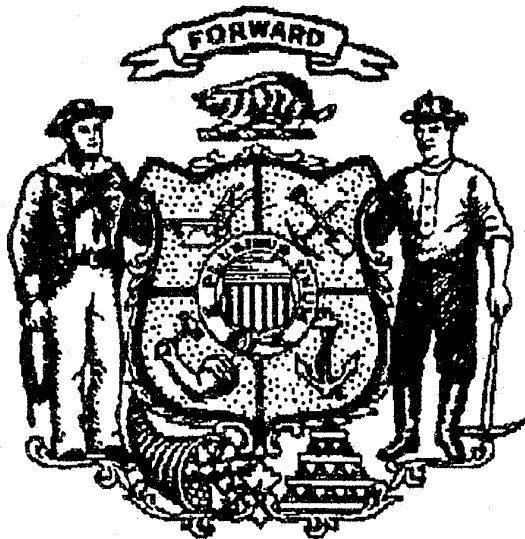

ACQUISITIONS

The Department of Corrections, established January 1, 1990, is responsible for the operation of Wisconsin's correctional facilities for adult offenders and for the supervision of offenders on probation or parole status in the community. This publication is designed to provide information about the volume and movement of offenders under the jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections during fiscal year 1991.

HIGHLIGHTS - ADULT INSTITUTION POPULATION

- \* The institution population includes inmates serving sentences in Wisconsin correctional institutions as well as those serving Wisconsin sentences in federal facilities, institutions operated by other states, and in Wisconsin county jails. Information about males confined at the Wisconsin Resource Center, an institution operated by the Department of Health and Social Services, Division of Care and Treatment Facilities, has not been included in this report.
- \* A total of 7,296 offenders were confined in Wisconsin's correctional facilities for adults on June 30, 1991. This represents an increase of 8.6 percent over the 6,717 offenders in confinement on July 1, 1990.  
(See Table 1.)
- \* Adult male correctional institution populations increased 8.7 percent from 6,408 at the start to 6,963 at the end of fiscal year 1991. Female populations rose from 309 to 333; an increase of 7.8 percent during the same time period.  
(See Table 1.)
- \* The average daily population of institutionalized offenders grew steadily from 5,419 in fiscal year 1987 to 7,034 in fiscal year 1991; an increase of 29.8 percent during the five-year period. The largest increase, 9.5 percent, occurred between fiscal years 1990 and 1991.

## HIGHLIGHTS - COMMUNITY SUPERVISION POPULATION

- \* Community supervision cases, i.e., those offenders supervised in the community under the conditions of probation and parole, increased 12.0 percent from 32,964 at the start to 36,913 at the end of fiscal year 1991.

- \* The number of community services cases on absconder status dropped 3.2 percent from 4,004 on July 1, 1990 to 3,878 on June 30, 1991.  
(See Table 3.)
- \* The Department of Corrections average daily population for community supervision and institution cases increased 14.3 percent from 36,549 in fiscal year 1990 to 41,764 in fiscal year 1991.  
(See Table A.)
- \* During fiscal year 1987 the average daily population of offenders under community supervision stood at 25,192. This average reached a high of 34,730 in fiscal year 1991; an increase of 37.9 percent during the five-year period.  
(See Table A.)
- \* Probation supervision average daily populations increased 40.7 percent from 21,483 in 1987 to 30,223 in 1991. The smallest increase, 2.9 percent, occurred between fiscal years 1988 and 1989; the largest, 16.7 percent, between fiscal years 1990 and 1991.  
(See Table A.)
- \* The average daily population of offenders under parole supervision during fiscal year 1991 was 4,507; an increase of 21.5 percent over the fiscal year 1987 average daily population of 3,709. The largest increase during the five-year period, 9.6 percent, occurred between fiscal years 1989 and 1990; the smallest, 1.7 percent, between fiscal years 1988 and 1989.

- \* Adult parole supervision average daily population rose 21.7 percent from 3,295 in 1987 to 4,010 in 1991. The largest increase during the five-year period (9.3 percent) took place between fiscal years 1989 and 1990; the smallest (2.1 percent) between fiscal years 1988 and 1989.  
(See Table A.)
- \* Juvenile aftercare average daily populations rose from a five-year low of 163 in 1989 to a high of 226 in fiscal year 1991; an increase of 38.7 percent.
