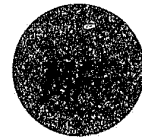

INTRODUCTION

This report has been developed to provide information regarding the Average Daily Population (ADP) in each Correctional Complex, Major Institution and Satellite Housing Unit under the jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections during Fiscal Year 1993 (July 1, 1992 to June 30, 1993). In addition, Average Daily Population (ADP) and end-of-month counts are reported for the Community and Residential Juvenile Programs.

The Prison complex includes New Jersey, East Jersey, Bayside and Northern State Prisons and Mid-State, Southern, Riverfront and the Edna Mahan Correctional Facilities and the Adult Diagnostic and Treatment Center.

The Youth Correctional Complex consists of Garden State Reception and Youth Correctional Facility, Albert C. Wagner Correctional Facility and Mountainview Youth Correctional Facility.

The Juvenile Facilities include New Jersey Training School for Boys, Lloyd McCorkle Training School for Boys and Girls and Juvenile Medium Security Facility.

The Average Daily Population for each major institution reported in Table I includes the number of inmates housed at the main institution plus those inmates who are assigned to each of the respective satellite units and prefabricated modular units, where applicable. Average Daily Population counts for each of the individual housing units are reported in Tables II through V.

NOTES ON FISCAL 1989 – 1993 TRENDS

During Fiscal Year 1993 there was an Average Daily Population of 23,700 offenders under jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections, 13,971 of whom were housed in State Prison Facilities, while 4660 were housed in Youth Correctional Facilities and 572 were housed in Juvenile Facilities. Three hundred fifty-four were housed in Contract Halfway Houses, 638 in Community and Residential Programs and 3859 were housed in County Facilities. An additional 59 offenders were involved in the Electronic Monitoring/Home Confinement Program.

From Fiscal 1992 to Fiscal 1993 the ADP for the Department as a whole decreased 3% from 24,358 to 23,700. Fiscal Year 1993 evidenced the first decrease in ADP since prior th implementation of Title 2C in 1978. The following are the changes within the various correctional complexes or facilities:

- The State Prison Complex count decreased 2% from 14,204 to 13,971.
- The Youth Complex count decreased 2% from 4764 to 4660.
- The Juvenile Facilities population decreased 6% from 609 to 572.
- The Community and Residential Juvenile Programs decreased 6% from 675 to 638.

PRISON COMPLEX AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION

New Jersey State Prison (main and satellites) had an average daily population of 2164 residents during Fiscal 1993, which represented 15% of those offenders housed in all prison facilities. New Jersey Main had an average daily population count of 1753, with Jones Farm minimum security satellite accounting for an additional 200 daily residents. The maximum security Vroom Readjustment Unit maintained an average population of 160 during the 1993 Fiscal Year. The Central Medical Unit had an average daily count of 51 offenders.

Of the 13,971 average daily offenders housed in State Prison Facilities during the year, 2414 or 17% were resident at East Jersey State Prison. The main institution had an average population of 1870, with the minimum security units averaging an additional 544.

Bayside State Prison accounted for approximately 14% of the residents housed in the Prison Complex with an average count of 1973. Bayside Main (medium unit) maintained an average population of 987, while the minimum security satellite units housed an additional 830 residents on a daily basis. An average of 156 inmates were housed at the new Bayside Reception Unit.

The average population for Mid-State Correctional Facility during Fiscal 1993 represented approximately 4% of those offenders housed in all prison facilities, with an average daily population of 555.

The average daily population for Southern State Correctional Facility was 1458 or 10% of all offenders housed in Prison Facilities.

Riverfront State Prison accounted for 7% of the daily residents housed in the Prison Complex, with an average daily count of 1040.

Northern State Prison accounted for 17% of the daily residents housed in the Prison Complex with an average daily count of 2385.

The average daily population for the Adult Diagnostic and Treatment Center was 671 or 5% of those housed in Prison Facilities.

The Edna Mahan Correctional Facility accounted for approximately 6% of the residents in the Prison Complex, with an average count of 827 female offenders.

There was an average count of 4660 offenders resident in the Youth Correctional Facilities during the 1993 Fiscal Year. Thirty-five percent or 1642 inmates were resident in the Garden State Reception and Youth Correctional Facility, of which 1317 were in the main institution.

Albert C. Wagner Youth Correctional Facility maintained an Average Daily Population of 1392, which represented 30% of the residents housed in youth facilities. One thousand two hundred sixty-four residents were housed in the medium facility at the main institution, with the remaining 128 residents housed in minimum security satellite units at New Lisbon and North Princeton Developmental Center (NPDC).

Mountainview Youth Correctional Facility accounted for approximately 35% of the total offenders housed in youth facilities, with an average daily population of 1626 inmates. Mountainview Main averaged a resident count of 1281, while the institutions's satellite units accounted for an additional 345 daily residents.

Juvenile Medium Security Facility	121

New Jersey Training School for Boys accounted for 76% of all juveniles housed in secure facilities. The Juvenile Medium Security Facility accounted for 19% and Lloyd McCorkle housed 3%.

Once again in FY 93, the juvenile community–based programs accomodated more juveniles than the secure facilities (636 vs 572).

NOTES ON FISCAL 1993 AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION

- A/ Residents include offenders in the institution and on furlough on the last day of the report period. For the Prison Complex and Youth Complex, number on furlough is included in the total counts and not in the counts for separate units.

Also note that, for this report, offender counts are based on physical location and not on correctional jurisdiction (e.g. prison offenders housed in Youth Correctional Facilities are included in Youth Correctional counts).

- B/ MEDIUM/MAXIMUM UNITS: Footnote "B" identifies units providing medium and maximum custody. The count provided includes all offenders resident in units which primarily house offenders requiring more than minimum custody. Thus these counts are not a count of offender custody status but are a count of the total number of offenders resident in designated units.
