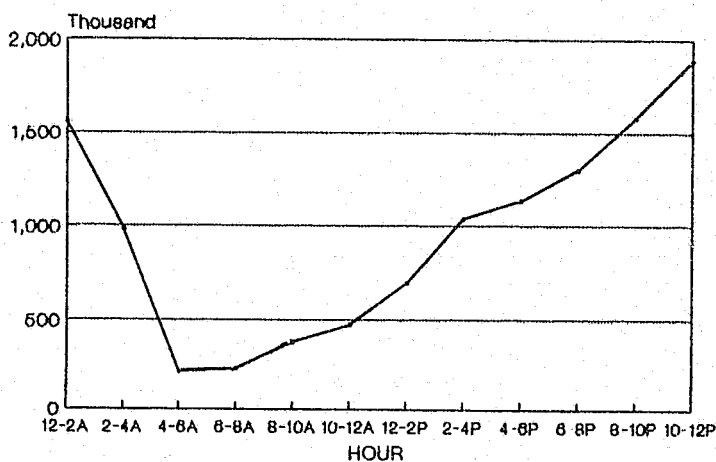

BY TWENTY-FOUR HOUR TREND, 1987**

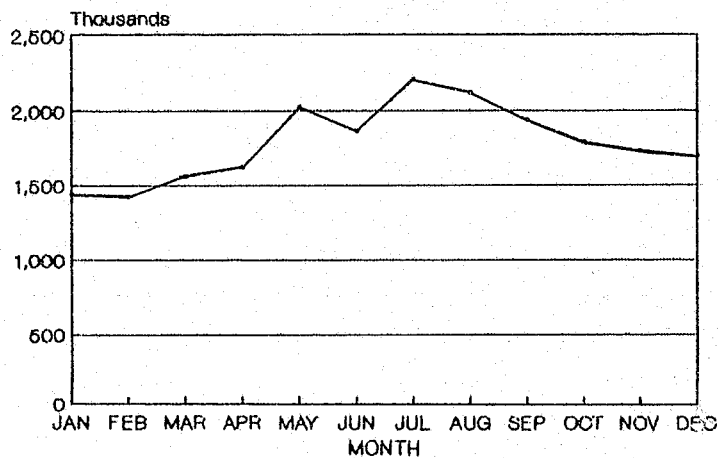

BY MONTH OF OCCURRENCE, 1987**



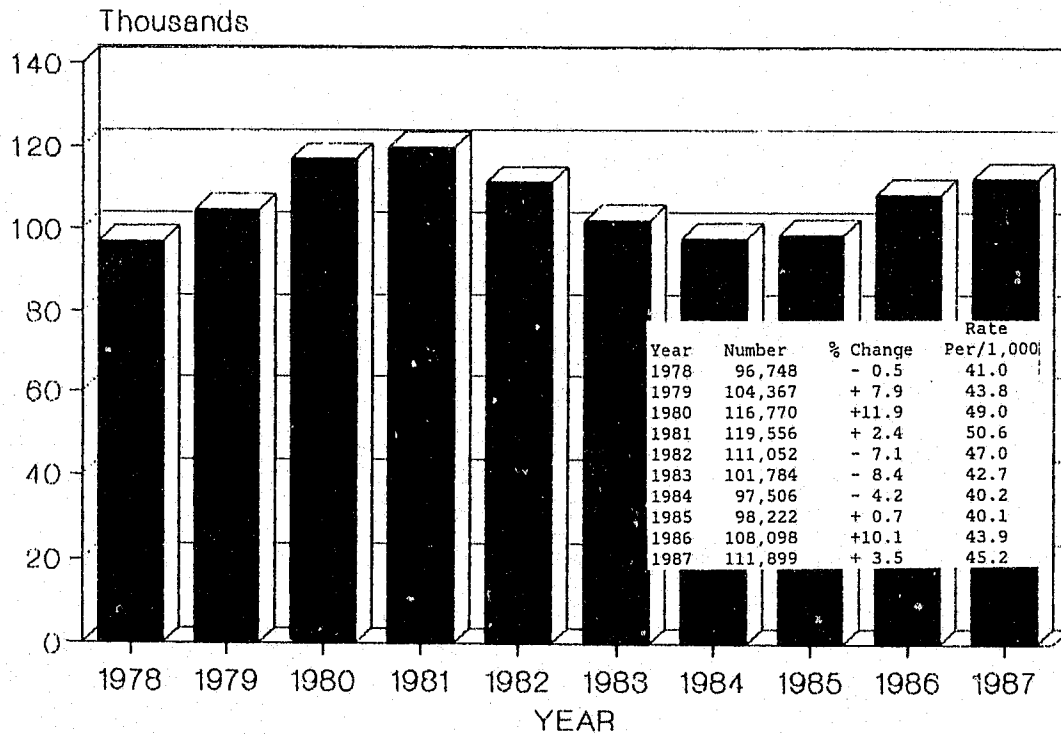


## PROPERTY CRIME

Part I property crime, which includes burglary, theft, and motor vehicle theft, increased 3.5% in 1987 and totaled 111,899 reported offenses. These three offenses represent 92.7% of the total crime index and are responsible for 98.6% of all reported stolen property.

Also included is data on the eighth Part I offense of arson. A new section has been included showing statistics on criminal damage to property which is a Part II crime and reported only by agencies on the Incident Base Reporting System.

### PROPERTY CRIME TREND 1978 - 1987

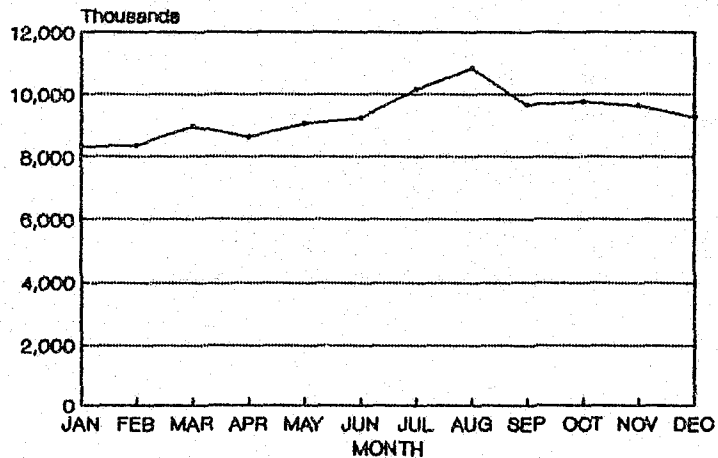

# BURGLARY

Burglary in Kansas is defined under K.S.A. 21-3715 as:

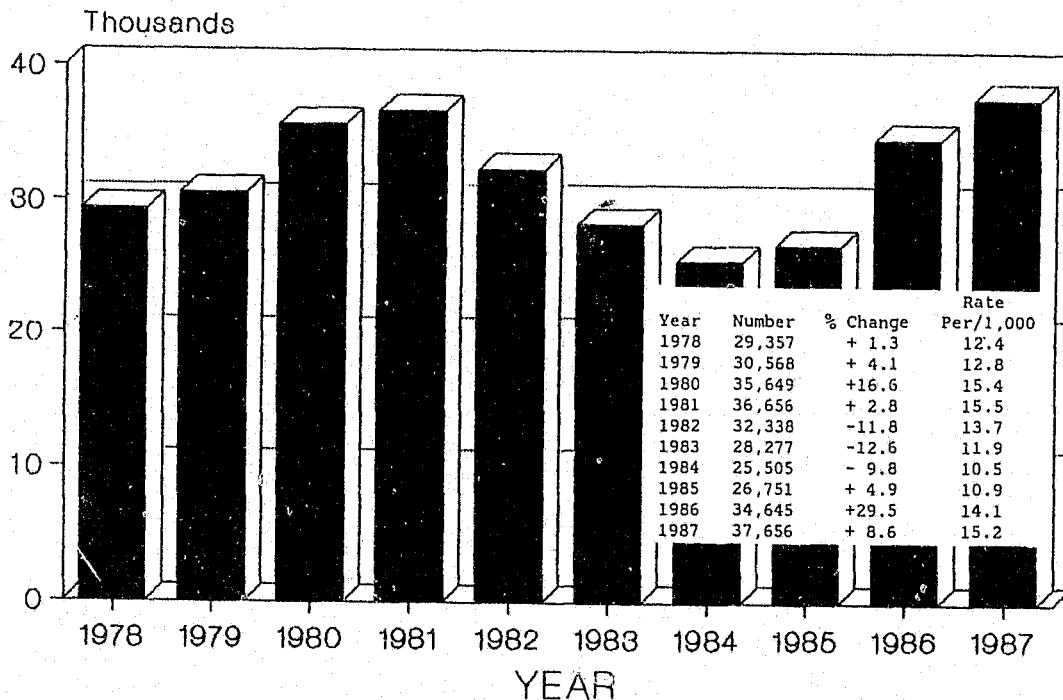
"...knowingly and without authority entering or remaining within any building, mobile home, tent or other structure, or any motor vehicle, aircraft, watercraft, railroad car or other means of conveyance of persons or property, with intent to commit a felony or theft therein."

The national UCR program does not recognize a vehicle as a structure, therefore, for UCR reporting purposes, breaking into a vehicle has traditionally been counted as a theft. However, under Kansas state statute these offenses are classified as burglaries.

In 1987 burglaries rose from 34,645, reported in 1986, to 37,656 an increase of 8.7%. Burglary had the lowest clearance rate of Part I offenses reported in 1987 at 10.5%. Of the total burglaries reported 53.7% were non-residence and 44.6% occurred at night.

Of the \$21,853,889 of stolen property reported for this offense, 50.8% was taken in residence burglaries. There was an increase of 10.1% for total property stolen in burglaries as compared to 1986.

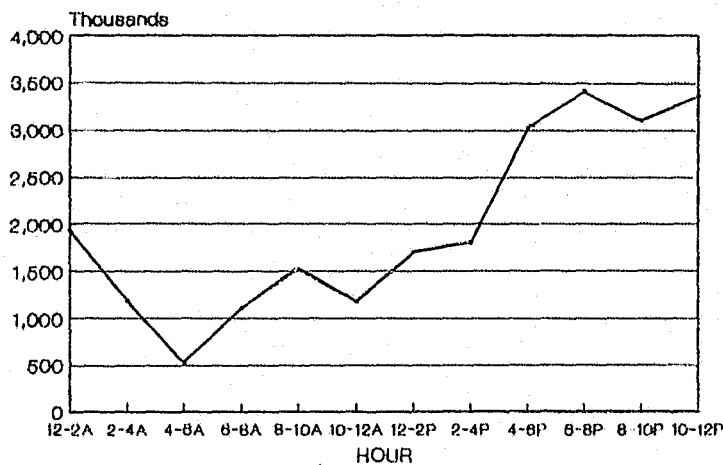

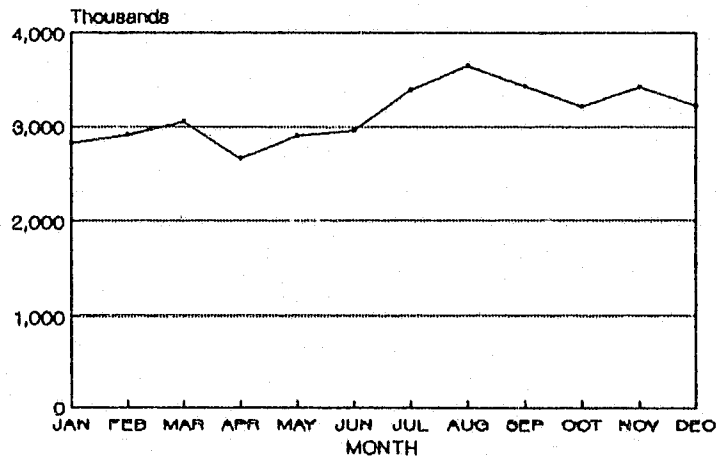

# THEFT

Kansas Statute K.S.A. 21-3701 defines theft as:

"...any of the following acts done with intent to deprive the owner permanently of the possession, use, or benefit of the owner's property:

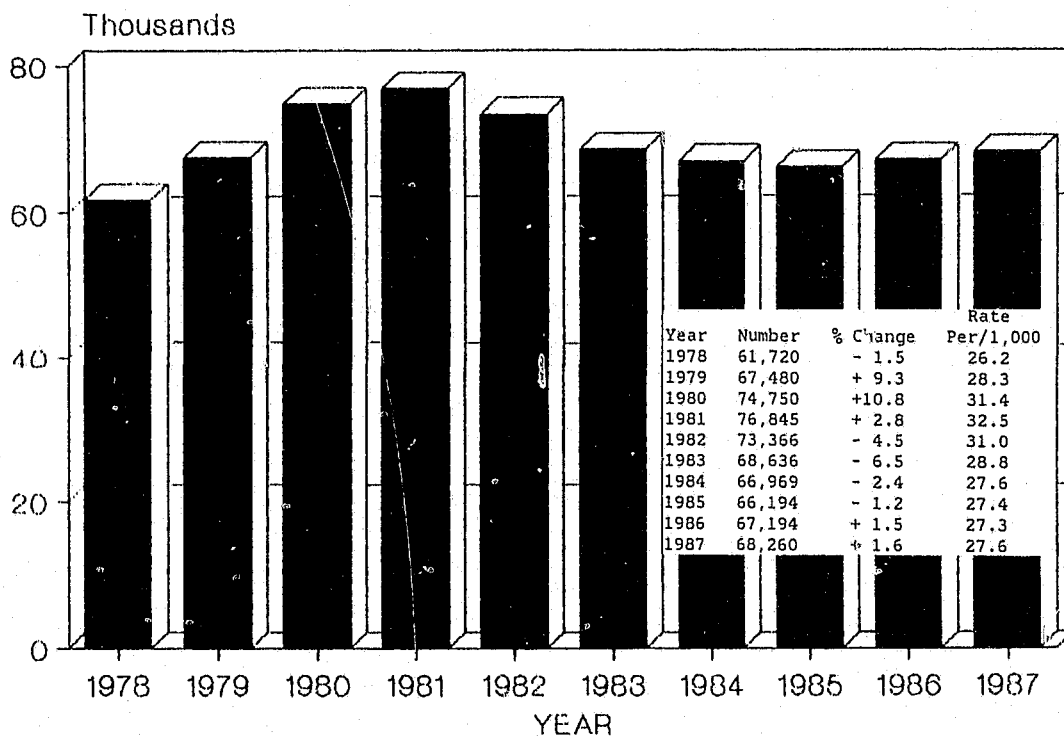
- (a) Obtaining or exerting unauthorized control over property; or
- (b) Obtaining by deception, control over property; or
- (c) Obtaining by threat, control over property; or
- (d) Obtaining control over stolen property knowing the property to have been stolen by another."

A slight increase (1.6%) in theft was reflected from 1986. Theft (which also includes attempts) was the most frequently reported Part I crime at 56.5% of the total index.

Theft of auto accessories accounted for 19.9% of total thefts reported and amounted to \$2,227,713.

Under Kansas law, theft is listed under several different statutes but is counted as theft for FBI purposes. A list of these statutes with a breakdown of eight specific categories of occurrence is included.

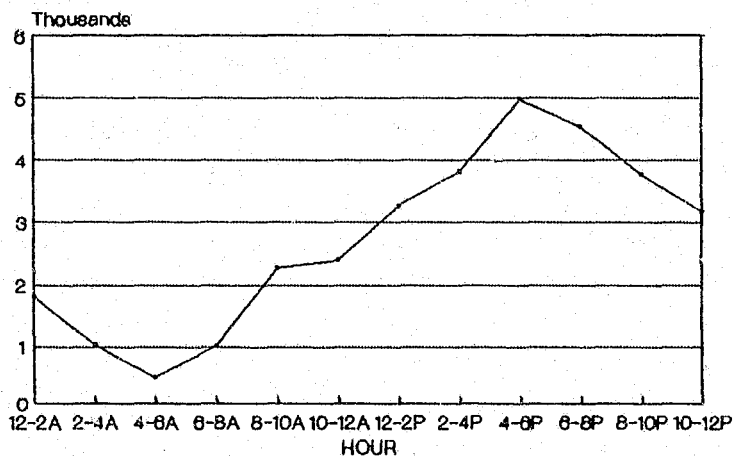

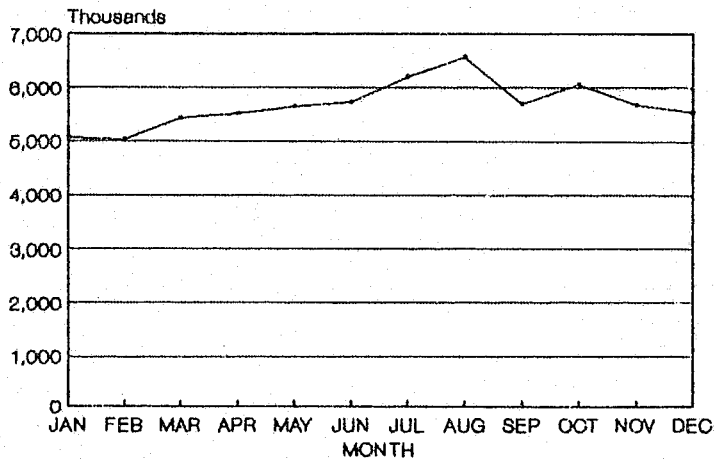

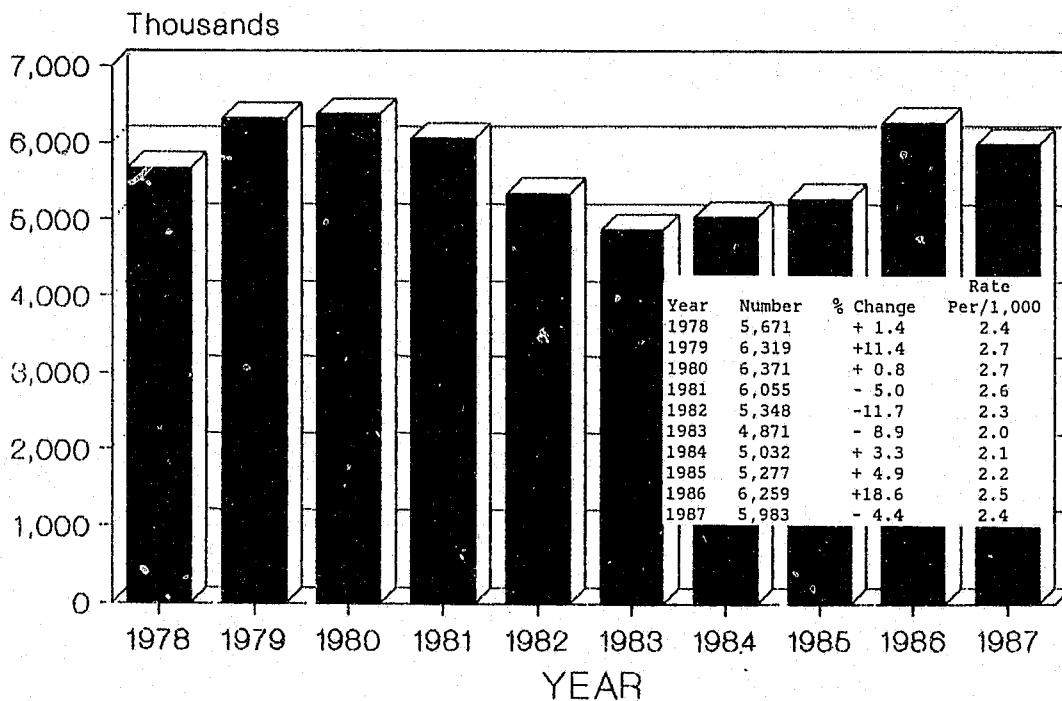

## MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

The national UCR program separates stolen motor vehicles from the general theft category to allow for more accurate accounting of vehicles stolen. Motor vehicle theft was the only property crime to show a decrease (4.4%) from 1986; however, motor vehicle theft had the highest value of stolen property for Part I crimes at \$25,568,267.

It should be noted that a discrepancy in dollar value of stolen vehicles exists in some tables. When a vehicle is taken in the commission of a more serious crime (rape, burglary, etc.) a motor vehicle theft is not tallied, but the vehicle will be counted as property taken during the offense.

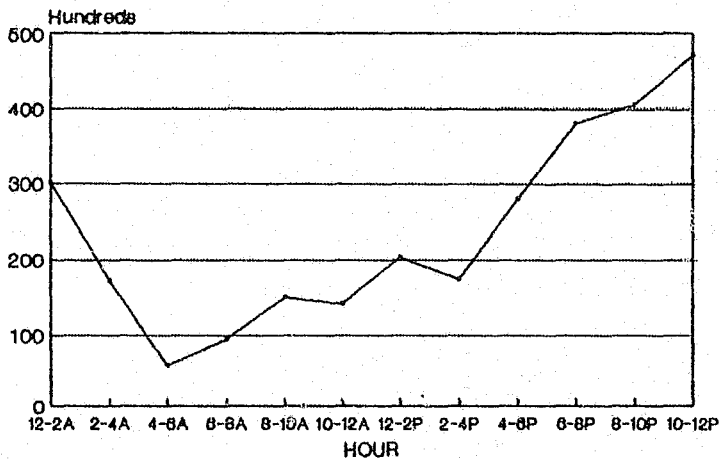

BY TWENTY-FOUR HOUR TREND, 1987**

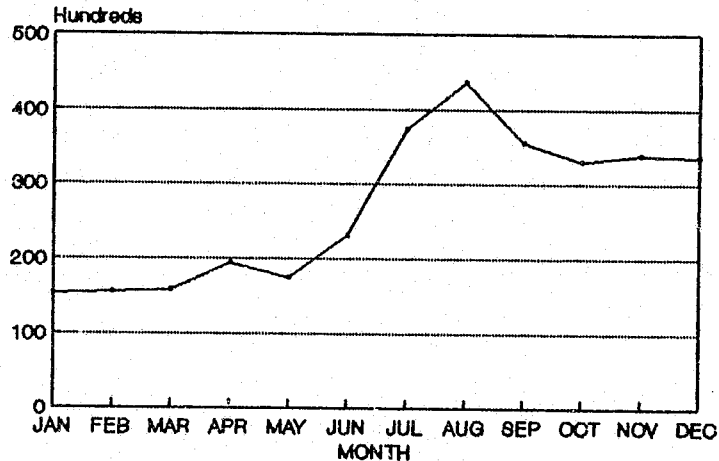

## CRIMINAL DAMAGE

Criminal damage to property is defined in K.S.A. 21-3720 as:

"...by means other than by fire or explosive:

- (a) Willfully injuring, damaging, mutilating, defacing, destroying, or substantially impairing the use of any property in which another has an interest without the consent of such other person; or
- (b) Injuring, damaging, mutilating, defacing, destroying, or substantially impairing the use of any property with intent to injure or defraud an insurer or leinholder."

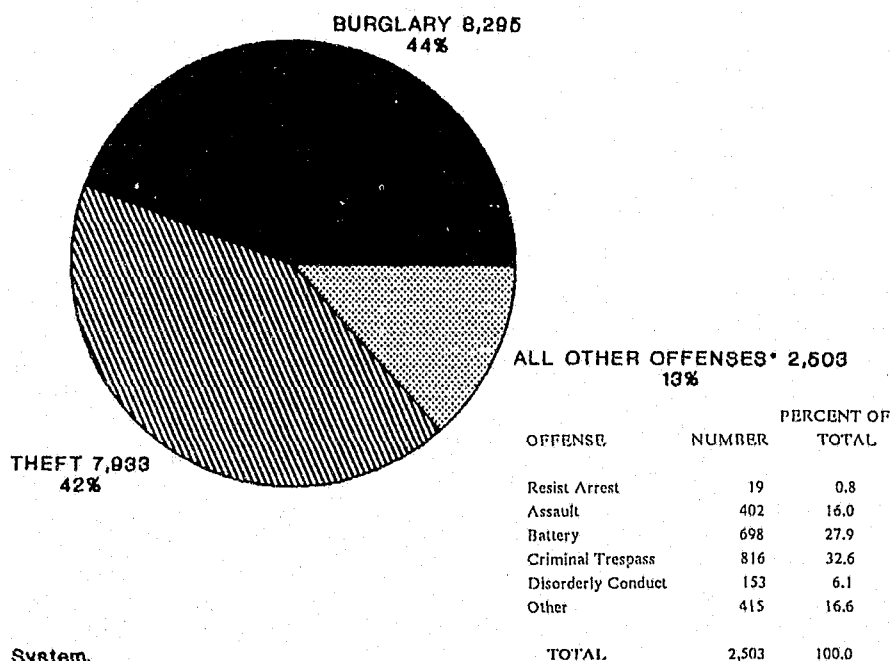
The figures provided in this section are based on statistics from the Incident Base Reporting System and do not include those agencies that are UCR participants only.

There were 22,773 criminal damage offenses reported in 1987 and 33,758 incidents where criminal damage was one of the offenses committed.

The largest number of criminal damages occurred on Saturday (4,562), and between 10:00 p.m. and 12:00 p.m. with 15.1% of the total incidents reported.

Criminal damage loss reported totaled \$5,758,488. Damage to vehicles equaled \$2,172,845 (37.7%).

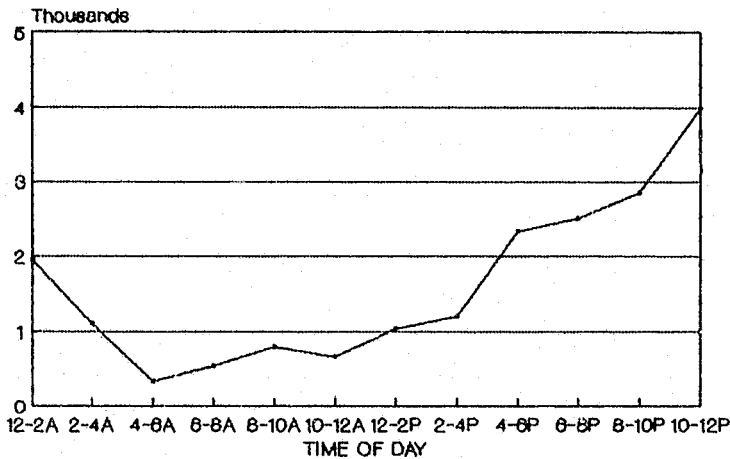

TWENTY-FOUR HOUR TREND, 1987**

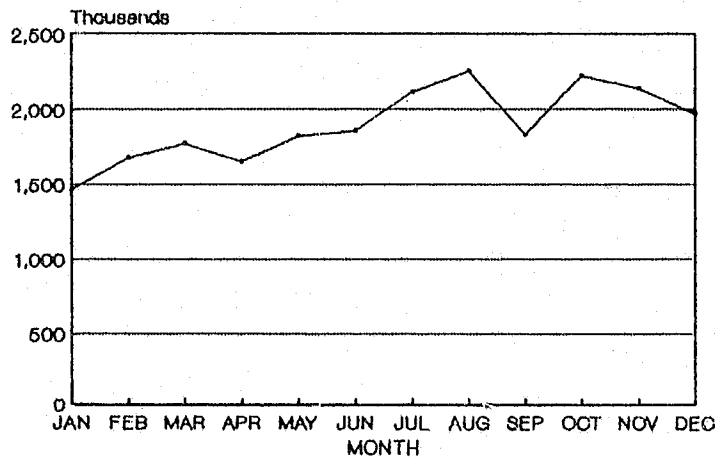

# ARSON

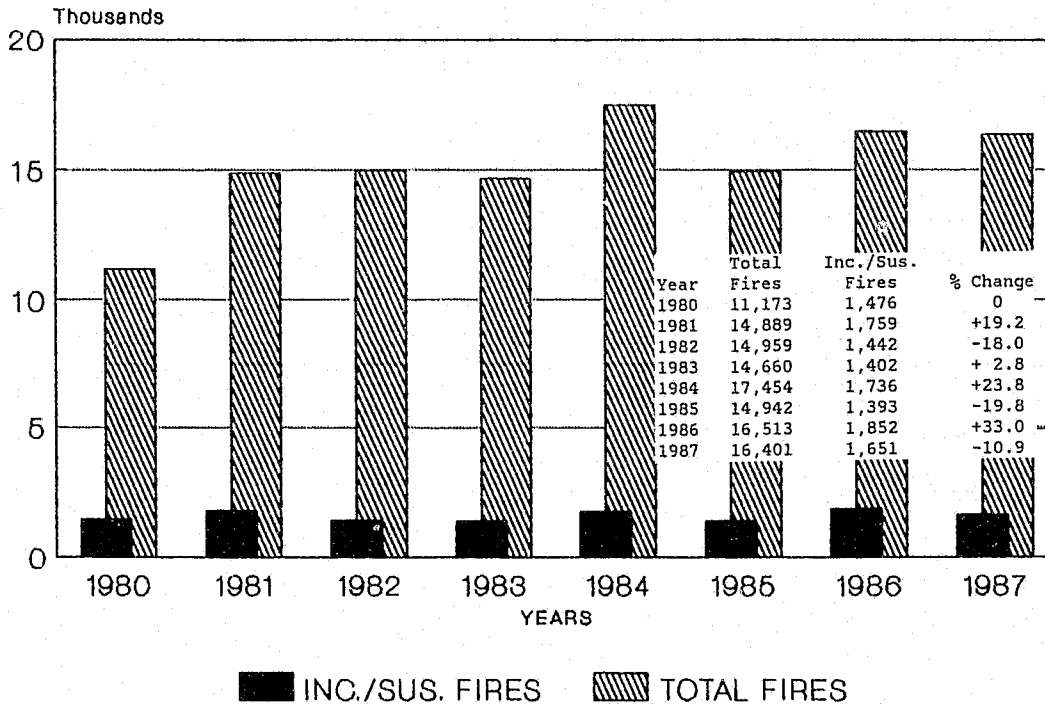
Arson is defined in K.S.A. 21-3718 as:

- "...knowingly, by means of fire or explosive
- (a) Damaging any building or property in which another person has any interest without the consent of such person;
  - or
  - (b) Damaging any building or property with intent to injure or defraud an insurer or lienholder."

Arson statistics for 1987 are based on information provided by the State Fire Marshal's Office as reported under the Kansas Fire Incident Reporting System (KFIRS).

The trend graph depicts yearly total fires as reported to KFIRS and the number of incendiary/suspicious fires. The data shows a substantial (46.8%) increase in fires from the beginning of the program in 1980 to present. The pie chart shows that grass/refuse fires are a primary problem to local firefighters.

### INCENDIARY/SUSPICIOUS FIRES TREND 1980 - 1987





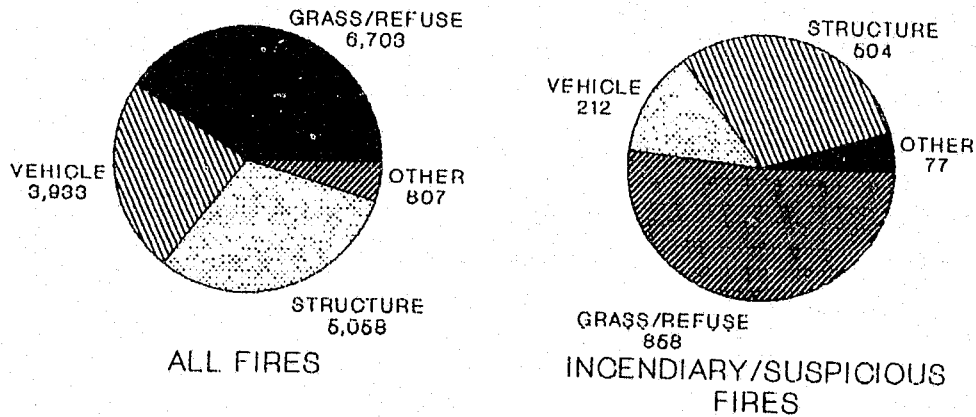

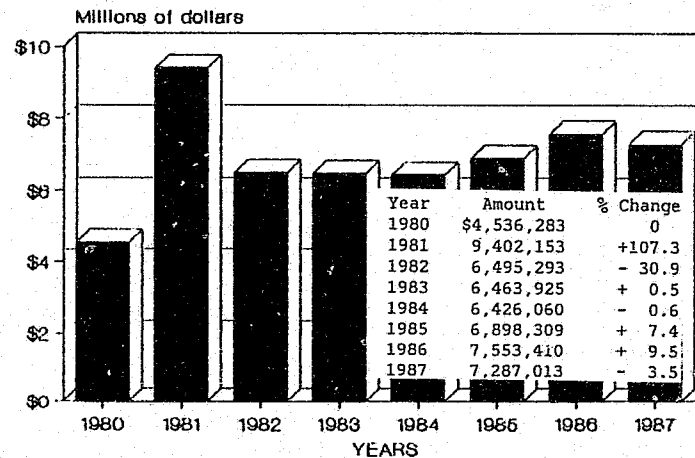

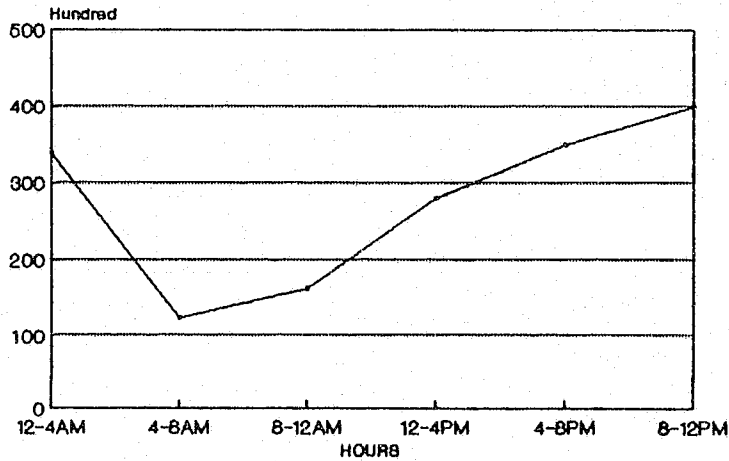

 TWENTY-FOUR HOUR TREND, 1987**

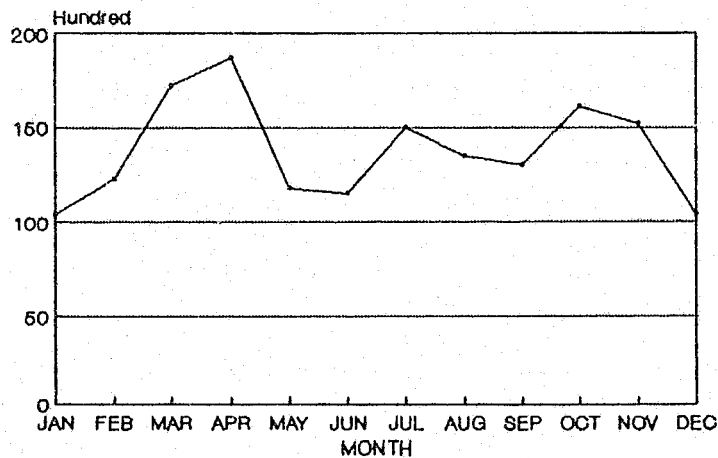

## STOLEN AND RECOVERED PROPERTY

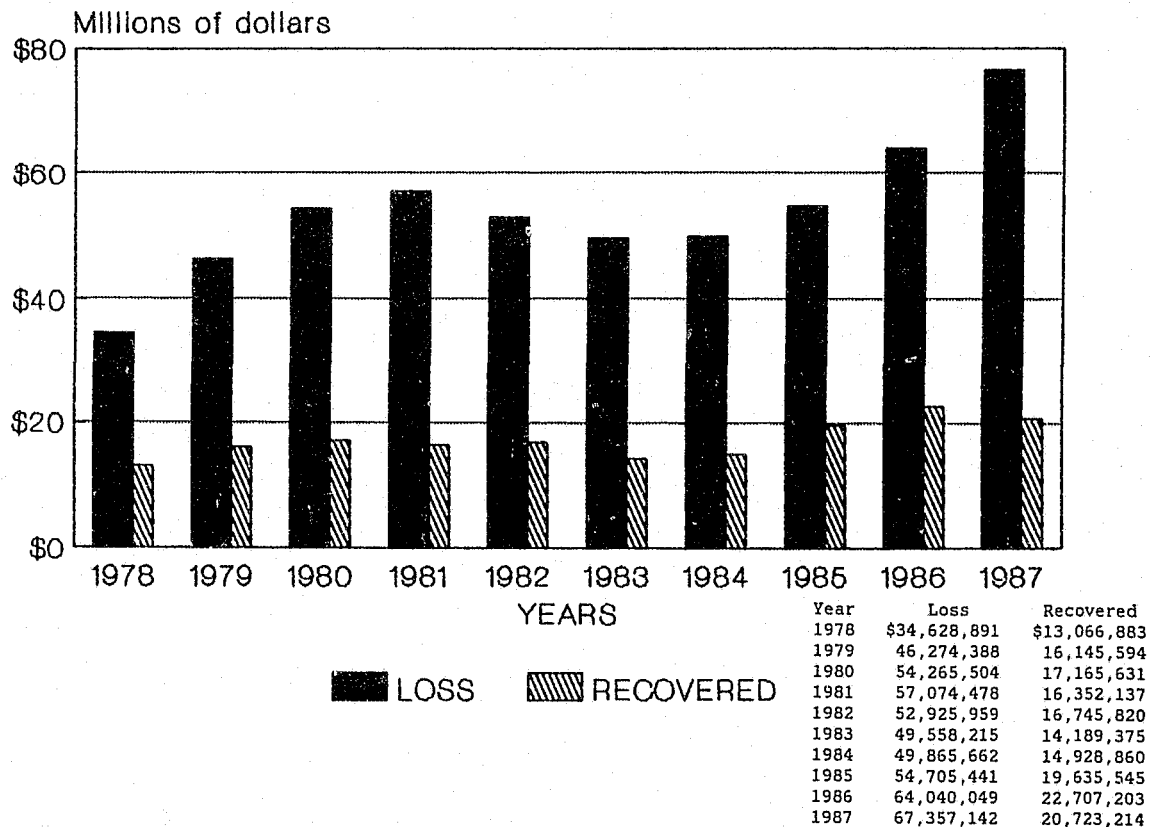
In 1987, property reported stolen equalled \$67,149,922. Agencies recovered \$20,723,214 of property that had been reported stolen either in, or prior to, 1987.

Motor vehicles accounted for 40.4% of property reported stolen and were the most frequently recovered property (81.2%).

Nearly 78% of reported stolen property was in cities with a population of over 10,000; recovered property totaled \$17,658,449 in these same cities.

A list of property reported stolen through the Incident Base Reporting System is included; this information is used to create the Kansas Stolen Property File. The file is used as a resource for law enforcement agencies to search for recovered property that may have been reported stolen by Kansas agencies. This system is unique in that only a property description is required for a search of the file. In 1987, this system had a 24% rate of identification.

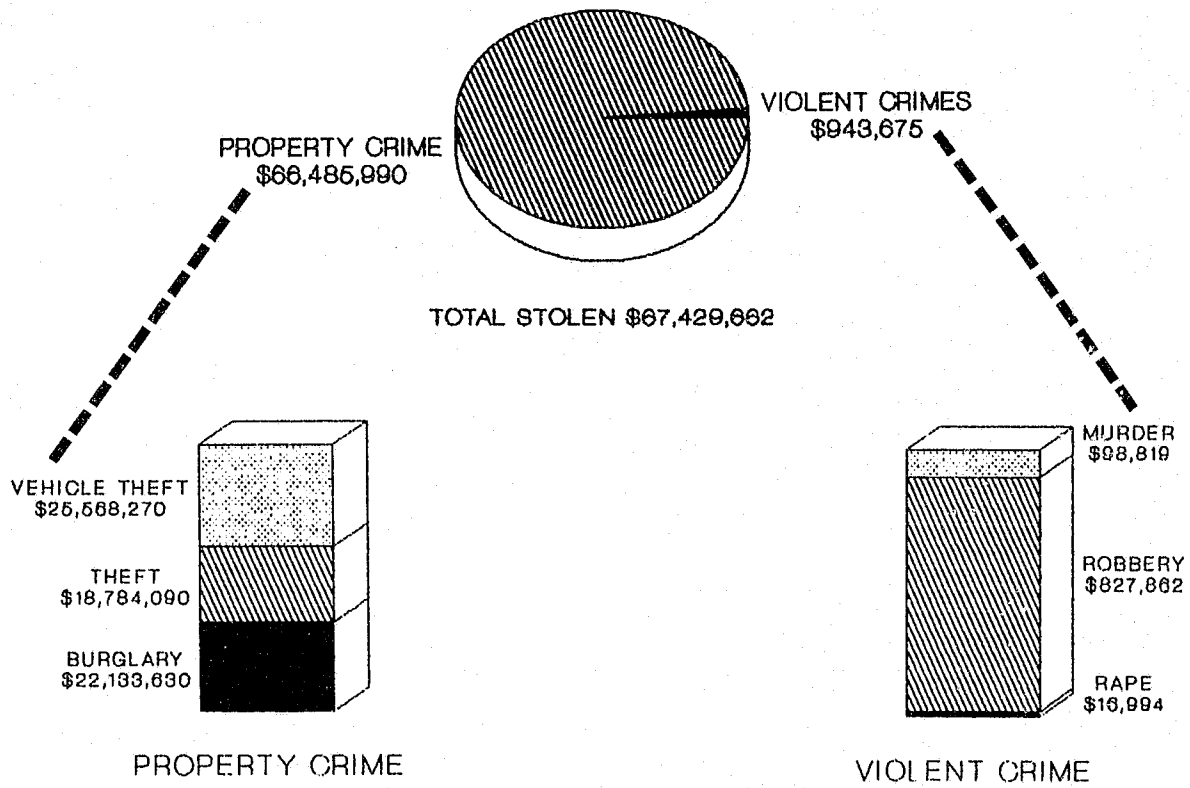
### PROPERTY LOSS AND RECOVERED TREND 1978 - 1987

## CRIME STUDY BY POPULATION GROUPING

The occurrence and complexion of crime in urban areas and in rural areas has long been of interest to those concerned with the criminal justice community and those charged with operating the criminal justice system. In order to respond to this interest, a grouping of counties by population has been established by the Kansas Bureau of Investigation and is presented here for the first time.

The 105 Kansas counties have been divided into four groups and are labeled and defined as follows:

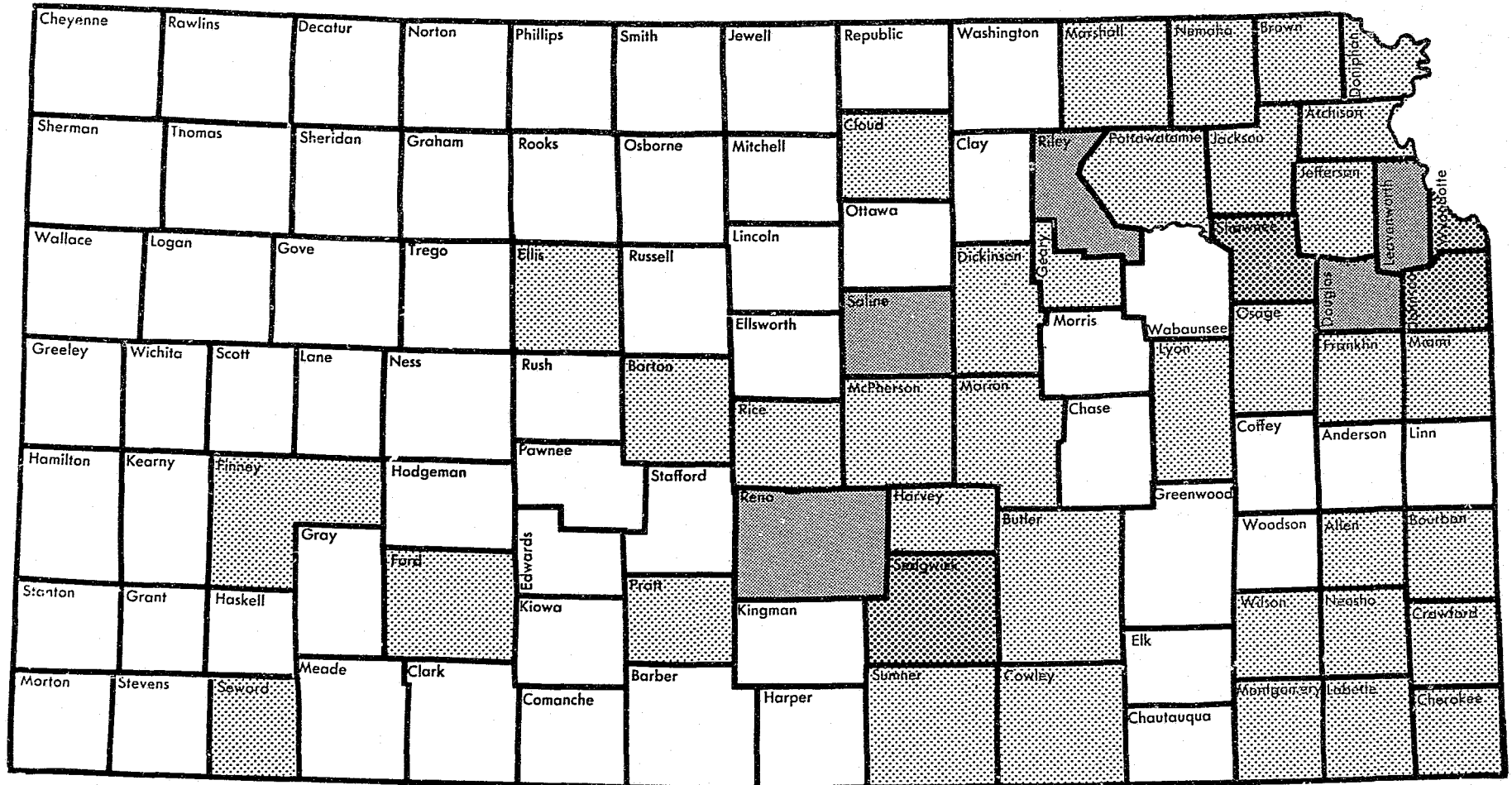

This crime study by population group will address questions concerning the urban vs. rural crime situation in Kansas. In considering this presentation, the reader should be aware of the type of community being considered. Grouping by population size considers only the population of the relevant area. It does not consider proximity to a major metropolitan area in spite of the fact that widely different crime patterns could be expected in a city of 30,000 which is a suburb of a large metro city and one which is in a more isolated area.

A listing of the counties included in each of the four groups, along with the total county population and the reported Crime Index Offenses, is shown below.

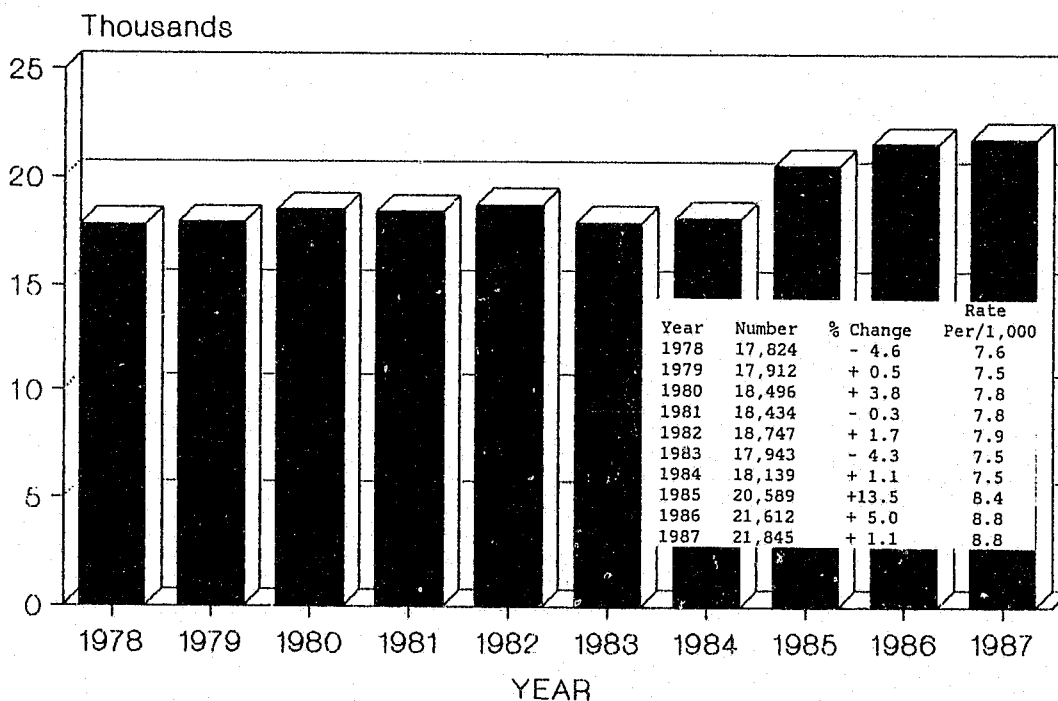
## ARRESTS

The total arrests for 1987 increased 4.0% as compared to 1986. The largest increase was adult arrests with 21,269 reported in 1987 and 19,802 in 1986. Both adult and juvenile males were arrested most frequently, accounting for 93.5% of total arrests.

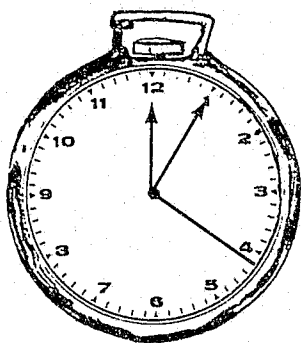
Juveniles seventeen years of age were the most often arrested accounting for 21.2% of all juvenile arrests. While the most frequently arrested adults were 25-29 amounting to 25.2% of total adult arrests.

The greatest number of juveniles arrested (5,275) were for the Part I crime of theft. The largest number of adults (14,416) for DUI.

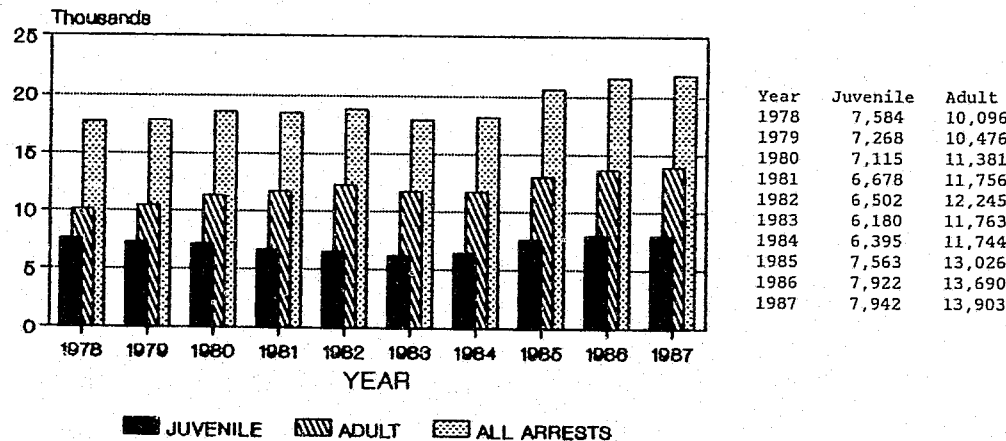

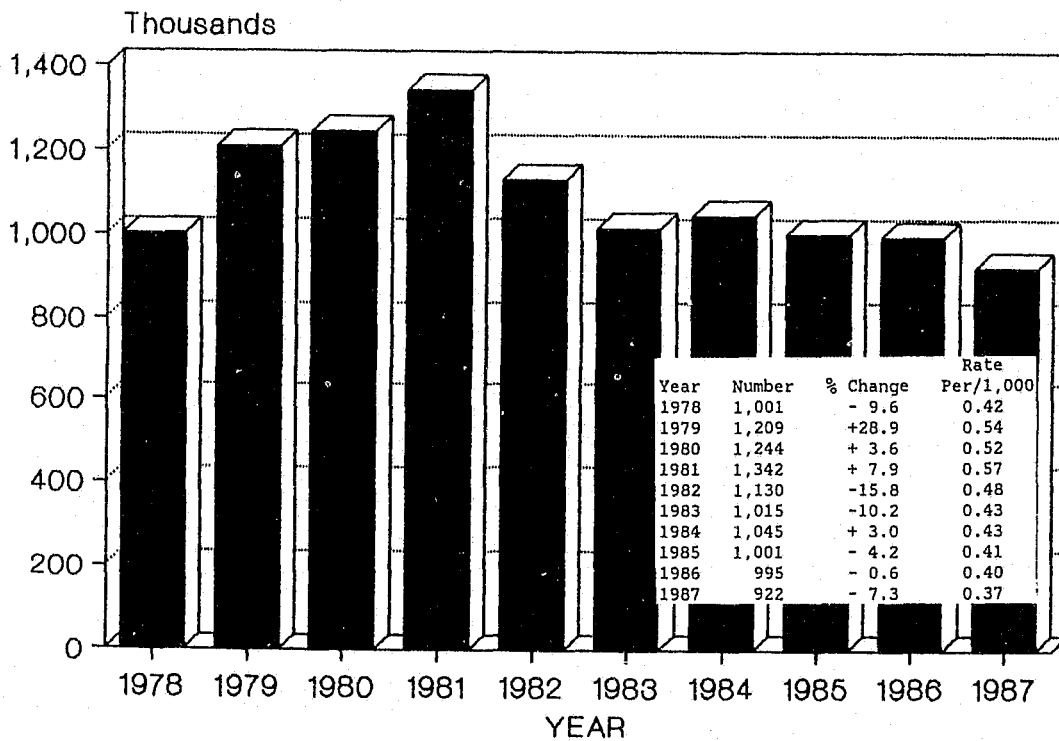

# LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED OR ASSAULTED

Kansas was fortunate in not having any law enforcement officers killed either accidentally or in the line of duty in 1987.

Assaults on law enforcement officers decreased 7.3%, from 995 in 1986 to 922 in 1987. Of these total assaults, 79% were without serious injury; 806 of these offenses, or 87.4% were committed by hands, fists, or feet. The highest incident of assault occurred while responding to some type of disturbance, with this category accounting for 48.3% of assaults. Approximately 66.1% of all assaults on law enforcement officers occurred between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 2:00 a.m.; ninety-two percent, or 852, of all assaults were cleared.

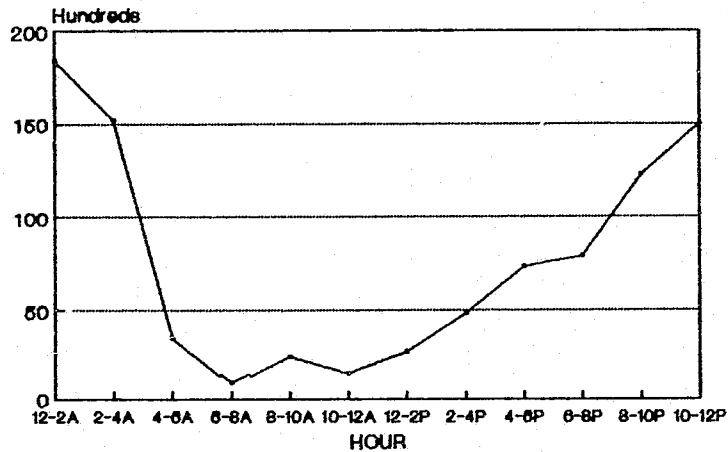

## LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES

Both the number of full-time sworn and civilian law enforcement employees for 1987, increased 9.8% as compared to 1986. There were 4,360 sworn employees and 1,530 civilian employees for a total of 5,890.

Over 67% of the civilian employees were female, and females represented 8.2% of the sworn employees. Most employees (1,456) had served 6-10 years in law enforcement and the majority 23.1% had been with the same agency that long. Nearly 62% of the law enforcement employees have attended college, and 1,599 have degrees.

**APPENDIX  
GLOSSARY**

## GLOSSARY

- ACTUAL OFFENSE:** An offense which law enforcement personnel confirm to have happened.
- ALL OTHER OFFENSES:** State and local offenses not otherwise specified.
- ARREST:** The act of taking a person into custody by authority of law, to charge him or her with a criminal offense or to initiate juvenile proceedings.
- ARSON:** Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud.
- ASSAULT, AGGRAVATED:** An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.
- ASSAULT, SIMPLE:** An unlawful attack or attempted attack by one person upon another in which no weapon was used and which did not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.
- BATTERY, AGGRAVATED:** The unlawful touching or application of force by one person upon another with intent of causing great bodily harm. This type of battery usually involves a deadly weapon or causes disfigurement, dismemberment, or death.
- BATTERY, SIMPLE:** The unlawful, intentional touching or application of force to the person of another, when done in a rude, insolent or angry manner.
- BURGLARY:** The unlawful entry of or concealment within a structure to commit a felony or theft.
- CLASS I:** Classification of offenses including the Crime Index and negligent manslaughter.
- CLASS II:** Classification of offenses encompassing all crimes not included in Class I. However, for purposes of this publication negligent manslaughter is included with the Class II offenses.
- CLEARANCE:** An offense that is "solved" where at least one person is arrested, charged, and turned over to the court for prosecution; or by "exceptional means" where extenuating circumstances prohibit the police officer from doing the above. Such reasons might include death of the offender, confession by an offender for another offense under different jurisdiction, denial of extradition, refusal of victim to cooperate, prosecution of offender for a lesser charge, and policy regarding handling of juveniles, etc.



**CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS:** Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, and aggravated assault/battery.

**CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY:** Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses robbery, burglary, theft, and motor vehicle theft.

**CRIME INDEX:** Classification of seven offenses selected for their seriousness, frequency of occurrence, and likelihood of being reported. Includes murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, aggravated assault/battery, burglary, theft, and motor vehicle theft, all of which share the feature of criminal intent.

**CRIMINAL DAMAGE TO PROPERTY:** The willfully injuring, damaging, mutilating, defacing, destroying, or substantially impairing the use of any property by means other than fire or explosives.

**CURFEW AND LOITERING LAW VIOLATIONS:** Transgressions of curfew or loitering ordinances pertaining to juveniles.

**DISORDERLY CONDUCT:** Committing or attempting to commit a breach of the peace. Includes affray; unlawful assembly; disturbing the peace; disturbing meetings; disorderly conduct in state institutions; prize fights; blasphemy, profanity, and obscene language; desecrating the flag; and refusing to assist an officer.

**DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE:** The driving or operating of any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.

**DRUG ABUSE VIOLATION:** Transgression of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs.

**DRUNKENNESS:** All offenses of drunkenness or intoxication except driving while intoxicated. Includes drunkenness, drunk and disorderly, common or habitual drunkard, and intoxication.

**EMBEZZLEMENT:** Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.

**FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING:** All offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of that which is true.

**FRAUD:** Converting and obtaining money or property by false pretenses other than forgery or counterfeiting.

**GAMBLING:** Promoting, permitting, or engaging in games of chance.

**INCENDIARY:** Involving a deliberate burning of property.

**INCIDENT:** A situation where offenses, (violations of local, state, or federal laws) occurs, more than one offense can be reported in one incident.

**INCIDENT-BASED REPORTING:** A system where criminal offense reports are submitted to a central repository on an individual basis for statistical and analysis purposes.

**JUVENILE:** Person under the age of eighteen.

**KANSAS PROPERTY FILE:** A list of property stolen or recovered by Kansas Law Enforcement agencies, which can be utilized as a data base for property searches.

**LIQUOR LAW VIOLATION:** Transgression of any state or local liquor law except drunkenness and driving while intoxicated.

**MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT:** The theft or attempted theft of a self-propelled vehicle that runs on the surface and not on rails.

**MULTIPLE OFFENSE SITUATION:** An incident where more than one offense is committed.

**MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER:** The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

**OFFENSES AGAINST FAMILY AND CHILDREN:** All charges of nonsupport and neglect of abuse of family or children.

**PREMISE:** The location where an offense occurred.

**PROPERTY CRIMES:** Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses burglary, theft, and motor vehicle theft.

**PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE:** Committing or attempting to commit sex offenses of a commercialized nature.

**RAPE:** The carnal knowledge of a person forcibly and against their will.

**REPORTED OFFENSE:** An act which comes to the attention of law enforcement authorities as a possible offense.

**ROBBERY:** The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

**RUNAWAY:** Protective custody of juveniles under local statute.

**SEX OFFENSES:** Offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like, other than forcible rape or prostitution and commercialized vice.

**STOLEN PROPERTY, BUYING, RECEIVING, AND POSSESSING:** Buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property or the attempt to commit any such offense.

SUSPICION: Arrests for examination by police, after which persons arrested are released.

THEFT: The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another or the attempt to do so.

UNFOUNDED OFFENSE: An act reported to law enforcement authorities which, upon investigation, proves to be not an offense.

VAGRANCY: Offenses of vagrancy, begging, loitering (adults), vagabondage, and being a "suspicious character or person, etc."

VANDALISM: The willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacing of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control, by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth, or any other such means as may be specified by local law.

VIOLENT CRIMES: Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault/battery.

WEAPONS OFFENSES: Offenses and attempted offenses against weapons regulations. Includes manufacture, sale, possession, or carrying open or concealed deadly weapons or silencers; furnishing deadly weapons to minors; possession of deadly weapons by aliens.

## STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

21-2501a. Maintenance of records of felony offenses and certain misdemeanors by law enforcement agencies; reports to bureau of investigation; form. (a) All law enforcement agencies having responsibility for law enforcement in any political subdivision of this state shall maintain, on forms approved by the attorney general, a permanent record of all felony offenses reported or known to have been committed within their respective jurisdictions, and of all misdemeanors or other offenses which involve the violation of the uniform controlled substances act.

(b) All law enforcement agencies having the responsibility of maintaining a permanent record of offenses shall file with the bureau of investigation, on a form approved by the attorney general, a report on each offense for which a permanent record is required within seventy-two (72) hours after such offense is reported or known to have been committed.

21-2504. Attorney general may call upon designated officers for information; forms. (a) For the purpose of controlling crime and obtaining reliable statistics about crime and criminals, the attorney general may call upon and obtain from the clerks of district courts, sheriffs, police departments and county attorneys all information that said attorney general may deem necessary in ascertaining the true condition of the crime situation; and it shall be the duty of the above-mentioned officers to furnish the information so requested by the attorney general.

(b) The attorney general shall provide, upon request, forms for fingerprint impressions, for the permanent record of offenses, and for the reports of offenses required by K.S.A. 21-2501 and 21-2501a.
