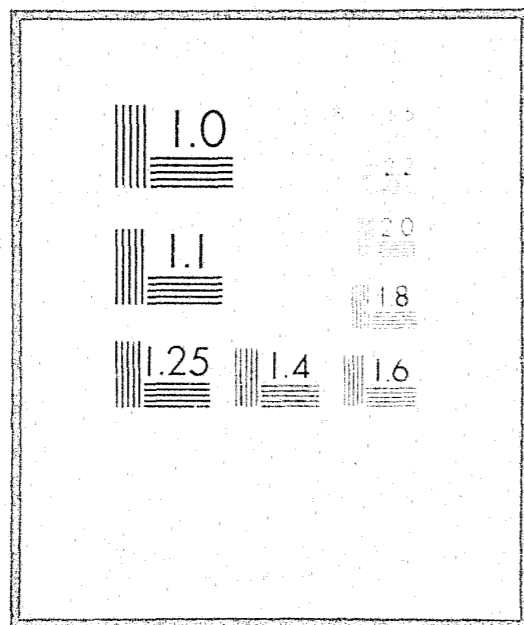


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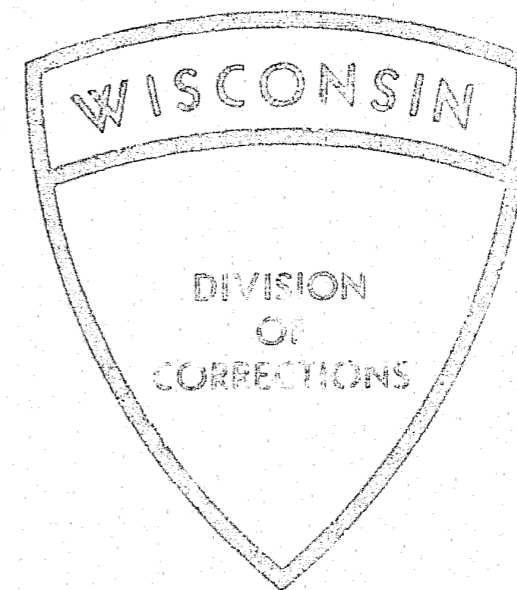

RESIDENTS IN WISCONSIN  
ADULT CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS  
ON DECEMBER 31, 1975  
WITH FIVE-YEAR TRENDS FOR 1971-1975

This bulletin contains information concerning 2,867 male and 125 female residents in Wisconsin adult correctional institutions on December 31, 1975. Adult males were housed in Wisconsin State Prison, Wisconsin State Reformatory, Wisconsin Correctional Institution, Kettle Moraine Correctional Institution, and the nine camps of the Wisconsin Correctional Camp System for the entire year of 1975. Beginning July 21, 1975 males were also housed in the Wisconsin Home for Women. All females resided at the Wisconsin Home for Women. Effective April 9, 1976 the Wisconsin Home for Women will be renamed Taycheedah Correctional Institution.

The increase in population over 1974 was 14.6 percent for males and 45.4 percent for females. Residents convicted of felonies comprised about 99 percent of the population, an increase of 0.6 percentage point from last year. The misdemeanor and sex deviate categories remained virtually unchanged, while "not reported" (those residents held temporarily pending revocation hearings) decreased 0.5 percentage point from a year ago.

About 83.5 percent of the male residents were new admissions, up three percentage points from 1974. Readmissions with new sentences for males declined by 1.6 percentage points, to 11.1 percent. Readmissions without new sentences decreased by one percentage point to 5.3 percent. New admissions for females remain nearly constant at 94.4 percent, with virtually no change in the year-ago statistics for each readmission category.

White males, including those of Mexican origin, showed a 2.4 percentage point decrease from last year. The Black male population rose by that proportion, to 36.9 percent. White females, including those of Mexican origin, decreased 5.7 percentage points, to 43.2 percent, reflecting the rise in non-white population. Black females increased by 9.1 percentage points over 1974, while Native American and other races declined 3.4 percentage points.

Median age of adult male residents declined very slightly to 25.5 years. Median age within Wisconsin Correctional Institution increased by 1.2 years and within Kettle Moraine Correctional Institution decreased by 2.0 years from 1974. The 37 males at the Home for Women had a median age of 21.7 years. Female adults resident on December 31, 1975 had a median age of 26.1 years, six months older than a year ago. Nearly 73 percent of all adult residents were under age 30.

Those resident males with sentences of less than five years decreased less than a percentage point, to 41.7 percent; those with sentences five less than 10 years increased one percentage point, to 29.4 percent since last year. Female residents sentenced less than five years represent 56.8 percent of their population, a 1.3 percentage point decrease from 1974. Females with five, less than 10 year sentences increased 6.1 percentage points to 22.4 percent. Female life sentence residents increased 1.7 percentage points, to 8.1 percent.

Adult males resident in Wisconsin institutions less than one year represent 49.3 percent of their population, a decrease of two percentage points from 1974. Those in residence five years, less than 10 are 4.2 percent, an increase of one percentage point from a year ago. Females resident less than one year comprise 72 percent of their population, an increase of 10.4 percentage points from a year ago. Those females resident one year, less than 18 months declined to 12.8 percent, a decrease of 8.1 percentage points from 1974 figures. Other lengths of stay remained relatively unchanged.

Offenses for which most male residents were committed remain reasonably in the same proportions over the last five years. Robbery (including armed) has risen from 20.8 percent in 1971 to 25.7 percent in 1975. Forgery and worthless checks have steadily declined from 8.0 percent in 1971 to 5.8 percent in 1975. Selected offenses against persons, murder, manslaughter, robbery, and assault for male residents has risen from 34.0 percent in 1971 to 40.1 percent in 1975.

Robbery shows significant steady increase as the major offense of female residents, rising from 7.3 percent in 1971 to 17.6 percent in 1975. Selected offenses against persons, murder, manslaughter, robbery, and assault for females has risen from 34.0 percent in 1971 to 41.6 percent in 1975.

Eight of Wisconsin's 72 counties were responsible for committing 75.1 percent of the male residents. No other county committed more than two percent of the total population. Milwaukee County contributed 50.8 percent, an increase of two percentage points over 1974.

Seven counties had committed 85.6 percent of the adult female population. No other county had committed more than one female resident on December 31, 1975. Milwaukee County commitments represent 66.4 percent of the females, an increase of 12.9 percentage points over last year.
