RATE OF FELON PAROLEES RETURNED TO CALIFORNIA PRISONS

HIGHLIGHTS

During 1992, 52,871 felon parolees were returned to prison, at a rate of 59.2 per 100 average daily parolee and PAL populations (ADP).

The rate of parolees returned to custody (PV-RTCs and pending revocation) decreased significantly from 50.3 in 1991 to 39.1 in 1992.

The rate of parole returns was 44.0 for females, and 60.8 for males.

The rate of parolees returned with a new term (PV-WNTs) increased slightly from 19.5 in 1991 to 20.1 in 1992.
