DEFINITIONS OF TERMS

Apprehension occurs when an individual under the age of 18 is taken into custody by a law enforcement officer on the basis that the individual has committed a crime.

Arrest occurs when an individual 18 years or older is taken into custody by a law enforcement officer on the basis that the individual has committed a crime.

Apprehension/Arrest Rate is the number of apprehensions/arrests per 100,000 population.

Property Crime includes burglary, larceny, auto theft and arson.


Serious Crime includes murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, auto theft and arson.


Serious Crime Rate is the number of serious crimes known or reported to law enforcement agencies per 100,000 population.

Violent Crime includes murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assault.

Note: These definitions are similar to the official FBI definitions.


Minnesota Juvenile Population Projections 10-19 year olds Boys






The number of 10-19 year old boys in Minnesota is projected to decrease 3 percent from 312,061 in 1990 to 302,930 in 2020. The number of 10-19 year old girls in Minnesota is projected to decrease 2 percent from 298,845 in 1990 to 292,290 in 2020.


Minnesota Juvenile Population Projections 10-19 year olds by Race/Ethnicity Boys




Juvenile Caucasian Population Projections 10-19 years Boys






The number of 10-19 year old caucasian boys is projected to decrease 17 percent from 287,678 in 1990 to 240,070 in 2020. The number of 10-19 year old caucasian girls is projected to decrease 16 percent from 274,849 in 1990 to 231,900 in 2020.


Juvenile African American Population Projections 10-19 years Boys






The number of 10-19 year old African American boys is projected to increase 212 percent from 9,084 in 1990 to 28,360 in 2020. The number of 10-19 year old African American girls is projected to increase 226 percent from 8,399 in 1990 to 27,370 in 2020.


Juvenile Asian Population Projections 10-19 years Boys






The number of 10-19 year old Asian boys is projected to increase 158 percent from 7,967 in 1990 to 20,540 in 2020. The number of 10-19 year old Asian girls is projected to increase 129 percent from 8,597 in 1990 to 19,680 in 2020.


Juvenile American Indian Population Projections 10-19 years Boys



Juvenile Other Race Population Projections 10-19 years Boys






Juvenile Hispanic Population Projections 10-19 years Boys









Serious Crimes in Minnesota











Violent Crime Rate (per 100,000 population)








Juveniles account for a lower percentage of all violent crime apprehensions/arrests and a higher percentage of property crime apprehensions/arrests for both Minnesota and the Nation.

Minnesota has a higher percentage of juvenile apprehensions for both violent and property crime apprehensions/arrests when compared to the Nation, except for murder.



Serious Crime Apprehension Rate (per 100,000 population)





Violent Crime Apprehension Rate (per 100,000 population)





Property Crime Apprehension Rate (per 100,000 population)




