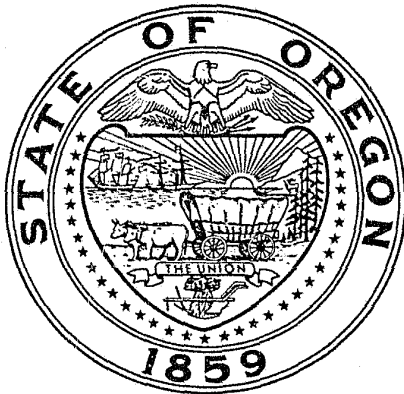

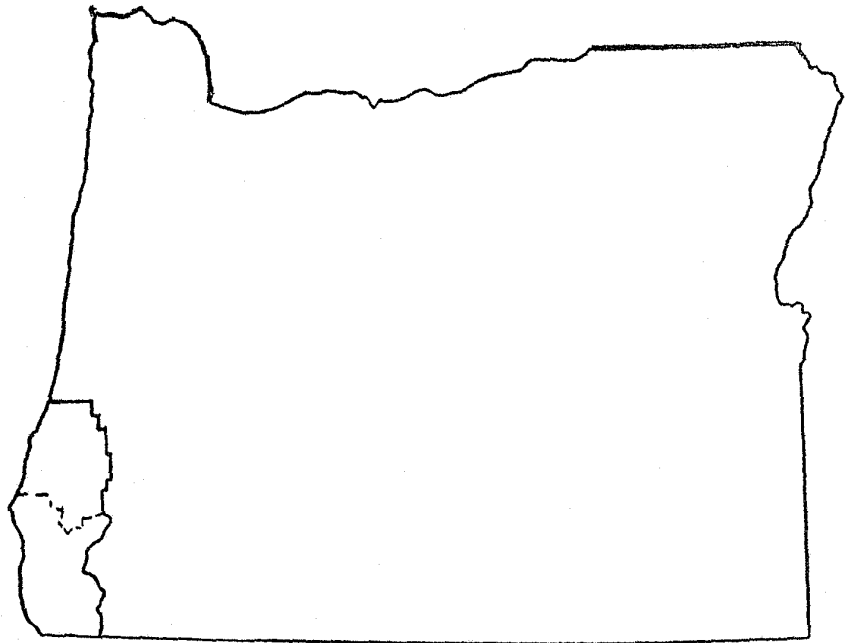

INTRODUCTION

Correctional services and research generally focus on the felon and juvenile offender. Misdemeanants form a far larger group than both of the others combined in terms of the number of cases handled by the criminal justice system. The Corrections Task Force of the President's Commission on Law Enforcement and Administration of Justice reported in 1967 that 93.5% of all defendants going through the courts annually were charged with misdemeanors. The Task Force report pointed out that there is a wide range and diversity of misdemeanor offenders and that the services for this misdemeanor group are extremely limited.

The Crime Commission made several recommendations for change in both misdemeanor programs and the organizational and administration of misdemeanor services. Among the programs they endorsed are: (1) increased pretrial release; (2) better and quicker classification and diagnosis, and referral of misdemeanants to community treatment and resources; (3) increased diversion of "status" offenders (alcoholics, vagrants) and nonserious offenders (minor traffic violators) from jails; (4) increased community treatment involving pretrial release (work or education); (5) wider use of transitional programs; (6) more rehabilitative programs in local jails; and (7) less reliance on fines without regard for ability to pay. Organizational and administrative changes recommended by the Commission included: (1) divorcing operating of jails from law enforcement agencies' functions; (2) integration of misdemeanor corrections, parole and probation in a single administrative unit; (3) creation of state-wide jail and probation standards; (4) state

subsidies for misdemeanor probation programs; (5) better pay and training for misdemeanor correctional officers; and (6) regionalization of misdemeanor institutions.

Purpose

This report and the data gathering that preceded it are Phase I of the Oregon Correctional Feasibility Study for District 7 (Coos and Curry Counties). This report presents data gathered about jail facilities, populations and programs in District 7. It is not the purpose or intent of this report to make recommendations for consideration or for implementation in District 7.

Feasibility Study

The Correctional Feasibility Study, funded by an LEAA block grant, began in 1970 as a pilot project to develop urban and rural regional correctional system models for Oregon. Although its scope has since expanded to provide planning assistance to 34 of the State's 36 counties, the Study's philosophy and process remain centered on local involvement in the planning process and community correctional programs for the misdemeanor.

To encourage rational regional planning, the Governor of Oregon has divided the state into administrative districts which comprise one to five counties. Many of these administrative districts contain councils of governments (COGS) which have responsibility for coordinating land use and service planning for the district. The Feasibility Study operates through these COGS or through the district law enforcement planner.

At the invitation of the COG or the planner, the Feasibility Study will enter a district and begin its three-phase process. First, the

Study collects baseline data on the criminal justice system. Sources of these data are jail booking ledgers and files, court dockets and monthly court activity reports. Data are collected on each jail booking for a sample period, usually one year. Once collected, these data are keypunched for the computer analysis, cross-tabulated and analyzed in a report to the district. These data are contained in this report.

The Study's second phase focuses on local participation in analysis of the baseline information, identification of problems in the criminal justice system and selection of ways to deal with those problems. The Study staff provides staff support and consultants to the local planning groups during this process, and prepares a report summarizing the recommendations for change and the data which underlie them.

The third phase--implementation of recommendations--is what distinguishes the Feasibility Study from most kinds of technical assistance. The Study staff commits itself to working closely with a district to help make its recommendations concrete, whether by locating project funds, by assisting in organizing the community in support of a recommendation, by doing research and staff work to build the case for change, or by providing consultants on issues of interest to the district. This third phase is both the most crucial and the most difficult, both for the local planning group and the Study staff.

Feasibility Study Progress Report

All but two counties in Oregon are now participating in the Correctional Feasibility Study. Their progress is as follows:

Districts 1, 3, 6, 8, 9, 10 and 13 have formulated recommendations for changes in their correctional systems and have begun implementation of these changes.

Districts 2, 4, 5, 12 and 14 are presently developing recommendations.

District 11 is not participating in the Study.

DATA SOURCES

Data collected deal with people who moved through the criminal justice system of District 7 during 1971. The following are major data sources used for this report:

Jail Bookings Data

The primary sources of data for this study are the booking ledgers and files of the ten jails sampled in the District. Court dispositions for those bookings were often sought in the files of the Circuit, District, Justice and Municipal Courts.

Municipal Court

Data from Municipal Courts were not collected because those courts handle relatively minor cases, in nature, which are not pertinent to the general purpose of this study. Only jail dispositions were gathered from these courts on bookings under municipal jurisdiction.

Justice Court

Court Continuation Sheets, which are monthly reports submitted by the Justice Courts to the State Revenue Department, were the source of data on actions in each of the two Justice Courts, beginning on page 113.

District Court

District Court Data were also collected from Court Continuation Sheets submitted to the State Revenue Department. District Court Data begins on page 120.

Circuit Court

Administrative District 7 is also Judicial District 15. Circuit Court dispositions were obtained from Circuit Court Dockets and Files. Circuit Court Data reflect all State of Oregon vs. cases during 1971.

BACKGROUND DATA

Geography

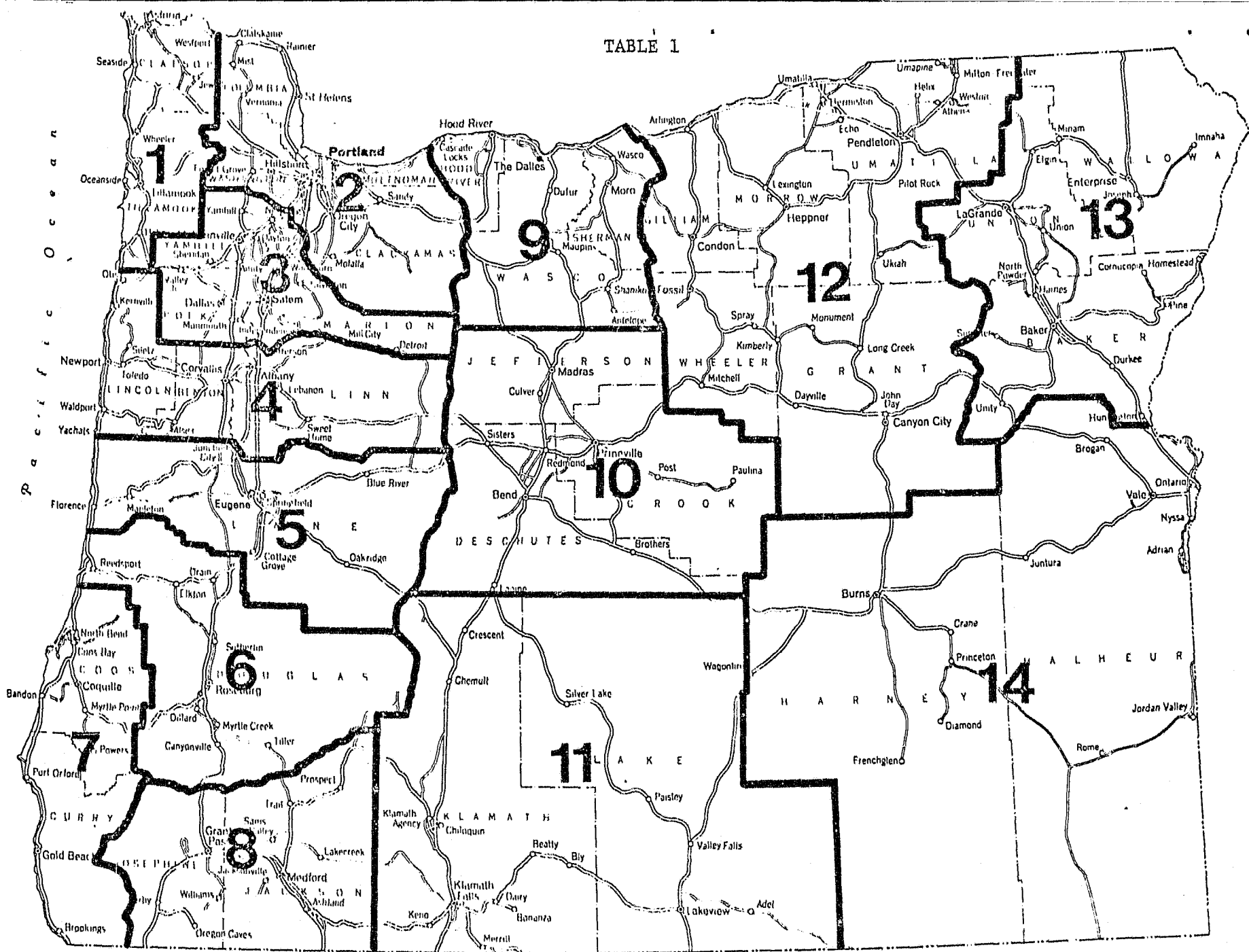
Created in 1968, when Oregon's Governor Tom McCall divided the State into fourteen administrative districts, District 7 consists of two counties, Coos and Curry. The District is located in southwestern Oregon; with the northern most boundary next to Douglas County (District 6). To the east are Douglas and Josephine Counties, the south is the Oregon-California State line and the entire west is the Pacific Ocean (see Table 1).

Population Characteristics and Economic Conditions

District 7 had a 1970 population of 69,521 which is an increase of 583 from 1960. Coos County increased from 1960 to 1970 by 1,560 or from 54,955 to 56,515. Curry County, however, decreased 977 in population from 1960 to 1970 from 13,983 to 13,006. Table 2 lists the population changes for districts throughout the State. Districts 12 and 13 are the only districts which decreased in population from 1960 to 1970. All other districts exhibit increases, with District 5 having the greatest percentage of increase.

Principal industries in Coos and Curry Counties are lumber manufacturing and timber harvesting. Both counties contain some of Oregon's most valuable standing timber. Shipping and commercial and sport fishing also employ many citizens in this area. Specialty crops in agriculture, such as cranberries and horticultural nurseries, play prominent roles in economic conditions in District 7. Currently, an industry receiving much attention is tourism. The coastal area of District 7 attracts thousands of travelers annually.

District 7 is Oregon's fifteenth judicial district.

Jails

Twelve jail facilities are located in District 7. These twelve include: Coos County Jail in Coquille, Curry County Jail in Gold Beach, Bandon City Jail, Brookings City Jail, Coos Bay City Jail, Coquille City Jail, Eastside City Jail, Gold Beach City Jail, Myrtle Point City Jail, North Bend City Jail, Port Orford City Jail and Powers City Jail. Eastside and Gold Beach do not use their holding facilities any longer, therefore, a physical description and jail data on these two facilities were excluded in this report.

Jail capacity in terms of beds range from four at Bandon, Powers and Port Orford to thirty-eight at Coos County. A complete breakdown of the District's jailing capacity is as follows:

Jail Descriptions

In this report there is no attempt at evaluation of objective procedures, practices or programs of the jail facility to be described. There are also no recommendations in this report. The intent of the study and report of District 7 is to describe the physical plant of the jail and its use as a facility. This report is the first phase of the overall study. This phase will be followed by recommendations and finally by implementation of cooperatively decided objectives.

The following are brief descriptions of the ten jail facilities in use in District 7:

BANDON CITY JAIL

This unfinished jail facility is about one year old, built into the basement of the City Hall which was constructed in 1969. Entrance to the jail is through a rear door of the basement. Upon entry, one is immediately inside the booking/supply area of the jail. Down the small hallway are two, two-man cells. Each cell contains steel bunks and institutional-type commode and sink. Three sides of each cell are concrete with the front being of steel bars. The door is locked by padlock. Between the front of the cells and hallway are glass windows without screens or bars. At the end of the hallway, adjacent to the second cell, is an unfinished room with a solid steel door that may eventually be utilized for further jail space. A shower, yet to be constructed, is to be installed in the cell area. Heating ducts inside and outside of the cells are used with a blower for ventilation. An intercom is being installed to be monitored upstairs in the Police Chief's office.

Supervision consists of occasional checks by police officers. No juveniles or women are housed in this jail facility, with adult males, both pre- and post-trial being incarcerated.

The sick are taken to the local hospital.

Visitors contact the Chief of Police for visitation rights. The visiting itself is done informally.

Meals are served twice daily by taking a prisoner to a nearby cafe.

BROOKINGS CITY JAIL

This five-year-old jail facility is in the rear of the City Hall building immediately behind the police department. Entrance into the building is through a back, side door. Upon entry is a short hallway with a clothes rack room to the left. This short hallway leads to another longer hallway. To the left is a small kitchen which substitutes as a photographer's darkroom, police offices, records, dispatcher's room and lobby. To the right is a room used for booking, fingerprinting and mugging, employees' restroom with a shower used by prisoners, and an archway entrance into the jail area.

The jail is composed of concrete blocks. Total capacity is ten, divided into five, two-man cells, housing men, women and juveniles. Cells are concrete blocks on three sides with a barred front. Steel sliding, key-locked doors secure the cells. Each cell has a washbasin and commode. Ventilation for the entire jail is by forced air. A smoke-type buzzer is located at the jail perimeter to sound an alarm if a fire should occur.

Visiting occurs in police officers' rooms and is left up to the discretion of the officer in charge. Two meals are served daily by a local cafe. A doctor is on call when emergency medical care is needed. The facility houses both sentenced and pretrial prisoners. No programs occur at this time.

COOS BAY CITY JAIL

Built in 1923, with some basic remodeling done in 1968, this jail is located behind the police department's general offices. Prisoner entrance is through the police car garage, through a back hallway into the booking room and finally ending at the security section of the jail.

The booking room contains a video monitor. The room also contains a chest-high bench to fingerprint prisoners upon admission. A solid wooden door, followed by a steel door with the top meshed, separates the booking room from the jail area.

Immediately upon entry into the security area of the jail is a steel stairway. The entrance door is actually located halfway between the top and bottom of these stairs. At the top of the stairs is a metal door with Plexiglas-type windows. Through this door is a short hallway containing a shower at the end and two, one-man cells on the left side. Each cell contains a hanging steel bunk with mattress and blanket, commode, washbasin and an open air window covered with a heavy steel screen and bars. Each cell has a lattice fronting and is locked by single key. The second floor cells usually house women or are used as an overflow area for men when women are not housed.

At the bottom of the stairway are two single cells, two steel cots in the hallway and a larger dormitory room with eight bunks. The two single cells contain open-air, screened and barred windows, commode and washbasin. In front of these lattice fronted cells are two cots used during high population periods. In a room adjacent to these cells is the eight-bunk dormitory with washbasin and commode. All rooms downstairs have exposed pipes overhead.

The entire jail is heated by coiled steam pipes. Ventilation is by opening the wooden entrance door and through the secured windows. Visiting occurs Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 2 - 3 p.m. Pretrial and sentenced adult prisoners are held in this municipal jail. Security checks are made occasionally by staff officers.

Three meals are served daily and are frozen dinners prepared in a small kitchen in the City Hall. Whenever any prisoner becomes ill or injured he is taken to a local hospital for treatment.

COOS COUNTY JAIL

The 1915 County Courthouse gives access to this third floor jail facility by way of a basement elevator which has an electrically-controlled jail lock or can be manually operated. Access to the jail can also be reached by a stairway. A steel bar door divides the elevator door from the booking area. Another buzzer-operated screen door leads into the jail security area.

Fingerprinting and booking occurs while a prisoner is contained in this sally port type entrance. Upon entry into the security jail corridor, prisoners are photographed in a make-shift area in the hallway.

This short photographing hallway leads to a small cramped supply room, the drunk tank and a bull pen. The supply room is long and very narrow. A staff rest room, kitchen freezers, storage of jail supplies and a room for new arrivals to change into institution clothes are the many purposes this room serves. Immediately next to this room is the drunk tank, containing two bunks, sink and commode. Directly across from the drunk tank, through a sally port entrance, is the bull pen area with four cells, four bunks in each. All incoming adult male prisoners are lodged in this area,

regardless of pretrial or posttrial status. There are only two useable commodes and sinks for the entire four cells. One shower is also shared by all the inmates in this tank area. Although total capacity is sixteen bunks, only twelve are used because of lack of adequate living space. The cell doors are double-locking and heating is by registers. On the outside of the cell area is a catwalk for observation. Some lighting is available by windows which are barred and screened.

Another hall from the booking cage leads by a four-man security cell, a trusty-laundry room and to the jail kitchen. The security cell has a bathtub, sink, commode and four steel bunks. Felony cases are generally held in this area.

Trusty quarters have a bed capacity for nine; five of which are not usable because of lack of storage space. The inmates also share the room with a hot water tank, laundry machines and bathroom. The crowded conditions make only five to seven trustys living in this area practical most of the time.

At the end of the hall is the kitchen area where three meals per day are prepared and served to all inmates and jail staff. One civilian cook is employed with assistance from trustys. Sinks, institutional stoves, refrigerators, kitchen utensils and supplies, plus jail staff eating in the area, makes this room crowded. A glass window with bars and screen is on the back wall looking to the outside.

A hallway to the right of the booking quarters leads to the jailer's office, women's quarters and juvenile detention. Records, files, supplies, desks and other office equipment are kept in the jailer's office. Because of the cramped quarters, any future filing expansion is nearly impossible.

Further down this small hall, directly behind the jailer's office, is female housing. Three steel-type bunk beds, a shower, toilet and

sink serve this area. A heavy, glassed-barred window overlooks the roof of part of the courthouse. Lack of forced air ventilation or air conditioning makes this room stuffy and hot.

In the hallway leading past the female quarters is a line of hanging clothes. Past this clothes storage is a key-locked door through which is the juvenile section of the jail. Upon entering is a large dayroom with television, chairs, couches, books and a ping pong table for recreation. The juvenile section is divided into two sections with four individual cell-type rooms in each section. One section is designated for boys, the other for girls or a total of four boys and four girls. The floor in the juvenile housing unit is tile. These rooms are brightly colored and each contains a sink and toilet. At the end of each housing unit is a shower.

Next to the dayroom is the juvenile counselor's office and a supply room. Another entrance and the one primarily used when juveniles are detained or released is located in the supply room. The juvenile section of the Coos County Jail was originally part of the jail. With the door division in the hallway, the juvenile department is able to keep the juvenile section relatively self-contained. The separation allows detained juveniles to be kept away from adults in both sight and sound.

The entire jail's heat, including the juvenile section, is from boilers in the basement of courthouse, causing uncontrolled heating problem, especially in summer months.

The visiting area is literally the same space in which a prisoner is booked (the area between the jail elevator and booking screen). Visibility is poor, causing eye strain upon long contact. Visiting hours are 1 - 3 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. No special area for attorneys is available.

The ceiling in part of the jail shows signs of leakage and some wiring and pipes are exposed. Capacity for entire adult male jail area is twenty-seven but with present conditions the best operating total is about twenty-one. The county health doctor volunteers his services with the local hospital and clinic used in case of emergency.

Jail supervision is twenty-four hours a day and at least one matron is on duty except during the graveyard shift. A woman from the juvenile section is called upon if needed during the hours in which no woman matrons are on duty. The jail has no present programs for inmates, primarily due to lack of adequate space.

COQUILLE CITY JAIL

The Coquille City Jail is located in the basement of the City Hall. Entrance to the jail is from the street, down a long declining concrete walkway. A wooden, electrically-operated door allows the transporting officer to escort a prisoner into the City Hall building. Once inside, to the left, is another wooden door which enters a large lobby-booking area and storage room. From the booking room, another wooden door enters into the immediate cell area.

The cell area is a large room with concrete walls on three sides and steel bars in the front. Inside the detention area is another smaller jail cage. This smaller cage is divided into two, two-man cells with commode in each. The cage has lattice fronting on two sides and two sides are solid steel. Each cell is secured by a padlock and a key lock secures the door to the main jail area. A lavatory-type sink is available outside the cage in the immediate large cell area.

On the back of the freestanding cage is attached two hanging bunks. Pipes are exposed in the main cell area and heating is done through hot

water coiled pipes. The furnace room is next door to the jail which also adds heat. A shower is located outside the security area of the jail.

Two meals are served daily by a local restaurant. A monitoring audio system is in the booking area which alerts officers in the police department of possible trouble.

Visiting is from 4 - 4:30 p.m. daily through the cell area bars and the entrance hallway.

Supervision consists of occasional checks by police officers.

CURRY COUNTY JAIL

This jail is located in the basement of the County Courthouse, adjacent to the dispatcher's office. The jail is reached from the ground level by descending a steep flight of steps. At the bottom of the steps is a small kitchen, dispatcher's office and a double-locking steel door which is the entrance to the security area of the jail.

Immediately to the right, upon entry to the jail, is a catwalk which views two, two-man cells. Each cell contains a washbasin and commode. The cell areas also contain one shower. Locks are single-key. To the left of entry is a small supply room which also doubles as a one-bunk trusty quarters. Further down the hallway is a security cell which is primarily used for intoxicated offenders or male juveniles. This cell contains no bunk, washbasin or commode. To the right of entrance is a small cramped two-man visiting booth, much the same as telephone booths. Each side of the booth contains a steel circular stool, a glass window divider and wire screen between. In the hallway is also a small supply closet and an access door used in case of emergency. At the end of the entrance hallway is the main holding tank. Prisoners held in this area

include misdemeanants, felons, pretrial and sentenced. There are ten bunks divided into two-cell compartments. One bunk (cell) area contains six sleeping bunks, the other four. Included in each cell is a commode and washbasin. One shower and a steel bench table is shared by the entire tank. A catwalk is located in front of the barred living area for observation.

Three meals are served daily from the small kitchen outside of the security area. Visiting is from 2 - 4 p.m. on Sundays. Some prisoners sentenced to work release are accommodated in this jail facility. As presently designed, this holding facility can only house male prisoners. Total capacity is fifteen adult male cells and one padded male cell.

Presently under construction, with occupancy occurring early in 1973, is a new county public safety building. This building will be directly behind the County Courthouse. It will house sheriff's offices, files, a dispatcher room, conference rooms, guest rooms, a crime lab, supplies and jail facility. Total jail capacity will be fifty-four; thirty-two adult males, ten juvenile males, eight adult females and four juvenile females.

MYRTLE POINT CITY JAIL

This 1924 jail facility's structure outside is cement. The jail is located in the back left-hand corner of the City Hall on the first floor. Entrance is up a long open walkway through a wooden door into an office area where prisoners are booked, fingerprinted and photographed. To right of entrance is a solid double-locking steel door which opens into a hall area. At the far left-hand corner there is an open shower which inmates utilize. There is no vision of this cell area when the solid

steel door is closed. Three single cells are in this area. Each cell contains a metal frame bed, commode and washbasin. A single key-lock secures each cell door. Glass windows with slab bars and wire mesh form little security to cell area.

In the booking area, a juvenile/female cell was built onto original structures in 1948. This cell contains one steel bunk, commode and washbasin. The cell door has a single-key lock.

Both pretrial and sentenced prisoners are housed in this facility. A matron is on duty from the City Hall office and an officer checks the jail occasionally. There is no direct supervision in cell area itself. Visiting is up to the discretion of the chief and generally occurs each day after 4 p.m.

Meals are brought in two times each day from a nearby restaurant. A town doctor is on call in case of sickness.

NORTH BEND CITY JAIL

The North Bend Police Department maintains a municipal jail in the rear of police department in the City Hall building. Entrance to this jail facility is at rear of the building into the booking area. This area also contains a T.V. monitor to video tape prisoners upon entry. To the right is the juvenile/female area secured by sliding, barred door, opened by key. A wooden door is directly inside the steel sliding door. The section contains two cells with two steel bunks attached to the wall, washbasin and commode in each. Cells are secured by sliding doors, opened by single-key locks. At end of hall is a shower. Neon lights supply lighting for prisoners confined in this area.

To the left of entrance is the adult male section of the jail facility. An electric switch opens a heavy mesh-screen door into small holding area which is also used during visiting. This area leads through a solid steel door, bolted by a padlock, into the cell area. The first cell on the right is the trusty quarters. The trusty quarters contain four bunks with foam mattresses.

The trusty area and security area is separated by an unlocked wooden door. A large walk area is directly in front of a caged security area. The security cell is really a cage inside the room. An open walk area is within the cell which has eight bunk spaces. The cells are steel-lattice front with washbasin and commode in each. The bunks are hanging steel cots, which can be lifted up and secured to the cell wall to allow more room. A solid steel wall separates the two cells with the perimeter being of lattice work. The doors to the cells are secured by a combination padlock and outside lever-action bolt. There are openings in the ceiling of this jail cage for ventilation, with bars across these openings. A shower is behind the extreme portion of cell area. Five screen-bar glass windows allow light from outside wall area. Five flood-type lights also furnish the area with light. Steam heat is located in this area.

Total capacity for the entire jail is sixteen. Prisoners include pretrial and sentenced.

Three meals are served daily. Supervision is maintained twenty-four hours per day and visiting is allowed each day from 2 - 4 p.m. with Sundays being 1 - 4 p.m. The sick are taken to local hospital which has facility for maximum security.

PORT ORFORD CITY JAIL

Adult male prisoners are the only prisoners detained in the Port Orford City Jail. The jail is relatively new, built in 1967 as part of the police department when the City Hall complex was constructed.

Prisoners are taken to the cell area by going through the police department reception area and through a solid steel door immediately to the left of the office counter.

The cell area itself contains three cells, two of which are used. The third is used for storage. The two cells contain two steel bunks, commode and washbasin in each. Walls are of solid concrete blocks on three sides with a lattice front. There are no windows and the steel-screened doors are locked by a padlock. A shower is located in a small room across from the first cell. Two floodlights in the hallway light the cells and an electric heater, also in the hallway, furnishes heat to the two cells. An exhaust fan is used for ventilation. A fire alarm is attached to the ceiling just inside the cell entrance. This alarm will be tripped by heat or smoke in case of a fire.

When in use, supervision consists of periodic checks by police officers. Prisoners are generally taken to the Curry County Jail in Gold Beach if detention other than a few hours is anticipated.

A doctor is on call in case of illness.

Visiting is done in the police office and is under the discretion of the police department. Prisoners are usually taken to a local restaurant for meals.

POWERS CITY JAIL

Built in the fall of 1963, this jail facility is behind the police department in the City Hall. Entrance to the jail proper is at the rear of the building. A booking counter is inside with the cell area to the left of entry.

Two holding cells with two bunks each can detain most prisoners long enough until transfer to Coos County Jail. However, some municipal court cases are sentenced to this jail.

A matron is on call for any female arrest and juveniles are detained in the front office for release to parents or transfer to the detention area in the Coos County Jail.

The cells are of lattice construction and steel, secured by a padlock on the door. A commode and steel bunks with mattresses are in each cell. Drinking water is given to prisoners by means of plastic pitchers. A heater in the booking area heats both cells.

Half-hour police checks by an officer are available when the cells are populated.

Prisoners are taken to a nearby cafe for meals.

POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS

Jail Bookings

Jail Bookings data were collected in ten of the twelve jails in District 7. Gold Beach City Jail and Eastside City Jail no longer detain prisoners so data were not included on these lockups and excluded in this report. Data were collected on 1971 bookings from Bandon City Jail, Brookings City Jail, Coos Bay City Jail, Coos County Jail, Coquille City Jail, Curry County Jail, Myrtle Point City Jail, North Bend City Jail, Port Orford City Jail and Powers City Jail.

A total of 4191 bookings occurred during 1971 in District 7 (Table JB-1). Coos County Jail accounted for 33% of the district's total bookings and 38% of Coos County's bookings. The Curry County Jail, while accounting for 8% of the district's bookings, totaled 68% of Curry County's bookings.

The 1971 bookings total represents an increase of 866 over 1969 with Coos County Jail increasing 609 and North Bend City Jail increasing 330. Bandon City Jail, Brookings City Jail, Coquille City Jail and Curry County Jail decreased slightly in total bookings from 1969 to 1971.

Population

Table JB-2 presents a selected summary of inmate population characteristics for District 7 and compares these characteristics with twelve other districts. District 7 has one of the highest booking rates, detains many juveniles and has one of the lowest alcohol booking rates in the State. This table shows that District 1 and District 7 each had 27% of their entire bookings composed of juveniles. On the other hand, District 7 had the second to lowest alcohol-related bookings at 31%. Total bookings per 1000 population averaged 60.

Table JB-3 further defines the age distribution of jail bookings. Total number of bookings, age of persons booked, the sex of persons booked and each jail's population is shown in this table. Fifty percent of the female bookings were juveniles (anyone 17 years of age or younger). The age groups of 25 years or younger for females is 71% of the total female population. The male population for the district also seems to be young in age. Seventy-two percent of the male bookings were 30 years of age or younger. Juveniles account for 22% of the male population.

Residency by jail is shown on Table JB-4. Seventy-eight percent of the 1971 District 7 bookings were residents of either Coos or Curry County. A total of 88% were residents of the State of Oregon. Table JB-5 compares the Governor's Administrative Districts with District 7 regarding residency. The table shows that in every district, except District 9, local offenders accounted for over 50% of the jail bookings.

Whites made up 93% of the bookings as seen on Table JB-6. American Indians totaled 1%, followed by Mexican-Americans, Mexicans, other ethnic groups, Blacks and Orientals.

Similar in design to Table JB-5, Table JB-7 compares twelve Administrative Districts with District 7 regarding the type of ethnic groups lodged into jail. The majority of ethnic bookings across the State of Oregon were people of white descent (an average of 81%). Table JB-8 lists racial groups found in Oregon and shows where these groups are distributed, as well as the 1970 census. (During recommendations, it might be interesting to compare Tables JB-4, JB-6 and JB-8 to see the proportion of whites and non-whites booked, where these people reside and if one particular ethnic group may be overrepresented or underrepresented in total bookings.)

Tables JB-9 and JB-10, respectively, reveal that the prior arrest and prior jail data on those cases booked are difficult to determine. The "unknown" amounts are high enough in both tables to render this information useless. These data are impossible to collect because of their unavailability and unreliability.

According to Table JB-11, there were 2964 people (76%) involved in the 4191 bookings that occurred in 1971. Of these, 2250 people were booked only once during the year; 453 were booked twice; 134 were booked three times; and 61 persons were booked into District 7 jails four times in 1971. One person was lodged eleven times during the year.

Offense Distribution

Table OD-1 shows the specific charges logged by the jail of detention and the sex of persons held. The dominant category shown on Table OD-1 is that misdemeanors account for 59% of the bookings; public intoxication is the most frequent. Nine percent of the bookings fell into crimes versus property and miscellaneous felonies and indictable misdemeanors. Crimes versus persons contributed 4% of the district's total bookings. Juvenile delinquency, which includes runaway, curfew, truancy, ungovernable behavior, beyond parental control, etc., had 15% of the total bookings.

Tables OD-2 and OD-3 are similar in design. These two tables show the number and percent of persons booked into all District 7 jails by their offense category and age. Table OD-3 shows that 27% of all offenses were charged against persons under 18 years of age. Sixty-four percent of all offenses were charged against persons 25 years of age or under.

Table OD-4 shows the offense distribution for all second and third charges. A total of 432 bookings (out of 4191) had two charges and 81 had third charges that were filed when the booking procedure occurred. The largest second charge, as well as the third charge, was traffic offenses. Misdemeanors accounted for 246 second charges and 50 of the third charges.

Frequency Of Arrest

A total of 316 persons charged with public intoxication were arrested only once in District 7 during 1971 according to Table FQ-1. This table examines the frequency of public intoxication arrests in the district's ten jails during 1971. Thirty-nine persons were arrested twice, 7 were arrested three times, 3 were arrest four times, 1 was arrested five times and 2 persons were arrested six times for public intoxication.

Essentially the same frequency table is displayed in Table FQ-2 except the occurrence of driving under the influence of alcohol is shown. A total of 387 persons were involved in 439 drunk driving bookings during 1971.

Table FQ-3 involves disorderly conduct arrests and shows 212 persons involved in 233 jail bookings for this offense. Ninety-one percent were arrested only once in 1971 for disorderly conduct in District 7.

Arresting Agency

Table AA-1 examines the 1971 bookings at each of the ten jails in District 7 by arresting agency. Of the 4191 bookings that occurred, the Coos Bay Police Department lodged 1048 (25%); the North Bend Police Department lodged 896 (21%); and the Coos County Sheriff's Office lodged 822 (20%). Coos County Sheriff's office booked 791 (58%) of that particular county's jail total and Curry County booked 234 (66%) of Curry County's jail total.

At each of the eight other municipal jails in Coos and Curry Counties, the local police department was responsible for the bulk of their jail bookings.

PRETRIAL DISPOSITIONS

The number of days someone was detained in jail before release, courts in which cases were arraigned, the types of pretrial actions (e.g. released on bail) and the dollar amounts of bail are shown in Tables PT-1 through PT-17.

Table PT-1 displays the number of days prisoners were detained in the ten jails sampled before their pretrial release or commitment on a sentence. Some observations are: 3166 (75%) of the 4191 bookings were held one day or less; 3824 (91%) of the 4191 bookings were held six days or less and 12 cases were detained over 100 days.

Tables PT-2 through PT-11 break down each of the ten jails in District 7 into pretrial population by month of arrest and by the sex of the defendant. June was the high month for Bandon City Jail with 10 of 43 bookings occurring. Brookings City Jail's high detention months were July, August and September as seen in Table PT-3. These three months totaled 35% of the 1971 bookings. In Table PT-4, Coos Bay City Jail's month of highest detention was August. The table also shows that 83% were released in one day or less. Coos County Jail's months of highest detention were August, April and July, respectively, according to Table PT-5. Eighty percent of those detained before sentencing were held six days or less. Table PT-6 shows that all women detained in Coquille City Jail were held one day or less. Ninety-two percent of the men detained pretrial were held one day or less. In December, 18 prisoners were booked into the Coquille City Jail. The Curry County Jail, Table PT-7, held 47 men in August. The majority of pretrial detentions were one day or less, however, four men were held over 100 days. Table PT-8, Myrtle Point City Jail,

also shows August as being the month of highest bookings. Ninety-eight percent of the bookings were held one day or less. In Table PT-9, North Bend City Jail's pretrial detention occurrences for 1971 are also observed by month of arrest. In December, 118 bookings occurred; of these, 109 were released the same day of arrest. Port Orford City Jail had at least 94% of its bookings out of the jail one day or less. This information, displayed in Table PT-10, shows that four women were the total population in June and three men were held in January. Powers City Jail, Table PT-11, held all 7 bookings one day or less. January and October each had two bookings.

Table PT-12 includes place of arraignment by the jail of detention and the sex of those arrested. Municipal Court was the court of jurisdiction in 30% of the bookings, and District Court was the court of jurisdiction in 22% of the bookings.

The Court of Jurisdiction by Pretrial Action is demonstrated in Table PT-13. This table shows that 466 cases were released on their own recognizance (R.O.R.), 1411 cases were released on bail, and 577 cases were held in jail because bail was not posted. In 141 cases, bail was not allowed.

Pretrial Action by Age distribution is shown in Table PT-14. Table PT-15 shows pretrial actions by place of residence. Residents received the pretrial disposition of released on bail 35% of the time, nonresidents (either transient in state or out-of-state) were released on bail 26%. Residents received R.O.R. 11% for a pretrial action and nonresidents were released on R.O.R. 9%. Residents were held in jail either by not posting bail or when bail was not allowed 16%, while nonresidents were held 19% of the time because bail was not posted or bail was not allowed.

The Amount of Bail Posted by Court is shown in Table PT-16. The most common bail received was \$50. Seventy-seven percent of the bails posted were \$300 or less. Bail was posted in Municipal Courts the most often at 796 or 56% of the 1411 bailed cases.

Table PT-17 is designed similar to Table PT-16 except cases which were held in lieu of bail are shown. Of the 577 cases which didn't post bail, 52% were for \$300 or less. The most common category was from \$101 - \$199 at 70 cases. Municipal and District Courts each had 42% of the cases held in lieu of bail.

POSTTRIAL DISPOSITIONS

Court Data On Jail Bookings

Table PD-1 indicates the final disposition on cases adjudicated in District 7 courts. Of a total of 4191 jail bookings, 2903 received a disposition in one of District 7's courts. Municipal Courts handled 1259 of the jail cases that were sentenced, followed by District Courts with 1137, Circuit Courts with 283, Juvenile Courts with 145 and 29 at Justice Courts. This table also shows that 1290 cases or 44% of the jail cases adjudicated received a fine as a sentence; 577 (20%) were dismissed or found not guilty, and 452 (16%) received a jail sentence. Percentage wise, more females had their cases dropped in court or received a fine than men according to Table PD-1.

Court dispositions by age are displayed in Table PD-2. The table shows that people receiving sentences are primarily young, with 53% being 30 years or younger. It is interesting to note that while the table shows 44% of the dispositions as fines, the age category of 18 through 20 had a fine percentage of 28%. The percentage of dispositions for jail sentences is 16%, but in the age group of 18 through 20, jail was imposed 23% of the time. Comparisons of this nature should be closely examined with such other tables as offenses by age to gain an accurate picture of the sentenced population in District 7 jails.

Tables PD-3 and PD-4 refer to the final dispositions of second and third charges. The totals of these two tables are greater than the totals on Table OD-4, page 41, because some cases received combinations of sentences (e.g. a fine and probation).

The most frequent sentence imposed on second offenses, Table PD-3, was a fine. A high percentage (23%) of the second charges were dropped or found not guilty during adjudication.

Third offenses, Table PD-4, also had a large percentage (30%) of cases dropped or found not guilty during court adjudication. Like first offenses and second offenses, the most common sentences imposed were fines.

Amount Of Fine

Table PD-5 shows the dollar amount of fines imposed by the various courts in District 7. The most frequent fine given was \$50. Sixty percent of the fines given by the courts in the District were \$100 or less.

The courts which imposed the most fines were the Municipal Courts. These courts imposed 854 sentences of fines, or approximately 66% of all fines. District Courts imposed a total of 377 fines or 29%.

Jail Sentence

Sixty-five percent of the cases in jail after court adjudication received a sentence of twenty days or less. This information is shown in Table PD-6. Table PD-6 also takes into account cases which resulted in jail because a fine was not paid.

The Coos County Jail had 275 sentenced prisoners during 1971. Coos Bay City Jail had 79, North Bend had 69, and Curry County Jail had 53 sentenced prisoners.

Tables PD-7 through PD-15 examine each jail's sentenced population during 1971 by the month in which the sentence was imposed. Port Orford had no sentenced prisoners during 1971, so a table is not included for this jail.

Daily Jail Population

Tables DP-1 through DP-10 contain complete daily population figures for each jail (daily population, total prisoners in per month, total prisoners out per month, highest count on any one day, lowest count on any one day and the average daily population each month and for the year). The high count per month is often a larger number than the population displayed for any one day because the daily population figures are "midnight counts". That is to say, a number of people could have been processed through the jail on that day, but the midnight count shows how many stayed overnight. Any person staying in jail, whether twenty-four minutes or twenty-four hours, is counted as having been in jail one day. The population figures on these ten tables give another point of view on jail populations.

Juvenile Offenses

In addition to other sources of data gathering, this section uses data obtained from Welfare Form 35. This information is reported voluntarily by County Juvenile Departments to the State Public Welfare Division.

Tables JD-1, JD-2, JD-3 and JD-4 show the number and type of offenses committed by juveniles as reported by Coos County Juvenile Department and Curry County Juvenile Department. Offenses applicable to juveniles and adults are shown in Tables JD-1 (Coos County) and JD-3 (Curry County). Offenses applicable to juveniles only are displayed in Tables JD-2 (Coos County) and JD-4 (Curry County).

Juvenile Detention

Table JD-5, which includes both Coos and Curry Counties, shows the juvenile cases handled officially and those handled unofficially as well as cases that were detained or not detained for Curry County. The table shows that 77% of Curry County's Juvenile contacts were not detained.

Juvenile Jail Bookings

The following two tables can be found elsewhere in this report. They have been included in this section again for the ease of reading and understanding of the juvenile population in District 7 jails during 1971.

Table JD-6 includes total juvenile bookings by jail, and Table JD-7 shows the offenses charged against juveniles lodged.

Table JD-6 shows that the greatest juvenile percentage of the total bookings of the district was in the Coos County Jail (12%). North Bend City Jail had a substantial number of juvenile jail bookings at 10% of the district's total bookings. Eighteen percent of the district's booking total were juvenile boys and 8% were juvenile girls.

The offenses charged against jailed youths are displayed in Table JD-7. The most frequent offense category was Delinquency. Delinquency here includes charges such as truancy, runaway, ungovernable behavior, curfew, etc. Minor In Possession Of Alcohol and Petty Larceny also account for many of the 1971 bookings.

If a long detention time is anticipated, juveniles will either be transported to the Juvenile section of the Coos County Jail or the North Bend City Jail which has two designated Juvenile holding cells. These "extra" data are added for the purpose of showing juvenile case loads and policing activities. (Tables JD-8 through JD-11.)

COURT DATA

Justice Court

Justice Court is held by a Justice of the Peace within the district for which he is chosen, excepting those cities where District Courts have been established. Curry County has two Justice Courts: Port Orford and Brookings. The Justice Court has civil jurisdiction, but not exclusive, where the amount of claim does not exceed \$250, excepting in actions involving title to real property, false imprisonment, libel, slander, malicious prosecution, criminal conversation, seduction or promise to marry.

The Justice Court Data in this report were taken from each court's "Continuation Sheet", which is a monthly report to the State Revenue Department. Basically, information was gathered in three areas: offenses, arresting agencies and dispositions.

Tables CD-1, CD-2 and CD-3 show Justice Court activities at Port Orford. Table CD-1 indicates that traffic offenses were the most common charges. The Oregon State Police (Table CD-2) was the dominant police agency referring cases to Justice Court and the most frequent disposition was a fine (Table CD-3).

Brookings Justice Court data are displayed in Tables CD-4, CD-5 and CD-6. The dominant offense was traffic (CD-4), the most frequent arresting agency (CD-5) was the Oregon State Police and the disposition occurring most often was a fine (CD-6).

District Court

District Court has only jurisdiction as is given by statute. Civil jurisdiction includes all cases where the amount of claim does not exceed \$2,500 except in an action where title to real property is in question. Criminal jurisdiction of District Courts extend to those crimes where maximum penalty does not exceed one year in jail and a fine of \$3,000 or both. In Coos and Curry Counties, District Court Judges may exercise the powers and duties of the Circuit Judge for the county in probate matters.

District Court data in this report were obtained from each court's "Continuation Sheet", which is reported monthly to the State Revenue Department.

Tables CD-7, CD-8 and CD-9 examine District Court data in Coos County at Coquille. Tables CD-10, CD-11 and CD-12 refer to District Court data in Coos County at North Bend. Curry County's District Court data are shown on Tables CD-13, CD-14 and CD-15.

The most frequent offenses brought before the three District Courts in District 7 (Tables CD-7, CD-10 and CD-13) were traffic. The arresting agency reported to be the most often involved in District Courts is the Oregon State Police (Tables CD-8, CD-11 and CD-14). Fines were the most common dispositions imposed by the District Courts in District 7 during 1971, according to Tables CD-9, CD-12 and CD-15.

Circuit Court

Circuit Courts exercise initial law, equity, criminal and divorce jurisdiction. Data collected concerning Circuit Court involved criminal actions brought before the court in 1971. Data forms (Appendix II-B) were used in obtaining information from these courts' dockets and case files.

Tables CD-16, CD-17, CD-18 and CD-19 show the data that were collected on Circuit Courts in District 7. Table CD-16 shows the criminal cases in Coos County Circuit Court by month of court adjudication. The most common offense was crimes involving drugs. Final disposition for Coos County Circuit Court by month is in Table CD-17. Thirty-nine percent were dismissed or found not guilty and 25% were placed on probation. Curry County's Circuit Court, located at Gold Beach, is calculated in Tables CD-18 and CD-19. Stolen property was the most common offense occurring during 1971 according to Table CD-18. Out of a total of 46, the offense of receiving and concealing stolen property totalled 13 or 17% of the court cases. Table CD-19 shows that 50% of the Circuit Court dispositions were probation.

Data Sources

The jail data collection form is shown on Appendix II-A. Jail data were collected from jail ledgers or logs and from individual inmate files. Police records were used, if needed, and court dispositions were obtained from the various courts in District 7 to complete each data form.

Appendix II-B was used to collect court activity data. Justice of the Peace Court's data were tabulated primarily from "Continuation Sheets" submitted to the Oregon State Revenue Department. District Court data were also primarily obtained from "Continuation Sheets". Circuit Court data were hand-tabulated using the Appendix II-B form from court dockets. Only criminal ("State of Oregon vs.") cases were examined. Information on Municipal Court cases which involved defendants who were not jailed before trial or on sentence was not collected because such data would have had to be collected by hand, resulting in expense which would have far outweighed its value to the study.
