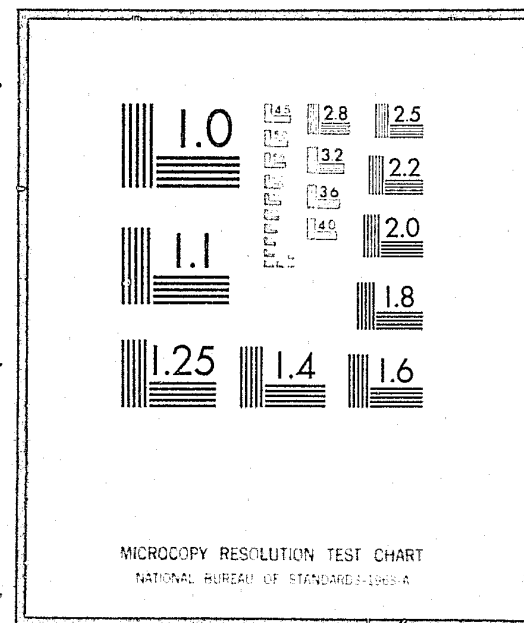

Residents in Wisconsin  
Juvenile Correctional Institutions  
on June 30, 1976  
With Five Year Trends for 1972-1976

There have been several changes in Wisconsin juvenile correctional facilities since publication of the last statistical bulletin on juvenile institutional resident population. The Wisconsin School for Girls, which had been co-educational, closed on June 29, 1976. Goodland Camp, on the grounds of Mendota Mental Health Institute, opened on the same date to house the last few girls who transferred out of WSG. Two institutions received name changes on May 5, 1976. Lincoln Boys School was renamed Lincoln Hills School, recognizing it as being co-educational. Wisconsin School for Boys, which continues to house only males, was renamed Ethan Allen School. Camp Flambeau continues as a boy's facility.

The proportion of white youth has declined from a year ago. White boys decreased by 6.2 percentage points, to currently represent 65.6 percent of the juvenile male population, while white girls declined by 13.8 percentage points, to 63.3 percent of the girls' total.

The median age of juvenile males has decreased only slightly, from 16.7 to 16.6 years, since June 30, 1975. Median age of female residents, however, decreased by six months, from 16.8 to 16.3 years, during the one-year interval.

Milwaukee County committed 34.7 percent of the juvenile male and 23.4 percent of the juvenile female institutional residents. These figures show little change from last year.

The 646 boys residing within correctional facilities on June 30, 1976 represent a five-year high, although there are only five more residents than last year. Juvenile female population is at a five-year low at 47. The decrease of only two girls since 1975 appears to indicate a leveling of juvenile female correctional population.

Those youth who have resided within a Wisconsin correctional facility for 6 months or more have declined to a five-year low for both boys and girls. Currently over two-thirds of the boys and four-fifths of the girls have stayed less than 6 months.

Newly committed boys are 78 percent of the male population, a one percentage point drop from last year. Returns from aftercare are 21 percent of the population, which is less than one-half the 44 percent that returns represented in 1972.

Juvenile girls returned from aftercare are currently 30 percent of the residents, which also is a significant drop from the 44 percent of 1972. Newly committed females remain nearly the same as last year at 63.8 percent.
