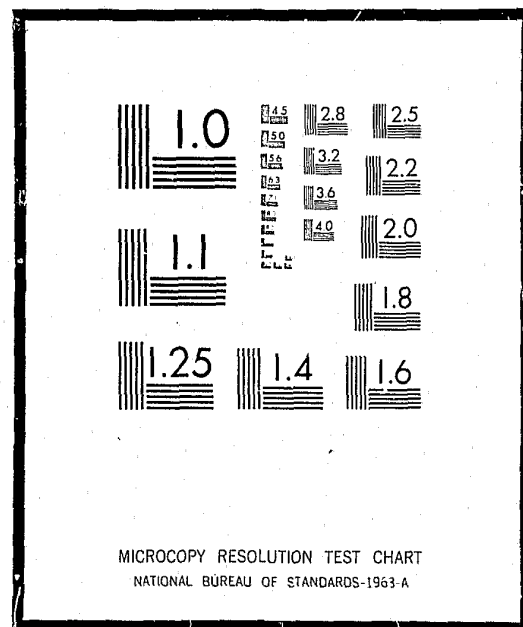

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PREFACE

Crime In Illinois 1973 is the fifth publication presenting a comprehensive review of the amount and extent of crime in our communities throughout the State. The crime statistical data depicted in this report was officially submitted on a monthly basis by 982 law enforcement agencies, representing villages, municipalities, counties, colleges, universities, and park districts. Three hundred thirty-five of these law enforcement agencies are very small part-time police agencies who report through the various sheriffs offices. The remaining 647 law enforcement agencies report directly to the Crime Studies Section of the Bureau of Identification, located in Springfield.

Reporting crime statistics was made mandatory by the 76th General Assembly, set forth by the Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 38, Section 206-8, quoted below:

206-8. Crime statistics. § 8. The Department (of Law Enforcement) shall be a central repository and custodian of crime statistics for the State and it shall have all power incident thereto to carry out the purposes of this Act, including the power to demand and receive cooperation in the submission of crime statistics from all units of government.

Even though the Program is mandatory by statute, it is administered to provide services to the law enforcement community, public and private agencies and institutions, researchers, planners and the public regarding the analysis of crime as defined by the Illinois Revised Statutes.

Crime statistical data reported each month by law enforcement agencies is reviewed for completeness and computer processed resulting in the production of an array of agency monthly output administrative

reports which are sent to the agencies. Output reports that are forwarded to law enforcement agencies, institutions, investigating commissions, planning agencies, and various Legislative Committees include: Offenses Known to the Police; Offenses Cleared or Cases Solved, Police Disposition of Persons Arrested; Stolen Property Analysis; Age, Sex and Race of Persons Arrested, and many special reports such as Beat Analysis, Residence of Persons Arrested, Manpower Utilization, etc. Any of these reports can be produced at the local, county, State level and any county arrangement making up a region or district within the State. In addition, these reports are produced monthly, quarterly and annually, providing specific crime trend information for each community and the State as a whole.

The Illinois-Uniform Crime Reporting Program (I-UCR) emphasizes law enforcement administration in the areas of manpower planning and deployment, budgeting, development and evaluation of crime prevention programs and manpower utilization. This problem or service orientation of the I-UCR program aids in obtaining more meaningful crime statistics in the analysis of the amount and extent of crime in our communities and consequently provides the various agencies with quantitative data to develop and evaluate prevention programs.

Since the publication of all of the statistical data is a voluminous and costly undertaking, only a part of the more general information is contained herein. To maintain a cost effective environment, more detail data is available as requested. INTRODUCTION

BACKGROUND

The Illinois-Uniform Crime Reporting System (I-UCR) was developed in 1971 and implemented January 1, 1972. Throughout the development phase of the I-UCR Program a large segment of the law enforcement community was involved in finalizing the data collection part of the system, it became apparent after extensive research that the agencies required more comprehensive data than that required for the National Program. Secondly, it was discovered during the development phase that if statistical data was to be meaningful to law enforcement agencies, other functions of criminal justice, the Legislature and investigating commissions; etc., the data should be identified with the criminal code which defines criminal deviant behavior. Thirdly, it was very important to relate crime statistical data to the National Program in order to relate to the Nation as a whole as well as adhering to the National Program's standards. Fourthly and lastly, the law enforcement agencies needed administrative statistics in return for submitting data to the State.

This is the substance upon which the I-UCR System was designed. It was developed to satisfy the above needs of the law enforcement community, planning agencies, the Legislature, education institutions, various commissions and a multitude of criminal justice agencies. Moreover, the development of the Criminal Justice Information System (CJIS) requires that a common language be used for all agencies—a common language that can be identified to the task to be performed. This task is the enforcement of that body of law entitled the Illinois Criminal Law. This means that statistical data that is derived from the criminal justice process is meaningful to all criminal justice agencies. This same data can be easily translated to the National Program. Additionally, the I-UCR system was designed to be compatible with all components of criminal justice, including those agencies at the National level of government in view of the development of the Criminal Justice Information System (CJIS).

In order to accomplish the task of orienting the I-UCR to both the State and National levels, it was only necessary to intercept statistical data prior to the FBI or National UCR system of classification. In the FBI-UCR Manual, each classification of a statistical offense definition describes what state laws generally go into each offense code. For example; Attempted Murder, Aggravated Assault, and Aggravated Battery make up the FBI-UCR Aggravated Assault Classification. The I-UCR system collects Attempted Murder, Aggravated Assault and Aggravated Battery separately because these offenses represent State Statutes. The I-UCR system

automatically translates these three offenses via the Department of Law Enforcement's Data Processing Center, uniformly into the FBI-UCR offense classification. Consequently, this enables the system to produce both State and National reports that are meaningful to everyone.

The statistical information collected was deepened considerably in comparison with the National Program by including all criminal statutes (excepting a very few) in the offense report such that the codes were uniform for all offenses, police and court dispositions and age, sex and race statistical data. This approach provided a uniform track through the police process, terminating with the prosecution. The expansion of the I-UCR crime codes was mainly suggested by many of our law enforcement agencies to gather and disseminate statistical data in other major categories of crime in addition to the commonly publicized Crime Index.

To satisfy the need for better and more comprehensive statistical data, analysis and compilation, all reports were made monthly, with output to the law enforcement agencies monthly, quarterly and annually in an array of different reports. These same data are summarized at the county levels, various regional planning levels and the State in the same manner. All data is translated into the FBI-UCR Program monthly on computer tapes which are forwarded to the FBI in accordance with conformance criteria established at the National level.

As a service to all law enforcement agencies the I-UCR accommodates 128 service codes other than crime which are optional or non-mandatory. Presently, 386 agencies use these codes, providing them with total activity accountability. For example, in the year 1973, the service code activity average was 76% of the total law enforcement activity, leaving approximately 24% for criminal activity and a few serious vehicle code offenses. These are very important numbers when we are used to looking at the Crime Index only (7 offenses) and relate the index to the number of officers per 1,000 population and consequently police efficiency. What needs to be accomplished is full activity reporting for the general public to better understand the police role in a given community as well as to assist local law enforcement agencies from a police administrative point of view in a uniform manner.

In connection with crime and service activity the agency has an option to enter manhours expended, by type activity, badge number, case number, beat (sub-jurisdictional area), mobility code of persons arrested (that is, residence out of jurisdiction), and items stolen by any particular offense. With these data the I-UCR Program can produce manhour utilization reports, officer activity, beat analysis by time of day, by type crime, by type property and

place being attacked in a multitude of arrangements. These data are in turn used for planning and research, budget accountability, forecasting and substantiation, and manpower determination and deployment, as well as meeting the needs of the State and the standards set by the National Program.

There are two ways in which law enforcement agencies can submit crime statistics. One way is by a fixed format tally method similar to the concept used by the FBI-UCR Group. The second way is by direct case entry. That is, as offenses and arrests occur the agency using the second method simply enters case summary information. Either method of reporting is optional depending upon needs of the particular agency. And if the agency wants to change method of reporting, it may do so at any point in time other than during a particular month.

OFFENSE CLASSIFICATIONS

The Illinois-Uniform Crime Reporting (I-UCR) offense classification structure is similar to the National Program, excepting that State Statutes are used rather than uniform offense definitions. The following is a list of offense classifications and statute reference used for reporting offense and arrest information.

OFFENSE CLASSIFICATIONS—NATIONAL PROGRAM

The National Program for uniform crime reporting defines seven offenses for offense reporting. These offenses are listed below.

1. Criminal Homicide
 - *a. Murder and Nonnegligent Manslaughter
 - b. Manslaughter by Negligence
- *2. Forcible Rape
 - a. Rape by Force
 - b. Attempts to Commit Forcible Rape
- *3. Robbery
 - a. Firearm
 - b. Knife or Cutting Instrument
 - c. Other Dangerous Weapons
 - d. Strong-Arm (Hands, Fists, Feet, Etc.)
4. Assault
 - *a. Firearm
 - *b. Knife or Cutting Instrument
 - *c. Other Dangerous Weapon
 - *d. Hands, Fist, Feet, Etc.—Aggravated Injury
 - e. Other Assaults—Simple, Not Aggravated
- *5. Burglary
 - a. Forcible Entry
 - b. Unlawful Entry—No Force
 - c. Attempted Forcible Entry
- *6. Larceny—Theft (Except Motor Vehicle Theft)

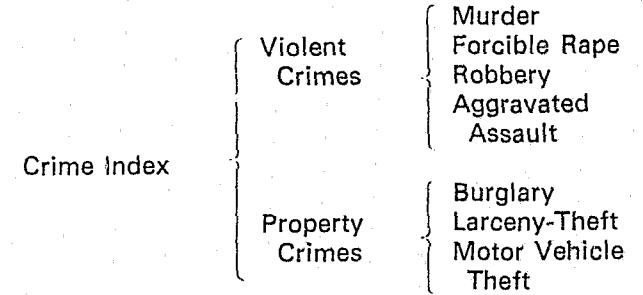
- *7. Motor Vehicle Theft
 - a. Autos
 - b. Trucks and Buses
 - c. Other Vehicles

*Indicates an Index Offense by National Definitions

Those offenses that make up the Crime Index are asterisked in the list above. It should be noted that in those categories of offenses that do not contain a sub-category for Attempts, the Attempts are scored as if the crime was completed excepting Murder and Nonnegligent Manslaughter. In this case an Attempted Murder is scored as an Assault. In contrast, the I-UCR Program has sub-codes in every category to bring out all Attempts. The reason for not summarizing crime codes is to maintain a statistic of completed as well as incompleting crimes. For example, Motor Vehicle Theft in the National Program includes both completed and incompleting Motor Vehicle Thefts. On the one hand the vehicle was stolen and the owner was deprived of his property. On the other hand an Attempted Vehicle Theft does not deprive the owner of his property nor does it require follow-up investigation to recover the vehicle. The I-UCR Program collects Attempts separately for each crime category, however, when I-UCR data is translated in FBI-UCR format, Attempts are included. The reader should be aware of this when reading Crime Index material.

CRIME INDEX

The Crime Index has been used for many years to indicate the amount and extent of serious crimes as defined by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP), Committee on Uniform Crime Reports. The Crime Index consists of seven offenses which are sub-divided into Violent Crimes or Crimes Against Persons, and Property Crimes or Crimes Against Property. The Crime Index is illustrated below:



The total of all crimes committed in these seven categories is defined as the **Crime Index**.

The **Crime Rate** is defined as the total number of index crimes per 100,000 inhabitants and is calculated as follows:

$$\text{Crime Rate} = \frac{\text{Crime Index} \times 100,000}{\text{Jurisdictional Population}}$$

The jurisdictional population can be a city, town, county, state or the Nation.

TRANSLATING I-UCR STATISTICS

It was mentioned before that I-UCR statistical data is translated into the National Program offense classifications. To better understand what you will be reading in this publication, the following illustration should help clarify how state statutes are translated into the National Program's crime index offenses.

It should be understood from the illustration that the Assault category of the National Program contains Attempted Murder, Aggravated Assault and Aggravated Battery. And Burglary From Motor Vehicle is treated as a Larceny-Theft. In this report part of the I-UCR statistical data is translated into the Crime Index for continuity with the National level. In addition, this report contains offense and arrest data in terms of State statutes for continuity throughout the Illinois Criminal Justice System and in particular activity that relates to **law enforcement**.

INTER-AGENCY COMPARISONS

When making comparisons of crime statistics between jurisdictions, many factors should be considered before drawing any conclusions. Most releases of crime statistics especially the Crime Index show a population or population group relationship which leads one to compare jurisdictions based on population alone and consequently arrive at false conclusions. For example, there are many jurisdictions that have approximately the same population, however, how many jurisdictions with the same population have a race track, or large manufacturing area or mostly residential, or have a large number of hotels and motels? The point is when comparing crime statistics, one must have at least a general understanding of the characteristics of each community to intelligently derive cogent conclusions. Another aspect of crime trends in a particular community is the fact that criminal deviant behavior is a community problem that requires more than the police department to understand and cur-

tail. The law enforcement community can only deal with those factors under its control, whereas, other agencies and institutions must deal with the entire problem in cooperation with law enforcement in conjunction with contributing factors which lead to crime. Some of these factors are listed below.

1. Density and size of the community population and the metropolitan area of which it is a part.
2. Composition of the population with reference particularly to age, sex and race.
3. Economic status and mores of the population.
4. Relative stability of population, including commuters, seasonal and other transient types.
5. Climate, including seasonal weather conditions.
6. Education and recreational characteristics.
7. Effective strength of the police force.
8. Standards governing appointments to the police force.
9. Policies of the prosecuting officials and the courts.
10. Attitudes of the public toward law enforcement problems.
11. The administrative and investigative efficiency of the local law enforcement agency, the level of services performed other than combating and preventing crime, and the degree of adherence to crime reporting standards to measure the amount and extent of crime over long periods of time.
12. The degree of inter-agency cooperation in combating crime.
13. Public official's attitudes toward law enforcement, including the law enforcement agency's involvement in the community planning process.

Most of these factors are environmental and should necessarily be considered, however, criminal deviant behavior is complex involving sociological, psychological, biological, pathological, physiological, etc. factors comingled in one degree or another to produce the criminal deviant. And each kind of crime committed is defined differently by statute and hence requires analysis of deviant behavior by definition. For example, one that viciously commits rape has different personality traits perhaps than one who commits theft to meet family needs because he is out of a job.

It is not an easy task to consider all of these factors when reviewing crime statistics, mainly because data isn't readily available to perform such an analysis nor is there a direct correlation presented herein to reflect a more meaningful statistic. In any event caution should be taken so as not to draw erroneous conclusions based on the population or your jurisdiction alone; consider total community factors in each comparison situation.

STATE SUMMARY

The Crime Index discussed in the introduction consists of seven statistical classifications as defined by the National Program. These are, Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter, Forcible Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Theft/Larceny and Vehicle Theft. Violent Crimes consist of Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter, Forcible Rape, Robbery, and Aggravated Assault. The statistical classifications; Burglary, Theft/Larceny and Vehicle Theft, represent the remaining offense classifications of the Crime Index, and are termed Property Crimes. The relationship between the Illinois-Uniform Crime Reporting (I-UCR) offense classifications and the National offense classifications is illustrated below.

Crime Index Offenses include attempts to commit these offenses. For example, Attempted Murder is included with the completed offense count of Aggravated Assault and Attempted Vehicle Theft is included in the total Vehicle Theft counts. The discussion and analysis of offenses that occurred in 1973 will include both the National Program and State Program statistics for a better understanding of the Crime Index. The data presented represents offenses known and reported by the 982 law enforcement agencies in the State; 647 of which report directly to the State and 335 very small agencies that report through the 102 Sheriff offices. During calendar year 1973, law enforcement agencies reported 481,940 index offenses, representing a 12.2 percent increase over 1972. Violent Crimes

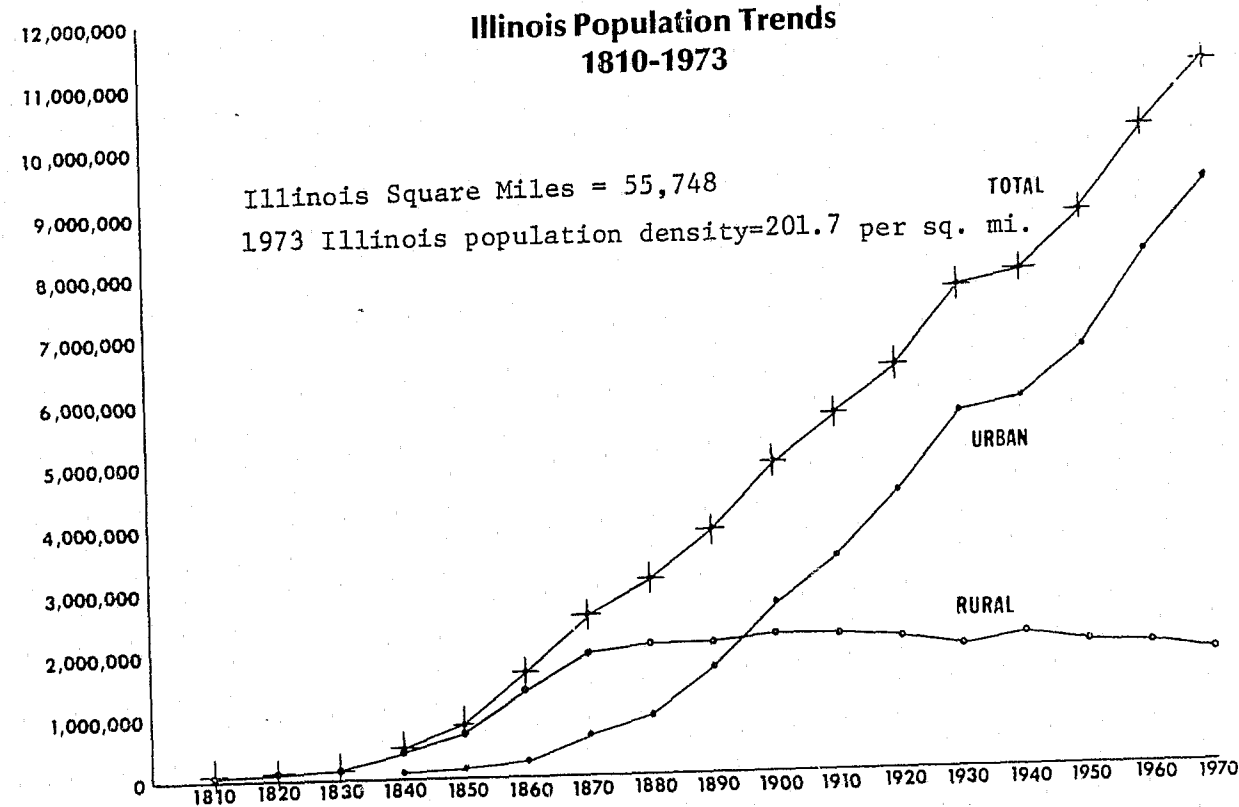
accounted for 13.2 percent of the Crime Index in 1973, representing an increase of 9.8 percent over 1972. Property Crimes accounted for 86.8 percent of the Index Offenses, representing an increase of 12.6 percent over 1972. Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter increased 19.4 percent in 1973 over 1972, Forcible Rape increased 2.8 percent, Robbery increased 5.7 percent, and Aggravated Assault (Attempted Murder, Aggravated Battery, Aggravated Assault) increased 15 percent. Burglary increased 21.1 percent in 1973 over 1972, Theft increased 8.2 percent and Motor Vehicle Theft increased 16.2 percent. In summary, all index offenses increased in 1973. The State Crime Rate (number of index offenses per 100,000 inhabitants) for 1973 was 4,287.1, an increase of 12.1 percent over 1972. The table below presents Crime Index offenses and rates for 1973.

The highest increase in Violent Crimes was Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter representing 19.4 percent; Burglary was highest in Property Crimes representing 21.0 percent and accounted for the highest increase in all Index Crimes for 1973 over 1972. Rape had the lowest increase in 1973. Over 45 percent of the Rape offenses known to the police are unfounded—meaning upon police investigation it was found that the crime didn't occur. The Crime Index shows 2,670 offenses of Rape, however 4,765 offenses actually were reported by the police in 1973 which means that 2,095 cases or 44% were subsequently unfounded after investigation.

Chart 1 depicts the Total Crime Index Trend beginning with 1965 through 1973. The Chart indicates that the Crime Index is up 78 percent over 1965 and the Crime Rate is up 68 percent. The table below the graph represents the data from which the points on the graph were plotted.

CRIME INDEX ARRESTS

There were 102,452 persons arrested for Index Crimes in 1973. Males represented 85,042 arrests or 83 percent of the total persons arrested. Females accounted for 17,410 persons arrested or 17.0 percent. White Males represented 38,544 persons arrested or 45.3 percent of the total Males. Blacks or Negro Males accounted for 43,628 arrests or 51.3 percent of the total Males arrested. White Females represented 7,917 persons arrested or 45.5 percent of the total Females. Black or Negro Females arrested for Crime Index offenses accounted for 7,085 arrests or 40.7 percent of the total Females arrested. Juveniles accounted for 38,057 persons arrested or 37.2 percent of the total arrests made for Crime Index offenses. The Theft category of the Crime Index accounted for 21,747 juveniles arrested in 1973 or 57.1 percent of all juvenile arrests for Index crimes. Tables 2 and 3 provide detail information regarding persons arrested for Index offenses in 1973 and 1972.

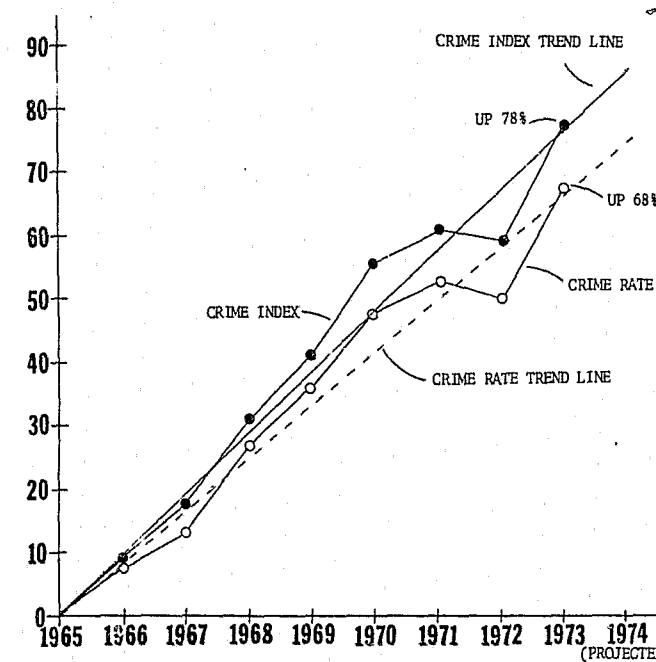

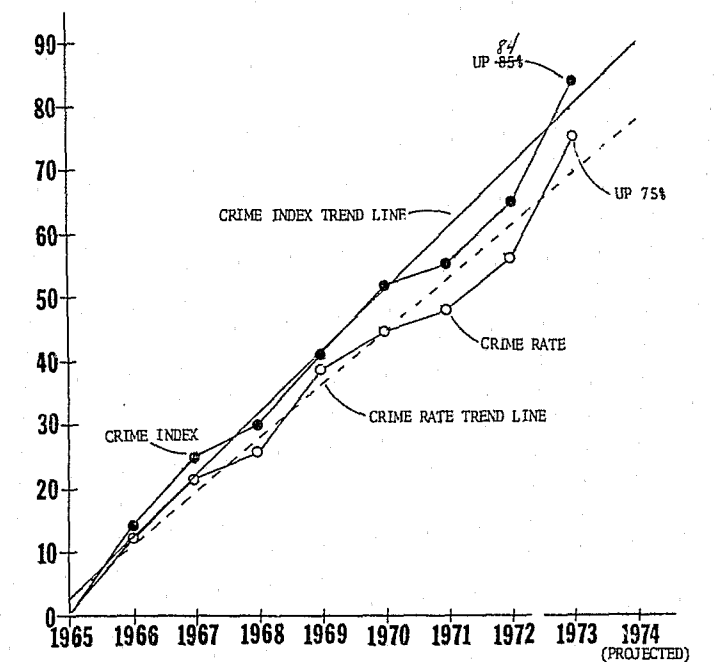

CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

Crimes Against Persons consist of Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Aggravated Battery and Attempted Murder. The total Violent Crimes that occurred in 1973 was 63,359. Chart 2 depicts the long term trend and specific data of violent crimes beginning with the year 1965. Violent Crimes were up 84 percent in 1973 over the base year 1965 representing a 9.7 percent increase over 1972.

VIOLENT CRIME ARRESTS

Arrests made for offenses within the Crimes Against Persons or Violent Crime category represented 23,840 or 23.3 percent of all arrests made for index offenses in 1973. Males accounted for 21,786 arrests for Violent Crimes or 91.4 percent, and Females accounted for 2,054 arrests or 8.6 percent of the total for Violent Crimes. White Males accounted for 7,840 arrests made for these crimes or 36.0 percent, Black or Negro Males represented

13,198 arrests for Crimes Against Persons or 60.6 percent, while all other races made up the remaining arrests. Tables 4 and 5 provide a detail breakdown of persons arrested for Crimes Against Persons in 1973 and 1972.

MURDER AND VOLUNTARY MANSLAUGHTER

Murder is defined in the Illinois Revised Statutes-1973, Chapter 38, Section 9-1, as follows:

9-1. § 9-1. Murder. A person who kills an individual without lawful justification commits murder if, in performing the acts which cause the death:

- (1) He either intends to kill or do great bodily harm to that individual or another, or knows that such acts will cause death to that individual or another; or
- (2) He knows that such acts create a strong probability of death or great bodily harm to that individual or another; or
- (3) He is attempting or committing a forcible felony other than voluntary manslaughter.

Voluntary Manslaughter is defined as follows:

9-2. § 9-2. Voluntary Manslaughter. A person who kills an individual without lawful justification commits voluntary manslaughter if

at the time of the killing he is acting under a sudden intense passion resulting from serious provocation by:

- (1) The individual killed, or

- (2) Another whom the offender endeavors to kill, but he negligently or accidentally causes the death of the individual killed.

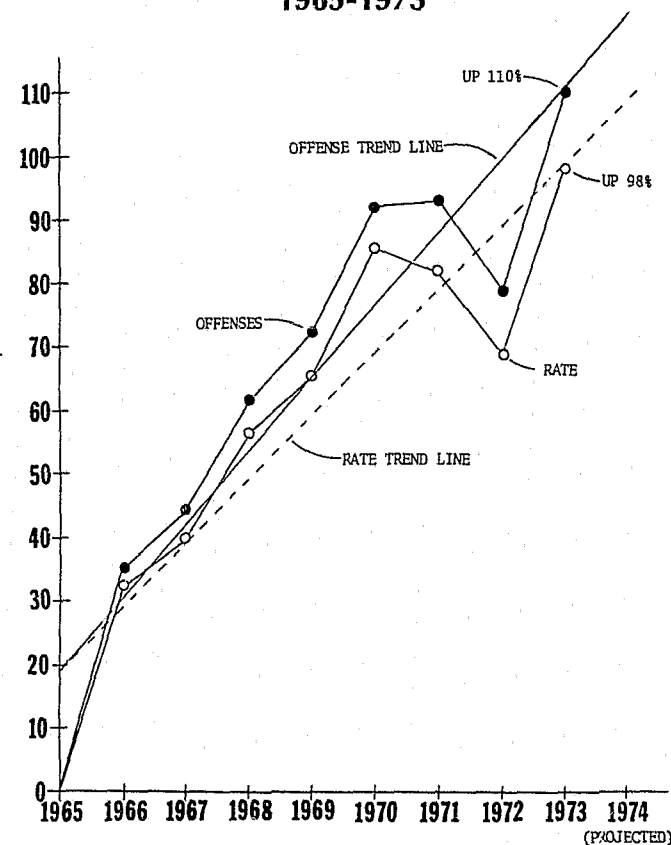
Serious provocation is conduct sufficient to excite an intense passion in a reasonable person.

The Crime Index offenses for Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter are merged in accordance with the National Program definition and are based solely on police investigation. Law enforcement agencies reported 1,071 Murders and 85 Voluntary Manslaughters in 1973, representing a 19.4 percent increase over 1972. Attempted Murder is included in the Aggravated Assault category in accordance with the National Program definitions.

The long term trend of Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter is illustrated in Chart 2.1. The offenses increased 110 percent in 1973 over 1965 and 19.4 percent over 1972. A detail analysis of these crimes indicates that Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter is difficult to prevent by law enforcement alone, since the majority of these offenses are committed by persons known to the victim.

Table 6 displays incidents of Murder and Voluntary

Manslaughter by month of occurrence, comparing 1973 with 1972. The right side of the table is partitioned into three categories of victim-offender relationships. Type I, the victim and offender are within the family which accounted for 158 offenses in 1972 and 189 in 1973, representing an increase of 19.6 percent in 1973 over 1972. Type I Murders and Voluntary Manslaughters represent approxi-

mately 16.5 percent of the total offenses committed on the average, in this crime category. In Type II victim-offender relationship, the victim and offender were acquainted prior to the offense occurring, representing 365 cases in 1972 and 474 cases in 1973 for an increase of 29.9 percent in 1973 over 1972.

Type I and Type II together accounted for 523 cases or 54.9 percent of the total offenses committed in 1972, and in 1973 these two categories consisting of the victim and offender knowing each other, accounted for 663 cases reported or 57.4 percent of the total Murders and Voluntary Manslaughters committed, representing a 26.8 percent increase in 1973 over 1972.

In Type III, the offender and victim are unknown to each other and represented approximately 43.9 percent of the cases reported on the average. There were 429 cases of Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter in 1972 and 493 cases in 1973, accounting for a 14.9 percent increase in 1973 over 1972. The bar chart below illustrates Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter occurrences by month for 1973 and 1972.

Table 7 Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter, Victim, Sex and Race; provides an analysis of victim sex and race by month of occurrence. Male victims represent approximately 78.6 percent of the cases on the average and females represented approximately 21.4 percent. Male cases increased 18.3 percent in 1973 over 1972, and Females increased 33.5 percent over the same period. White victims accounted for 37.2 percent of the cases in 1973, Black victims represented 60.3 percent.

An analysis of Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter by type weapon used in committing the crime is presented in Table 8. The use of handguns to commit Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter remains the highest in the type weapons used. In 1972, 61.7 percent of the offenses committed, involved a handgun and in 1973, 61.3 percent of the cases involved the same type weapon with little change over the past two years. The use of shotguns increased from 5.9 percent in 1972 to 7.3 percent in 1973. Incidents involving a knife as the murder weapon declined from 16.3 percent of the total cases in 1972 to 15.2 percent in 1973. The use of a club which includes any blunt instrument, increased from 4.4 percent of the cases in 1972 to 5.7 percent in 1973. The use of hands, fists, feet or any other part of the body used in the crime declined from 7.4 percent in 1972 to 5.6 percent of the total cases in 1973. All other type weapons or instruments accounted for approximately 2 percent of the cases.

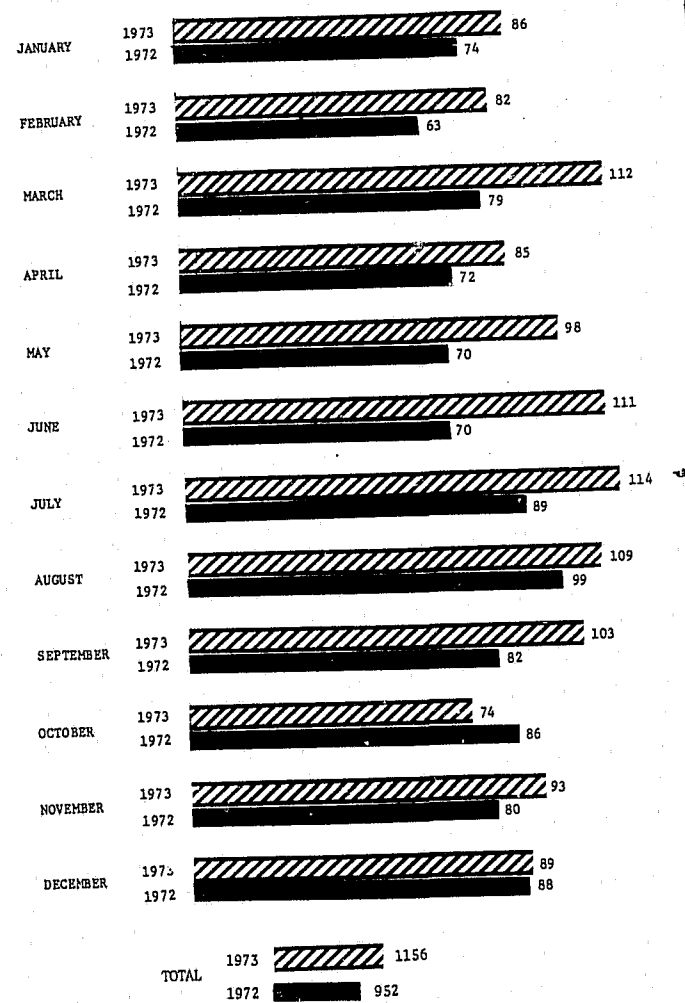
Handguns, rifles and shotguns together accounted for 667 of the offenses in 1972 or 70 percent, and in 1973 the use of these firearms accounted for 820 cases, representing 71 percent of the total Murders and Voluntary Manslaughters.

MURDER AND VOLUNTARY MANSLAUGHTER ARRESTS

The total persons arrested for Murder and Voluntary

Manslaughter in 1973 was 1,240, representing 5.2 percent of the Violent Crime category and 1.2 percent of the arrests made for all Index Crimes. Males represented 1,117 or 90.1 percent of the arrests and Females 123 or 9.9 percent of the arrests. White Males accounted for 218 or 19.5 percent of the total Males arrested for Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter in 1973. Black or Negro Males accounted for 873 or 78.2 percent of the total Male arrests. Tables 9 and 10, provide additional statistical data of persons arrested for this offense for 1973 and 1972 for comparison purposes.

RAPE

The crime of rape is defined in Chapter 38, Section 11-1 of the Illinois Revised Statutes-1973. Paragraph (a) (2) is a deviation from the National Program definition and is accommodated by a sub-category of other sex offenses. The Section reads as follows:

11-1. § 11-1. Rape. (a) A male person of the age of 14 years and upwards who has sexual intercourse with a female, not his wife, by force and against her will, commits rape. Intercourse by force and against her will includes, but is not limited to, any intercourse which occurs in the following situations:

- (1) Where the female is unconscious; or
- (2) Where the female is so mentally deranged or deficient that she cannot give effective consent to intercourse.

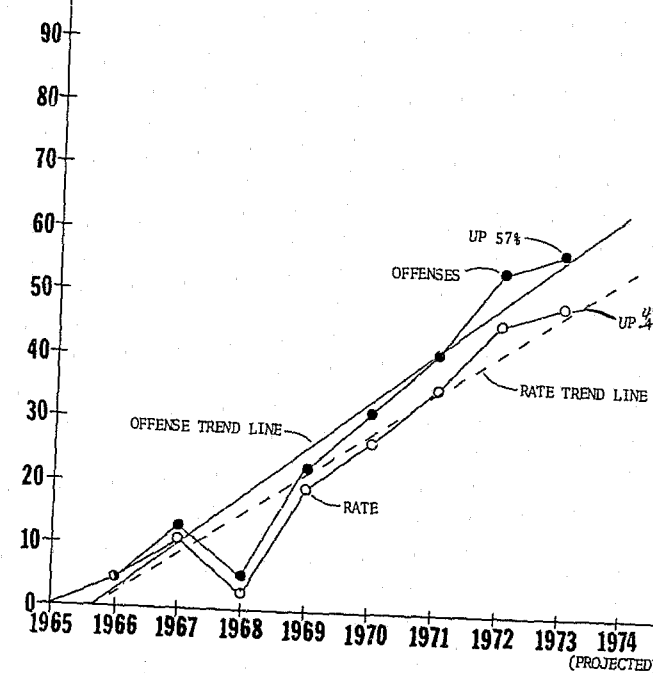
(b) Sexual intercourse occurs when there is any penetration of the female sex organ by the male sex organ.

There were 4,765 Rapes known to and reported by the police in 1973. Over 45 percent of these cases were unfounded, based upon results of police in-

vestigation. Included in the 2,670 actual offenses that occurred were 455 Attempts to commit rape. Rapes accounted for 0.6 percent of the Crime Index and 4.2 percent of the Crimes Against Persons category. Rape offenses increased by 2.8 percent in 1973 over 1972. The Crime Rate for Rape was 23.8 per 100,000 inhabitants representing an increase in Crime Rate of 3.0 percent in 1973 over 1972.

Chart 2.2 shows an eight year trend of Rape, indicating an increase in offenses committed of 57 percent in 1973 over 1965, and a 48 percent increase in the Rape Rate over 1965. The table below the graph provides a nine year history of Rape for comparison purposes.

RAPE ARRESTS

Tables 11 and 12 display detailed statistics of persons arrested for Rape. In 1973, Table 11 shows that 1,126 persons were arrested for Rape, and in 1972 there were 1,481 arrests representing a decrease in arrests of 24 percent in 1973. Adults accounted for 983 arrests in 1973 or 87.3 percent, and Juveniles represented 143 arrests or 12.7 percent of the total arrests made; White Males accounted for 360 or 32.0 percent of the arrests, and Blacks or Negroes represented 695 arrest cases or 61.7 percent of the total arrests.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT, AGGRAVATED BATTERY, ATTEMPTED MURDER

These three offenses make up the Aggravated Assault category of the National Program. These offenses are defined in the Illinois Revised Statutes, 1973, Chapter 38, as follows:

12.2 Aggravated Assault. A person commits an aggravated assault, when, in committing an assault, he:

- (1) Uses a deadly weapon.

Other sub-paragraphs of this statute are accounted for in the I-UCR Program under a sub-category in order to be consistent with the National Program. The intent here is to threaten great bodily harm, both at the State and National level regarding Index Crimes. Aggravated Battery is the furtherance of the Assault whereby physical contact is made resulting in great bodily harm. Aggravated Battery is defined in the Illinois Statutes, Chapter 38, as:

12-4. Aggravated Battery. (a) A person who, in committing a battery, intentionally or knowingly causes great bodily harm, or permanent disability or disfigurement commits aggravated battery.

- (b) (1) Uses a deadly weapon;

(c) A person who administers to an individual or causes him to take, without his consent or by threat or deception, and for other than medical purposes, any intoxicating, poisonous, stupefying, narcotic or anesthetic substance commits aggravated battery.

All other sub-paragraphs in this Statute are included in other sub-codes of the Illinois-Uniform Crime Reporting Program to maintain consistency with the National Program.

Attempted Murder is defined the same as Murder excepting that the offense wasn't completed but the intention was by his acts to complete the offense, which is covered in the Illinois Revised Statutes, 1973, Chapter 38, Section 8-4.

It is important for the reader to understand that when reading statistics published by the National

Program that the Crime Index category, Aggravated Assault, includes the above State Statutes. Statistics relating directly to each State Statute of the Criminal Law of Illinois can be found elsewhere in this report. See the Table of Contents, Offense Summary.

The three offenses defined above which are included in the Aggravated Assault category of the National Program, accounted for 28,396 offenses in 1973, representing a 15.0 percent increase over 1972. This category of the Crime Index makes up 5.9 percent of the Crime Index and 44.8 percent of the Violent Crimes.

The Crime Rate for Aggravated Assault (Aggravated Assault, Aggravated Battery, and Attempted Murder) was 252.6 offenses or victims per 100,000

inhabitants in 1973, representing an increase of 14.9 percent over 1972.

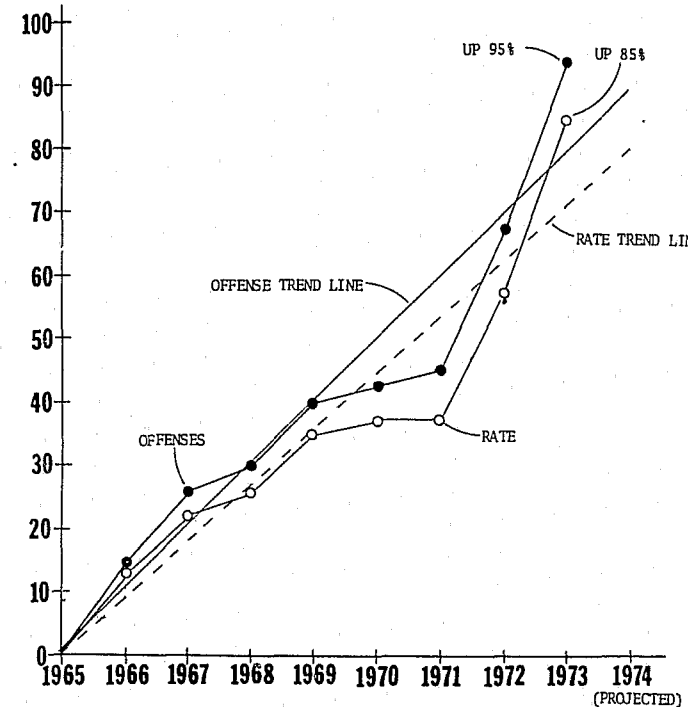
Table 13 shows the type weapon used in committing Attempted Murder, Aggravated Battery and Aggravated Assault. Firearms were used in 7,073 or 24.9 percent of the incidents; a knife or cutting instrument was used in 6,912 or 24.3 percent of the offenses; other dangerous weapons (club, rope, iron bar, pipe, etc.) were used in 5,558 or 19.6 percent of the crimes; and hands, fist, feet, etc., were used in 8,853 or 31.2 percent of the cases in 1973. Note that the table reflects the use of Firearms in Attempted Murder and Aggravated Assault as the highest for these two offenses, representing 73.0 percent of all weapons used in Attempted Murder and 35.4 percent in Aggravated Assaults.

The volume of offenses in 1973 was 28,396, and in 1972 the volume was 24,701 offenses representing an increase in volume of 3,695 or 15.0 percent in 1973, and 95 percent over 1965 as illustrated in Chart 2.3.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT, AGGRAVATED BATTERY AND ATTEMPTED MURDER ARRESTS

Persons arrested for Aggravated Assault, Aggravated Battery and Attempted Murder amounted to

11,810 in 1973, and 11,179 in 1972, representing an increase in 1973 of 5.6 percent. Adults accounted for 9,583 or 81.1 percent of the total persons arrested, and Juveniles made up 2,227 or 18.9 percent of the arrests in 1973 for these offenses. Males represented 88.0 percent of the arrests and Females accounted for 12.0 percent of the arrests. Whites represented 6,193 arrests or 52.4 percent; Blacks or Negroes accounted for 41.9 percent or 4,952 arrests; Mexicans accounted for 222 or 1.9 percent of the arrests, and the remaining arrests were distributed among the other races shown in Table 14. Table 15 provides the arrest data for 1972 for comparison purposes.

In the Juvenile area, the arrests were relatively high in age group 14, 15 and 16 years of age. In the Adult class, the majority of arrests were made between ages 17 through 27 indicating a constant increase beginning at age 13 in the Juvenile group to age 27 in the Adult group and dropping off rapidly with increasing age.

ROBBERY

Robbery is usually included in the Property Offense sub-category of the Crime Index. However, Robbery by definition includes assault and/or battery with the intent to deprive the person of property or commit a theft. It is considered in the Illinois-UCR Program as a Violent Crime or Crime Against Persons. The State Statute is quoted below from Chapter 38 of the Illinois Revised Statutes-1973:

18-1. Robbery. (a) A person commits robbery when he takes property from the person or presence of another by the use of force or by threatening the imminent use of force.

18-2. Armed Robbery. (a) A person commits armed robbery when he violates Section 18-1 while armed with a dangerous weapon.

From the definition of Robbery one can conclude that an Assault or Battery, both of which can be Aggravated is committed concurrently with the intent to deprive a person of his property. For example; if a person points a gun at an individual with a threat to do great bodily harm which is present by the display of the gun it could be termed an Aggravated Battery. However, if the offender takes property from the person it is Armed Robbery. Likewise, if an individual grabs a purse it could be considered a common theft called purse-snatching. However, if the individual strikes you with his fist or any other weapon intended to produce force, it is a Robbery. As a result Robbery is more importantly classified as a Violent Crime or Crime Against Persons than being classified as a Property Crime. Obtaining property is the intent of the offense.

There were 31,137 Robberies in 1973, representing an increase of 5.7 percent over 1972. Robbery accounts for 49.1 percent of the Crimes Against Per-

sons and 6.5 percent of the Crime Index. The Crime Rate for Robbery was 277.0 offenses per 100,000 inhabitants representing an increase of 5.6 percent over 1972. Armed Robbery, a more serious crime, accounted for 19,871 offenses or 63.8 percent of the total Robberies committed. Chart 2.4 shows the eight year trend for Robbery, indicating that offenses were up 78 percent and the Crime Rate was up 68 percent over 1965 considered the base year for computation. Specific statistical data is presented in the table below the graph.

Table 16, provides a detailed breakdown of Robbery by type weapon used and those Robberies that were committed by using a certain degree of force called strong-armed robbery.

Accordingly, there were 19,871 Armed Robberies in 1973 which represented 63.8 percent of the total robberies committed, not considering the 373 Attempts to commit Armed Robbery.

ROBBERY ARRESTS

Tables 17 and 18 displays detailed data of persons arrested for Robbery in 1973 and 1972. There were 9,663 persons arrested in 1973 for Robbery and 9,927 persons arrested in 1972, representing a 2.7 percent decrease in arrests in 1973 over 1972. Males accounted for 9,154 out of the 9,663 arrests in 1973, representing 94.7 percent of the

total. Juveniles represented 2,648 or 27.4 percent of the 1973 arrests and Adults made up 7,015 or 72.6 percent. Whites accounted for 1,576 or 16.3 percent and Blacks or Negroes represented 7,555 or 78.2 percent of the arrests, while the remaining arrests were distributed among the other races.

Property involved in committing Robbery amounted to \$4,762,721 in 1973. Out of the total value of property stolen, \$191,285 worth of property was recovered, and \$16,838 in property was destroyed. Property taken amounted to 3.4 percent of the total value of all property stolen in all Property Offenses. Table 19 provides an analysis of Robbery by Place or location of occurrence. The total offenses reported indicates 30,222 which is 915 offenses less than the Crime Index shows. The difference between 31,137 and 30,222 or 915 is made up of 719 offenses which were attempts and are not included. The remaining 196 offenses were not reported by law enforcement agencies for one reason or another, with respect to the property stolen, however, the offenses were reported as an offense only without property analysis. The large number of offenses occurring in the Unknown column is caused by the transition from the National Program to the State Program. The National Program does not require reporting the time of day when the crime occurred; the State Program does. It is expected that 1974 data will be more meaningful regarding

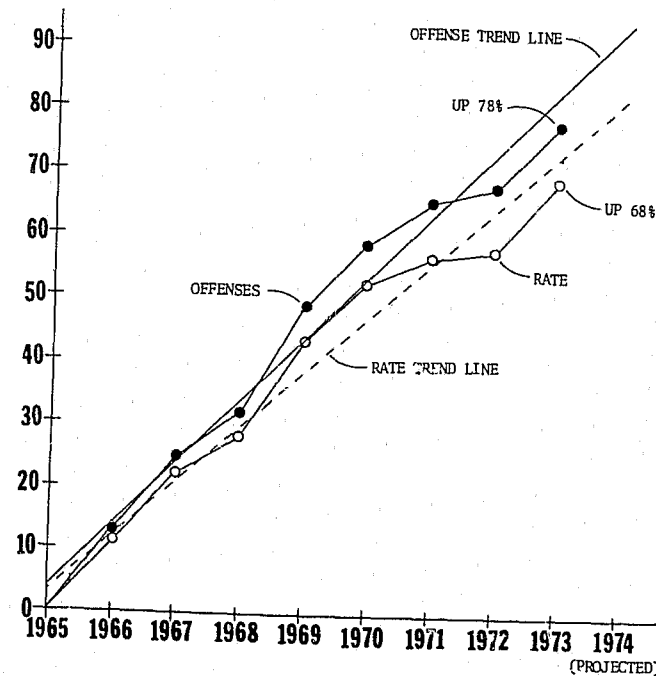

detailed breakdown of time occurred as well as places of occurrence to give more visibility in understanding Robbery offenses. In looking at the Table, Robbery occurrences on thoroughfares is highest at 50.5 percent of the total, followed by business place and private residences. The Unknown column means that the time of occurrence was not reported.

CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY

Included in this sub-category of the Crime Index is Burglary, Theft and Auto Theft. The National Program includes Robbery as mentioned previously. In addition to these three property crimes, the I-UCR Program includes Arson and Vandalism which will be considered separately in this section to avoid confusion between Index crimes and other crimes that are on the State Program.

Property crimes amounted to 418,581 incidents in 1973 compared to 371,793 in 1972, amounting to an increase of 46,788 offenses or 12.6 percent. The Crime Rate for Crimes Against Property was 3,723.5 offenses per 100,000 inhabitants in 1973, representing an increase of 12.5 percent over 1972. Property crimes accounted for 86.9 percent of the Crime Index offenses in 1973 and 86.6 percent in 1972, indicating only a slight increase in volume relative to the Index itself.

The total value of property stolen was \$135,890,632 in 1973 for these three offenses, compared to \$101,128,173 in 1972, amounting to an increase of 34.4 percent in 1973 over 1972. Property recovered amounted to \$59,643,385 in 1973, accounting for 43.9 percent of the property stolen. In 1972, property value recovered was \$36,261,900, representing 35.9 percent of the total property taken. The relative amount of property recovered increased by 64.5 percent in 1973 compared to 1972. Table 20 displays a summary of property offenses as related to the type crime and value of property.

Chart 3, depicts the long range trend of Crimes Against Property. This Crime Index for property crimes is up 77 percent over 1965 and the Crime Rate for property crimes is up 68 percent over 1965. The table below the graph represents the data plotted over the same period of time.

CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY ARRESTS

In 1973 there were 78,612 persons arrested for Crimes Against Property and 74,807 persons arrested in 1972, representing an increase of 5.1 percent in 1973 compared to 1972. Male arrestees accounted for 63,256 arrests in 1973, or 80.5 percent of the total persons arrested. Females accounted for 15,356 arrests or 19.5 percent in 1973. Juveniles made up 32,946 arrests or 41.9 percent and Adults accounted for 45,666 arrests or 58.1 percent. It should be noted that 41.9 percent of the persons arrested for property crimes were ju-

veniles, i.e., children 16 years of age and under, and 21.4 percent of the total persons arrested for violent crimes were juveniles. It is also known that whether the crime is serious or not juvenile statistics are not necessarily reported because such statistics are "sensitive." However, one can't begin solving a problem if the problem is not portrayed in perspective regarding the amount and extent of offenses committed by juveniles. Therefore, the statistics reported here for 1973 are understated for the Juvenile category of arrests. Concerning race statistics, Whites accounted for 38,103 persons arrested in 1973, or 48.5 percent, Blacks or Negroes accounted for 36,592 arrests or 46.6 percent of the total arrests made for Crimes Against Property, and the remaining arrests were distributed among the other races as indicated in Tables 21 and 22.

BURGLARY

The crime of Burglary is defined in the Illinois Revised Statutes-1973, Chapter 38, Section 19-1, as:

19-1. § Burglary. A person commits burglary when without authority he knowingly enters or without authority remains within a building, house trailer, watercraft, aircraft, motor vehicle as defined in The Illinois Vehicle Code, railroad car, or any part thereof, with intent to commit therein a felony or theft.

The National Program does include in its defini-

tion of Burglary, Burglary from Vehicles, such as, autos, trucks, trailers, aircraft; etc., and in order to be consistent with the National Program this Statute had to be divided between Burglary from Building or Structure and Burglary from Vehicle in order to collect and disseminate statistics by State Law. The I-UCR Program has two categories of Burglary; viz., Burglary from Vehicle and Burglary. The Burglary from Vehicle is treated as a Theft on the National level in the Index Crime called Theft/Larceny. Therefore, when reviewing the Crime Index one should understand what type of offenses defined by State law make up the various categories of the Crime Index.

Burglaries (not Burglary from Vehicle) accounted for 114,803 offenses in 1973, representing an increase in volume of 20,007 offenses over 1972 or an increase of 21.1 percent. Chart 3.1 shows the long term trend beginning with 1965 as the base year. The number of offenses increased by 96 percent over 1965 and the Crime Rate for Burglary increased by 86 percent over the same period of time. In 1973, 73.9 percent of the burglaries were committed by forcible entries, representing 84,852 offenses. Unlawful entries amounted to 20,937 offenses or 18.2 percent of the total burglaries. Included in Burglary Index Crimes are Attempts to commit burglary, amounting to 9,014 offenses or 7.9 percent of the total offenses.

The clearance rate (number of crimes solved/total crimes occurred) for Burglary in 1973 was 19 per-

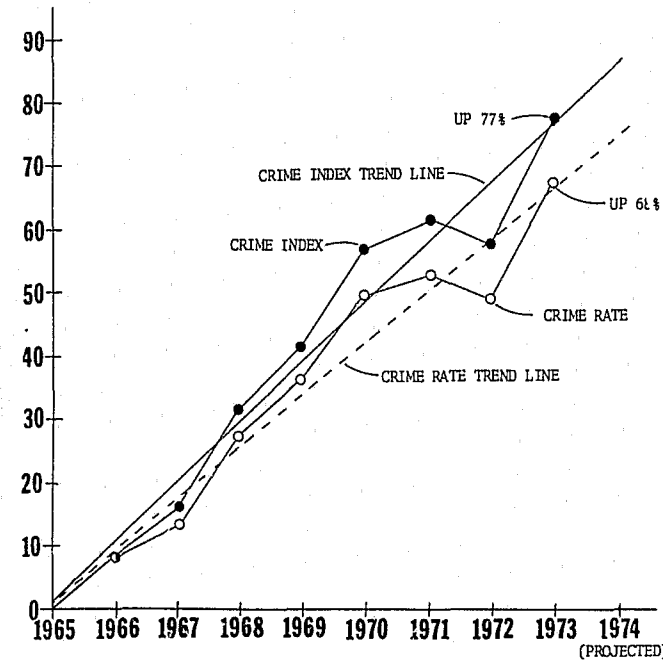

cent, the same as the National average. This low figure, of course, is not satisfactory to the law enforcement community. Burglary requires concentrated effort within each community to develop programs that will severely reduce and prevent burglaries from occurring. The Illinois-Uniform Crime

Reporting Program is assisting law enforcement agencies through the analysis of this and other crimes in terms of beat analysis, time of day of occurrence, analysis of persons arrested and residency, stolen property and location analysis; etc.

BURGLARY ARRESTS

In 1973, there were 19,355 persons arrested for Burglary and 17,425 persons arrested in 1972, representing an increase of 11.1 percent. Males represented 96.2 percent of the persons arrested in 1973, and Females accounted for 3.8 percent. Table 23 also shows that Adults represented 56.0 percent of the persons arrested for Burglary in 1973, and Juveniles made up 44.0 percent. In the Juvenile area the age group ranged from 10 years of age to 16 years of age, with the highest number arrested in this group being 14 year olds with 2,277 persons arrested, representing 27 percent of all Juveniles arrested. Juvenile arrests for Burglary increased by 16.7 percent in 1973 over 1972. (See Table 24) The race distribution showed Whites accounting for 9,252 arrestees or 47.8 percent, Blacks or Negroes made up 8,841 persons arrested or 45.7 percent, while the remaining 6.5 percent was distributed among all other races, as Table 23 indicates.

STOLEN AND RECOVERED PROPERTY—BURGLARY

In 1973, Burglary accounted for \$40,539,111 worth of stolen property, representing an increase over 1972 of \$7,908,626 or 24.2 percent. Recovered property amounted to \$3,668,802 or 9.1 percent in 1973. The percent recovered in 1972 represented 5.7 percent of the total property stolen. The amount of stolen property recovered in 1973 increased 71.9 percent over 1972, which is a trend in the right direction.

Table 25 displays places where burglaries occurred in 1973, by time of day and percent distribution. The total burglaries that occurred in residences represented 54.4 percent of 56,118 incidences. Day time burglary from residence occurred 46.3 percent, Night time burglary from residence occurred 32.5 percent of the time and 21.2 percent were unknown; i.e., the person was away from home and upon discovery of missing property or a forcible entry the victim could not tell investigating officers when the crime occurred. However, what is noteworthy is the high percent of Day time burglaries of residences. This simply means that persons committing these acts are aware that occupants are at work, on vacation, out of town, etc. This situation in turn raises the question how to

prevent burglaries; i.e., what can the home owner or occupant do in cooperation with the police to prevent residential burglaries. The presence of the occupant does reduce burglary incidents. For example, referring to Table 25; Business Places represent 22.3 percent of all places where burglary occurs. Day time burglaries of business places occurs 20.8 percent of the time, which is just the reverse of burglaries from residences which accounts for 21.2 percent at Night time. When the business place is open during the Day burglaries are obviously minimized, and when the residents are at home at Night time in most cases, burglaries are minimized.

Type property stolen, recovered or destroyed related to Burglary is presented in Table 26. Currency

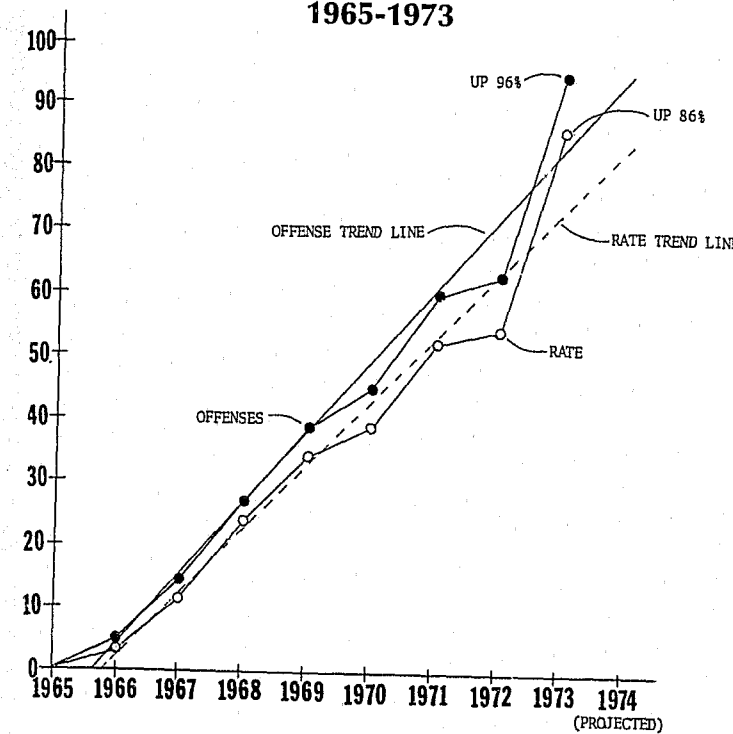
ranked highest in number of offenses and property value stolen, followed by the value of jewelry however the number of offenses was relatively low compared to currency. Jewelry, for example, had a property value of \$1,545 (approximately) per offense, whereas currency was valued at \$286 per offense committed in 1973. Appliances represent \$361 per offense; Furnishings \$512 per offense, Audio Visual Equipment \$530 per offense, etc.

It should be noted that the total offenses presented in Tables 25 and 26, are not equal to the total Burglaries reported on the Crime Index. The reason for the discrepancy is that Attempts are not included in the Property Analysis and are included in Index Offenses.

BURGLARY FROM MOTOR VEHICLE

It was mentioned previously that the National Program requires that burglaries from vehicles be recorded as a theft. However, our State Statutes do not permit this. To accommodate both the State and National requirements, a separate offense code is used to record these offenses. Translation of State data into the National Program crime definitions require merging Burglary From Motor Vehicle into the Theft category of the Crime Index. Therefore, when reviewing Index data, it should be remembered that Index Crimes do not necessarily

relate to Illinois Criminal Law as was mentioned previously under Aggravated Assault. Consequently, data related to Theft as defined by the National Program will have burglary from motor vehicle data included. However, a separate analysis of this specific crime will be presented in the following section.

THEFT

Theft is defined in the Illinois Criminal Code, Chapter 38, Section 16-1 as:

16-1. Theft. A person commits theft when he knowingly:

- (a) Obtains or exerts unauthorized control over property of the owners; or
- (b) Obtains by deception control over property of the owner; or
- (c) Obtains by threat control over property of the owner; or
- (d) Obtains control over stolen property knowing the property to have been stolen by another or under such circumstances as would reasonably induce him to believe that the property was stolen, and

- (1) Intends to deprive the owner permanently of the use or benefit of the property; or
- (2) Knowingly uses, conceals or abandons the property in such manner as to deprive the owner permanently of such use or benefit; or
- (3) Uses, conceals, or abandons the property knowing such use, concealment or abandonment probably will deprive the owner permanently of such use or benefit.

Included in the figures that follow is burglary from motor vehicle which will be treated separately within this section.

The number of Thefts that occurred in 1973 was 246,002 representing 51.0 percent of the Index Crimes and 58.8 percent of Crimes Against Property. Theft increased 8.2 percent over 1972, causing a corresponding increase in the Theft Crime Rate of 1973 amounting to 2,188.3 offenses per 100,000 inhabitants or an 8.1 percent increase over 1972. Thefts over \$150 (a class 3 felony) accounted for 20.4 percent of the total thefts and 77.7 percent of the offenses reported were under \$150. Attempts accounted for the remaining offenses reported.

The total offenses that were cleared (solved) amounted to 58,877 giving a Clearance Rate of approximately 24 percent, which was slightly higher than the national average.

Theft offenses increased 79 percent over the base

year of 1965 as illustrated in Chart 3.2, and the Crime Rate for Theft increased 69 percent over the same eight year period. Specific data by year is presented in the table below the chart showing a nine year history of theft offenses and rate per 100,000 inhabitants.

THEFT ARRESTS

There were 53,341 persons arrested for theft in 1973 representing an increase of 3.5 percent over 1972. Males accounted for 73.1 percent of the total persons arrested for theft in 1973 and 79.9 percent in 1972 according to Table 27. Females made up 20.1 percent in 1972 and 26.9 percent in 1973, indicating a 33.8 percent increase in female arrests for theft in 1973 compared to 1972.

Adults accounted for 31,120 arrests or 58.3 percent in 1973, and Juveniles represented 22,221 or 41.7 percent. Whites made up 49.1 percent of the persons arrested and Blacks or Negroes accounted for 46.6 percent with the remaining arrests distributed among all other races.

The crime of theft accounted for \$26,033,536 in stolen property in 1973, representing an increase of 17.7 percent over 1972. The average dollar value per offense was approximately \$112 in 1972 and \$122 per offense in 1973.

PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED

Purse snatching increased from 9,959 incidents in 1972 to 10,670 offenses in 1973 representing an increase of 7.1 percent. The value of property taken in purse snatchings was \$448,411 in 1972 and \$553,491 in 1973. Shoplifting made up 24,051 offenses in 1973 which amounted to \$862,990, and in 1972 shoplifting accounted for 21,719 offenses and \$614,195 in property stolen. There were 2,084 cases of pocket picking in 1972 amounting to \$160,752 in property taken, and 2,432 cases occurred in 1973 with a property stolen value of \$216,007.

Table 28 presents places where theft offenses occurred by Day, Night and Unknown. Note that 40.4 percent of the offenses indicated in the last column is Other, meaning that a place category was not listed or some agencies simply didn't score the proper place. The largest percent of offenses that occurred were unknown as to when the theft took place and they didn't occur in any of the places listed. Therefore, 76,701 theft offenses occurred somewhere other than the places listed and the time of occurrence was unknown, representing 35.8 percent of the incidences that occurred during 1973. In relation to time when offenses occurred, 25.8 percent occurred during the day time, 20.6 percent during the night time and the remaining were unknown. Residences were highest in places where offenses occurred accounting for 29,706 events or 13.8 percent, followed by Buildings making up 10.3 percent, Business Places at 8.0 percent, Highway-Streets-Alleys, etc., accounting for 6.4 percent, Chain Stores representing 5.8 percent; etc.

The type property being taken by Day, Night and Unknown with value of property stolen, recovered and destroyed is displayed in Table 29. Bicycle offenses accounted for 39,318 incidents, representing 18.3 percent of all offenses, amounting to \$52 per offense. Currency had the highest value of stolen property, averaging out at \$184 stolen per offense. Auto Parts rank high in value with a total of 31,939 offenses occurring, representing \$40 per offense on the average.

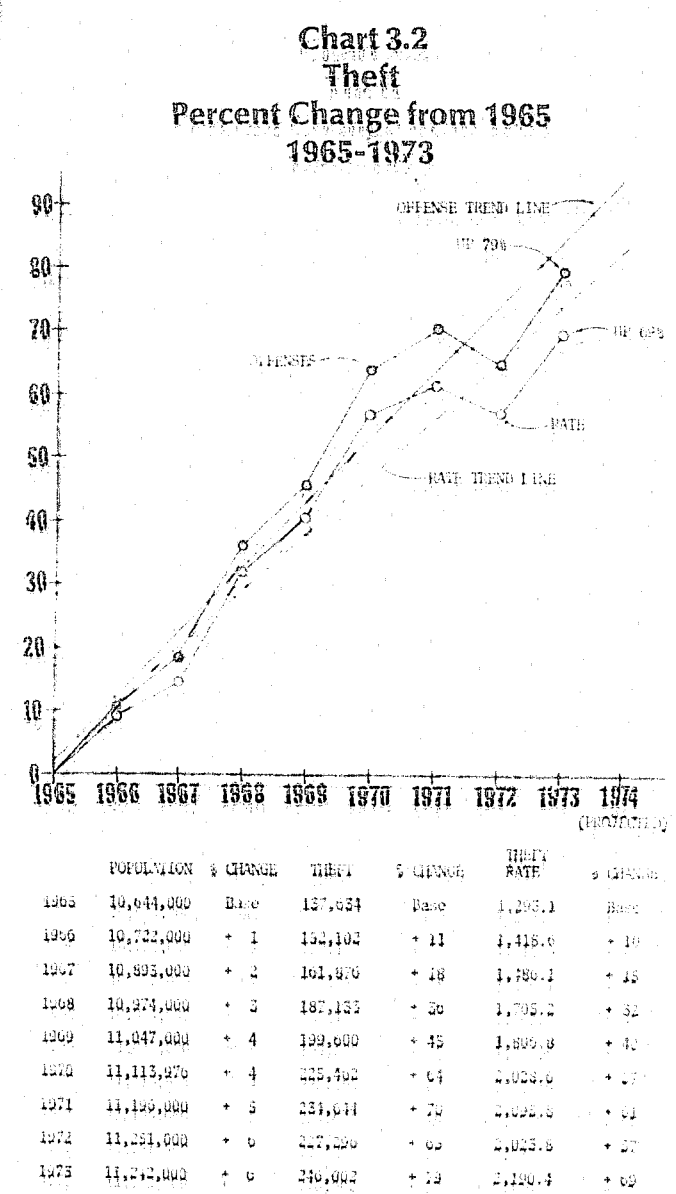
The following is an analysis of Burglary from Vehicle. It was mentioned before that the offenses collected against this portion of the Burglary Statute are translated into the Theft classification of the National Uniform Crime Reporting Program. Therefore, the 246,002 offenses reported for Theft also include Burglary from Vehicle. However, all property analysis statistics, such as Table 29, discussed above only pertain to Theft by State statute. Consequently, the following discussion regarding

property involvement in committing Burglary from Vehicle is separate and distinct from the data presented under Theft.

BURGLARY FROM VEHICLE
 In 1973, law enforcement agencies, other than the City of Chicago, reported 25,686 Burglaries from Vehicle, representing an 11.4 percent increase over 1972. The value of property stolen from motor vehicles in 1973 was \$3,623,004, and in 1972 the property value amounted to \$3,115,257, which indicates an increase of 16.3 percent in 1973 compared to 1972.

Table 30 displays the place associated with the vehicle at which the offense occurred by time of day and percent distribution. Parking lots account for the highest number of offenses, making up 32.8 percent of the total; followed by highways-streets-alleys; etc., which accounted for 27.0 percent of the total offenses. It was mentioned previously that the total offenses that occurred in 1973 as shown in this table will not be equal to the number of offenses indicated above (25,686) because Attempts are not included since property was taken.

Forty-one categories of property types are provided in the I-UCR Program to obtain as much specific data as possible for planning and research purposes. Table 31, presents detailed information regarding the kind of property stolen from vehicles (autos, trucks, trailers, etc.) and the value of each type property. Tape Decks stand out as the highest followed by Auto Parts, Tape Recorders, etc. Note also, the number of firearms obtained in committing this offense.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT
 Motor Vehicle Thefts rose from 49,701 offenses in 1972, to 57,776 offenses in 1973, representing an increase of 8,075 offenses or 16.2 percent in 1973 over 1972. The Clearance Rate (cases closed or solved divided by total offenses occurred) for 1972 was 22 percent and in 1973 it was 19 percent, a decrease in Clearance Rate of 14.6 percent in 1973 compared to 1972.

Motor Vehicle Theft accounts for 12.0 percent of the Index Crimes and 13.8 percent of Crimes Against Property. The Crime Rate for Motor Vehicle was 513.9 offenses per 100,000 inhabitants in 1973, indicating an increase of 16.1 percent over 1972. Motor Vehicle Thefts increased by 43 percent in 1973 over 1965 as indicated in Chart 3.3. The Crime Rate is up 35 percent in 1973 over 1965. Specific information by year is contained in the table below the chart for your convenience and comparison purposes.

VEHICLE THEFT ARRESTS
 Persons arrested for Motor Vehicle Theft in 1973 amounted to 5,916 arrests, and in 1972, 6,066 arrests were made. Persons arrested for this offense declined by 2.5 percent in view of a 16.2 percent rise in Vehicle Theft offenses in 1973. Adults accounted for 3,717 arrests in 1973 and Juveniles 2,199, representing 62.8 percent and 37.2 percent respectively. Whites accounted for 44.6 percent of the arrests in 1973, Blacks or Negroes represented 49.3 percent, the remaining arrests were distributed among the other races. Juveniles and Adults, and racial relationships were about the same in 1972 as indicated in Tables 32 and 33.

PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED
 The Stolen Value of Vehicles amounted to \$65,

694,981 representing an increase of 51.7 percent over 1972. Value recovered amounted to \$49,538,715 in 1973, accounting for 75.4 percent of the total Value Stolen. In 1972, 68.5 percent of the total value of vehicles was recovered. Table 34, displays the locations of vehicles when they were stolen. The percent distribution column of total offenses committed indicates 12.7 percent were stolen when parked on highways, streets and alleys, followed by 10.2 percent stolen from parking lots, new and used car lots, and finally 4.4 percent from residences. The place called Other accounted for 68.9 percent which means that vehicles were stolen from places other than those listed and a certain amount of the 68.9 percent were not recorded properly.

VANDALISM

The term Vandalism is used in the National Program and includes a broad range of malicious behavior, such as; cutting auto tires, drawing obscene pictures on public restroom walls, smashing windows, destroying school records, etc. The Illinois-Uniform Crime Reporting Program includes the following State Statutes quoted from Chapter 38 of the Illinois Revised Statutes:

21-1. Criminal Damage to Property. Any of the following acts shall be a Class A misdemeanor and any act enumerated in sub-section (a) or (f) when the damage to property exceeds \$150 shall be a Class 4 felony;

- (a) Knowingly damages any property of another without his consent; or
- (b) Recklessly by means of fire or explosive damages property of another; or
- (c) Knowingly starts a fire on the land of another without his consent; or
- (d) Knowingly injures a domestic animal of another without his consent; or
- (e) Knowingly deposits on the land or in the building of another, without his consent, any stink bomb or any offensive smelling com-

pound and thereby intends to interfere with the use by another of the land or building.

(f) Damages any property, other than property described in Sub-section 20-1(3), with intent to defraud an insurer.

For statistical analysis purposes this Statute is divided into parts; viz., (1) Criminal Damage to Property and (2) Criminal Damage to Vehicle.

21-4. § 21-4. Criminal Damage to State Supported Property. Any of the following acts is a Class A misdemeanor when the damage to property is \$500 or less, and any such act is a Class 4 felony when the damage to property exceeds \$500:

(a) Knowingly damages any property supported in whole or in part with State funds or Federal funds administered or granted through State agencies without the consent of the State; or

(b) Knowingly, by means of fire or explosive damages property supported in whole or in part with State funds or Federal funds administered or granted through State agencies; or

(c) Knowingly starts a fire on property supported in whole or in part with State funds or Federal funds administered or granted through State agencies without the consent of the State; or

(d) Knowingly deposits on land or in a building supported in whole or in part with State funds, or Federal funds administered or granted through State agencies without the consent of the State, any stink bomb or any offensive smelling compound and thereby intends to interfere with the use by another of the land or building.

Offenses that occur in accordance with these two Statutes is equivalent to the National Program's Vandalism. It should be understood that the following statistics are **not** part of the Crime Index offenses, and are presented because of general in-

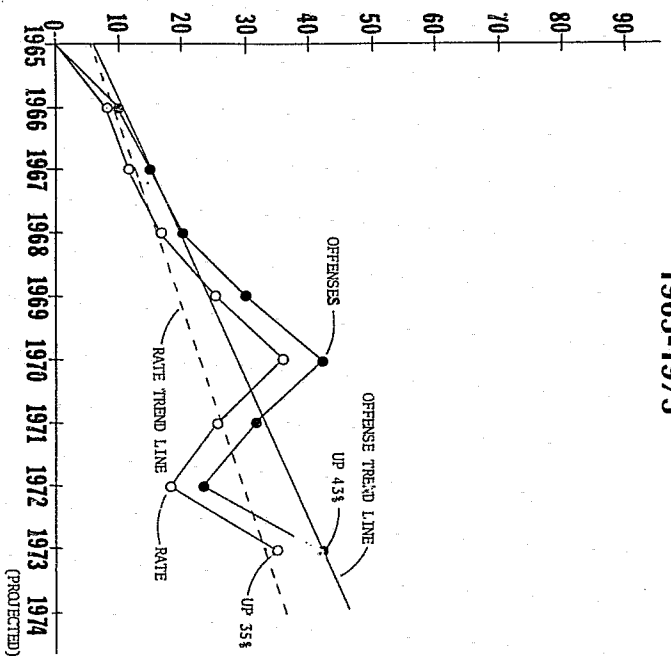

In 1973, 84,255 offenses of Vandalism were reported, representing a 30.6 percent increase over 1972. Out of the 84,255 offenses reported by law enforcement agencies in 1973, 51,418 were reported with value of property destroyed and type place attacked. The property value destroyed in 1973 increased from \$2,510,895 to \$4,585,603, representing an 82.6 percent increase in 1973 over 1972. Property is destroyed in other property crimes such as burglary, theft, auto theft, arson, etc., however, these offenses are specific for criminal damage to property which is mostly malicious and intentional.

Table 35, displays places where vandalism takes place by Day, Night and Unknown time. The percent distribution shows that residences were attacked 34.2 percent of times when criminal damage to property occurred, followed by thoroughfares, business places and parking areas.

Arresting persons committing the crime is as difficult as apprehending a thief or burglar. The clearance rate (offenses or cases cleared divided by total offenses that occurred) was 18 percent in 1973 about the same as burglary, larceny and vehicle theft. Put another way 71,148 of the 84,255 cases that occurred remained unsolved. For all property crimes reported (burglary, theft, vehicle theft and vandalism) which amounted to 502,836 cases, approximately 90,510 were cleared or solved, leaving 412,326 crimes unsolved.

VANDALISM ARRESTS

The number of persons arrested for vandalism in 1973 was 13,264 and in 1972 there were 15,308, representing a decrease of 13.3 percent in 1973 over 1972. Males accounted for most arrests made in 1973, representing 93.6 percent of the total persons arrested, and in 1972, males represented 91.9 percent of the total arrests that year. Adults accounted for 5,284 persons arrested for vandalism in 1973, making up 39.8 percent, whereas juveniles represented 60.2 percent. In 1972, juveniles accounted for approximately the same percentage, representing 59.1 percent of the total persons arrested. Tables 36 and 37 show the distribution of persons arrested in 1973 and 1972 by sex, race, juvenile and adult age groups for comparison purposes.

CRIME INDEX 1973/1972

In this section of the report, the Crime Index is displayed for all law enforcement agencies, showing 1973 compared to 1972. The first table, Table 38, is in alphabetical order by county and law enforcement jurisdiction within county. Some of the agencies have a numeric indicator preceding the year. The meaning of the numeric indicators is located at the bottom of each page. The indicator, number 1—One Or More Months Data Missing, means that the indicated agency did not submit one or more of the required monthly reports for one reason or another. Number 2, No Index Crimes, means that the agency submitted all reports but didn't experience an Index Crime throughout the year. Number 3—No Return From Agency, means that the agency did not submit any of the required reports for the year indicated. Numeric indicator number 4—Reported Thru Other Agency, means that the agency submitted incidents of crime primarily through the Sheriff Office. Agencies that report in this manner are very small part-time agencies.

It was mentioned in the Introduction that there are many social factors that are related to crime. In making community comparisons these contributing factors must be considered in addition to the community's residential population which is used to calculate the Crime Rate. Communities like Bedford Park and McCook in Cook County have very small populations but have a very large moving population because they are manufacturing areas.

Likewise, Rosemont in Cook County is located adjacent to O'Hare Airport and has a relatively large transient population due to the number of motels within the jurisdiction. As a consequence these large moving populations attract criminal behavior that occurs within these small jurisdictions, and therefore must be reported by each of the law enforcement agencies. The Crime Rate calculation does not compensate for a moving population and when one reads Index material it appears that the crimes are committed by the residents of the community which is not necessarily the case. In conclusion, caution should be exercised when reviewing and using these data.

The last page of the Crime Index shown in Table 38, contains three totals; viz., State Totals, Sheriffs (not county) and Police Departments. The State Total indicates a 12.2 percent increase in Index Crimes in 1973 compared to 1972. The Sheriffs total shows a 16 percent increase in crime and Police Departments accounted for a 11.9 percent increase in crime in 1973 over 1972. The 16 percent increase indicated by the Sheriffs total is not necessarily indicative of an increase in Rural Crime to this extent, as Rural areas are defined by the U.S. Bureau of Census which will be discussed shortly in this section. Table 41A displays annual 1973 statistics reported by Universities and Colleges.

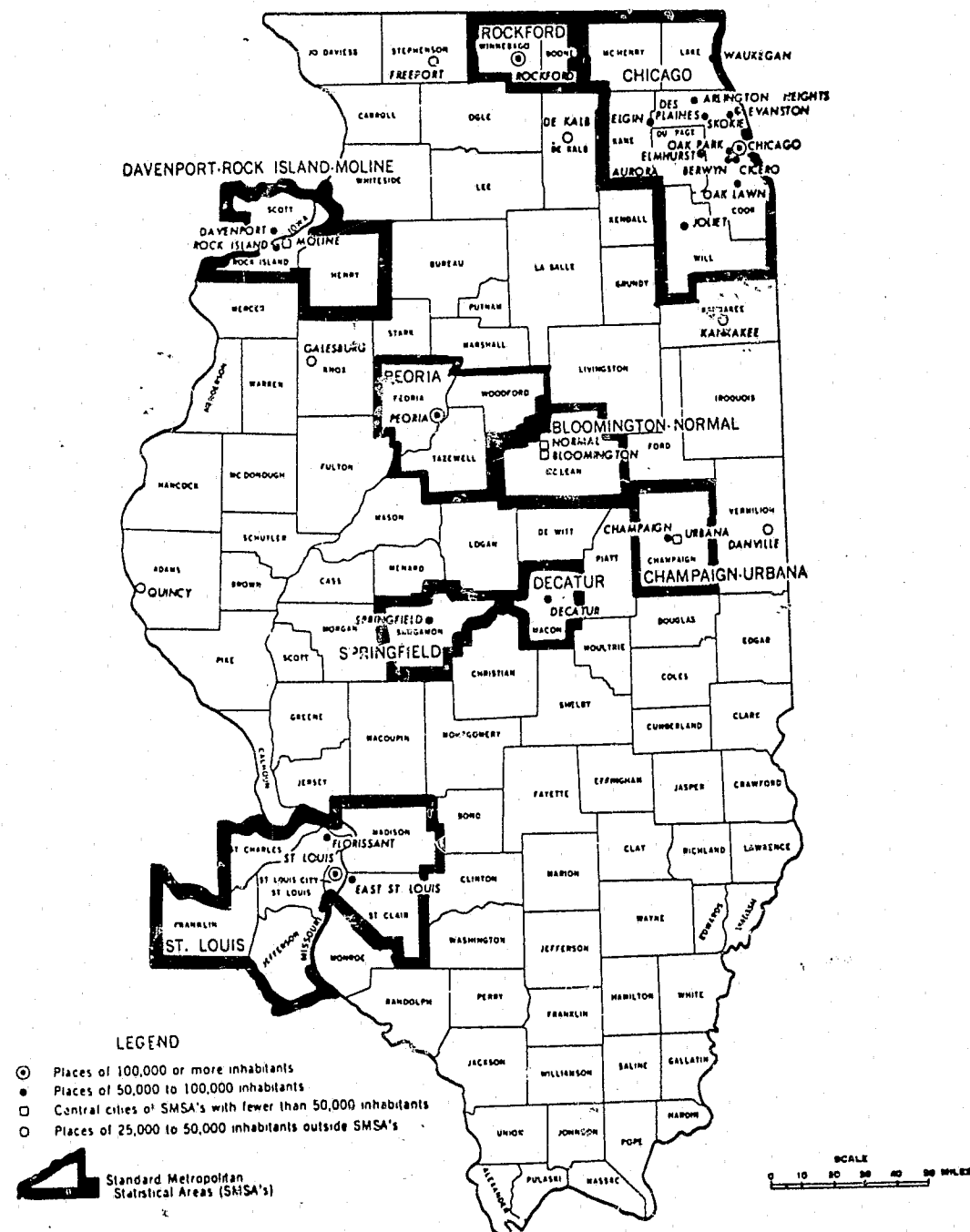

Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA)

Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA's) are defined by the U.S. Bureau of the Census as follows:

A **Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area (SMSA)** includes a city of more than 50,000 and the county in which the city is located plus other cities which exhibit strong ties with the city. The county sheriff's office is also included for crime reporting purposes.

A **core city** is within an SMSA and has a population of more than 50,000 or more inhabitants. In certain SMSA's, there are "twin central cities" that have a combined population of 50,000 or more inhabitants and together are considered a core city.

The **suburban area** consists of cities and towns with 50,000 or less population including the counties which are within the SMSA. The county sheriff's office is included in the suburban area.

The **rural area** is the unincorporated portion of a county outside of the SMSA's. For Illinois-Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, the rural area is composed of the sheriff's jurisdiction outside of the SMSA's.

The **other cities** are urban places outside of the SMSA's. For Illinois-Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, these are cities and towns outside the SMSA's, surrounded by rural areas that are not under the jurisdiction of the county sheriff's offices.

Figure 2 is a map of Illinois with the SMSA's outlined with heavy lines. Two of the SMSA's overlap with Iowa and Missouri. Areas outside of the State that are included in an SMSA are deleted from the statistics about to be presented. Menard and Clinton counties have been added to the Springfield and St. Louis SMSA's respectively. However, crime statistics for these two counties are not included in their respective SMSA's for this reporting period (1973) in order to maintain the present trend analysis. In 1974, all statistics reported for previous years will be adjusted for continuity purposes.

SMSA SUMMARY

All seven crime categories making up the Crime index increased in 1973 compared to 1972. Table 42 represents summary statistics for 1973 versus 1972 for all SMSA's in Illinois as defined above. The SMSA estimated population was 9,015,914 in 1973, accounting for 80.2 percent of the State population, and 91.7 percent of the State's Crime Index for 1973. Burglary represented the highest percent change with a 22.8 percent increase in 1973 over 1972, followed by Murder and Voluntary

Manslaughter indicating a 20.3 percent increase and finally, Motor Vehicle Theft was up 16.5 percent in 1973.

SMSA CORE CITY SUMMARY

Core Cities are included in SMSA's and account for 5,001,410 inhabitants or 55.5 percent of the total SMSA population and 44.5 percent of the State population. Core Cities also accounted for 69.1 percent of the total SMSA Index Crimes and 63.3 percent of State Index Crimes in 1973. Core Cities accounted for 88.3 percent of the Murders and Voluntary Manslaughters committed within SMSA's and represented 85.0 percent of the total Murders and Voluntary Manslaughters that occurred in the State in 1973. Particularly, noteworthy are the figures on Robbery. The Core cities accounted for 91.6 percent of the Robberies within SMSA's and 90.0 percent of the total Robberies that occurred in the State in 1973. Table 43 provides other informative statistics in contrast with Table 42. An analysis of the suburbs will shed more light on this subject.

SMSA SUBURBAN SUMMARY

Suburban areas like Core Cities fall within the SMSA. The suburbs are bounded by the SMSA lines by definition and outside the Core Cities. Total Suburban areas accounted for 4,014,504 estimated inhabitants in 1973, and represented 44.5 percent of the SMSA population and 35.7 percent of the total State population. The Crime Index increased 13.9 percent in the suburbs in 1973 with Burglary representing the highest increase followed by Motor Vehicle Theft, Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter and Robbery in that order. Table 44 presents summary comparison statistics for 1973 and 1972.

RURAL AREA SUMMARY

Rural Areas had a 9.0 percent increase in the Crime Index in 1973 which was attributed by the relatively large increase in Theft and Motor Vehicle Theft as indicated in Table 45. All Crimes Against Persons show a sizeable decrease excepting the small increase in Aggravated Assaults and Batteries. Rural Areas accounted for 10.0 percent of the Illinois inhabitants and 2.7 percent of the total Index Crimes. To keep crime statistics in perspective, the index crimes per 100,000 inhabitants or the Crime Rate was 1154.7 for Rural Areas in 1973, 2,457.8 for Other Cities (discussed below), 3,402.5 for Suburban Areas and 6,103.9 for Core Cities. Statistics are being collected in 1974 to determine the mobility of offenders by using a residential code for persons arrested. That is, when a person is arrested by a jurisdiction his place of residence is reported along with other arrest data.

This statistical measurement should indicate crime over-reach from Core Cities into the Suburbs and Rural Areas as well as point to concentrated crime impact programs in a Core City without considering the shifting of crime to more vulnerable and fruitful areas.

OTHER CITIES SUMMARY

The Other Cities area consists of 196 cities outside of the SMSA's and within the Rural Areas. These cities account for 9.8 percent of the State's inhabitants and 5.6 percent of the Index Crimes for

1973. Even though the Other Cities population is comparable to the Rural Areas, they experienced an increase in crime in every Crime Index category and consequently the Crime Rate is more than twice the Rural Area. Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter ranks highest in percent change, followed

by Theft, Burglary and Robbery. One basic difference between the Other Cities and Rural is population density and the opportunity to commit a crime is greater in the cities than Rural Areas. Table 46 provides additional information for comparison purposes at the summary level.

Illinois-Uniform Crime Reports

1973 OFFENSE SUMMARY

Comprehensive crime statistical data is presented in this part of *Crime In Illinois*. Tables 47 and 48 represent offense data summarized to the State level. The first column contains the four digit offense code structure related to the Illinois Revised Statutes. The second column entitled Offense Classification, contains the descriptors of each offense code. If some of the descriptors seem to be over-abbreviated, refer to the Introduction where the offense code structure is completely typed with Statute reference numbers. The third column is Offenses Known to Police. The fourth column, Unfounded with sub-columns, number and % means that after investigation of offenses reported to the police, it was determined that a crime didn't occur. The percent column is calculated by dividing the number of unfounded offenses by the offenses known to the police. It is of interest to law enforcement agencies to maintain cognizance of the number of calls for service that come in and actually didn't occur. The fifth column—Referred to Responsible Jurisdiction—means that a jurisdiction was called about an incident, but it was found that the incident location is beyond their jurisdiction, and hence the call is referred to the agency having jurisdiction. Column six—Offenses actually occurred is calculated by adding columns four and five (Unfounded and Referred to Other Jurisdiction) and subtracting this quantity from the Offenses Known to the Police. These are the offenses that the police pursued with investigation and solution, and are used in the Crime Index.

The next group of columns is headed—Offenses Cleared and contains four major columns and eight sub-columns. The first four sub-columns present statistics relating to exceptional clearances. A case is cleared exceptionally when:

1. The investigation has definitely established the identity of the offender, and
2. There is sufficient information to support and arrest, charge, and turn over to the court for prosecution, and
3. The agency knows the exact location of the offender so that he could be taken into custody, and
4. There is some reason outside of police control that stops the police from arresting, charging and prosecuting the offender.

Some examples of exceptional clearances are:

1. Suicide of the offender (the person responsible is dead).
2. Double murder (two persons kill each other).
3. Deathbed confession (the person responsible dies after making a confession).
4. Offender killed by police or citizen.

5. Confession by offender already in custody or serving sentence.
6. An offender prosecuted in another city for a different offense by State or local authorities or prosecuted in another city or State by the Federal Government for an offense which may be the same.
7. Extradition is denied.
8. The victim refuses to cooperate in the prosecution.
9. For some reason outside of the agency's control, an offender is prosecuted for a less serious charge than that for which you arrested him.
10. The handling of a juvenile offender either orally or by written notice to parents in instances involving minor offenses such as petty larceny. No referral is made to juvenile court as a matter of publicly accepted policy.

It is recognized that departmental policy in various police agencies permit the discontinuance of investigation and closing administratively cases in which all investigation has been completed. **The administrative closing of a case or the "clearing" of it by departmental policy does not permit the offense to be cleared exceptionally. The recovery of property is not reason to clear a case for UCR purposes.** The clearance of a case for I-UCR purposes should have no effect on whether or not the agency's internal policies as to "closing" a case or discontinuing active investigation on a case.

The column—Failed to File a Complaint is of particular interest to law enforcement agencies and is therefore separate from all other reasons for exceptional clearances. Failing to File a Complaint means that the victim refuses to cooperate with the prosecution. For example, there were 25,228 cases exceptionally cleared because the victim refused to cooperate with the prosecution in 1973. This represents 3.2 percent of the total incidents that occurred. All other reasons for exceptionally clearing a case are included in the "other" column.

Offenses cleared by arrest is self-explanatory. Each of the clearance columns is divided into adult and juvenile. The last column of the Offense Summary gives the total clearances (total of exceptionally cleared and cleared by arrest). The clearance rate is defined as:

$$\text{CLEARANCE RATE} = \frac{\text{(Column 10) TOTAL OFFENSES CLEARED}}{\text{(Column 6) ACTUAL OFFENSES OCCURRED}} \times 100$$

This report is produced for each reporting agency and is summarized to the county and state levels. The Crime Index presented in the previous section for each agency is developed from this basic report. For example, Attempted Murder (0121, 0122,

0123 and 0124), Aggravated Battery (0410, 0420, 0430 and 0440) and Aggravated Assault (0510, 0520, 0530, and 0540), added together makes up the Aggravated Assault category of the Crime Index of the National Program. The data is kept separate by State Statute in the I-UCR Program because the Statutes describe significantly different criminal behavior and are handled differently by the police and the prosecution as well as all other criminal justice agencies.

At the end of the tables are five different totals that must be understood. The Grand Total means the total of all activity. The *Total means the total of incidents not necessarily included in National crime counts and are therefore subtracted for volume comparisons only with the National Program regarding all criminal activity. The Sub-Total (less *) is the total that should be used for comparison purposes. In addition, the Total Attempt to commit a crime are provided for information regarding incompleting crimes, followed by the Adjusted Total, which represents all activity less* and Attempts. We will use the Sub-Total (less *) for the 1973 versus 1972 comparison of crime trends referring to Tables 47 and 48.

In 1973, there were 892,859 incidents known to the law enforcement agencies, accounting for an increase of 11.4 percent over 1972. Thirteen percent of these were unfounded in both years leaving 778,128 incidents for investigation in 1973 and 692,550 in 1972. In 1973 there were 56,180 offenses Exceptionally Cleared, making up 7.2 percent of the Actual Offenses that occurred. In comparison with 1972 statistics, there were 45,893 offenses exceptionally cleared, representing 6.6 percent of the offenses that were found to have occurred after investigation. It follows then that there was a 22.4 percent increase in Exceptional Clearances in 1973 over 1972. The Clearance Rates for both 1973 and 1972 are indicated on the Sub-Total (less *) line in the last column of both Tables 47 and 48, which was 35 percent in 1973 and 38 percent in 1972. Therefore the percent of cases cleared by arrest or by exception declined in 1973 compared to 1972. The decrease in the percent of cases cleared was accounted for by the reduction of cases cleared by arrest from 31.1 percent in 1972 to 27.8 percent in 1973. Note that juvenile cases exceptionally cleared in 1973 were not recorded separately from adults. The adult columns represent both juvenile and adult.

OF PERSONS ARRESTED AND HELD FOR PROSECUTION OR RELEASED**

The total number of persons arrested in 1973 amounted to 504,975 and in 1972, 497,171 persons were arrested. In 1973 there were 504,975 persons arrested for criminal offenses representing an increase of 7,804 arrests in 1973 over 1972 in volume or 1.6 percent. Males represented 85.3 percent of the persons arrested in 1973 and females 14.7 percent. In 1972, males accounted for 85.5 percent of the total arrests and females 14.5 percent, which is approximately the same as 1973. Juveniles accounted for 23.6 percent of the arrests in 1973 and adults 76.4 percent. In 1972, juveniles represented 26.7 percent and adults 73.3 percent, again indicating only a slight difference in 1973 versus 1972. In 1973, 49.1 percent of the arrestees were 21 years of age and under. In this same period, persons 27 years of age and younger accounted for 67.7 percent of the persons arrested. The highest number of arrests out of all age groups was 16 year olds and at age 17 the numbers begin to drop off. Regarding race, Whites accounted for 267,955 of the arrests in 1973 or 53.1 percent, Blacks or Negroes accounted for 40.3 percent, and the remaining arrests were distributed among the other races as shown in Tables 49 and 50.

Based on the U.S. Bureau of Census figures for 1970, the Illinois population was 11,113,976. In 1970, the Bureau reported that Whites accounted for 86.4 percent of the population, Negroes represented 12.8 percent and all other races accounted for the remaining 0.8 percent. Using these same percentages for the 1973 estimated population of 11,242,000; Whites accounted for 9,713,087, Blacks or Negroes 1,438,975 and all other races 89,938. The Arrest Rate is defined the same as the Crime Rate as follows:

$$\text{ARREST RATE} = \frac{\text{TOTAL ARRESTS} \times 100,000}{\text{POPULATION}}$$

Using this formula, the Arrest Rate for Illinois in 1973 was,

$$\text{ARREST RATE} = \frac{504,975 \times 100,000}{11,242,000} = 4,494 \text{ per one hundred}$$

thousand inhabitants, and in 1972 the Arrest Rate was 4,419, representing an increase in 1973 of less than one percent.

Considering the White inhabitants only, the Arrest Rate for 1973 was;

$$\text{ARREST RATE} = \frac{267,955 \times 100,000}{9,713,087} = 2,759 \text{ per one hundred}$$

thousand White inhabitants. The Arrest Rate for Black or Negroes in 1973 was,

$$\text{ARREST RATE} = \frac{203,274 \times 100,000}{1,438,975} = 14,126 \text{ per one hundred}$$

thousand Black or Negro inhabitants and the Arrest Rate for all other races was 37,521 per one hundred thousand inhabitants. Other Arrest Rates may be calculated for each type of offense which is presented in Table 51, by using specific arrest data and the populations given above. For example, there were 30,819 persons arrested for Aggravated Battery in 1973. The Arrest Rate is calculated as follows:

$$\text{ARREST RATE} = \frac{30,819 \times 100,000}{11,242,000} = 274 \text{ per one hundred}$$

thousand inhabitants or the Arrest Rate for Disorderly Conduct was 1,398 per 100,000 inhabitants in 1973, for Adults the Arrest Rate was 1,262 and for Juveniles it was 136 per 100,000 inhabitants. Table 51 provides comprehensive arrest information for 1973. The 1972 data was published in **Crime In Illinois—1972** and is not presented here.

LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY INFORMATION

LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY INFORMATION

This section of Crime In Illinois contains information about law enforcement agencies, divided into three sections; Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted/Battered, Law Enforcement Employment Information and Other Law Enforcement Services.

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED—1973

There were four law enforcement officers killed in Illinois in 1973. Three Chicago police officers were killed by handguns and one Hillside police officer was killed by a knife. A summary of each case was provided by the FBI-UCR Group's publication, **Law Enforcement Officers Killed—1973**, and are presented below:

JANUARY

The Chicago, Illinois, Police Department reported a patrolman, white male 36 years of age, was shot and killed after making a traffic stop. The victim officer stopped a vehicle for a speeding violation. As he approached the automobile containing two male occupants, the victim officer was shot in the neck with a .38 caliber handgun. The victim officer returned the gunfire wounding one Negro subject 44 years of age. He was apprehended and charged with the killing. The second subject succeeded in escaping.

MARCH

While attempting to apprehend two robbery suspects, a patrolman, Negro male 41 years of age, of the Chicago, Illinois, Police Department was shot and killed. The patrolman, off-duty, was walking out of a bowling alley when he observed an individual being robbed by two subjects in a parking lot. The patrolman announced his identity and the subjects fled. One subject, a Negro male 22 years of age, took the robbery victim's automobile and fled down the street. The second subject, a Negro male 24 years of age, fled on foot. The patrolman entered his private vehicle and chased the subject in the stolen vehicle. Several blocks from the robbery scene, the patrolman was found lying next to his vehicle with a fatal chest wound. The stolen vehicle was smashed nearby and the subject had fled the scene on foot. Both subjects were subsequently apprehended and identified by the robbery victim.

AUGUST

The body of a patrolman of the Hillside, Illinois, Police Department was discovered in a shallow grave on property in Rhinelander, Wisconsin. The patrolman, white male 24 years of age, stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation in October, 1972. The victim patrolman radioed for assistance and upon

arrival, the backup unit found an empty patrol car and the area was deserted. Witnesses indicated the patrolman was abducted by two subjects in a late model vehicle. An autopsy revealed the patrolman had died from multiple stab wounds in the back. Investigation is continuing to identify the subjects.

SEPTEMBER

The Chicago, Illinois, Police Department advised that a patrolman, white male 35 years of age, was shot and killed while attempting to apprehend a subject who committed a robbery of a pedestrian on the street. The victim and two other officers approached the subject, announced their identities, and ordered the subject to surrender. Without warning, the subject allegedly fired a 9 millimeter handgun and hit the victim officer in the head. The other officers returned the gunfire. The subject, a Negro male 16 years of age, surrendered.

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS ASSAULTED/BATTERED

Table 52 is a summary of law enforcement officers killed or assaulted or battered. There are three major divisions in this table viz., (1) Type of Weapons Used, (2) Type of Assignment, and (3) Police Assaults/Batteries Cleared.

The type of weapon refers to the subject's use of a weapon to assault or batter a police officer. The type of assignment means deployment technique for patrol and answering calls. For example; one column is headed "2-man vehicle"—2 men were assigned to a vehicle and were assaulted or battered 1,168 times with this deployment technique. When a "1-man vehicle" is deployed with an assist from another "1-man vehicle" the assaults and batteries amount to 317 incidents. The last column of the table displays "cases cleared by arrest" by type activity. The table indicates that 2,225 cases were cleared by arrest out of 2,367 (first column total) cases that occurred or the clearance rate was 94.0 percent.

Item 15, "Time of Assault" is divided into AM and PM. Note that between the hours of 1001-1200 Midnight through 1201-0200 AM represents 736 incidents out of 2,367 or 31 percent of the incidents that occurred in this 4 hour span out of the 24 hour day. The table also shows that the highest frequency of occurrence in the Type Weapons area was when answering disturbance calls followed by Attempting Other Arrests, Traffic and Handling Prisoners.

LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYMENT INFORMATION

The total law enforcement personnel as of October, 1973, amounted to 31,428 employees. Part-time

employees were considered working half-time or less and are reflected in the totals as one-half person without carrying over fractional amounts. Part-time employees accounted for 2,437 employees or 7.8 percent. Civilians represented 4,002 employees or 12.7 percent of the total. Full-time employees (sworn officers) amounted to 26,209 employees or 83.4 percent of the total employees on the payroll in October of 1973. The police full-time employees represented 68.8 percent of the total.

Summary—1973

The percent of Civilian employees relative to Full-Time and equivalent Part-Time for the police was 11.2 percent. For the sheriffs, the percent Civilian employees represented 14.0 percent.

The number of employees per 1000 inhabitants for the police was 2.7. The National average was 2.4 police officers per 1000 inhabitants. Sheriffs had 1.3 employees per 1000 inhabitants. Law enforcement employees per 1000 inhabitants should not be used as it relates to the Index Crimes, because other crimes and many services performed by the

typical police or sheriff's office amounts to over 80 percent of their workload which usually remains unpublished. Again, each community should consider all the factors related to causes of crime and determine the role of the department relative to crime and services that are required.

Calculation of employees per 1000 inhabitants is accomplished by using this formula:

$$\text{EMPLOYMENT RATE} = \frac{\text{NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES} \times 1000}{\text{YOUR JURISDICTIONAL POPULATION}}$$

EXAMPLE:

Your department has 60 employees. What is the manpower ratio per 1000 inhabitants when your current population is 51,000 inhabitants?

$$\text{ER} = \frac{60 \times 1000}{51,000} = 1.76 \text{ or } 1.8/1000 \text{ inhabitants}$$

If you want the full-time sworn officers per 1000 inhabitants use the same formula and use the number of full-time officers that you have.

Specific law enforcement information is included in the following tables. Table 55 is a listing of police departments ranked by population. Table 56 is an alphabetical listing of Sheriff's Offices and related employment information. Following Table 56 is a list of Colleges and Universities that are on the I-UCR Program. Table 57 also shows location without a jurisdictional population. And Table 58 shows other law enforcement agencies that are on the I-UCR Program excepting the Illinois State Police. In 1975, 18 additional Park Districts and the Department of Conservation's Law Enforcement Division will be on the Program.

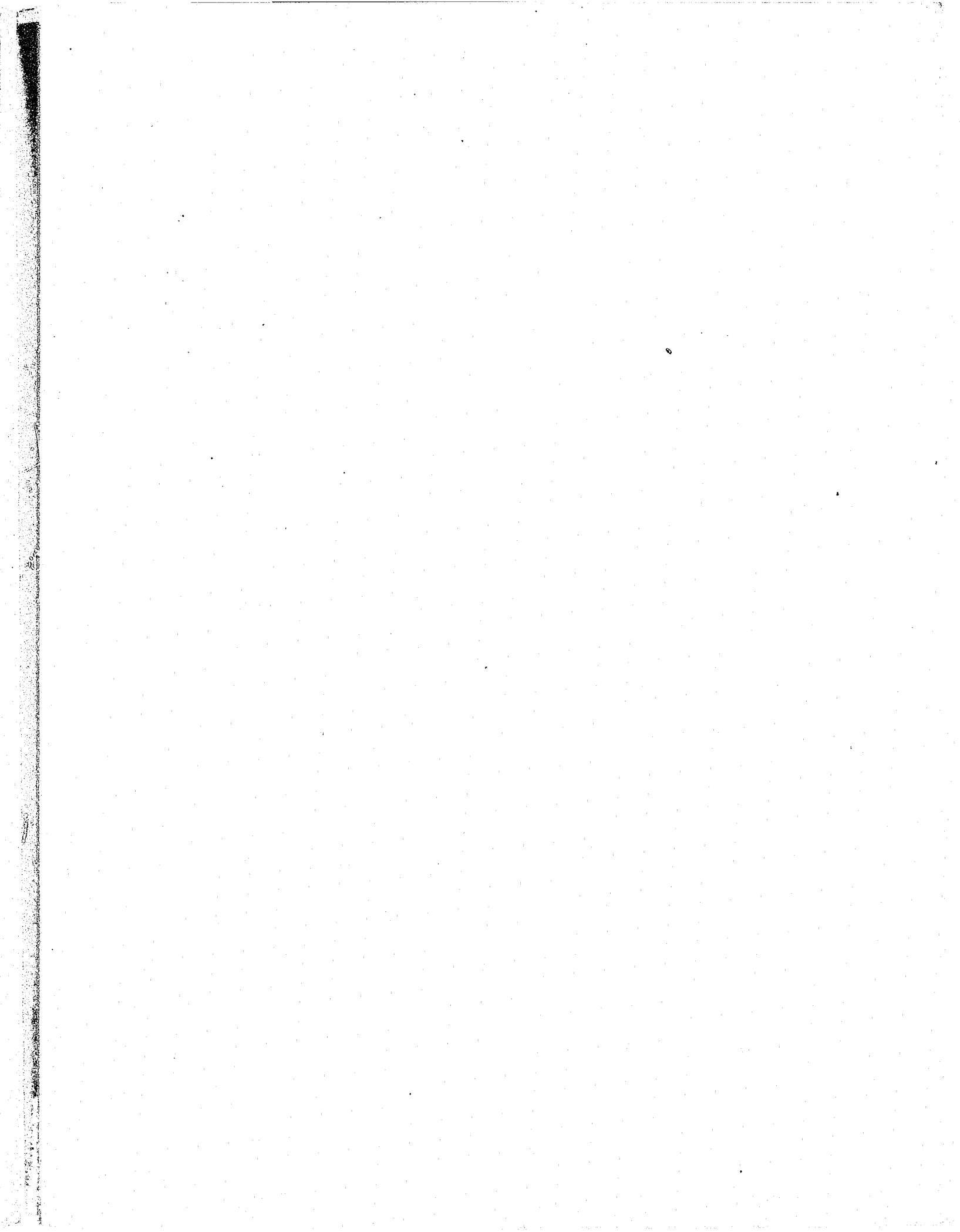
