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Introduction

In December, 1993, the Illinois Council for the Prevention of Violence convened a Task Force of more than 50 members to assist the Council in identifying and implementing school-based violence prevention and life skills development strategies. With funding from the Illinois Department of Public Health, the Task Force has developed a guiding framework for school-based efforts in violence prevention and life skills development, developed criteria for reviewing violence prevention curricula and other resources, reviewed more than 90 violence prevention resources for schools, and identified strategies for assisting schools in implementing violence prevention initiatives.

In October, 1994, *Peacing It Together: A Violence Prevention Resource for Illinois Schools* was published and distributed to every school principal, district office, and regional education office in Illinois. Several thousand additional copies have been sent to individuals and organizations that have requested them between October, 1994 and April, 1995. These requests have come from all over the United States. The *Resource Guide* includes:

- Illinois statistics on violence and youth
- An overview of the role of schools in addressing violence
- Questions for schools to use in assessing the school-community environment
- A guiding framework for developing a comprehensive approach to violence prevention in the schools
- An annotated bibliography of 36 recommended violence prevention curricula and other resources for schools (reviewed in Winter, 1994)

This is the first addendum to the *Resource Guide*. It contains:

- An annotated bibliography of newly recommended violence prevention curricula and other resources for schools (reviewed in Winter, 1995)
- A list of Illinois-based violence prevention training resources for schools
- Corrections to the initial *Resource Guide*

Users of the *Resource Guide* and *Addendum One* should recognize that these do not represent an exhaustive list of violence prevention curricular and training resources for schools. The Peacing It Together Task Force will review additional resources in Fall, 1995. 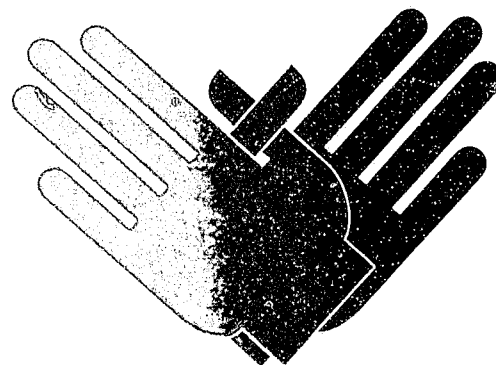
