### Classification Level of Male Felons

### June 1993

The attached tables present data on the classification of male felon inmates within the California Department of Corrections prison system. California felon inmates are given a classification score based upon a number of different factors, such as length of prison term, prior incarceration behavior, and prior escapes. A high classification score should result in a high security level placement. Correctional institutions are also classified by security level. In most cases, inmates with higher classification scores are placed in higher security level institutions. Circumstances, such as educational, work, or other administrative needs, can result in the placement of inmates in institutions with different security levels and does not mean the inmate is inappropriately "out of level".

Table 1 shows the number of male felon inmates (excluding civil narcotic addicts) in the California prison system. The number of inmates housed in each security level, the number of inmates in reception centers, and the number of inmates without classification scores are listed. Inmates on temporary release (for family emergencies, college courses, re-entry program furlough, release to hold, etc.) are included in the felon population.

Table 2 presents information on the location of inmates by the security level of the institution and the classification score level of the inmate. Since most correctional facilities have more than one level of security, a facility may be listed under more than one security level.

Table 3 contains data on the number of inmates housed in facilities with a security level different from the inmates' classification score level by the reason (administrative determinant) for the exceptional placement.

A set of definitions of reasons for exceptional placements is included in the March, June, September, and December reports. A mailing list exists for the March, June, September, and December reports and additional names/organizations will be included on the mailing list upon written request. Note: In October 1988, the classification scoring system was revised. Due to the number of inmates, the revised scoring system was implemented on an institution by institution basis. The implementation was completed in October 1989. During this transitional period "Classification Level of Male Felons" reports were not published.





### Definitions of Reasons for Exceptional Placements

### Reason

### **Definition**

IN PROCESSING

Includes: (1) will be in proper placement after ongoing classification is complete; (2) currently in proper placement but the computer file has not been updated or contains incomplete information; and (3) enroute to proper placement (on waiting list, in temporary housing, or awaiting transportation).

UNKNOWN

Includes those cases placed out of level for reasons that are not valid for an override to a higher or lower level. For example, a reason of camp placement would not be valid for an override to a higher level placement and arson or disciplinary problems would not be valid reasons for an override to a lower level.

PRE-RELEASE

Cases too close to parole release date to be

moved to another institution.

**WORK CREW** 

Inmates currently needed to fill a vital work crew position who cannot be readily

replaced.

**ENEMIES** 

Cases whose lives would be endangered if

placed in another facility.

**DISCIPLINARY** 

Placement based on disciplinary problems

which threaten the security of another

institution.

**ESCAPE RISK** 

Placement is based on circumstances which

would suggest high escape potential.

# Definitions of Reasons for Exceptional Placements

Reason

**Definition** 

**HOLDS & DETAINERS** 

Placement is based on circumstances where a Hold or Detainer is likely to be exercised.

SEX PROBLEMS

Includes rapists, sexual deviants and those who need special security because of the nature of their offense behavior.

TIME TO SERVE

Time to serve is long (e.g., life without possibility of parole), indicating a need for a higher level placement than indicated by inmate's score.

CAMP PLACEMENT

Cases approved for camp training and placement prior to becoming Level I cases.

BEHAVIOR OK

This indicates that the inmate has demonstrated by good conduct that custody needs can be met at a lower level institution.

POPULATION NEEDS

No beds are available at the time of classification action for the level indicated by the inmate's classification score.

**VOC/SCHOOL & PROGRAMS** 

Involved in academic or vocational training not available at the level of institution indicated by the inmate's classification score.

**OUT TO COURT** 

Placed in a particular facility in order to be close to a court jurisdiction where the inmate is required to testify or appear.

**MISCELLANEOUS** 

All other reasons such as age of inmate, nature of offense makes inmate a risk (e.g., an arsonist), medical problems, gang involvement, etc.
