INTRODUCTION

The Firearms Discharge Assault Report is compiled and produced, on a yearly basis, by the Firearms and Tactics Section. The information contained in this report is obtained from Firearms Discharge/Assault Reports prepared by uniformed members of the service and narrative reports prepared by supervisory personnel. All pertinent information contained in these reports is thoroughly analyzed, evaluated and collated. Once the pertinent information is assessed, it is used to prepare the yearly Firearms Discharge Assault Report.

This report is not merely designed to provide a statistical analysis of firearms discharges and assaults upon uniformed members of the service. Its primary function is to serve as a training tool. Patterns, trends and possible police hazards are identified which allows the Department to structure training courses to address current conditions. Tendencies, circumstances or conditions which may occur during one or more incidents permits the Department to incorporate necessary changes into training cycles to help promote the safety of all concerned.

Training is neither static nor rigid but is continuously evolving to serve our needs. The most significant concern of firearms and tactics training is safety. The safety of our members and the safety of the public we serve is paramount to all other concerns. The promotion and implementation of sound tactical procedures is the most effective means of ensuring the safety of all during the accomplishment of our mission.

- FIREARMS (SHOOTING) INCIDENT** This defines any incident during which a member of the service fired his/her weapon for any reason. (These statistics include gunfights.)
- ASSAULT** Defines an incident in which an officer is assaulted with any type of weapon, including firearms **AND** the officer DOES NOT fire his/her weapon.
- INCIDENTS** Includes all GUNFIGHTS, FIREARMS/SHOOTING INCIDENTS, and ASSAULTS as defined in this Report.
- M.O.S.** Member of the service

OVERVIEW

During 1992, a total of 392 incidents were reported as compared to 440 incidents reported in 1991, showing a decrease of 11%. Of the 392 incidents reported, MOS fired a total of 1,094 shots as compared to 1,112 shots in 1991 (a decrease of 1.6%). It should be noted that of the 1,094 shots fired by MOS in 1992, 96 shots were fired at animals as compared to 128 shots in 1991 (a decrease of 25%). In the incidents involving shots fired at dogs, 57 of the shots fired were at pitbulls attacking civilians or MOS.

The overall hit potential of MOS increased from 28% in 1991, to 29% in 1992. MOS hit potential against perpetrators increased from 21% in 1991 to 23% in 1992.

Perpetrators fired 429 shots at MOS in 1992 as compared to 444 shots in 1991 (a decrease of 3.4%). The number of perpetrators that fired decreased from 170 in 1991 to 155 in 1992 (a decrease of 8.8%). The number of incidents in which perpetrators fired their weapon decreased from 154 in 1991 to 140 in 1992 (a decrease of 9.1%)

It should be noted that during this reporting year there were decreases in the number of perpetrators who fired a weapon, number of shots and number of hits by perpetrators, number of incidents perpetrators were armed with a firearm, and incidents perpetrators firing at M.O.S. There was a slight increase of average shots per perpetrator from 2.61 in 1991 to 2.76 in 1992. There was a decrease of perpetrator hit potential from 12.2% in 1991 to 8.2% in 1992. In the percentage of incidents where perps were armed with firearms, there was an increase from 59% in 1991 to 60% in 1992.

Gunfights decreased from 94 in 1991 to 76 in 1992 (a decrease of 19.1%). M.O.S. hit potential increased from 15% in 1991 to 17% in 1992. During 1992, 1 MOS was killed and 8 MOS were wounded as compared to 2 MOS killed and 17 wounded in 1991. In 1992, 6 perpetrators were killed and 27 wounded as compared to 6 killed and 31 wounded in 1991. During the reporting year MOS fired 583 shots as compared to 558 shots in 1991 (an increase of 4.5%). In 1992 hits scored by members of the service increased from 82 to 96 (an increase of 17.1%).

In 1992 there were 8 incidents where MOS were robbed/disarmed of their firearms and 2 incidents reported where MOS were disarmed of their nightsticks.

GUNFIGHT SYNOPSIS

CASE # 1 - M.O.S. in confines of the 44 Precinct, while on patrol, heard shots being fired and observed two Housing P.D. Officers taking cover. M.O.S. heard more shots and went to investigate. 1 perp fired several rounds at two M.O.S. One P.O. fired 2X striking perp 1X injuring him. Distance undetermined - Sights used. Perp arrested.

Case # 5 - M.O.S. in confines of the 71 Precinct on patrol heard shots. M.O.S. exited their R.M.P. and approached the location on foot. Perp pointed a gun at officers; one P.O. fired 1X0. Perp ran and was joined by another perp. Both perps turned and fired approximately 6X0. P.O. again fired 3X0 at a distance of 50 feet. No sights used. Two arrests.

Case # 10 - M.O.S. in confines of the 67 Precinct on anti-crime patrol were informed by complainant that perp pulled a gun and demanded money. M.O.S. radioed for backup and followed perp. Perp refused to stop when ordered by M.O.S. Eight other M.O.S. arrived at scene. One officer attempted to take perp into custody. Perp escaped, turned and fired 2X0 at M.O.S. Four M.O.S. fired 17X hitting perp 12X. Perp D.O.A. Distance of 3 - 10 feet, no sights used.

Case # 11 - P.O. off duty in confines of the 88 Precinct was approached by two males, one of which had a gun. P.O. identified self, perp ran, turned and pointed gun. P.O. and perp fired simultaneously at each other 2X each. No hits at a distance of 8 - 12 feet. No sights used. No arrest.

Case # 15 - M.O.S. in R.M.P. on a pickup of a past robbery were involved in a car chase. R.M.P. blocked perps car. Three perps exited vehicle and one perp turned and fired 2X0 at officers. Five M.O.S. fired 14X hitting two perps 3X injuring them at a distance of 7 - 10 feet. Unknown if sights used. Three arrests

CASE # 18 - M.O.S. in confines of 88 Precinct on radio run searching for robbery perp. Perp observed by M.O.S. who exited R.M.P. and gave chase on foot. Perp turned and fired 1X striking one P.O. in hand. Partner fired 2X0 at an unknown distance. Unknown if sights used. Perp arrested.

GUNFIGHT SYNOPSIS (continued)

Case # 35 - M.O.S. in confines of the 60 Precinct on radio run of past robbery. M.O.S. observed three perps and began chasing them on foot through a parking lot. One perp turned and fired 1X0. Two M.O.S. fired 5X0 at a distance of 20 - 25 feet using no sights. Three arrests.

Case # 40 - P.O. off-duty in the confines of the 46 Precinct in elevator with girlfriend. Inside elevator two perps attempted to rob P.O. and a struggle ensued. Two perps fired 3X hitting P.O. 3X. P.O., while prone, fired 4X at both perps at approximately 3 feet - unknown if sights used. Both perps found in hospital, hit 2X each. P.O. died from gunshot wounds.

Case # 43 - MOS on duty in confines of the 101 Precinct working undercover were approached by perp selling drugs. Undercover #1 and perp went into vacant lot. During this time, another perp approached undercover #3, pulled a gun and dragged him into lot. Perp fired 1X into chest and then between the legs of undercover #3. Undercover broke away. Undercover #1 and 2 fired 11X4 killing perp. Undercover #3 saved by vest. Unknown if sights used. Unknown distance. Other perp escaped.

Case # 59 - M.O.S. on duty in confines of the 40 Precinct heard shots being fired. Officers observed perp and gave chase. Perp turned and fired 1X0. One P.O. fired 1X0 at a distance of 25 feet. No sights used. Perps 9MM jammed. One arrest.

Case # 78 - M.O.S. on duty in confines of the 63 Precinct answered a robbery in progress, possible hostage situation. At location four perps entered pet store where off duty detective was working, and proceeded to beat him and rob him of his off-duty gun. M.O.S. arrived at location and as two perps exited store they were placed under arrest. The other two perps exited with a female hostage. One perp fired 2X at M.O.S. M.O.S. took cover. One perp ran, turned and fired 5X0 at M.O.S. Officer #1 fired 4X0 at perp - perp escaped. Perp holding hostage, walked and fired 2X. Hostage broke free and perp again fired 2X0. P.O. #2 fired 2X0, P.O. #3 fired 6X0, P.O. #4 fired 3X0, P.O. #5 fired 4X0. Perp ran and discarded gun (O/D Det. 38 Rev). Perp pulled another gun (9MM) and fired 5X0 at P.O. #'s 6 and 7. P.O.'s #6 and 7 each fired 2X0. Perp dropped weapon and was apprehended. Three perps arrested, one escaped. Distance 20 - 30 feet; four used sights, two did not use sights.

GUNFIGHT SYNOPSIS (continued)

Case # 79 - MOS on patrol in confines of the 77 Precinct informed of perps robbing a livery cab driver. M.O.S. observed perps. One perp entered a building and was apprehended. Other perp fired at M.O.S. Officer ordered perp to drop gun; perp refused and pointed gun again. P.O. fired 1X0 with Glock 19. Distance 20 - 30 feet - No sights - Two arrests. No injuries.

Case # 80 - MOS in confines of the 103 Precinct on a buy and bust operation. Four males followed both officers into an alley. One perp fired 4X0; one P.O. fired 6X1. One perp was later found in a hospital with a gunshot wound to thigh. Distance 50 - 60 feet. Unknown if sights used. Perps .380 semi-auto jammed.

Case # 82 - Det. on duty in confines of the 46 Precinct observed a male place a gun in his jacket. Detective exited vehicle and identified self and attempted to arrest perp. Perp ran with detective in pursuit. Perp turned and fired. Detective returned fire 6 X 0. Perp continued running with both detectives in pursuit. Perp turned again and fired his weapon 4 X 0. Detective fired at a distance of 50 feet. Sights used. One arrest.

Case # 84 - M.O.S. in confines of the 70 Precinct heard shots being fired. At location, M.O.S. observed several youths one of whom had a gun. Perp fired 1X0 at Officer and ran. Officer chased perp. Perp turned and pointed gun. On P.O. fired 2X0 at a distance of 30 feet. No sights used. One arrest.

Case # 92 - M.O.S. in confines of the 71 Precinct working anti-crime patrol, heard shots and observed a male exiting basement of a grocery store with a gun in waistband. Perp observed M.O.S., ran and turned firing 2X0. Both M.O.S. took cover, returned fire 6X0 at a distance of 20 yards. No sights used. Perp arrested.

Case # 94 - M.O.S. in confines of the 43 Precinct working anti-crime on a radio run of a man with a gun. M.O.S. observed male and told him three times to drop gun. Perp pulled trigger; perps .38 revolver misfired. One P.O. fired 1X1 killing perp. Unknown distance, unknown if sights used.

Case # 99 - P.O. off duty in the confines of Nassau County, was shot at 5X1 by his stepbrother who has psychiatric problems. P.O. was hit in the back of head. Officer fired 5X hitting stepbrother 3X and injuring him. Officer fired at an undetermined distance. Unknown if sights used. Stepbrother arrested. P.O. shot and injured.

GUNFIGHT SYNOPSIS (continued)

Case # 100 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 70 Precinct had a pickup of a disorderly group. At location, officers observed two perps. The two perps observed M.O.S. and fired several rounds at officers and ran. One perp continued firing while running. One P.O. fired 3X; perp fired again. Officer again fired 3X then reloaded. The two perps ran into an alleyway and continued firing at M.O.S. M.O.S. took cover and fired 5X0. Two more M.O.S. arrived and were fired upon from a window. The two M.O.S. fired 4X0. Distances of shots were 25 feet and 40-50 feet. No sights used.

Case # 104 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 34 Precinct informed of a robbery/with a gun in an apartment. M.O.S. went to 4th floor apartment and opened door. Two perps fired at M.O.S. M.O.S. returned fire and backed away for cover. One perp pointed gun and M.O.S. fired again. One perp collapsed due to injury and the other was D.O.A. M.O.S. fired 23X6 and the perps fired 4X0. Unknown distance - unknown if sights were used.

Case # 111 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 44 Precinct answered a radio run of male/with a gun. At location M.O.S. exited R.M.P. Perp fired 1X into air, ran, then fired 1 more time at police officer. Officer fired 5X hitting perp 1X in hand. Officer fired at a distance of 20 feet - Unknown if sights used. One arrest.

Case # 113 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 77 Precinct answered a radio run of a robbery. At location M.O.S. observed two perps fitting description and ordered perps to stop. One perp arrested at location the other perp fled and was chased by M.O.S. Perp turned and fired at two officers. Two officers returned fire. Four other M.O.S. arrived and were fired at by perp. Those four officers returned fire. Perp shot 3X and injured. Distance - 7 shots at 15 - 20 feet, 10 shots at 40 feet. M.O.S. did not use sights. Perp fired 6X0 with a .45 semi-auto.

Officer again returned fire 4X0. Perp entered van and pointed gun at the officer's partner. The officer fired 2X0. Perp escaped. Distance of 15 - 20 feet. One M.O.S. used sights - the other officer did not.

Case # 138 - M.O.S. on R.M.P. patrol in the confines of the 34 Precinct observed male with a gun. M.O.S. exited R.M.P., perp ran into building with officers chasing him. Perp turned and fired 2X0, both officers fired 2 times each at a distance of 10 feet with no sights. One arrest.

Case # 139 - M.O.S. on radio run in confines of the 79 Precinct. At location, M.O.S. informed by civilians that perp in an apartment was firing a gun. Officers went to apartment door, perp opened door slightly (two times) then slammed and locked door. M.O.S. went to front of house and took cover. Perp fired 3X0 from window. Two M.O.S. fired 5X0 from a distance of 15 - 20 feet. No sights used. Perp arrested.

GUNFIGHT SYNOPSIS (continued)

Case # 143 - P.O. while off duty in confines of the 34 Precinct was followed into the elevator by two perps. One perp pulled gun and robbed officer of money and jewelry. Perp attempted to go into the officer's pocket and officer pushed him back. Perp fired once grazing officer's hand and the bullet entered the other perps abdomen. Perps ran with officer in pursuit. Perp turned and fired twice. Officer fired 2X0. Perps continued running and dropped gun. P.O. caught perp and went to retrieve perp's fallen gun. Perp grabbed officer's gun. During struggle, P.O. fired 1X hitting perp in arm. P.O. fired from a distance of less than 3 feet. No sight used. Two arrests.

Case # 146 - M.O.S. on a radio run of a drug sale-guns involved in the confines of the 73 Precinct. At location one perp ran from crowd. One P.O. chased perp. Perp turned and fired 1X0. P.O. fired 1X0 at a distance of 15 yards. No sights used. One arrest.

Case # 154 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 66 Precinct, informed by passerby of shots fired in a Law Office. At location M.O.S. observed two perps in hasidic dress and false beards, armed, leaving Law Office. M.O.S. gave chase. One perp fired 4X0. Perp #2 fired Glock .40 cal. 3 times inside office; malfunctioned; recovered with discharged shell in chamber. Two M.O.S. fired a total of 14X1, injuring one perp. One officer reloaded. No sights. M.O.S. fired at a distance of 15 feet. Two arrests. Both perps had bullet resistant vests.

Case # 162 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 115 Precinct, heard shots fired. At location, M.O.S. observed perp shoot complainant. Perp fired 1X0 at M.O.S. and fled, turned again, and fired one more time. Perp turned around again pointing gun. Officer fired 6X0; perp fled in vehicle. Complainant D.O.A. P.O. fired at a distance of 25 feet. No sights used. No arrest.

Case # 166 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 105 Precinct received a radio run of burglary in progress. At location complainant gave description of perps and entered R.M.P. to search for perps. Complainant observed four perps. Officers exited R.M.P. and ordered perps to stop. Two perps obeyed, other two perps ran with M.O.S. in pursuit. One perp stopped and surrendered; other perp turned and fired 1X0. Three M.O.S. fired 8X hitting perp 3X, injuring him. Distance unknown, unknown if sights used. Four arrests.

Case # 168 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 43 Precinct observed two other M.O.S. chasing a male. P.O. exited police van and chased perp. Perp turned and fired 3X0. Officer fell to ground and fired 6X0 at a distance of 100 feet. No sights used. Perp escaped.

Case # 175 - P.O. off duty in confines of the 66 Precinct heard gunshot and observed male with a gun, and a victim with a licensed shotgun. Victim had just been shot in the leg by perp. Detective exited his vehicle and four male perps escaped in livery cab. Detective chased perps on foot. Officer took cover and ordered perps out of cab. One perp pulled unknown semiautomatic and fired 1X. Perps gun misfired. Detective fired 1X0. All perps escaped. No arrests. Detective fired at a distance of 7 feet. Unknown if sights used.

Case # 178 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 30 Precinct on radio run of "dispute-shots fired". At location, M.O.S. observed perp firing at civilians. Perp observed M.O.S. and fired 7X0 at responding M.O.S. Five officers fired 39X2, perp injured. Three M.O.S. used sights. One officer used no sights and other officer unknown if sight used. Seven shots at undetermined distance; ten shots at a distance of 20 feet; ten shots at a distance of 30 feet and twelve shots at 50 feet. Four M.O.S. reloaded.

Case # 180 - M.O.S. on anti-crime patrol in confines of the 107 Precinct responded to radio run of robbery of a livery cab. M.O.S. put complainant in vehicle and observed one perp on street. Perp arrested. One other perp appeared from behind bushes and fired, hitting one officer in buttocks. Officer returned fire 6X0. Other M.O.S. observed gunfight and chased perp. Perp turned and fired 2X0 at M.O.S. Two officers fired 12X0. One officer reloaded and fired additional two rounds. Three perps arrested. No sights used. 30 - 40 feet distance.

One officer chased perp, perp turned and fired 1X0. Officer fired 1X0 at a distance of 15 - 20 feet. Unknown if sights used. Perp was wearing bullet resistant vest. Six arrests and six guns recovered.

Case # 235 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 120 Precinct heard shots and observed six males running. One perp ran into building with other five males splitting up. Two males in vehicle drove towards M.O.S. in R.M.P. and hit their R.M.P. One perp exited his vehicle and fired 2X0 at M.O.S. M.O.S. exited vehicle and one officer fired 1X0 at a distance of 15 feet. No sights used. One arrest.

Both officers fired 4X each, hitting perp 5X. Perp injured. Distance 20 feet. No sights used. One arrest.

Case # 248 - P.O. on solo R.M.P. duty in confines of the 103 Precinct informed of a "robbery in progress". At location, officer was fired upon. P.O. returned fire 6X0 at a distance of 30 feet. Unknown if sights used. Perp fled, turned and fired several more rounds. Perp arrested. Perp's 9MM weapon had jammed.

Case # 249 - M.O.S. in confines of the 110 Precinct informed of a holdup in progress at nearby Social Club. M.O.S. could not gain access and called for backup. M.O.S. arrived and gained entrance to basement. M.O.S. positioned on stairs of basement identified self to perps. Perps fired 2X. M.O.S. retreated out door and secured same. Perps ran to roof and fired 4X. Perp then ran down to rear yard and broke into a residence taking a hostage. Perps brought hostage outside and were confronted by numerous M.O.S. One perp held gun to hostage's head while another perp put a gun to the hostage's ribs. Perps tried to board a bus with hostage but driver refused. One perp turned and fired 1X into hostage's head. M.O.S. opened fire on perps with perps returning fire. One perp D.O.A. Hostage D.O.A. One perp wounded. Fourteen M.O.S. fired 66X with 19 hits. M.O.S. hit hostage 10X unintentionally. Seven M.O.S. used sights - Undetermined distance. Perps fired 20X.

Case # 252 - M.O.S. in confines of the 48 Precinct on "buy and bust". Backup team arrived and knocked on apartment door. Perp opened door and fired 1X. Two M.O.S. fired 6X0. One Officer hit in buttocks. Other M.O.S. arrived. One Officer fired 1X0 at perp. Perp ran onto fire escape. Lieutenant fired seven times from Glock and two Detectives fired 6X. Perp hit 3 times. Unknown distance. Unknown if sights were used. One arrest.

GUNFIGHT SYNOPSIS (continued)

Case # 253 - M.O.S. in confines of the 115 Precinct searching for perp with complainant regarding a robbery. Complainant pointed out perp. Perp fled with M.O.S. in pursuit. Perp turned and pointed a 9MM. Two M.O.S. fired 1X0 each. Perp fired 1X0. One P.O. returned fire 1X0. Officers fired at a distance of 40 feet. Unknown if sights used. One arrest.

Case # 254 - M.O.S. in confines of the 70 Precinct observed perps with guns. One officer chased four perps while other P.O. chased another male. Two perps turned and fired 4X at Officer. P.O. returned two shots. Perps split up. One M.O.S. arrested one perp at which time two more shots were fired at M.O.S. Other perps escaped. One perp hit unintentionally by other perp. Distance of 25 feet, no sights used.

Case # 256 - M.O.S. in confines of the 70 Precinct were flagged down by Transit Officer and informed of robbery of a newsstand. M.O.S. exited R.M.P., approached newsstand and observed perp struggling with owner. Officer drew his service revolver. Perp pointed his .44 Magnum at one officer then the other. Perp fired 1X, Officer fired 1X0. Perp dropped gun. Perp shot self and complainant. Complainant had grabbed perp's gun hand when perp fired at officer. Distance 5 feet, no sights used.

Case # 260 - P.O. off duty in confines of the 48 Precinct heard disturbance on corner and observed perp firing at a group of males. Officer identified self. Perp turned and fired 2X at P.O. Officer fired 6X hitting perp once. Perp escaped but was later arrested. Distance 8 - 10 feet. Unknown if sights were used.

Case # 262 - M.O.S. on duty in confines of the 46 Precinct working in R.I.P. Unit, responded to a past robbery in an apartment. Four males exited apartment with one perp carrying a gun in waistband. Perp with gun ran downstairs. Detective chased him. Perp turned and fired 1X0, Detective fired 2X0. Perp escaped. Unknown distance. Unknown if sights used.

Case # 272 - P.O. assigned to Solo Print Unit while in confines of the 120 Precinct was advised by a pedestrian of a male shot at gas station. P.O. advised communications and responded to location where he observed two perps running from gas station. P.O. exited R.M.P. Perp turned and fired 1X0. Officer fired 2X0 at a distance of 45 - 50 feet. No sights used. Perp escaped.

GUNFIGHT SYNOPSIS (continued)

Case # 278 - P.O. off duty in confines of the 115 Precinct, heard vehicle accident and observed passenger get out of livery cab covered with blood while cab took off. P.O. rendered aid to the passenger. Driver came back with gun, screaming. A civilian tackled the driver. P.O. drew gun and identified self. Perp ran, P.O. chased perp. Perp turned and fired 4X0 and P.O. fired 4X0 at a distance of 50 feet. Unknown if sights used. Perp escaped.

Case # 287 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 52 Precinct observed male acting suspicious while in a livery cab. M.O.S. approached perp and spoke to him. Perp pulled gun and fired 2X0 at M.O.S. Sergeant and two other officers fired 15X. Perp ran with M.O.S. in pursuit. Anticrime Unit officers in area observed perp. Perp turned and fired at officer 2X. P.O. fired 5X. Perp hit 10X - D.O.A. No sights used. Distance 10 feet.

Case # 291 - M.O.S. working SNEU in confines of the 75 Precinct observed vehicle being driven erratically. M.O.S. pulled vehicle over. Perp jumped from vehicle holding a gun. P.O. pulled R.M.P. in front of perp and ordered the perp to drop gun. Perp fired 1X0. Sergeant and police officers fired 3X0. Perp ran, then was apprehended. Distance 15 - 20 feet. No sights used.

Case # 297 - M.O.S. from Tactical Narcotics Team in confines of the 34 Precinct heard description over radio of a perp with a gun. M.O.S. observed perp, exited vehicle and identified selves. Perp was ordered to halt. Perp turned with gun and fired 1X0. Two M.O.S. each fired 1X0 at a distance of 12 - 20 feet. No sights used. Perps 9MM jammed. One arrest.

Case # 298 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 28 Precinct on radio run of a man with gun. At location, M.O.S. observed perp. Perp ran with M.O.S. in pursuit. Perp turned and fired 1X0 at Officers with .20 gauge sawed off shotgun while running with M.O.S. in close pursuit. Perp turned once again and pointed shotgun. One P.O. fired 1X0 at a distance of 15 feet. No sights used. One arrest.

Case # 299 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 52 Precinct observed a drug transaction. Two perps went into basement. M.O.S. entered basement where one perp fired 2X0. One P.O. fired 2X2 killing perp. Unknown distance. Sights used. One arrest.

GUNFIGHT SYNOPSIS (continued)

Case # 301 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 84 Precinct were chasing perps in a vehicle. Perps vehicle struck an iron fence. Perps exited vehicle. One officer chased perps on foot while the other officer drove in R.M.P. One perp turned and fired 1X0. P.O. fired 2X0 at a distance of 70 feet. Unknown if sights used. Two arrests.

Case # 303 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 40 Precinct observed perps firing at each other. M.O.S. stopped R.M.P. and exited their vehicle. M.O.S. found themselves in the line of fire. Perp fired 2X0 at officers. One officer fired 4X2 hitting and injuring one perp. Undetermined distance. Unknown if sights were used.

Case # 312 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 71 Precinct on a radio run of a dispute with firearm. Two M.O.S. approached males on corner of location. One perp ran with M.O.S. in pursuit. Perp turned and fired 1X0 at M.O.S. One sergeant and two officers fired 1X each. No hits. Perp ran, turned and again fired 1X0. Three M.O.S. fired 7X0. Perp escaped. Distance 20 - 30 feet. No sights used.

Case # 317 - P.O. on scooter patrol in confines of the 79 Precinct was advised by complainant of robbery. At location officer observed males involved in a robbery. P.O. pursued perps on foot. Perps entered vehicle. One perp fired 1X0. P.O. fired 6X0. Perp turned corner and again fired 3X0. P.O. fired at a distance from 20 feet. Unknown if sights used. Two of the four perps were arrested. One bystander shot and injured by officer.

Case # 318 - Detectives on investigation (R.I.P.) in confines of the 73 Precinct observed two perps wanted for homicide. Two detectives exited vehicle with one detective cutting off perps vehicle. Two detectives approached the perp's car. One perp fired 3X0 at M.O.S. Three detectives fired 15X0. No sights used. Detectives fired 6 shots at 10 feet; 3 shots at 6 feet and 6 shots at 30 - 40 feet. Two arrests.

Case # 322 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 115 Precinct observed two suspicious vehicles in a service station. When occupants observed M.O.S. they drove away. M.O.S. followed one of the vehicles. Perps vehicle had flat tire and stopped. M.O.S. exited R.M.P. One perp exited vehicle and fired 1X0 at M.O.S. M.O.S. took cover. Other four perps exited vehicle and ran. M.O.S. chased perps on foot. One other perp turned and fired 1X0. Two M.O.S. fired 4X0. Perp fired again 1X0. Total of five perps. Four arrests. Distance 15 - 20 feet. No sights used.

Case # 323 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 77 Precinct observed male firing shots at another male. M.O.S. approached the perp and ordered male to freeze. Perp turned and fired at M.O.S. Both M.O.S. returned fire 4X at a distance of 100 feet. Unknown if sights used. Perp escaped. One bystander grazed in leg by M.O.S.

Case # 335 - M.O.S. on anti-crime patrol in confines of the 77 Precinct observed perp making movement towards waist, pulling a gun from same and fled. Sergeant and officers chased male. Another perp appeared and pointed a gun at other officer's back. Sergeant turned and saw perp pointing gun at officer's back. Sergeant identified self; perp turned and fired gun 1X0. Sergeant fired 1X1 injuring perp. Unknown distance. Unknown if sights used. Two arrests.

Case # 338 - P.O. off duty in confines of the 90 Precinct making a night deposit at bank accompanied by his father were approached from behind by two perps. P.O. was told "Don't turn around, don't look, I know you have a piece. Don't take it out". One perp removed bag containing receipts and ran. Two perps turned and fired 6X1 hitting officer in left side of chest. Officer fired 2X0. Perps escaped. Officer fired at a distance of 40 feet. Unknown if sights used.

Case # 344 - M.O.S. on duty in confines of the 60 Precinct responded to a radio run of shots fired. At location, perp fired 1X then closed apartment door. Perp breaks into other apartment via balcony and fires several more times. P.O. fired 3X with Glock. Perp breaks into another apartment via balcony and fires again at M.O.S. M.O.S. fires 17X (one officer using a service revolver and 12 gauge shotgun). Perp hit in arm 1X. Perp attempts to climb balcony and falls to his death. Distance 15 - 20 feet. One officer stated that he used sights.

Case # 354 - M.O.S. on patrol in confines of the 13 Precinct observed robbery in progress at a liquor store. Perp observed M.O.S. Perp fired 3X0 at officer with a 9MM Glock. Two officers fired 6X1 hitting perp in thigh. Perps 9MM Glock jammed twice. One bystander shot and injured by perp. Undetermined distance. No sights used. One arrest.

Case # 364 - P.O. off duty in private vehicle within confines of the 34 Precinct was involved in a vehicle accident with a perp who had just robbed a delicatessen and was being pursued by a Transit Police Officer. Perp exited vehicle and ran with off duty officer and Transit Officer in pursuit. Perp and M.O.S. exchanged shots. Perp took cover and again shots were exchanged. Perp shot and injured a livery cab driver and stole the cab with two passengers in the rear seat. Perp fired 2X at passengers causing no injury. Case # 386 - M.O.S. on anti-crime patrol in confines of the 13 Precinct observed perps attempting to steal a car. Perps started car. M.O.S. exited R.M.P. and approached perps. Perps ran from vehicle. One officer grabbed one perp while another perp fired 1X0. Three M.O.S. fired 7X1 hitting and injuring perp. Perp that was shot, jumped into vehicle with other perps and drove away. Perps later arrested at hospital. Unknown distance, unknown if sights were used.

During 1992 there were 62 incidents where members of the service were fired at and did not return fire. Of these 62 incidents, 163 shots were fired at 113 members of the service. Of the 113 members of the service shot at, 11 officers received injuries (shot or grazed).

XVI. MISTAKEN IDENTITY - 2 INCIDENTS

Case # 47 - A uniformed M.O.S. heard description of perpetrator wanted for possession of a gun and observed male fitting description running with a gun in hand. Uniformed M.O.S. fired one round at male. No injury. Male fitting description was an on-duty Anti-crime Unit officer, in civilian clothes, who was also chasing perpetrator.

Case #283 - Street Crime Unit looking for perps with gun inside apartment building. S.C.U. officers running downstairs to lobby when Anti-crime Unit officers and S.C.U. officers fired at each other. One P.O. shot in chest, neck and back. Vest saved life. One P.O. shot in thigh and one other P.O. received graze to leg.

XVII. OFF-DUTY EMPLOYMENT RELATED INCIDENTS

During this reporting period there were 2 shootings that were not carried in this report due to the fact that M.O.S. involvement was strictly related to off duty employment.

SYNOPSIS OF GLOCK 19 INCIDENTS

On Monday, April 3, 1989, the Police Academy's Firearms and Tactics Section commenced training of selected units of the Department in the use of the Glock 19 9MM semiautomatic Pistol. In addition, on October 21, 1991, this unit also commenced training of selected members of the Patrol Bureau. A total of 684 members of the service have attended this training during calendar year 1992. Of the above members trained, 256 were from OCCB, 253 from Patrol, 92 from the Detective Bureau, 46 from the Intelligence Division/Police Commissioner's Office, 28 from the Firearms and Tactics Section, 3 from Hostage Negotiation, 5 from the Chief of Department's Office and 1 from the Chief of Patrol's Office.

A total of 514 Glock 19 Pistols have been issued by this unit. The breakdown is as follows: there are 190 issued to OCCB, 187 to Patrol, 88 issued to the Detective Bureau, 26 issued to the Intelligence Division/Police Commissioner's Office, 15 issued to the Firearms and Tactics Section, 6 to Chief of Department's Office and 2 issued to Hostage Negotiation.

QUALIFICATION CYCLE 1 OF 1992, commenced on January 2, 1992, and finished on March 27, 1992. Five hundred eighty-three (583) members attended this cycle, while seven (7) members had their Glock 19 removed for failing to attend. Two (2) members had their Glock 19's removed for not being able to meet standards.

QUALIFICATION CYCLE 2 OF 1992, commenced on April 8, 1992, and finished on June 26, 1992. Five hundred fifty-nine (559) members attended this cycle, while five (5) members had their Glock 19's removed for failing to attend. Eight (8) members had their Glock 19's removed for not being able to meet standards.

QUALIFICATION CYCLE 3 OF 1992, Commenced on July 22, 1992, and finished on September 30, 1992. Four hundred ninety-five (495) members attended this cycle, while eight (8) members had their Glock 19's removed for failing to attend. Two (2) members had their Glock 19's removed for not being able to meet standards.

QUALIFICATION CYCLE 4 OF 1992, commenced on October 7, 1992, and finished on December 30, 1992. Four hundred thirty-six (436) members attended this cycle, nine (9) members had their Glock 19's removed for failing to attend. There were no members of the service who had their Glock 19's removed for not being able to meet standards.

Incident #1 - ACCIDENTAL DISCHARGE GLOCK NOT AUTHORIZED
P.O. Shot Self

On January 1, 1992, at approximately 2030 hours off duty M.O.S. was at his residence unloading his 9MM Glock (not authorized) when he accidentally discharged 1 round striking himself in the hand.

Incident #2 - INTENTIONAL SHOOTING - GUNFIGHT

On March 11, 1992, at approximately 0040 hours on duty M.O.S., Sergeant's Operator (77 Pct.), was informed by livery cab driver of being robbed by 2 perps. M.O.S. observed perps armed with guns entering a vehicle. Perps drove car; then abandoned it. M.O.S. followed perps. 1 perp entered a building and was arrested. 2nd perp ran with gun. M.O.S. exited RMP - perp fired then pointed gun again, M.O.S. fired 1x0 from Glock 19. Perp dropped gun and was arrested. M.O.S. was approximately 20 - 30 feet from perp - no sights used.

Incident #3 - ACCIDENTAL DISCHARGE - PERP SHOT INJURED

On March 18, 1992, at approximately 1855 hours on duty M.O.S., Lieutenant's Operator (83 Pct.), was informed of a robbery. M.O.S. observed suspect and pursued him. Perp confronted M.O.S. and struggle ensued. Perp grabbed M.O.S.'s Glock 19. M.O.S. accidentally discharged 1x hitting perp in arm. No sights. - Perp arrested. M.O.S.'s Glock jammed

Incident #4 - INTENTIONAL SHOOTING - DOG - GLOCK NOT AUTHORIZED

On April 24, 1992, at approximately 0145 hours, off duty M.O.S. of the 49 Pct., at his mother's residence went to push his dog off bed. Dog attacked him. M.O.S. fired 3x3 - killing dog.

Incident #5 - ACCIDENTAL DISCHARGE - NO INJURY - GLOCK NOT AUTHORIZED

On May 4, 1992, at approximately 2345 hours in the locker room of the 79 pct., 2 M.O.S. had just completed the 4x12 tour and were changing into civilian clothes. One M.O.S. removed his unauthorized Glock 19 and placed it on the bench. The other M.O.S. picked up Glock 19, removed the magazine and pulled trigger. (1 in chamber) causing no injury.

Incident #6 - INTENTIONAL SHOOTING - Perp Shot - Injury

On May 29, 1992, at approximately 0230 hours, M.O.S. received a radio run of robbery in progress at a hardware store in Mid-Town North Pct. At location M.O.S. observed 2 males inside store. M.O.S. banged on door and 1 male opened door, I.D. self as manager. Other male had hands under coat and refused to I.D. self. Sergeant pushed manager out of way and male perp pulled a 32 revolver. One M.O.S. fired 2x with his Glock hitting perp 2x injuring him. Perp ran outside and collapsed. Manager told M.O.S. of 2 other perps downstairs who were arrested. Distance 4 feet - no sights used.

Incident #7 - INTENTIONAL SHOOTING - Perp DOA

On July 23, 1992, at approximately 1455 hours on duty sergeant, Bronx Narcotics, TNT observed male in jeep selling drugs. MOS approached to make arrest when perp put jeep in reverse striking sergeant's vehicle. Other department vehicle attempted to block perps car. Perp again rammed sergeant's vehicle. Perp drove towards other detective and attempted to run him down. Detective fell to ground. Sergeant fired 16x hitting perp 4x killing him.

Incident #8 - INTENTIONAL SHOOTING - Perp Shot

On July 24, 1992, at approximately 1703 hours, on-duty lieutenant of Queens Narcotics received radio transmission of male with gun. Officers observed male with gun in waistband. Perp observed MOS pull gun from waistband and ran. Officers exited vehicle. Perp ran toward lieutenant who ordered perp to drop gun. Perp pointed gun and lieutenant fired 1x hitting perp in hand. Distance 10-15 feet no sights used. 1 arrest.

Incident #9 - INTENTIONAL SHOOTING - GUNFIGHT 1 P.O. WOUNDED
1 PERP INJURED

On August 14, 1992, approximately 1245 hours, on duty MOS from Bronx TNT on buy and bust in apartment made a crack buy. MOS called for backup. MOS arrived knocked on door. 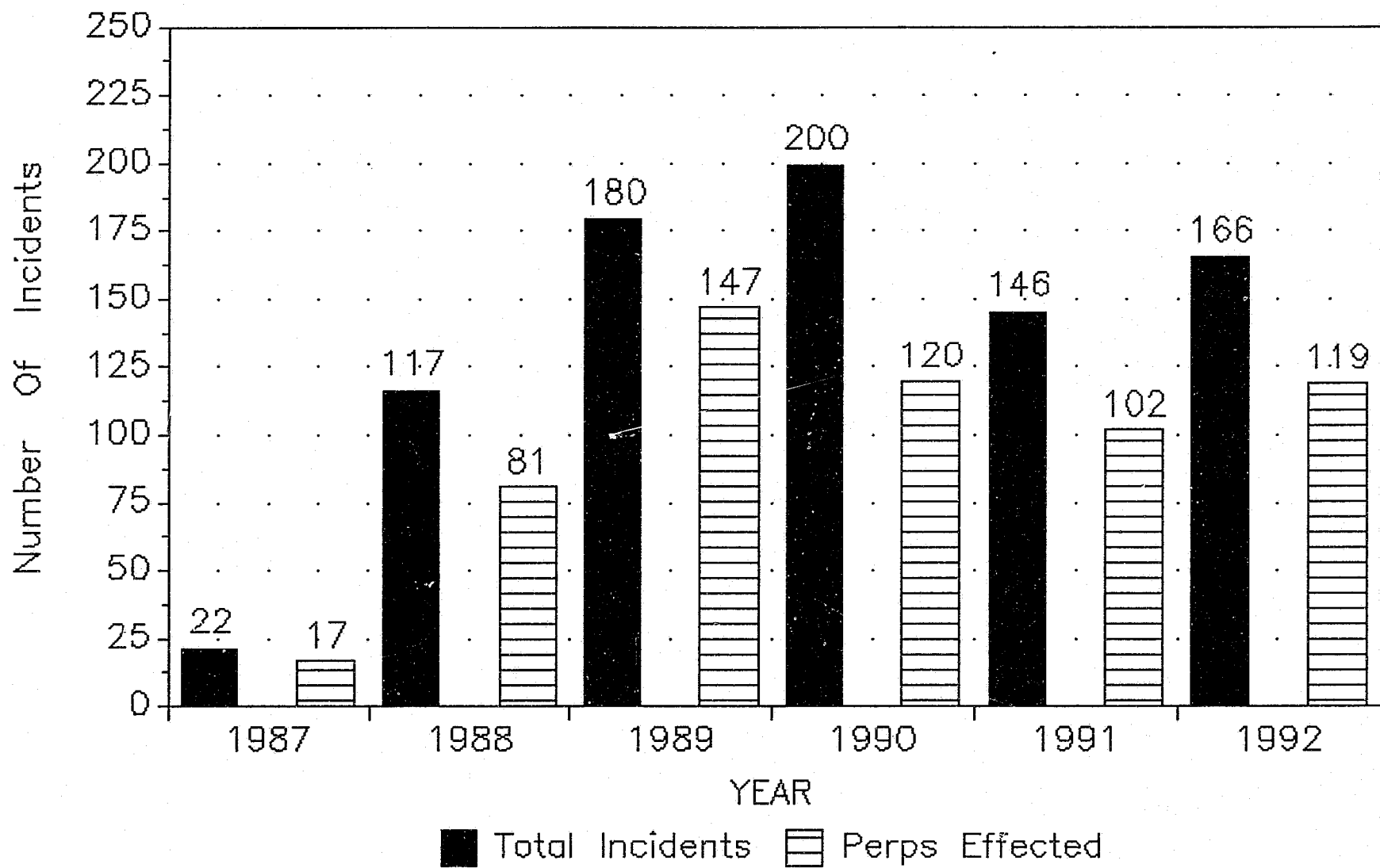

[1987 to 1992]

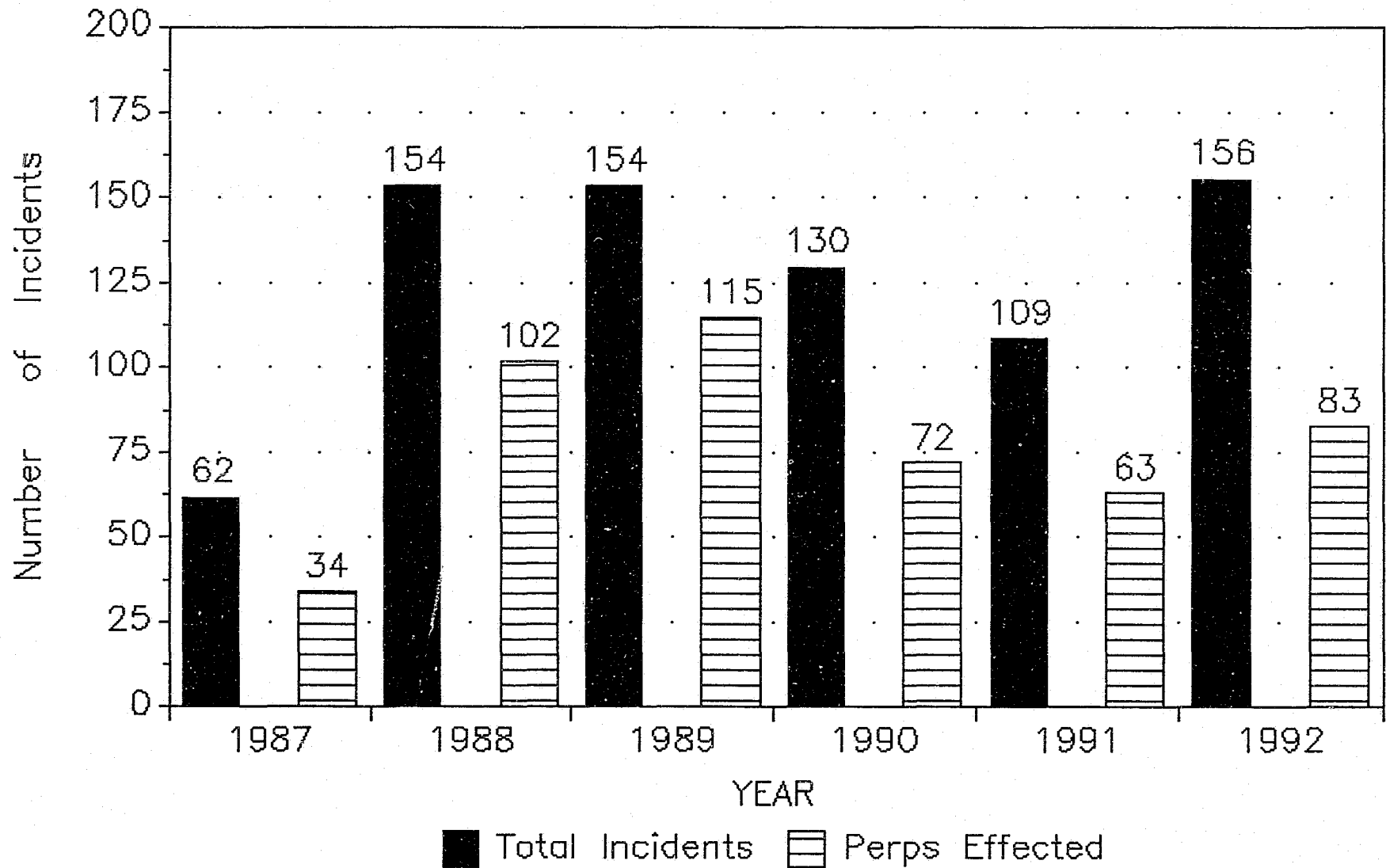

[1987 to 1992]

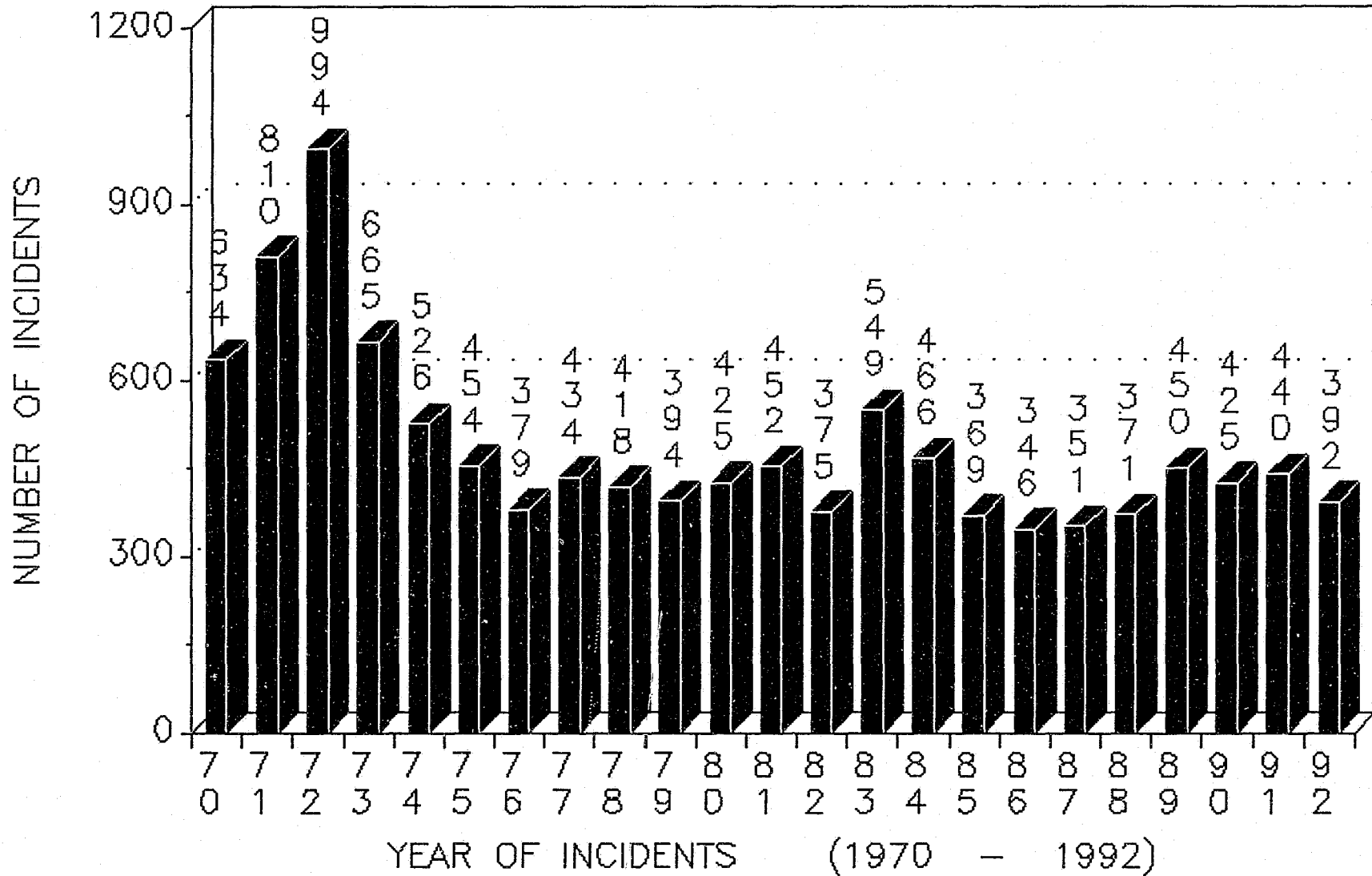

N.Y.P.D. SOP - 9

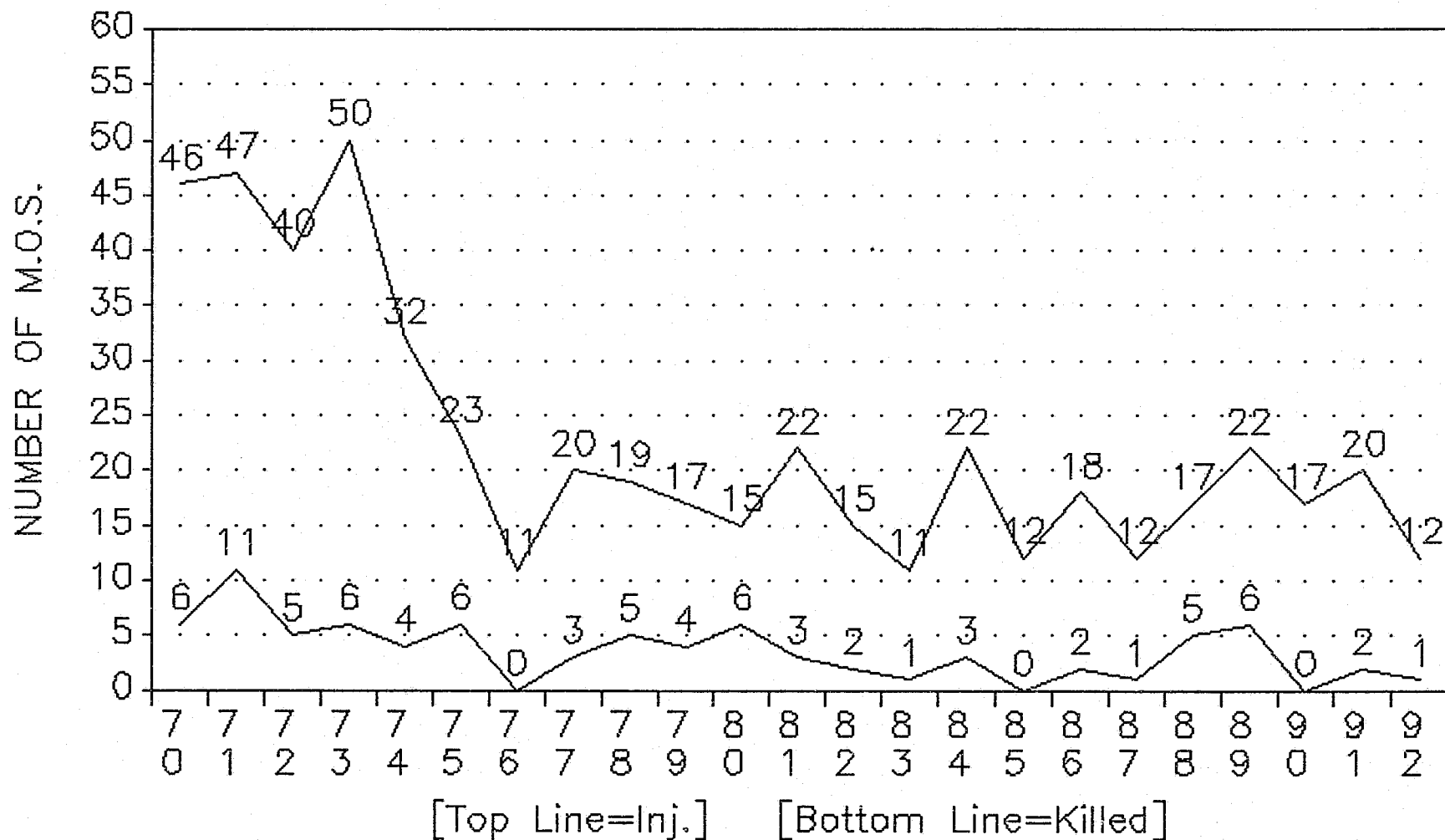

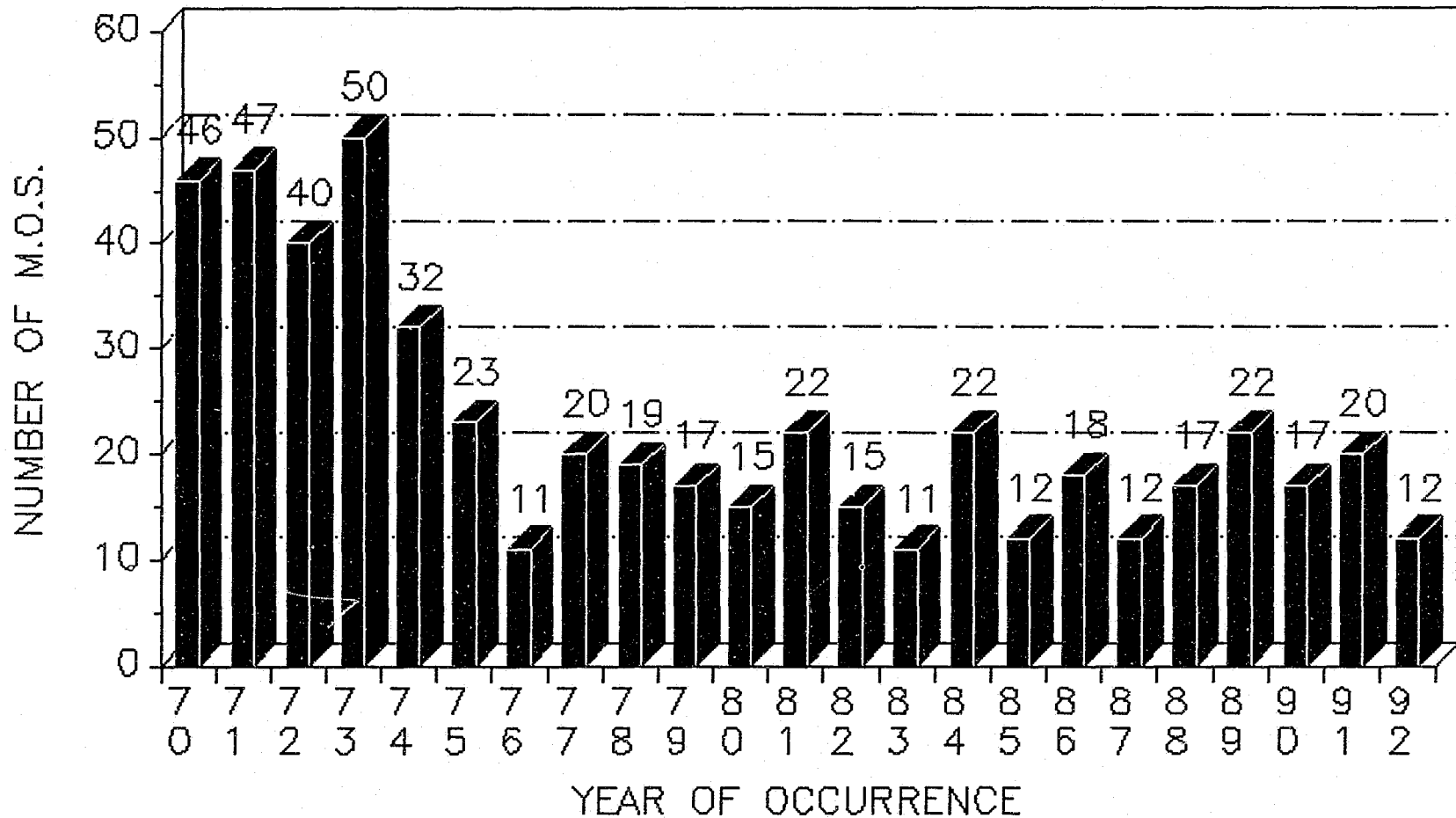

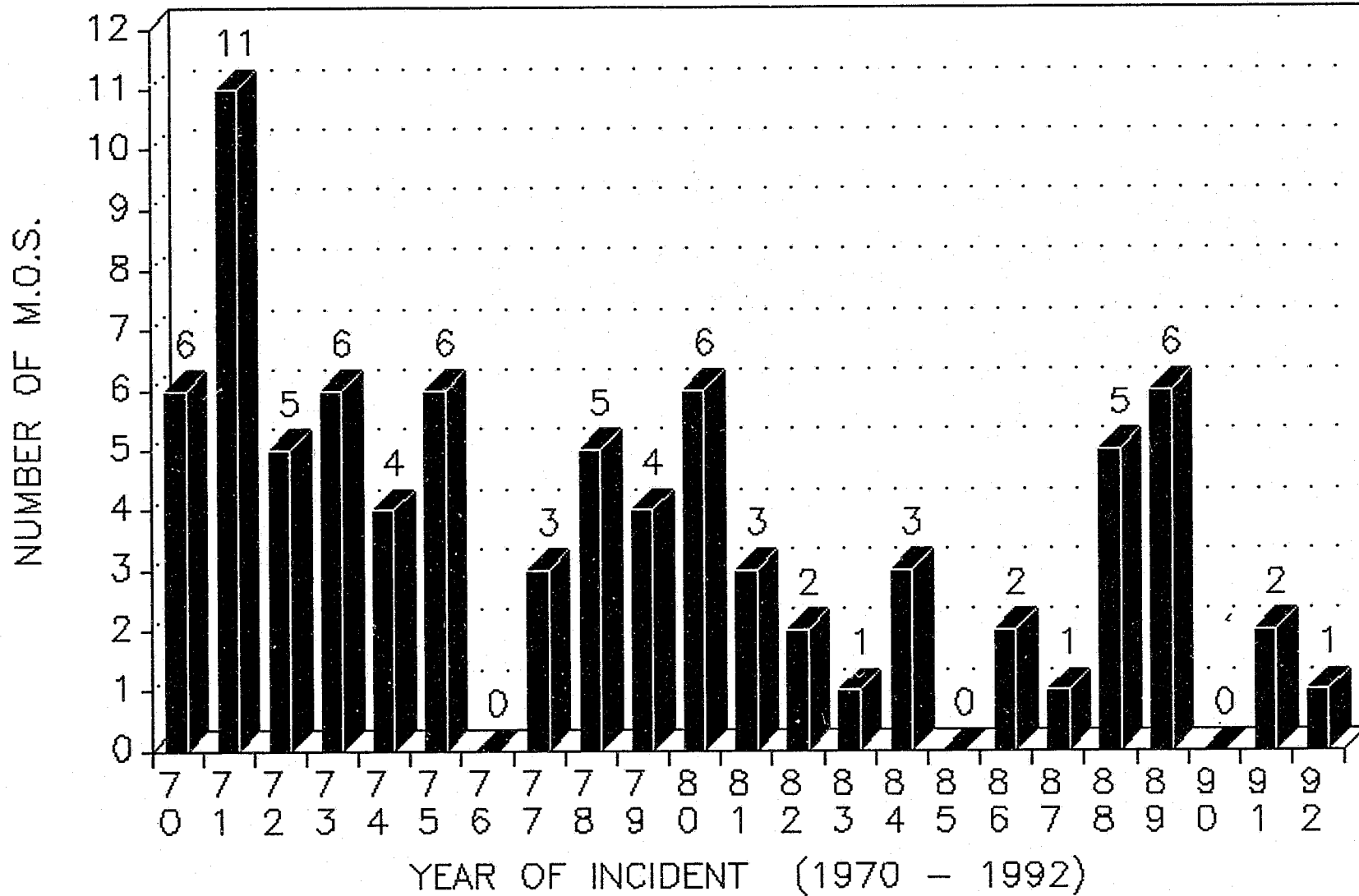

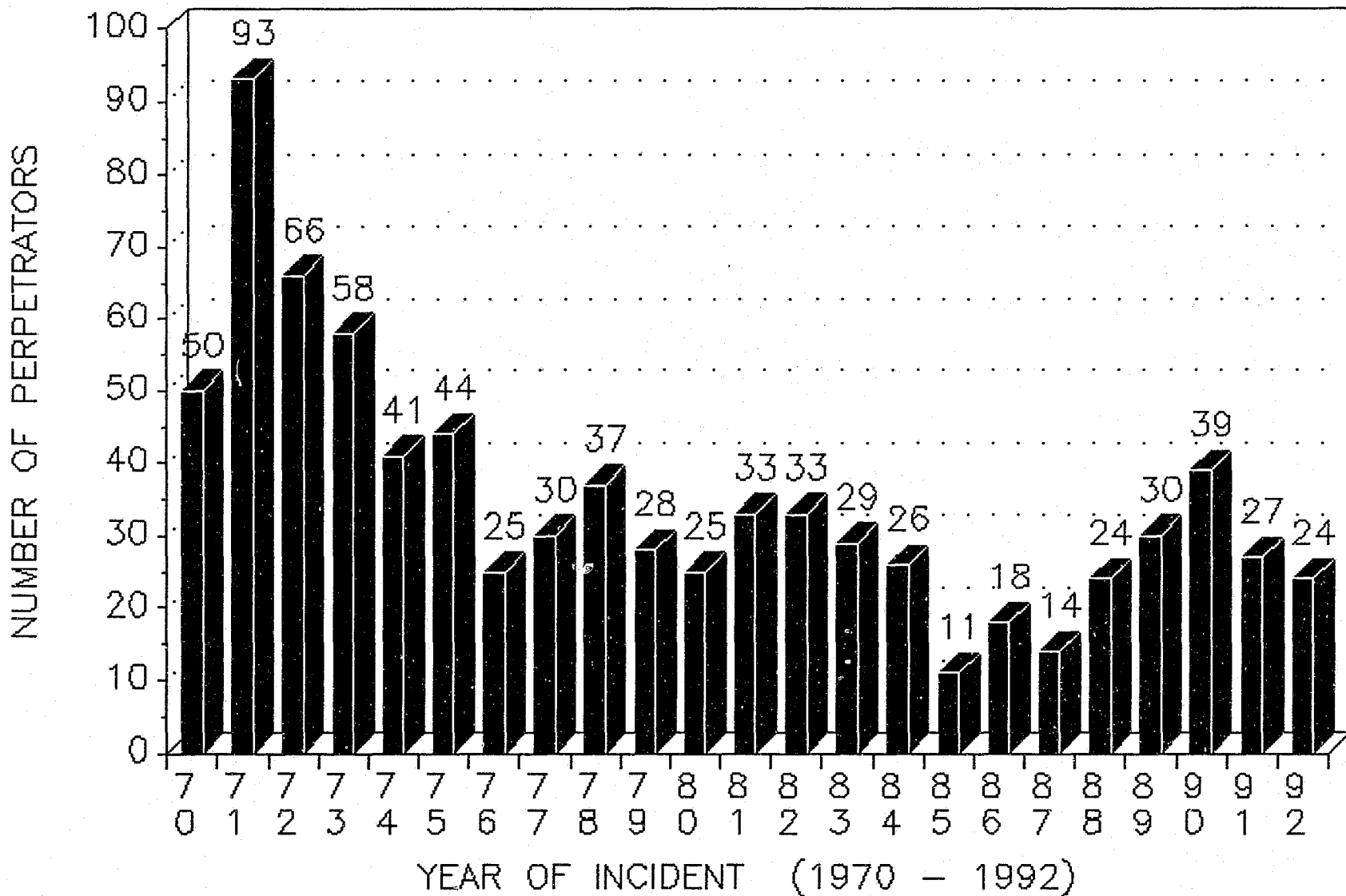

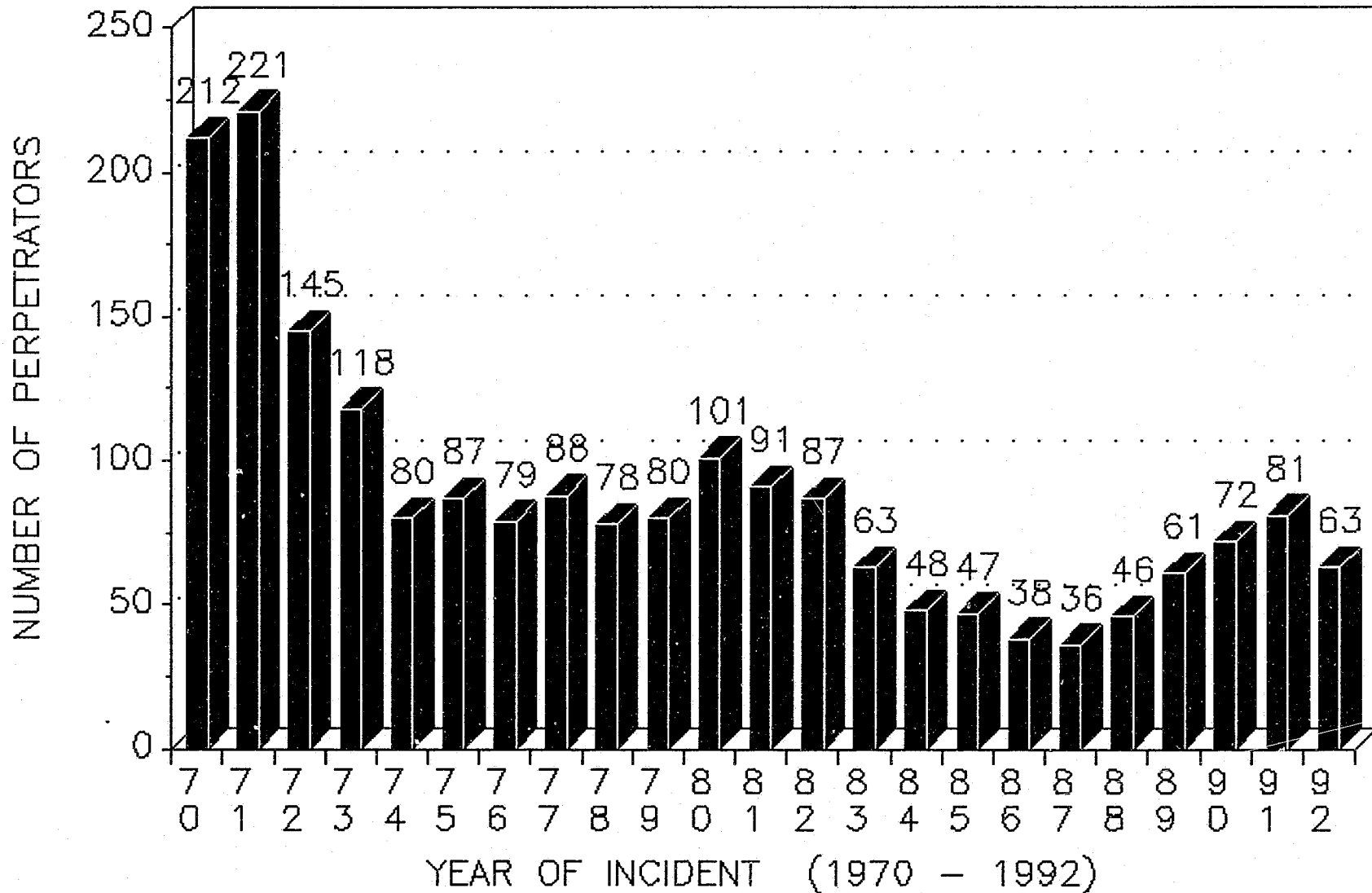
Adversaries Shot & Killed by M.O.S.

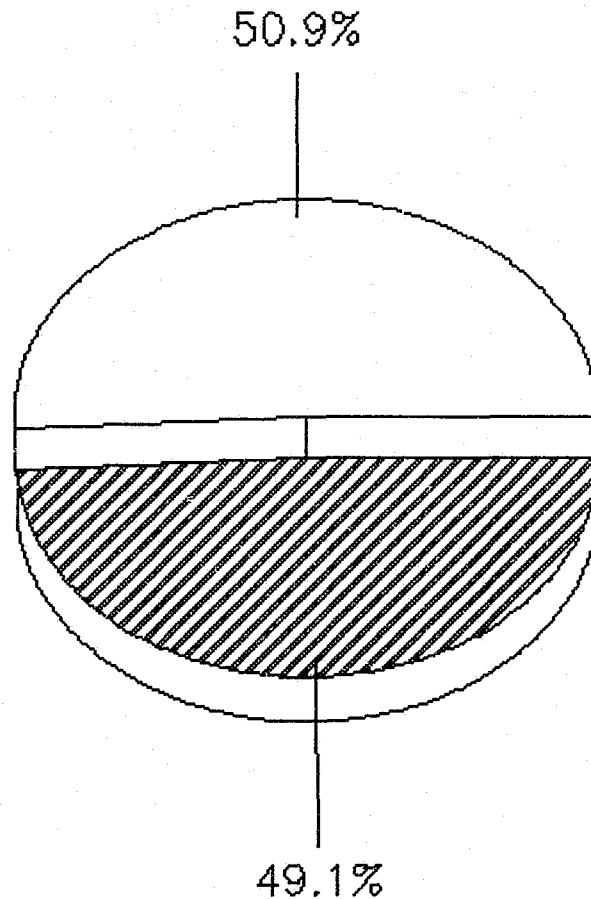

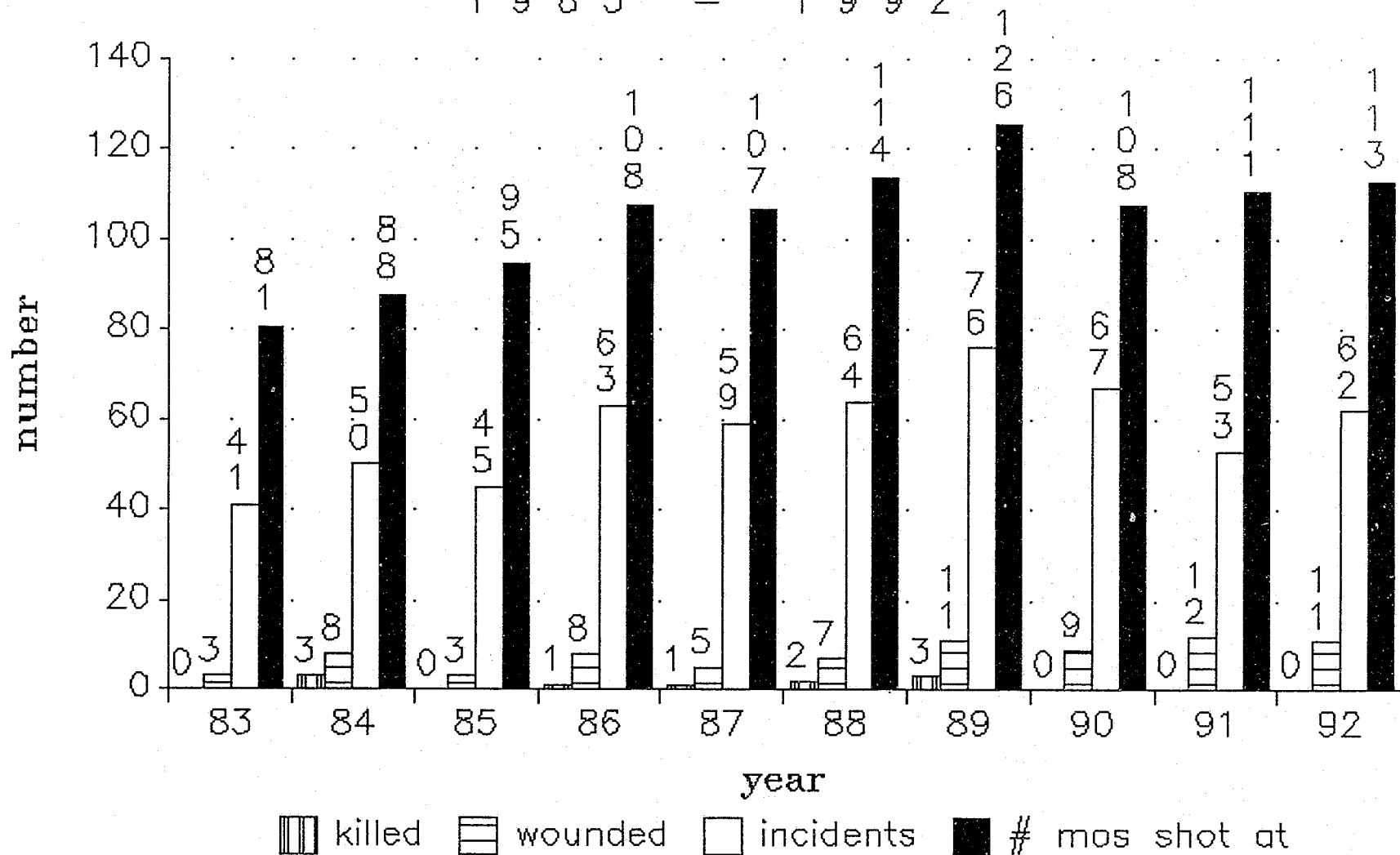
