Juveniles Released from Wisconsin
Division of Corrections' Juvenile Institutions in 1974

H I G H L I G H T S

1. Juvenile male first-releases increased slightly more than one-third (36 percent) from 1973 to 1974. Re-releases remained at 1973 levels.
2. Juvenile female first-releases increased 76 percent over 1973 levels. Re-releases, however, continued to decrease.
3. Parents who were divorced or separated, widowed, or had never been married were reported for more than one-half (54 percent) of the first-released boys, 55 percent of the re-released boys, 54 percent of the first-released girls, and for more than three-fourths (76 percent) of the re-released girls. (See Table 7.)
4. About one-half of the first-released boys and girls (52 and 49 percent respectively) were from families reported to be in at least the lower-middle socio-economic brackets. This was also true for two-fifths of the re-released boys and girls. (See Table 8.)
5. Seven out of 10 first and re-released boys were reported to have made satisfactory progress while enrolled in institution educational programs. Four-fifths of the first-released girls and two-fifths of the re-released girls also made satisfactory educational progress. (See Table 9.)
6. Eight out of 10 boys and 7 out of 10 girls first-released to aftercare were white. One-third of the re-released boys and girls were white. (See Table 14.)

The downward trend in the number of youths released to aftercare supervision which was first noted in 1971 reversed during calendar year 1974. The increase reflects the earlier increase in youths admitted to juvenile correctional institutions during calendar year 1974.

Tables A through D report selected characteristics of first and re-released youths for the period 1970-1974. Tables 1 through 14 present data relating to youths released to aftercare supervision during 1974. Institution social service staff reported material contained in this publication to the Bureau of Planning, Development, and Research.

The average (mean) length of stay for first-released boys decreased from a five-year high of 10.1 months in 1973 to 9.5 months in 1974. Other characteristics have remained relatively stable during the past five years.

Slightly fewer than one-fifth (18 percent) of the girls first-released to aftercare supervision in 1974 went to placements in Milwaukee County; a low for the five-year period. The average (mean) length of stay for first-released girls remained relatively stable: 10.3 months in 1973 and 10.1 months in 1974. There has been little or no change in other selected characteristics during the past five years.

Boys re-released to aftercare supervision spent an average (mean) of 10.9 months in the institution. This is a high for the five-year period and an increase of .8 months over 1973. Other characteristics have remained relatively stable during the five-year period.
