
Dear Governor and Members of the Cabinet:

## INTRODUCTION

The State of Florida currently has a resident population of 12,797,318. All of these individuals are protected and served by the 30,183 law enforcement officers of the State.

Due to the high standards established for law enforcement officers in Florida, those persons that have chosen law enforcement as a career are highly dedicated men and women who have earned the respect of all they serve. The minimum requirements to become a law enforcement officer are that the individual must be nineteen (19) years of age, a United States citizen, a high school graduate or equivalent, not have a dishonorable discharge from any branch of the United States military, pass a background investigation of their character, complete a physical exam and then satisfy the minimum training requirement.

The minimum training requirement includes a basic

recruit course of 520 hours completed at a certified law enforcement training center. Each officer is annually required to maintain proficiency in physical skills and weapons requalification, and each must complete forty (40) hours of retraining every four (4) years. Officers of Florida are provided salary incentives for completion of college courses and professional courses approved by the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission.

This Law Enforcement Employee Data Report provides information on full-time sworn and civilian personnel currently employed and authorized for each municipal, county, state and other law enforcement agency in the State.

The figures presented in this publication are in no way intended to establish a norm or standard for hiring purposes.

# LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEE DATA

## UNIFORM CRIME REPORTS PROGRAM

The Florida Uniform Crime Reports (UCR) Program, in addition to collecting basic offense and arrest information, provides for the annual compilation of statistical information relating to law enforcement employees.

There are currently 377 law enforcement agencies throughout the State contributing directly to the Florida UCR program. These include sixty-six (66) county law enforcement agencies and 289 municipal agencies. In addition, five (5) state law enforcement agencies, nine (9) universities, two (2) county school police departments, four (4) airport police departments, the Seminole Indian Reservation and the Miccosukee Police Department submit data to the program.

## METHODOLOGY

Annually, data on full-time law enforcement employees of Florida are collected from the contributing agencies of the UCR program by the UCR unit on the Florida Department of Law Enforcement Employee Data form. These forms are returned to the UCR unit and verified for accuracy. Once discrepancies have been addressed, the information is processed and readied for publication.

The population figures used in this publication are compiled by the Division of Population Studies, Bureau of Economic and Business Research, University of Florida. These population estimates, as of April 1, 1989, were produced under contract with the Executive Office of the Governor for incorporation into the 1989-1990 Revenue Sharing Program.

## SWORN EMPLOYEES

Sworn personnel includes all sworn officers with full arrest powers, including the chief, sheriff, or other department head, supervisors of line officers, and line officers engaged in active field work, i.e., traffic, patrol, investigation, vice, etc. Also included are those employees who are sworn and have arrest powers but do not routinely perform these functions.

In 1989 Florida had 30,183 sworn law enforcement officers, compared to the 1988 figure of 28,924. This is an increase of 1,259 officers or 4.4 percent in the number of officers in the State. Males comprised 90.6 percent of all sworn personnel, while females comprised 9.4 percent.

## CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES

Civilian employees include clerks, stenographers,

technicians, mechanics, and others who do not have sworn powers. Also included as civilians are those employees that are sworn for civil processing or correctional purposes but do not have full arrest powers outside of the department or correctional facilities.

There were 20,581 civilian law enforcement employees employed in the State during 1989. This is an increase of 10.8 percent over the 1988 total of 18,574. Females comprised 60.0 percent, while males made up the remaining 40.0 percent.

## LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEE RATES

The rate of law enforcement employees per 1,000 population in any given community is influenced by a number of factors, much the same as the crime rate. Employee rates differ among the agencies since there is a wide variation in the responsibilities and level of activity among various law enforcement agencies. The determination of the law enforcement strength of a given county or municipality is based on factors such as population density, size and character of the community, funding constraints, geographic location and other conditions which exist in the area which generate the need for law enforcement services.

The relative stability of the population, for instance, is a factor particularly evident in Florida, with its numerous resort areas having mobile and seasonal populations. Obviously, the need for law enforcement services in such areas is different from that of locales with a relatively fixed population.

The sworn rate is the number of sworn employees reported for each unit of population defined as per 1,000 persons. Sworn rates are computed by dividing the number of sworn employees by the population figure of the community being served and then multiplying the answer by 1,000. The authorized sworn rate is the number of sworn personnel authorized for each agency by unit of population and is calculated using the same method.

Rate figures are not compiled for state, university, school board and airport police agencies because there are no established population figures for their jurisdictions. The population figures of contractual cities are automatically added to the agencies that have contractual jurisdiction over that municipality. Contract agencies are cities which contract their police services to an existing law enforcement agency rather than establish their own.



## LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL

Specific information concerning the number of law enforcement employees reflects that there were 50,764 total full-time sworn and civilian employees as of October 31, 1989. This reflects an increase of 6.9 percent over the 47,498 reported as of October 31, 1988.

In 1989, the average number of full-time law enforcement employees, including civilian personnel, amounted to 4.0 employees for each 1,000 inhabitants of the State, reflecting a 0.2 percent increase from the 1988 rate. Rates based solely on sworn law enforcement personnel show that the State average was 2.4 officers per 1,000 inhabitants. The reader is reminded that the employee rates expressed here and within the various charts should not be construed as representing recommended ratios for Florida law enforcement agencies but merely represent an average.

## COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENTS

As of October 31, 1989, there were 24,614 persons (sworn and civilian) employed full-time in Florida's sixty-six (66) county-wide law enforcement agencies (Office of the Sheriff-Consolidated City of Jacksonville is included in the municipal figures). Of these, 12,152 were sworn sheriffs and deputies, amounting to a rate of 1.8 sworn personnel per 1,000 population, as compared to 1.8 per 1,000 for 1988. The computation of the rates is based on the estimated population of the unincorporated areas of counties and not on the entire county population estimate.

In an attempt to compare employment levels of individual sheriff's departments with other agencies, consideration must be given to certain functions which are unique to the sheriff's department. In addition to their active role in criminal investigative matters, they may serve civil process, serve warrants, administer major jail facilities and furnish a bailiff staff for the courts. These functions are usually performed by sworn personnel, thereby creating a need for more such personnel.

## MUNICIPAL POLICE DEPARTMENTS

Of the 21,073 full-time employees (sworn and civilian) employed by 290 municipal police departments in Florida as of October 31, 1989, 14,877 were sworn personnel. This amounts to a rate of 2.4 per 1,000 estimated inhabitants, as compared to 2.4 per 1,000 for 1988. The number of municipal sworn employees increased 3.7 percent from 1988.

## AIRPORT POLICE DEPARTMENTS

Of the 126 full-time employees (sworn and civilian) employed by the four (4) airport police departments in Florida as of October 31, 1989, 106 were sworn personnel. The number of airport sworn employees decreased 1.9 percent from 1988. The airport police departments had 20 civilian employees as of October 31, 1989 and this reflected a 17.6 percent increase over the number of 1988 civilian employees.

## SEMINOLE INDIAN RESERVATION AND THE MICCOSUKEE POLICE

These agencies had 44 employees (sworn and civilian) as of October 31, 1989. Of these, 34 were sworn and 10 were civilian. The number of sworn employees for the Seminole Indian Reservation increased 3.8 percent while the number of civilian employees remained the same. The Miccosukee Police numbers reflected a 16.7 percent increase in sworn personnel and a 50.0 percent increase in civilian personnel.

## UNIVERSITY AND COUNTY SCHOOL POLICE DEPARTMENTS

There were 476 employees (sworn and civilian) employed by the nine (9) universities and two (2) county school police departments as of October 31, 1989. This was a 1.5 percent increase over the number employed in 1988. The sworn employees amounted to 343, and there were 133 civilian employees. The number of sworn employees increased 0.3 percent over 1988, and the number of civilian employees increased 4.7 percent from 1988.

## STATE AGENCIES

As of October 31, 1989 there were 4,431 persons (sworn and civilian) employed full-time in the five (5) state agencies contributing to the UCR program. This number constituted a 3.7 percent increase over the number of employees for 1988. There were 2,671 sworn employees during 1989, reflecting an increase of 2.6 percent in the number of sworn personnel.
