

RECIDIVISTS COMMITTED TO THE VIRGINIA STATE PENAL SYSTEM

This report contains selected statistics for recidivists both committed to or confined in the Virginia State Penal System for fiscal year 1974. The report is divided into a narrative summary and statistical tables. The summary is a brief digest of significant facts and/or trends developed from an analysis of the recidivist data.

SECTION A

FELCN FRISONERS COMMITTED TO THE VIRGINIA PENITENTIARY
AND TO THE INDUSTRIAL FARM FOR WOMEN DURING THE
YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 1974 WHO PREVIOUSLY SERVED
FELONY SENTENCES IN THE VIRGINIA STATE PENAL SYSTEM

The following data deals only with recidivists who had served prior felony sentences in the Virginia Prison System. This includes those felons convicted and sentenced for three or more petty larceny offenses.

- NUMBER OF RECIDIVISTS: Among the 2,061 prisoners received on felon sentences during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1974, were 497 or 24 percent who had served one or more previous felon sentences in Virginia. After remaining constant at 17 percent for three years the recidivism rate has increased by 7 percent.
- RACE AND SEX: Of the 497 recidivists, 481 were male. Of the 956 white felon prisoners committed during the fiscal year, 181 or 19 percent were recidivists; of the 1,105 non-white felon prisoners committed, 316 or 29 percent were recidivists.
- PRIOR COMMITMENTS: Of the 497 recidivists, 374 or 75 percent had served one prior Virginia sentence; 89 or 18 percent had served two prior sentences; and 34 or 7 percent had served three or more prior sentences. This is compatible with last year's data.
- PAROLE OR PARDON STATUS: 104 or 21 percent of the repeaters were on parole at the time of committing the offense for which they were returned.

 Another 116 or 23 percent had been paroled from their last sentence but had been discharged from parole supervision prior to committing the new offense.
- OFFENSES: There were 227 or 46 percent of the recidivists committed for offenses against property; 202 or 40 percent for offenses against persons; and 14 percent for "other offenses." In 1973, 33 percent of the recidivists were committed for offenses against persons, and in 1972 only 30 percent.
- COURT COMMITTED FROM: As in past rears, the urban courts returned more repeaters to the State Penal System than did the rural courts.
- Analysis of data on the age of recidivists shows that 304 or 61 percent were in the 20-29 age bracket. The median age for recidivists this year was 27; last year's median age was 29.
- INTELLIGENCE: As noted in recent years, the intelligence level of recidivists has been increasing. For those for which test data is available, 51 percent were ranked as normal, 19 percent as dull normal, and 15 percent as borderline, moderately or severely retarded.

SECTION B

FELON PRISONERS COMMITTED TO THE VIRGINIA STATE PENAL SYSTEM DURING THE YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 1974 WHO PREVIOUSLY SERVED FELONY SENTENCES IN VIRGINIA AND/OR ELSEWHERE

The data in this section deals with recidivists who had served prior felony sentences either in Virginia, another state or the Federal Prison System.

NUMBER AND DISTRIBUTION: A review of data shows that of the 2,061 new felon commitments, 610 or 30 percent of the prisoners committed had served one or more felon sentences in the Virginia Penal System and/or elsewhere. Further analysis shows that 424 or 69.5 percent of the 610 had served one prior sentence, 131 or 21.5 percent had served two prior sentences and 55 or 9 percent had served three to nine prior felony sentences. A comparison with similar data for 1967-1973 indicates a gradual but steady decline in the overall percentage of repeaters who have served prior felony sentences until this year, when the recidivist rate jumped to 30 percent from last year's 23 percent rate.

SECTION C

PRIOR RECORD OF FELONS CONFINED IN THE VIRGINIA PENAL SYSTEM ON JUNE 30, 1974

The following data deals with prior felon sentences and juvenile records for the total felon population confined as of June 30, 1974.

- PRIOR VIRGINIA SENTENCE: On June 30, 1974, 1,551 or 28 percent of the 5,447
 felons confined had served one or more felony sentences in the Virginia
 Prison System. Further analysis showed that 1038 or 67 percent of
 these had served one prior sentence, 364 or 23 percent had served two
 prior sentences and 149 or 10 percent had served three or more prior
 sentences. In comparing the breakdown according to number of prior
 sentences served with recent years, the percentages have remained
 approximately the same.
- PRIOR SENTENCE: Of the total felon population, 1,949 or 36 percent had served one or more felon sentences in the Virginia Prison System and/or elsewhere as of June 30, 1974. A further breakdown of the 1,949 recidivists reveals that 1,172 or 60 percent had served one prior sentence, 497 or 26 percent had served two prior sentences, and 280 or 14 percent had served three to nine prior sentences.
- JUVENILE RECORD: Records as of June 30, 1974, reveal 2,486 or 46 percent of the total felon prison population had a record of juvenile delinquency while 2,558 or 47 percent had no record; prior juvenile record was unknown for 403 prisoners. Of the 46 percent who had a juvenile record, 1,268 or 51 percent had been committed to the Department of Welfare and Institutions as juveniles.
