CHARACTERISTICS OF FELON NEW ADMISSIONS

HIGHLIGHTS

The number of felon new admissions from court increased 94.4% from 17,602 in 1984 to 34,226 in 1989.

The number of Mexican-American felon new admissions more than doubled from 5,034 in 1984 to 10,640 in 1989.

More than half (56.8%) of felon new admissions were under the age of 30 in 1989.

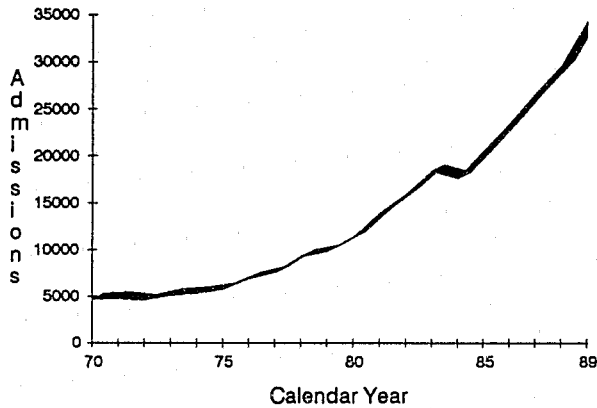
The admission rate for felon new admissions in calendar year 1989 was 117.8 admissions per 100,000 California population. This rate was the highest ever experienced by CDC.

The number of felon drug offender admissions reached an all time high of 12,962. This represented a 433.9% increase over 1984.

Of the total felon new admissions to CDC, Los Angeles accounted for 38.4% in 1984 and 41.1% in 1989.

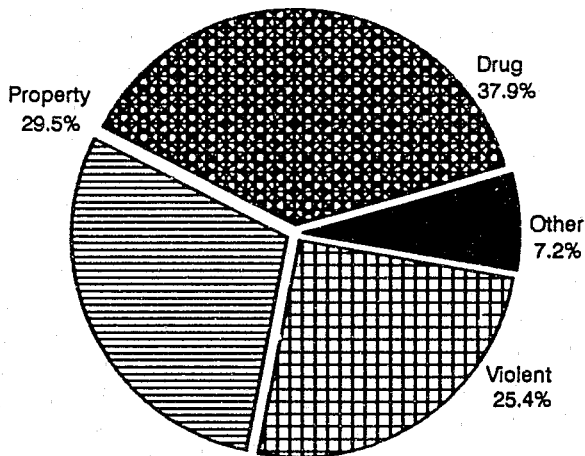
NEW ADMISSIONS

There were 34,226 felon new admissions from court.

- This represents an increase of 15.8% (4,675) from Calendar Year 1988.
- This is an increase of 94.4% (16,624) from Calendar Year 1984.
- The number of male felon new admissions was 30,872, while the number of female felon new admissions was 3,354.

Total CDC felon new admissions increased 94.4% from 17,602 in 1984 to 34,226 in 1989.

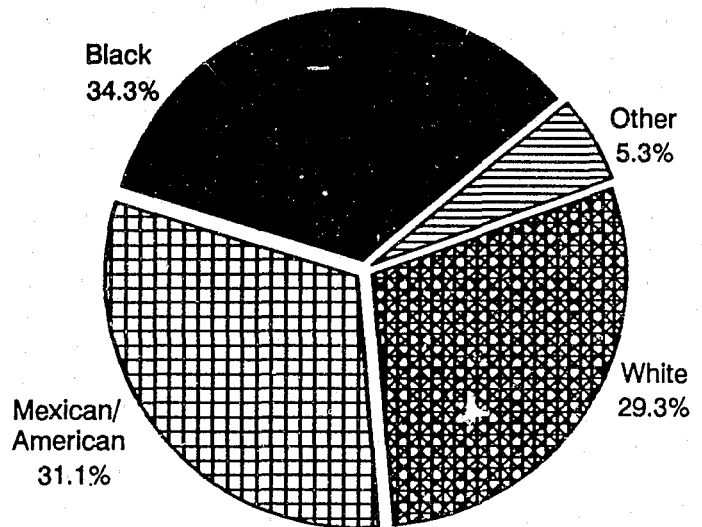
- Violent offenders accounted for 25.4% (8,678) of felon new admissions.
- Property offenders accounted for 29.5% (10,097) of felon new admissions.
- Drug offenders accounted for 37.9% (12,962) of felon new admissions.
- Offenders who committed other offenses made up the remaining 7.2% (2,473) of felon new admissions.

CHARACTERISTICS OF FELON NEW ADMISSIONS

RACIAL/ETHNIC GROUPS

- The number of felon new admissions who were Black increased by 115.5% from 5,454 in 1984 to 11,754 in 1989.
- The number of felon new admissions who were Mexican/American increased by 111.4% from 5,034 in 1984 to 10,640 in 1989.
- The number of felon new admissions who were White increased by 63.2% from 6,137 in 1984 to 10,015 in 1989.

Calendar Year 1989



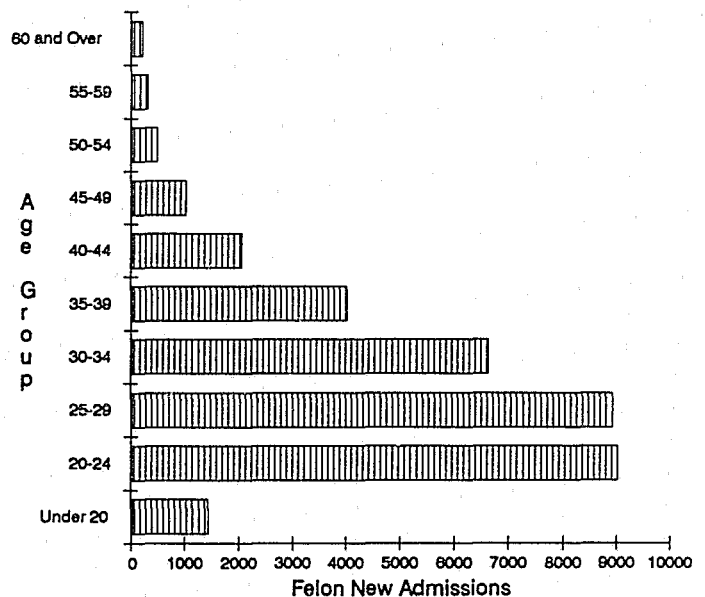
AGE GROUPS

During Calendar Year 1989:

Over half (52.5%) of the felon new admissions were 20-29 years of age.

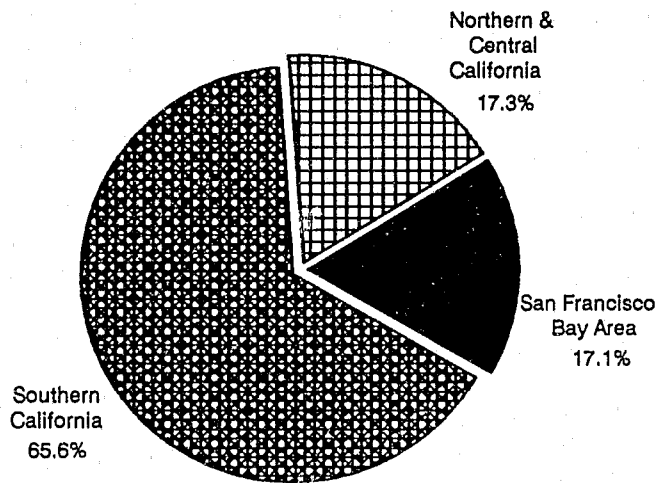
- The largest age group of felon new admissions was 20-24 years of age and accounted for 26.4% (9,027).
- The second largest age group was the 25-29 years of age, accounting for 26.1% (8,935).
- The smallest age group was the under 18 which represented 0.1% (21) of the felon new admissions.

 Calendar Year 1989



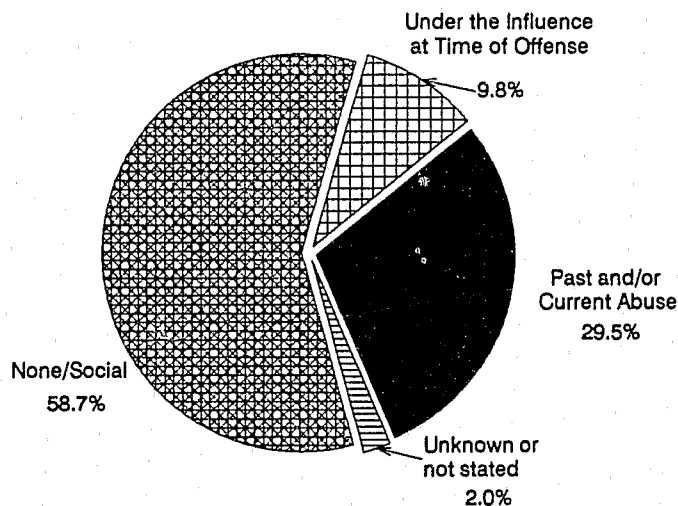
During Calendar Year 1989:

AREA OF COMMITMENT

- 22,451 (65.6%) felon new admissions were admitted from Southern California.
- 5,853 (17.1%) felon new admissions were admitted from the San Francisco Bay Area.
- 5,922 (17.3%) felon new admissions were admitted from Northern and Central California.

ALCOHOL USE

Alcohol History
 Calendar Year 1989



- 58.7% of felon new admissions reported no history of alcohol abuse. This group either did not use alcohol or used it only on social occasions.
- 9.8% of felon new admissions were under the influence of alcohol at the time they committed their offense.
- 29.5% of felon new admissions had either past or current alcohol abuse before entering CDC.

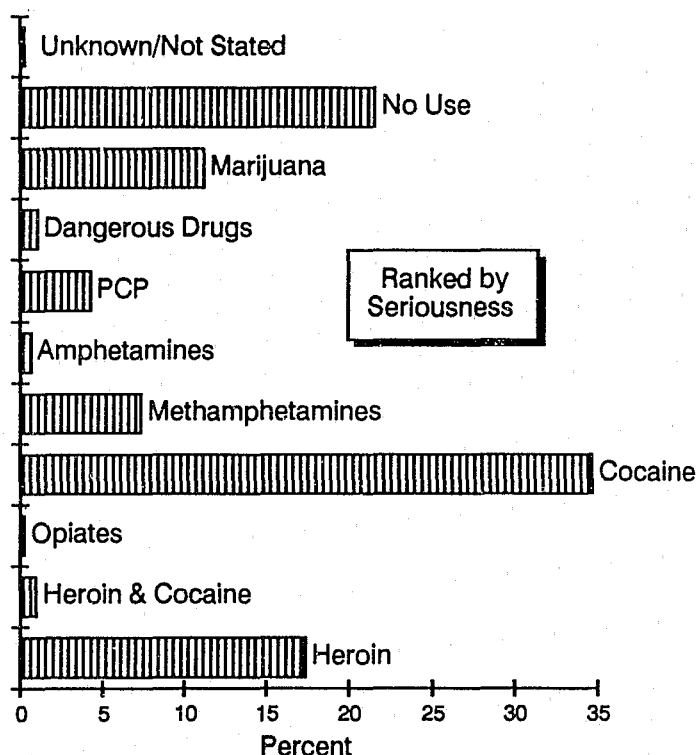
During Calendar Year 1989:

DRUG HISTORY

Nearly eight out of ten felon new admissions had a reported drug use history.

- The largest group of drug users of the felon new admissions (34.7%) had a past history of cocaine use.
- The second largest group of felon new admissions (21.6%) had no reported drug use.
- The third largest group of felon new admissions (17.4%) had used heroin.
- 11.2% of felon new admissions had a history of marijuana use.
- 8.1% of felon new admissions had a history of methamphetamine or amphetamine use.
- 4.3% of felon new admissions had a history of PCP use.

CHARACTERISTICS OF PAROLE VIOLATORS RETURNED WITH A NEW COMMITMENT (PV-WNT)

HIGHLIGHTS

The number of PV-WNTs increased 176.8% from 3,988 in 1984 to 11,040 in 1989.

During the last five years, the percentage of White PV-WNTs, like White felon new admissions, has decreased while the remaining ethnic groups have all increased.

Half (50.0%) of the PV-WNTs were under the age of 30 in 1989.

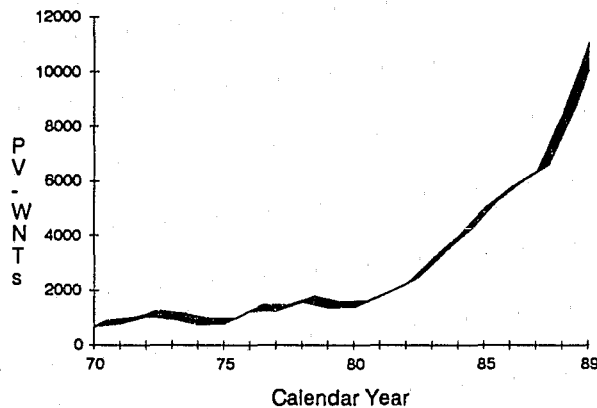
Of the total PV-WNTs to CDC, Los Angeles accounted for 34.3% (1,365) in 1984 and 44.2% (4,885) in 1989.

The number of drug offender PV-WNTs has increased tenfold from 379 in 1984 to 3,884 in 1989.

The percentage of violent offender PV-WNTs has decreased from 25.0% in 1984 to 15.1% in 1989.

Calendar Years 1970 through 1989



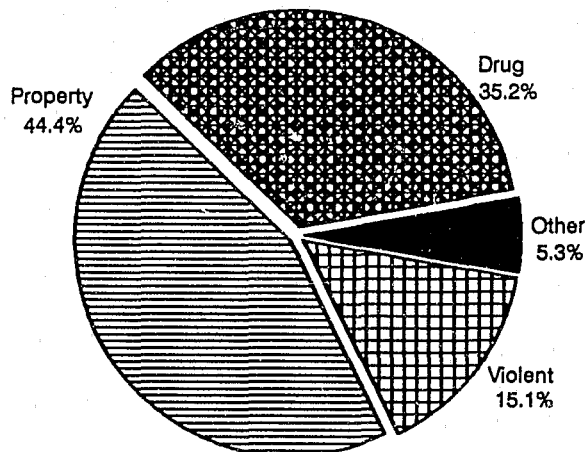
PV-WNTs

During Calendar Year 1989 there were 11,040 PV-WNTs returned to prison.

- This represents an increase of 30.5% (2,582) from Calendar Year 1988.
- This is an increase of 176.8% (7,052) from Calendar Year 1984.
- The number of male PV-WNTs was 10,341, while the number of female PV-WNTs was 699.

During Calendar Year 1989:

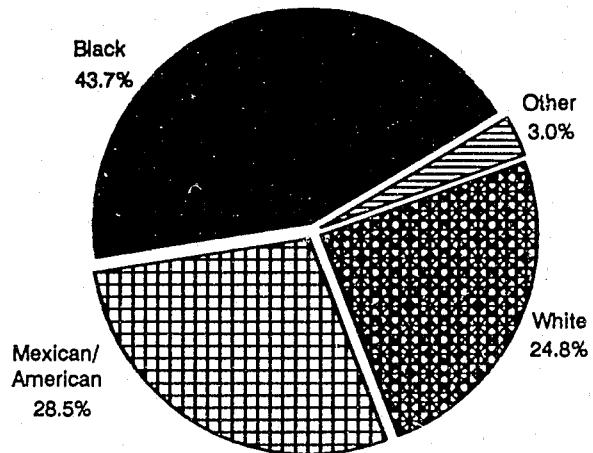
- Violent offenders accounted for 15.1% (1,665) of the PV-WNTs.
- Property offenders accounted for 44.4% (4,904) of the PV-WNTs.
- Drug offenders accounted for 35.2% (3,884) of the PV-WNTs.
- Offenders who committed other offenses made up the remaining 5.3% (587) of the PV-WNTs.

CHARACTERISTICS OF PAROLE VIOLATORS RETURNED WITH A NEW COMMITMENT (PV-WNT)

RACIAL/ETHNIC GROUPS

- The number of PV-WNTs who were Black increased by 201.2% from 1,602 in 1984 to 4,825 in 1989.
- The number of PV-WNTs who were Mexican/American increased by 211.9% from 1,010 in 1984 to 3,150 in 1989.
- The number of PV-WNTs who were White increased by 112.4% from 1,287 in 1984 to 2,734 in 1989.

Calendar Year 1989

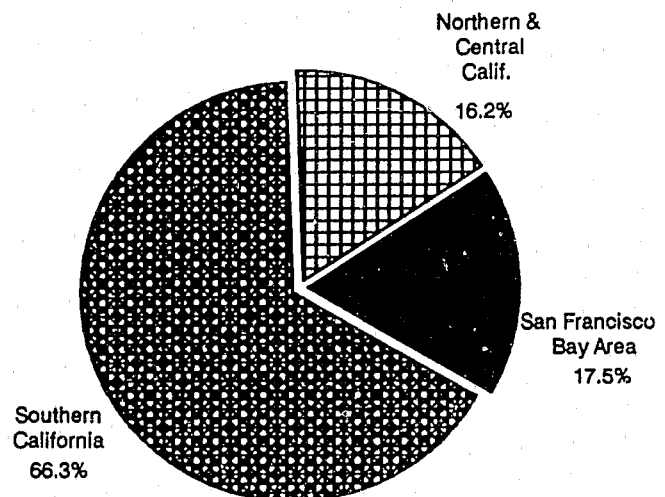


AREA OF COMMITMENT

Calendar Year 1989

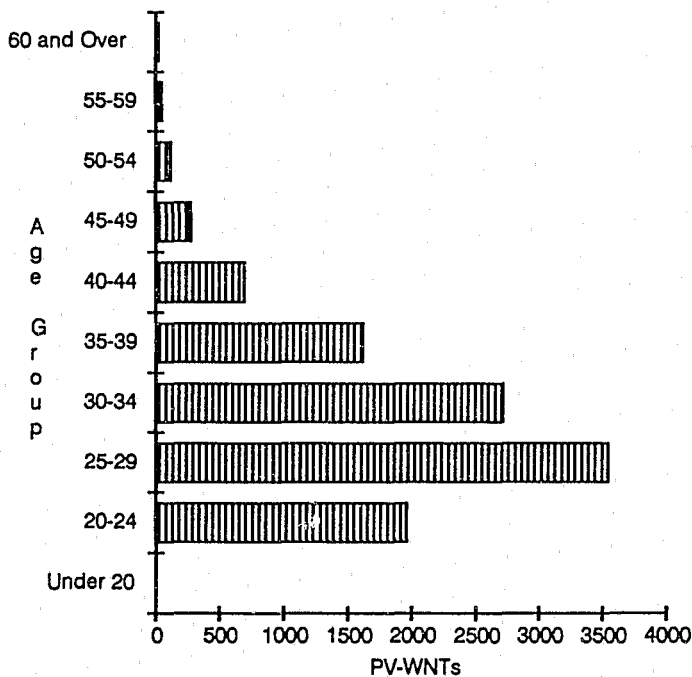

Over half (56.7%) of the PV-WNTs were 25-34 years of age.

- The largest age group of PV-WNTs returned was the 25-29 years of age and accounted for 32.1% (3,544).
- The second largest age group was the 30-34 year olds, accounting for 24.6% (2,720).
- The smallest age group was the 18-19 year olds accounting for 0.1% (10).
- There were no PV-WNTs under the age of 18.
- PV-WNTs age 55 and over represented 0.7% (77) of those returned..
