The information in the following annual statistical report was compiled by the Department of Corrections, Bureau of Management Information. All questions, remarks or requests relating to the report should be directed to this agency.

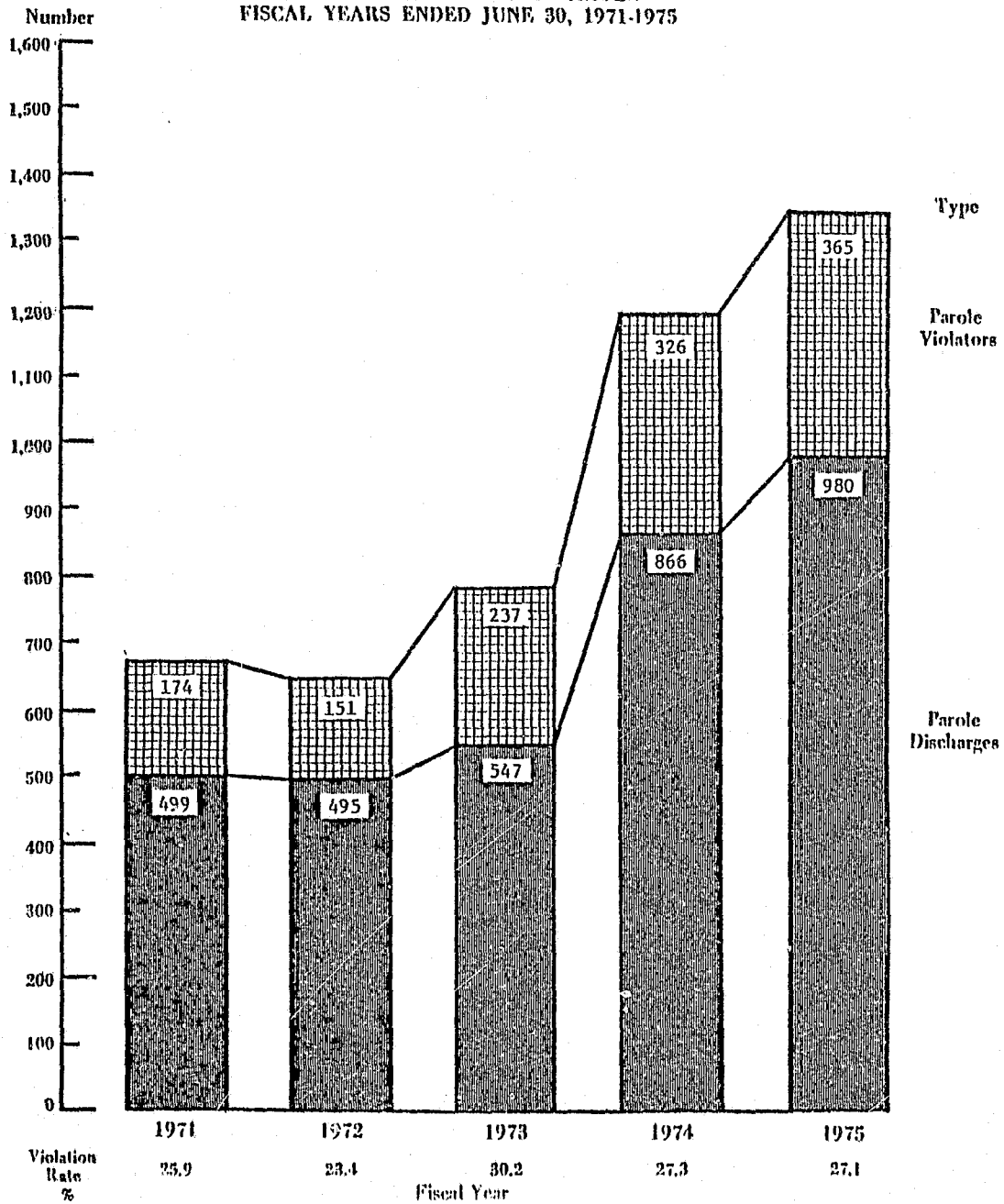

REPORT OF PERSONS DISCHARGED FROM PAROLE
AND PERSONS VIOLATING PAROLE
FISCAL YEAR ENDED
JUNE 30, 1975

This report contains statistical data on persons discharged from parole and who violated parole during fiscal year 1975 in Virginia. The parole officers in the twenty-three Probation and Parole Districts of the Commonwealth submitted data to the Bureau of Management Information on parolees under their supervision who were discharged or violated parole conditions.

During fiscal year 1975, two new Probation and Parole Districts were created. District Twenty-Two was formerly part of District Fourteen, and District Twenty-Three was previously part of District Three.

The total number of persons discharged from or violating parole increased from 1,192 in fiscal 1974 to 1,345 in fiscal 1975, a 12.8 percent increase. Discharges from parole went from 866 to 980, a 13.2 percent increase, while parole violations showed an increase of 12.0 percent, going from 326 to 365.

PAROLE VIOLATORS

District and Violation Type

Parole violators (365) represented 27.1 percent of the total persons released. This violation rate shows little change from the previous year's rate of 27.3 percent. District One reported the highest number of violations (94). Every district had at least one violation reported, in comparison to fiscal year 1974 when three districts had no violations.

An evaluation of the distribution of violations by type shows that of all violators reported, 44.7 percent committed felonies, 16.7 percent committed misdemeanors, 14.2 percent broke regulations and 24.4 percent absconded. The number of parolees who broke regulations (52) remained the same as fiscal 1974, with the percentage for this type slightly decreasing (15.9 to 14.2). Total absconders decreased from 104 in fiscal 1974 to 89 in fiscal 1975, with a similar percentage decrease (31.9 to 24.4). District One had the highest number of violations in each category with 30 felonies, 15 misdemeanors, 20 persons who broke parole regulations, and 29 parolees who absconded. The 94 violations in District One represented 25.8 percent of the total violations reported, while the same district carried 21.1 percent of the average parole supervision caseload during fiscal 1975.¹

Race and Sex

Thirteen persons who violated parole were female and 352 were male. The violators were 71.8 percent non-white and 28.2 percent white, compared to 62.3 percent non-white and 37.7 percent white in fiscal year 1974. Violations by type for non-white violators ranged from 126, or 48.1 percent, on felony offenses to 37, or 14.1 percent, on misdemeanor charges. The white violators varied from a high of 37, or 35.9 percent, with felony offenses to a low of 12, or 11.7 percent, who broke regulations.

Marital Status

As in fiscal year 1974, the majority of the parole violators were single (253, or 69.3 percent). There were 39 married persons violating parole, or 10.7 percent. Further analysis shows that 89.3 percent of the violators were either single, separated, divorced, or widowed. Married parolees had a violation rate of 17.3 percent versus a violation rate for all other persons of 29.1 percent.

Length of Sentence

For parole violators the median length of sentence at the time of parole, including any additional sentences received after commitment, was 6-9 years (this compares to a median of five years in fiscal year 1974). The most frequent length of sentence again fell into the four year category with 50 occurrences. It should be noted that of the sixteen persons with life sentences who were released from parole by discharge or violation, 8 of these violated their parole, a 50 percent violation rate. An analysis of violation rates by length of sentence (Table XIII) indicates that the violation rate tends to increase as the sentence length increases.

Other Significant Statistics

Among the characteristics most frequently displayed by parole violators in fiscal year 1975 were: age at time of parole, 20-24 years (119 or 32.6 percent); offense at last conviction prior to parole, Robbery or Attempted Robbery (90 or 24.7 percent), and Burglary or Break and Enter (89 or 24.4 percent); time served in prison prior to parole, over one year but less than three years (158 or 43.3 percent); time remaining to be served on sentence when paroled, over one year but less than three years (125 or 34.2 percent); time on parole before violation, seven to twelve months (97 or 26.6 percent); habits, occasional drinker and no record of drug use (123 or 33.7 percent); normal intelligence (153 or 42.5 percent of those tested); one appearance before parole board prior to parole (228 or 62.5 percent); work record on parole, frequently idle because of own laxity (106 or 29.0 percent), and steady, satisfied with work (105 or 28.8 percent). In addition, the mean for the educational achievement test score for parole violators who were tested was 6.9, reflecting a seventh grade average. The educational test is administered at the time of initial commitment to the Department of Corrections.

Juvenile Record

Of the 365 violators, 211 or 57.8 percent had known juvenile records, a slight decrease from last year when 58.6 percent had known juvenile records. A separate study made of only those persons released from parole by discharge or violation with juvenile records shows that they displayed a slightly higher violation rate (33.1 percent) than the total persons released (27.1 percent). However, in comparing the studies, the parolees involved generally exhibited the same characteristics statistically.

PAROLEES DISCHARGED

The Division of Probation and Parole Services discharged 980 persons from its supervision in Virginia during fiscal year 1975. In addition there were 203 persons on parole from the Virginia Penal System who resided in other states at the time of their discharge or upon their death. This report does not reflect these 203 parolees, since they reported to parole officers not under Virginia's jurisdiction.

Race and Sex

Of the 980 parolees discharged within the state in fiscal year 1975, 917 or 93.6 percent were male, and 63 or 6.4 percent were female. Non-whites accounted for 516 or 52.7 percent of the total, with white parolees who were discharged numbering 464, or 47.3 percent. This compares with a racial distribution in fiscal 1974 of 57.5 percent non-white and 42.5 percent white.

Marital Status

Single parolees who were discharged numbered 534, or 54.5 percent, while those who were married, living with spouse, represented only 19.1 percent (187). This contrasts to 10.7 percent of parole violators being married, living with spouse. The unmarried parolees (single, separated, divorced, widowed) accounted for 80.9 percent of all discharges.

Length of Sentence

At the time of their parole, 69.3 percent of the parolees discharged in fiscal year 1975 had a total sentence of five years or less. The most frequent sentence was three years, representing 18.3 percent of all discharges (the three year sentence was also the most common in fiscal 1974, with 19.5 percent). The second most frequent sentence was five years, numbering 169, or 17.2 percent. This year, only eight parolees, or 0.8 percent, with life sentences were discharged from parole supervision. Last year 16 parolees with life sentences, 1.8 percent, received discharges.

Offense

At the time of their last conviction in Virginia, 23.2 percent of the parolees discharged in fiscal year 1975 received sentences for Burglary, or Break and Enter, while 18.6 percent had convictions for Violation of Narcotic Laws and 13.5 percent were in custody for Robbery or Attempted Robbery. As shown last year, these three offense categories accounted for slightly more than half of all parolees discharged.

Time Served, Time Remaining to be Served, and Time on Parole

Prior to their parole from the Virginia Penal System, 86.6 percent of the parolees discharged this year had completed less than five years of their sentences. The remaining sentence to be served at parole time was less than five years for 84.2 percent of this year's parolees being discharged. The category of over one year, less than three years was the most frequent in both time served prior to parole and time remaining to be served, with 46.9 percent and 42.0 percent, respectively. Of the parolees discharged 37.4 percent spent 13 to 18 months on parole supervision.

Educational Level and Intelligence

For the discharged parolees who were tested for educational level at the time of their initial commitment, the mean test score was 7.8, representative of an eighth grade level. An evaluation of the intelligence scores shows that both the mode and the median lie in the normal or 90 to 109 IQ range, this category describing 386 parolees, or 40.5 percent of the total tested. The second most frequent intelligence range was 80 to 89, dull normal, with 215 (22.6 percent of those tested).

Juvenile Record

Of the parolees discharged in fiscal year 1975, 43.6 percent had known juvenile records, an increase from the previous year's frequency of 38.1 percent. For 169 discharges, or 17.2 percent, there was no information available concerning their juvenile record.

FIVE YEAR TRENDS

During the past five fiscal years, the total number of persons released from parole by discharge or violation has almost doubled, going from 673 in fiscal 1971 to 1,345 in fiscal 1975, a 99.9 percent increase. Only one year, fiscal 1972, registered a decrease from the previous fiscal year (673 to 646, a 4.0 percent decrease). Fiscal year 1974 experienced by far the largest change, increasing by 52.0 percent from 784 in fiscal 1973 to 1,192.

The number of parolees discharged from supervision has increased over the last five fiscal years from 499 in fiscal 1971 to 980 in fiscal 1975, a percentage increase of 96.4. Again, only fiscal year 1972 showed a decline in discharges (499 to 495, a 0.8 percent decrease). Fiscal 1974 again showed the biggest increment (547 to 866, a 58.3 percent increase).

Parole violations have more than doubled during the fiscal years 1971 through 1975, increasing by 109.8 percent from 174 to 365. Fiscal years 1971 and 1972 both showed decreases in violations (191 to 174, an 8.9 percent decrease; and 174 to 151, a 13.2 percent decrease, respectively) while fiscal year 1973 registered the greatest increase during the five year period (151 to 237, a 57.0 percent increase). An analysis of the violation rates during this time period shows that the rate peaked at 30.2 in fiscal 1973, and has decreased during each subsequent year.

APPENDIX III
DEFINITIONS RELATIVE TO PERSONS DISCHARGED FROM PAROLE
AND PERSONS VIOLATING PAROLE

- I. *Person Violating Parole* -- For purpose of this report, a person violating parole is defined as:
- a. An individual who is being charged with failing to comply with one or more conditions of their parole; or
 - b. An individual who has failed to comply with one or more conditions of their parole, and has had their parole revoked.
- The types of violations are as follows:
- a. Felony - the parolee has been convicted of an offense which carries a sentence of at least one year in the penitentiary.
 - b. Misdemeanor - the parolee has been convicted of an offense that carries a maximum sentence of twelve months in jail.
 - c. Broke Regulation - the parolee has violated one or more of the technical conditions of their parole.
 - d. Absconder - a person who has broken contact with the parole officer and whose whereabouts are unknown.

- II. *Person Discharged From Parole* -- The individual has satisfactorily complied with the terms of his or her parole and has been released from parole supervision.

- III. *Violation Rate* -- In any particular category, the violation rate is calculated as:

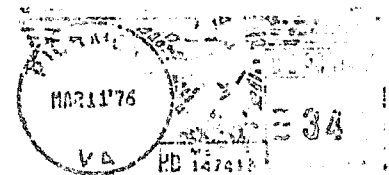
$$\frac{PV}{PV + PD} = VR$$

Where PV = Parole Violators
PD = Parole Discharges
VR = Violation Rate

Violation rates are expressed as percentages.

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
