

FACTS AT A GLANCE

CRIME CLOCKS

In 1988, an Index Crime occurred on the average of one every 3.2 minutes, a violent crime every 35.7 minutes and property crime every 3.5 minutes.

INDEX CRIME

There were 165,220 Index Offenses reported in 1988, an increase of 5,298 over the 1987 total. This is the fourth consecutive year showing an increase in crime.

CRIME RATE

The Crime Rate for the State of Connecticut was determined to be 5097.8 Index Offenses for every 100,000 residents. The 1988 population is estimated at 3,241,000 persons.

The Rate of Violent Crime increased from 418.3 per 100,000 residents in 1987 to 454.9 per 100,000 residents in 1988, an increase of 8.7%.

The Rate of Property Crime increased from 4,562.2 offenses per 100,000 to 4,642.9 per 100,000 residents which is an increase of 1.8%.

VIOLENT CRIME

The Crimes of Murder, Rape, Robbery and Aggravated Assault make up the Violent Crime category. Collectively, Violent Crime increased by 1,312 offenses, a 9.8% increase.

The Crimes of Murder and Aggravated Assault increased by 12.2% and 12.9% respectively. Rape increased by 5.5% and Robbery by 6.5%.

PROPERTY CRIME

Property Crime consists of Burglary, Larceny and Motor Vehicle Theft. In 1988, Property Crime increased by 3,986 offenses which was a 2.7% increase since 1987.

Of all Index Crime, the one which showed the greatest increase was the Property Crime of Motor Vehicle Theft. In 1987 it had increased by 18.8% and in 1988 it increased by 17.5%, an increase of 39.6% since 1986.

CLEARANCE RATE

Law Enforcement Agencies cleared 21.0% of all Index Offenses.

STOLEN/ RECOVERED PROPERTY

In 1988, Law Enforcement Agencies reported \$166,835,112 worth of property stolen during the commission of Index Crimes. \$70,968,850 was recovered for a 42.5% recovery rate.

ARREST DATA

During 1988, there were 210,572 persons arrested for all criminal activities, an increase of 6.6% over the previous year. Of the total arrests, 18.2% were females. 13.2% of all arrests were persons under 18 years of age.

Total arrests for drug abuse violations increased from 14,874 in 1987 to 19,870 in 1988, an increase of 33.6%.

LAW OFFICERS ASSAULTED

There were 1,182 Law Officers assaulted during 1988. Of these, 542 received injuries.

The Uniform Crime Reporting System

Purpose

The Uniform Crime Reporting Program periodically measures crime in the United States by counting those offenses brought to the attention of law enforcement agencies. The program's objective is to produce reliable criminal statistics for Law Enforcement administration, operation, and management. Criminal Justice professionals, legislators, scholars, and others concerned with crime problems make frequent use of UCR-generated statistics.

National Program

Uniform Crime Reporting was initiated in 1929 when the International Association of Chiefs of Police (I.A.C.P.) standardized procedures for crime data collection. On June 11, 1930, Congress enacted legislation authorizing the Federal Bureau of Investigation to collect nationwide crime counts and to serve as the clearinghouse for such data. The Committee on Uniform Crime Records of the I.A.C.P. continues to advise the F.B.I. in the operation of the UCR Program and offers them a valuable link to local police departments.

State Program

In July, 1977, Connecticut began its own Uniform Crime Reporting Program. By August of the same year, data collection began with the recruitment and training of 70 agencies. Today, Connecticut has 100 full-time police departments participating in its UCR Program.

The State Program ensures quality control and uniformity of the crime and arrest reports submitted. The centralized state collection agency streamlines the time-consuming process of resolving questions between contributors and verifiers. Upon completion of the quality control process, the returns are forwarded to the F.B.I.

Types of Data Collected

Every month law enforcement agencies throughout the state submit UCR data. They indicate the number of offenses brought to their attention through such sources as victim, police, or witness reports. The UCR Program defines Crime Index offenses as the following: Murder and Non-negligent Manslaughter, Forcible Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Larceny-Theft, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson.

After counting Crime Index offenses reported, minus any unfounded complaints, contributors provide the number of "actual offenses" and the number of crimes cleared. For a criminal offense to be "cleared", either of two situations must prevail: (1) at least one person is arrested, charged, and turned over to the court for prosecution; or (2) some element beyond police control precludes the physical arrest of the offender, resulting in the offense being cleared by "exceptional means". Contributing agencies also include data on the value of property stolen and recovered in connection with the aforementioned offenses, plus specific information regarding homicides and arson.

UCR arrest data is collected for <u>all</u> crimes except traffic violations. The age, sex, and race of arrestees are reported for all crime categories.

Reporting Procedure

Contributing agencies are responsible for submitting their own crime reports to the State UCR Program. A full-time field representative offers training in Uniform Crime Reporting procedures to ensure quality and uniformity in the data submitted to the State Program. Contributors also receive the Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook which provides a detailed outline of offense classifying and scoring procedures.

Verification Procedures

UCR reports are set up with numerous internal cross-checks to achieve reporting accuracy of the data. It is standard operating procedure to examine each incoming report for arithmetical accuracy. Reports are then subjected to logical tests of reasonableness, which are of key importance to confirming validity. Logical errors resulting from misinterpretations of what is to be measured can then be corrected. UCR personnel correct minor errors without contacting contributors, but necessary arithmetical adjustments or unusual variations are brought to the attention of the submitting agency.

UCR Limitations

There are inherent limitations in current crime reporting practices. Of primary importance is the question of how much crime is being reported. The degree to which crimes are being reported varies from area to area. A considerable volume of crime is not reported to law enforcement agencies because the victims consider the offenses against them to be of very little consequence or the likelihood of

apprehending the suspect is small. They may also fear retaliation from offenders, or are reluctant to reveal their own involvement in the offense or in other crimes. Consequently, information concerning some offenses is never entered into the reporting system.

Even with these given limitations, the UCR Program provides the best network of State and National crime figures currently available.

Crime Factors

Because not all factors that have an impact on crime problems are measured or considered by the UCR Program, superficial conclusions are sometimes drawn from its crime and arrest data, particularly when attempts are made to compare jurisdictions. Local ordinances and criminal justice administrative policies, record-keeping practices, and the degree of adherence to Uniform Crime Reporting standards all affect the number of crimes and arrests reported. Additionally, socio-economic conditions and the characteristics and attitudes of the local population influence the extent and nature of criminal behavior in a community. The following factors must be taken into consideration before an informed assessment of crime data can be made:

- * Density and size of the community population and its surrounding area.
- * Variations in the composition of the population, particularly its age, sex, and race composition.
- * Stability of population with respect to such factors as commuters, seasonal residents, and other transient types.
- * Economic conditions, including unemployment.
- * Cultural conditions, such as educational, recreational, and religious characteristics.
- * Climate.
- * The trafficking and abuse of drugs in the community.
- * Effective strength of law enforcement agencies.
- * Administrative and investigative efficiency of the local law enforcement agency.

- * Policies of other components of the criminal justice system, such as prosecutorial, judicial, correctional, and probational.
- * Attitudes of citizens toward crime.
- * Crime reporting practice of citizens.

Future of the UCR Program

The State Uniform Crime Reporting Program and the Connecticut Chiefs of Police UCR Redesign Committee are working together to produce an Incident-Based Reporting System. The National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) will be used as a model for design and implementation.

In the future, police departments will send crime data by floppy disk, magnetic tape or by on-line transmission. The advantages to this type of system are: less paperwork for police departments, better uniformity and validity of crime data, a uniform method of collecting data and a superior criminal data base for analysis.

The new Incident-Based System will collect data on additional crimes such as kidnapping, sex crimes, and white collar crimes in addition to the historical Index Offenses.

For the first time in Connecticut, police will have a collection of data that can be used to address pressing law enforcement issues. Analysis of juvenile crime, computer crime, drug abuse, and victimization of special populations will become a reality when this system is implemented.

Together, the Connecticut Chiefs of Police and the State Police with the financial assistance from the Bureau of Justice Statistics can make this system work. Statewide conversion to the new system will begin with appropriate federal funding.

INDEX CRIME


The tabulations presented in the graphs and charts in this publication indicate the volume, fluctuation, and distribution of crime in Connecticut on the basis of a Crime Index. The Index is composed of those crimes considered to represent the most serious by nature or by the volume in which they occur.

Crime classifications used in the Crime Index are: Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter, Forcible Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Larceny, and Motor Vehicle Theft.

MURDER


Murder is defined in the Uniform Crime Reporting Program as the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another. Any death due to a fight, argument, quarrel, assault, or commission of a crime is included. Attempts to kill and assaults to kill are counted under aggravated assault. Suicides, accidental deaths, and justifiable homicides are not counted in this category.

Traffic deaths caused by the negligence of someone other than the victim are counted under arrests for Manslaughter by Negligence according to age, sex and race.



RAPE


Forcible rape is defined as the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. For UCR purposes, this offense is divided into two categories: Forcible Rape and Attempted Rape. Statutory Rape offenses and other sex offenses are not included in this classification.

ROBBERY


Robbery is defined as the felonious and forcible taking of property of another against his will by violence or by putting him in fear. The element of personal confrontation is always present in this crime. In the UCR Program, all attempts to rob are included in this classification.

Robberies are reported in four categories: firearms, knife or cutting instrument, strong-arm and other dangerous weapons.



WEAPONS DISTRIBUTION




AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

Aggravated Assault is defined as the unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury, usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or other means to produce death or great bodily harm. Attempts to commit Aggravated Assault are included under this classification. Simple Assaults are excluded.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT BY MONTH




BURGLARY

Burglary is defined as the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft. The use of force to gain entry is not required as an element for this crime. Burglary is reported under three categories: Forcible Entry, Unlawful Entry - No Force, and Attempted Forcible Entry.




LARCENY


MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

Motor Vehicle Theft is defined as the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. This classification includes thefts of such vehicles as automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, snowmobiles, etc.

ARSON

Arson is defined by the Uniform Crime Reporting Program to include any willful or malicious burning, or attempt to burn with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc. Only fires determined through investigation to have been willingly or maliciously set are classified as arsons. Fires of suspicious or unknown origin are excluded.

Since Arson offenses frequently occur in conjunction with other Index Crimes; e.g., Burglary, the Hierarchy Rule has been modified specifically for Arson. Arson, regardless of its occurrence in conjunction with another crime against person or property has to be reported.



In 1983, Connecticut began compiling County data. Caution must be taken in attempting to make direct comparisons between counties. Many demographic factors including density and size may affect criminal behavior incidents and the reporting thereof.

According to population figures supplied by the F.B.I., Connecticut's eight counties in descending order of population are: Hartford (844,337), Fairfield (825,465), New Haven (794,279), New London (249,587), Litchfield (165,214), Middlesex (139,276), Tolland (124,440) and Windham (98,402).


PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED

For further analysis of crime, the Uniform Crime Reporting Program collects supplementary reports relating to properties stolen and recovered by type and value.

Although Connecticut law enforcement agencies recovered approximately 43% of the property stolen, the net loss was over \$95 million dollars.

The reader should take note that these values relate only to Index Crime. Property lost or damaged as a result of crimes such as fraud, vandalism, etc., are not included in these totals.

CONNECTICUT ARREST DATA

ARREST DATA

The Connecticut Uniform Crime Reporting Program requires the submission of monthly reports of data concerning persons arrested in the state. A record of total arrest activity for criminal acts in both Part 1 and Part 2 crime classes is received from UCR participants according to the Age, Sex and Race of persons arrested. Traffic arrests, except driving under the influence, are not reported.

The Age, Sex, and Race of Persons Arrested Forms are designed to collect data on the number of persons arrested and not the number of charges lodged. For example, a person may be arrested on several charges at one time; only one arrest would be scored. For UCR purposes, a juvenile is counted as "arrested" when the circumstances are such that if he or she were an adult, an arrest would result.

The Part 2 offenses are as follows:

- 9. <u>OTHER ASSAULTS</u> Assaults and attempted assaults which are simple or minor in nature and where no weapon is used.
- 10. <u>FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING</u> Offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering or possessing, with the intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of that which is true.
- 11. <u>FRAUD</u> Fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretense. Includes bad checks, confidence game, etc., except forgeries and counterfeiting.
- 12. <u>EMBEZZLEMENT</u> Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.

- 13. <u>STOLEN PROPERTY; BUYING, RECEIVING, POSSESSING</u> Offenses of buying, receiving, and possession of stolen property, as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.
- 14. <u>VANDALISM</u> Willful or <u>malicious</u> destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control. This offense covers a wide range of malicious behavior directed at property.
- 15. <u>WEAPONS; CARRYING, POSSESSING, ETC.</u> Violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers. Attempts are included.
- 16. <u>PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE</u> Sex offenses of a commercialized nature, such as: prostitution, keeping a disorderly house, pandering, and all attempts to commit the above.
- 17. <u>SEX OFFENSES</u> (Except Forcible Rape, Prostitution, and Commercialized Vice) offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like. Attempts are included.
- 18. <u>NARCOTIC DRUG LAWS</u> Narcotic drug law arrests on the basis of the narcotics used. Includes arrests for violation of State and Local ordinances, specifically those relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing and making of narcotic drugs.
- 19. <u>GAMBLING</u> Charges which relate to promoting, permitting or engaging in gambling.
- 20. <u>OFFENSES AGAINST THE FAMILY AND CHILDREN</u> Includes all charges of non-support and neglect or abuse of family and children.
- 21. <u>DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE</u> Limited to the driving or operating of any vehicle while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotic drug.
- 22. <u>LIQUOR LAWS</u> With the exception of "Driving Under the Influence", Liquor Law violations, State or Local, are placed in this class. Includes: manufacturing, sale, transporting, furnishing, possessing, etc.
- 23. <u>DRUNKENNESS</u> Not reported in Connecticut.
- 24. <u>DISORDERLY CONDUCT</u> All charges of breach of peace including affray, unlawful assembly, disturbing the peace, disturbing meetings, refusing to

- assist an officer, or any attempts of the above.
- 25. <u>VAGRANCY</u> Vagabondage, begging, loitering, etc.
- 26. <u>ALL OTHER OFFENSES</u> Includes every other State or Local offense not included in classes 1 through 25.
- 27. <u>SUSPICION</u> Not reported in Connecticut.
- 28. <u>CURFEW AND LOITERING LAWS (JUVENILE)</u> Arrests made for violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances.
- 29. <u>RUNAWAY (JUVENILE)</u> Apprehensions for protective custody as defined by Connecticut State Statute. Arrests for runaways from one jurisdiction by another agency should be counted by the home jurisdiction.



LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEE DATA

POLICE EMPLOYEE DATA

As of October 31, 1988, 100 agencies covering 3,241,000 Connecticut residents reported a total of 7,216 full-time law enforcement officers. When full-time civilians are included, the total is 8,816 law enforcement employees.

Before making comparisons in police strength from one municipality to another, serious consideration should be given to the many factors that affect the need for police service. For example, the need for law enforcement service in a seasonal or highly mobile community differs from a locale whose population is stable. Other factors that affect police service are geographic location, density of population, nearby urban areas, and community interest in law enforcement.

1988 SUMMARY ANALYSIS

Law enforcement agencies in the State reported a total of 8,816 full-time police employees for 1988.

There were 7,216 sworn police officers employed by law enforcement agencies, 81.9% of the total law enforcement employees.

Full-time civilian employees were reported at 1,600; 18.1% of total law enforcement employees.

94.6% of all full-time law officers were male, 5.4% were female.

66.8% of all full-time civilians were female, 33.3% were male.

Of the 7,216 full-time sworn police officers, 84.8% were Municipal and 15.2% were State Police.




STATISTICAL SUMMARY 1988 FAMILY VIOLENCE ARREST CASES

- √There were 21,293 incidents of family violence in which at least one person was arrested during 1988. This represents a 2.3% increase in the number of incidents over 1987.
- ✓ Nearly nine in ten cases involved an arrest for assault, breach of peace or disorderly conduct. In 42.9% of cases the most serious offense for which an arrest was made was assault. Breach of peace was the most serious offense in 23.7% of cases and disorderly conduct was the most serious offense in 20.4% of cases.
- √83.8% of victims were female and 89.2% of offenders were
 male.
- √In three-quarters of the incidents the closest relationship between the parties involved was that of spouse (28.0%), former spouse (3.0%) or live-in (45.1%).
- √More than half (60.1%) of the participants were between the ages of twenty-one and thirty-five.
- √Thirteen percent of cases involved prior court orders.
- ✓Incidents in which serious injury occurred declined 6.5% since 1987.
- √Liquor/drugs were involved in nearly half of the incidents (48.4%).
- √36.0% of incidents occurred on Saturday (18.8%) or Sunday (17.2%).
- √ 43.6% of incidents occurred during the six hour period between 6:01 p.m. and midnight.
- √ Children were present or directly involved in 45.0% of incidents. Specifically, children were involved in 10.1% of cases and present in 34.8% of cases.

TYPE OF OFFENSE







SEX OF PARTICIPANTS 1988





AGE OF PARTICIPANTS 1988









PRIOR COURT ORDERS




EXTENT OF INJURY



FAMILY VIOLENCE HOMICIDE 1988


INTRODUCTION

The following summarizes cases of family violence homicide which occurred during 1988. Homicides were chosen for rigorous analysis because the small number of incidents allowed examination of each piece of descriptive information available concerning the act and the parties involved. Such close scrutiny would not be possible for other types of family violence offenses such as assault due to the great number of offenses and the character of data available.

Family violence homicides which occurred during 1988 resulted in either the arrest or suicide of the offender. Information on arrest cases was taken from Family Violence Offense Reports submitted to the Family Violence Reporting Program and verified as homicides through the reporting agency and/or the Uniform Crime Reporting Program (UCR). Murder-suicide information was taken from UCR records.

Of the 175 homicides reported to UCR during 1988, thirty (17.1%) were verified as conforming to the definition of "Family or Household Member" as set forth in the Connecticut General Statutes (Title 46b, Section 38a (2)).*

NON-NEGLIGENT HOMICIDE



Note that while the total number of UCR homicides includes offenses which may have occurred in prior years and were not reported until 1988, the incidents identified as family violence only include offenses committed during 1988.


Of the thirty family or household member homicide victims, two-thirds (20) were female. More than half (53%) of the victims were the spouse or live-in partner of the offender.

More than three-quarters of the 29 offenders were male. (One murder-suicide involved two victims.) However, females were responsible for 24% of the family violence homicides. Females committed 11% of all Connecticut homicides during 1988 in which the sex of the offender was known (information from UCR Program reports). Guns and knives accounted for nearly three-quarters of weapons used.

MURDER-SUICIDE


In one-third of the homicides the offender committed suicide. None of the parties-- neither victims nor offenders-- were involved in previous family violence arrest incidents.* All ten of the victims were female and eight of the nine offenders were male. Half of the victims were the partner of the offender (three were spouses and two were live-in partners).

Guns were used in seven of the ten murder-suicides. Of the victims who were killed with guns, five were shot with handguns, one with a shotgun and one with a rifle.

ARREST

During 1988, there were twenty homicides for which a family or household member was arrested.

Half of the twenty victims were male and half were female. Fifty-five percent of the victims were the partner of the offender (eight victims were spouses and three were live-in partners).

Fourteen of the offenders were male and six were female. Knives were used by half of the offenders to commit the homicide. Of the fourteen male offenders, seven used knives, two used guns, one used scissors and four used physical force. Three of the six female offenders used knives and one used a gun to commit the homicide. One female offender abandoned her child.

Prior court orders existed in four of the twenty homicide incidents which resulted in arrest (that information could not be obtained for murder-suicides).

Children were either involved or present in half of the incidents.

Liquor/drugs were involved in six of the eighteen incidents for which that information was known.

Eight victims and eight of the offenders were previously involved in family violence incidents which resulted in an arrest (victims of homicide could have previously been arrested or offenders could have previously been victims).

^{*} Information on prior involvement in family violence was obtained from Family Violence Reporting Program computer files. FVRP records date from October 1, 1986 (the effective date of the Family Violence Prevention and Response Act through to the time of the homicide.

DEFINITIONS

ARREST INCIDENT: An occurrence of family violence in which at least one arrest has been made. One arrest incident is counted for each Family Violence Offense Report submitted; regardless of the number of parties arrested.

BREACH OF PEACE AND DISORDERLY CONDUCT: Crimes of Threatening; Harassment and Reckless Endangerment may be reported under either Breach of Peace or Disorderly Conduct.

BOTH (ALL) PEOPLE ARRESTED: An individual is assigned the status of BOTH when involved in a family violence incident in which all parties were arrested. Each participant who has been coded as BOTH has committed an offense involving family violence, and therefore cannot be considered a "pure" victim. However, an individual classified as BOTH cannot be classified as a "pure" offender either, since s/he has also been the target of a violent domestic crime. Note that these incidents frequently involve more than two people.

FAMILY VIOLENCE: Defined as an incident resulting in physical harm; bodily injury or assault; or an act of threatened violence that causes fear of imminent physical harm; bodily injury or assault between or among family or household members. Verbal abuse or argument does not constitute family violence unless there is present danger and the likelihood that physical violence will occur.

FAMILY OR HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS: Spouses; former spouses; parents and their children; persons eighteen years of age or older related by blood or marriage; persons sixteen years of age or older other than those related by blood or marriage who are presently residing together or who have resided together in the past; and persons who share a child in common regardless of whether they are or have been married or have lived together at any time.

FAMILY VIOLENCE CRIME: A crime as defined in section 53a-24 of the Connecticut General Statutes which contains as an element an act of violence to a family or household member and does not include verbal abuse or acts by parents or guardians when disciplining minor children unless those acts constitute abuse.

HIERARCHY OF OFFENSES: The Family Violence Reporting Program follows a hierarchy of offenses classification system similar to that employed by the Uniform Crime Reporting Program. Although multiple offenses are frequently reported, particularly for multiple arrest incidents, only one offense code is accepted into the computer system. When there are multiple offenses, the offense code highest in the following list is accepted: Homicide; Assault; Kidnapping; Sexual Assault; Criminal Mischief; Risk of Injury to a Minor; Breach of Peace; Disorderly Conduct; and Other.

LIVE-IN COMPANION: Persons presently residing together or who have resided together in the past, and persons who share a child in common.

"OTHER" CRIME: Offenses included under the classification of "OTHER" include all family violence crimes which are not covered by the offense types listed. "OTHER" crimes include, but are not limited to: Robbery; Burglary; Arson; and Criminal Trespass.

RELATIVE (SAME HOME/DIFFERENT HOME): Includes parents and children; brothers; sisters; aunts; uncles; in-laws; cousins; etcetera.
