THE ILLINOIS UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM

The Illinois Uniform Crime Reporting (I-UCR) Program was developed in 1971 and implemented on January 1, 1972. The I-UCR Program has evolved into a system intended to meet the needs of all reporting agencies. It is an incident-based reporting system designed to accomplish the following major goals:

- To provide needed administrative statistics for law enforcement agencies.
- To provide the legislature with information necessary to formulate effective laws which address the crime problem.
- To provide Illinois citizens with the most complete information on the nature and extent of crime.
- To include comprehensive data for researchers and planners.
- To adhere to the national program's standards.

Reporting crime statistics is mandated by chapter 38, paragraph 206-8 of the *Illinois Revised Statutes*:

206-8. Crime Statistics.8. The Department (of State Police) shall be a central repository and custodian of crime statistics for the State and it shall have all power incident thereto to carry out the purposes of this Act, including the power to demand and receive cooperation in the submission of crime statistics from all units of government.

Reporting agencies receive monthly and quarterly summaries of the reported criminal activity within their jurisdictions upon request. All offenses known to law enforcement agencies are reported monthly to the Crime Studies Section of the Bureau of Identification. Participating jurisdictions include villages, municipalities, counties, colleges, universities, park districts, railroads, and hospitals throughout Illinois. Agencies may also submit service code and local ordinance data in order to provide law enforcement administrators with information for use in planning and research, determining and utilizing manpower, budgeting, and developing and evaluating crime prevention programs.

In 1988, there were 1,002 law enforcement agencies in Illinois, 744 of which reported crime statistics directly to the Bureau of Identification. The remaining agencies reported their crime statistics through an intermediary agency (sheriff's office, police department, etc.). Agencies submit their data through the use of paper forms, computer printouts, magnetic tape, floppy disk, or via remote on-line terminals.

CONSIDERATIONS FOR INTERPRETATION

When comparing the crime statistics of one agency with another, many factors should be taken into consideration before conclusions are made. Some of the conditions affecting the type and volume of crime are:

- Population density and degree of urbanization with size of locality and its surrounding area.
- Variations in composition of the population, particularly youth concentration.
- Stability of population with respect to residents' mobility, commuting patterns, and transient factors.
- Modes of transportation and highway system.
- Economic conditions, including median income, destitution, and job availability.
- Cultural conditions, such as educational, recreational, and religious characteristics.
- Family conditions with respect to divorce and family cohesiveness.
- Climate.
- Effective strength of law enforcement agencies.
- Administrative and investigative emphases of law enforcement.
- Policies of other components of the criminal justice system (i.e., prosecutorial, judicial, correctional, and probational).
- Attitudes of citizenry toward crime.
- Crime reporting practices of citizenry.¹

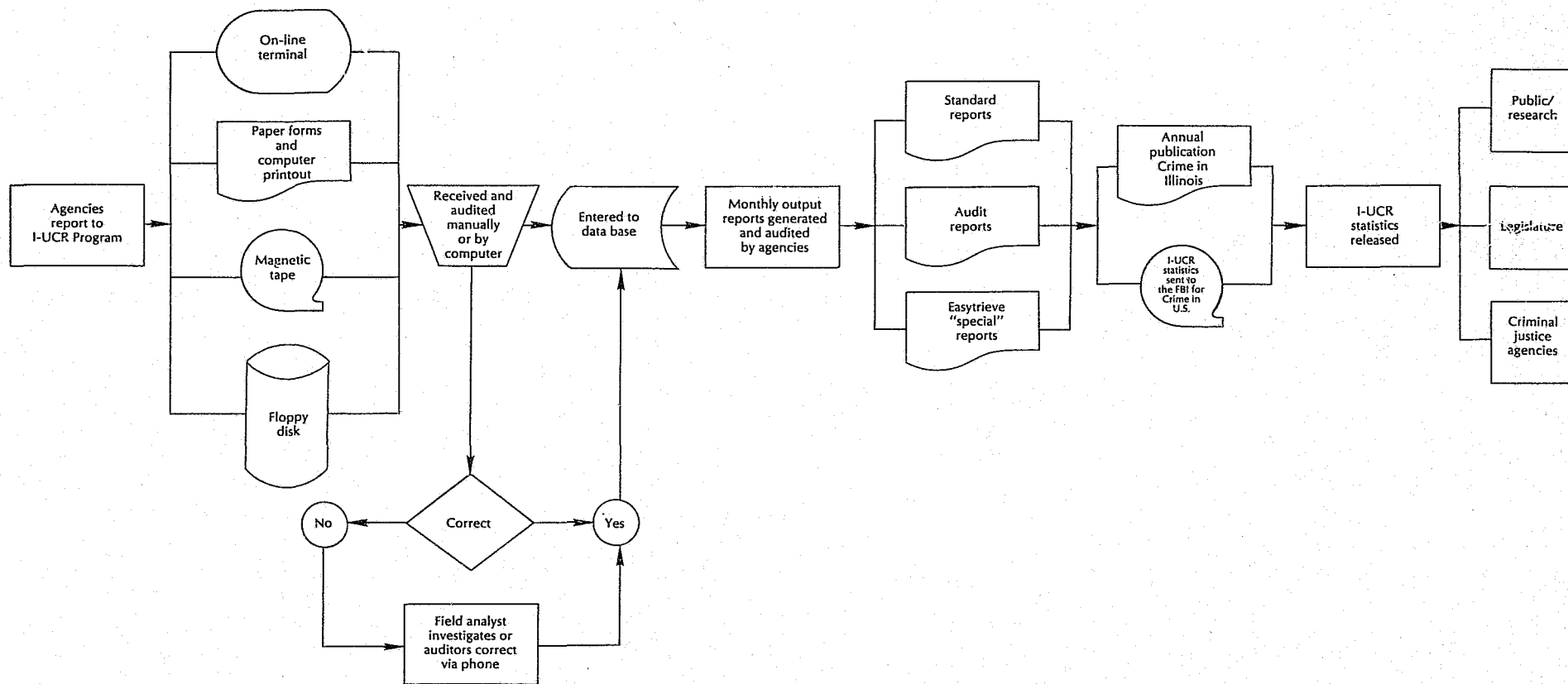

THE CRIME INDEX

The Crime Index is the total number of index offenses occurring within a given jurisdiction during a specified period of time. It is used to indicate the amount and extent of serious crimes as defined by the International Association of Chiefs of Police Committee on Uniform Crime Reports. The Crime Index consists of violent crimes — murder and voluntary manslaughter; forcible rape; robbery; and aggravated assault, aggravated battery, and attempted murder, and of property crimes — burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson.

The index crimes used by the I-UCR Program translate into the national program's eight Crime Index offenses as:

Violent Crimes

Murder and voluntary manslaughter — The willful killing of a person or the death of a person caused by gross negligence of an individual other than the victim.

Forcible rape — The carnal knowledge of a female, forcibly and against her will; includes attempted rape. Illinois reports criminal sexual assault offenses rather than rape offenses under this category.

Robbery — The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence; includes attempted robbery.

Aggravated assault — The intentional causing of serious bodily harm or the intentional attempt or threat of serious bodily injury or death; includes aggravated battery and attempted murder.

Property Crimes

Burglary — The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft; includes attempted burglary.

Theft — The unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles without the use of force, violence, or fraud; includes burglary from motor vehicle and attempts.

Motor vehicle theft — The unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle; includes attempted motor vehicle theft.

Arson — The willful or malicious burning or attempts to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building or any building, motor vehicle, aircraft, or personal property of another.

THE CRIME RATE

The crime rate indicates the volume of crime occurring within a given population. It is defined as the total number of index crimes per 100,000 inhabitants and is calculated as follows:

$$\frac{\text{Crime Index} \times 100,000}{\text{jurisdictional population}} = \text{crime rate}$$

The jurisdictional population can be that of a city, town, village, state, or nation.

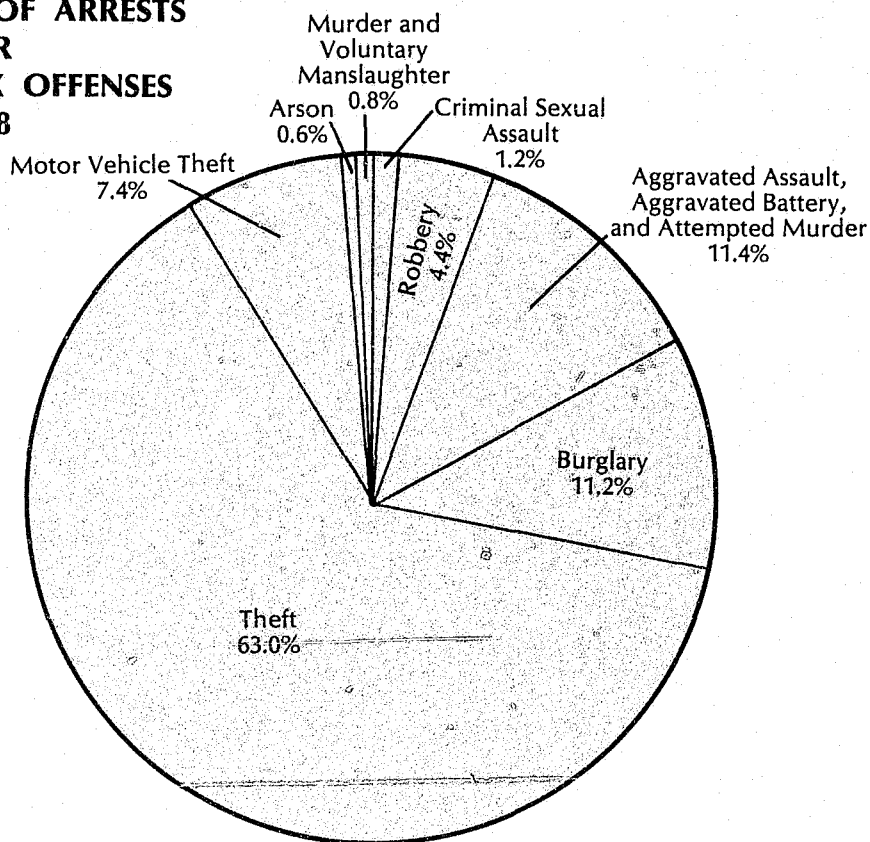

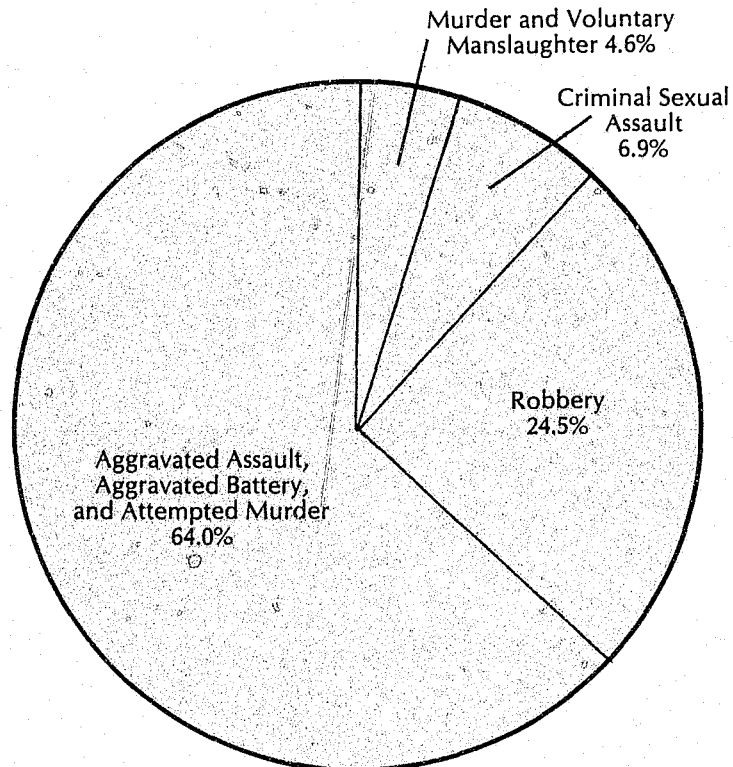

MURDER AND VOLUNTARY MANSLAUGHTER

The index offenses of murder and voluntary manslaughter are merged in accordance with the national program definition and are based solely on police investigation.

Effective July 1, 1987, the provisions of these statutes were amended and included in the offenses of first degree murder (*Illinois Revised Statutes*, chapter 38, paragraph 9-1) and second degree murder (*Illinois Revised Statutes*, chapter 38, paragraph 9-2) respectively. Since the changes took effect during the reporting year, the I-UCR offense code change was not implemented until January 1, 1988. However, the new classifications are shown in various reports due to data processing requirements.

Murder

38 § 9-1.

- (a) A person who kills an individual without lawful justification commits murder if, in performing the acts which cause the death:
 - (1) He either intends to kill or do great bodily harm to that individual or another, or knows that such acts will cause death to that individual or another; or
 - (2) He knows that such acts create a strong probability of death or great bodily harm to that individual or another; or
 - (3) He is attempting or committing a forcible felony other than voluntary manslaughter.

Voluntary manslaughter

38 § 9-2.

- (a) A person who kills an individual without lawful justification commits voluntary manslaughter if at the time of the killing he is acting under a sudden and intense passion resulting from serious provocation by:
 - (1) The individual killed; or
 - (2) Another whom the offender endeavors to kill, but he negligently or accidentally causes the death of the individual killed.

Serious provocation is conduct sufficient to excite an intense passion in a reasonable person.
- (b) A person who intentionally or knowingly kills an individual commits voluntary manslaughter if at the time of the killing he believes the circumstances to be such that, if they existed, would justify or exonerate the killing under the principles stated in chapter 38, Article 7, *Illinois Revised Statutes*, but his belief is unreasonable.

First degree murder (Effective July 1, 1987)

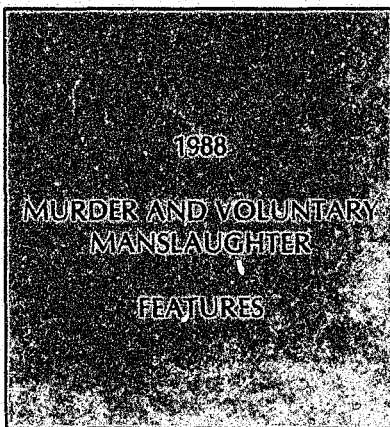
38 § 9-1.

- (a) A person who kills an individual without lawful justification commits first degree murder if, in performing the acts which cause the death:
 - (1) He either intends to kill or do great bodily harm to that individual or another, or knows that such acts will cause death to that individual or another; or
 - (2) He knows that such acts create a strong probability of death or great bodily harm to that individual or another; or
 - (3) He is attempting or committing a forcible felony other than second degree murder.

Second degree murder (Effective July 1, 1987)

38 § 9-2.

- (a) A person commits the offense of second degree murder when he commits the offense of first degree murder as defined in paragraphs (1) or (2) of subsection (a) of Section 9-1 of this Code and either of the following mitigating factors are present:
 - (1) At the time of the killing he is acting under a sudden and intense passion resulting from serious provocation by the individual killed or another whom the offender endeavors to kill, but he negligently or accidentally causes the death of the individual killed; or
 - (2) At the time of the killing he believes the circumstances to be such that, if they existed, would justify or exonerate the killing under the principles stated in Article 7 of this Code, but his belief is unreasonable.
- (b) Serious provocation is conduct sufficient to excite an intense passion in a reasonable person.

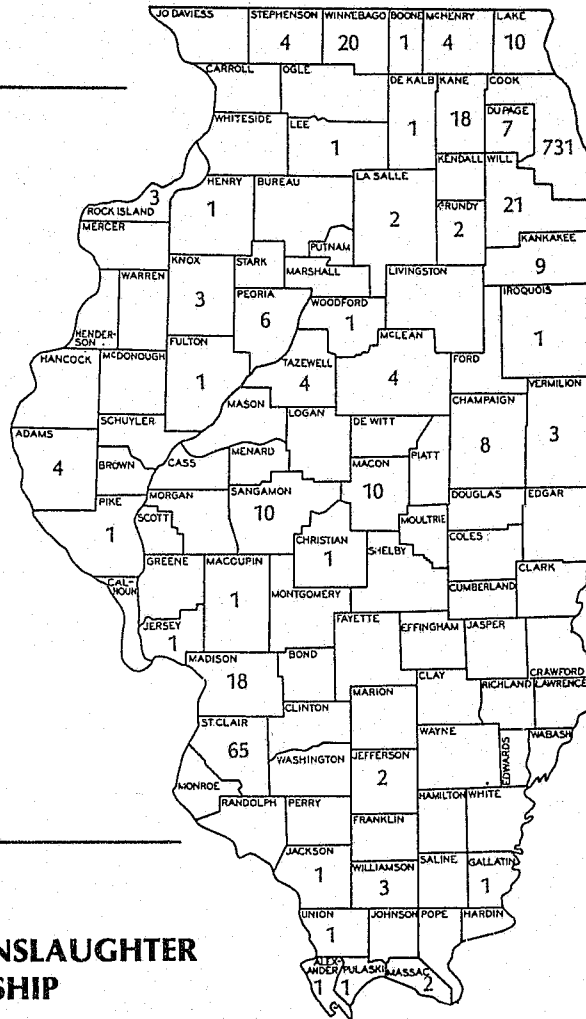

38 § 12-13.

- (a) *The accused commits criminal sexual assault if he or she:*
- (1) *commits an act of sexual penetration by the use of force or threat or force; or*
 - (2) *commits an act of sexual penetration and the accused knew that the victim was unable to understand the nature of the act or was unable to give knowing consent; or*
 - (3) *commits an act of sexual penetration with a victim who was under 18 years of age when the act was committed and the accused was a family member.*

Aggravated Criminal Sexual Assault

38 § 12-14.

- (a) *The accused commits aggravated criminal sexual assault if he or she commits criminal sexual assault and any of the following aggravating circumstances existed during the commission of the offense:*
- (1) *the accused displayed, threatened to use, or used a dangerous weapon or any object fashioned or utilized in such a manner as to lead the victim under the circumstances reasonably to believe it to be a dangerous weapon; or*
 - (2) *the accused caused bodily harm to the victim; or*
 - (3) *the accused acted in such a manner as to threaten or endanger the life of the victim or any other person; or*
 - (4) *the criminal sexual assault was perpetrated during the course of the commission or attempted commission of any other felony by the accused; or*
 - (5) *the victim was 60 years of age or over when the offense was committed.*
 - (6) *The victim was a physically handicapped person.*
- (b) *The accused commits aggravated criminal sexual assault if:*
- (1) *the accused was 17 years of age or over and commits an act of sexual penetration with a victim who was under 13 years of age when the act was committed; or*
 - (2) *the accused was under 17 years of age and (i) commits an act of sexual penetration with a victim who was under 9 years of age when the act was committed; or (ii) commits an act of sexual penetration with a victim who was at least 9 years of age but under 13 years of age when the act was committed and the accused used force or threat of force to commit the act.*

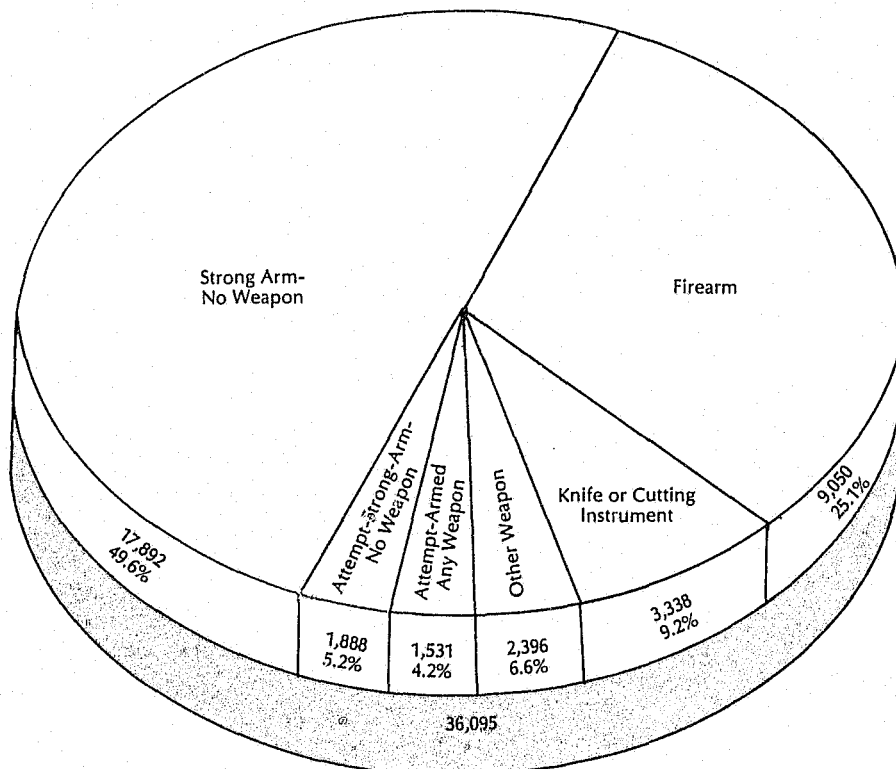

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT, AGGRAVATED BATTERY, AND ATTEMPTED MURDER

Aggravated assault, aggravated battery, and attempted murder make up the aggravated assault category of the national program. The offenses of simple battery, simple assault, battery or assault without intent to do great bodily harm, and reckless conduct are not included in this crime category. These other offenses are included in the I-UCR Program under a subcategory in order to be consistent with the national program.

Aggravated assault

38 § 12-2.

- (a) A person commits an aggravated assault, when, in committing an assault, he:
(1) Uses a deadly weapon.

Other subparagraphs of this statute are accounted for in the I-UCR Program under a subcategory in order to be consistent with the national program. The intent here is to threaten great bodily harm both at the state and national level regarding index crimes.

Aggravated battery

Aggravated battery is the furtherance of the assault whereby physical contact is made resulting in great bodily harm.

38 § 12-4.

- (a) A person who, in committing a battery, intentionally or knowingly causes great bodily harm, or permanent disability or disfigurement commits aggravated battery.
(b) Uses a deadly weapon.
(c) A person who administers to an individual or causes him to take, without his consent or by threat or deception, and for other than medical purposes, any intoxicating, poisonous, stupefying, narcotic, or anesthetic substance commits aggravated battery.
(d) A person who knowingly gives to another person any food that contains any substance or object that is intended to cause physical injury if eaten, commits aggravated battery.

Attempted murder

(See the definition of murder.)

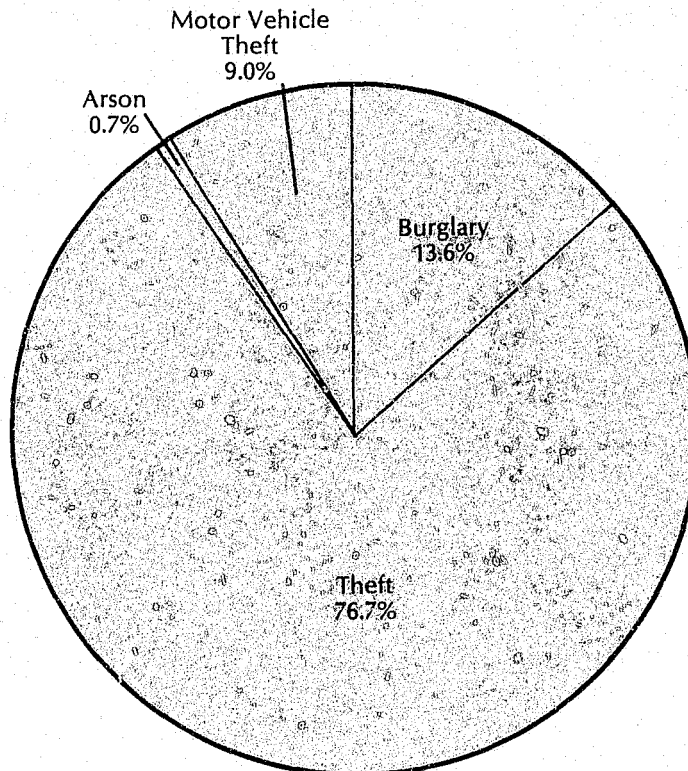

BURGLARY

The Illinois Uniform Crime Reporting Program has two categories of burglary: burglary and burglary from motor vehicle. Burglary from motor vehicle is categorized as theft on the national level in the index crime of larceny/theft. In order to be consistent with the national program, the Illinois statute for burglary is divided and burglary from motor vehicle data are included in the theft category.

38 § 19-1.

- (a) *A person commits burglary when without authority he knowingly enters or without authority remains within a building, housetrailer, watercraft, aircraft, or motor vehicle as defined by the Illinois Vehicle Code, railroad car, or any part thereof, with intent to commit therein a felony or theft.*

Theft

38 § 16-1.

A person commits theft when he knowingly:

- (a) Obtains or exerts unauthorized control over property of the owner; or*
- (b) Obtains by deception control over property of the owner; or*
- (c) Obtains by threat control over property of the owner; or*
- (d) Obtains control over stolen property knowing the property to have been stolen or under such circumstances as would reasonably induce him to believe that the property was stolen, and*
 - (1) Intends to deprive the owner permanently of the use or benefit of the property; or*
 - (2) Knowingly uses, conceals or abandons the property in such manner as to deprive the owner permanently of such use or benefit; or*
 - (3) Uses, conceals, or abandons the property knowing such use, concealment or abandonment probably will deprive the owner permanently of such use or benefit.*

Arson

38 § 20-1.

A person commits arson when, by means of fire or explosive, he knowingly:


- (a) *Damages any real property, or any personal property having a value of \$150 or more, of another without his consent; or*
- (b) *With intent to defraud an insurer, damages any property or any personal property having a value of \$150 or more.*

Property "of another" means a building or other property, whether real or personal, in which a person other than the offender has an interest which the offender has no authority to defeat or impair, even though the offender may also have an interest in the building or property.

Aggravated arson

38 § 20-1.1.

- (a) *A person commits aggravated arson when, in the course of committing arson, he knowingly damages, partially or totally, any building or structure, including any adjacent building or structure, and:*
 - (1) *He knows or reasonably should know that one or more persons are present therein; or*
 - (2) *Any person suffers great bodily harm, or permanent disability or disfigurement as a result of the fire or explosion.*
 - (3) *A fireman or policeman who is present at the scene acting in the line of duty, is injured as a result of the fire or explosion.*

VANDALISM

As used in the national program, the term vandalism includes a broad range of malicious behavior such as cutting auto tires, drawing obscene pictures on public walls, smashing windows, destroying school records, etc. Vandalism statistics are not part of the Crime Index, but are presented here for general interest.

The I-UCR Program includes criminal damage to property, criminal damage to vehicle, criminal damage to state supported property, criminal damage to fire fighting apparatus, and institutional vandalism in the data presented under the heading of vandalism.

Criminal damage to property

(This includes criminal damage to vehicle.)

38 § 21-1.

Any of the following acts, except any act described in paragraph (g), is a Class A misdemeanor, and any act enumerated in paragraph (a) or (f) when the damage to property exceeds \$300, is a Class 4 felony:

- (a) *Knowingly damages any property of another without his consent; or*
- (b) *Recklessly by means of fire or explosive damages property of another; or*
- (c) *Knowingly starts a fire on the land of another without his consent; or*
- (d) *Knowingly injures a domestic animal of another without his consent; or*
- (e) *Knowingly deposits on the land or in the building of another, without his consent, any stink bomb or any offensive smelling compound and thereby intends to interfere with the use by another of the land or building; or*
- (f) *Damages any property, other than property described in Subsection 20-1(3), with intent to defraud an insurer; or*
- (g) *Knowingly shooting of a firearm at any portion of a railroad train is a Class 4 felony; or*
- (h) *Knowingly damages the property of another without his consent by defacing, deforming or otherwise damaging such property by the use of paint or any other similar substance.*

Criminal damage to state supported property

38 § 21-4.

Any of the following acts is a Class A misdemeanor when the damage to property is \$500 or less, and any such act is a Class 4 felony when the damage to property exceeds \$500:

- (a) *Knowingly damages any property supported in whole or in part with state funds or federal funds administered or granted through state agencies without the consent of the state; or*
- (b) *Knowingly by means of fire or explosive damages property supported in whole or in part with state funds or federal funds administered or granted through state agencies; or*
- (c) *Knowingly starts a fire on property supported in whole or in part with state funds or federal funds administered or granted through state agencies without the consent of the state; or*
- (d) *Knowingly deposits on land or in a building supported in whole or in part with state funds, or federal funds administered or granted through state agencies without the consent of the state, any stink bomb or any offensive smelling compound and thereby intends to interfere with the use by another of the land or building.*

Criminal damage of fire fighting apparatus, hydrants or equipment


38 § 21-1.1.

Whoever willfully and maliciously cuts, injures, damages, tampers with or destroys or defaces any fire hydrant or any fire hose or any fire engine, or other public or private fire fighting equipment, or any apparatus appertaining to such equipment, or intentionally opens any fire hydrant without proper authorization, is guilty of a Class B misdemeanor.

Institutional vandalism

38 § 21-1.2.

- (a) A person commits institutional vandalism when, by reasons of the race, color, creed, religion or national origin of another individual or group of individuals, he knowingly and without consent inflicts damage to any of the following properties, provided that the damage inflicted is at least \$300:
- (1) Any church, synagogue or other building, structure or place used for religious worship or other religious purpose;
 - (2) Any cemetery, mortuary, or other facility used for the purpose of burial or memorializing the dead;
 - (3) Any school, educational facility or community center;
 - (4) The grounds adjacent to, and owned or rented by, any institution, facility, building, structure or place described in paragraphs (1), (2) or (3) above; or
 - (5) Any personal property contained in any institution, facility, building, structure or place described in paragraphs (1), (2) or (3) above.
- (b) Institutional vandalism is a Class 3 felony.
- (c) Independent of any criminal prosecution or the result thereof, any person suffering damage to property or injury to his person as a result of institutional vandalism may bring a civil action for damages, injunction or other appropriate relief. The court may award actual damages, including damages for emotional distress, or punitive damages. A judgment may include attorney's fees and costs. The parents or legal guardians of an unemancipated minor, other than guardians appointed pursuant to the Juvenile Court Act, shall be liable for the amount of any judgment for actual damages rendered against such minor under this subsection (c) in any amount not exceeding the amount provided under Section 5 of the Parental Responsibility Law.

ADULT AND JUVENILE ARREST DATA

The Adult and Juvenile Arrest Trend report is produced annually upon request for each reporting agency and summarized on the state level. Index crime arrest information are developed from this summary.

The **Adult and Juvenile Arrest Trend** report includes:

Total Adults Arrested — compiled from police dispositions of Arrested and Held for Prosecution (including Released on Bond); Summoned, Cited, or Notified; Released Without Charge; and Referred to Other Agency.

Total Juveniles Arrested — compiled from police dispositions of Handled within Department and Released; Summoned, Cited, or Notified; Referred to Welfare Agency; Referred to Juvenile Court; Referred to Criminal or Adult Court; and Referred to Other Agency.

Total Adult and Juvenile Arrests.

Adult and juvenile arrest totals for 1988 should be considered with caution when compared to 1987 figures. In 1988, Chicago Police Department (CPD) began reporting arrests for aggravated assault as index offense arrests. The statewide increase in arrest totals for this offense is chiefly the result of this CPD reporting change.

CRIME INDEX/CRIME RATE DATA

Caution should be exercised when reviewing and using these data. The many social factors related to crime and a community's residential population — used to calculate the crime rate — must be considered when making statistical comparisons. A community may have a small residential population but a large moving population because of a substantial number of manufacturers, motels, etc., within its jurisdiction. The large moving population attracts criminal behavior that occurs within the small jurisdiction and must be reported by the law enforcement agency. The crime rate calculation does not compensate for a moving population. The statistics can make it appear that crimes are committed by community residents when this is not necessarily true.

The Crime Index/Crime Rate Comparison Report is in alphabetical order by county. To determine in which county a particular agency may be located, refer to the Law Enforcement Employees Report in Section VI.

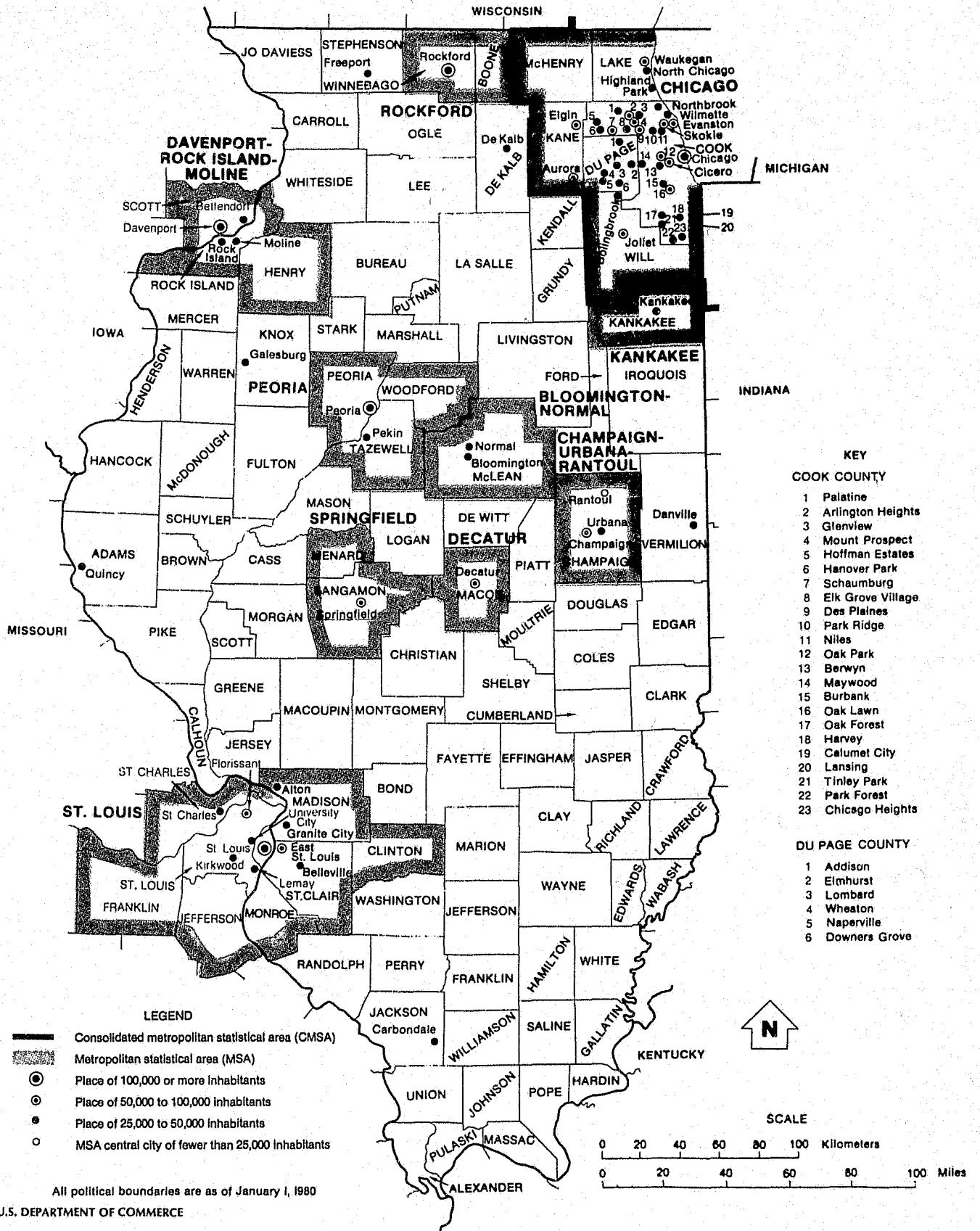

Areas outside of Illinois that are included in an MSA are not represented in the statistics presented here. In some cases, the percentages may not equal 100 due to rounding.

MSA Summary

The estimated population of core cities and suburban areas — the two regions that comprise the MSAs — accounts for 81.0 percent of the state population. The total MSA index crimes account for 91.8 percent of the Illinois Crime Index.

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED

During 1988, three Illinois Law Enforcement Officers were killed by felonious act and two by accident. A brief narrative on the circumstances surrounding each death is presented below:

January

Illinois State Police — On January 15, 1988, a Special Agent, a nineteen-year veteran of the force, became the fifty-third Illinois State Police Officer to die in the line of duty. The Special Agent was fatally wounded during a staged motorist assist incident which was conducted as part of an investigation by Illinois State Police for a solicitation to commit murder offense. The armed offender was fatally wounded by other officers who were assisting with staging the motorist assist incident.

April

Lockport Police Department — On April 1, 1988, at approximately 10:45 p.m., an officer sustained injuries, which were later fatal, from a motor vehicle accident occurring on Highway 171 near Ludwig School. The officer was responding to a call pertaining to a man with a gun while in a marked vehicle. The occupants of the other vehicle were injured and taken to the hospital.

May

Chicago Police Department — On May 19, 1988, a 50-year-old officer with 18 years of experience with the department was killed in a motor vehicle accident. The officer was enroute to address a Senior Citizen and Disabled group when the unmarked vehicle crashed into a tree at 1500 South Sacramento Avenue.

Chicago Police Department — On May 21, 1988, a 27-year-old officer, while off duty assisted other officers from the fourth district who had been assigned to disburse offenders causing a disturbance in the North Wolf area. Later, while the officer was returning to his home, the officer was ambushed and assaulted by five offenders. The extensive injuries proved fatal.

September

Chicago Police Department — On September 22, 1988, a 40-year-old female officer with 12 years of experience with the department was fatally wounded after confronting an armed offender at the Moses Montefiore School, 1300 South Ashland. This was the second Chicago Police Department female officer to be killed in the line of duty.

LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYMENT INFORMATION

The employment rate for law enforcement personnel is calculated as follows:

$$\frac{\text{number of employees} \times 1,000}{\text{jurisdictional population}} = \text{employment rate}$$

Example:

A department with 60 employees in a population of 51,000 has an employment rate of 1.2 per 1,000 inhabitants.

$$\frac{60 \times 1,000}{51,000} = 1.2 \text{ per } 1,000 \text{ inhabitants}$$

Law enforcement employment rates should not be correlated with index crimes; non-index offenses and the many services performed by the typical law enforcement officer amount to over 80 percent of the officer's workload, the details of which usually remain unpublished. Each community should consider all the factors related to the causes of crime and determine the role of the law enforcement department relative to crime and to required services.

The 25,270 part- and full-time sworn officers in 1988 account for 84.2 percent of the police department work force. The 1988 employment rate for sworn employees of police departments is 2.7 per 1,000 inhabitants. The 4,732 civilian employees comprise 15.8 percent of the police department work force, with an employment rate of .5 per 1,000 inhabitants.

The 3,514 part- and full-time sworn officers in 1988 account for 73 percent of the sheriffs' offices work force. The 1988 employment rate for sworn employees of sheriffs' office is 1.7 per 1,000 inhabitants. The 1,299 civilian employees comprise 27 percent of the sheriffs' offices work force, with an employment rate of .6 per 1,000 inhabitants.
