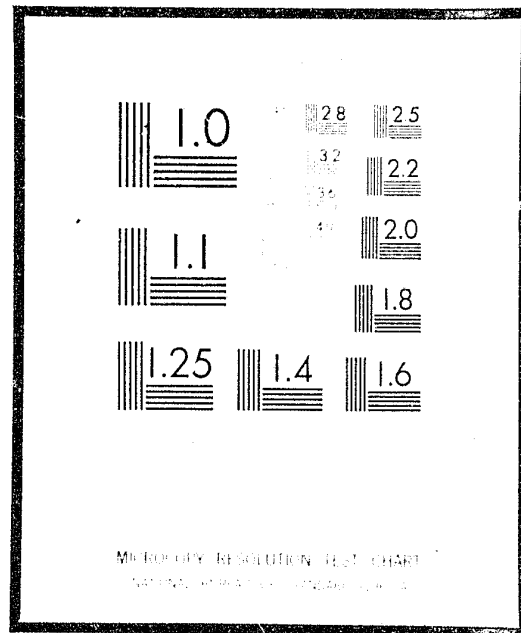

New admissions for boys continued to increase (8.7% in 1974, 14% in 1973) from a five year low in 1972 when "community corrections" and "intervention" were popular concepts.

New admissions for girls decreased 31% in 1974 as compared with 1973. This reflects a five year trend in the Wisconsin Juvenile Justice System of not institutionalizing girls for truancy and running away, girls' primary methods of anti-social behavior.

Male readmissions decreased 16% from 1973. While the rate of readmissions has declined since 1970, it is interesting to note that the average "total" length of stay for boys has remained about the same. When the juvenile institutions were overcrowded (late 60's, early 70's) boys stayed at the juvenile institutions for about one school semester, but were usually readmitted for another semester stay, for a total of about 10-11 months. As population pressures decreased, the average length of stay approached two consecutive semesters, for no increase in total time in the institutions, but readmissions decreased markedly.
