

Offenders Released From Wisconsin Adult Correctional Institutions Calendar Year 1988

HIGHLIGHTS

- Wisconsin's correctional institutions for adult offenders reported the release of 2,723 persons, 2,526 males and 197 females, during calendar year 1988. Offenders classified as first releases accounted for seven-tenths (72.5 percent) of the group, rereleases just over one-fifth (22.0 percent) of the group, and the remainder were offenders released following completion of a revocation hearing, after completion of alternative to revocation placement, or for other reasons. (See Table 1.)
- Nine out of 10 offenders (88.2 percent) released during 1988 left the institutions for supervision in the community on parole (29.5 percent) or mandatory release (70.5 percent) status. The remainder of the releases were discharged at completion of sentence (5.0 percent), discharged by court order (1.1 percent), released after alternative to revocation admission (5.1 percent), or for other reasons (0.6 percent). (See Table 2.)
- Ounarmed burglary (26.0 percent), theft (8.2 percent), and armed robbery (7.4 percent) were the offenses for which males first and rereleased in 1988 had most frequently been sentenced. Females were most often sentenced for forgery (23.8 percent), theft (16.6 percent), and other drug violations (12.4 percent). (See Table 3.)
- The average (mean) length of sentence for all offenders released during 1988 was 61.8 months: males were serving average (mean) sentences of 63.3 months; females, 44.4 months. Five males serving life sentences were excluded from these computations. Almost one-half (46.3 percent) of the males and just under three-fifths (58.5 percent) of the females were serving sentences of less than four years. (See Table 4.)
- Four out of 10 males (38.2 percent) and females (42.0 percent) were committed from Milwaukee County. Dane, Kenosha, Racine, and Rock Counties had committed three-tenths (30.5 percent) of the females and one-fourth (24.2 percent) of the males released in 1988. (See Table 5.)
- The average (mean) length of stay since most recent admission for all offenders released in 1988 was 23.8 months. Males had spent an average (mean) of 24.4 months in the institution; females, an average (mean) of 17.5 months. (See Table 6.)
- Offenders rereleased in 1988 had spent, since last new admission, an average (mean) of 58.8 months in the institution. Males spent an average (mean) of 59.6 months; females, 34.2 months. (See Table 7.)
- Seven out of 10 males (74.0 percent) and eight out of 10 females (83.3 percent) rereleased during 1988 had a record of one prior release since last new admission. (See Table 8.)

ACQUISITIONS

- Over one-half (53.1 percent) of the males and two-fifths (40.4 percent) of the females were reported to be White. (See Table 9.)
- Property offenders made up one-half (49.8 percent) of the male and three-fifths (59.6 percent) of the female releases. One-fourth (26.9 percent) of the males were regarded as solely assaultive offenders while over one-tenth (12.1 percent) were classified as both assaultive and sex offenders. Less than one-fifth (20.2 percent) of the females were categorized solely as assaultive offenders while seven females (3.6 percent) were considered as both assaultive and sex offenders. One-tenth of the releases, 9.6 percent of the males and 14.5 percent of the females, were classified as drug offenders. (See Table 10.)
- Less than one-tenth (6.4 percent) of the males and eight (4.1 percent) of the females were turned over at release to authorities from other jurisdictions because of outstanding detainers. (See Table 11.)
- About one-fifth (18.5 percent) of the males and one-fourth (25.9 percent) of the females participated in an adult basic education program prior to release. (See Table 12.)
- Participation in programs leading to GED or HED certificates was noted for about one-fifth of the males (18.9 percent) and females (19.2 percent) released in 1988. (See Table 13.)
- Three-fourths (75.6 percent) of the males and four-fifths (84.5 percent) of the females did not take part in a high school education program while incarcerated. High school diplomas were earned by 19 males and 2 females prior to release. (See Table 14.)
- o Three out of 10 males (29.8 percent) and females (35.2 percent) took part in programs designed to assist them in dealing with problems relating to the usage of alcohol and/or other drugs. (See Table 15.)
- One-fifth (21.9 percent) of the males and somewhat less than one-fifth (15.5 percent) of the females participated in work release programs during incarceration. (See Table 16.)
- Thirty-seven males (1.6 percent) and nine females (4.6 percent) participated in study release. (See Table 17.)
- One-fourth (24.2 percent) of the males and less than one-tenth (7.3 percent) of the females were enrolled in a vocational and/or apprenticeship program prior to release. (See Table 18.)
- Participation in a college level education program was noted for 100 males (4.2 percent) and 17 females (8.8 percent). (See Table 19.)
- Males serving sentences for unarmed burglary, theft, and other drug violations, which were the crimes for which males first-released in 1988 had most often been sentenced, spent an average (mean) of 24.0, 18.1, and 16.0 months respectively in the institution. First-released females, who were most often sentenced for forgery, theft, and other drug violations spent an average (mean) of 18.8, 15.5, and 13.9 months in the institution. (See Table 20.)
- Males serving sentences for the most common offenses among those rereleased in 1988 (unarmed burglary, armed robbery, and forgery) served an average

(mean) of 18.6, 25.7, and 15.0 months between the time of reinstitutionalization and release. Females serving sentences for theft, unarmed burglary, and unarmed robbery spent an average (mean) of 15.3, 14.7, and 10.5 months in the institution prior to rerelease. (See Table 21.)

- Males first-released in 1988 who were serving five year sentences spent an average (mean) of 30.3 months in the institution while female first-releases with the same sentence served an average (mean) of 26.3 months prior to release. (See Table 22.)
- Males and females with five year sentences who were previously released and returned to the institution following revocation of field supervision spent an average (mean) of 12.0 and 10.0 months in the institution prior to rerelease in 1988. (See Table 23.)
- Nine-tenths (88.0 percent) of the males and three-fourths of the females (76.2 percent) planned to take up residence somewhere in Wisconsin. The remainder of the releases, with the exception of three males who planned to live in a foreign country, intended to take up residence elsewhere in the United States. (See Table 24.)

BD:mlc 4-27-24/oppb The graphs on the following pages present a variety of information about releases from Wisconsin's correctional institutions for adult offenders during the years 1969 through 1988.

The first graph indicates that the total number of releases added up to 1,730 in 1971 and dropped to 931 in 1974 which was a low for the 19-year period. After 1974 releases generally increased reaching a high of 2,712 in 1988; an increase of 191.3 percent. Male releases closely resembled the total release trend with the low at 879 in 1974 and the high at 2,517 in 1988. Female releases generally remained stable during the 19-year period with a low of 52 in 1974 increasing gradually to a high of 195 in 1988.

The second graph indicates that the number of males released on parole peaked at 1,140 in 1972 and generally took a downward trend reaching a 19-year low of 434 in 1988. Conversely, the number of males leaving institutions on mandatory release status remained below 400 during 1969-1976 and rose to a high of 1,638 in 1988.


Graph 3 indicates that females released to parole supervision reached a high of 104 in 1971, declined dramatically to 33 in 1980, and after rising to 76 in 1984 and 1985, dropped to the 19-year low of 30 in 1986 before increasing to 56 in 1988. Mandatory releases showed a generally upward trend from a low of 9 in 1976 to the high of 56 in 1988.

Graph 4 shows releases from maximum, medium, and minimum security institutions. The number of offenders released from maximum security institutions rose rather consistently from a low of 392 in 1974 to a high of 969 in 1988. Releases from medium security institutions dropped to a low of 104 in 1974 and then remained relatively stable prior to increasing to a high of 333 in 1988. Since 1974 more offenders have been released each year from minimum security institutions than from any other security level. The number of releases from this type of facility rose steadily from a low of 423 in 1973 to a high of 1,538 in 1984 and has continually fluctuated since that time.


The final graph displays average (mean) length of stay by sex. The overall length of stay, which was 19.7 months in 1969, increased to 22.9 months in 1972 and decreased again to 21.2 in 1974-75 rising to the all-time high of 25.3 months in 1983. The length of stay then declined to 21.7 months in 1986 only to rise again to 23.8 months in 1988. The average (mean) length of stay for males closely paralleled the overall figures showing a low of 20.4 months in 1969 and a high of 25.7 months in 1981. The length of stay for males in 1988 was 24.4 months. The length of stay for females generally showed an upward trend ascending from a low of 10.3 months in 1969 to a high of 21.2 months in 1979, a decade later. An average length of stay of 17.5 months was reported for females released in 1988.


RELEASES FROM WISCONSIN ADULT CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES BY SEX 1969 THROUGH 1988






