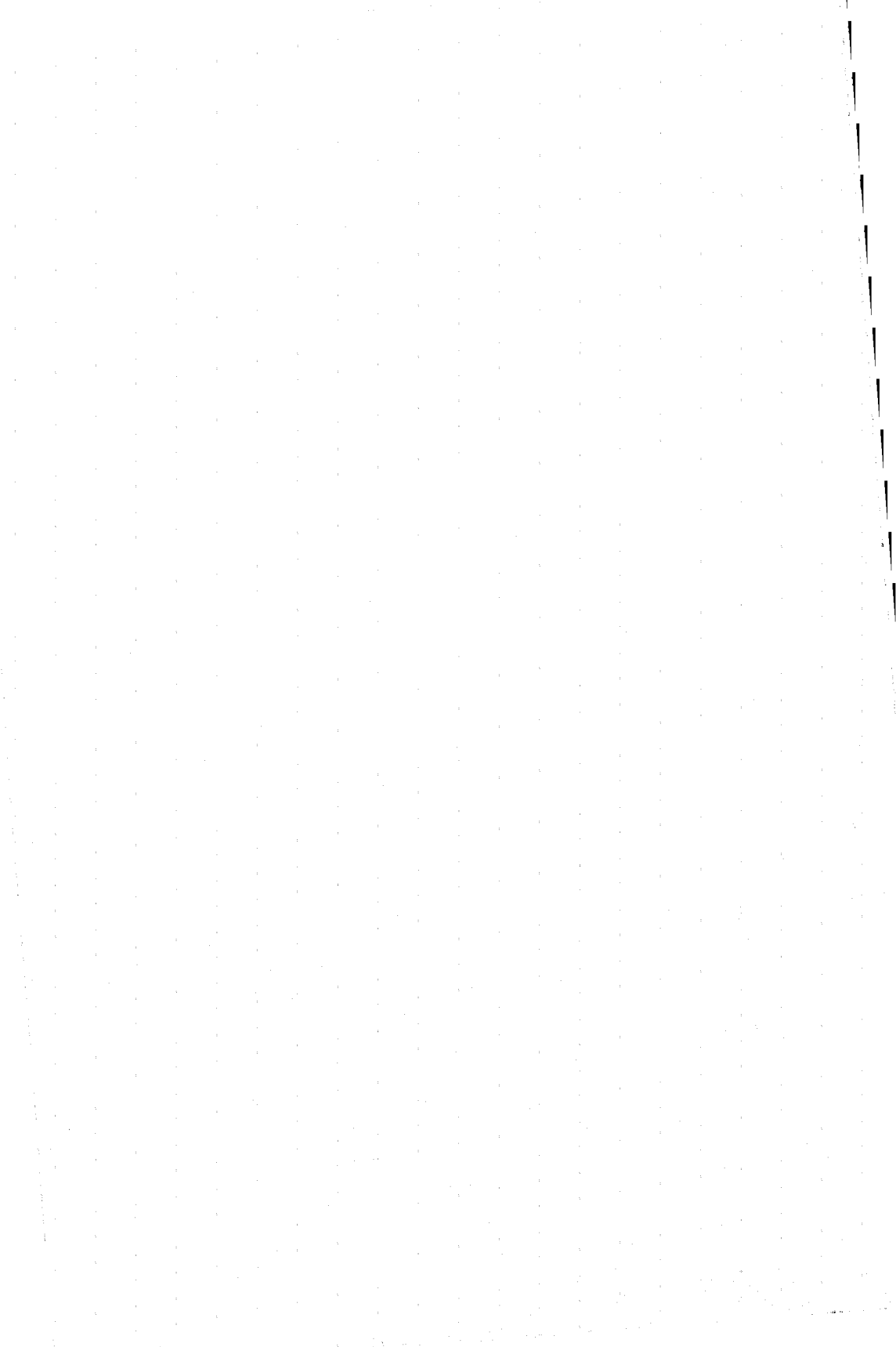

Audio Cassettes

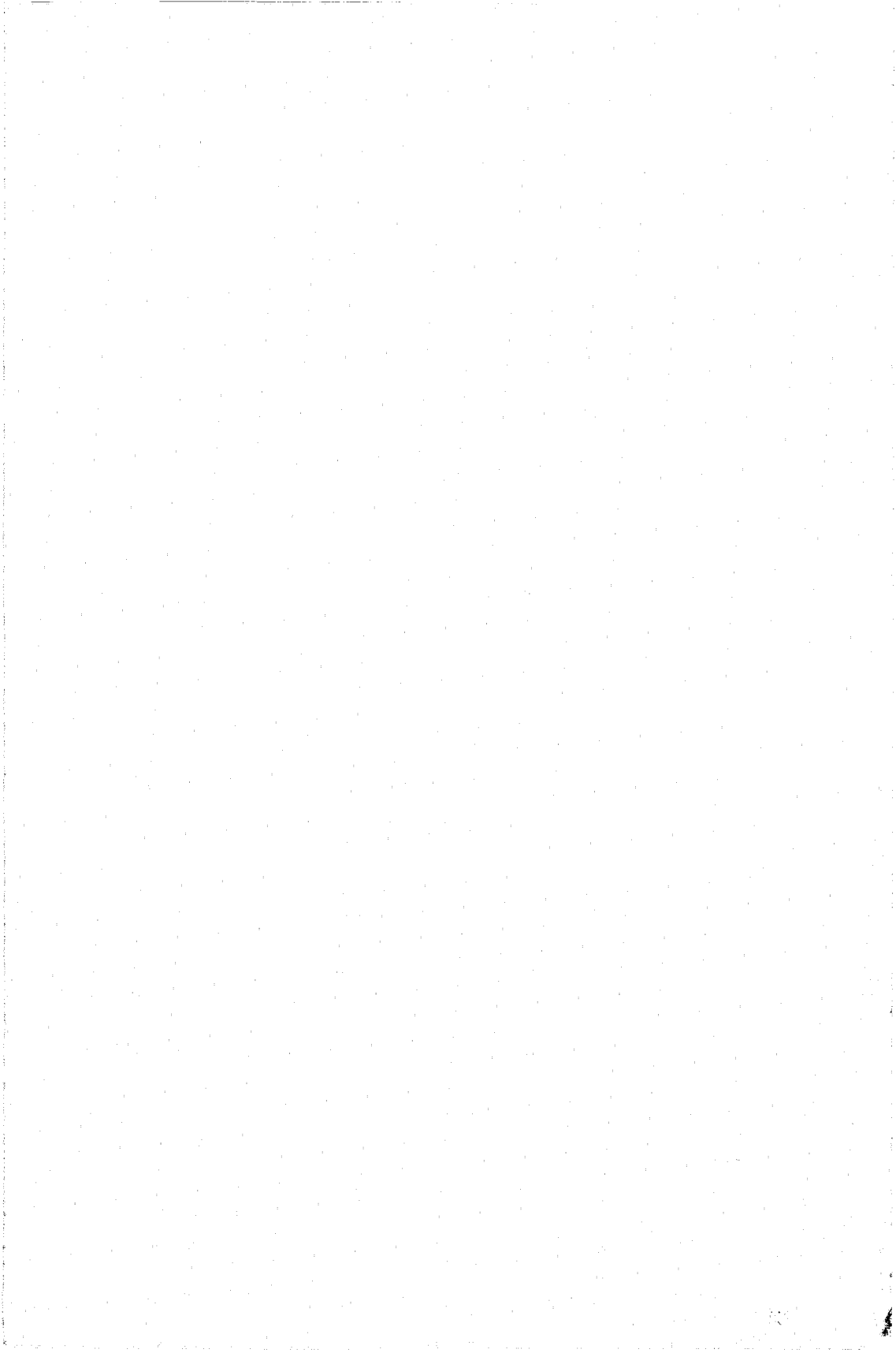

ZZ-601(F) THE DANGEROUS YEARS (Film: 27 min; 16 mm;
black & white)

Documentary portraying, through actual life situations, the current problems of the juvenile and youthful offender, and the role played by the law enforcement officer, judge, probation officer, and correctional worker in the apprehension, adjudication, and rehabilitation processes. The film is primarily for lay audiences.

ZZ-602(F) THE THIN BLUE LINE (Film: 26 min; 16 mm;
black & white)

Documentary which takes a look at the law enforcement officers who man "The Thin Blue Line" between law and order and criminal chaos. The film is a study of the policemen today -- his training, his objectives and his working conditions. You see the inner working of police departments across our country, you hear actual calls as they come into the Communications Center of the Chicago Police Department, you see the newest training methods of our police officers, you go on the 8:00 p.m. to 4:00 a.m. tour of duty with officer Tony Day in Rochester, New York, and you gain insight into problems facing the police today.

ZZ-603(F) IT TAKES A LOT OF HELP (Film: 27 min; 16 mm;
color)

Documentary on community drug abuse action, narrated by Lorne Greene. The film is one of the first to actually document and explore the numerous avenues available to individuals and communities combating local drug abuse. The film involves you in an in-depth analysis of citizen initiated programs in Cedar Rapids, Iowa; group therapy sessions in Chicago; a dramatic conversation on Boston's narcotics "hot line"; an actual drug free sensitivity trip in the forests near Tucson, and much more.

ZZ-604 (F) THE NOBLE BREED

(Film: 27 min; 16 mm;
black & white)

Rod Serling narrates a fire fighters film. Emphasis is placed on the chemical fires which have become more numerous with technology. Several statistics are discussed: 1) For every one policeman killed - five firemen die each year, 2) 10% of fires caused each year are by arsonists. The film ends by stating the need for the community to support their community fire departments for continuing education and training.

ZZ-605 (F) CRIME AND THE COURTS

(Film: 37 min; 16 mm;
black & white)

"Crime and the Courts" is the fourth in a four part film series on Justice in America. Using the city of Denver as an example, the film explores the problems the courts face in dealing with crime. This is done by showing sample situations and live interviews with police, defendants, prosecutors, judges, probation officers, probationers, prison wardens, inmates, ex-offenders, juvenile detention hall officials, and volunteer probation officers. The film gives a fair and accurate picture of the positive and negative aspects of the criminal justice system components as they relate to the courts. The thrust is that the system is not all bad - it needs citizen involvement, and more money, professional manpower, and resources. (For lay audiences.)

ZZ-606 (F) THE EYE OF THE SUPERVISOR

(Film: 10 min; 16 mm;
color)

Portrays a supervisor looking at various employee problems. The main thrust of the film is that the supervisor must be aware and have an open mind in order to see situations objectively. Basic job needs such as 1) need for approval, 2) consistent standards and 3) a supervisor who really listens, are emphasized. (For office organization or introduction to supervision.)

ZZ-607(F) BUNNY

(Film: 18 min; 16 mm;
color)

The film begins with a young college co-ed named "Bunny" talking about her life. She sets the scene by describing her non-committal environment. The film proceeds by filling in various details of her life. Several attitudes of the youth involved in drugs are displayed.

1. The euphoric opinion. (while under drugs)
2. The pessimistic view of the working world and its so-called straight society.
3. Disregarding (although knowledgeable) of the damage a drug may do to a person's body as well as mind. (Self-destruction)

(Introduction to attitudes & insight of drug user.)

ZZ-608(F) GUY

(Film: 18 min; 16 mm;
color)

GUY is about the Chicano culture. It typifies the life situation of a Chicano, his friends, his school, and his family. Frustrations are explained concerning overcrowding and poverty. The drug subculture is shown to exist in the Chicano community as well as the emphasis of peer approval, which points out that to belong to the Chicano community, one must serve time in jail. At the end of the film, Guy is arrested for rape. His mother does not believe that Guy has committed the crime and the viewer is left to see the helplessness that prevails throughout the life of the Chicano.

ZZ-609(F) TOM

(Film: 18 min; 16 mm;
color)

This film focuses on a young adult whose lifestyle is different from most middle class Americans. The total rejection of the work ethic, and the concept of material success as a measure of personal worth, is emphasized. Tom's life is portrayed as tranquil. He regards the psychedelic drugs as sacraments which effect his attitudes, feelings and choices. (Film for introduction into the hallucinogen user's reaction to society.)

This film was a discussion of the numerous addicting drugs. Effectively, an individual from the street world and the straight world touch on and list each of the following drugs giving both the slang and technical names: Alcohol; Coffee; Cigarettes; Barbiturates; Heroin; Morphine; Codeine; Methadone; Cocaine; Amphetamines; Marijuana; L.S.D.; Mescaline; Psilocybin and D.M.T.

The film discusses sociological aspects as being the causes for addiction. This is backed up by discussing the facts which we do know such as: Name of Substance; Source; Classifications; Medical Use; How Taken; Usual Dosage; and Physical as well as Mental Dependency.

In conclusion, the film discusses the little amount known about drugs and touches on alternatives which must be found to combat both the criminal effect as well as the emotional effect that drugs have made on our society.

This is a film about two undercover narcotics agents who, through their work, have become involved with young people living in the drug culture. Both agents know what involvement means. They know the need that young people have to be involved with other people, and they know their frustration at the lack of it in family and school environments. These two men have found it difficult to sustain their old, impersonal views of the drug user because they have now shared the lifestyle. "You're talking about other human beings," says one agent, "kids 13,14,15 years of age." Thus involvement means dealing with real people - not just crime statistics. The two narcotic agents have discovered a certain futility in enforcing narcotic laws on small dealers and users, without being able to attack drug distribution at its source.

The two men's realistic appraisal of the problems surrounding enforcement of narcotics laws and the nature of the drug culture can assist the professional in assessing his own approach to the drug user who comes to him for help.

ZZ-612(F)

CONFRONTATION: A NURSE AND A DRUG
ADDICT

(Film: 8 min; 16 mm;
color)

This film displays several reasons why conflict can occur in the clinical situation, which exists in many psychiatric units in various hospitals of the U.S.

Larry, an 8 year heroin addict, is in a methadone program in a psychiatric unit. A nurse finds a bag of heroin in the communal bathroom and accuses Larry. Larry is instantly furious and hurt. From the conflict between the nurse and Larry, several reasons why drug programs are not successful are shown: 1) Cultural differences of the white, middle-class nurse, who knows little of the pressures that Larry, the lower-class Mexican American has, and therefore there is a lack of communication. 2) There is little training available to the psychiatric nurse, because there is little knowledge about drugs. 3) Drug units still have many security problems such as smuggling in of drugs, which does not help while a patient is under treatment (Introduction to alternatives for drugs as a psychiatric unit.)

ZZ-613(F)

TREATMENT: NEW TEAMS

(Film: 10 min; 16 mm;
color)

"Treatment: New Teams" is a film about the attitudes and feelings of nonprofessionals currently working in one rehabilitation program. They see a central problem; the drug user's close identification of the professional health or social services worker with "the establishment." To the people involved in drug use, "the establishment" means police; consequently, drug users tend to be wary of professionals who do not understand their lifestyles.

There is another problem as well: The nonprofessional does not want his responsibility assumed by a professional. His experience has taught him that he is effective, and he wants to continue to be effective. Thus the issue involves ways in which both professionals and nonprofessionals can develop appropriate, nonconflicting roles and follow these through in their work with drug users.

ZZ-614(F) THEORY X & THEORY Y
TWO SETS OF ASSUMPTIONS
IN BUSINESS MANAGEMENT

(Film: 35 min; 16 mm;
color)

This film provides all the materials that a management trainer or educator needs to acquaint his students with McGregor's ideas. It also provides opportunities for the students to apply the ideas to their organizations and to themselves as present or future managers. Theory X and Theory Y represent important differences in assumptions managers have about human nature and have come to be associated with two contrasting styles of management. (For supervision - 25 handout questionnaires along with an instructional guide, pictures, cards.)

ZZ-615(F) BEYOND THEORY Y - THE CONTINGENCY
APPROACH

(Film: 15 min; 16 mm;
color)

This business management training film package poses the question: what's the best approach to structuring an organization so as to get the best out of the people in it and to help the people get the most out of their work psychologically? The film suggests that there is no one best approach, but rather that the approach a manager uses should be contingent upon two determining factors: 1. the nature of the job, and 2. the nature of the people. Only such a "contingency approach" will insure the most effective management.

The package includes: 1. The 16mm color film. 2. A self-administered, self-scored questionnaire and accompanying graph to involve participants personally in the training session. 3. A comprehensive set of notes and guidelines for the management trainer/educator to plan his session. 4. Three large wall charts. (For discussion of managerial techniques.)

ZZ-616(F) YOU PACK YOUR OWN CHUTE

(Film: 30 min; 16 mm;
color)

Dr. Eden Ryl demonstrates how to conquer unrealistic fears that develop out of insecurity and habit. By parachuting into the Pacific Ocean off the coast of California, Dr. Ryl overcomes her fear of height and water. This dramatization stresses a very useful procedure in conquering fears. The viewer learns how to become responsible for decisions made in the office, as well as outside the office.

Because of the film's flexibility it:

1. raises questions
2. stimulates group involvement
3. sharpens skills in public contact

ZZ-617(F) YOU CAN SURPASS YOURSELF

(Film: 30 min; 16 mm;
color)

By shooting an aspirin in mid-air with a BB gun, Dr. Ryl shows the viewer that one can achieve beyond one's expectations.

According to Dr. Eden Ryl, limitations keep individuals from obtaining personal goals. These limitations which are learned forms of behavior, restrict teachability and flexibility in working atmospheres.

ZZ-618(F) TIME OF YOUR LIFE

(Film: 30 min; 16 mm;
color)

This training film gives the viewer a basic view of effective time use. Five step procedures are elaborated upon to help establish time management rules. They are: (1) List goals and set priorities, (2) Make daily lists for daily priorities, (3) Decide what the best way is for daily use of time, (4) How to sort to handle each piece of paper once, (5) Do not procrastinate- do it now.

The film concludes by establishing that by meeting the 5 time management rules, one can achieve the highest % of productivity through the lowest % of time/work involvement.

The Bob Knowlton Story creates a psychological atmosphere of openness and readiness to learn behavioral changes involved in management/relationships.

The film's story is about a high level manager who is afraid to confess his feelings of inadequacy to his superior. By the conclusion, the main character has quit his job without communicating with his superior about his true reasons for resignation.

The film may be used to open discussion by posing questions such as: Why can't an employee level with his boss when he needs help?, What work environment and managerial styles facilitate openness?, or How can harmonious working relationships be developed in a group without destroying a "results-oriented" posture?

The film presents a period in the life of a manager who has allowed his job to manage him. It also illustrates how inefficiency has caused the following problems to result:

- a) Failure to delegate work
- b) Poor establishment of priorities
- c) Lack of systemization
- d) Poor control (self-work-staff)
- e) Failure to motivate subordinates

The film provides solutions to the problems listed above in a stimulating and effective story.

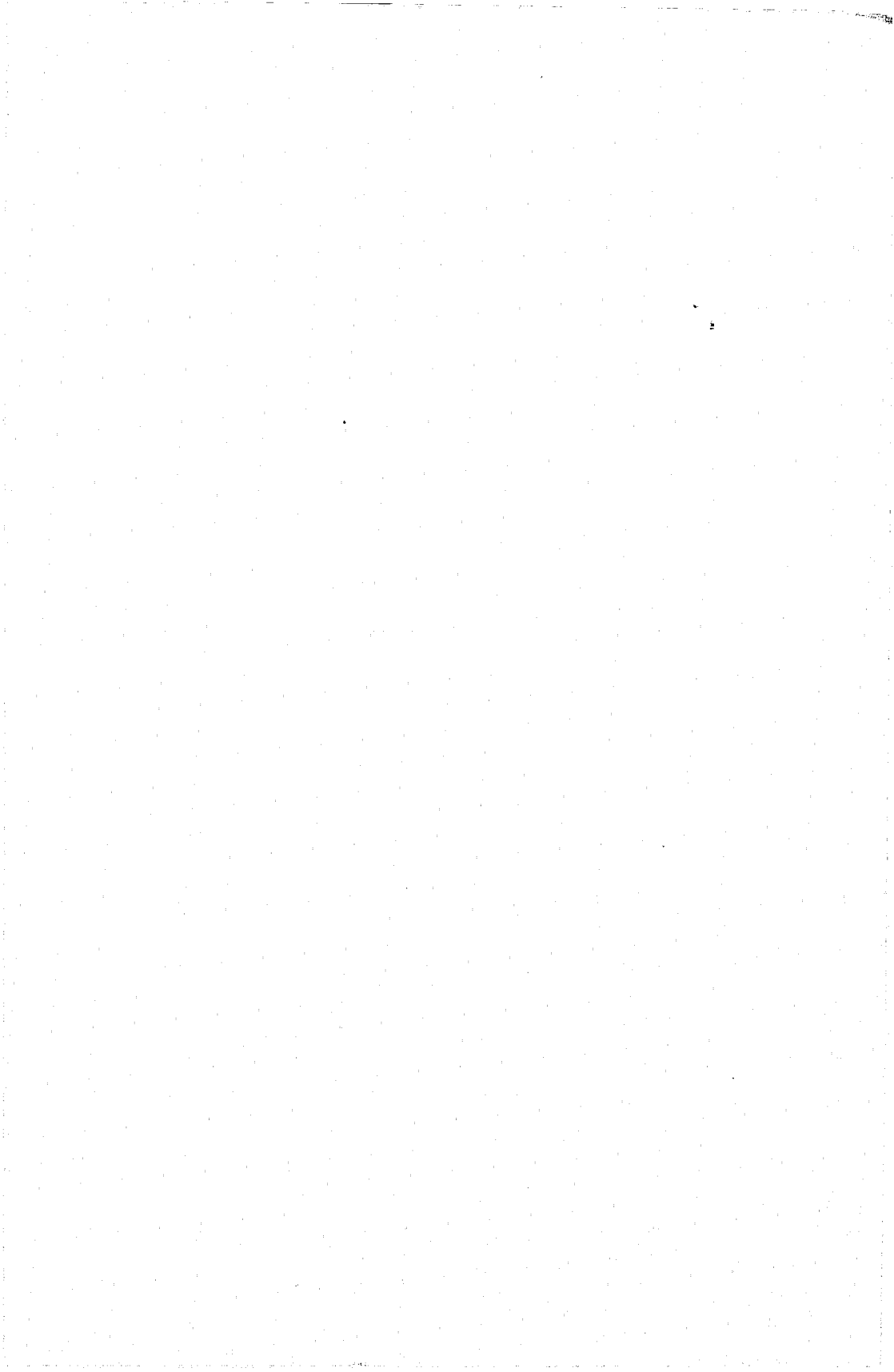
