
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"CRIME IN COLORADO - 1989"

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INTRODUCTION

Two-hundred fifty-four law enforcement agencies reported crime statistics to the Colorado Bureau of Investigation during 1989. This included 62 sheriffs' departments, 192 municipal and other local agencies, plus the Colorado State Patrol and the Division of Wildlife.

The on-line incident by incident phase of the State Crime Statistics Program included 125 of the above agencies. This direct input is supplemented by the entry of the hard copy summary reports by the CBI staff. The statistics are collected and stored in the Colorado Crime Information Center (CCIC) computer.

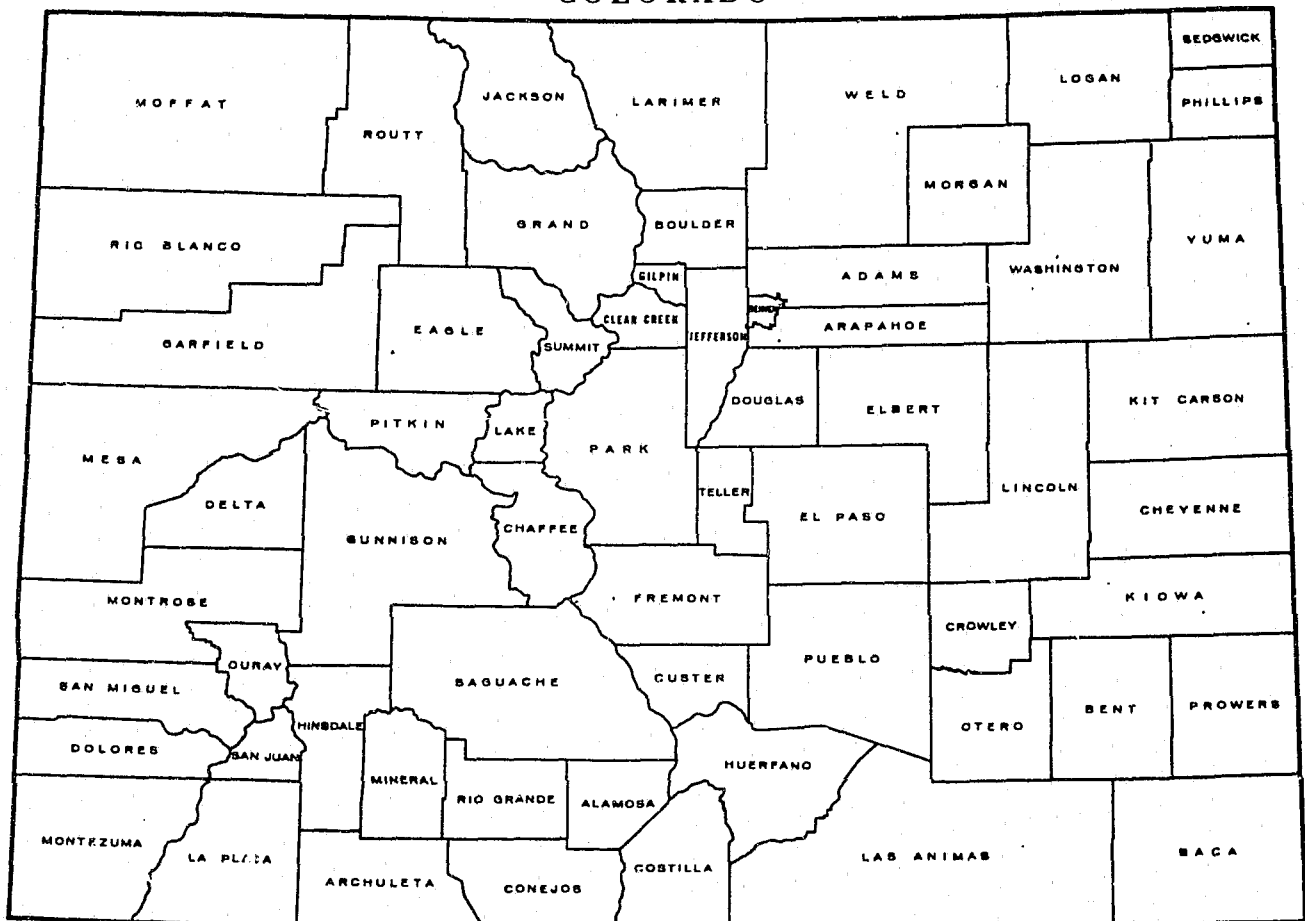
Agencies reporting Part II offenses to the CBI via CCIC receive monthly and annual summary reports from the CBI concerning those Part II incidents.

TRAINING ASSISTANCE

The CCIC staff provides continuing quality control, monitoring, and training assistance to the personnel of over 250 criminal justice agencies statewide. This assistance insures that accurate, complete, and properly classified crime information is identified, recorded, and reported.

Files maintained relate to crime, arrests, arrest disposition, fugitives, and stolen and/or recovered property. The CCIC staff also assures proper use by over 2,000 CCIC terminal operators of the state and national law enforcement telecommunications systems.

| 1. Criminal Homicide | - The willful killing of one human being by another. |
| 2. Forcible Rape | - The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. |
| 3. Robbery | - The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or putting the victim in fear. |
| 4. Assault | - The unlawful attack by one person upon another. Aggravated Assault -An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. |
| 5. Burglary | - The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. |
| 6. Larceny-Theft | - The unlawful taking, carrying, leading or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. |
| 7. Motor Vehicle Theft | - The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. |
| 8. Arson | - Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle, aircraft or personal property of another. |

THE INDEX OF CRIME

The crime index consists of the seven most commonly reported offenses which compose the Part I crimes: murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft and motor vehicle theft. (Excludes "manslaughter by negligence and simple assaults"). The tabulations on the following pages present a summary picture of Part I crimes for the State of Colorado. Reference to the Uniform Crime Reporting definitions of each of these crimes should be made for a more precise understanding of what kinds of criminal activity these statistics represent.

The seven index crimes are also divided into two groups to enable further analysis. The categories and their components are:

VIOLENT CRIMES

Murder
Forcible Rape
Robbery
Aggravated Assault

PROPERTY CRIMES

Burglary
Larceny-theft
Motor Vehicle Theft.

For 1989 the number of actual offenses reported and the rate of property crimes decreased while the rate of violent crimes increased. Based upon a 1989 estimated Colorado population of 3,360,219 the crime rate rose .1% while the number of reported offenses decreased by 1.4%. The chart below reflects those changes.

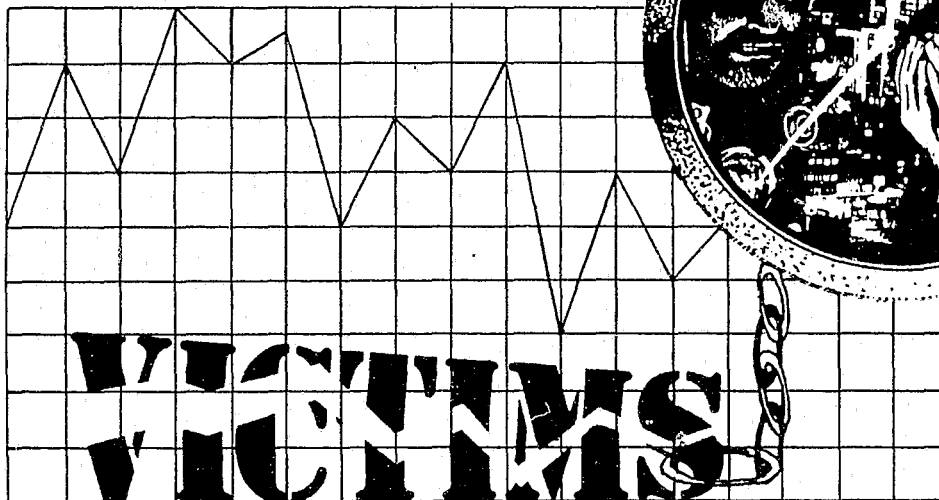

Summaries by Jurisdiction

Obviously crime may occur throughout the city limits and in all counties effected. For reporting purposes however, the agencies totals are included under only one county. Following are the cities which cross county lines; next to each city is the county within which it is counted for statistical purposes.

In 1989 the number of arsons increased 6.6% over 1988.

The average dollar loss per arson in 1989 was \$10,087. This is a .7% increase over last year.

COLORADO ARREST DATA

Submitting agencies are required to report monthly the number of arrests made for offenses committed within their jurisdictional limits.

There is no direct correlation between persons arrested, the number of offenses reported or the number of offenses cleared. Several persons could be arrested for the same offense or the arrest of one person may clear several offenses. A person is counted only once each time arrested. Therefore, if a person is arrested but wanted for several crimes within the same jurisdiction, he or she would be scored only once for the most serious crime in accordance with the hierarchy rule. The same process is applicable whether the arrestee is adult or juvenile.

Volume and Rate

Reported arrests in Colorado totaled 242,257 for Part I and Part II crimes in 1989. This represents a 2.7% increase over 1988. There were 7,210 arrests per 100,000 persons in 1989 as compared with 7,025 per 100,000 persons in 1988. Part I arrests accounted for 19.2% of the total arrests. Of those Part I offenses, Larceny-Theft comprised the greater portion with 65.8%. The greatest percentage of Part II arrests were for All Other Offenses (except traffic), 32.8%, followed by Driving Under the Influence, 19.7%. During 1989, arrests for violent crimes (Murder, Forcible Rape, Robbery and Aggravated Assault) accounted for 17.2% of all Part I arrests and 3.3% of the total arrests.

Arrests by Age

The number of persons under the age of 18 (Juveniles) arrested during 1989 increased 8.3% over 1988. Arrests of juveniles for Part I crimes increased 7.2% compared to 1988. The number of persons over the age of 18 (Adult) arrested during 1989 increased 1.4% from 1988. Arrests of adults for Part I crimes decreased compared to 1988.

Arrest by Sex

Of the 242,257 total arrests in 1989, the greatest percentage of arrests were male, 78.4%, an increase of 2.0% from 1988. Females accounted for the remaining 21.6% of the 1989 arrests.

Seven hundred and eighty-four assaults on sworn officers were reported during 1989. This represents an increase of 3.0% over the assaults on officers reported in 1988.

ACTIVITY AT THE TIME OF THE ASSAULT

The discussion below examines activities of law enforcement officers at the time of the assaults. The greatest number of assaults, 36.2% involved disturbance calls. The second highest incidence, 19.3% of the assaults, were in handling prisoners.

TYPE OF ASSIGNMENT

Of those officers assaulted during 1989 in Colorado, 12.1% were in two-man vehicles, 73.7% in one-man vehicles, 2.2% on detective or special assignments and 12% on other assignments.

INJURIES TO LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

Assaults on Colorado officers resulted in 40 cases of serious personal injury to every 100 officers assaulted.

TIME OF ASSAULT

62.4% of the assaults on officers occurred between 8 p.m. and 4 a.m. The period with greatest incidence was from 10 p.m. to 2 a.m. During this four hour period, 40.9% of all assaults on officers occurred.

CLEARANCE OF ASSAULTS ON POLICE

Statewide, 92.9% of police assaults were cleared by arrest. This is the same clearance percentage as was reported in 1988.

CRIMINAL HOMICIDE-SPECIAL SUPPLEMENT

Criminal homicide is defined as the willful killing of one human being by another. It is the one offense in the Uniform Crime Reporting Program for which detailed information is received for each reported offense. This type of data collection permits the analysis of homicides in terms of characteristics of the victims, the offenders, and the circumstances surrounding each offense. The benefits of this type of analysis are apparent. Namely, simple offense counts are complimented with the examination of complicated interrelationships ultimately producing a much more informative and functional overview of homicide offenses.

In this report, basic homicide data is focused on certain victim offender, and weapon characteristics. These characteristics provide us with a contrastive profile of homicide in the state of Colorado.

VOLUME AND RATE

The following data applies only to murder and non-negligent manslaughter and does not encompass negligent manslaughter. In 1989 there were 146 murders and non-negligent manslaughters that were reported and determined as actual. During 1989, murder and non-negligent manslaughter account for .0007% of all index crimes and .01% of all violent crimes. The 1989 statewide total decreased by 40 cases or 21.5%. Furthermore, one murder or non-negligent manslaughter occurred every 60 hours. The frequency of incidences during 1989 was greatest in the month of May, when 16 homicides occurred. The month of April, with 7 homicides, depicted the lowest monthly volume reported in 1989.

THE VICTIMS

146 persons were reported as victims of homicide by means of murder or non-negligent homicide in 1989. The male was more likely to be a victim, accounting for 62.3% compared to the female, accounting for 37.0%. By age, the majority of victims ranged between the ages of 15 to 45. The 25-29 age group accounted for the highest number of homicide victims, 16.4%. Analysis by race disclosed that of all victims, 81.5% were White*, 17.8% were Black, 0% were Indian and 0% Asian or Pacific Islander.

THE OFFENDER

In the area of known perpetrators, 156 persons were identified by one or more of the following characteristics: age, sex, or race. The male represented 71.2% whereas the female represented 11.5%. In 17.3% of the cases there was no information available. Examination of known offenders by age revealed the largest number of offenders fell between 15 and 44. The offenders in the 20-29 year age bracket displayed the largest number of offenders, 34.6%. Offender analysis by race indicated that 60.9% were White*, 21.2% were Black, .6% were Indian, 0% were Asian or Pacific Islander and 17.3% were unknown.

VICTIM-OFFENDER RELATIONSHIPS

A study of victim-offender relationships revealed 38.5% were situations where victims were killed by offenders who were acquaintances. Further analysis disclosed 13.5% of incidents involved strangers, 20.5% consisted of circumstances where no relationship could be established, and 11.5% were attributed to episodes between spouses. Instances involving family members accounted for 3.2% and the parent/child relationship represented 10.9%.

WEAPONS

During 1989 firearms were utilized in 46.6% of the homicides reported in which a weapon was identified, a decrease from 1988. Within the firearms category, handguns were the predominant weapon representing a 73.5% involvement. Knife and cutting instruments represented a 23.3% involvement in all homicides. Personal weapons such as hands, fists, and feet accounted for 18.5%. Other dangerous weapons were responsible for 8.2% of the homicides, and the remaining 3.4% was attributed to cases where the weapon used could not be definitely identified.
