NATIONAL MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH CLEARINGHOUSE

The National Center (NCEMCH) and the National Clearinghouse (NMCHC) are sister organizations developed to provide education and information services in maternal and child health. Both agencies are funded by the Bureau of Maternal and Child Health and Resources Development of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

The Center responds to information requests, maintains a reference collection of MCH program materials, develops publications on maternal and child health topics, and provides technical assistance in educational resource development, program planning, and topical research.

The Clearinghouse provides current information through the collection and dissemination of publications on maternal and child health topics. Each month the Clearinghouse distributes more than 50,000 publications to over 2,000 requesters nationwide.

WHO IS SERVED BY THE CLEARINGHOUSE AND CENTER?

Federal, State, and local agencies; voluntary organizations; health professionals; and consumers.

HOW DO THE CLEARINGHOUSE AND CENTER RESPOND TO INFORMATION NEEDS?

The Clearinghouse maintains a large inventory of publications on a wide range of MCH topics and makes them available to the public through this catalog. Most of these publications are produced by the Bureau of Maternal and Child Health and Resources Development, the National Center for Education in Maternal and Child Health, the National Center for Clinical Infant Programs, or the Healthy Mothers, Healthy Babies Coalition. Some publications from other sources are also available.

When a request cannot be completely answered by sending publications from the Clearinghouse, the Center responds with appropriate information from its reference collection. This may include copies of educational materials, bibliographies, and referral to national and local sources for further information.

WHAT SUBJECT AREAS DO THE CLEARINGHOUSE AND CENTER COVER?

Maternal health, infant health, child health, adolescent health, children with special health care needs, and maternal and child health services and programs.

WHAT IS THE MCH REFERENCE COLLECTION?

An in-house collection of books, journals, professional and patient education materials, organization and program information, and instructional materials. These resources are used in responding to requests, providing technical assistance, and developing publications.

WHAT KINDS OF PUBLICATIONS DOES THE CENTER PRODUCE?

Resource directories, topical bibliographies, information packets, and other educational materials. Most are available through this catalog.

IN WHAT LANGUAGES ARE CLEARINGHOUSE AND CENTER PUBLICATIONS WRITTEN?

While most are in English, some publications are available in Spanish, Chinese, Korean, Lao, Tagalog, and Vietnamese.

HOW MUCH DO CLEARINGHOUSE AND CENTER PUBLICATIONS COST?

Most publications distributed by the Clearinghouse are available in limited quantities at no cost. Some are for sale by the Center, and they are listed in this catalog with their prices.
