




The following analysis compares data in the reports *Wisconsin Criminal Justice Information, Crime and Arrests - 1973* and *Crime in the United States, Uniform Crime Reports - 1973* published earlier this year by the Crime Information Bureau and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, respectively.

Wisconsin crime experience is frequently related to that of the North Central States, either individually or as a group. North Central States are Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, and Wisconsin.

NEW CRIME INDEX IN 1973

A significant modification occurred to the Wisconsin and National Uniform Crime Reporting Programs during 1973. Prior to this, the Crime Index was composed of the offenses of murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, theft \$50 and over in value and auto theft. Beginning in 1973, however, after consultation with and approval by the Uniform Crime Records Committee of the International Association of Chiefs of Police, the National UCR Program was changed to include all thefts, regardless of value, as a Crime Index offense. The effect was to add thefts of under \$50 in value to the Crime Index (and to the Property Crime component). This policy change was adopted by the Wisconsin UCR Program to provide for comparability of state and national data.

This document utilizes this new definition of the Crime Index and Property Crimes and shows total theft as a Crime Index offense. Percentage changes in offenses between 1972 and 1973, or between 1968 and 1973, also reflect the new definition. Percentage changes in crime between these years are based on comparable data with the same definition of Crime Index offenses. Total theft in 1973 is compared with total theft in 1972 or in 1968. Property Crime includes all thefts in 1973 and is compared with Property Crimes, including all thefts, in 1972 or in 1968. Crime Index offenses in 1973 are compared with Crime Index offenses in 1972 or in 1968, adjusted to include thefts of a value less than \$50.

Because of the redefinition of the Crime Index in 1973, the 1973 number of thefts, number of Property Crimes and number of Crime Index offenses cannot be directly compared with previously published data for prior years. Compatible prior year data must first be calculated, as has been done within this volume, in the manner explained above to determine correct percentage fluctuations.

OFFENSES

CRIME INDEX OFFENSES

DEFINITION: *Crime Index offenses are murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, theft and auto theft. Attempts are included (an attempted murder is scored as an aggravated assault).*

One crime is counted for each victim of a murder, forcible rape or aggravated assault. One crime is counted for each distinct operation in the case of a robbery, burglary or theft. One auto theft is counted for each motor vehicle stolen or subjected to an attempted theft.

Beginning in 1973 all thefts, regardless of value, are included as Crime Index offenses. Prior to this, only thefts of a value of \$50 or more were counted. This change affects the Theft, Property Crimes and total Crime Index Offenses categories. All comparisons with prior periods of time are based on offenses defined consistently for 1973 and prior periods.

Attempts are included (an attempted murder is scored as an aggravated assault).*

One crime is counted for each victim of a murder, forcible rape or aggravated assault. One crime is counted for each distinct operation in the case of a robbery.

One crime is counted for each distinct operation in the case of a burglary or a theft. One auto theft is counted for each motor vehicle stolen or subjected to an attempted theft.

Beginning in 1973 all thefts, regardless of value, are included as Crime Index offenses. Prior to this, only thefts of a value of \$50 or more were counted. This change affects the Theft, Property Crimes and total Crime Index Offenses categories. All comparisons with prior periods of time are based on offenses defined consistently for 1973 and prior periods.

MURDER

DEFINITION: Murder and nonnegligent manslaughter includes all willful killings without due process and is scored on the basis of police investigation as opposed to any decision of a court, coroner, jury, or other judicial body. Deaths caused by negligence are not included in this category but are counted as manslaughters by negligence. Attempts or assaults to kill are scored as aggravated assaults and not as murder. The crime count for this offense classification also excludes suicides, accidental deaths, justifiable homicides and murders of law enforcement officers in the line of duty.

One offense is counted for each victim of a murder.

FORCIBLE RAPE

DEFINITION: *Forcible rape is defined as the carnal knowledge of a female through the use of force or the threat of force. Assaults or attempts to commit forcible rape are included; however, statutory rape (without force) is not counted. Crime counts in this category are limited to actual offenses of forcible rape or attempts as established by police investigation.*

One offense is counted for each victim of a forcible rape.

ROBBERY

DEFINITION: Robbery is a vicious type of crime which takes place in the presence of the victim to obtain property or a thing of value from a person by use of force or threat of force. Assaults to rob and attempts are included. Robbery is a violent crime that sometimes results in injury to the victim. Both armed robberies where any weapon (actual or pretended) is used, and strong-arm robberies where no weapon other than a personal weapon is employed ("muggings"), are included in this category.

One offense of robbery is counted for each distinct operation.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

DEFINITION: *Aggravated Assault is defined as an unlawful attack by one person upon another with the intent to inflict great bodily injury, usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or other means likely to produce death or serious bodily harm. Attempts are included since it is not necessary that an injury result when a gun, knife or other non-personal weapon is used which could and probably would result in serious personal injury were the crime successfully completed. Attacks with personal weapons must result in serious personal injury to be classified as an aggravated assault. Attempted murders are included in this category. The number of offenses in this classification does not include assaults on law enforcement officers in the line of duty.*

One offense is counted for each victim of an aggravated assault.

DEFINITION: *The crime of burglary includes any unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. It is not necessary for force to be used to gain or attempt to gain entrance in order for the event to be classified as a burglary. Moreover, a loss does not have to occur in the case of an illegal entry for it to be counted. Attempted burglaries are included.*

One offense of burglary is counted for each distinct operation.

THEFT

DEFINITION: Theft is the unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles of value without the use of force, violence or fraud. It includes crimes such as shoplifting, pocket-picking, purse-snatching, thefts from motor vehicles, thefts of motor vehicle parts and accessories, bicycle thefts, etc. Beginning in January, 1972, thefts from temporary residence, recreation-type dwellings (e.g., camping tents, campers, camping trailers, houseboats and similar recreational vehicles, trailers or dwellings) were included in this offense category. Previously, these were classified as burglaries. For purposes of Uniform Crime Reporting, this offense category does not include embezzlement, unlawful conversions, forgery, counterfeiting, worthless checks or thefts by bailees. Auto theft is a separate Index Crime and, therefore, is also excluded. Attempted thefts are included.

One offense of theft is counted for each distinct operation.

Beginning in 1973 all thefts, regardless of value, are included as Crime Index offenses. Prior to this, only thefts of a value of \$50 or more were counted. This change affects the Theft, Property Crimes and total Crime Index Offenses categories. ARRESTS

Arrest statistics reflect the age, sex and race of suspects in criminal acts. According to Uniform Crime Reporting Scoring rules, an arrest is counted each time a person is taken into custody, notified or cited. Arrests do not measure the number of individuals taken into custody because one person may be arrested more than once during the year for the same or different offenses. Juveniles are scored as having been "arrested" for purposes of Uniform Crime Reporting procedures, although under Wisconsin Statutes law enforcement custody of a child is not legally considered an arrest. A juvenile arrest is reported when the conditions are such that, if he or she were an adult, an arrest would be scored.

TOTAL ARRESTS

Total arrests increased 9 percent in Wisconsin from 1972 to 1973 as compared to a rise of 4 percent nationwide.

Arrests for narcotic drug law violations rose 61 percent in the State versus an increase of 19 percent in arrests for this offense in the Nation.

Arrests for forcible rape rose 57 percent in the State compared to an increase of 12 percent in arrests for this offense in the Nation.

When offenses are ranked in order from high to low according to number of arrests, the top 10 offense categories accounted for 85 percent of all arrests in Wisconsin and 82 percent of all arrests in the Nation.

Two Crime Index offenses were ranked in the top 10 offense categories in terms of number of arrests in both Wisconsin and the Nation. Juvenile arrests increased 11 percent in Wisconsin and 5 percent in the Nation.

Adult arrests increased 8 percent in Wisconsin and 3 percent in the Nation.

Adult arrests for theft ranked fifth highest in Wisconsin and sixth highest in the Nation in terms of arrest frequency. Arrests of adults for burglary ranked tenth in Wisconsin in terms of all adult arrests and eighth in the Nation. Adult arrests for aggravated assault were not ranked in the top 10 adult arrest categories in Wisconsin but were ranked ninth highest nationwide. Arrests of adults for narcotic drug law violations were sixth highest in Wisconsin and fifth highest nationwide.

Arrests for theft ranked highest in juvenile arrest frequency in both Wisconsin and the Nation. Arrests of juveniles for burglary were eighth highest in Wisconsin and fourth highest in the Nation. Juvenile arrests for auto theft ranked tenth in both Wisconsin and the Nation. Arrests of juveniles for narcotic drug law violations were ninth highest in Wisconsin and fifth highest nationwide.

LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES

As of October 31, 1973, Wisconsin law enforcement agencies reporting directly to the Crime Information Bureau (As opposed to reporting through their local Sheriff's office) indicated a total of 9,706 full-time employees; full-time officers represented 87 percent of this total and civilians comprised 13 percent.

767 assaults on Wisconsin law enforcement officers; 66 percent involved some form of injury to the officer. Nationally, 40 percent of all assaults on officers were with injury as compared to an injury ratio of 27 percent in the North Central States.

9.1 assaults per 100 officers in Wisconsin as opposed to assault rates of 15.0 in the Nation and 15.9 in the North Central States.

83 percent of all assaults on Wisconsin law enforcement officers involved personal weapons such as hands, fists or feet as compared to an 80 percent proportion in both the Nation and the North Central States. Dangerous weapons other than cutting instruments or firearms were employed in 11 percent of the assaults in Wisconsin, 9 percent of those in the Nation and 8 percent of the assaults in the North Central States.

Assaults on Wisconsin law enforcement officers by type of activity closely paralleled the percentage distribution of assaults by type of activity experienced nationwide. 51 percent of the attacks on Wisconsin officers occurred while they were responding to disturbance calls or attempting other arrests* as compared to a 49 percent proportion throughout the Nation.

* The term "Attempting Other Arrests" is defined as arrests during situations other than robbery matters, burglary matters, disturbance calls, civil disorders or traffic matters.
