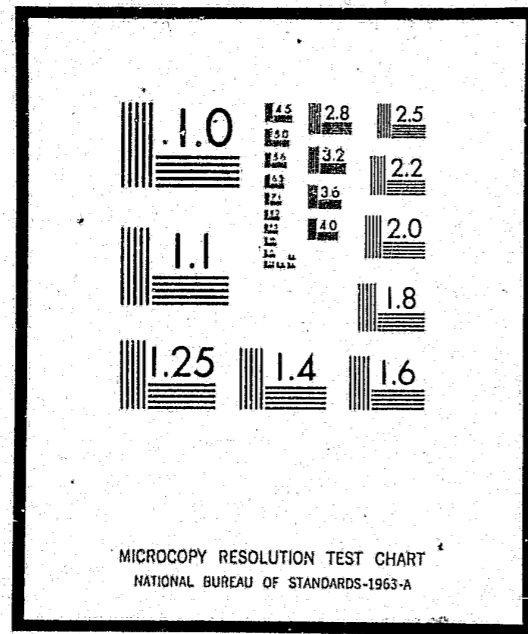

FOREWORD


Today, we as members of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department must be aware of the sweeping social changes that are affecting our future as law enforcement officers.

INTRODUCTION

Quite often, individuals desiring to further their education are faced with what appears to be an impossible task. Prospective students encounter a bewildering assortment of college catalogs which list hundreds of course offerings with a multitude of major and minor options. This tremendous amount of information may lead to indecision, procrastination or even failure to begin advanced schooling.

In compiling this catalog, every effort has been made to provide comprehensive and timely data on selected institutions. Each college and university in the Los Angeles County area was contacted and asked to provide current catalogs, bulletins and other relevant information for inclusion in this catalog. The eight major subject areas most frequently sought after by personnel of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department were found to be as follows: Administration of Justice (Police Science), Business Administration, Psychology, Sociology, English, History, Engineering and Political Science. Based upon such factors as relevancy of curriculum, location, and availability of financial aid, forty-six schools were selected for inclusion in this initial catalog. In addition, a section describing financial assistance and reimbursement programs with particular attention being given to eligibility requirements for personnel in need of educational financing is included. And, Peace Officers' Standards and Training (P.O.S.T.) requirements for various certification programs are delineated.

The purpose in preparing this catalog is to provide a reference source of local educational institutions. The schools and courses out-

lined herein are not intended to constitute an "approved" list, nor should they be construed as the only acceptable institutions or areas of study. If used properly, this catalog will be a valuable tool to assist personnel in planning their educational goals. However, it should not be used as a substitute for educational counseling which is available at colleges and universities.

CHAPTER I

COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY INFORMATION

COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY INFORMATION

Explanation of Data

Type of Institution. This section represents three main classifications of schools. First, the Community College, which is a two year institution offering Associate Degrees, Vocational Certificates, and Curriculums in preparation for transference to a four year college or university. Second, the four year college, which offers undergraduate and graduate courses leading to Bachelor's and Master's Degrees. And third, the University, which has similar offerings to the four year college but also offers specialized educational programs leading to Doctor's Degrees. Colleges and Universities are either privately or State operated.

Calendar. There are basically four systems referred to. First, the semester system is usually comprised of two twenty-week periods a year. Second, the trimester system encompasses three segments approximately fifteen weeks long. Third, the quarter system is composed of four ten-week periods of instruction. Fourth, the 4-1-4, which is four months, one month, and four months. The one-month session offers a condensed period of intensive study.

Enrollment. This is an approximation of attendance based on undergraduate, graduate and extension students in either full or part time enrollment.

Tuition. Fees shown represent estimated tuition reported by institutions for one academic year as paid by a typical full time undergraduate student. Recognizably, part time students will experience considerably less expenditures than those shown.

Class Scheduling. Refers to day classes and/or night classes which are offered at a particular institution.

Highest Degree Offered. Includes those degree programs for which institutions are accredited to offer.

Career Education Certificates. These certificates are granted for completion of vocational programs directed as specific skills or occupations. They are also referred to as Vocational Certificates.

Financial Aid Programs Available. The programs are referred to as V.A. (Veteran Administration), L.E.E.P. (Law Enforcement Educational Program), and Los Angeles County (Los Angeles County Reimbursement). These programs are fully explained in a latter section of the catalog as to qualifications and method of application. The three programs above are most often used by Departmental personnel. For additional programs, contact the Financial Aid Representative at the particular institution.

Extension Classes. An indication of either 'yes' or 'no' is made to show whether or not extension courses are offered at a particular institution. A full explanation is in a latter section of this catalog.

Dean of Admissions. That official overseeing the admission process of applicants to a particular institution.

Administration of Justice Rep. The designated representative of Police Science, Criminal Justice or Police Administration courses who on occasion acts as L.E.E.P. advisor.

Financial Aid Rep. The representative charged with administering the various financial assistance programs to students enrolled at a particular institution.

School and Course Numbers. The four digit numbers adjacent to the school names and courses will be used in the future to update personnel training records.

Map Numbers. The "Map #" on the school description sheets correspond to the school locations of the Los Angeles County map on page 52.

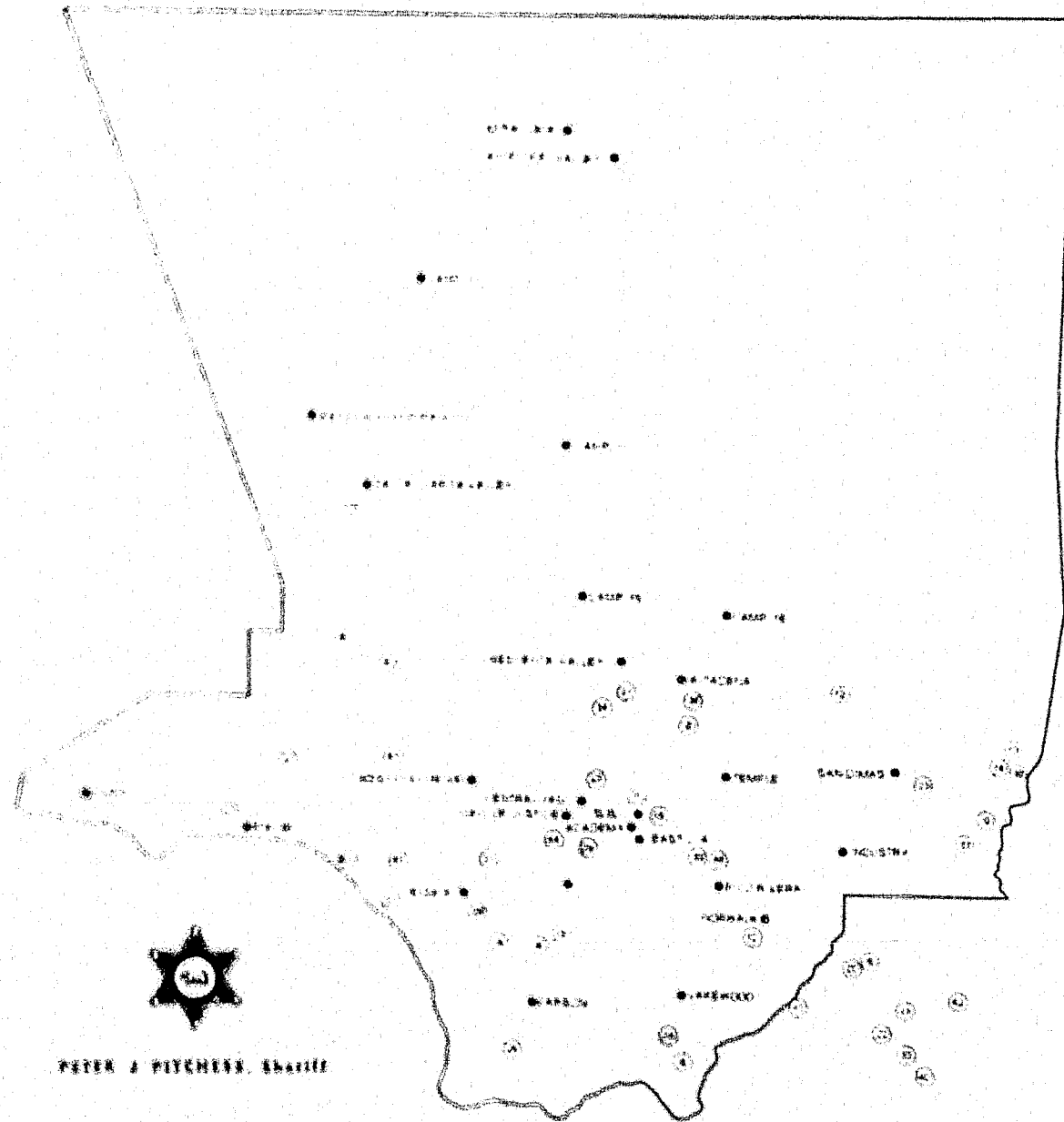

Law Schools

The following is a list of law schools located in the Los Angeles and Orange County areas. The schools are classified as to their status of accreditation. All law schools are required to meet certain academic and program standards as established by the Committee of Bar Examiners of the State Bar of California. Law schools that fully meet these standards are given a fully accredited status.

A law school may be provisionally accredited prior to obtaining full accreditation. This means it is subject to annual re-inspection by the Committee of Bar Examiners to determine if the school is capable of qualifying for fully accredited status.

An unaccredited law school may obtain preliminary approval. This signifies that, although the school does not meet the standards for provisional accreditation, it appears to have an organizational structure and program capable of qualifying in the near future.

Statistics have shown that a higher percentage of graduates from accredited schools pass the Bar Examination than graduates from unaccredited institutions. Also, graduates from major accredited law schools find it easier to obtain employment than unaccredited school graduates.

CHAPTER II

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Many financial assistance programs have been created to relieve and offset the financial burden of law enforcement personnel who are employed full time and simultaneously engaged in obtaining a formal education. These reimbursement programs are funded at the local, state and federal levels of government.

In the following sections, financial aid and monetary reimbursement programs will be explained. The provisions of the Los Angeles County Tuition Reimbursement, the Law Enforcement Educational Programs (both grants and loans) and the Veterans Financial Assistance plans will be explained in terms of applicant requirements and the allocations which can be expected from these funding agencies.

Los Angeles County Tuition Reimbursement

The Los Angeles County Administrative Code (Ordinance 4099, Article xxxiii, Section 631-649, Sheriff Education Advancement Program Financing) entitles Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department sworn personnel to receive reimbursement for both textbooks and tuition fees while attending a college or university. However, the maximum amount of tuition reimbursement changes annually and is based on a standard tuition rate set by the California State University System. Therefore, those attending a private institution may not be reimbursed for the total tuition costs if they are higher than these rates. Textbooks are handled separately

from tuition costs and may be reimbursed fully. Additionally, the \$20.00 application fee to a state college or university is reimbursable.

The employee will be reimbursed for educational costs upon receipt of a satisfactory grade ("C" or its equivalent) only if the employee is not receiving reimbursement to cover full tuition from any other agency, organization or association (e.g., Veterans Administration, L.E.E.P.). Reimbursement can be claimed no more than two semesters, trimesters, or quarters for each fiscal year, with a maximum of two classes each semester, trimester or quarter.

To be eligible for this program, employees must submit an Application for General Education Reimbursement (SH-AD-504) at the beginning of the semester or quarter to the Educational Reimbursement Unit, Training Bureau. At the conclusion of the class period, three copies of a Claim for General Education Reimbursement (SH-AD-506) must be submitted to that unit, along with a copy of your grades and receipts or copies of cancelled checks for textbooks.

Tuition Reimbursement - Master's Programs

The County of Los Angeles grants full tuition reimbursement to its employees who are taking approved graduate courses for credit at a state college or university. The County will not reimburse for courses taken at private institutions unless it can be established that these courses are not available at a state college or university. Curriculum outlines of the selected Master's Programs must be submitted to the Training and Education Records Unit, Training Bureau, by October of the current year

to be eligible for the next fiscal year (July 1).

As in the General Reimbursement Program, graduate program students must receive a grade of "C" or its equivalent and not be receiving any other governmental education funding.

Tuition Reimbursement - Seminars

Sworn Sheriff's Department personnel may be reimbursed for tuition paid for a seminar or special course taken on the employee's own time, when the subject matter is applicable to Sheriff's Department business and when the tuition for the class is less than \$100.00. The application procedure is the same as in the General Reimbursement Program.

Law Enforcement Education Program

Under provisions of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968, the Law Enforcement Education Program (L.E.E.P.) makes available numerous grants and loans to officers attending institutions of higher education in the Los Angeles area.

Loans

To qualify for a L.E.E.P. loan, an officer must be academically classified as a full time student (15 semester units, 12 trimester units, or 12 quarter units) and must be enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate program leading to a degree with a major directly related to law enforcement (e.g., Police Science, Police Administration, Judicial Administra-

tion). A qualified officer may be granted a general loan up to a maximum of \$1,800 per academic year.

The officer must sign an agreement to remain in the service of his employing law enforcement agency for four years following completion of the academic year for which loan funds were provided. The loan agreement contains a clause that provides loan cancellation at the rate of 25% of the total (original) amount of the loan plus 7% per annum simple interest after the granting of the loan. Failure to remain in law enforcement obligates repayment of the loan at 7% simple interest per annum on the unpaid balance in regular payments of not less than \$50.00 per month, billed quarterly.

Grants

To qualify for a L.E.E.P. grant, an officer must be enrolled in graduate or undergraduate course(s) which are suitable for a person employed in law enforcement, and can be accredited toward an Associate, Bachelor's, or Graduate Degree. A grant recipient need not be enrolled in a degree program, and need not be academically classified as a full time student. However, his Division Commander, Watch Commander, or Immediate Supervisor must certify on the grant application that the grant recipient "will be taking courses in . . . an area suitable for persons employed in law enforcement", including Business Administration, Psychology, Economics, English Composition, Computer Science and Accounting.

Furthermore, any course which will improve the "job skills, work ability, and/or overall job functioning" of the officer or upgrade his

"general education level" may be considered suitable for a person employed in law enforcement.

A L.E.E.P. grant makes available funds for payment of tuition and fees not to exceed \$200.00 per academic quarter, or \$300.00 per semester. Books and supplies are not included in a grant. The officer must sign an agreement to remain in the service of his employing law enforcement agency for two years following completion of the academic year for which grant funds were provided. Upon completion of this two year period, the entire loan will completely diminish and contract agreements will end. Failure to fulfill this agreement obligates immediate repayment on a loan basis at 7% simple interest per annum on the unpaid balance in regular payments of not less than \$50.00 per month, billed quarterly.

Eligible officers may apply for and receive L.E.E.P. grants and loans concurrently. No one may receive Veteran's Educational Benefits while receiving a L.E.E.P. grant. However, an officer may receive Veteran's Educational Benefits while receiving a L.E.E.P. loan.

Veteran's Educational Benefits

Under the provisions of Chapter 34, Title 38, U.S. Code, qualifying veterans are eligible to receive educational benefits for attending college or participating in vocational training.

To be eligible, applicants must have served more than 180 consecu-

tive days on active duty (except reserve training) in a branch of the United States Armed Forces and must have received a discharge under honorable conditions.

Veterans accrue 1-1/2 months eligibility for each month of active duty, with a maximum eligibility of 36 months. Generally speaking, veterans must use their VA benefits within eight years and one day from their date of discharge, or lose eligibility. Only veterans discharged after June 1, 1966, are presently entitled to VA educational benefits. However, many veterans are still eligible to receive benefits under VA laws passed prior to 1966, but only under special circumstances.

To apply for VA benefits for the first time, contact the Veteran's secretary or counselor at the school you plan to attend and obtain an Application for Training (Form 22E-1990).

After completing this form, return it, along with a copy of your DD-214, to the Veteran's secretary. To avoid unnecessary delays, it is advisable to include copies of your marriage certificate and children's birth certificates. Under normal circumstances, the applications take from four to six weeks to be processed. Use your entire legal name when completing VA forms and in all correspondence with the VA.

The VA allows participating veterans to change majors and programs two times, without counseling, while receiving educational benefits. To avoid losing your eligibility because of program changes, use general terms to describe educational goals (e.g., Bachelor's Degree, Master's Degree, Ph.D.). When changing programs, schools, or number of dependents, contact the Veteran's secretary at the school you last attended and

complete a Change of Location Application (Form 22E-1995). Your previous school should fill out a Notice of Change in Student Status (Form 22E-1999b) and give it to you to be forwarded with your Change of Location Application.

When changing your home address, write to the VA and notify the Veteran's secretary at your school. Also notify the postmaster at your old address so your check will be forwarded. The postmaster will return your check to the VA unless he is aware of your move.

Once it has been determined that you are eligible for Veteran's benefits, you will receive a certification letter which will contain your identification claim number, the amount of monthly benefits to be paid, and what period of time you will be eligible for VA benefits.

Approximately one month before the end of a certification period you will receive an IBM card (Certificate of Attendance) that should be completed and returned. If this card is not returned, you will be asked to return all funds paid during the certification period and you will not receive any additional VA funds.

ADDITIONAL TRAINING AND EDUCATION

Peace Officer's Standards and Training

Recently, P.O.S.T. has limited the number of courses for which certificates are awarded. Due to this policy, certification will generally be limited to basic, intermediate, advanced, supervisory training, management course,

Peace Officer's Standards and Training

The Commission provides such services to law enforcement as are authorized by law.

P.O.S.T. Certified Courses are designed to fulfill many of the standards and specialized training required by personnel to effectively operate and raise the education level of law enforcement. Recently, P.O.S.T. has limited the number of courses for which certificates are awarded. Due to this policy, certification will generally be limited to basic, intermediate, advanced, supervisory training, management course,

and executive development.

The requirements for these certificates are explained in detail below. And, tables are provided for a quick analysis of individual eligibility for the intermediate and advanced certificates.

Basic Certificate

To obtain this certificate, a minimum of 200 hours of Academy training is required.

Intermediate and Advanced Certificates

Any combination of experience, training points, and education points, as listed in the following table, is required to obtain an intermediate or advanced certificate:

Supervisors' Certificate - Sergeants

Those persons promoted to Sergeant must complete the Sergeant Supervisors' Course within 18 months of promotion to obtain the Supervisors' Certificate.

Management Certificate - Lieutenants or above

Candidates must either possess or be eligible to possess the Advanced Certificate. It is necessary to have a Bachelor's Degree or an Associate Degree, or no less than 60 college semester units. Successful completion of the Middle Management Course with at least two years as a manager or Assistant Department Head is also required. The above criteria must be met within five years prior to date of application.

Executive Certificate - Department Head

To obtain the Executive Certificate, the applicant must possess or be eligible to possess the Advanced Certificate as well as having either a Bachelor's Degree or Associate Degree, or no less than 60 college units. It is necessary to have completed the Executive Development Course and served as a Department Head for a period of two years. The above criteria must be completed within five years prior to application.

Education Points

Education points are accredited on the basis of one semester unit being equal to one education point, and one quarter unit equal to two-thirds of an education point. College credit may be counted for either

training points or education points, whichever is to the advantage of the applicant.

Training Points

Twenty classroom hours of Academy training approved by the Commission will equal one training point.

Selected Educational Programs

A number of local colleges and universities offer programs to satisfy the needs of persons desiring specialized continuing education. Offerings are in all categories of education to allow for an expanded background and field of experience for the student.

Courses are normally presented at off campus facilities for both credit and non-credit. Convenience for the student to avail themselves of these courses is a prime consideration.
