This report is one of a series to make data available on the population in New York State Department of Correctional Services Institutions. The data in this report cover reported inmate characteristics at the time of commitment and include the following selected items: Reason for Commitment, County of Commitment, Race or Nationality, Minimum and Maximum Sentence, Dangerous Drug Usage, Education, Prior Adult Criminal Record and Present Age. In addition, summary figures are shown for all institutions combined and for both sexes along with percent distributions. Summary totals are also provided for the four basic types of correctional institutions: General Confinement, Reception and Classification, Camps and Specialized Facilities.

H I G H L I G H T S

1. 97.1% of the inmate population are males.
2. 91.3% of male inmates were committed for felonies while 8.7% were committed for other reasons. 86.5% of female inmates were committed for felonies and 13.5% were committed for other reasons.
3. 66.8% of the male inmates were committed from New York City while 61.5% of females were committed from that area.
4. 72.7% of the male population are non-white and 75.5% of the female population.
5. 42.5% of the male population had received maximum sentences of over five years while only 31.0% of the female population fell in this category.
6. 53.8% of the male population have a record of dangerous drug usage and 47.1% of the female population.
7. 20.1% of male inmates had completed high school before commitment and 20.6% of female inmates.
8. 57.6% of the male population had experienced prior institutional commitment but only 29.7% of the female population.
9. Of the total population, 14.7% were under 21 years of age on December 31, 1973. However, 10.7% of women under custody were under 21 while 14.9% of males were in this category.
