SUMMARY

1. Total number of admissions

There were 32,229 total admissions to the New York State Department of Correctional Services in calendar year 1992. Of these 25,155 (78%) were new court commitments, 4,697 (15%) were returned parole violators and 2,377 (7%) were other admissions (see Table 1.1, p. 4 and Figure 1.1 p. 3).

2. Commitment Crime

Overall, 34% of 1992 new commitments were violent felony offenders, 45% drug offenders, 14% property or other offenders, 5% coercive crime offenders and 2% Youthful Offenders (see Table 2.2, p. 10 and Figure 2.1 p. 7).

Violent felony offense commitments grew at a faster pace than drug offenses and other offense commitments from 1989 to 1992. Thus the violent felony offense commitments in 1992 were slightly higher proportionally at 34% than in 1989 (33%) whereas drug offense commitments, etc. either dropped or remained the same from 1989 to 1992 (see Table 2.1, p. 8).

3. Second felony offenders

Forty-two percent of 1992 new court commitments were sentenced as first felony offenders (N=10,545), 57% (N=14,324) as second felony offenders and 1% (N=283) as persistent felony offenders (see Table 3.1, p. 13; Figure 3.1 p. 12).

4. Felony Class

Three quarters of new felony commitments in 1992 were for class C or lower category felonies. Most lower felony commitments (class D and E) were also second felony commitments and about half of class C felony commitments were second or persistent felony commitments (see Table 4.2, p. 27).

5. Average minimum sentence

The average minimum sentence for 1992 new court commitments was 36.3 months (the median was 24.0 months). For persons sentenced as a first felony offender the average was 37.2 months (median 18.0 months), for persons sentenced as a second felony offender the average was 34.2 months (median 24.0 months), the average for a persistent felony offender is 113.8 months (median 96.0 months) (see Table 5.2, p. 33). That the average minimum sentence for a second felony offender (34.2 months) is lower than that for a first felony offender (37.2 months) is due to the greater concentration of lower level class D and E offenders in the second felony group.

The average minimum term for legislatively designated violent felony offenders committed in 1992 was 53.6 months (median 30.0 months). For drug offenders the average was 30.2 months (median 30.0). For property and other offenders the average was 20.6 months (median 18.0 months) (see Table 5.2, p. 33).

6. Prior adult criminal record

Examination of the prior adult criminal record of 1992 new court commitments, shows 13% had no prior adult arrest, 9% had a prior adult arrest but no conviction, 22% had a prior conviction but received a sentence other than jail or prison, 31% had served a prior local jail sentence, and 27% had previously served a state or federal term (see Table 6.1, p. 45 and Figure 6.1 p. 44).

7. Drug Commitments

Though the number of drug offender court commitments grew from 1989 (N=9,763) through 1992 (N=11,225), the percent increase was less than that of the remainder of the new commitment population (15% and 18% respectively) and the proportion of drug offenders in the new commitment population fell about one percent from 45.4% in 1989 to 44.6% in 1992.

The proportion of drug commitments that were second felony offenders grew from approximately 54% in 1989 to 66% in 1992 (see Table 7.2, p. 48).

8. Gender

Males were 92% of 1992 new court commitments (N=23,264), females 8% (N=1,888) (see Table 2.1, p. 8 and Figure 8.1 p. 61).

The number of female offenders committed to state prison has grown substantially in recent years from 279 (3.7%) in 1979, to 1,612 (7.5%) in 1989, to 1,888 (7.5%) in 1992 (see Table 8.2, p. 63).

9. Race/Ethnic status

Whites made up 14% of 1992 new court commitments, blacks 50%, and Hispanics 35% (see Table 9.4, p. 69 and Figure 9.1 p. 65).

10. Age

The average age of 1992 new court commitments was 29.2 years. For males the average age was 29.1 years, for females 30.8 years (see Table 10.1, p. 81).

11. Region of the State

In 1992, 71% (N=17,922) of court commitments were from New York City, 11% (N=2,807) were from suburban New York City counties, 10% (N=2,530) were from upstate counties with a population-center of 50,000 or more, and 7% (N=1,867) were from the remaining upstate counties (see Table 11.1, p. 93 and Figure 11.1 p. 92).

12. Country of Birth

Among 1992 new court commitments 76% (N=19,190) were born in the United States, 11% (N=2,654) in United States Possessions, 8% (N=1,988) in the island nations located in the Caribbean Sea, 2% (N=534) from nations in South America, and 3% (N=647) in other nations (see Table 12.1, p. 106 and Figure 12.1 p. 105). As a percentage of total new court commitments foreign born inmates have remained fairly constant (12.9% in 1991) 12.6% in 1992 (see Table 12.1, p. 106).

13. Education

The average educational level (based on last grade completed as reported by the inmate) among 1992 new court commitments is 10th grade. Based on tests administered at reception to the Department, the average reading level is 8th grade, the average mathematics level is 7th grade (see Tables 13.1, 13.2, 13.3, pp. 111-112).

14. Marital Status

Sixty-seven percent of 1992 new court commitments were single never legally married, 16% were married, 8% reported common-law relationships, and 9% were divorced, widowed or separated (see Table 14.1, p. 116).

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CHARACTERISTICS OF NEW COURT COMMITMENTS 1992

INTRODUCTION

This report is one of a series designed to make data available on the inmate population of the New York State Department of Correctional Services. The report presents basic descriptive information on selected characteristics of offenders admitted to Department custody as court commitments. Information on criminal justice system variables is presented (e.g., commitment offense type, prior adult criminal record) as well as information on demographic variables (e.g., ethnic status). In addition, at several stages in the report, commitments in 1992 are compared with commitments received in each of the three preceding years to determine whether any significant shifts have occurred over the period 1989 through 1992.

The overall finding of this latest report in an annual series is "stability amidst growth." The steady growth of the admissions population which began in 1970 has continued in 1992. Total commitments for 1992 rose to 32,229, their highest level since 1970, from 29,860 in 1991. All categories of commitments rose: new court commitments from 24,116 in 1991 to 25,155 in 1992; returned parole violators from 3,401 in 1991 to 4,697 in 1992; and all other admissions from 2,343 in 1991 to 2,377 in 1992.

New court commitments are the main focus of this annual report. In this category, it was found that not all component populations rose but most did. Male new commitments, for example, rose from 21,851 in 1991 to 23,267 in 1992. Female new commitments, however, declined from 2,264 in 1991 to 1,888 in 1992. Black and Hispanic new commitments increased in 1992 from 1991 levels but white new commitments in 1992 declined slightly from 1991.

Among crime categories, all categories of offenders rose from 1991 to 1992. New commitments for violent felony offenses rose from 8,329 in 1991 to 8,650 in 1992. Drug offenders rose from 10,778 to 11,225.

The number of first and second felony offenders both rose in 1992 over 1991. However, the proportion of second felony offenders increased while that of first felony offenders decreased from 1991. The largest proportional growth in new felony commitments was in class E felons who increased from 4,109 in 1991 to 4,839 in 1992. Class C and D new felony commitments also rose in 1992 over 1991; however, both class B and A-II new felony commitments declined from 1991 levels. It is evident that a strong increase in numbers of less serious class E through C felons committed has more than offset a slight decline in more serious class B to A-I felons to account for the rise since 1991 in new felony commitments.

TYPE OF ADMISSION


Individuals may be committed to state prison following conviction of a felony offense in a New York State court. For some offenses the court is required by law to sentence an individual to a state correctional facility. For other felony offenses a period of incarceration in state prison is one of several sentencing alternatives available to the judge. The large majority (78%) of people admitted in 1992 to the New York State Department of Correctional Services were committed from county-courts following conviction for a felony offense. Approximately 15 percent of admissions to state prison were returned parole violators. The remaining were admitted for other reasons. Figure 1 shows the proportion of admissions that fall into each of three general categories: (1) new court commitments, (2) returned parole violators, and (3) all other admissions. Each of these general categories is examined in detail.

New Court Commitments

Table 1.1 presents the number of 1992 admissions to state prison that fall into each specific admission category. These specific admission categories are grouped into three larger categories. The first of these larger categories is referred to as new court commitments and it comprises 78.1% (N=25,155) of total admissions. New court commitments are persons who have been convicted of a felony offense and are sentenced to state prison as a result of this conviction.

There are several subgategories in the new court commitment pool. The first group, labeled "new court commitments", are persons committed to state prison for conviction of a felony offense. Also included in the new court commitments group are people who were on parole at the time they committed the offense for which they were admitted to prison in 1992. Persons identified as "new term absconders from work release" in Table 1.1 (N=215) are people who had been incarcerated on a previous conviction and had been approved for work release. These inmates absconded from the work release program and then committed a new crime. They were returned to state prison on the new conviction charge even though they were absconders from work release. There were also 50 individuals who were arrested while in the community on work release and these persons were returned to prison following conviction on the new charges. Finally, each year the Department receives a few persons who had been committed to the Division for Youth but at age 21 were transferred to the state correctional system to complete service of a juvenile offender sentence. In 1992, there were five such cases. There were also three new commitment cases admitted and discharged the same day for whom no crime data were recorded. These are excluded from all analyses in subsequent sections of the report.

Returned Parole Violators

The second large category of admissions to state prison consists of returned parole violators. Felony offenders committed to prison in New York State receive an indeterminate sentence which has a minimum term and a maximum term. Once inmates have served the minimum sentence they may, at the discretion of the Board of Parole, be released to parole supervision. Except for people serving a life sentence and people who lose good time, once inmates have reached their conditional release date (defined as service of two-thirds of the maximum sentence) they must, by law, be released to parole supervision. The grant of parole may be revoked if the parolees violate the rules that are a condition of release on parole. People whose parole status has been revoked are returned to state prison to continue service of the original sentence until such time as they are re-released by the Board of Parole, or until the inmates reach their conditional release dates, or the maximum expiration date of their sentences are reached. People returned for violation of parole were 14.6% (N=4,697) of 1992 admissions.

Other Admissions

The third large category of admissions to state prison (labeled "other admissions", see Table 1.1) contains a range of different reasons for re-admission to state prison. "Returns from court ordered discharge" refers to individuals who had appealed the original conviction and while court proceedings were taking place the court had ordered the person to be discharged. People whose criminal charges (and sentence) were upheld by the appellate courts and who were returned to state prison fall into this category (N=91). "Returned escapees" (N=10) are inmates who had escaped from Department custody and were then returned. Similarly, "returned absconders from work release" (N=1,392) accounts for inmates who had been placed in the Department's work release program and who absconded from this program and were then returned to custody.

Inmates transferred to Central New York Psychiatric Center for mental health services are passed to the legal custody of the Office of Mental Health. These individuals continue to earn time toward the service of their sentence. Inmates that are returned to the Department of Correctional Services from the Office of Mental Health are identified as "Returns from Office of Mental Health" (N=658). "Return from other agency" (N=5) refers to persons who were transferred from the Department to another state, to the federal system, or to other criminal justice agencies and who were subsequently returned to the Department. "Return temporary release arrest" (N=150) refers to inmates who were arrested while out on work release and then returned to Department custody. These inmates did not receive a new sentence prior to their return to DOCS' custody. There were an additional 66 admissions to the Department in 1992 categorized as "other."

COMMITMENT OFFENSE

The commitment crime for the persons who were new court commitments to the Department of Correctional Services in 1992 is presented in Table 2.1 (see also Figure 2.1 p. 8). Commitment crimes are grouped into several larger categories the first of which is termed "violent felony". During a 1978 special session the New York State Legislature enacted laws designed to provide for more severe penalties for certain violent felony crimes (see N.Y.S. Penal Law Section 70.02). The Legislature designated certain-crimes as "violent felony offenses" (e.g., Attempted Murder 2nd, Manslaughter 1st, Rape 1st, Robbery 1st, Assault 1st). The Legislature did not include Murder 1st (which has been declared unconstitutional), Murder 2nd, Kidnapping 1st and Arson 1st in the designated violent felony legislation because these crimes as class A-1 felony offenses already carry the most severe sentences ranging from 15 years to Life imprisonment. However, due to their violent nature, we include Murder 2nd, Kidnapping 1st and Arson 1st in the violent felony group.


Persons convicted of violent felony crimes were 34% (N=8,650 cases) of 1992 new court commitments.

The second general category is labeled "other coercive" crimes. It includes crimes that are of a violent or coercive nature but were not designated by the legislature as violent felony crimes. These "other coercive" crimes made up 5% (N=1,380) of new court commitments. The third category includes all felony classes of drug commitments. Forty-five percent (N=11,225) of 1992 new court commitments were for drug offenses. The fourth general category is termed "property and other" and contains non-violent offenses such as Burglary 3rd, Grand Larceny, Forgery, and Stolen Property. Property and other felonies comprise 14% of 1992 new court commitments (N=3,480).

The last general category is Youthful Offenders who were 2% (N=417) of new court commitments. Youthful Offenders are persons aged 16 to 19 at the date of the offense who were convicted of a felony crime but were subsequently granted Youthful Offender status by the court. (See New York State Criminal Procedure Law Section 720.10).

Gender Differences in Commitment Crime

The population of persons committed to state prison in 1992 was predominately male. Females were only 7.5% (N=1,838) of the 25,155 persons committed to state prison in 1992. It should be noted however that while the number of female commitments has increased, the proportion of females among new court commitments has remained constant between 1989 and 1992. There were 7.5% in 1989, 7.3% in 1990, 9.4% in 1991 and 7.5% in 1992 (see also Section 8 below, pages 60-3).

Among men committed to state prison in 1992, 36.0% were convicted of a violent felony crime. This is more than twice the percent of women (14.6%) committed to state prison for these offenses (see Table 2).

Women committed to state prison were, however, considerably more likely to have been convicted of a drug offense than were men. Of females committed to state prison, 72.0% were convicted of a drug offense compared with 42.4% of males.

Shifts in Commitment Crime 1989-1992

Increases in new commitments occurred in all the broad crime categories (violent felony offenses, etc.) and relative proportions of offenders committed for each of these types of crimes remained fairly constant across the period. However, violent felony offense commitments increased more from 1989 to 1992 than any other category. The increase in violent felony offenses was 1,534 new commitments from 1989 to 1992 while the next largest increase was 1,462 new commitments for drug offenses. Violent felony offenses rose proportionately more than any other category except coercive offense new commitments. The increase of the latter was 24 percent, for violent felony offenses it was 22 percent, while for drug crimes it was 15 percent.

Because of the faster increase of violent felony offenses than of drug offenses, the former actually was a slightly higher percent of the total 1992 new commitments than of the 1989 new commitments, increasing from 33 percent to 34 percent while all other categories either remained the same or dropped slightly.

SECOND FELONY OFFENDER STATUS

The New York State Penal Law provides for more severe sentences for second felony offenders and for persistent felony offenders (see Appendix A). In addition, the penal law requires with some exceptions a mandatory state prison term for persons convicted of a second felony offense (see section 70.06 NYS Penal Law).

Among 1992 new court commitments 42% (N=10,545) were sentenced as first felony offenders, 57% as second felony offenders (N=14,324) and 1% (N=283) as persistent felony offenders (see Table 3.1 and Figure 3.1).


Those persons in Table 3.1 identified as second felony offenders are defendants who were sentenced by the trial court judge as a second felony offender. Some of those persons listed as first felony commitments have been convicted of prior felony crimes and some have previous sentences to state prison, but they were not sentenced as second felony offenders. This occurs because the statutes for class A-1 felony crimes do not contain provisions for sentencing as a second felony offender. The penalty for A-1 felony crimes is already the most severe so there is no need for additional enhancement in length of sentence.

There are differences in the percent of persons sentenced as second felony offenders in each general crime group. According to Table 3.1, in 1992 69% of those committed for property offenses were sentenced as second felony offenders as were 66% of persons committed for drug offenses. Among those committed for violent felony crimes, only 43% were sentenced as second felony offenders.

Table 3.2 also shows crime by second felony offender status yet the percentages are based on felony offender status rather than commitment crime.

Increase In Second Felony Offenders Committed For Drug Offenses

Data on the number of persons committed to DOCS as a first, second, or persistent felony offender according to commitment crime for the period 1989 through 1992 is presented in Table 3.3. The proportion of commitments sentenced as a second felony offender grew from 51% in 1989 (N=10,885), to 57% (N=14,324) in 1992.

Among drug offenders committed to state prison the proportion sentenced as a second felony offender grew substantially from 1989 through 1992. In 1989, 54% of drug offenders were sentenced as a second felony offender; by 1992 66% of drug offenders were sentenced as a second felony offender (see Table 3.3). There were either small or no differences in the proportion sentenced as a second felony offender in other crime groups. In 1989, 40% of violent felony offenders were sentenced as second felony offenders; it rose to 43% in 1992. In 1989 56% of commitments for other coercive offenses were second felony offenders; it rose to 58% in 1992. Among property offenders there was no change in second felony offenders as there were 69% in both 1989 and in 1992. (See Table 3.4 for the percent of first, second and persistent felony offenders within each specific crime group).

Between 1989 and 1992, the proportion of drug offenders among those sentenced as a second felony offender grew from 48.0% of the total in 1989 to 51.0% in 1992. Drug offenders were 43% of first felony offenders committed to state prison in 1989 and this decreased to 36% in 1992 (see Table 3.5).

FELONY CLASS CATEGORY

In New York State felony offenses are classified into one of several felony class categories: Class A (including Class A-I and A-II), Class B, Class C, Class D, Class E, and Youthful Offender. In general, more serious offenses are categorized as Class A, Class B, or Class C felonies and the less serious offenses are categorized as Class D or Class E felonies. There are still less serious offenses that are treated as misdemeanors or violations, but only those convicted of a felony may be sentenced to state prison. Conviction for an "attempt" of a particular felony offense generally drops the conviction into the next lower felony class category. For instance, Robbery 1st is a Class B felony offense, but Attempted Robbery 1st is a Class C felony offense as is Robbery 2nd. The felony class category of the conviction offense is relevant because the sentencing laws are based on the felony class category. That is, the range of minimum and maximum sentences that apply to conviction for a particular offense are governed, in part, by the felony class of the offense. Appendix A contains a brief summary of the range of minimum and maximum sentences for each felony class category.


Table 4.1 shows the specific commitment crime, broken out by felony class category, for new court commitments committed to DOCS in 1992 (see also Figure 4.1). (Appendix B contains the Penal Law Section number for the offenses listed in Table 4.1.) The letters "ATT" before the offense indicate that the crime was an attempt. Approximately two percent of 1992 new court commitments were Class A-I crimes. Class A-II offenses made up 3% (N=675) of commitments. Offenses in the Class B felony category were 18% (N=4,610) of 1992 new court commitments. Class C felony offenders were 22% (N=5,615) of 1992 commitments. The Class D felony category was the largest at 34% (N=8,531) of new commitments. Class E felony offenders comprise 19% (N=4,838) of new commitments.

Table 4.1 indicates that the first felony offender group when compared with those sentenced as second felony offenders had a higher concentration of persons sentenced for Class B (30%) and Class C (27%) felony offenses. The second felony group had a higher concentration of Class D (43%) and Class E (28%) felony offenses. This reflects an important fact of sentencing. For many first felony offenders it is the violent nature of the act that results

¹For example, the minimum sentence range for a Class D felony offense for a first felony offender is 1 year to 2 years and 4 months. The sentencing court judge must select a minimum term that falls between 1 year and 2 years 4 months. Other factors affect the range of sentences that apply to each felony class category. In general, if the offense is a legislatively designated violent felony the sentence length range is more severe. For a Class B violent felony the lowest legally permissible minimum term is 2 years. For all other Class B felony offenders the lowest legally permissible minimum term is one year. It is also the case that the range of sentences that may be available to the judge after a conviction depends on whether the person is a first, second or persistent felony offender. In general, persons who are convicted of a second felony offense face more severe penalties that do first felony offenders.

in a state prison sentence (the 1978 Violent Felony Offender Legislation requires a prison sentence for convictions of a Class B or C violent felony). For many of those sentenced as a second felony offender it is the existence of a prior felony conviction that results in a state prison commitment. (In 1973 the legislature required that persons convicted as a second felony offender must be sentenced to state prison).

The percent of first, second and persistent felony offenders in each felony class group is presented in Table 4.2. As one moves from the Class A-II category to the Class E category the proportion of second felony offenders steadily increases. Fully 82% of Class E and 72% of Class D commitments were second felony offenders.

Crime by Felony Class and Predicate Felony Status

In recent years several proposals have been put before the legislature which would permit judges to select a sentencing alternative other than state prison for second felony offenders convicted of Class D or Class E non-violent offenses.² Consideration of these and other proposals has often led to requests for additional information, particularly on the number of court commitments in a calendar year that fall into subgroups defined by: (1) crime, (2) felony crime class and (3) first, second or persistent felony offender status. These data are presented for 1992 in Table 4.3.

Trends in Commitments by Felony Class

Table 4.4 shows changes across the years 1989-1992 in first, second, and persistent offenders and in the crime classes of each offender group. Generally, among first felons, there was little change in the four-year period, except for the class B first felons whose declined four percent. Among second felony offenders, there were small increases in most crime categories in that time.

MINIMUM AND MAXIMUM SENTENCE


Persons committed to prison in New York State receive an indeterminate sentence which is composed of a minimum period of imprisonment and a maximum period of imprisonment. The minimum sentence reflects the shortest period of time that a person must serve in prison before being considered for release on parole.³ The maximum sentence reflects the longest possible period that the defendant can be held in custody on the instant offense. Individuals serving an indeterminate sentence are eligible for release to parole after having served the minimum sentence (given favorable action by the Board of Parole) and they must by law be released once the conditional release date is reached (the conditional release date is the point at which 2/3 of the maximum sentence has been served). Persons in custody may serve past the conditional release date if for disciplinary reasons they have lost "good time" during service of the sentence.⁴

A crosstabulation of crime by minimum sentence length for 1992 commitments is presented in Table 5.1. The table shows the number and percent of cases in each minimum sentence length category for several different types of crime.

³Felony criminal offenses in New York are classified according to six felony class categories (Class A,B,C,D, and E felony offenses, and Youthful Offenders). For each felony class category the legislature has enacted certain provisions which affect the length of the minimum term of imprisonment and which determine the range of maximum sentence available to the judge (see Article 70 New York State Penal Law). In addition to the felony class category that the offense falls into, the minimum period of imprisonment may differ depending on whether the defendant is a first, second, or persistent felony offender, and/or whether the defendant has been convicted of a legislatively designated violent felony offense. In general, the minimum maximum sentence range is more severe for those defendants with a prior felony conviction and for those convicted of violent felony crimes. For first felony offenders sentenced to state prison for a violent felony crime the judge must in most cases set the minimum period of imprisonment at one-third the maximum sentence. For first felony offenders sentenced to state prison for other felony offenses (i.e. all offenses not designated as a violent felony) the judge must fix the minimum period of imprisonment at some point between one-year and one-third the maximum term. For second felony offenders committed to state prison the judge must set the minimum period of imprisonment at one-half the maximum sentence. Article 70 of the Penal Law spells out the different sentencing provisions that pertain to armed felony offenders; first, second or persistent felony offenders; and violent felony offenders. Appendix A presents a brief summary of the sentences that apply to each felony class category.

⁴Good time refers to days deducted from the maximum sentence for inmates who maintain a satisfactory disciplinary record while under custody.

Average and Median Minimum Sentence by Crime

The average and median minimum sentence length according to commitment crime and first or second felony offender status is presented in Table 5.2. In this and other tables the arithmetic average and the median are used as measures of central tendency. The value for the median is generally somewhat lower than the value for the average. The median was 24 months while the average prison sentence was 36.3 months. Generally the median minimum sentence is close to the value of the minimum-minimum term (this is clearer in Table 5.7 below). The median is a measure of central tendency which represents the value of the middle case (i.e. the case or cases at the 50th percentile) in the distribution of cases and is preferred by some users because it is less sensitive to extreme values than is the arithmetic average.

The average minimum sentence for the total new court commitment population in 1992 was 36.3 months. The average minimum sentence for violent felony crimes was 53.6 months, for other coercive crimes it was 24.8 months, for drug offenders 30.1 months and for property offenders 20.6 months (Table 5.2).

The average minimum sentence was generally longer for persons sentenced as a second or persistent felony offender when compared with those sentenced as a first felony offender (see Table 5.2). For example, the average minimum sentence for first felons sentenced for Robbery 1st was 33.0 months, for second felony offenders convicted of Robbery 1st it was 75.9 months, and for persistent felony offenders committed for Robbery 1st the average was 156.4 months.

Trends in Average Minimum Sentence Length

The average minimum sentence by crime and second felony offender status for each year 1989 through 1992 is presented in Table 5.3. Within each specific crime group and within each felony status category (e.g. 1st or 2nd felon) the average minimum sentence generally remains stable across the commitment years. For example, first felony offenders convicted of Robbery 1st received an average minimum sentence of 33.0 months in 1989, 30.7 months in 1990, 32.7 months in 1991 and 33.0 months in 1992.

The data in Table 5.3 is repeated in Table 5.4 except that the measure of central tendency is the median.

Minimum Sentence by Felony Class Category

Average minimum sentence by felony class category and second felony offender status for 1992 New Court Commitments is presented in Table 5.5. These figures show that as the felony class declines from A-I to E the average minimum sentence also declines. Generally, within each felony class category, as one moves from first felony offender to second felony offender to persistent felony offender the average minimum sentence increases, as would be expected based on the sentencing requirements found in the New York State Penal Law (see Appendix A for a brief statement of the sentence range for each subgroup).

Table 5.6 shows average minimum sentence by felony class category and second felony status (persistent felons have been grouped with second felony offenders) for each year 1989 through 1992. Within each specific felony class category as one moves from 1989 to 1992 the average minimum sentence fluctuates within a narrow range from one year to the next.

In Table 5.7 the data are broken out by felony class category, violent or nonviolent offense; and first or second felony offender status. Within the broad category of first or second felony offenders the median minimum sentences showed considerable stability over time. Violent first felony median sentences were 24.0 months from 1989 to 1992 and nonviolent first felony median sentences were 12.0 months in the study period. Median sentences of violent second felony offenders were 36.0 months and those of nonviolent second felony offenders were 24.0 months in the period 1989-1992.

There were some noteworthy changes in median minimum sentences of particular crime categories. Sentences of class A-I violent felony offenders had a median length of 276.0 months in 1989. However, they rose to 300.0 months in 1990 and remained at 300.0 months in 1991 and 1992. Median sentences of class B violent felony offenders, committed as second felony offenders, were 90.0 months in 1989 through 1991 but rose to 96 months in 1992.

Among first felony offenders, however, median sentence length of persons committed as class B violent felony offenders fell from 42.0 months in 1989 to 36.0 months in 1990. They then rose to 40 months in 1991 and remained at that length in 1992.

Class E violent felony offenders committed as second felony offenders received median sentences of 24.0 months from 1989 to 1990. The median minimum sentence fell in 1991 to 18.0 months and remained at 18.0 months in 1992.

Except for the noted changes, median sentence lengths remained quite stable. Average minimum sentences, which are sensitive to extreme values, showed more movement. Average minimum sentences received by class A-I violent felony offenders rose from 293.4 months in 1989 to 306.1 months in 1990. They then declined two years in a row. In 1991, they were 297.3 months and in 1992 they were 295.4 months.

Average sentences for class B violent felony offenders sentenced as second felony offenders fluctuated considerably in the four years 1989 through 1992. In 1989, the average sentence for these offenders was 115.6 months. The average fell to 104.3 months for class B violent felony offenders sentenced as second felony offenders in 1990. It then rose to 117.7 months in 1991 and then fell again to 109.9 months in 1992.

Maximum Sentence Length

A crosstabulation of commitment crime by maximum sentence is presented in Table 5.8. Since the development of programs such as Earned Eligibility,⁵ the minimum sentence is a much better estimate of the length of time that will be served in state prison than is the maximum sentence.

Persons committed for violent felony offenses were more likely (36%) to be given a maximum sentence of nine years (108 months) or longer when compared with drug (15%) or property (2%) offenders. Seven percent of violent felony offenders received a Life maximum sentence (see Table 5.8). Approximately 7% of drug offenders received a Life maximum sentence. Many of the Class A-II drug offenders were persons with a minimum term of six years and a maximum term of Life.

Table 5.9 shows average and median maximum sentence length by crime and second felony offender status. A Life sentence has been treated as 25 years. For 1992 new court commitments the average maximum sentence was 82.6 months, the median 54 months. The average maximum sentence for a first felony offender was 95.8 months (median 54.0 months). The average for second felony offenders was 69.2 months. This is somewhat lower than the average for first felony offenders because the second felony group had a higher concentration of the lower level Class D and E felony commitments than in the First Offender group.

PRIOR ADULT CRIMINAL RECORD

Prior adult criminal record for 1992 new court commitments is presented in Table 6.1. Persons are coded according to their most serious penetration into the criminal justice system. Among 1992 commitments 27% had served a prior prison term, and an addition 31% had served a prior term in a local jail. An additional 22% had a prior conviction which resulted in a sentence to probation or a fine or other non-incarcerative sentencing alternative. Approximately 9% have prior misdemeanor or felony arrests which did not result in a conviction and approximately 13% had no prior arrests (see-also Figure 6:1).

Trends in Prior Adult Criminal Record


Prior criminal history for new court commitments received across the years 1989 to 1992 is shown in Table 6.2. There was an increase in 1992 in the percent committed to state prison who had no prior arrest (13%) when compared with earlier years. There was a continuous decline between 1989 and 1992 in the percent committed who had a prior arrest but no conviction (from 10% down to 9%). There was a steady decline over 1989-1992 in the percent committed who had a prior adult conviction but who did not receive a sentence to jail or state prison (28% down to 22%).

In the period under study, the percent of commitments with a conviction that resulted in a sentence to a local jail remained stable across the interval. Commitments in 1992 show a increase in the percent who had served a prior state or federal prison term (27%) when compared with 1989 (21%). In general, the last few years have shown a decline in the percent of commitments who had an adult conviction that did not result in a jail or prison sentence; and an off setting rise in the percent of cases with a prior prison term.

¹⁰The first category shows those who have no prior felony or misdemeanor arrests. The second category contains those persons who have prior arrests but no prior convictions (i.e. charges were dismissed or defendant was acquitted or rap sheet has no further information on disposition of the charges). The third category contains those who have prior convictions but did not receive a sentence to jail (i.e., they were sentenced to probation, fined, adjourned in contemplation of dismissal, ordered to pay restitution, or other sentencing alternative). The fourth category includes those who have prior convictions and who received a sentence that included a term in a local jail (including those who may have received a sentence of jail and then probation). The last category includes those persons who have served a prior state or federal prison term.

DRUG COMMITMENTS

Given the dramatic effect on the number and background characteristics of commitments to state prison as a result of recent drug enforcement efforts this section contains several tables which focus only on drug offenders committed to state prison.¹¹

The number of drug offenders committed to state prison increased substantially between 1989 (N=9,742) and 1992 (N=11,225) (see Table-7.1). This growth was heaviest in the lower felony class categories. The number of class A-I drug offenders committed to state prison dropped from 105 individuals in 1989 to 84 cases in 1992. The A-II drug offenders declined from 770 to 675 in the same four years. The number of class B drug felony offenders declined between 1989 (N=2,722) and 1992 (N=2,252) and the percent of all drug commitments that were in class B declined from 28% in 1989 to 20% in 1992. Increases both numerically and as a percent of all drug commitments occurred in the class C, D, and E categories. Class C drug offenders increased from 2,095 in 1989 to 2,729 in 1992. Class D drug offenders increased from 2,937 in 1989 to 3,830 in 1992. Class E drug offenders increased from 1,113 in 1989 to 1,655 in 1992.

Among drug commitments there has been a considerable shift in the percent that were sentenced as second felony offenders. In 1989 approximately 54% (N=5,305) were sentenced as second felons but by 1992, 66% (N=7,446) of drug offenders were sentenced as second felons (see Table 7.2).


In general, over the years 1989-1992, drug commitments have increased among second felony offenders convicted of class C and D drug offenses. For example, second felony offenders committed for a class C drug crime were 10% of drug commitments in 1989 but they were 14% of 1992 drug commitments. Class D second felony offenders increased from 27% in 1989 to 31% in 1992.

In 1992, 92% of the class D and 96% of E drug commitments were sentenced as second felony offenders, compared with 56% of class C drug commitments and 33% of class B drug commitments.

Trends in Drug Commitments by Possession or Sale

Of those committed to state prison for a drug offense the large majority are commitments for drug sale (e.g., 69% in 1992) as opposed to drug possession (31% in 1992, see Table 7.4 and Figure 7.1). However, as a percent of total drug commitments to state prison, those convicted of drug possession have shown a small increase over the four-year period 1989 to 1992. People committed for possession of controlled substances were 27% of total drug commitments in 1989 (N=2,643) but they were 31% of drug commitments in 1992 (N=3,504). This shift is due to more commitments for lower level class D and E-drug possession offenses.

Trends in Drug Commitments by Region

The increase in the number of drug commitments to state prison is a phenomenon that occurred in each region of the state (see Table 7.5, counties that fall into each specific region are listed in Table 11.1 below). Further, each region of the state shows a higher concentration of second felons among drug offenders committed over the period 1989 through 1992. For example, in Suburban New York 54% of drug offenders committed in 1989 were sentenced as a second felony offender compared with 59% in 1991 and 61% in 1992.

The most substantial percent increase over the period 1989 to 1992, about 4-5 percent, occurred among second felony offenders committed for class C through E offenses from New York City (see Table 7.5). For example, second felons convicted of a class C drug felony were 9% of drug crime commitments from New York City in 1989 but they were 13% of such commitments in 1992. Furthermore, New York City second felony drug felony commitments for class E offenses rose from 13% in 1989 to 17% in 1992. Increases generally occurred in Suburban New York in B and C second felony commitments, more than offsetting a drop between 1989 and 1992 in class D second felony commitments from 23% to 19%.

Table 7.6 shows felony crime class and second felony offender status for drug commitments over the period 1989 to 1992. In this table the five New York City counties are shown separately.

Trends in Drug Commitments by Gender

An increase in the percent of drug offenders who are second felony offenders is evident among both male drug commitments (i.e., 55% second felons in 1989 rising to 67% in 1992) and female drug commitments (48% sentenced as second felons in 1989 and 61% in 1992) (see Table 7.7).

By increasing the number of persons with a drug felony conviction, the recent enhancements to drug law enforcment also increase the pool of persons who are at risk for sentencing as a second felony offender should a second conviction result. New York State law mandates a state prison sentence for a second felony conviction (Penal Law Section 70.06, 70.02). In terms of increasing drug commitments to state prison, recent drug enforcement efforts appear to have had a more pronounced effect on women than men. While the number of males committed to state prison for a drug offense increased by 14% between 1989 (N=8,672) and 1992 (N=9,866), the number of females committed for a drug offense rose 27% between 1989 (N=1,070) and 1992 (N=1,359).

Trends in Drug Commitments by Ethnic Status

There are important differences in commitments to prison for drug offenses according to ethnic status. Among whites committed to prison in 1992, 17% were convicted of a drug offense, among blacks 44% were committed for a drug offense, and among Hispanics 56% were committed for a drug offense (see Table 9.3 below). Table 7.8 shows that among whites, the proportion of drug offenders who were sentenced as a second felon increased from 1989 (34% second felony) to 1992 (43%). Among blacks committed for a drug-offense in 1989—56% were sentenced as a second felon but in 1992 69% were sentenced as a second felon. Among Hispanics committed for drug offenses in 1989, 57% were second felons and this increased to 66% in 1992. For all three ethnic group categories there was a greater concentration of drug commitments who were second felony offenders convicted of class C and class D offenses in 1992 than in 1989 (see Sections 3 and 4 of this study for analysis of crime class and second felony offender status of all commitments including non-drug offenders).

Trends in Average Minimum Sentence for Drug Offenders

In any year, as the felony class category of drug commitments declined from most serious (e.g., class A-I, class A-II) to least serious (e.g., class E) the average minimum sentence also declined (see Table 7.9). Further, second felony offenders were earning longer sentences than were first felony offenders in the study period (see Table 7.10). For example, in 1992 a first felony offender convicted of a class B drug felony received a minimum term (on average) of 18.8 months, but a second felony offender convicted of a class B drug felony received a minimum term (on average) of 64.1 months. Medians provide a similar picture. In 1992, a class B felon convicted as a first felony offender received a median minimum sentence of 12 months while a class B second felony offender received a median minimum of 54 months.

Within each specific felony class category the average minimum sentence fluctuated only slightly from year to year across the period 1989 to 1992 (see Table 7.10).

The average minimum sentence for the total group of drug offenders committed in 1992 was 30.1 months. For first felony offenders it was 27.5 months and for second felony offenders 31.3 months, a difference of less than four months. That the difference in average minimum sentences between the two groups is not even greater is due to the larger number of class D and class E offenders in the second felony group compared to class B and C offenders in the first felony group.

GENDER

There were significant differences in the commitment offense of males and females in the study period. In 1992, 36% of males were committed for a violent felony offense compared with only 15% of females (see Table 8.1). Males were also slightly more likely to be committed for other coercive offenses (6% compared with 4% for females) and somewhat more likely to be committed for property and other offenses (14% compared with 9%). On the other hand, females were considerably more likely than males to be committed to state prison for a drug offense (72% compared with 42% for men).

The proportion of commitments to state prison who were drug offenders grew among females while declining among males in this period. In 1989 the percent of males committed for a drug offense was 45%; by 1992 it declined to 42%. However, among females the percent of drug offenders increased from 66% in 1989 to 72% in 1992.

Long Term Trend in Female Commitments


The largest number of female offenders committed to state prison in the study period were committed in calendar year 1991 (N=2,264). In 1992, however, female new felony commitments declined from the year earlier period to 1,888 new commitments. As a proportion of new commitments, the female new commitments also fell from 9.4% in 1991 to 7.5% in 1992. However, the latter figure is still a high proportion historically (see Figure 8.1 and Table 8.2). In only two of the prior sixteen years was this percent equalled or exceeded.

Over the admission years 1976 through 1983 women offenders were approximately 3.6% of new court commitments. In 1986 women were 4.8% of new commitments; by 1989 they were 7.5% and in 1991 with 2,264 female new commitments they were 9.4% of the total new commitments. The 1992 percent, though only equal to that of 1989 is more than double the percent female of total new commitments that prevailed from 1976-1983.¹³

ETHNIC STATUS

Race/Ethnic Status of 1992 Commitments

In 1992, 14% of commitments were white, 50% were black, and 35% were Hispanic. The balance were others: 0.2% Native American (N=46); 0.3% Asian (N=80), and 0.4% (N=100) other ethnic groups (see Table 9.1).


Commitment offense by ethnic status for 1992 new court commitments is shown in Table 9.2 and in Table 9.3. (In Table 9.3 Native American, Asian and other ethnic groups are categorized as "other"). Approximately the same percent of whites and blacks are committed for violent felony crimes (35%, and 37%, respectively) (see Table 9.3). Compared with whites and blacks, 31% of Hispanics were committed for violent offenses. Whites were also more likely to be committed for other coercive offenses (10%) than either blacks (6%) or Hispanics (3%). Among Hispanics, the largest commitment crime category is drug offenses (56%). Drug offenders also make up a large percent of blacks sentenced to state prison (44%). Whites are more likely to be committed for property offenses (34%) than either blacks (12%) or Hispanics (9%).

In brief, white offenders committed to state prison in 1992 were approximately one-third violent felony offenders, one-third property offenders and the remaining one-third other felony offenders. Black offenders were approximately one-third violent felony offenders, one-half drug offenders and the remainder other offenders. Hispanic offenders committed to state prison in 1992 were approximately four-sevenths drug offenders, a third violent offenders and the remainder other offenders.

Table 9.4 shows the ethnic status distribution for specific offenses with the percentages based on each offense group. For examples, commitments for murder in 1992 (N=356), were, for whites, 15% (N=52); for blacks 52% (N=185) and for Hispanics 30% (N=106). The remaining 4% (N=13) were others.

Race/Ethnic Status of Female 1992 Commitments

Earlier tables have shown the high concentration of drug offenses among female commitments and the concentration of drug offenses among Hispanic commitments. The data in Table 9.5 show that 84% of Hispanic females committed to state prison were sentenced for a drug offense. Seventy percent of black females were committed for a drug offense. In sharp contrast, only 46% of white females committed to state prison were sentenced for a drug offense. Compared with black and Hispanic females, white females were somewhat more likely to be committed for a violent felony offense (23% compared with 16% for blacks and 10% for Hispanics) and considerably more likely to be committed for a property offense (23% compared with 9% for blacks and 3% for Hispanies).

Trends in Commitment Crime by Ethnic Status

The number of white, black and Hispanic offenders in each crime category for commitment years 1989 through 1992 is shown in Table 9.6. These are the figures upon which the percentages in Table 9.7 are based.

The proportion of whites committed for violent felony offenses declined slightly from 39% in 1989 to 35% in 1992 (see Table 9.7). There was a slight increase in property offenders among whites (28% in 1989 to 34% in 1992).

Among blacks there is no change in the percent committed for violent felony crimes between 1989 (36%) and 1992 (37%) and a slight decline in the percent committed for property offenses (14% in 1989 to 12% in 1992) (see Table 9.7). There is a slight increase in the percent of blacks committed for drug offenses between 1989 (42%) and 1992 (44%).

Among Hispanics the proportion committed for violent crimes increased 5% from 26% in 1989 to 31% in 1992. There was a corresponding decline in drug offense commitments from 61% in 1989 to 56% in 1992 in this component population. There was virtually no change in percent committed for other coercive offenses among Hispanics during the study period (3% in 1989 and 1992).

The raw number of males in each crime and ethnic status group for the years 1989 to 1992 is presented in Table 9.8. The percent figures in Table 9.9 are based on the numbers in Table 9.8. Since males are such a predominant portion of total commitments the patterns in the ethnic status distribution of offenses over time generally correspond to those found in Table 9.7 (which are briefly discussed in the paragraphs immediately above).

Trends in Commitment Crime by Race/Ethnic Status for Females

The number of white females committed to state prison rose about 11% in the period 1989 (N=183) to 1992 (N=203), (see Table 9.10). The number of black females committed to state prison grew from 762 in 1989 to 1,011 in 1992. This is a 33% increase since 1989. However, the number of Hispanic females committed to state prison in 1992 was about the same (N=658) as the number committed in 1989 (N=646).

The crime distribution of white, black and Hispanic females has changed a little over the years 1989 to 1992. For white females the percent committed for violent felony crimes fluctuated somewhat between 1989 and 1992, with a low of 19% in 1990 and a high of 23% in 1992. The percent of white females committed for drug offenses declined from 51% in 1989 to 46% in 1992. Twenty-two percent of black females were committed for a violent felony in 1989 but only 16% were in 1992. In 1989 58% of black females were sentenced to prison for a drug felony but this rose to 70% by 1992. Even in 1989 there was a high concentration of drug offenses among Hispanic females (82%). The percent committed for drug offenses still rose slightly to stand at 84% in 1992. The percent of Hispanic females committed for a violent felony declined from 12% in 1989 to 10% in 1992. Except for white female offenders, there was a small decline in the percent committed for violent crimes and an increase in the percent committed for drug offenses.

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AGE AT ADMISSION

The average age at admission was 29.2 years in 1992. For males the average was 29.1 years, for females 30.8 years (see Table 10.1).

Whites were the oldest at commitment (average age 30.6 years), followed by Hispanics (average age 29.7 years), blacks (28.5 years) and others (26.7 years) (see Table 10.2).

The age distribution by gender and ethnic status for 1992 new court commitments is presented in Table 10.3 (see also Figure 10.1). The modal age at commitment for all groups (except "others") was 25-29 years old. For "others" it was 21-24 years old. Crime by age at commitment (broken into 12 categories) is presented in Table 10.4.

Average Age at Admission by Crime and Gender

Among 1992 commitments females were approximately a year older on average than were males committed for the same offenses except for property and other felonies where females were three years older on average than males (see Table 10.5).

It can also be seen in Table 10.5 that for both males and females the average age at commitment within the violent and other coercive crime group is steady across the years 1989 through 1992. However, among drug and property offenders, the average age of new commitments rose from 1989 to 1992. Among males committed for drug offenses, the average age at commitment rose from 29.3 in 1989 to 30.4 years in 1992. The average age of female drug commitments also rose, from 29.6 years in 1989 to 31.1 years in 1992. The average age of male property and other felony commitments increased by nearly two years from 1989 to 1992, rising from 28.9 years among males and 31.8 years among females in 1989 to 30.6 years among males and 33.5 years among females in 1992.

Average Age at Admission by Crime and Race/Ethnic Status


Whites committed in 1992 for violent felony crimes were older (average age 29.5) than either blacks or Hispanics committed for violent crimes (average age 26.7 years and 27 years) (see Table 10.6). The same age ordering occurred among other coercive offenders and drug offenders. Among property offenders, black offenders (31.1 years), and white offenders (30.9 years) were about the same age at commitment and Hispanic offenders were about a year younger (29.7 years).

The average age at commitment fell for violent felony offenders from 27.8 years in 1989 to 27.3 years in 1992. This was because among non-white violent felony offender commitments average age at commitment fell. For example, among black violent felony offender it declined from 27 years in 1987 to 26.7 years in 1992. Contrary to the trend for violent felony offender commitments as a whole, age at commitment for whites rose from 29.5 years in 1989 to 30.0 years in 1992.

Average age at commitment for drug, property, and various coercive offenses rose from 1989 to 1992. For example, among drug offenders, average age at commitment increased from 29.3 years to 30.5 years between 1989 and 1992.

People committed in 1992 were slightly older (average age 29.2) than those committed in 1989 (average age 28.6) (see Table 10.7). Between 1989 and 1992 the percent of commitments that were 19 to 24 years of age declined from 32.6% to 28.6% while commitments that were between 30 and 44 years of age increased a little from 31.2% to 33.4%.

Section 11

COUNTY AND REGION OF COMMITMENT

Seventy-one percent (N=17,922) of 1992 new court commitments were sentenced to state prison from New York City (see Table 11.1 and Figure 11.1)¹⁴. Eleven percent (N=2,807) were sentenced from the Suburban counties near New York City. Ten percent (N=2,530) were committed from Upstate Urban counties and 7% (N=1,867) from Upstate Rural counties. Table 11.1 also shows that the county-of commitment distribution was similar for males and females.

Commitment Crime by County and Region

There were important differences in commitment crime according to region of the state. Commitments from New York City were most likely to be drug offenders (48%) followed by violent felony offenders (35%) and then property offenders (11%) (See Table 11.2). The suburban New York counties were similar to New York City with drug commitments as the largest category (48%), followed by violent felony offenders (31%) and then property offenders (16%). Compared with either New York City or Suburban New York City, persons committed from Upstate counties were less likely to be committed for drug offenses and more likely to be committed for property offenses. For example, among commitments from Upstate Rural counties 30% were property offenders, 31% were drug offenders and 26% were violent felony offenders.

Table 11.3 presents the commitment crime distribution for each New York State county.


Felony Class of Crime by Region

The percent of cases in each felony class category was similar across region of the state (see Table 11.4) with a few exceptions. For example, among commitments from Suburban New York there was a somewhat higher percent of class C felony offenders (30%) and a somewhat lower percent of class E felony offenders (14%) when compared with other regions. The reverse was true for commitments from Upstate Rural counties where the percent of cases that were class C felony offenders (15%) was somewhat lower and the percent of class E felony

¹⁴ The 62 counties in New York State are grouped for statistical purposes into 4 larger regions. New York City refers to commitments from the five counties (or boroughs) that comprise New York City which are Kings, New York, Queens, Richmond, and Bronx counties. Suburban New York City refers to Nassau, Rockland, Suffolk and Westchester counties. The Upstate Urban region refers to counties in upstate New York that have a population center of 50,000 or more. Finally, Upstate Rural refers to all the remaining New York State counties.

offenders (24%) was slightly higher when compared with other regions. The regions were roughly similar. When all serious felony offenders (class A-I, A-II, and B) were combined, the Upstate Rural Region and New York City regions were roughly similar in their proportion of such commitments. The Suburban New York and the Upstate Urban regions were also similar in commitments of serious offenders (i.e. class A-I, A-II, and class B offenders). The combined proportion of class A-I, class A-II, and class B offenders committed from each region in 1992 was as follows: New York City 22%, Suburban New York 26%, Upstate Urban 26%, and Upstate Rural 23%.

Trends in Commitments by Region

The percent of offenders committed from each region of the state showed a little change from 1989-1992 (see Table 11.5); upstate urban commitments were 10% of the total in 1992 compared to 9% in 1989 and New York City commitments were 71% of the total in 1992 compared to 72% in 1989.

Section 12

COUNTRY OF BIRTH

Country of birth for new court commitments across the years 1989 through 1992 is presented in Table 12.1. Among 1992 new court commitments, 76% (N=19,190) were born in one of the 50 states of the United States. Another 11% (N=2,654) were born in one of the U.S. Possessions (for purposes of immigration persons born in United States Possessions are treated as U.S. citizens). Another 8% (N=1,988) were born in one of the island nations in the Caribbean Sea. One percent were born in countries in Central America (N=220) and approximately 2% (N=534) in South America. Approximately 1% (N=427) were born in other countries in the world. For 134 cases (0.5%) place of birth was missing.

Trends in Foreign Born Commitments

The number of new commitments who were foreign born increased across the four years 1989-1992. There were 2,578 foreign born persons committed in 1989, 2,646 in 1990, 3,106 in 1991 and 3,169 in 1992. As a percent of total new court commitments foreign born inmates have remained fairly stable at about 12.6% over the period 1989 to 1992.

In recent years the number of commitments who claim to have been born in certain countries increased at a rate more rapid than the population as a whole. Some of these include: Dominican Republic (730 in 1989, 1,032 in 1992), El Salvador (24 in 1989, 50 in 1992), Guyana (75 in 1989 to 120 in 1992), China (from 13 in 1989 to 36 in 1992), Vietnam (11 in 1989 to 20 in 1992) (see Table 12.1).


Commitment Crime for Foreign Born

Table 12.2 presents crime by region of birth (i.e. countries are grouped into regions, see Table 12.1) for 1992 new court commitments. The 34% of 1992 new court commitments who were sentenced for violent felony crimes included a high percent of offenders from North America (i.e. Canada and Mexico) (55%), Central America (44%), and Asia (71%) committed for violent felony offenses.

A high percent of the offenders born in U.S. Possessions (64%), island nations in the Caribbean (57%), and South America (51%) were included in the 45% of 1992 new commitments were sentenced for drug offenses. Among the 3,169 foreign born persons committed in 1992, 51% (N=1,608) were convicted of a drug offense.

Of the 11,224 drug offenders committed in 1992 70% (N=7,846) were born in the United States, 15% (N=1,699) in U.S. Possessions, and 15% (N=1,679) in foreign nations.

Section 13

EDUCATION

Education level by gender for 1992 new court commitments is presented in Table 13.1. In this table education status refers to the last school grade completed as reported by the inmate. Where the individual claims to have earned a General Education Diploma (i.e. High School Equivalency) he or she was assigned to the 12th grade. As shown in Table 13.1, the average grade level achieved was 10th grade based on reports of new commitments at reception.

In order to properly place inmates in education programs, the Department administers a battery of tests during the reception/classification process. These include tests on reading vocabulary and reading comprehension. Table 13.2 shows the distribution of combined reading vocabulary and reading comprehension scores for 1992 commitments. The average reading level (7.9) based on these tests was approximately 8th grade. While the average grade completed as reported at reception was 10th grade, tested reading proficiency was 2 to 3 grade levels below this depending on gender. While only 1% of inmates claimed education year completed of 4th grade or below (see Table 13.1), fully 23.4% performed on reading tests at the less than 5th grade level (see Table 13.2).

Results from tests on ability to perform math computations and to solve math problems are shown in Table 13.3. For 1992 new commitments the average proficiency in mathematics based on these test scores was almost 7th grade.

Trends in Education Level

Reading proficiency based on tests administered at reception was at the 7th to 8th grade level in each commitment year 1989 through 1992 (see Table 13.5). Average performance level in math proficiency was about the 6th grade level though in 1992 it rose closer to the 7th grade (see Table 13.6).

MARITAL STATUS

Among 1992 commitments 67% were single, never married, 16% of commitments reported that they were legally married; 8% reported common law relationships and 9% reported that they were divorced, widowed or separated (see Table 14.1). Males and females were about equally likely to report being legally married (16%-17%).—Males were somewhat more likely to report marital status of divorced, widowed or separate (10%) than were females (5%).

During the period 1989 through 1992 approximately the same percent of male new commitments (16%-17%) reported being married at time of reception to state prison.

Among females, the percent legally married fluctuated in the study period between a low of 11% (1990) and a high of 19% (1991). In both 1989 and 1992 it was 17% (see Table 14.2).

Section 15

JAIL TIME

Among those individuals committed to state prison many have accumulated time in a local jail prior to the date of reception at a New York State correctional facility. Following arrest the court may require that a defendant post bail to ensure that the defendant will re-appear at a later date for further court proceedings. Those unable to post bail when it is required by the court will generally be confined in a local jail pending court proceedings. Also, for those sentenced to a state prison term, jail time may accumulate between the date of sentencing and the date of transfer to a state correctional facility. Time spent in a local jail prior to conviction or prior to commitment to state prison is credited toward service of the minimum term.

On average, the length of time served in a local jail was approximately the same in 1992 (6.1 months) as for new commitments in 1991 (average 6.4 months); for both new commitments received in 1991 and 1992 it was longer than in 1990 (average 5.5 months) or 1989 (average 5.5 months) (see Table 15.1).

Jail Time by Crime and Crime Class

Violent felony offenders often have served more jail time than have other offenders. For example, among 1992 new commitments, those convicted of a violent felony had served 7.8 months on average compared to 5.7 months for other coercive offenders, 5.2 months for drug offenders and 5.1 months for property offenders (see Table 15.1). Also, when sentenced for the same crime, persons sentenced as a second felony offender often have served more jail time than those sentenced as first felony offenders. This is seen in comparisons of average jail time for first and second felony offenders. For instance, second felony offenders committed for Robbery 1st in 1992 served 9.4 months of jail time on average compared with 6.9 months for first felony offenders convicted of Robbery 1st. That the average jail time for the total group of first and second felony offenders is similar (6.0 and 6.1 months on average in 1992) is due to the higher concentration of drug and property offenders in the second felony group. (See Section 4, p.16-19)

Average and median jail time according to felony class category for the year 1989 through 1992 is reflected in Table 15.2. These data show that as the felony class category declines from most serious (class A-I felony) to least serious (class E felony) the average jail time also declines. This is true for both first and second felons.

Table 15.3 further classifies these data by first and second felony offender. Average and median were slightly higher for second felony offenders committed for the same class of felony as expected.

Jail Time by Region

For the years 1989 and 1990 the average jail time for commitments from New York City was 5.5 months and 5.6 months respectively (see Table 15.5). This increased to 6.8 months for 1991 commitments and 6.1 months for 1992 commitments. For Suburban New York counties the average jail time (6.8 months) in 1992 was approximately the same as that in 1989 (6.6 months). For Upstate Urban counties average jail time increased from 4.9 months in 1989 to approximately 5.4 months in 1992.
