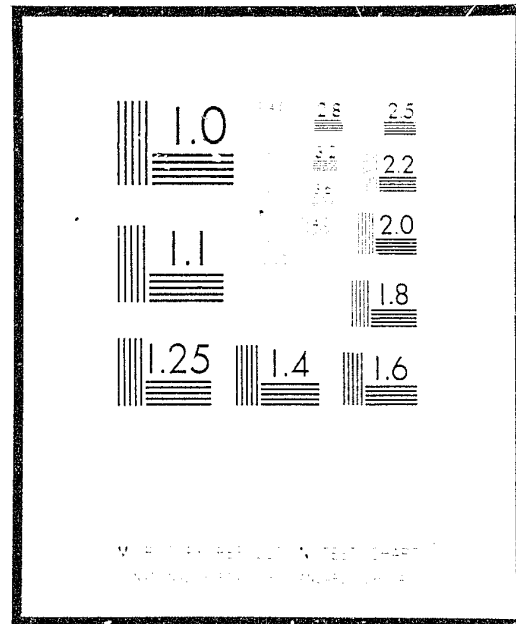

This bulletin contains descriptive information pertaining to juveniles admitted to Wisconsin's juvenile correctional institutions during calendar year 1973.

Tables A-D report selected characteristics of new admissions and re-admissions for the period 1969-1973. Information relating to 1973 admissions only is presented in Tables 1-15.

New admission (State Probation Violator) is introduced as an admission category this year. Selected characteristics are reported in Table E.
