

RESIDENTS IN WISCONSIN CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS ON DECEMBER 31, 1976 WITH FIVE-YEAR TRENDS FOR 1972-1976

The resident population of Wisconsin adult correctional institutions on December 31, 1976, was made up of 3,119 males and 139 females. Males resided at Wisconsin State Prison, Wisconsin State Reformatory, Wisconsin Correctional Institution, Kettle Moraine Correctional Institution, Taycheedah Correctional Institution and the nine camps of the Wisconsin Correctional Camp System. Taycheedah Correctional Institution also housed females and a female camp was opened April 9, 1976, named Women's Community Center.

The adult male population increased by 8.8 percent over a year ago, while females increased by 11.2 percent. Residents convicted of felonies continue to comprise nearly 99 percent of the population.

The admission status of residents remains virtually unchanged for both males and females. New admissions for males are 83.6 percent of their population. Newly admitted females remain at 94.4 percent.

White males, including those of Mexican origin, decreased by 1.6 percentage points from 1975, to 58.6 percent of their population. Black males increased by 2.1 percentage points. White females, including those of Mexican origin, decreased by 4.4 percentage points, to 38.8 percent.

Median age of adult males is currently 25.0 years; a year ago it was 25.5 years. Age of adult females also declined, to 25.7 from 26.1 years. Seventy-three percent of all residents are under age 30, virtually unchanged from a year ago. Currently 50 percent of the residents are under 25 years, which is a 2.5 percentage point increase over 1975 figures.

Length of sentence patterns show no significant changes from last year. The median length of sentence excluding life, indeterminate (sex deviate) sentences, and those on temporary hold decreased 0.1 year (to 5.9 years) for males, and increased 0.1 year (to 4.0 years) for females.

Adult males resident in Wisconsin institutions less than one year represent 45.8 percent of their population, a decrease of 3.5 percentage points from

one year ago. Those males resident 1 year less than 2 years increased 2.5 percentage points, to 28.2 percent. Median months residence in institution since last admission rose from 12.3 to 13.5 for males.

Adult females resident less than one year declined sharply from 71.0 percent to a current 54.7 percent of their population. Those resident 1 year less than 2 years increased from 16.0 percent to 33.8 percent. The median months in institution since last admission reflects this change, rising from 6.7 months to 11.0 months for female residents.

Table 3, showing offenses for which residents were committed, was expanded beginning with the June 30, 1976 resident population bulletin. The current list separates first degree murder from second and third degree combined. Attempted murder is now reported separately. These offenders previously were reported either as "murder" or "all other." Direct comparisons with previous years should take this change into account.

The former category of "robbery" is now distinguished as "armed" and "unarmed." Direct comparisons to previous publications can be made by adding the two groups. Robbery, armed and unarmed, continues to increase for males, representing 26.9 percent of the current resident admissions. Burglary, however, declined somewhat, to 25.4 percent. Auto theft and assault also declined, while theft except auto, other sex offenses, and drug violations all increased slightly, reaching highs for the five-year period (See Table A).

Wisconsin statutes relating to rape and intercourse with a child were revised July 1, 1976. The law now provides for four degrees of sexual assault which are not directly comparable to any previous categories.

As it was last year, the same eight of Wisconsin's 72 counties were responsible for committing exactly 75.1 percent of the male residents. Within those eight, however, there were changing proportions. Milwaukee County commitments decreased 1.5 percentage points to 49.3 percent of the population. Racine County increased 1.3 percentage points to 6.0 percent. Other counties fluctuated less than one-half a percentage point. The top twelve counties committed nearly 80 percent of the residents.


