Five Year Comparison 1986 - 1990

INTRODUCTION

This report summarizes workload information about the Maricopa County Juvenile Court Center in 1990. It is a modified version of the standard "Five Year Book". As such, this report compares the court activity in 1990 with the activity of the prior four years (1986-1989). This report also presents a brief twenty-five year comparison of selected statistics.

The bulk of this report deals with juvenile delinquency and incorrigibility referrals. The data are based on information obtained from police reports, other referring entities, and from probation officers who interviewed the children and their families.

A child becomes known to the court by a "referral" which alleges that the child has violated the law in some way. It should be noted that many children whose actions or social conditions might warrant action by the Juvenile Court are not referred to the court and are therefore not included in these data. Some children are not referred simply because their illegal actions are not observed or reported, or the child is not apprehended. Furthermore, not all activities of juveniles once reported to the police are subsequently referred to the Juvenile Court. Some police agencies within the county use community counseling programs for children apprehended for minor offenses, followed by release to their parents. Consequently, the data presented in this report cannot be taken as a complete measure of the extent of delinquent behavior in Maricopa County.

When it has been decided by a referring agency that a child's action or social condition warrants intervention by the court, that child is referred, and when a child is referred, the intake division of the Juvenile Court begins the process of diagnosis and recommendation. There are numerous ways in which a referral may be dealt with by the court. However, the best interest of the child, balanced with what is in the best interest of the community, must always be considered.

Children also become known to the court when they are being adopted, when one or both parent's rights are being severed (usually prior to adoption), or when the child may have been neglected, abandoned or abused.



STATE AND COUNTY STATISTICS



Approximately 57% of the states population reside in Maricopa County. There are 230 residents per square mile.





There are more than half a million children in Maricopa County, and of those about half (289,221) are between 8 and 17 years of age inclusively.


Juveniles of these ages are at risk of referral to the Juvenile Court for delinquency or incorrigibility.






In any given year, about 7% of the juvenile population are referred at least once to the Court Center.

Type of Referral Delinquent & Incurrigible





Severity of Referral Delinquent & Incurrigible




**Number of Delinquent & Incurrigible

Based on 29,031 Total Referrals for 1990**



SEVERITY OF REFERRAL 1986-1990




Fight Referrals




Grand Theft Referrals




Drug Referrals



Obstruction Referrals






Theft Referrals







Auto Theft Referrals











Ethnicity of Referred









During 1990, there were 7,100 requests for detention. This resulted in detention 5,316 times, or for about 75% of the requests. A request for detention may occur when a Police Officer believes, for the safety of the community or the juvenile, that physical detention may be required. The juvenile is taken to one of the Maricopa County Juvenile Court facilities where an Intake Screening Officer interviews the juvenile. Based upon statutes

and the Court Center's administrative criteria, the Intake Screening Officer has the option to release the juvenile to the parents or physically detain the juvenile pending court action. Probation Officers are on duty seven days per week, 24 hours per day to screen juveniles brought to the detention center by police or parents. If the juvenile is detained, a petition must be filed and a detention hearing is held within 24 hours.

The average daily population in detention in (including both facilities) was just under 200 juveniles (199.3). The average (mean) length of stay was 13.3 days. Length of stay does not have a normal distribution. Most juveniles stay less than 13 days while those who stay longer remain much longer than the 1990 average might suggest.

The cost of a juvenile/day in detention to the taxpayer was \$79.33 in 1990. The financial impact of opening the second detention facility is reflected in the 1990 costs. In 1989, the cost was about \$10 less

per juvenile per day, and the 1989 cost was consistent with the costs of prior years. The number of detainees is up considerably from prior years as well, reflecting the new capacity.



During 1990, 2,104 juveniles were placed on probation, almost 400 more than in 1989. This reflects the increase felt in referrals and in petitions filed by the County Attorney's Office. An additional effect was the increase in Probation Officer caseload to a five year high of 51 cases under supervision. The average stay on probation has remained at 14 months.

The average number of prior complaints at probation has increased from 1.3 in 1986 to

1.8 in 1990. The court is taking longer (in the sense of allowing more referrals to occur) to place a juvenile on probation than was true in the past.


1990 Probationer Profile




Assessments are imposed by the judiciary in cases allowed for probation service fees and placement service fees among others.


Probation assessments and collections peaked in 1989, and though more juveniles were placed on probation in 1990, the assessments for this year are considerably less.





A transfer hearing (remand) is held on the motion of the County Attorney. The Juvenile Court has the exclusive responsibility for making the decision to remand an individual for criminal prosecution.

The number of transfers to adult criminal court have diminished over the past five years (from 155 in 1986, to 101 in 1990). This effect has been coincident with an increase in the number of referrals experienced prior to transfer (from 5.7 in 1986 to 6.8 in 1990).



Intake Caseload Cite-in First Set






The Intake cite-in is the interview of the referred juvenile and parent(s) at the Juvenile Court by an Intake Officer. Generally, these juveniles are first and second referral misdemeanors or status offenses. The Intake Officer has the discretion to handle the referral without initiating a formal Court process.

The average number of days to first cite-in measures how quickly the Intake Division is able to get to the caseload assigned. A second measure is the number of pending (unfinished) cases. Both indicators increased in 1990 from previous years, reflecting increases in referrals.

Intake Caseload




Referrals (complaints) where no formal petition is filed may be adjusted by the Intake Officer after the initial interview with the juvenile and parents. If the juvenile has acknowledged involvement in the alleged offense, the matter will not be adjusted until specific conditions established by the Probation Officer are met. Conditions of adjust may include referral to community agencies for family counseling,

individual counseling, specialized education, and awareness programs such as alcohol and drug abuse, restitution to victims, voluntary work hours in the community, and other similar options.

Intake Caseload has increased by 178% since 1986. The amount of cases received has risen steadily and the amount of cases completed has kept pace.

Progressively Increasing Consequences Act (PIC-ACT)


The Progressively Increasing Consequences Act (PIC-ACT) became effective through legislative action on July 1, 1984. If after conducting an intake interview with the alleged juvenile offender and parent(s), the juvenile acknowledges responsibility for the delinquent act or alcohol offense, the Juvenile Probation Officer may adjust the delinquency complaint once the juvenile has complied with specific conditions.

This legislation concentrates on first and second time

offenders in hopes of eliminating delinquent behavior patterns before they become firmly established. The development of PIC-ACT centers on the debate of whether holding youthful offenders more accountable for their delinquent behavior will result in lower incidences of recidivism. Programs sponsored under PIC-ACT are currently in operation in all fifteen counties in Arizona.

Assessments made at intake for intake services dropped slightly from 1989 to 1990.

Home Detention





Home Detention is an alternative between structured institutional detention and release back into the community. Juveniles originally held in the juvenile detention facility but being allowed to return home pending Court may be assigned to Home Detention.

In this program, the juvenile's freedom is greatly restricted and the Home Detention staff maintain frequent and close contact with the juvenile on an unannounced basis to assure compliance with the conditions of release.

Diversion Programs




Juveniles Completing Diversion Programs

Diversion programs are established and supervised by various municipalities for the needs of first time misdemeanor offenders in their communities. These programs are developed in agreement with the Court Center by means of a Memoranda of Understanding. Municipalities

within Maricopa County have designed First Offender Programs to work with juveniles. Cities such as Phoenix, Mesa, Tempe, Glendale, Peoria, Scottsdale, and Gilbert all have various types of diversion programs for the first time offender.

Violation, and Invalid Complaints.**


In this table, recidivism is defined as the probability of a subsequent referral within one year of the initial referral. Administrative offenses (Holds), and technical probation violations (i.e., no law violation charged) are not counted as initial referrals or subsequent referrals. If the juvenile is 17 years or older at the initial referral, they are not considered. For instance, if a juvenile was referred September 1, 1989, and was 17 years and 6 months old, the case would not be counted, since he could not get more than 6 months of experience in the juvenile system. As soon

as a juvenile reaches the age of 18, the Juvenile Court loses all jurisdiction over that person.

Two samples are used above. The sample called "First Timers" utilized only the first referral to Juvenile Court as the initial referral, while "All Juveniles" utilize any referral except an administrative offense or probation violation.


Recidivism for "All Juveniles" shows an increase of 2-3% over prior years.
